Scene Setter

The University of Kansas (3-1, 0-0 Big 12) opens the 2006 Big 12 season Saturday as the Jayhawks travel to Nebraska (3-1, 0-0 Big 12) in a nationally televised game on FoxSports Net. The game against the Cornhuskers marks the second-straight season that KU will open conference play on the road.

Kansas improved to 3-1 on the year after defeating South Florida 13-7 in Lawrence on Sept. 23 in a game highlighted by outstanding defensive play. Following a scoreless first half, the Jayhawks took a 3-0 lead in the third quarter on a 37-yard field goal from junior Scott Webb. After USF took a 7-3 advantage, the Jayhawks outscored the Bulls 10-0 in the fourth quarter to claim victory.

Nebraska enters the contest boasting the Big 12's top scoring offense, averaging 42.8 points per game. NU is 3-0 at home this season, winning by an average score of 53.7-5.7 on its home turf. No. 4 USC handed Nebraska its only loss of the year -- a 28-10 setback in Los Angeles.

KU -- Nebraska Notes

The KU-NU series is tied for the third-longest in NCAA Division I-A history at 112 games, trailing only Minnesota-Wisconsin (115) and Kansas-Missouri (114) ... The two teams have faced each other 100 consecutive years making it the longest current uninterrupted series in NCAA I-A history ... KU's 100th all-time football win was an 8-6 victory over NU in 1906 ... Including Saturday night, five of the last eight meetings in the series with the Cornhuskers have been played at night ... KU snapped a 36-year losing skid to the Cornhuskers last season, defeating NU 40-15 in Lawrence ... Saturday's contest marks the earliest ever meeting between the two school in the series (previous Oct. 2 in 2004).

The Coaches

KU head coach Mark Mangino (22-30, .423), who was a driving force in the successful turnaround of two Big 12 Conference football programs prior to his arrival in Lawrence, is in his fifth season as head football coach at the University of Kansas.

During the 2005 season, Mangino led the Jayhawks to their first bowl victory since 1995 as the team defeated Houston 42-13 in the Fort Worth Bowl. By appearing in the 2005 bowl game, Mangino became the only coach in KU history to direct his team to a pair of bowl contests during a three-year span. Mangino's 2005 squad also posted a perfect 6-0 record at KU's Memorial Stadium - the team's first undefeated/untied season at home since 1951. In fact, KU fans backed Mangino and his team like never before. An average of 43,675 fans showed up per game -- an all-time Memorial Stadium record. He also guided the team to its first win over Nebraska since 1968, snapping a 36-game Cornhusker win streak. In addition, Mangino's club won its third consecutive game against Border Showdown rival Missouri. Under Mangino's guidance, senior linebacker Nick Reid became KU's first-ever Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2004, Mangino guided a relatively inexperienced club to a 4-7 record, with a schedule that included six games against opponents ranked among the Top 25 during the 2004 season -- only two NCAA Division I teams played more regular-season games against opponents ranked in the Top 25. In addition, for the first time since the 1989 season, Kansas was victorious against both of its biggest rivals -- Missouri and Kansas State. The Jayhawks snapped K-State's 11-game win-streak in the series by defeating the Wildcats 31-28 on Oct. 9 in Lawrence, and later tamed the Tigers 31-14 on Nov. 9 in Columbia, Mo.

In 2003, Mangino led the Jayhawks to their first bowl appearance since 1995 when the team faced North Carolina State in the Mazda Tangerine Bowl.

The Cornhuskers are coached by Bill Callahan (16-11, .593 at Nebraska), who is in his third season as the team's head coach. He is the 27th head football coach in NU history and arrived in Lincoln, Neb., after spending nine seasons in the NFL with the Philadelphia Eagles and Oakland Raiders. Callahan was a full-time college assistant for 14 seasons, including stints at Wisconsin (1990-94), Southern Illinois (1989), Northern Arizona (1987-88) and Illinois (1981-86).

A Quick Look at Nebraska

Nebraska enters the game against Kansas on the heels of a 56-0 win in its game against Troy on Sept. 23 to improve to 3-1 on the season. The Cornhuskers are averaging 42.8 points per game and allowing 11.2 points per contest. NU collects 224.2 rushing yards per game and averages 248.2 yards per game through the air. Senior quarterback Zac Taylor leads the team in passing (218.0 yards per game) and has thrown for eight touchdowns. Sophomore I-back Marlon Lucky collects 91.2 rushing yards per game and averages 7.2 yards per carry. He has scored a team-best five rushing touchdowns. Nebraska ranks third among all Big 12 teams in total defense, allowing 257.8 total yards per game. Safety Tierre Green, linebacker Stewart Bradley and linebacker Corey McKeon are all tied with a team-best 21 total tackles.

Receivers Have Talent

Junior wide receiver Marcus Henry and sophomore wideout Dexton Fields may be short on experience, but both are quickly become favorite targets of the KU quarterbacks. Against South Florida on Sept. 23, Henry finished the game with five catches for 66 yards, but failed to reach paydirt for the first time this season. He leads the team with 175 receiving yards. Fields, who had three catches for 58 yards against USE, has two touchdowns this season and is tied for second on the team with 13 receptions. Senior Brian Murph leads the team with 17 catches and ranks second with an average of 43.5 receiving yards per game. Sophomore Marcus Herford has seven catches for 104 yards this season and leads the team with an average of 43.8 yards per contest.

Herford and Murph Lead Big 12 in Returns

In his first full year as KU's kickoff return specialist, Marcus Herford has 10 returns for 305 yards -- an average of 30.5 yards per return (1st in the Big 12). Punt returner Brian Murph, who has two career punt returns for touchdowns, leads all Big 12 players with an average of 21.8 yards per punt return attempt. In the season-opener against Northwestern State, the Howardville, Mo., native returned his only attempt 70 yards for a touchdown. In KU's final game of the 2005 season against Houston in the Fort Worth Bowl, Murph scored on an 85-yard punt return -- his only attempt of that season. The KU record for punt return TDs in a career is three, held by Donnie Shanklin who starred at Kansas from 1966-68.

Learning on the Job

Nine players, including six on the defensive side of the ball, made their first career starts against Northwestern State in KU's season-opener -- sophomore Dexton Fields (WR), freshman Kerry Meier (QB), senior Jon Cornish (RB), senior Wayne Wilder (DT), sophomore Joe Mortensen (LB), sophomore Mike Rivera (LB),

senior Eric Washington (LB), junior Blake Bueltel (CB) and junior Sadiq Muhammed (FS). In addition, four true freshman played for the Jayhawks in the season-opener -- Olaitan Oguntodu, Maxwell Onyegbule and Anthony Webb played mostly on special teams, while Jake Sharp worked on both special teams and as a backup running back.

Stuffing the Run

Despite losing eight starters from the 2005 team, the Jayhawk defense showed it can still smother a running game, evident by the fact that Louisiana Monroe collected just 51 yards on the ground Sept. 9 and Northwestern State rushed the ball 30 times, but only managed 62 yards in KU's first game of the year. Through four games this season, the KU defense has allowed a total of 327 rushing yards for an average of 2.9 yards per carry. Such stats are strikingly similar to last year's defense, which ended the season allowing 83.3 yards per game and 2.4 yards per carry, tops in the Big 12 Conference and third-best in NCAA Division I-A.

The solid run defense numbers this season have been aided by KU's 27 tackles-for-loss totaling 86 yards. Eight players made stops behind the line of scrimmage in KU's season-opener against Northwestern State and five different Jayhawks posted TFLs against South Florida, including a career-best three by defensive end Paul Como.

Controlling the Clock

Nebraska and Kansas rank 1-2 respectively in the Big 12 in time of possession. NU leads the conference with an average time of possession of 33:24 per game while the Jayhawks are second in the league, holding the ball for an average of 31:57.

O-Line to Lead KU Offense

KU's offensive line is both deep and talented as the Jayhawks return nine of 10 offensive linemen from last year's depth chart, including David Ochoa, Bob Whitaker, Cesar Rodriguez, Ryan Cantrell, Jake Cox and Travis Dambach who combined for 47 starts a

year ago. In 2005, KU's offensive line helped lead a rushing attack which ended the season averaging 134.0 yards per game and nearly four yards per carry. (In 2004, the Jayhawks averaged just 94.0 yards per game and less than three yards per carry.) Ochoa, a senior captain, is on the preseason watch lists for the Lombardi Trophy, Rimington Trophy and the Outland Trophy after earning All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors by the league's head coaches and the *Associated Press* in 2005. Whitaker, a senior, also was an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention selection by the league's head coaches last year and won the Gale Sayers Award for Most Courageous Player at the team's end of the year awards banquet.

About the Run Game

The Jayhawks return more than 60 percent of their rushing offense, including two of the team's top three ball carriers from last year. Senior running back Jon Cornish led the team in 2005 with 780 rushing yards and nine touchdowns, while junior Brandon McAnderson added 102 yards and a score from his fullback position. In KU's first game of the 2006 season, the Jayhawks rushed the ball 31 times for 209 yards -- the fifth time since the start of last season the Jayhawks have topped the 200-yard barrier. Cornish led the way with 140 yards against Northwestern State, including a 69-yard touchdown scamper. Freshman running back Jake Sharp (39 yards) and redshirt-freshman quarterback Kerry Meier (59 yards) combined for 98 rushing yards in their collegiate debuts. As a team, the Jayhawks are averaging 159.0 rushing yards per game and Cornish ranks second in the Big 12 with an average of 109.2 rushing yards per game. He is one of just three players who average better than 100 yards per contest.

Tucker Pinning the Opposition

Over the course of the last three games, KU punter Kyle Tucker has landed seven kicks inside the opponent 20-yard line (4 vs. ULM, 3 at Toledo). For the season, Tucker is averaging 36.9 yards per attempt (17 punts) and has a season-long 52-yarder.

Linebackers Lead KU Defense

KU linebackers Mike Rivera (35 tackles, three TFLs), Eric Washington (30 tackles, 1 fumble recovery) and Joe Mortensen (26 tackles, 6 TFLs) are KU's three leading tacklers, despite the fact they have started just 12 combined games (all in 2006). Against USF on Sept. 23, Washington collected his first career double-digit tackle game by making 10 total tackles. He also led the team with three quarterback hurries against the Bulls.

Five Jayhawks Earn Preseason Recognition

Senior offensive lineman David Ochoa was named to the preseason watch lists for the Outland Trophy, Rimington Trophy and Lombardi Award. The Houston, Texas, native was also listed as preseason second-team All-Big 12 by Collegefootballnews.com. Senior offensive lineman Bob Whitaker was projected as a second-team All-Big 12 member and senior safety Jerome Kemp earned preseason All-Big 12 first-team honors by *The Sporting News*. Sophomore cornerback Aqib Talib was a preseason All-Big 12 selection by the league's coaches and also was named to the preseason watch list for the Bronco Nagurski Award. Junior punter Kyle Tucker, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award in 2005, was named to the award's 2006 preseason watch list. He also was named preseason

Supporting the Jayhawks

After setting a school-record for season tickets sold in late August, the announced attendance of 44,025 against Northwestern State in KU's season-opener represented the largest turnout for a home-opener since 1994 (48,100 vs. Michigan State). The attendance of 40,993 at KU's game against South Florida on Sept. 23, marked the sixth-straight game that Kansas has had 40,000-plus fans for a home contest.

Tough Schedule

The game against Nebraska represents the third-straight contest the Jayhawks have played against a team that participated in a bowl contest in 2005. Overall, six of the Jayhawks' 12 opponents this year appeared in bowl games last season including Toledo (GMAC Bowl), South Florida (Meineke Car Care Bowl), Nebraska (Alamo Bowl), Colorado (Champs Sports Bowl), Iowa State (Houston Bowl) and Missouri (Independence Bowl).

Name Changes at Memorial Stadium

In February, the Kansas Board of Regents granted the University of Kansas permission to name the planned football facility near Memorial Stadium the Anderson Family Football Complex. In addition, the university announced it will name the field inside the stadium Kivisto Field. The names, approved by Chancellor Robert Hemenway, recognize the primary donors for the \$31 million football complex: the Kivistos (former KU basketball team captain Tom Kivisto and his wife, Julie) and the Andersons (Dana and Sue, and their son, Justin, and his wife, Jean).

New Faces in the Press Box

Former All-Big Eight performer David Lawrence joins veteran play-by-play announcer Bob Davis in the booth this fall. Lawrence serves as color analyst on KU radio broadcasts after serving the last 12 years as the team's sideline reporter. KU graduate Nate Bukaty succeeds Lawrence on the sidelines and will host the "Crimson & Blue Line" pre-game show. The moves follow legendary Max Falkenstein's retirement after 60 years of broadcasting Jayhawk games.

Miscellaneous Jayhawk Notes

Kansas is playing its 117th season of football -- only 11 NCAA Division IA schools have been playing football longer. Through 116 seasons, Kansas has posted a record of 539-532-58 ... Kansas has forced at least one turnover in 34 of its last 38 contests including 11 of its last 14 games... Since 1995, KU is 33-10 when a Jayhawk player rushes for more than 100 yards in a game ... Senior offensive lineman Bob Whitaker has the team's longest starting streak at 40 games and has started every game of his KU career.

Jayhawks in the NFL

Seven former Kansas football players are currently on National Football League rosters as the 2006 NFL season opened in mid-September. **Don Davis**, a linebacker with the New England Patriots, is the dean of former Jayhawks in the NFL. **Moran Norris** was released by the Houston Texans following the 2005 season but was acquired by the San Francisco 49ers as a free agent. **Justin Hartwig** signed with Carolina in March. Other NFL veterans who once played for the Jayhawks include **Adrian Jones**, who started all 16 games for the New York Jets last season at offensive tackle and linebacker **David McMillan** who was a rookie with the Cleveland Browns in '05. Wide receiver/cornerback **Charles Gordon** signed with the Minnesota Vikings and recently was signed to the practice squad. Former Jayhawk wide receiver **Leo Bookman**, released recently by the Green Bay Packers, signed with the Oakland Raiders' practice squad earlier in September.

Rule Changes for 2006

Several rule changes have been implemented for the 2006 NCAA football season. Following is a small list of some of the more noticeable changes.

Game clock - The game clock will start when the referee signals "ready for play" after any possession change (punts, turnovers, failed fourth-down plays). Also, the clock will start when the ball is kicked-off or kicked or punted on post-safety free kicks.

Shortened tees - Kickers will use 1-inch instead of 2-inch tees on kickoffs. The idea is to produce shorter and lower kicks for more kickoff returns.

Instant replay - Every conference will use instant replay, and coaches will have one challenge per game. Unsuccessful challenges will result in a lost timeout.

Bowl eligibility - In a 12-game regular season, teams with 6-6 records will be eligible for postseason play.

Game-by-Game Post-Game Notes

at Kansas 49, Northwestern State 18 (Sept. 2)

►The attendance of 44,025 was the largest for a Kansas home opener since 1994 (48,100 vs. Michigan State in a 17-10 KU win).

►The victory marked the third-straight season-opening win for Kansas. The last time Kansas won three straight season-openers was 1995, 1996 and 1997.

►KU's 49 points were the most in a season-opener since the Jayhawks scored 49 at Oregon State on Sept. 5, 1992.

►Kansas scored two special teams touchdowns (punt return, blocked punt in the endzone) in a game for the first time since Nov. 4, 1997 against Iowa State when the Jayhawks blocked two punts for TDs.

►Nine KU players made their first career starts - sophomore Dexton Fields (WR), freshman Kerry Meier (QB), senior Jon Cornish (RB), senior Wayne Wilder (DT), sophomore Joe Mortensen (LB), sophomore Mike Rivera (LB), senior Eric Washington (LB), junior Blake Bueltel (CB) and junior Sadiq Muhammed (FS).

►Sophomore Marcus Herford's first career kickoff return went for 88 yards and was the 10th longest in KU history.

►In the first quarter, freshman Kerry Meier threw his first career TD pass to junior Marcus Henry, who caught his first career TD as a Jayhawk.

►For the second-straight game, Brian Murph scored a TD both on a punt return and as a wide receiver. He did the same against Houston in the 2005 Fort Worth Bowl.

►Senior Jon Cornish's 69-yard touchdown run was the second longest of his career. He had a 72-yard TD run against Nebraska last season.

►Cornish's 140 yards rushing were a career-high and marked the fifth 100-yard rushing game of his career.

►Sophomore LB Mike Rivera recorded 11 total tackles to mark his first career double-digit tackling performance.

►Sophomore LB Joe Mortensen recorded a career-high six tackles, including four TFLs and a sack.

at Kansas 21, Louisiana Monroe (Sept. 9)

►Kansas won its eighth straight game at home, the longest home-win streak since the 1967-68 seasons, when the Jayhawks also won eight straight under then-head coach Pepper Rogers.

►Kansas held ULM to 51 yards rushing, marking the 11th time in the last 14 games that the KU defense has held its opponent to under 100 yards rushing for a game.

►The two point margin of victory was the closest for KU since its 39-37 four-overtime victory win at UAB in 1998.

►The win moved Kansas to 6-0 against teams from the Sun Belt Conference.

►Coupled with his 140 yards against Northwestern State in the season-opener, senior running back Jon Cornish tallied back-to-back 100-yard rushing games. The last KU player to accomplish the feat was Clark Green last season (125 vs. Missouri and 100 vs. Nebraska). The last KU player to do it in the first two games of the season was June Henley in 1996 (187 vs. Ball State and 201 vs. TCU).

►Cornish's 46-yard reception in the second quarter was a career long. Cornish also set a new mark in single-game receiving yards with his 62, surpassing his 43 yards against Houston in last year's Fort Worth Bowl.

►Sophomore Marcus Herford's 29-yard reception in the first quarter was a career long, replacing a 24-yarder from last season.

►Sophomore Dexton Fields' touchdown was the second TD of his career. His six receptions were a career high, as were his 39 receiving yards.

►Kyle Tucker's four punts inside the 20 yard line represented a career-best.

►Senior DE Paul Como recorded a career-high eight tackles. His previous high was four stops at Texas last year. Como's three TFLs were also a career-best.

at Toledo 37, Kansas 31 2ot (Sept. 15)

►Junior WR Marcus Henry and sophomore CB Aqib Talib made their first starts of the season.

►Kansas played its first overtime game since the 2005 regular-season finale when KU defeated Iowa State 24-21 on Nov. 26. It marked the second time in KU history the Jayhawks played more than one overtime period. KU's longest contest was a 39-37 four overtime win at UAB on Sept. 26, 1998.

►Kansas' only other road overtime loss was a 47-50 defeat at Colorado on Oct. 11, 2003.

►Redshirt freshman LB Brandon Duncan recorded his first career sack and forced a fumble late in the first quarter.

►Junior RB Brandon McAnderson's two-yard, second quarter touchdown run was his first score of the season and the second of his career.

►Sophomore DE John Larson sacked backup Toledo QB Brandon Summers for a safety midway through the third quarter. It was Larson's first career sack and the first safety KU scored since the fourth quarter on Nov. 5, 2005 against Nebraska.

►Marcus Henry caught a career-long 33-yard touchdown in the third quarter from Meier. The TD was the third of Henry's career -- all this season. It was Meier's fifth touchdown pass of the season and the longest TD pass of his three-game career.

►Henry finished the contest with a career-high 67 yards receiving.

►Sophomore WR Marcus Herford set career-highs with four catches for 38 yards.

►Meier finished the game with career-highs for completions (23), pass attempts (41) and passing yardage (243). His previous highs were 16-of-27 passing for 185 yards against Louisiana Monroe.

South Florida at Kansas (Sept. 23)

►The last time a Kansas football game ended the first half at 0-0 was Sept. 13, 1980 at Oregon. That game ended 7-7.

►Kansas registered eight tackles-for-loss to give the Jayhawks 31 on the season.

►The attendance of 40,933 was the sixth straight 40,000-plus crowd at Memorial Stadium.

►Kansas had a season high eight different receivers with at least one catch.

►Senior Adam Barmann started his first game of the season at quarterback. It was Barmann's 14th career start at Kansas.

►Barmann moved into ninth place on the KU career pass attempts list, with a total of 414. Barmann passed Zac Wegner (1995-99) who had 380 attempts from 1995-99.

►Senior RB Jon Cornish registered his third 100-yard rushing game of the season and seventh of his career.

►Cornish had a career-high 26 carries to surpass his 23 against Louisiana-Monroe earlier this season.

►Cornish tied his career high with six receptions.

►Senior WR Brian Murph tied his career high with six receptions.

►Junior WR Marcus Henry tied his career-high with five receptions.

►Senior WR Jonathan Lamb's 22-yard catch in the second quarter was his first reception since his freshman season. It was Lamb's third career reception and a career long.

►Sophomore WR Dexton Fields' 23-yard catch in the second quarter was a career long only to be surpassed by his 31-yard catch in the third quarter.

►Senior LB Eric Washington recorded a career-high 10 tackles.

►Senior DE Paul Como tied his career-high three tackles-for-loss. Como's two sacks also tied a career-high.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- Behind a career-high 140 rushing yards from senior Jon Cornish, Kansas opened the 2006 season with a 49-18 victory against Northwestern State at Memorial Stadium. A crowd of 44,025 - the largest home-opening crowd at Memorial Stadium since 1994 - saw KU win its third-straight season opener under Head Coach Mark Mangino. The win was also Kansas' fifth-straight against non-conference foes and its seventh-straight at home. KU's 49 points were the most in a season opener since 1992. Kerry Meier's debut as Kansas' quarterback saw the red-shirt-freshman throw for 118 yards and two touchdowns. Meier also rushed for two scores, including 31-yard scamper to end the scoring at 49-18 with 3:46 to play. He also scored on a one-yard plunge earlier in the fourth quarter and finished with 59 yards rushing. Kansas scored 28-straight points behind two touchdown passes, a punt return and a fumble recovery of a blocked punt to lead Northwestern State 28-6 at halftime. Trailing 6-0, Kansas sophomore Marcus Herford returned a kickoff 88 yards to set up KU's first score of the season. Herford's jaunt was the 10th longest in school history as Kansas took a 7-6 lead on a Kerry Meier 10-yard pass to Marcus Henry with 4:32 in the first quarter. After a three-and-out by the Demons, KU senior Brian Murph returned a punt 70 yards to paydirt to make the score 14-6 with 1:42 to play in the first quarter. With 8:20 remaining in the half, KU sophomore Dexton Fields blocked a Demon punt in the endzone and it was recovered by junior Jeff Foster to make the score 21-6 in favor of the Jayhawks. After a fumble recovery by Kansas senior Eric Washington, Meier hit Murph on a 15-yard fade pass to make the score 28-6 with 6:52 remaining before intermission. KU's first drive of the second half saw Cornish score on a 69-yard run. The running back went on to post his fifth career 100-yard rushing game and also set a personal high with 156 all-purpose yards.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- The University of Kansas defeated Louisiana Monroe, 21-19, behind the efforts of senior running back Jon Cornish and freshman quarterback Kerry Meier. Cornish tallied 165 total yards, a new career-high, while Meier threw for two touchdowns and scored one on the ground. Cornish carried the ball a career-high 23 times for 103 yards. His consecutive 100-yard performances to open the season makes him the first Jayhawk to do so since June Henley in 1996. Meier, making his second career start, was 16-for-27 for 185 yards and two touchdowns. He connected with sophomore Dexton Fields six times for 39 yards. Fields' six receptions - including an 11-yard touchdown grab in the first quarter - set a new career-high for the Dallas native. The Jayhawks struck in the middle of the first quarter after orchestrating an 11-play drive, which was capped off by an 11-yard pass-and-catch from Meier to Fields. The drive spanned over five minutes and the Fields' touchdown was the second of his career. With 2:02 left in the opening period, Louisiana Monroe evened the score at 7-7, after a 59-yard touchdown pass to Zeek Zacharie from quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster. Kansas countered the Warhawks score with a four-yard touchdown pass from Meier to sophomore Marcus Henry putting the Jayhawks ahead, 14-7, at halftime. The touchdown marked Henry's second touchdown in the young season. The drive was ignited by Cornish's 46-yard reception, the longest of his Jayhawk career. After forcing a Warhawks punt on their opening drive of the second half, the Jayhawks marched down the field and scored on a 10-yard touchdown scamper by Meier. The drive included several strong runs by Cornish including a 22-yard jaunt. The Warhawks were able to claw back into the game after Lancaster ran for a nine-yard touchdown, to make the score 21-13. However, the Warhawks missed the resulting extra-point. ULM pulled within two points of the Jayhawks after another Lancaster-to-Zacharie touchdown connection for three yards with 3:31 remaining in the fourth quarter. The ensuing two-point conversion attempt failed after Lancaster's toss to Zacharie sailed out of the end zone. Junior running back Brandon McAnderson retrieved ULM's on-side kick, allowing the Jayhawks to run out the clock and preserve the victory. On defense, KU senior Paul Como registered a career-high eight tackles including three behind the line of scrimmage. Sophomore Mike Rivera also added seven tackles to give him 18 for the season.

Toledo, Ohio -- The Kansas football team suffered its first loss of the season after it dropped a double-overtime decision, 37-31 to Toledo. The KU defense shined in the defeat, limiting the Rockets to just 237 yards of total offense for the game. Linebacker Mike Rivera registered eight tackles to lead the squad and safety Jerome Kemp collected seven tackles while cornerback Aqib Talib, linebacker Eric Washington and linebacker Joe Mortensen each added six tackles for the unit. Freshman quarterback Kerry Meier threw a pair of touchdown passes and ran for another in the first road game of his collegiate career. Running back Jon Cornish rushed for 89 yards on 20 carries and also caught three passes for 26 yards. Tight end Derek Fine had a team-high five receptions for 49 yards while sophomore Marcus Henry hauled in a three passes for a career-high 67 yards, including a 33-yard touchdown grab. The Jayhawks started quickly, scoring on the team's opening possession when Meier scrambled for a 12-yard touchdown run. After a Toledo safety and rushing score, the Jayhawks responded with a two-yard touchdown plunge by fullback Brandon McAnderson. The touchdown, the second of McAnderson's career, made the score, 14-9, midway through the second quarter. Toledo took a 17-14 lead into halftime after connecting on a fourth-down touchdown reception with under a minute left in the first half. The Jayhawks answered quickly in the second half when defensive end John Larson sacked Rockets quarterback Brandon Summers early in the third quarter for a safety. The Jayhawks regained the lead after the safety when Meier hooked up with Henry on the 36-yard score, making the score 23-17. After the Rockets struck back twice to take a 31-23 lead, Meier drove KU down the field before connecting with wide receiver Dexton Fields on a 20-yard scoring play. Meier successfully converted the two-point attempt, knotting the score at 31. The teams then entered overtime, where the Rockets were unsuccessful on the opening possession. However, Meier fumbled a hand-off to Cornish on the Jayhawks' possession, sending the game into double overtime, only the second time in school history that Kansas has played a contest with more than one overtime period. In the second overtime, Meier was intercepted and Rockets running back Jalen Parmale scored on a 25-yard run to end the game.

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- The University of Kansas used a solid defensive effort to outlast South Florida 13-7 at Memorial Stadium. KU freshman Justin Thornton intercepted USF quarterback Matt Grothe's final pass as time expired. The Bulls, 3-1, drove to the Kansas 27-yard line and had two endzone pass attempts on the game's final drive. Kansas, 3-1, won its ninth-straight home game limiting USF, of the Big East Conference, to a season-low seven points. The Jayhawks forced three turnovers and limited the Bulls to 113 rushing yards en route to the victory. After a scoreless first half, a crowd of 40,933 saw points put on the board in each of the first three drives of the second stanza. Kansas took the second half kickoff and drove 60 yards before junior Scott Webb gave KU a 3-0 lead with a 37-yard field goal. USF answered on the next possession to take a 7-3 lead on a seven-yard touchdown run by Grothe. The Jayhawks then drove 79 yards in seven plays to take a 10-7 advantage on senior Jon Cornish's two-yard run at the start of the fourth quarter. On USF's ensuing drive, KU's defense forced a punt and the Jayhawks responded with a 47-yard drive that concluded with a Webb 42-yard field goal to make the score 13-7 with nine minutes to play. KU senior quarterback Adam Barmann received his first start of the season and 14th of his career. The Weston, Mo., native was 25-of-35 for 273 yards passing and hit seven different receivers in the game. Cornish recorded his third 100-yard rushing game of the season with 105 yards on a career-high 26 carries. Cornish also had six receptions and 119 all-purpose yards for the contest. The first half was a defensive battle that ended 0-0. It marked the first scoreless first half in a Kansas game since 1980. USF made the field long for Kansas as KU's first three possessions started inside its own five-yard line. KU outgained USF 219-166 in the first half.
