Nov. 4, 2006 — Memorial Stadium — Lincoln, Neb.

KICKOFF: 11:10 a.m. (central time).

STADIUM: Memorial Stadium (81,067 – FieldTurf surface). Nebraska is 352-106-13 there alltime (.761), including 4-1 in 2006.

RADIO: Tiger Network (Mike Kelly, play-by-play/John Kadlec, color/Chris Gervino, sidelines). Carried on over 50 stations statewide, and on the Internet at mutigers.com. The game is also carried on SIRIUS Satellite Radio on Channel #152.

TIGERS AND HUSKERS SQUARE OFF FOR BIG 12 NORTH LEAD

The Missouri Tigers (7-2 overall, 3-2 in Big 12 Conference play) head North this Saturday to face the Nebraska Cornhuskers (6-3, 3-2) in a battle that will put the winner in control of the Big 12 North Division race. The game, which will be televised regionally on ABC Sports, will kickoff at 11:10 a.m. at Nebraska's Memorial Stadium.

Mizzou is looking to bounce back from a 26-10 home defeat last Saturday to 19th-ranked Oklahoma, in a game that saw the Sooners score all of their points directly after Tiger turnovers, drive-extending penalties, and a safety on a blocked punt.

Similarly, Nebraska is looking to make amends after losing as favorites last Saturday at Oklahoma State, by a 41-29 count. The Huskers jumped out to a 16-0 lead, but were outscored 41-7 in a 35-minute stretch spanning from midway through the 2nd quarter until three minutes remained in the game.

TIGERS AND HUSKERS BATTLE FOR BIG 12 NORTH LEAD

Even with both teams coming off losses last week (with both having been favored over teams from the Sooner State), Saturday's game between Mizzou and Nebraska in Lincoln is still a huge one that will go a long way toward determining who will win the Big 12 North Division in 2006.

The combatants enter the game tied atop the North with identical league records of 3-2 – one game ahead of 3rd-place Kansas State (2-3) entering the weekend. With both teams having already beaten the Wildcats in head-to-head matchups, K-State enters the final 3 games of the year essentially 2 games behind both teams.

In the same vein, the winner of Saturday's Mizzou-Nebraska game will in effect have a 2-game lead over the losing team with just 2 games remaining. That means the winner, standing 4-2, will need to win just 1 of its remaining 2 games in order to represent the North in the Big 12 Championship game (Dec. 2nd in Kansas City, Mo.).

After Saturday's game, Mizzou has a bye week, then wraps up the regular season with a Nov. 18th game at Iowa State (3-6, 0-5), followed by a Nov. 25th home game against rival Kansas (4-5, 1-4). Nebraska will close the regular season

with a Nov. 11th game at Texas A&M (8-1, 4-1) and a Nov. 24th home game against Colorado (1-8, 1-4).

In somewhat of a factual oddity, even though we're 9 games into the season, Mizzou and Nebraska have only one common opponent among them so far, and that was the aforementioned Kansas State Wildcats. K-State lost consecutive games to each team, first losing at home to Nebraska on Oct. 14th (21-3), and then falling the next week at Mizzou (41-21).

MORE MUSINGS ON THE BIG 12 NORTH RACE

Here's a quick look at the basic scenarios for each team in the North, in terms of how they can reach the Big 12 Championship game...

- ♦ Mizzou (3-2) & Nebraska (3-2) Saturday's winner will have a 1-game lead with 2 games left, but with head-to-head being the first tiebreaker if the teams end tied, it is in essense a 2-game lead. That means for the loser Saturday to reach Kansas City, it would have to win its last 2 games, while Saturday's winner would have to lose its last 2 games...
- ♦ Kansas State (2-3) K-State has to win its 3 remaining games to reach Kansas City, and hope that both Mizzou and Nebraska finish no better than 4-4. K-State has already lost games to both MU and NU, meaning they would have to be a game better in the standings...
- ◆ Kansas (1-4) and Colorado (1-4) One of these teams will be eliminated from championship game contention Saturday (KU with a Nebraska win, and CU with a Mizzou win due to head-to-head competition). For the team not eliminated this Saturday, it would have to win out to reach 4-4 and tie for first, with KU winning a head-to-head tiebreaker with Mizzou (KU plays at MU on Nov. 25), and CU winning a head-to-head tiebreaker with Nebraska (CU plays at NU on Nov. 24)...
- **②** Iowa State (0-5) Iowa State will be eliminated from the title game contention regardless of which team wins Saturday in Lincoln. Even if the Cyclones win this Saturday at home against Kansas, they would be 1-5, and be 3 games behind the winner of MU-NU, with just 2 games left to play.

SOONERS CAPITALIZE ON TIGER MISCUES FOR 26-10 WIN LAST SATURDAY

Missouri entered last Saturday's home contest as the nation's 23rd-ranked team, and was a slight favorite as it hosted 19th-ranked Oklahoma. The Sooners, however, didn't pay heed to the prognosticators, as they capitalized fully on numerous Tiger mistakes to claim a 26-10 win in Columbia.

#25 Mizzou at Nebraska — Nov. 4, 2006

Oklahoma made the plays it needed in order to win – as good teams so often do – but those in the Tiger camp couldn't help but feel that they didn't make the Sooners work very hard for the win. All 26 Oklahoma points came directly from MU mistakes that came in the form of 4 turnovers, a blocked punt and an absolute killer drive-extending penalty. Add into the mix that Mizzou receivers dropped two passes that would have gone for touchdowns, and you've got a recipe for a Tiger loss.

Mizzou took the opening kick and drove for a field goal to take a quick 3-0 lead, and after holding the Sooners to a 3-and-out series, appeared poised to make a huge play when QB Chase Daniel found TE Chase Coffman all alone in the OU secondary for an apparent 66-yard TD. The sure-handed Coffman, who just last week was named the national TE of the week, couldn't make the catch, as the ball went off his fingers. Instead of leading 10-0, on the very next play, Daniel had a pass tipped at the line of scrimmage and intercepted at the Tiger 34 yardline, and OU went in for a TD 7 plays later to take a 7-3 lead.

The Tiger offense once again put together a nice drive, and had moved into OU territory on its next series, only to lose the ball when TB Tony Temple was hit hard and fumbled. The Sooners capitalized by driving for a TD to take a 14-3 lead, and that was extended to 16-3 on MU's following possession when P Adam Crossett had to fall on the ball in the endzone after his punt from the MU 12 yardline was blocked, and that's how the score stood at halftime.

While that barrage left MU bloodied, the Tigers responded with some fire in the 3rd quarter, as its defense forced an OU fumble that it recovered in MU territory to start things, and the offense responded with an 8-play, 66-yard TD drive that took just 1:52, to make it 16-10.

The pro-Mizzou crowd of 62,045 was whipped into a frenzy when the Tiger defense stopped OU on a 3-and-out series and appeared to get the ball back at midfield with all sorts of momentum and nearly a full quarter-and-a-half left to play. But "Uncle Mo" decided to hit the snooze button on the Tigers, as S William Moore was flagged for roughing the punter on the ensuing punt, giving OU a fresh set of downs. The battle-tested Sooners took advantage of their reprieve, and marched for a back-breaking TD to make it 23-10 with 5:02 left in the 3rd quarter.

The Tigers still had time to get back into the game, and they appeared poised to do just that, as they drove to the OU 2 yardline late in the 3rd quarter. Facing a 1st-and-goal from the OU 2, MU could muster only 1 yard on a pair of rushes sandwiched around an incomplete pass on its first 3 tries. On 4th down, a pass went incomplete, and the Tigers had missed another golden scoring opportunity.

Oklahoma got its final points, a 30-yard field goal with 3:48 left in the game, after Daniel's 2nd interception of the day.

MIZZOU-OKLAHOMA WRAP UP NOTES

- **②** − QB Chase Daniel had a personal-best 359 yards of total offense in the game. Amazingly, he accounted for all but 1 yard of total offense for Mizzou, as Oklahoma shut down the Tiger running game outside of Daniel himself. Daniel completed 23-of-44 passes for 284 yards, and rushed a career-high 20 times for 75 yards and 1 TD, while TBs Tony Temple and Earl Goldsmith were held to a net of 1 yard on 7 combined carries (all coming in the 1st half)...
- **②** Daniel threw a career-high 3 interceptions, with 2 of them coming in the final 4 minutes of the game as it became desperation time with the Tigers trailing by 16 points. He was also held without a passing TD for the 1st time this season, ending his school-record streak of 8 consecutive games with a TD pass...
- **♦** MU outgained Oklahoma in total offense on the day, by a 360-to-358 margin, but the Sooners rushed for a season-high 231 yards to win the time of possession battle by a 36:23-to-23:37 margin...
- ◆ Red zone efficiency played a key role in the outcome of the game, as OU was a perfect 4-of-4 on their scoring opportunities, including 3 TDs and 1 FG, while Mizzou converted on just

half of its 4 opportunities. The Tigers got 1 FG and 1 TD (on their first possession of each half, respectively), but missed out on a 3rd-quarter drive that ended on downs at the OU 1-yardline and at the end of the game that ended on the OU 19-yardline...

- ❖ Senior SS David Overstreet, playing against the school where his late father starred as a running back in the late 1970s and early 1980s, led the Tiger defensive effort, with a team-best 14 tackles (film adjusted). He also recovered a Sooner fumble in the 4th quarter in MU territory, but the Tiger offense couldn't capitalize and had to punt the ball away...
- ◆ Sophomore PK Jeff Wolfert continued his string of perfection, as he connected on a 39-yard FG to open the game, and made his only PAT try in the 3rd quarter. He has now made 35 consecutive kicks including his last 8 FGs and 27 PATs since missing his last kick (a 36-yard FG try in game #2 against Ole Miss). For the season, Wolfert is now 11-of-13 on FGs and a perfect 34-of-34 on PATs...

TURNOVERS LOOM LARGER THAN LIFE IN TIGER LOSSES

When taking a look at Mizzou's pair of losses this season (25-19 at Texas A&M and 26-10 at home to Oklahoma), the biggest thing that stands out is turnovers.

In losses to the Aggies and Sooners, MU has turned the ball over 7 times (4 fumbles, 3 INTs), and those have been converted into 27 points (10 by A&M, 17 by OU), while Mizzou has forced just 2 turnovers (for 10 points) in those games.

Conversely, in Mizzou's 7 wins, the Tigers have forced 19 turnovers and converted those into 69 points, while giving up 13 turnovers that foes have turned into 45 points.

What isn't reflected on the stat sheet in both of those losses were plays that MU didn't make that ended up being so instrumental in the defeats. Against A&M, WR Will Franklin fumbled going into the endzone on the 3rd play of the game – on what would have been a 65-yard TD pass – and instead of a quick 7-0 lead for MU, A&M got a touchback and drove for a FG to take a 3-0 lead (a 10-point swing).

Last Saturday against Oklahoma, a similar momentum swing occurred, as TE Chase Coffman had a pass from QB Chase Daniel go off his fingers that would have easily gone for a 66-yard TD that would have given MU a 10-0 lead in the 1st quarter. Instead of that, however, the ball fell to the ground, and on the next play Daniel had a pass tipped at the line of scrimmage, and intercepted by OU. The Sooners drove just 34 yards for a TD to take a 7-3 lead – a 14-point swing going against the Tigers.

TIGERS LOOK TO GET GROUND ATTACK BACK ON TRACK

As noted previously, Mizzou's rushing attack was held under wraps by a tough Sooner defense in Saturday's 26-10 defeat. Oklahoma held MU to just a net of 76 yards rushing on the day, in 27 carries (2.8 avg.), while the Sooners tallied a season-best 231 yards on 52 attempts (4.4 avg.).

That followed a similar pattern in MU's other loss, as at Texas A&M, the Aggies rushed for 180 yards on 51 carries (3.5 avg.), while holding MU to a season-low 74 net yards on the ground in 26 attempts (2.8 avg.).

In both of those games, opponents used their advantage on the ground to enjoy huge advantages in controlling the clock. Texas A&M held the ball for a whopping 41:30 (to MU's 18:30), while the Sooners enjoyed a 36:23-to-23:37 advantage.

In MU's 2 losses, the Tigers have been outrushed by an average of 205.5-to-75.0, and the average time of possession has been 38:56-to-21:03 in favor of the bad guys.

In MU's 7 wins, the Tigers have outrushed opponents by a 177.9-to-99.7 margin, and have faced an average deficit in time of possession of only 30:10-to-29:50.

TIGERS HANG AROUND IN COACHES' POLL AT #25

Despite the loss to then 19th-ranked Oklahoma last Saturday, Mizzou hung around the USA Today Coaches' Poll, dropping just 2 spots to #25, after entering the OU game as #23. The Tigers fell out of the Associated Press poll after a 5-week stay in that poll that saw MU reach as high as 19th. MU received enough votes to rank 28th in this week's A.P. poll.

After defeating Ohio, 31-6, on Sept. 23rd, the Tigers moved into the AP poll – at No. 25 – for the first time since 2004, when the Tigers were ranked 19th prior to the second game of the year, at Troy. MU began that season ranked 18th in the AP poll.

In the A.P. poll, Mizzou has been ranked 11 weeks under Gary Pinkel, as the Tigers were ranked for 4 weeks (peaking at #22) in 2003, in addition to the aforementioned 2-week stay in the polls in 2004, and this year's 5-week span.

BIG 12 CONFERENCE BOWL SELECTION PROCESS

Again this season, the Big 12 has 8 bowl slots guaranteed. The Conference is partnered with 9 different bowls for the 2006 season, with the Gator Bowl and Sun Bowl picking alternately over the next 4 years, with each bowl taking a Big 12 team twice over the next 4 years. The Gator Bowl has first pick of a Big 12 team, and if it passes, then the Sun Bowl will figure into the mix. If the Gator Bowl chooses a Big 12 team in 2006, then the Sun Bowl will not take a Big 12 team this season.

Here's a quick breakdown of the selection order for Big 12-affiliated bowls in 2006:

- 1. BCS The winner of the Big 12 Championship game is guaranteed a slot in 1-of-5 bowls the Rose Bowl (Jan. 1 in Pasadena, Calif.), the Fiesta Bowl (Jan. 1 in Glendale, Ariz.), the Orange Bowl (Jan. 2 in Miami, Fla.), the Sugar Bowl (Jan. 3 in New Orleans, La.), and the brand new BCS Championship Game (Jan. 8 in Glendale, Ariz.)...
 - 2. Cotton Bowl Jan. 1 in Dallas, Texas...
 - 3. Holiday Bowl Dec. 28 in San Diego, Calif...
 - 4. Gator Bowl (when it selects a Big 12 school) Jan. 1 in Jacksonville, Fla...
 - 5. Alamo Bowl Dec. 30 in San Antonio, Texas...
 - 6. Sun Bowl (if the Gator Bowl does not select a Big 12 school) Dec. 29 in El Paso, Texas...
 - 7. Insight Bowl Dec. 29 in Tempe, Ariz...
 - 8. Independence Bowl Dec. 28 in Shreveport, La...
 - 9. Texas Bowl Dec. 28 in Houston, Texas.

TIGERS HAVEN'T BEEN ROAD WORRIERS

Mizzou has shown it can play winning football on the road this season, as the Tigers stand 2-1 on the year in road games. While MU hasn't won in Lincoln, Neb., since 1978 (a span of 14 straight losses), the Tigers have more than held their own on the road so far, winning at New Mexico (27-17) and at 24th-ranked Texas Tech (38-21), while dropping a heartbreaker at Texas A&M (25-19), which is now ranked in the top-25 at 8-1 overall.

Quick starts fueled the Tigers to their first 2 road wins, as MU jumped out to leads of 10-0 and 24-0 at New Mexico and Texas Tech, respectively. The A&M affair was a back-and-forth game that saw 7 lead changes and a late MU rally fall short.

PINKEL HAS WON 15 OF LAST 22 GAMES AT MIZZOU

Mizzou Head Coach Gary Pinkel is in his sixth season at MU and touts a career record of 109-69-3 (61.1%). His career winning percentage of 60.2% to begin the season ranked him 23rd in the nation among active Division I-A coaches with a minimum of seven years coached.

Pinkel, who has led MU to a combined record of 27-18 over the past four seasons (including 15 wins in his last 22 games dating back to the 2004 season finale), and to bowl games in 2003 and 2005, has a six-year record in Columbia of 36-32 (52.9%).

The 2006 season got off to an historic start for Pinkel and his Tigers, as he led MU to its first 6-0 start since 1973, and its first 7-1 start to a season since 1969. Mizzou heads into its final 3

games of the regular season with a shot at winning its first conference title in football since the 1969 season – not bad for a team that was picked in the pre-season by Big 12 media to finish in 5th place.

With a team picked to finish 4th in the Big 12 North in 2005, Pinkel's Tigers tied for 2nd place last year (winning all tiebreakers), and were playing for a chance to share for the division title heading into the regular-season finale. Pinkel has led MU to two bowl games, and with a third on the horizon in 2006, that puts him in select company, as he joins Don Faurot, Dan Devine, Al Onofrio, and Warren Powers as the only coaches to guide MU to three bowl games. After beating Nebraska (41-24 in 2005) for the second time in three years, Pinkel became the first MU coach since Onofrio to defeat NU twice.

Mizzou's 34-7 win over Ole Miss earlier this year drew him above the .500 mark at Mizzou. Pinkel is the first Tiger coach since Powers to have an MU record of above .500 after at least one full season of coaching (Powers left after the 1984 season with an MU record of 46-33-3).

Pinkel has driven Mizzou to a pair of winning seasons (8-5 in 2003 and 7-5 in 2005) in his five previous years at the wheel, with those representing two of MU's four winning campaigns dating back to the 1983 season. With a winning season in 2006, he would become the first MU coach since Powers to have three winning years.

SATURDAY IS 100TH MEETING BETWEEN MIZZOU AND NEBRASKA

Mizzou and Nebraska will meet for the 100th time when they square off Saturday in Lincoln. Nebraska holds a 62-34-3 lead in the previous 99 meetings, with the lion's share of that overall

advantage due to a stranglehold the Cornhuskers held over MU from 1979-2002 that saw Nebraska win 24 straight games.

Prior to that NU winning streak, the Mizzou-Nebraska series was a very competitive and fiercely fought rivalry, as going into the 1979 season, Nebraska held just a 37-32-3 overall lead.

Mizzou has won 2 of the last 3 meetings coming into Saturday's game, with both wins coming in Columbia in 2003 and 2005 (both scores being identical 41-24 affairs). Nebraska has won 14 straight over Mizzou in Lincoln, dating back to the Tigers' last win – a 35-31 upset special that saw MU knock off the #2-ranked Huskers one week after they had upset #1-ranked Oklahoma in 1978. That Tiger win ranks as one of the most bitter losses in Nebraska lore, as it forced the infamous Orange Bowl rematch between Oklahoma and Nebraska in the 1979 Orange Bowl.

This will mark the 3rd straight time that Mizzou has played in Lincoln against an unranked Husker team (Nebraska is currently receiving votes in this week's A.P. poll, and also was receiving votes in 2002 when MU played in Lincoln). Prior to that, the Huskers had been ranked in the A.P. poll every year the Tigers came to Lincoln from 1964-2000.

In 8 games in Lincoln spanning from 1964-1978, the Tigers held their own quite well, managing a 4-4 split despite going against ranked Husker teams in each outing. That span included 3 straight wins in Lincoln for Mizzou – in 1974 (21-10 over #12 Nebraska), in 1976 (34-24 over #3 Nebraska) and in 1978 (35-31 over #2 Nebraska).

LAST YEAR REWIND: MIZZOU 41, NEBRASKA 24

Brad Smith set a school record with 480 yards in total offense, ran for three scores and threw for another, turning up the production after Missouri lost an 18-point first-quarter lead in a 41-24 victory over Nebraska in a game played Oct. 22, 2005 in Columbia.

Smith had 246 yards rushing on 28 carries and was 21-for-36 for 234 yards for Missouri (5-2, 3-1 Big 12). David Overstreet had a key third-quarter interception to help the Tigers beat Nebraska (5-2, 2-2) for the second time in three years after winning only once in the previous 26 meetings.

Missouri has won two straight at home over Nebraska for the first time since 1967 and '69 when the team was coached by Dan Devine. The final score, which gave coach Gary Pinkel his 100th career victory, was identical to that of Missouri's victory at home over Nebraska in 2003.

Zac Taylor had two touchdown passes for Nebraska, which entered the game leading the nation in rushing defense at 65 yards per game. Missouri gouged the Cornhuskers for 277 yards on 49 carries and totaled 523 yards.

Missouri scored on its first four possessions, three touchdowns and a field goal, to take a 24-10 lead. A blocked punt and a fumble in the 2nd quarter that led to quick scores helped Nebraska tie it at 24 at the half, before Missouri took control again after the break.

Smith's 45-yard run late in the third quarter, his third carry of 40 or more yards, put Missouri ahead to stay at 31-24. In the first quarter he was untouched on a career-long 79-yarder and had a 53-yarder to the Nebraska 16 that set up his 4-yard scoring run.

Everything worked in the first quarter for Missouri's offense, which needed only 13 plays to score three touchdowns on its first three possession while running up a 21-3 lead. Smith's 79-yarder came on the first play after a Nebraska punt, and the Tigers also were successful on fourth-and-1 from their own 43 late in the period when Smith hit Sean Coffey for a 37-yard gain that led to a field goal by Adam Crossett for a 24-10 lead early in the second.

Smith also threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Tommy Saunders for the first score of the game. Saunders alertly grabbed the ball in the end zone after it popped out of teammate William Franklin's hands, a play reminiscent of Matt Davison's miracle grab that beat Missouri in 1997 after the ball was kicked in the air by teammate Shevin Wiggins.

A blocked punt by Daniel Bullocks and a fumble recovery by Jay Moore after Barry Turner's sack of Smith led to two quick scores that helped Nebraska tie it at 24 at halftime. Bullocks recovered the blocked punt at the 1 and Cody Glenn scored on the next play, and Nebraska needed two plays to tie it on Zac Taylor's 8-yard pass to Nate Swift after Moore returned the fumble to the 8.

LAST TIME IN LINCOLN: NEBRASKA 24, MIZZOU 3 (2004)

The last time that Mizzou visited Nebraska, the outcome and how it happened seem reminiscent of how the Tigers lost this past weekend to Oklahoma – turnovers, missed MU scoring opportunities and blocked punts that led to a Husker 24-3 win on Oct. 30, 2004.

A rough day on special teams proved fatal for Missouri, as the Tigers fell despite owning statistical advantages in most categories.

Nebraska took advantage of two Tiger errors in the punting game, one on a blocked punt, and the other on a fumbled snap, and turned those into 14 points as the Huskers took a 17-3 lead in the 3rd quarter.

An 86-yard TD run Nebraska's Cory Ross with less than 3 minutes left in the gameinflated the final score, as prior to that run, the Tiger defense had been dominant, holding the Huskers to a mere 146 yards of total offense to that point.

Mizzou's sterling defensive effort went for naught, as its offense moved the ball reasonably well, but could not reach the endzone – the first time since 2002 that MU failed to score a TD.

Mizzou held Nebraska without a 3rd-down conversion on the day (0-of-14), and ran 91 offensive plays, compared to just 58 for the Huskers, as MU outgained NU by a 328-to-235 margin.

The Tiger defense was especially effective against the Husker passing game, as NU QB Joe Dailey completed only 4-of-17 passes for just 26 yards.

But the Tiger defense couldn't produce any turnovers, which proved to be a key to the game, given the fact that Nebraska entered the game with an NCAA-high 27 turnovers committed.

Nebraska opened scoring with a 41-yard field goal on the game's opening possession. From that point, until the late, meaningless 86-yard TD run by Ross, the Huskers managed only 94 yards of offense.

Mizzou tied the game in the 2nd quarter, on a 39-yard field goal by Joe Tantarelli. The Tigers missed out on three other golden scoring opportunities, however, as Tantarelli and Adam Crossett missed on field goal tries of 42 and 44 yards, respectively.

Nebraska blocked a Matt Hoenes punt midway through the 2nd quarter, and returned it 16 yards for a TD that made it 10-3, and that's how it stood at halftime.

Mizzou took the opening possession of the 3rd quarter and drove as far as the Husker 15 yardline, but a sack pushed the ball back and led to the long miss by Crossett.

Later in the 3rd, Nebraska caught a break when MU's Hoenes fumbled a snap on a punt attempt, with the Huskers recovering on MU's 15-yardline. Ross ran it in on the ensuing play, as Nebraska surged to a 17-3 lead with 1:34 left in the 3rd.

Mizzou still had a chance late in the game, as Brad Smith, who ended with a season-high 277 yards passing, drove the Tigers to a 1st-and-goal from the Nebraska 8-yardline with 5 minutes left, but MU couldn't punch it in, and Ross sealed the game with his long run after MU turned it over on downs.

Nebraska held MU on the day to a season-low 51 yards rushing on 35 attempts.

MIZZOU IS NCAA'S ALLTIME OVERTIME KING

Overtime is old hat around Mizzou. Since the rule was put into effect for the 1996 season, Mizzou has played the most overtime games in NCAA history, with 11 through games of Oct. 21st, 2006. With MU's 27-24 OT win in 2005 versus Iowa State, the Tigers improved to 8-3 alltime in overtime games, a win total which also is most in the NCAA.

Mizzou went 1-1 in 2002 in overtime affairs, dropping a tough 42-35 home overtime game to #18 Colorado and the very next week winning a 33-27 double overtime thriller at Texas A&M, the week after A&M beat #1-ranked Oklahoma on the same field.

Interestingly, MU Head Coach Gary Pinkel won the very first overtime game played in Division I his-

tory when his Toledo Rockets beat Nevada, 40-37, in the 1995 Las Vegas Bowl. The overtime rule was put into effect for that bowl season, and has been in use ever since.

Pinkel is now 7-1 alltime in his career in overtime games, including 5-1 at Mizzou.

CHASE DANIEL HAVING RECORD-SETTING YEAR

Sophomore QB Chase Daniel made his first career start Sept. 2nd against Murray State, and to call his performance good would be a slight understatement. Daniel was precision-like in his distribution of the ball, and he broke the MU single-game record by throwing 5 TD passes. He ended the night 23-of-32 passing for 320 yards in leading the Tigers to a 47-7 victory.

It's been more of the same ever since then, as the Southlake, Texas native has turned into a gunslinger of record-setting proportions for Mizzou this year, as he has thrown for 2,287 yards and 19 TDs through 9 games. His 19 passing TDs has already broke the MU single-season

record of 18 (held by Terry McMillan in 1969), and he needs just 177 passing yards to break the MU single-season record of 2,463 set in 1992 by Jeff Handy.

Daniel enters Saturday's game Nebraska ranked 2nd in the Big 12 (7th nationally) in total offense (289.89 ypg) and 7th in the Big 12 (29th nationally) in pass efficiency (143.50 rating). His 2,609 yards of total offense so far already ranks 5th on the MU single-season chart, and he stands 997 yards away from breaking Brad Smith's record of 3,605 set in 2005.

Daniel, who became the first-ever MU QB to throw 5 TD passes in a game (Sept. 2nd vs. Murray State), also became the first-ever MU QB to have 4 or more TD passes in a game more than once. He's done it three times now – 5 vs. Murray State, 4 vs. Colorado (Sept. 30th) and 4 vs. Kansas State (Oct. 21st).

Daniel's single-game passer rating in his first career start was an astounding 207.44, and for his efforts, he was named the Big 12's Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 4th.

What Daniel would do against a tougher opponent, was the big question, and he answered that as best he could the next week against Ole Miss, as he amassed 332 yards of total offense in leading the Tigers to a 34-7 dismantling of the SEC school.

Daniel completed 24-of-40 passes on the day for 1 TD, and unveiled an ability to run for yardage as well, as he ran 13 times for a team-best 89 yards and 1 TD. He led the Tigers to 10 points in their first 2 possessions, including a precision-like 10-play, 80-yard TD drive to open the game that he capped with a 3-yard TD run.

His 1st-ever road start wasn't without its bumps, but Daniel passed with flying colors in the end, as he led the Tigers to a 27-17 win in Albuquerque, N.M. in week #3. He led the Tigers to a quick 10-0 lead in the 1st quarter on 8-of-9 passing for 74 yards and 1 TD in his first two series. After throwing his 1st interception of the year in the 2nd quarter (which was returned 11 yards for a TD by the Lobos), Daniel responded in crunch time to drive the Tigers to consecutive 4th-quarter TDs (on drives of 80 and 72 yards) to extend a 13-10 lead to 27-10 with 1:46 left in the game. In the 4th quarter at New Mexico, Daniel was 5-of-5 passing for 46 yards, and he rushed 5 times for 22 yards, including an 8-yard keeper for a TD that came at the 10:52 mark to make it 20-10 in favor of the Tigers.

He then had a 4-TD passing day and threw for 253 yards as he led MU to a 28-13 win over Colorado to move the Tigers to 5-0 on the season. His numbers weren't gaudy at Texas Tech, but he was still effective, as he completed 15-of-22 passes for 173 yard and 1 TD. Most importantly, he showed moxie early by leading MU to a FG drive on the game's opening possession in front of a rabid Red Raider Homecoming crowd, and he calmly directed a 10-play, 73-yard drive in the 3rd quarter for a huge TD to quell Tech's momentum after they had closed to within 24-21 at the time. He did all of this while celebrating his 20th birthday that night.

Daniel is replacing all-everything QB Brad Smith, who started every game for Mizzou from 2002-2005 and left holding 69 different MU, Big 12 and NCAA game, season and career records. He gained invaluable experience as a true freshman in 2005, playing in 10 games and completing 38-of-62 passes (.576) for 347 yards and 1 TD (2 INTs).

Most notably, Daniel relieved an injured and ineffective Smith in the fourth quarter of MU's Homecoming game last year against Iowa State, and led MU from a 10-point deficit with just under 9 minutes left to a thrilling 27-24 comeback win. With MU's back squarely against the wall, Daniel belied his youth by calmly leading the Tigers downfield on consecutive drives of 75 and 87 yards, and hit WR Sean Coffey from 4 yards out for a game-tying TD with just 20 seconds left in regulation. After ISU failed to score on its OT possession, Daniel again directed a drive that culminated with PK Adam Crossett's game-winning 26-yard field goal.

DANIEL KNOWS WINNING

The legendary coach Vince Lombardi was once credited with saying something to the effect of "winning isn't everything, it's the only thing."

With that in mind, winning is about the only thing that MU's sophomore QB Chase Daniel has known. <u>Daniel – who celebrated his 20th birthday on Oct. 7th by leading MU to a 38-21 win at Texas Tech (he was born Oct. 7, 1986)</u> – is currently 7-2 as a collegiate starter.

To continue the theme, however, dating back to his days as starting QB for the powerful Southlake (Texas) Carroll High School program, <u>Daniel has won 38 of his last 41 starts under center</u>. As the starting QB for the Dragons each of his last 2 years, Daniel went 15-1 as a junior

in 2003, losing only in overtime in the state championship game. He then went a perfect 16-0 as a senior in 2004, leading the Dragons to a mythical national title, as well as national player of the year honors.

Additionally, Daniel was a starting wide receiver for Coach Todd Dodge as a sophomore in 2002. How did the Dragons do that year? They merely went 16-0 and won a state title.

Add it all up, and <u>Daniel has won 54 of his last 57 games in which he's been a starter</u>. Somehow, we think that Coach Lombardi would be impressed.

CHASE ON PACE IN THE PASSING RECORD RACE

QB Chase Daniel has already broken the MU single-season passing TD record, with 19 TD passes through 9 games thus far in 2006 (versus 8 interceptions), which has surpassed the previous MU record of 18 set in 1969 by Terry McMillan. Daniel broke the record with his 4-TD passing day in game #8 against Kansas State.

Daniel also had at least 1 passing TD in each of MU's 1st 8 games this year, which was a school record for consecutive games with a TD pass – breaking the old mark of 7 previously coheld by McMillan (1969) and Brad Smith (2004).

At the risk of further jinxing things, Daniel is also on pace to establish records in many other categories, figuring in a 13-game season with the upcoming bowl game. Here's a quick look...

OVERSTREET PUTS MONEY WHERE HIS MOUTH IS

Senior safety David Overstreet is in his final season as a Tiger and is helping lead MU's defense. Named one of 4 team captains by his teammates, Overstreet has both the mouth and the game to do just that.

Overstreet is coming off a 14-tackle outing last Saturday against Oklahoma (the school where his late father starred as a running back in the late 1970s and early 1980s). He also recovered a fumble in the 4th quarter to snuff out a Sooner possession.

The week prior, Overstreet won his 1st-ever Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week award, he for his performance in MU's win over Kansas State. Against the Wildcats, Overstreet had a team-high 11 tackles and scored the first TD of his career on a 41-yard fumble return for a TD.

Referred to as "the mouth of the south" by many who hear him talking on and off the field all the time, Overstreet can back up his talk, as evidenced by his career year in 2005. Overstreet led Mizzou with 100 tackles a year ago and emerged as one of the Big 12 Conference's top playmakers in the secondary. He led the team with 5 turnovers gained, including 3 fumble recoveries and 2 interceptions, with the former tying for most in the league.

Early in the 2006 season, Overstreet's numbers weren't jumping off the page, and as he joked with reporters, it had more to do with the fact that the Tiger defensive line was so dominant ("selfish" as he joked) that he didn't get a chance to stick his nose into much action.

After notching a total of just 13 tackles total in MU's first 4 games combined (3.5 avg.), Overstreet has gotten his wish of being more active, as he's registered 53 tackles combined in the last 5 outings (10.6 avg.). Overstreet had 8 tackles (4 solo) at Texas Tech. He had a huge pass break up in the 1st quarter as he went flying near the Tech sideline to waylay a Tech WR that was attempting to make a catch. His hit forced an incompletion that came on third down and forced a Red Raider punt.

He followed with a career-best 15-tackle day at Texas A&M, and turned in the 11-tackle day last week against KSU that earned him the Big 12 honor.

For the season, Overstreet ranks 3rd on the team with 67 stops, and he is tied for 2nd on the team lead with 5 passes broken up.

Overstreet had a stellar performance in 2005 against Nebraska, in a game in which he made numerous big plays that helped make the difference in MU's 41-24 win on Oct. 22nd.

Overstreet led MU's defense with a 10-tackle performance against NU. He was involved in a number of game-changing plays, as he broke up a near TD-pass in the endzone to snuff out a Nebraska drive in the 1st quarter, and on consecutive possessions in the 3rd quarter, he recovered a fumble on the MU 3-yardline and intercepted a pass near midfield.

Overstreet, a native of Dallas, Texas, is the son of the late David Overstreet, who was a standout running back for the Oklahoma Sooners and in the NFL with the Miami Dolphins.

FORMER DIVER WOLFERT MAKING A SPLASH AS TIGER KICKER

A newcomer to the scene this year is PK Jeff Wolfert. Wolfert originally came to Mizzou as a diver on the men's swimming and diving team, but the former high school kicker gave up diving into water for jumping into the fire of placekicking. Wolfert missed his senior year of high school football due to a hip injury, and wanted to give kicking one more try. He was very consistent kicking in fall scrimmages, and was named the starting placekicker for the season opener.

He hasn't disappointed, as the sophomore from the Kansas City area has made 11-of-13 field goals through 9 games and is a perfect 34-of-34 on extra points. He enters the Nebraska game ranked 5th in the league, and 38th in the NCAA with his per-game scoring average of 7.44 points per game, and is coming off a perfect day last Saturday against Oklahoma, as he nailed a 39-yard FG on the game's opening drive, and later made his only PAT try of the day.

Wolfert enters Saturday's game against Nebraska having made 35 consecutive kicks (8 FGs, 27 PATs) since his last missed kick – a 36-yard FG missed in the 4th quarter against Ole Miss in week #2.

Against Ohio, Wolfert was perfect for the 2nd-straight outing, as he nailed a career-long 44-yard field goal in the 3rd quarter to extend Mizzou's lead at the time to 17-6. He was also perfect on 4-of-4 PATs, as MU defeated Ohio, 31-6. Wolfert was also perfect in his kicks at New Mexico the previous week, connecting on field goals of 36 and 37 yards, and making all 3 extra point tries on the night.

Wolfert was a standout freshman diver on the Mizzou men's swimming and diving team during the 2004-05 school year. He produced a top-five performance on the platform and top-10 finishes on the 1 and 3-meter boards at the 2005 NCAA Zone Diving Championships. He also finished 4th in the 1-meter board, 5th on the 3-meter board and 6th on the platform at the Big 12 Championships. He gave up a swimming scholarship and joined the football team as a walk-on for the 2005 season.

FRANKLIN IS MIZZOU'S LONG-DISTANCE CARRIER

Junior WR Will Franklin is Mizzou's top passing game threat, and he's emerged this year as one of the Big 12's top overall receiving targets. Franklin is pushing for All-Big 12 honors this season, as he ranks 3rd in the Big 12, and 16th in the NCAA currently, in receiving yards per game, at 82.56 coming into the Nebraska contest this Saturday.

"Will the Thrill" is coming off a 4-catch, 53-yard outing last Saturday against Oklahoma. Prior to that, he continued his push for All-Big 12 honors with a 5-catch, 87-yard, 1-TD outing in MU's 41-21 Homecoming win over Kansas State.

In that game, Franklin scored on a 52-yard catch-and-run play where he took a quick hitch from QB Chase Daniel, made one move to break free, and ran untouched the remaining 45 yards for a score that made it 17-7 at halftime and helped give MU momentum that led to the win.

That marked the 5th receiving TD of the season for Franklin of over 30 yards (he has 6 TDs this season in all), and that tied him with former greats Mel Gray (1969), Henry Marshall (1974) and Sean Coffey (2004), who all had 5 TDs of 30 yards or more in a season.

Franklin currently leads the Tigers in receiving (42 catches for 743 yards and 6 TDs). With his first grab at Texas Tech (good for 20 yards), he went over the 1,000-yard mark for his career, and he enters the Nebraska game this week with 88 career receptions for 1,330 yards and 9 TDs.

With a minimum of 4 games remaining in the 2006 season (including a bowl game), Franklin has an outside shot of breaking the MU single-season receiving yardage record of 1,210 set by Victor Bailey in 1992. He's moved into 8th on the career list entering the Nebraska contest, and his season yardage total of 743 yards currently sits 9th on the MU single-season list.

Something about season openers gets Franklin revved up and ready to roll. Franklin opened his junior campaign on Sept. 2nd against Murray State by grabbing 4 catches for a career-high 138 yards and 2 TDs – with all of the catches coming in the 1st half. His yardage total was the most in a game for a Tiger receiver since former standout Justin Gage had 148 yards against Kansas in 2001.

Franklin also had a 2-TD day in week #4 against Ohio that saw him catch 4 passes for 99 yards in MU's 31-6 win. His first grab was a big momentum play, coming on a 3rd-and-7 from the MU 32-yardline after the Tigers had turned the ball over on the game's opening possession and blocked an Ohio FG attempt. Facing the 3rd-and-long situation, Franklin got behind a Bobcat cornerback, and caught a perfectly lofted pass from QB Chase Daniel about 35 yards downfield in stride. He avoided being caught as he dove into the endzone for the first score of the game on a play that went 68 yards in all – the longest pass play at Mizzou since the 2000 season.

He got his junior season started in a big way early on, as on the 5th play of the season, he took what was a quick hitter route of about 12 yards, spun to his left out of the defender's grasp, and took off down the sideline and after getting a good block downfield from fellow WR Brad Ekwerekwu, went untouched into the endzone for a 60-yard TD.

At New Mexico, he caught a career-high-tying 9 balls for 76 important yards, and had a 4-catch, 114-yard, 1-TD outing at Texas A&M.

RUCKER & COFFMAN ARE AMONG NATION'S TOP TIGHT END DUOS

If there's a better duo of tight ends on one team in the nation, than Mizzou's Chase Coffman and Martin Rucker, we'd be interested in hearing about it. That's a little boastful, certainly, but we feel the numbers are there to back up that claim.

Rucker and Coffman combined in 2005 to catch 94 passes for 1,070 yards and 5 TDs, and they were both pre-season candidates for the John Mackey Award, which goes annually to the nation's top tight end. Mizzou is just one of three schools to have two players listed on the Mackey Award Preseason Watch List, along with Arizona State and BYU.

Coffman currently leads all Big 12 TEs with 40 catches for 410 yards and 5 TDs this season, while Rucker is right behind, with 32 catches for 284 yards and 3 TDs.

Last week, Coffman was named the John Mackey national Tight End of the Week for his performance against Kansas State, as he hauled in 6 catches for a season-best 75 yards and 1 TD in MU's 41-21 win. It was the first time that Coffman has won the weekly award, and it marked the 2nd time a Tiger TE has won the award this year – Rucker won the award after catching 6 passes for 66 yards and 1 TD against Colorado.

Coffman needs 1 more TD to equal the MU single-season record for tight ends of 6, co-held by former greats Kellen Winslow (1978) and Dwayne Blakley (1999).

Rucker's 47 catches in 2005 was only 8 shy of the MU single-season record for tight ends (55 by A.J. Ofodile in 1993), and his yardage was only shy of Ofodile's single-season tight end record of 589. In just 2+ years of play, Rucker already ranks 2nd on the school TE career catches (98) and 3rd on the yardage (1114) list for tight ends. He needs 4 catches to break the standing record of 101 by Andy Gibler (1979-82) and he needs 177 yards to break Gibler's yardage mark of 1,290.

The dynamic duo showed early and often just what kind of impact they can provide in MU's 28-13 win over Colorado. Coffman caught 2 TD passes in the 1st quarter (2 yards, and 9 yards), as he helped get MU out to an early 14-3 lead, while Rucker led all Tigers with 6 catches for 66 yards on the day. Rucker also caught a key 1-yard TD pass with just 11 seconds left in the 2nd quarter to extend the Tiger lead to 21-6 heading into halftime.

Coffman was a 1st-Team Freshman All-American a year ago, as he led all the nation's freshmen tight end with his 47 catches for 503 yards, and added 4 TDs. He was as sure-handed as could be, as he made catch after catch that made the highlight reel, and caught virtually everything he got his hands on. His 47 grabs tied him for the team lead along with his running mate Rucker, and his 503 yards ranked 2nd on the team behind Rucker, while his 4 receiving TDs was tied for the most, along with WR Brad Ekwerekwu. Coffman already ranks 4th on the MU career

tight ends list for receptions (87) and is 5th currently in TE yardage (913).

Both tight ends for MU have NFL bloodlines. Coffman's father, Paul, was a standout tight end for the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs (1986-87), and the Green Bay Packers (1978-85), after playing collegiately at Kansas State.

Rucker is the younger brother of Mike Rucker, who is a standout defensive end with the NFL's Carolina Panthers, and was an All-American collegiately at Nebraska.

TIGER SACK ATTACK BRINGS THE PAIN

The Tiger defense has been creating havoc game in and game out this year with opposing offenses. Mizzou enters the Nebraska contest ranking 4th in the Big 12 Conference, and ranking 12th in the NCAA, in sacks per game, with an average of 3.22 per outing.

As noted earlier, the Tiger pass rush took quite a blow, losing career sacks leader Brian Smith to a season-ending injury two games ago against Kansas State, but there are still plenty of accomplished pass rushers in Defensive Line Coach Craig Kuligowski's arsenal. Senior DE Xzavie Jackson has 13.5 career sacks, which ranks 9th on the MU career list. Junior DT Lorenzo Williams, with 12 career sacks, is also currently sitting at 10th place on the list.

Through 9 games, Mizzou has already reached its 12-game sack total from the 2005 season. MU currently has 30 sacks for 181 yards, after notching 30 sacks in 2005 for 234 yards.

Mizzou's defensive line was dominant in week #3 at New Mexico, as the front four wreaked havoc all night long on the Lobo offense. Mizzou ended the night with 8 QB sacks for total losses of 55 yards. Brian Smith tied the MU single-game record (on his birthday), with 4 sacks, and was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

BACON'S BEEN BRINGING HOME, WELL, THE BACON

Senior WLB Marcus Bacon has been playing his way into contention for All-Big 12 honors, as he's registered a team-best 81 total tackles, including an even dozen in each of the 1st 2 games.

The Houston, Texas native currently leads MU and ranks 4th in the Big 12 in tackles (28th in the nation), averaging 9.00 per game. He's had a hand in 5 turnovers so far, including a Big-12 leading 3 fumble recoveries and he's added a pair of interceptions. He's also forced 5 fumbles thus far through 9 games.

Bacon had a productive outing at Texas Tech, as he registered 8 tackles, including 1 QB sack, and added a forced fumble and a fumble recovery, in addition to 1 QB hurry.

Bacon made a huge play early in the game that served notice that MU's defense would be causing problems for Tech all night long, as he broke free to sack Tech QB Graham Harrell, knocking the ball loose in the process. MU's DeMarcus Scott recovered on the Tech 12-yardline, and that set up MU's offense, which responded 4 plays later with a 1-yard TD run to put MU up, 10-0 early in the game.

Bacon had 12 stops in MU's 34-7 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 9th, and also forced a fumble, intercepted a pass that he returned 52 yards, and broke up a pass on the day. For his efforts, he was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 11th – making him the first Tiger LB to win the weekly conference award since current Director of Football Operations Barry Odom won the award on Sept. 22, 1997 for his play in a Tiger win at Tulsa.

Bacon had quite a night in the 2006 season opener, as he led the Tiger defensive effort by making a career-high 12 tackles. The Houston, Texas native had 8 solo stops and added 4 assists (adjusted for coaches' film) and also contributed with 1 tackle for loss.

Bacon had a breakout year as a junior, as he amassed a career-high 85 tackles (which ranked 3rd on the team overall and 1st among LBs), while starting 8 games at the strongside position. Bacon was also a standout on special teams, playing on several units, and led the team in total special teams tackles with 12 (8 on punts, 4 on kickoffs). On defense, he recorded a career-high 3 QB sacks for 23 yards in losses, and had 5 tackles or more in all but 1 game, and reached double figures three times overall.



TIGERS LOSE ALLTIME QB SACKS LEADER BRIAN SMITH TO INJURY

Mizzou's Homecoming win over Kansas State on Oct. 21st came with a heavy price to pay, as senior defensive end Brian Smith was lost for the remainder of the regular season with a broken right hip. The injury does not require surgery, but he'll need to be on crutches for around 8 weeks, meaning there could be an outside chance of him being available in a bowl game.

Smith was injured in the 3rd quarter on the play when safety David Overstreet returned a fumble 41 yards for a Tiger touchdown. Smith was running interference for his teammate, and leapt to hurdle a downed player, and landed awkwardly, apparently breaking his hip in a non-contact situation.

Smith was having an outstanding senior season for the Tigers, as he was named just last week as 1 of 12 semi-finalists for the prestigious Lombardi Award. He had ranked all season long among the nation's top-5 in QB sacks, with 7.5 through 8 games. He is Mizzou's alltime career leader in sacks, with 31.5, and needed just 3 more to break the Big 12 Conference career record of 34, held by Aaron Hunt of Texas Tech (1999-2002).

The loss of Smith leaves senior DE Xzavie Jackson as MU's most accomplished sack master. Jackson enters the OU game with 5.0 sacks on the year and 13.5 career sacks – both numbers currently best among active MU players. Jackson's 13.5 sacks now ranks as 9th-best in MU history.

Replacing Smith directly in the lineup will likely be sophomore DE Stryker Sulak. Sulak actually has more tackles on the 2006 season than Smith (35-to-30), despite more limited reps, and he has produced nicely, accumulating 4.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 QB sack, breaking up 3 passes, and recovering 1 fumble. Sulak has 8 starts in his career, including 7 in 2005 as a redshirt freshman, and 1 in 2006, as he started in place of Jackson in the season opener while Jackson sat out the game due to disciplinary reasons.

TIGERS HAVE TAKEN HOME BIG 12 WEEKLY HONORS FOUR TIMES IN 2006

Senior strong safety David Overstreet II (Dallas, Texas) was named the Big 12 Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 23rd, after he led the Tiger defensive effort in MU's 41-21 win over Kansas State the previous week. Overstreet earned the honor after he had 11 tackles against K-State (film adjusted), 1 pass break up and added his 1st career TD on a 41-yard fumble return for a score.

Overstreet became the 4th Tiger to win weekly Big 12 player of the week honors this season, and the 3rd defender for the Tigers. He joined LB Marcus Bacon and DE Brian Smith, who won for their performances against Ole Miss and New Mexico, respectively.

Those awards followed QB Chase Daniel, who won the offensive weekly award after MU's season opener against Murray State, when he threw for an MU record 5 TD passes in his first career start.

With MU leading, 10-0, and Tech starting at their 20 yardline after the kickoff, Jackson read the eyes of Tech QB Graham Harrell, and dropped back to snuff out a would-be crossing pass. Unseen by Harrell, Jackson reached up to grab the ball on the Tech 17-yardline, and raced untouched into the endzone for a TD to put the Tigers up 17-0. Tech's Homecoming crowd was

in stunned disbelief when FS William Moore did basically the same thing on Tech's very next snap (this time from 22 yards out), to put the Tigers up 24-0.

The TD was Jackson's 2nd of his career, matching a 16-yard fumble he returned for a score in 2005 against Iowa State. Jackson enters the Oklahoma game with 33 tackles on the year, but he's been much more of a disruptive force than that number would indicate. He's notched 5 QB sacks so far (31 yards), 8 TFLs in all (41 yds), is 2nd on the team with 8 QB hurries, and has 3 passes broken up, in addition to his INT.

With the loss of MU career sack leader Brian Smith, Jackson is now MU's active career sacks leader, with 13.5 – that ranks 9th currently on MU's career list.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - Chase Daniel set a Missouri record with five touchdown passes, helping the Tigers beat Murray State 47-7 as he led an offensive attack that racked up 589 yards on the night – the 10th-highest single game output in MU school history.

Daniel, making his first career start, was 23-of-32 for 320 yards with a passer rating of 207.44. He broke the school mark that was held by six others, including former record-setting quarterback Brad Smith, who had four in last season's opening 44-17 win over Arkansas State.

Daniel's passing yardage total was also the 10th-highest mark in MU single-game annals.

The Tigers needed just six plays to take the lead for good. Daniel's quick toss to Will Franklin became a 60-yard scoring pass when Franklin spun past the cornerback and ran untouched into the end zone.

Daniel connected with Brad Ekwerekwu on an 8-yard touchdown pass and with Chase Coffman on a 3-yard score later in the first quarter. In the second quarter, Marcus Woods scored on a 2-yard run and Daniel and Franklin connected again, this time on a 34-yard scoring pass in the final minute of the half.

The record-breaking touchdown pass came with 10:53 to play when Daniel hit a wide-open Jared Perry down the left sideline, putting Missouri ahead 47-0.

The Tigers also scored on a safety in the third quarter when Sean Weatherspoon blocked a punt out of the end zone, and on

a 38-yard field goal by Jeff Wolfert.

Missouri's defense played well, too. Murray State, in the first game under new coach Matt Griffin, didn't make a first down until 7:34 remained in the second quarter. By then, Missouri was head 21-0. Starting quarterback Ryne Salyer was 8-of-13 for 39 yards with a lost fumble and an interception. Backup Zac Barnard was 12-of-17 for 89 yards and a touchdown. The Racers' leading rusher, Chad Cook, gained 12 yards on 31 carries.

Murray State's lone score came late in the fourth quarter on a 13-yard TD pass from Barnard to Nate Moore.

Mizzou's defense held the Racers to only 150 yards of offense on the night, including just 25 rushing yards on 27 attempts. The Tiger defenders held Murray State to just 2-of-13 on third down attempts, and snuffed out the only fourth down try the Racers had all night.

Starting tailback Tony Temple carried 15 times and ended with a career-high 119 yards – the most by an MU tailback since former standout Zack Abron rushed for 139 yards in 2003 against Texas Tech.

Senior linebacker Marcus Bacon led the Tiger defensive charge, with a career-high 12 tackles. Bacon recovered a fumble by noseguard Ziggy Hood, and safety Brandon Massey intercepted a pass to account for two forced turnovers by Murray State.

The win was the 30th in the six-year Missouri career of Head Coach Gary Pinkel, and evened his record at MU to 30-30.

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - Chase Daniel had 332 yards in total offense, and Missouri got a dominant effort from its defense in a 34-7 victory over Mississippi to move to 2-0 on the season.

Daniel ran for a 3-yard score and had a 20-yard touchdown pass in a strong follow-up to his first career start when he threw a school-record five touchdown passes against Division I-AA Murray State. Saturday's effort came against tougher competition, with Daniel going 24-for-40 for 243 yards and rushing for 89 yards on 13 carries.

Mississippi (1-1) managed just 162 total yards, and Mizzou's defense forced Rebel guarterback Brent Schaeffer into throwing three interceptions. The Rebels were outgained 169-7 in the first guarter and surrendered 471 yards overall.

Missouri (2-0) scored on three of its first four drives in the first half and the first two possessions of the second half. The Tigers are 2-0 for the first time since 2003, after getting upset by New Mexico and Troy the previous two seasons.

Mississippi's lone score came after a turnover gave the Rebels possession in Missouri territory for the only time. Marcus Woods fumbled a punt return, and Charles Clark recovered at the 40. Two plays later, Schaeffer threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Marshay Green with 1:50 left in the first half to cut the gap to 17-7.

Daniel accounted for all 80 yards on the Tigers' opening drive, going 6-for-6 for 50 yards and rushing four times for 30 yards. He busted a 25-yard run off a fake handoff and scored on a 3-yard run.

A 24-yard pass from Daniel to William Franklin set up a 22yard field goal by Jeff Wolfert, and a punt downed at the 2 ended up giving Missouri favorable field position on a 43-yard drive capped by Woods' 1-yard run for a 17-0 lead.

Brad Ekwerekwu caught a 20-yard touchdown pass to cap Missouri's first drive of the second half, and backup quarterback Brandon Coleman had an 8-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter.

BenJarvus Green-Ellis had 69 yards on 16 carries for Mississippi, which had 240 yards rushing in its opening victory over Memphis.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) -Chase Daniel's fourth quarter touchdown run broke open the game, Tony Temple rushed for 168 yards and Brian Smith tied an MU single-game record with 4 sacks as the Tigers remained unbeaten with a 27-17 win over New Mexico.

Missouri (3-0) showed plenty of offensive potential with 396 total yards, but the Tigers couldn't capitalize on several scoring opportunities against a New Mexico defense that played good enough to keep the Lobos (1-2) in the game.

Daniel finally gave the Tigers breathing room by taking Missouri on an 80-yard, 11-play drive in the opening minutes of the fourth guarter and scoring on an 8-yard keeper for a 20-10 lead.

Earl Goldsmith added a late 2-yard TD for the Tigers and New Mexico scored with 25 seconds left on a 13-yard pass from Chris Nelson to Marcus Smith in garbage time.

New Mexico, whose other touchdown came from linebacker Michael Tuohy's 11-yard interception return of a Daniel pass in the second quarter, had trouble all night against the bigger and quicker Missouri defensive front.

The Lobos finished with 201 total yards - just 33 of them rushingand Missouri's pressure sacked Nelson eight times. But the Lobos were still thinking upset after Kenny Byrd's career-best 52-yard field goal cut Missouri's lead to 13-10 with 31 seconds left in the third quarter.

That's when Daniel, who completed 25 of 36 passes for 199 yards, led the Tigers on their best drive of the night. He completed four passes in the drive, the two biggest a 16-yarder to Will Franklin and a 13-yarder to Martin Rucker to the New Mexico 17.

The Tigers had wasted a good drive in the third guarter when Temple was hit by Lobo freshman defensive back Frankie Solomon and fumbled the ball into the end zone, where defensive end Phillip Harrison recovered for a touchback.

Missouri led 13-7 at the half, but the Tigers easily could have had a bigger cushion.

The Lobos lost two fumbles and Nelson threw an interception in the second quarter, but all the Tigers got from the three turnovers was a 36yard field goal by Jeff Wolfert.

Missouri's offense clicked early as Daniel completed his first six passes in a smooth 13-play drive that ended with a 37-yard Wolfert field goal.

After New Mexico went three-and-out, Missouri went 56 yards on five plays, with Daniel hitting Rucker with a 6-yard TD. The big play in that drive was a 39-yard run by Temple.

New Mexico, which spent much of the first half with negative rushing, cut it to 10-7 on Tuohy's interception. Missouri's receivers broke upfield on the play and Daniel's pass into the flat went right into Tuohy's hands. It was Daniel's interception this season after seven TD passes.

New Mexico's defense held the Tigers on fourth down at the Lobos' 5-yard line late in the first half. That drive started with a fumble by Lobo halfback Rodney Ferguson at the New Mexico 30 that was recovered by linebacker Marcus Bacon. Daniel completed three straight short passes that got the Tigers to the New Mexico 7. On fourth-and-one from the six, Daniel tried to sneak for it and came up short.

New Mexico's offense again gave the Tigers another opportunity when Nelson fumbled and Lorenzo Williams recovered at the Lobos' 19. But Missouri gained just 1 yard on three plays and settled for Wolfert's second field goal.

A dominant second-half performance buoyed Mizzou to a 31-6 win over the Ohio Bobcats, and a perfect 4-0 start for just the sixth time in the last 82 seasons (since 1925).

The MU defense, which allowed 157 yards of offense in the 1st half, shut down Ohio after intermission, allowing only 31 total yards in the 2nd half (with 37 coming on its final possession before an MU interception ended the game). The Tiger offense chipped in adequately, despite 3 turnovers in the game, outgaining the Bobcats 211-to-31 in the 2nd half, and 428-to-188 in total on the day.

The Tiger defense, ranked 2nd in the nation coming into the game, got challenged early, as Ohio forced a turnover on MU's game-opening possession and took over on the Tiger 41-yardline. The Bobcats mustered only 20 yards, however, and had a 38-yard field goal attempt blocked by LB Marcus Bacon to end the threat.

The Tiger offense responded 3 plays later, when QB Chase Daniel hit a wide-open WR Will Franklin down the left sideline for a 68-yard TD pass – the longest pass play since 2000 at MU – to give Mizzou the lead, 7-0.

The Bobcats wouldn't go away, however, as they strung together a 7-play, 80-yard TD drive midway through the 2nd quarter to close to within one point, at 7-6. The extra point was blocked by DL Lorenzo Williams and DE Xzavie Jackson, though, to preserve the lead.

That block seemed to swing momentum for the

homestanding Tigers, as the offense answered with an 11-play, 75-yard TD drive that ended with Daniel's 2nd TD pass to Franklin (from 11 yards) with 5:26 left in the half to make it 14-6.

After a quick 3-and-out forced by MU's defense to open the 3rd quarter, the Tiger offense scored on its first two possessions – on a career-long 44-yard field goal by PK Jeff Wolfert and a 5-yard TD run by Daniel – to extend the lead to 24-6 with 6:38 left in the period.

The TD drive covered only 28 yards and was set up by Williams' fumble recovery after CB Darnell Terrell crashed from the corner to force an errant option pitch by Ohio QB Austen Everson that Williams pounced on.

In four 3rd-quarter possessions by Ohio, the Tiger defense held the Bobcats to -13 yards on 14 total plays, while the MU offense totaled 102 yards in the same 15 minutes.

TB Jimmy Jackson capped the scoring with a 2-yard run (his first of the season) with 3:13 left in the game to account for the final score. Ohio drove 37 yards on its final drive, only to have Bacon grab his 2nd interception of the season. He returned his pickoff 48 yards before being dragged down.

Bacon led all Tigers, with 9 tackles, while Daniel totaled 302 yards of total offense, including 258 passing and 44 rushing. Franklin led all receivers with 99 yards receiving on 4 catches, and TB Tony Temple had a team-high 60 yards rushing on 15 attempts.

The 25th-ranked Missouri Tigers beat Colorado 28-13 in their Big 12 Conference opener to improve to 5-0 and match their best start in a quarter-century.

Chase Daniel threw four touchdown passes as Missouri equaled the 5-0 start of the 1981 team.

Daniel, a sophomore in his first season as a starter, completed 23 of 35 passes for 253 yards, with two interceptions. He has now thrown 13 TD passes this season, including a teamrecord five against Murray State.

Daniel and tight end Chase Coffman teamed up for firstquarter scoring passes of 2 and 9 yards. Daniel hit Missouri's other tight end, Martin Rucker, on a 1-yard score with 11 seconds left in the first half, and connected with wide receiver Jared Perry on a 9-yard score midway through the third quarter.

Both teams entered the game ranked in the top 10 nationally in team defense - Missouri (5-0, 1-0) was first and Colorado eighth. But the Tigers moved easily to touchdowns on their first two possessions, scoring on drives of 71 and 77 yards.

Colorado, ranked 113th in offense with just 223.5 yards per game coming in, actually outgained Missouri 373-353, but could manage just two Mason Crosby field goals - a 32-yarder in the first guarter and a 36-yarder in the second - and one third-quarter touchdown.

Missouri's third score was set up by a Colorado mistake when punter Matt DiLallo let a high snap slip through his hands late in the second quarter. He recovered but was tackled at the Colorado 14.

Six plays later, on third-and-goal from the 1 and out of timeouts, Daniel hit Rucker to make it 21-6.

Colorado guarterback Bernard Jackson and wide receiver Dusty Sprague connected on a 63-yard pass on the first play of the third quarter, and Jackson scored from the 1 a play later to make it 21-13.

Missouri answered with a 52-yard scoring drive ending with Perry's score.

Colorado went for it on fourth down five times. All five failed, including a second-quarter effort on fourth-and-goal from the Missouri 4 with the Buffaloes trailing 14-3.

Jackson was 13-of-27 for 190 yards and ran 15 times for 93 yards. Hugh Charles carried 13 times for 87 yards for Colorado. Tony Temple led Missouri runners with 70 yards on 18 carries.

Crosby's two field goals and extra point gave him 256 career points and made him Colorado's all-time leading scorer.

The Tigers had not allowed a first-quarter score until Saturday and have outscored opponents 62-3 in the first quarter.

Missouri converted 11-of-18 third down coversions, and its defense held the Buffaloes to only 3-of-12 on third downs, in addition to the 0-of-5 on fourth downs.

Missouri enjoyed a total team effort, making enough big plays on both sides of the ball, to earn a solid 38-21 win at Texas Tech, spoiling the Red Raiders' Homecoming game.

The No. 23 Tigers' defense, which came into the game ranked No. 10 in the nation, set up most of the scoring on the night. If there were any questions coming into the game about MU's ability to defend the high-powered Tech offense, the answers came in four turnovers - two interceptions and two fumbles - by Tech quarterback Graham Harrell, which led to 28 points for Missouri. In all, MU collected five turnovers on the night, the most by Mizzou since gaining five in 2003 against Nebraska.

Chase Daniel threw for 171 yards and a touchdown, giving Missouri its first 6-0 start in 33 years.

Xzavie Jackson and William Moore scored on interception returns on consecutive Texas Tech possessions in the second quarter, to help stake the Tigers to a commanding 24-0 lead, before Tech staged a rally to pull to within 24-21 early in the 3rd quarter.

Daniel, who returned to Texas where he played high school football in the Dallas area, kept Tech's defense guessing. The Birthday Boy - Daniel turned 20 on Saturday - completed 15 of 22 passes, threw one interception and ran for 37 yards.

Missouri (2-0 Big 12) got up 24-0 before Texas Tech (4-2, 1-1) crossed the 50. The Red Raiders scored a two touchdowns before halftime and appeared to have momentum turned around.

But Missouri stiffened and allowed only one score in the second half. Daniel and his offensive teammates responded after Tech closed it to 24-21 with a methodical 10-play, 73-yard drive for a TD to end the Tech momentum and push the lead back to 31-21, as Daniel connected with TE Chase Coffman from 6 yards out.

Harrell's second fumble came early in the second half and gave the Tigers good field position at Tech's 44. Daniel threw a 36-yard pass to Will Franklin and Tony Temple ran 8 yards for a touchdown (his 2nd of the night) on the first play of the fourth quarter to give the Tigers their winning margin.

Missouri's defense pressured Harrell early, forcing a fumble at the Red Raiders 12 on the first play of Tech's second possession. DeMarcus Scott recovered the ball and four plays later Temple put Missouri up 10-0 on a 1-yard run.

Missouri's defense got better in the second quarter.

Jackson got the first Missouri defensive score on a screen pass over the middle by Harrell and the defensive end lumbered 17 yards into the end zone untouched to give the Tigers a 17-0 lead.

Harrell's very next pass - to Robert Johnson near the sideline - was picked off by Moore, who scampered 22 yards to put Missouri up 24-0.

Mizzou was dropped from the ranks of the undefeated, thanks in large part to three costly turnovers and an inability to get a methodical Texas A&M offense off the field, as the homestanding Aggies claimed a 25-19 win over the 19th-ranked Tigers.

The Tigers lost three fumbles on the day – all in the first half – and Texas A&M turned those into 10 points as the Aggies forged a 17-17 tie at halftime.

All 10 of those Aggie points off turnovers had an involvement with instant replay, as both plays that led to points were reviewed, and both ultimately went against Mizzou.

The first was potentially the most crucial play of the game, and it came just three plays into the game. Tiger QB Chase Daniel threw a perfectly-lofted pass deep downfield to a wide-open WR Will Franklin, who caught the ball in stride and raced toward the goalline for an apparent 65-yard TD. However, Franklin was caught from behind by A&M's Jordan Peterson inside the 5-yardline, and Peterson punched the ball out of Franklin's arms as he crossed the goalline, with the ball rolling out of the back of the endzone. The play was originally ruled a TD for MU, but replay showed that the ball came out before Franklin crossed the goalline, and it was overturned for a touchback.

The Aggies drove 74 yards on 15 plays for a 23-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead, which represented MU's first deficit of the entire season.

The Tigers responded quickly, however, driving 73 yards in just 7 plays to take a 7-3 lead as TB Tony Temple scored on a 5-yard run.

Texas A&M used a reverse pass that went for 67 yards on its next possession to key a drive that saw them regain the lead at 10-7, but Mizzou again responded with a TD drive of its own, with Daniel and Franklin hooking up for a TD pass that covered 38 yards this time.

The next big replay that hurt MU came midway through the 2nd quarter, as Temple ran into traffic in the middle of the field, and was ruled to have fumbled the ball, which was recovered by A&M on the Tiger 23 yardline. Replay showed that Temple's knee appeared to be down, but the call was not overturned by replay officials, giving the Aggies field position that they cashed in for a subsequent TD to take a 17-14 lead.

MU's Jeff Wolfert tied the game just before half with a 39-yard field goal, and things looked to be going the Tigers' way when A&M QB Stephen McGee had to fall on an errant snap in his own endzone on the opening possession of the 3rd quarter for a safety, giving MU a 19-17 lead.

However, the Tiger offense – despite owning great field position at its own 45yardline - couldn't seize the momentum, and went three-and-out.

A&M responded with a 13-play, 80-yard drive that was aided by a McGee 12-yard pass to himself that was deflected at the line of scrimmage by MU's Brock Christopher. McGee caught the deflection and raced for 12 yards on a 2nd-and-10 situation to the A&M 43-yardline. Instead of facing a 3rd-and-10, the Aggies were near midfield and on their way to what would ultimately prove to be the winning score. That came 10 plays later, when TB Mike Goodson scored from 2 yards out with 6:38 left in the 3rd quarter, and after McGee rushed for the 2-point conversion, A&M held a 25-19 lead.

The Tigers certainly had plenty of opportunities to regain the lead, but it couldn't score in any of its last four possessions. Its best chance came early in the 4th quarter, as Daniel directed a sharp drive that went from MU's 20-yardline to the A&M 4. Daniel hit his first 7 passes on the drive, before his 3rd-and-goal attempt to TE Chase Coffman in the endzone was batted away. After taking a delay of game penalty back to the 9-yardline, Mizzou went for the jugular, as it tried a fake field goal, but holder Brad Ekwerekwu's rush attempt was stopped after gaining only 3 yards.

That would prove to be MU's best chance to score the rest of the way, as the Tiger defense twice more got the ball back for the offense. But the Mizzou offense couldn't convert a 3rd-and-2 from its own 42-yardline on its first chance, and also came up short on a 4th-and-2 rush by Temple from its own 46 on its last possession. Replays showed that Temple might have gotten a bad spot, as he came up a football length short, but the the play was not reviewed.

A&M held the ball for a commanding 41 minutes and 30 seconds, and converted 9-of-15 third down situations, as the Tiger defense couldn't muster any turnovers, one week after forcing 5 Texas Tech turnovers that turned into 28 MU points.

A wet field, a slippery ball, a 13-game losing streak — none of it mattered to Chase Daniel.

Missouri's sophomore quarterback put on another passing display, throwing touchdown passes to four different receivers as the 24th-ranked Tigers beat Kansas State 41-21, snapping a 13-game losing streak against the Wildcats.

Missouri (7-1, 3-1) overcame a turnover turned into a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage to bounce back from the previous week's 25-19 loss to Texas A&M and get off to its best start since 1969. After starting 3-0 under new coach Ron Prince, the Wildcats (4-4, 1-3) dropped their fourth game in their last five.

The game, played in a driving rain, marked Missouri's first win over Kansas State since a 27-14 victory in Columbia in 1992.

Kansas State seemed poised for the upset early. Defensive end Rob Jackson broke around left end on the first play from scrimmage at the Missouri 41 and blindsided Daniel, forcing a fumble that was scooped up by linebacker Zach Diles, who ran 43 yards for the score.

After Jeff Wolfert made a 30-yard field goal for Missouri, the Wildcats had a chance to go up 14-3 early in the second quarter. But on fourth-andgoal from the 1, James Johnson was stopped for no gain.

Prince said going up 14-3 would have given his young team — the offense starts five freshmen — confidence on the road.

Missouri then drove 99 yards in 10 plays, scoring on a 14-yard pass from Daniel to tight end Martin Rucker.

The Tigers made it 17-7 later in the half. On third-and-1 from the Missouri 48, Daniel threw a short sideline pass to Will Franklin, who spun around a defender on single coverage and ran untouched to the end zone.

Daniel, who set a team record with five TD passes in a seasonopening 47-7 win over Murray State, was 24-of-31 for 262 yards. He broke Terry McMillan's record of 18 touchdown throws in a season, set in 1969.

Franklin had five catches for 87 yards and a touchdown, and tight end Chase Coffman had six catches for 75 yards and a 14-yard fourth-quarter score. Tony Temple gained 62 yards on nine carries.

Kansas State freshman quarterback Josh Freeman, who came in completing just 43.1 percent of his passes, was 5-of-19 for 63 yards, was intercepted twice and lost a fumble. He was also sacked four times, twice by linebacker Marcus Bacon.

But the Wildcats had success running the ball, rushing for 262 yards. Johnson carried 20 times for 127 yards and a fourth-quarter 9-yard score, and Patton rushed 18 times for 112 yards and a 15-yard touchdown run in

The start of the second half was a disaster for Kansas State as the Wildcats committed turnovers on three of their first four plays from scrimmage, resulting in 17 Missouri points.

Freeman was intercepted by Dedrick Harrington at the Missouri 48, and the Tigers eventually scored on a 3-yard pass from Daniel to Tommy Saunders. After the kickoff, Darnell Terrell outmuscled Yamon Figurs for a Freeman pass at the Kansas State 29 and returned it to the 11, setting up a 20-yard field goal by Wolfert.

Two plays after that, Missouri's Brock Christopher jarred the ball loose from Patton, and David Overstreet picked up the fumble and ran 41 yards for a touchdown.

Paul Thompson threw two touchdown passes and ran for another score as No. 19 Oklahoma turned five Missouri mistakes into points in a 26-10 victory over the 23rd-ranked Tigers.

Two interceptions, a fumble, a blocked punt and a roughing the kicker penalty set up every point scored for Oklahoma (6-2, 3-1 Big 12), which beat No. 23 Missouri for the 15th time in 16 tries.

The Tigers (7-2, 3-2) lost at home for the first time in nine games.

Thompson was 11-for-19 for 127 yards, passed for two touchdowns and ran for another. Allen Patrick, in his second game as a starting for the injured Adrian Peterson, carried 36 times for 162 yards.

Missouri came in averaging 33.1 points, but struggled against the Sooners' 11th-ranked defense. Chase Daniel was 23-for-44 passing for 284 yards and three interceptions (with two of them coming in desperation time near the game's end). He also ran 20 times for 75 yards and a score, but was held without a passing TD for the first time this season – breaking a school-record string of eight consecutive games with a TD pass. Other than Daniel, Missouri gained 1 yard rushing on seven carries.

Things started promising for Missouri.

Leading 3-0, the Tigers missed a chance for a sure 66-yard touchdown when tight end Chase Coffman, uncovered down the right sideline, let a pass slip off his fingertips.

Instead of taking a 10-0 lead, on the next play, Daniel's pass was tipped and linebacker Zach Latimer intercepted, giving Oklahoma the ball at the Missouri 33. That set up Thompson's 3-yard TD run on an option play seven plays later to make it 7-3 in favor of the Sooners.

After driving into Sooner territory on their next possesseion, Mizzou

lost the ball again when Tony Temple fumbled and Lendy Holmes recovered at the Oklahoma 42. The drive ended with Thompson's 18-yard scoring pass to Joe Jon Finley on the first play of the second quarter.

After Daniel's fumble resulted in a 21-yard loss in MU's next series, the Tigers were forced to punt from their 12. Oklahoma's Jason Carter blocked Adam Crossett's kick and Crossett recovered in the end zone for a safety, and OU led 16-3.

Missouri took advantage of an Oklahoma turnover to cut the margin to 16-10 early in the third quarter. Patrick fumbled and Missouri recovered at its own 34. Daniel was 4-for-4 passing on the drive and ran the other four plays for 30 yards, including a 13-yard score on a quarterback draw.

Oklahoma was forced to punt on its next possession and the Tigers would have had the ball at midfield along with a worldy amount of momentum. But Missouri's William Moore was called for roughing the kicker on the punt, giving the Sooners an automatic first down. Given new life at their 35, the Sooners drove to the Missouri 15, where Thompson connected with Quentin Chaney for a touchdown to extend the lead to 23-10.

The Tigers reached the Oklahoma 1 on their next drive, with a chance to make it a one-score game again. But on fourth-and-goal, Daniel's fade pass to Coffman was incomplete with 44 seconds remaining in the 3rd quarter.

Daniel's second interception, by Marcus Walker with 6:19 to play, set up a 30-yard field goal by Garrett Hartley to close the scoring.
