### GAME NOTES

#### NEBRASKA

- Senior G Tear'a Lauderhill led Nebraska with 16 points and five assists.
- Senior F Emily Cady tallied 15 points and eight rebounds. She is five rebounds shy of No. 2 on Nebraska's all-time list and No. 9 on the Big Ten list.
- After starting 1-for-3 from the field, Nebraska made eight field goals in a row to take 20-17 lead with 14:02 to play. That was part of a combined 16-for-23 shooting performance from both schools to start the game.
- Senior G Brandy Jeffery and freshman G Natalie Romeo also finished in double figures with 14 points each. Romeo converted four three pointers, giving her 11 over the last two games.
- Senior F Hailie Sample led all players on the glass with 10 rebounds, her fourth double-digit rebounding game this year
- Tonight's loss snaps a four-game Big Ten Tournament winning streak. Nebraska is now 8-3 overall in Big Ten Tournament games.

#### IOWA

- Iowa is making its second straight semifinal appearance and 10<sup>th</sup> overall.
- This is head coach Lisa Bluder's 15th Big Ten Tournament victory (15-13). She now sits alone in fourth place on the all-time Big Ten Tournament victory list. She ranks second among active coaches, trailing only Purdue's Sharon Versyp (18).
- The Hawkeyes opened the second half on a 17-5 run to take their largest lead of the game at 53-38 with 13:56 to play.
- Senior G Samantha Logic had 15 points and six assists. She is the NCAA's active career assists leader with 859.
- Iowa is 21-18 all-time in the Big Ten Tournament and 5-1 as the No. 2 seed.
- The Hawkeyes improve to 22-3 this season when scoring 70 or more points.
- Senior C Bethany Doolittle contributed 15 points. She had 11 first half points on 5-for-5 shooting. For the game she shot 70 percent from the field (7-10), the second time this season she has shot 70 percent or better.
- Junior F Kali Peschel scored 13 points off the bench for her fourth double-digit game this year. Her three three-point field goals ties her career best.
- Iowa extended its winning streak over Nebraska to three games. The win snaps a three-game losing skid to the Huskers in the Big Ten Tournament.
- Each of the last four games between Iowa and Nebraska have been decided by nine points or less.
- Sophomore G Ally Disterhoft scored 16 points today. This season she has averaged 16.6 ppg in three meetings with Nebraska.
