

VINCE FERRAGAMO—Quarterback

6-3 ... 208 ... Carson, Calif.



Tabbed an All American by Football News, Ferragamo was co-captain of the 1976 Nebraska team that finished 9-3-1 and defeated Texas Tech in the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl . . . Established himself as one of Nebraska's premier quarterbacks when he set the Husker record for most touchdown passes in a season — 22 . . . Transferred to Nebraska after two years at the University of California, where he started ahead of Steve Bartkowski . . . Adding together his two years at Cal and two years at Nebraska, Vince passed for 5,061 yards — almost three miles — and 46 TD's . . . Hero of the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl, Vince directed Nebraska to two come-from-behind scores in the third quarter that gave the game to the Huskers . . . In 1975, Vince began the year as a backup to Terry Luck, but started every game beginning with the Kansas contest. . . Led the Huskers in their 1975 stretch drive to a 10-2 overall season and 6-1 conference mark that tied Oklahoma for the Big 8 crown . . . A fine student, in '76, Ferragamo earned All American and All Big 8 honors . . . He was also a National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame Scholarship Award Winner . . . One of six Huskers drafted by the pros, Vince was picked in the fourth round by the Los Angeles Rams . . . Parents: Vince and Stella Ferragamo.

Caught 33 passes for 722 yards in 1976, the most yards receiving of any Husker . . . Chuck set the Nebraska record for most yards receiving in one game when he caught 166 yards worth in the game against Hawaii . . . Voted the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl's Most Valuable Lineman for his 107-yard performance against Texas Tech . . . Will try out with the Houston Oilers this summer . . . An excellent middle distance runner, Malito was the 1974 Big 8 Outdoor 440 champ . . . One of the great Husker athletes. Chuck lettered seven times, four times in track and three in football . . . Malito earned All State football honors at Lakewood High School . . . Parents: Frank and Francis Malito.
