### Extra Points

► The two teams have met 108 previous times and have played 96 consecutive games since 1906, making KU-NU the current longest uninterrupted series in college football.

---

► NU running backs coach Dave Gillespie coached at Kansas from 1994-97 serving as assistant coach/administrative assistant while on the KU staff.

---

► NU leads the series 84-21-3, including a 39-15-2 mark while playing in Lincoln, and has won 33 consecutive games. KU's last win in Nebraska came in 1968 - a 23-13 victory.

---

► Slow starts have been a problem this season for the Jayhawk offense. Kansas, which has fallen behind in six straight games dating back to Sept. 28, has produced just two first-quarter touchdowns in 2002. In fact, KU opponents hold a 102-16 first quarter scoring advantage this season.

---

► After a Bobby Bihiray interception last Saturday, a total of six different KU players have now recorded at least one interception this season led by cornerback Remuise Johnson with six picks.

---

► The Jayhawks are averaging 201.6 passing yards per game this season, which qualifies as the fourth-highest average per game in school history.

### Scene Setter

Kansas (2-8, 0-6) will play its final road encounter of the season when it travels to Lincoln, Neb. to play the Cornhuskers of Nebraska (6-4, 2-3) on Saturday, Nov. 9, in Memorial Stadium. Kickoff is at 12:30 p.m. on Tom Osbourne Field.

The Huskers are 6-4 overall and 2-3 in the league after a 27-24 loss at home to Texas last weekend.

The two teams have played 96 consecutive games (since 1906) making the series the current longest uninterrupted in college football.

NU leads the series 84-21-3, including a 39-15-2 mark while playing in Lincoln, and has won 33 consecutive games. KU's last win in Nebraska came in 1968 - a 23-13 victory.

Nebraska is coached by Frank Solich, who is 48-13 in his fifth year at Nebraska and overall.

### The Coaches

Kansas head coach Mark Mangino is in his first season as a head coach with an overall 2-8 (.200) career mark. Mangino, who was a driving force in the successful turn-around of two Big 12 Conference football programs over the last 11 years, comes to KU after working the past three seasons as assistant head coach/offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at the University of Oklahoma. Mangino, the 35th coach in KU history, had an impressive record during his 11-year career as an assistant coach at both Kansas State and Oklahoma. Overall, Kansas State and Oklahoma were a combined 101-30-1 and were ranked in the top 25 nationally in eight of the 11 seasons during Mangino's involvement on the coaching staff.

Nebraska coach Frank Solich (Nebraska, '66) has a 48-13 (.787) record in his fifth season at NU and overall.

### Last Time Out

The University of Kansas football team committed seven turnovers as No.14 Kansas State capitalized with a huge first quarter to defeat the Jayhawks, 64-0, in the 100th game of the Sunflower Showdown, last Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium.

Kansas State jumped out to a 30-0 first quarter advantage as the Wildcats racked up 494 yards of total offense while KU was held to 14 yards of offense in the first half and 115 total offensive yards in the game.

KSU quarterback Ell Roberson and running back Darren Sproles paced a Wildcat running attack that gained 337 yards on the ground while rushing for seven touchdowns. Roberson led the team with three touchdowns, rushing for 60 yards on 13 carries. Sproles gained a game-high 110 yards on 15 carries, rushing for two touchdowns. Roberson completed nine passes on 14 attempts for 157 yards, including a touchdown pass to wide receiver James Terry in the first quarter.

Fifth-year senior Jonas Weatherbie struggled in his first start at quarterback for KU, subbing for regular starter Bill Whittemore who sat out with an injury, completing two passes on nine attempts for no yards and an interception. Running back Clark Green was a spot for KU, leading the team with 41 yards rushing and 31 yards receiving. With the 37 degree weather and light rain falling throughout the game, KU fumbled six times, losing five.

Starting on the Kansas one yard line after a K-State punt, Green could not escape the grasp of several Wildcats on a handoff and was promptly brought down in the KU endzone at the 11:06 mark. Already down 9-0 after a Roberson touchdown run, KU botched a punt attempt and gave the ball right back to KSU at its own 11 yard line. Four plays later, the Wildcats would get a Sproles TD to make it 16-0 after seven minutes of play. KSU scored two more touchdowns to make it 30-0 after one quarter of play.

Redshirt freshman Brian Luke replaced Weatherbie in the second quarter and managed to complete three passes on seven attempts, passing for 21 yards in his first career quarter of action. However, the KU offense could not put any points up on the board while KSU scored two field goals by Joe Rheem and a touchdown to lead 43-0 at the half. For the game, Luke finished with 74 yards passing, completing seven passes on 18 attempts and tossing one interception.

Kansas State put up three more scores in the third quarter, all on the ground, to lead 64-0, which was how the scoring would end.

**Kansas State Leftovers**

- Senior offensive lineman Justin Sands and defensive lineman Charlie Dennis extended their starting streaks to 21 games.
- Senior offensive lineman David Hurst played in his team-leading 44th consecutive game.
- Senior quarterback Jonas Weatherbie made his first career start.
- Freshman quarterback Brian Luke saw his first career action in the second quarter. Luke finished the game 7-of-18 passing for 74 yards with a long pass of 31 yards to Clark Green.
- The 43-point halftime deficit was the most since a 49-point halftime deficit (49-0) to Oklahoma on Nov. 13, 1971.
- KU's 43-0 halftime deficit was its biggest since Oklahoma held a 49-0 advantage over KU on Nov. 13, 1971. OU won that game 56-10.
- Freshman Greg Heaggans surpassed the KU single-season record for kickoff return yards. Heaggans notched five returns for 119 yards on the day and now has a total of 610 return yards on the season. The previous record was 531 kickoff return yards by Arnold Snell in 1988.
- Junior defensive back Bobby Bihiray notched his first career interception in the KSU endzone in the third quarter.
- Senior wide receiver Byron Gasaway extended his streak of games with at least one catch to 12 dating back to the Iowa State game last season.
- KU tied a Big 12 Conference record with five lost fumbles. Nebraska lost five fumbles vs. Colorado on Nov. 26, 1999 and Kansas State lost five fumbles versus USC earlier this season on Sept. 21.
- The KSU 64-0 win was the largest Wildcat win in the KU/KSU series -- previous was 54-6 on Oct. 31, 1998. It was the first time KU has been shutout since a 59-0 loss at Texas on Nov. 10, 2001, and the first time KU was shut out by Kansas State since a 46-0 loss to the Wildcats on Nov. 5, 1955. KU has shutout K-State seven times since 1955 with the most recent shutout in the series coming on a 28-0 KU win on Nov. 1, 1975.
- The Memorial Stadium crowd of 43,000 was the largest KU has played in front of at home this season.

**A Quick Look At Nebraska**

Nebraska enters this week's matchup against Kansas with a 6-4 overall record and a 2-3 mark in the Big 12 Conference after falling to No. 7 Texas, 27-24, last Saturday in Lincoln.

NU's offense is led by quarterback Jammal Lord, who is the Huskers' top passer and rusher this season. Lord is averaging 211.2 yards of total offense per game and is the only Big 12 quarterback to average over 100 yards rushing per game (115.5 pg). Lord is completing 50.7 of his passes this season as he has thrown for 957 yards on 69-of-136 passes, eight touchdowns and eight interceptions. His 115.5 rushing yards per game is the second most in the league and ranks 19th nationally. Joining Lord in the backfield is Dahrran Diedrick who is NU's second leading rusher, carrying the ball 134 times for 622 yards and five scores this year.

Nebraska coach Frank Solich (Nebraska, '66) has a 48-13 (.787) record in his fifth season at NU and overall.

On defense, five Nebraska defenders have 50-plus tackles, led by Philip Bland who has recorded a team-high 59 stops. In addition, the defense has recorded 88 tackles for loss this year.

**Texas Defeats Nebraska**

The nation's longest home winning streak ended at 26 games as the University of Texas defeated Nebraska, 27-24, last Saturday at Memorial Stadium in Lincoln, Neb.

Nebraska had a chance to tie or win the game with :34 seconds remaining but Nebraska's Jammal Lord threw his second interception of the game when he was picked off by UT's Nathan Vasher at the one-yard line.

Lord carried the offensive load for Nebraska on Saturday as he ended the day with 23 carries for 234 yards and com-

pleted 7-of-14 passes for 98 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions.

The Husker defense held Texas to only 79 rushing yards but UT quarterback Chris Simms completed 29-of-47 passes for 419 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. Simms' top target on Saturday was Roy Williams who hauled in 13 passes for 161 yards and two scores.

### ***Kansas - Nebraska Series Notes***

The two teams have met 108 previous times and have played 96 consecutive games since 1906, making KU-NU the current longest uninterrupted series in college football ... The series is also tied as the third-longest in NCAA Division 1A history (108 games), trailing only Minnesota-Wisconsin (112) and KU-Missouri (111) ... Nebraska has won the last 33 meetings and leads the overall series 84-21-3 ... The Pepper Rodgers-coached Jayhawks own the most recent win by a KU team over Nebraska ... Kansas last won in 1968, when the sixth-ranked Jayhawks downed the ninth-ranked Cornhuskers, 23-13, in Lincoln ... The Jayhawks face an unranked Nebraska squad for the first time in 32 years ... KU has an overall road record of 190-273-26 and is 1-4 in road games this season.

### ***Vs. The State Of Nebraska***

Kansas has a combined record of 24-84-3 versus opponents from the state of Nebraska. The Jayhawks hold a perfect record of 3-0 record against Creighton and hold a 21-84-3 record against the University of Nebraska.

### ***In Last Year's Game***

Nebraska exploded for 458 total yards and six touchdowns en route to a lopsided 51-7 victory over the Jayhawks in Lawrence late last season. The Huskers did most of their damage in the second and fourth quarters, accumulating 44 of their 51 points in those two periods.

Husker senior quarterback Eric Crouch guided Nebraska, connecting with six different receivers, on 14-of-24 passes for 164 yards, and carried the ball 13 times for 49 yards and a score. Crouch left the game after the first Nebraska drive in the fourth quarter with NU leading 37-0.

The Cornhuskers led 44-0 midway through the fourth quarter when the Jayhawk offense came to life. KU used an impressive 10-play, 80-yard drive culminating in a four-yard TD pass from KU Zach Dyer to tight end Adrian Jones. Kansas tallied five first downs on the drive, more than doubling the total number for the game up to that point.

After a scoreless first quarter, Nebraska had all cylinders clicking in the second. Less than a minute into the second quarter, junior running back Dahrran Diedrick put the first points on the board on a 10-yard run. Minutes later, NU junior kicker Josh Brown booted a 32-yard field goal. After a 21-yard TD scamper by junior running back Thunder Collins, Brown connected on another field goal, this time a 43-yarder, as the clock ran out in the first half and the Cornhuskers took a 20-0 lead into the break.

With both teams putting in reserves in the fourth quarter, the Cornhuskers struck four times, and KU got its only score. Brown split the uprights on a 32-yard field goal to open the fourth. After the Jayhawks punted on the follow-

ing possession, Kansas native Ben Cornelson fielded a punt for Nebraska and returned it 71 yards for a touchdown.

After picking up just six total yards in the first half, KU got back on track in the second half finishing with 203 total yards.

### Stacking The Sacks

As a team, the KU defense has recorded 21 quarterback sacks this season which qualifies as the 12th-best mark in school history. The top quarterback sack performance for one season came in 1992 when the Jayhawk defense - which included current NFL players Gilbert Brown and Dana Stubblefield - tallied 40 sacks. (NOTE: Sack statistics are available only since 1982.)

### Did You Know?

The Jayhawks are averaging 188.8 passing yards per game this season, which qualifies as the seventh-highest average per game in school history. The highest average came in 1983, as KU averaged 286.0 yards per game (3,146 yards in 11 games).

### On This Day

KU holds a 4-12 all-time record while playing on Nov. 9. The last time the Jayhawks played on Nov. 9, was back in 1996, a 38-12 loss to No. 13 Kansas State in Lawrence. In that game, current Tennessee Titan Isaac Byrd, hauled in nine receptions for 178 yards. The nine receptions ties for the fifth highest single-game total and the 178 yards is the sixth-best single-game total in KU history.

The Jayhawks' first game played on Nov. 9 came in 1895, a 32-0 win against Doane.

### Hawk Notes

Kansas has five wide receivers with 20 or more catches ... Senior wide receiver Byron Gasaway has caught at least one pass in 12 straight games, including all 10 this season ... Since 1999, the Jayhawks are 11-5 when scoring 21 or more points ... KU opponents are the second-most penalized among Big 12 teams as they are averaging 67.6 penalty yards per game ... KU has been penalized just 49 times for 412 yards, an average of 41.2 yards per game ... KU is 2-2 in night games this season ... Kansas has caused at least one turnover in eight of 10 games this season and in 18 of its last 21 games ... Since 1995, KU is 20-6 when a Jayhawk player rushes for over 100 yards in a game ... Greg Heaggans is ninth in the latest NCAA statistics in kickoff return yards with a 27.3 yards per return average.

### Slow Starts

Slow starts have been a problem this season for the Jayhawk offense. Kansas, which has fallen behind in six straight games dating back to Sept. 28, has produced just two first-quarter touchdowns in 2002. In fact, KU opponents hold an 102-16 first quarter scoring advantage this season. In five of the last six games, the Jayhawks have fallen behind 13-0 (at Tulsa), 14-0 (at Baylor), 14-0 (Colorado), 24-0 (Texas A&M) and 7-0 (at Missouri) before scoring their first points of the game. Last Saturday, the Jayhawks were shutout for the first time since a 59-0 loss at Texas last season.

Kansas has turned the ball over in two games, punted six times, missed a field goal and has been sacked in the endzone for a safety on its first possession of each game this season.

### Youthful Green Making Statement

Redshirt freshman running back Clark Green's performance this season qualifies him as one of the emerging young offensive talents in the Big 12 Conference. Green, a native of Tampa, Fla., is KU's top rusher this

season and ties as KU's top receiver. On Oct. 26 at Missouri, Green fell just five rushing yards shy of recording his second 100-plus yard game of the season as he tallied 95 yards on 23 carries. Earlier this season Green rushed for a career-best 131 yards against SMS on Sept. 14.

Green:

- Carried the ball 153 times for 606 yards and three scores this season.
- Ties with Byron Gasaway as KU's top receiver with 30 receptions for 312 yards.
- Leads KU in all-purpose yards this season, averaging 91.8 yards per game.
- Led KU in rushing in seven of 10 games.
- Led KU in receiving in three of 10 games.

### Pick Pocket

Junior Bobby Birhiray became the latest member of the Jayhawk defense to pick off an opponent pass this season, as the 6-0, 200-pound defensive back picked off KSU's Marc Dunn's pass in the endzone last Saturday. A total of six different KU players have now recorded at least one interception this season led by cornerback Remuise Johnson.

Johnson is leading the Jayhawks this season with six interceptions which not only ranks third on the KU list for interceptions in a single season behind Pete Konek, who had eight picks in 1951 and Ray Evans, who holds the record with 10 in 1942, but the six picks also ties for the 12th-best mark in the nation.

Johnson, who is second in the Big 12 in interceptions behind Brandon Everage of Oklahoma, is the first KU player since 1983 to collect more than five interceptions in a season.

### Youth Movement

Linebackers Nick Reid and Kevin Kane have made an immediate impact as true freshmen on the KU defense this season.

Reid, who has started the past four games, is the Jayhawks' fourth-leading tackler this year and has appeared in all 10 games. Reid, a native of Derby, Kan. who started two-a-days as a quarterback, has also recorded four sacks, three tackles for loss, two pass breakups and forced two fumbles.

Kane, who recorded his best game as a Jayhawk with a team-best 12 tackles against Kansas State last weekend, has seen action in nine of 10 games and has 20 total stops this year.

### Whittemore Shines

Junior quarterback Bill Whittemore missed his first game as a Jayhawk as he sat out of last week's game after suffering an injury in the third quarter against Missouri on Oct. 26. Through KU's first nine games this season, Whittemore has put on a show for Jayhawk fans with his impressive play at quarterback. Not only is the KU signal caller the top passer, averaging 185.1 yards per game, but he qualifies as the team's second-leading rusher, with an average of 61.0 yards on the ground per contest.

Through the first nine games, Whittemore is averaging 246.1 yards per game in total offense, which qualifies as the fourth-best average in the Big 12 Conference. The Fort Scott CC transfer has completed 151-of-305 (49.5%) passes for 1,666 yards, 10 touchdowns and six interceptions. On the ground, the 6-0, 195-pound native of Brentwood, Tenn., has carried the ball 137 times for 549 yards and 11 touchdowns.

Currently, Whittemore ranks in the top 40 in three national statistical categories (32nd in total offense, 246.1 ypg, 39th in scoring, 7.78 ppg and tied for sixth in points responsible for, 15.56 per game).

### *Gasaway Ending KU Career On Positive Note*

Senior Byron Gasaway is winding down his five-year KU career on an impressive note as the 6-2, 205-pound wide receiver ties as KU's top receiver this season with 30 catches for a team-best 334 yards and three touchdowns. At Missouri on Oct. 26, the Grandview, Mo., native hauled in six passes for a career-best 101 yards and a touchdown and against Texas A&M two weeks ago, Gasaway recorded six catches for 63 yards and two scores. Gasaway's 101 yards at Missouri marked the first time since Oct. 7, 2000 a KU player had recorded 100-plus receiving yards, and it marked the most receiving yards by any KU player this year.

Gasaway, who has caught at least one pass in the last 12 games dating back to last season, currently sits in 19th place on the KU career receptions list with 66 career catches and needs just three receptions to move into 17th place, passing both Roger Ross (68 catches - 2000-01) and John Schroll (68 catches - 1970-72).

### *Tackle Leader*

Senior linebacker Greg Cole is the Jayhawks' leader on defense this season as he leads the defensive unit and ranks among the leaders in the conference with 90 total tackles (an average of nine per game), including 19 for loss, four sacks, one intercepted pass, one pass breakup, three quarterback hurries and a blocked field goal attempt in the third quarter against the Rebels of UNLV on Sept. 7.

This season, Cole has recorded six double-figure tackle games and has been KU's top tackler in four of 10 games. Cole, a transfer from Hutchinson CC last season, already has 19 tackles for loss this season, including a career-best five TFLs against Texas A&M on Oct. 19. His 19 tackles behind the line of scrimmage ranks him second on the single-season tackles for loss list and is only two shy of breaking the school record for TFLs in a season held by Ron Warner in 1997.

### *Ansel Semifinalist For Ray Guy Punter Of The Year Award*

Kansas junior Curtis Ansel is among 10 semifinalists for the third annual Ray Guy Award recognizing the nation's top collegiate punter, the Greater Augusta Sports Council announced on Oct. 30.

Ansel averages 42.3 yards per punt, ranks sixth in the Big 12 and is 20th in the NCAA punting statistics. The 6-1, 205-pound native of Lakin, Kan., has booted a career-best and Big 12 Conference record 83-yard punt (at Baylor) and an 82-yard punt (at UNLV) this season. The 83-yard punt ties as the second-longest in KU history with Mike Hubach's 83-yard punt in 1979, while the 82-yard boot ties as the third-longest punt in school history with Dean Royal's 82-yard punt in 1997. In addition, Ansel has 22 punts that have been down inside the 20 this season.

Each of the 45 punters on the watch list was evaluated on his overall statistics and contribution to his team with emphasis placed on the following categories: net average, percentage of total punts inside the 20, average return yardage and percent not returned.

These various components are what made Ray Guy, the award's namesake, a most exceptional punter and these characteristics are indicative of the nation's top collegiate punter. Ray Guy, a former NFL punter (Oakland Raiders, 1973-1986) is a native of the Augusta, Ga. area, currently residing in Thomson, Ga.

### *Returns To Remember*

Redshirt freshman Greg Heaggans set the KU single-season record for kickoff return yards as he had five returns for 119 yards against Kansas State last weekend, giving him the record. Heaggans replaced Arnold Snell's record of 531 yards during the 1988 season.

This season, Heaggans has 23 kickoff returns for 610 yards and a touchdown and has two games with 100-plus return yards in a game (195 vs. SMS, 115 vs. KSU). The Kansas City, Kan. native and Schlagle High graduate sits in ninth place in this week's national statistics in kickoff return yards as he averages 26.5 yards per return.

Listed below are some of Heaggans highlights this season:

- The 100-yard return against SMS on Sept. 14 ties as the second-longest return in school history as Eric Vann ran a kick back 100 yards against Oklahoma on Oct. 5, 1996 and June Henley ran a kick back 100 yards against Colorado on Nov. 13, 1993. Bert Pooler, who holds the KU record for the longest kickoff return, ran a kick back 108 yards against Oklahoma on Oct. 21, 1905.
- Heaggans ended the day against SMS with 195 (4 returns) total kickoff return yards which breaks the single-game record held by John Hadl, who had 153 kickoff return yards (4 returns) versus Syracuse on Sept. 26, 1959.
- Named Big 12 co-Special Teams Player of the Week for his 195 return yards and touchdown score against SMS.
- Holds the KU single-season recorded for kickoff return yards in a season with 610 yards through 10 games.

### ***Dyer Makes Move***

Junior Zach Dyer made his debut on the Jayhawk defensive side of the ball against Colorado on Oct. 12 after spending the first three years of his KU career as a quarterback. Dyer has made an immediate impact on the defense as he has led KU in tackles in two of the last four games and has recorded double-figure tackles in three of four contests. Dyer recorded a team-best 11 tackles, including three solo stops, after seeing significant time as a backup safety and a member of several special teams against Colorado, and on Oct. 19 recorded a team-high and career-best 14 tackles while making his first career start on defense against Texas A&M.

Dyer appeared in 17 games as a quarterback for KU with five starts. He completed 57-of-120 passes for 618 yards, five interceptions and three touchdowns.

### ***Booting The Ball***

Kansas punter Curtis Ansel continues to be one of the top punters in college football this season. Ansel ranks sixth in the Big 12 and is 20th in the NCAA punting statistics, as he averages 42.3 yards per punt.

So far this season, Ansel has booted a career-best and Big 12 Conference record 83-yard punt (at Baylor) and an 82-yard punt (at UNLV). The 83-yard punt ties as the second-longest in KU history with Mike Hubach's 83-yard punt in 1979, while the 82-yard boot ties as the third-longest punt in school history with Dean Royal's 82-yard punt in 1997. In addition, Ansel is averaging 42.4 yards per punt this season, but his average has decreased slightly due to punting on a short field. Ansel has 22 punts that have been down inside the 20 this season.

### ***Up Next***

Kansas will play its final game of the 2002 season as it hosts Oklahoma State on Saturday, Nov. 16, in Memorial Stadium. Kickoff is still to be determined based on television selections for that weekend.

The Cowboys are 4-4 overall and 2-2 in the league after a 28-23 win against Texas A&M last weekend.

Oklahoma State is coached by Les Miles, who is 8-11 in his second year at OSU and overall.

KU leads the series 28-25-3, including a 15-14-1 mark while playing in Lawrence, and has won six of the last eight meetings. KU's last win against OSU in Lawrence came in 1994 - a 24-14 victory.

### ***Versus The Ranked***

KU's most recent win over a ranked opponent came in 1998 when the Jayhawks defeated Colorado (33-17) on Oct. 24 (ranked 17 in the AP Poll). The Jayhawks have lost to 13 ranked opponents since that win, losing to Kansas State later that season, Notre Dame, Texas A&M and Nebraska in 1999, Oklahoma, Kansas State, Nebraska and Texas in 2000, UCLA, Oklahoma, Nebraska and Texas last season and Kansas State last Saturday in Memorial Stadium.

### ***Historically Speaking***

The 2002 football season will mark KU's 113th year of intercollegiate football. Only 11 NCAA Division IA schools have been playing football longer. Through 112 seasons, Kansas has posted a 519-510-58 record.

### ***Streaking***

Two Jayhawks - offensive tackle Justin Sands and defensive end Charlie Dennis - enter Saturday's game with a 21-game starting streak on the line. Senior offensive lineman David Hurst has played in a team-high 44 consecutive games.

**AMES, Iowa** -- The University of Kansas fell to Iowa State University, 45-3, Saturday, Aug. 31 in its 2002 season and conference opener. The loss makes KU 0-1 overall and 0-1 in the Big 12 Conference.

Kansas was held to just 150 total offensive yards, 69 rushing and 81 passing, and gave up 511 yards, including 277 on the ground, to the Cyclones on Saturday.

The Jayhawks' only score came on a 28-yard field goal from sophomore kicker Johnny Beck. The kick was deflected, but Beck's effort was strong enough to push the ball through the goal posts to end the third quarter. The drive came on a pass-interference call on the Cyclones, aligning the Jayhawks in scoring territory.

Jayhawk starting quarterback Zach Dyer completed 6-of-14 attempts for 50 yards and lost 16 yards on the ground. In the second half, junior college transfer quarterback Bill Whittemore went 4-of-17 for 31 yards and led the Jayhawks on their only scoring drive. The Jayhawks were led on the ground by redshirt freshman Clark Green, who had nine carries for 31 yards while junior Reggie Duncan, who started the game at running back for KU, had nine carries for 21 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Brandon Rideau was the team's top receiver, catching four passes for 30 yards while both Derick Mills and Byron Gasaway recorded two catches a piece.

Iowa State scored in every quarter leading to the Cyclones' first win of the season and a 1-1 overall record on the season.

Iowa State quarterback Seneca Wallace completed 16-of-24 passes for 234 yards and rushed for 22 yards on eight attempts. The Cyclones had 277 rushing yards and 234 passing yards on 81 plays. They were led on the ground by junior Hiawatha Rutland who rushed for 122 yards on 20 carries and a touchdown.

Eleven KU players made their first career starts on Saturday including seven on offense. In addition, 18 Jayhawk newcomers saw their first action in a KU uniform.

Cornerback Remuise Johnson made his first career interception on Saturday when he picked off a Wallace pass early in the second quarter. The pass was tipped by DT Travis Watkins near the line of scrimmage.

**LAS VEGAS, Nev.** -- The University of Kansas football team fell to UNLV, 31-20, in Las Vegas, on Sept. 7, dropping the Jayhawks' record to 0-2 on the season.

Trailing 14-0 with a little more than seven minutes remaining in the first half, Kansas put together its first touchdown score of the season with a seven-play, 80-yard scoring drive that was capped off with a two-yard run by junior quarterback Bill Whittemore with 7:11 remaining in the first half. Later in the quarter sophomore kicker Johnny Beck scored a 30-yard field goal with :18 seconds remaining to make the score 14-10 heading into halftime.

KU was held scoreless in the second half until a 27-yard field goal by Beck with a little more than five minutes remaining in the game, and the Jayhawks' final score of the game was a 23-yard touchdown pass from Whittemore to senior wide receiver Marcellus Jones with :45 seconds remaining in the game.

Against the Rebels, Whittemore connected on 22-of-42 passing attempts for 225 yards and a touchdown. During one stretch in the fourth quarter, he connected for eight straight completions, while leading the Jayhawks in their final scoring drive.

Kansas, who racked up 294 yards in total offense, was led on the ground by red-shirt freshman Clark Green, who carried the ball 18 times for 69 yards. Green also had three receptions for 15 yards.

Jones was the leading receiver for the Jayhawks as he hauled in a career-high seven catches for 73 yards and his first career touchdown reception. Freshman wide receiver Mark Simmons caught a career-high five passes for 38 yards and sophomore Brandon Rideau hauled in a pair of passes for a career-best 50 yards, including a long of 39.

Senior Curtis Ansel punted nine times for a total of 401 yards (44.6 avg.) and his 82-yard punt in the fourth quarter ties for the third-longest punt in KU history.

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** -- The University of Kansas football team earned its first win of the season, a 44-24 victory over Southwest Missouri State last Saturday night in Memorial Stadium. The win marks KU fourth consecutive home-opening victory and the 11th win in the last 12 home debuts. Kansas head coach Mark Mangino celebrated his first victory as a head coach in front of the largest home-opening crowd, 40,500, since 1994 (48,100 versus Michigan State).

KU started the game with a bang as redshirt freshman Greg Heaggans returned the opening kickoff 100-yards for a touchdown, marking the Jayhawks' first kickoff return for a touchdown since 1996. Heaggans' return ties as the second-longest in school history, as Eric Vann (1996) and June Henley (1993) also have 100-yard kickoff returns for touchdowns. A native of Kansas City, Kan., Heaggans ran for a total of 195 yards on four kickoff returns, breaking the single-game record held by John Hadl (153 yards on four returns, 1959).

SMS scored with 10:51 left in the first quarter, but Kansas answered in the second quarter with a six-play, 53-yard drive that ended in a seven-yard touchdown run by junior quarterback Bill Whittemore, giving the Jayhawks a 14-7 lead.

The Bears scored again late in the second quarter to tie the score at 14-14, but with :50 left in the half, Whittemore answered again, this time with a two-yard quarterback sneak, making the score, 21-14, headed into halftime.

In the third quarter, junior linebacker Glenn Robinson sacked SMS quarterback Ryan Porter at the one-yard line, forcing a fumble which KU senior linebacker Leo Etienne scooped up and ran in for a score, giving the Crimson and Blue a 27-14 lead. The Bears scored twice in the third quarter with a field goal and a touchdown, but it wasn't enough as the touchdown was their last scoring drive of the game. The Jayhawks, however, were not finished.

Freshman running back Clark Green ran the ball nine yards for a touchdown with 20 seconds left in the third quarter and then ran 13 yards for his second touchdown of the evening with 12:32 remaining in the game.

Sophomore kicker Johnny Beck finalized the Jayhawks' last score, hitting a 37-yard field goal with 1:23 remaining to end the game with a final score of 44-24.

Offensively, the Jayhawks rushed for a total of 202 yards and gained 112 in the air for a season-best 314 net yards on 67 offensive plays and 23 first downs. Green carried the offense, leading the Jayhawks in rushing and receiving. The redshirt freshman from Tampa, Fla. rushed for a total of 131 yards on 24 carries and two touchdowns and caught four passes for 54 yards. Whittemore connected on 10-of-18 passes for 112 yards and two interceptions. He was also the second-leading rusher for the Jayhawks with 55 yards on 14 carries and two touchdowns.

On the defensive side of the ball, Etienne led the Jayhawks with 11 tackles and one fumble recovery for a touchdown.

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** -The treacherous Bowling Green duo of quarterback Josh Harris and running back Joe Alls was too much for the University of Kansas football team as the Jayhawks were defeated, 39-16, Saturday night at Memorial Stadium, dropping KU to 1-3 overall this season.

Special teams and defensive efforts from both rosters kept the scoreboard blank for the first quarter as they battled for field position. The Jayhawks would take an early second-quarter lead when senior Marcellus Jones collected his second career touchdown on a 16-yard pass from quarterback Bill Whittemore. After the failed extra point attempt, KU led 6-0. Bowling Green then answered with a nine-yard touchdown run from Harris at 10:14 in the second quarter to bring the score to 7-6. Beck then came back and capped-off a nine-play, 60-yard drive with a 22-yard field goal, marking the Jayhawks' second and last lead of the game, 9-7, midway through the second quarter.

That's when Bowling Green took over, scoring two touchdowns with less than three minutes left in the half. With the Jayhawks backed-up against their own endzone, Bowling Green's Mitch Hewitt recovered a Jayhawk fumble for a touchdown. On an 11-yard conversion made the score 15-9 and marked the first defensive points scored by a KU opponent this season. Bowling Green quickly forced the Jayhawks to punt and followed up with another score, this time on a 15-yard pass from Alls to Harris to make the score 22-9 going into halftime.

Bowling Green would score two more touchdowns in the third quarter, on an 11-yard touchdown rush from Alls and a two-yard run from Harris to make the score 36-9. Kansas scored late in the third quarter as Dan Coke picked up his first career touchdown on a two-yard run. The carry was Coke's first of the season. Bowling Green would score one more time, at 13:55 in the fourth quarter, before being held scoreless for the remainder of the game by the KU defense.

Despite the outcome, a handful of Jayhawks left their names in the season statistics. Jones notched a career-long 37-yard reception late in the third quarter. Junior defensive back Remise Johnson snared his third interception of the season on the last play of the first half. Whittemore, who was blitzed constantly by the BGSU defense, still managed to connect with seven different receivers, throwing for 188 yards on 18-of-41 passing and a touchdown. Whittemore was the second-leading rusher with 31 yards on 15 carries, behind redshirt freshman Clark Green, who carried the ball 18 times for 56 yards and also hauled in four catches for 56 yards. Jones also recorded four catches for 62 yards in last Saturday's game.

**TULSA, Okla.** -- The University of Kansas football team overcame a 13-0 first-quarter deficit and never looked back, holding the lead for the rest of the game to defeat the University of Tulsa, 43-33, in non-conference action, at Skelly Stadium in Tulsa, Okla. With the win, KU improves to 2-3, while Tulsa falls to 0-5.

Junior quarterback Bill Whittemore had a career night, spearheading a KU charge that racked up 523 yards of total offense including a 28-point outburst in the second quarter. Whittemore passed for 218 yards and ran for 177 yards, throwing a touchdown and running for three, including a 74-yard scamper in the third quarter. His 395 yards of total offense ranks as the fifth best total in a game by an individual in KU history. Whittemore was the first KU quarterback to rush and pass for over 100 yards since Chip Hilleary last did so in 1990.

KU dug itself a big hole early in the game, as Tulsa capitalized on good field possession to take a quick 13-0 lead in the first quarter. The Golden Hurricane mounted two consecutive 44-yard scoring drives, highlighted by a 30-yard touchdown reception by Montiese Culton on the pass from Tyler Gooch for the first score and a five-yard run by Eric Richardson to give TU the two touchdown advantage.

It appeared as though Tulsa would snap its NCAA Div. I-leading 14 game losing streak, but the Jayhawks rallied for 28 unanswered points in the second quarter, to take a 28-13 lead into the half.

Whittemore capped a 10-play, 68-yard drive with a two-yard rushing touchdown to narrow the score to 13-7. KU got the ball right back after the defense forced a punt and marched down the field, scoring on a four-yard run by Clark Green, to give the Crimson and Blue a 14-13 lead. On the following Tulsa drive, freshman Donnie Amadi plucked his first career interception at the Hurricane 31 yard line and KU capitalized on the turnover by scoring its third touchdown of the quarter, on a one-yard plow into the end zone by sophomore fullback Austine Nwabuisi to make it 21-13 Jayhawks. The Kansas secondary was not done, as Remuise Johnson intercepted his fourth pass of the season on the next Tulsa drive, giving KU the ball back on its 49 yard line with 1:10 to go until the half. The Jayhawks stomped down the field in 1:06, with Whittemore capping off an eight-play, 51-yard drive by scoring his second rushing touchdown of the game and more importantly, giving KU a 28-13 halftime lead.

Tulsa would did not give up, as it came out after the half and scored a TD in six plays, making the score 28-19, after a failed two-point attempt. But the day was Whittemore's, as the Brentwood, Tenn., native squashed any hopes for a Tulsa rally, by scampering 74 yards on the following drive for his third rushing touchdown of the game, giving KU a 35-19 lead with 11:09 to go in the third quarter. KU got on the scoreboard again, with 46 seconds left in the third quarter, when junior tight end Adrian Jones caught his first career KU touchdown on a 10-yard pass from Whittemore, making it 43-19 after Mark Simmons caught a Whittemore pass for the two-point conversion.

Tulsa made things close late in the game, rallying with two touchdowns late in the fourth quarter to make it a 43-33 game. KU recovered an onside kick and ran out the clock to close the game.

The KU receivers had their best performance of the season as Brandon Rideau had five catches for 93 yards and Byron Gasaway had four receptions for 55 yards to lead the receiving corps.

**WACO, Texas** -- With less than a second remaining on the clock, Baylor University hit a 33-yard game-winning field goal giving it a 35-32 win over the University of Kansas in Waco, Texas on Saturday, Oct. 5.

Baylor jumped out to an early 14-0 lead which was unanswered by the Jayhawks in the first quarter. The tide turned in the second quarter as the Crimson and Blue held the Bears scoreless and collected 12 points of its own. Junior quarterback Bill Whittemore threw a nine-yard pass to freshman Mark Simmons for the first KU touchdown, making the score 14-6. Moments later senior Jake Letourneau intercepted a Baylor pass that eventually turned into a Kansas touchdown when junior Reggie Duncan ran the ball 13 yards with one minute remaining in the half for the score. The Jayhawks failed on a two-point conversion try, but Kansas trailed by a mere two points heading into halftime.

In the third quarter, the Jayhawks took their first lead of the game as Whittemore connected on an 18-yard pass to junior Derick Mills for a touchdown. Unfortunately for KU, the Bears intercepted the two-point conversion attempt. After the change of possession, Baylor created a six-play, 91-yard touchdown drive, capped off by a Vince Copeland 16-yard touchdown run, leaving the battle 21-18 after a successful PAT by Daniel Adino.

On the next Kansas possession, Baylor intercepted a Whittemore pass and eventually turned it into a 46-yard field goal to make the score 24-18. Kansas quickly forced Baylor to punt and then scored on a Whittemore 34-yard run as the third quarter clock ran out. The Jayhawks led, 25-24, to begin the fourth quarter of play.

Neither team scored until less than three minutes remained in the fourth quarter when KU's offense was able to take over thanks to the Jayhawk defense. The Jayhawk defense rattled Karas on back to back sacks. After KU's David McMillan dropped Karas for a five-yard loss, jayhawk Glenn Robinson knocked the ball loose from Karas on the following play, allowing Charlie Dennis to recover at the Baylor 19. With 2:51 left in the game, Whittemore scored his second rushing touchdown and increased the Kansas lead to an eight-point spread, 32-24.

Baylor did not give up the battle. With 1:18 on the game clock, Baylor's Robert Quiroga scored on a 41-yard pass from Karas, and then the Bears made good on a two-point conversion rush to tie the game, 32-32, with 1:12 left. It was the Bears' turn to quickly force KU to punt and they succeeded. Baylor worked its way down to the Kansas 16-yard line with less than a second left, and Adino kicked a 33-yard field goal to win the game. Kansas returned the Baylor kickoff, but it was too late as the game clock ran out.

Whittemore led the Jayhawks in the air and on the ground, gathering 325 yards of total offense. He rushed 12 times for 79 yards and two touchdowns, and connected on 23-of-42 passing attempts, two touchdowns and an interception. Senior Marcellus Jones was the leading receiver for KU with five catches for 75 yards.

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** -- The University of Kansas football team fell to Big 12 Conference foe Colorado in Memorial Stadium, 53-29, Saturday afternoon. While KU quarterback Bill Whittemore tallied 338 total offensive yards, Colorado running back Chris Brown stole the show, rushing for 309 yards on 25 carries and two touchdowns.

Whittemore led Kansas in the air and on the ground as he connected on 16-of-33 passing attempts for 217 yards, two touchdowns and an interception and ran the ball 27 times, gaining 121 yards and two touchdowns. Redshirt freshman running back Clark Green was KU's second-leading rusher and receiver with four catches for 30 yards and 61 rushing yards on 12 carries. Junior Derick Mills was the Jayhawks' top receiver, catching four passes for 78 yards. Senior wide receiver Marcellus Jones scored Kansas' two other touchdowns, with three catches for 67 yards. Sophomore kicker Johnny Beck made three-of-three PAT attempts, but missed a 51-yard field goal in the last :48 seconds of regulation.

Colorado came out strong, scoring twice within the first five minutes of the game. First, on an eight-yard pass from CU quarterback Robert Hodge to D.J. Hackett, and then once again on a 78-yard Brown run. After Kansas punter Curtis Ansel kicked a 63-yard punt, forcing the Buffs to begin their drive on their own one-yard line, KU's Johnny McCoy and Greg Cole tackled Brown in the Colorado endzone on the following play for a Kansas team safety, making the score 14-2 with 9:32 to play in the first quarter. After the safety, the Jayhawks retained possession and turned it into a seven-play, 60-yard scoring drive as Whittemore found Jones for a 26-yard touchdown reception. After a Beck extra point, the score was 14-9 at the end of the first quarter.

Kansas would take its first and only lead of the game seconds into the second quarter, as Mills caught a 38-yard pass from Whittemore for a first down at the CU one-yard line, putting Whittemore in position for a five-yard quarterback rush into the endzone at the 14:56 mark. The Jayhawks failed on a two-point conversion making the score 15-14.

Colorado controlled most of the second quarter, scoring three times. Brown ran 51-yards for a touchdown, Derek McCoy caught a 15-yard pass from Hodge that was followed by a successful two-point conversion and Don Strickland intercepted a Whittemore pass and ran it back 95 yards for a touchdown with 4:22 remaining in the second quarter, making the score 36-15 in CU's favor.

But late in the second frame, Kansas was in a fourth down situation with six yards to go for a first down. The KU punt team came out, but would fake the punt as Jayhawk freshman Darren Rus caught a pass from freshman teammate Nick Reid for the first down. Three plays later, Jones caught a 20-yard pass from Whittemore with 1:03 left, leaving the score 36-22 at the half.

Both teams would score once in the third quarter. Colorado kicker Patrick Brougham made good on a 43-yard field goal attempt while KU scored late in the quarter as Whittemore ran nine yards for his second touchdown of the day and the last Kansas score of the game. The Buffaloes would score two more times in the fourth quarter, with an eight-yard Hodge pass to McCoy and a 21-yard Brandon Drumm rush. KU's Beck attempted a 51-yard field goal in the last :48 seconds of the game, but missed and the final score was left at 53-29.

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** - The University of Kansas football team was defeated by Texas A&M, 47-22, Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium. The Jayhawks now move to 2-6 overall and 0-4 in conference play while the Aggies improve to 5-2 on the season and 2-1 in the Big 12.

Both teams were held scoreless in the first quarter, but the Aggies scored first on a 14-play, 78-yard drive that began in the first quarter and ended with just over a minute into the second quarter as Derek Farmer ran four yards for the score. The Aggies scored three more times to control the second quarter, first on an 18-yard pass from Dustin Long to wide receiver Bethel Johnson, then on a 12-yard fumble recovery by Randall Webb and finally on a Todd Pegrum 19-yard field goal to make the score 24-0 at halftime.

KU would get on the scoreboard in the third quarter, snapping TAMU's string of six consecutive quarters of shutout defense as Kansas senior linebacker Leo Etienne recovered an A&M fumble at the Aggies' 24-yard line. Two plays later, KU quarterback Bill Whittemore connected with senior Byron Gasaway for an 18-yard touchdown completion with 7:56 left in the third quarter, making the score 24-7. It looked as if Kansas would score again after senior linebacker Greg Cole intercepted an A&M pass at the Aggie 35-yard line. The Jayhawks lined up for a Johnny Beck 35-yard field goal attempt but after a penalty the Jayhawks were forced to re-kick from 40 yards out. KU would come up short as Beck's second attempt was wide left. A&M's Long threw a 69-yard touchdown pass to Jamaar Taylor on the next Aggie possession, making the score 31-7 to end the third quarter.

The Jayhawks scored five seconds into the fourth quarter on a 12-yard touchdown pass from Whittemore to Gasaway, capping off an eight-play, 80-yard drive that began in the third quarter. Whittemore then connected with senior Marcellus Jones on a two-point conversion to cut the score to 31-15. The Aggies scored three more consecutive times, first with a one-yard Derek Farmer rush where Kansas stopped a two-point conversion attempt, then on a 30-yard pass from Long to Johnson and finally with a 42-yard Pegrum field goal, making the score 47-15. Kansas scored once more with :54 seconds left in the game as Whittemore ran one yard for a touchdown to finish off an 11-play, 80-yard scoring drive. The final score was left at 47-22.

Whittemore completed 21-of-44 passes for 187 passing yards, two touchdowns and an interception. He ran the ball 21 times for 27 net yards and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman Clark Green was the KU's top rusher with 10 carries for 65 yards. Gasaway was Whittemore's favorite target, catching a career-best six passes for 63 yards and two touchdowns. Green would account for 127 yards of total offense, also catching five passes for 62 yards. Senior Curtis Ansel punted 10 times for a total 454 yards, including a 56-yard boot. Ansel also put three punts inside the 20-yard line.

**COLUMBIA, Mo.** -- The University of Kansas football team fell to border rival Missouri, 36-12, Saturday afternoon at Faurot Field in Columbia, Mo. Despite trailing by just eight points at half-time, the combination of Missouri's third-quarter scoring frenzy and the loss of Kansas quarterback Bill Whittemore became too much for the Jayhawks to overcome.

The Jayhawks held Missouri to just one touchdown in the first quarter, as Tiger quarterback Brad Smith threw a 62-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Justin Gage for the first and only score of the quarter.

Kansas would get on the scoreboard in the second quarter when Whittemore found freshman wide receiver Mark Simmons for a 14-yard touchdown pass. KU had a chance to tie the game but missed the extra point as Johnny Beck's kick was no good. Mizzou retaliated with 1:55 left to play in the half as T.J. Leon ran the ball in from seven yards out for the touchdown, making the score 14-6 at halftime. The Jayhawks had other opportunities to score in the first half but came up short on two field goal attempts.

The Missouri offense would score three touchdowns against the Jayhawks in the third quarter, the first being a five-yard run by Leon for his second TD of the game. KU senior wide receiver Byron Gasaway answered the Mizzou attack, catching a 20-yard pass from Whittemore for a touchdown, but the Jayhawks' two-point conversion failed and the score was increased to just 21-12. The rest of the scoring belonged to the Tigers, beginning with a 75-yard quarterback draw by Smith for a touchdown. Next, MU's Darius Outlaw caught a 15-yard pass for a touchdown in the last minute of the third quarter and the Mizzou lead was increased to 34-12. The Tigers scored one last time as MU's Keith Wright tackled backup quarterback Jonas Weatherbie in the endzone for a team safety with 5:28 left in regulation. The Kansas defense held off the Tigers for the remainder of the game and the final score was left at 36-12.

Before leaving the game, Whittemore completed 19-of-37 passes for 242 yards and two touchdowns without suffering a sack or an interception. He also was the second-leading rusher, running eight times for 27 yards. Redshirt freshman Clark Green, the top KU rusher of the game, collected 95 yards on 23 rushing attempts and also caught three passes for 21 yards. Gasaway caught six passes for 101 yards and one touchdown to lead the KU receiving corps, while Simmons followed with four catches for 48 yards and one touchdown. Senior punter Curtis Ansel punted seven times for 307 yards, with a 69-yard boot in the fourth quarter and three that landed inside the 20-yard line.

**LAWRENCE, Kan.** -- The University of Kansas football team committed seven turnovers as No.14 Kansas State capitalized with a huge first quarter to defeat the Jayhawks, 64-0, in the 100th game of the Sunflower Showdown, Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium.

Kansas State jumped out to a 30-0 first quarter advantage as the Wildcats racked up 494 yards of total offense while KU was held to 14 yards of offense in the first half and 115 total offensive yards in the game.

KSU quarterback Ell Roberson and running back Darren Sproles paced a Wildcat running attack that gained 337 yards on the ground while rushing for seven touchdowns. Roberson led the team with three touchdowns, rushing for 60 yards on 13 carries. Sproles gained a game-high 110 yards on 15 carries, rushing for two touchdowns. Roberson completed nine passes on 14 attempts for 157 yards, including a touchdown pass to wide receiver James Terry in the first quarter.

Fifth-year senior Jonas Weatherbie struggled in his first start at quarterback for KU, subbing for regular starter Bill Whittemore who sat out with an injury, completing two passes on nine attempts for no yards and an interception. Running back Clark Green was a bright spot for KU, leading the team with 41 yards rushing and 31 yards receiving. With the 37 degree weather and light rain falling throughout the game, KU fumbled six times, losing five.

Starting on the Kansas one yard line after a K-State punt, Green could not escape the grasp of several Wildcats on a handoff and was promptly brought down in the KU endzone at the 11:06 mark. Already down 9-0 after a Roberson touchdown run, KU botched a punt attempt and gave the ball right back to KSU at its own 11 yard line. Four plays later, the Wildcats would get a Sproles TD to make it 16-0 after seven minutes of play. KSU scored two more touchdowns to make it 30-0 after one quarter of play.

Redshirt freshman Brian Luke replaced Weatherbie in the second quarter and managed to complete three passes on seven attempts, passing for 21 yards in his first career quarter of action. However, the KU offense could not put any points up on the board while KSU scored two field goals by Joe Rheem and a touchdown to lead 43-0 at the half. For the game, Luke finished with 74 yards passing, completing seven passes on 18 attempts and tossing one interception.

Kansas State put up three more scores in the third quarter, all on the ground, to lead 64-0, which was how the scoring would end.
