Nebraska allowed just 194 yards of total offense against Rutgers. The yardage total was the lowest for an NU opponent in 47 games, dating back to a win at Michigan in November of 2013.

Nebraska has won 14 consecutive games when out-rushing the opposition. Overall, Nebraska is 16-3 under Mike Riley when it outgains the opponent on the ground.

Nebraska averages more than 33 minutes per game in time of possession (33:23). The Huskers rank fourth in the Big Ten and 15th nationally in that category. In the second half against Rutgers, Nebraska held the ball for nearly 23 minutes.

THE MATCHUP

Nebraska hits the road for the first time in Big Ten Conference play taking on Illinois on Friday night in Champaign. Game time at Illinois' Memorial Stadium is set for shortly after 7 p.m. CT, with national televison coverage on FS1 and radio coverage on the IMG Husker Sports Network.

The Huskers enter the matchup at Illinois with a 2-2 record, and a 1-0 mark in conference play following a 27-17 victory over Rutgers on Saturday. Nebraska relied on a strong running game and tough defense to control the second half of the game against Rutgers. The Huskers rushed for nearly 200 yards, while allowing less than 200 yards of total offense to the Scarlet Knights.

Illinois comes into Friday's matchup with a 2-1 record, including a 2-0 mark at home in 2017. The Fighting Illini last played at South Florida on Friday, Sept. 15, when they lost 47-23. Illinois will have a 14-day break before Friday's contest with the Huskers. Illinois opened the season with non-conference victories over Ball State and Western Kentucky.

The 2017 season marks the fifth consecutive year the Nebraska-Illinois contest has been one of the Huskers' first two conference games. Aside from its traditional post-Thanksgiving game, Friday's game will mark the first time Nebraska has played a weekday regular-season game since 2010.

The Friday matchup between Nebraska and Illinois will be the fifth between the schools as Big Ten opponents. The schools now meet each year as members of the Big Ten West Division.

- Nebraska has limited Illinois to 19 or fewer points in all four Big Ten meetings between the teams. NU has scored at least 31 points in three of the four meetings.
- The Huskers and Illinois met seven times between 1892 and 1925, but played just three times between 1926 and 2013.

HUSKERS PREPARE FOR BIG TEN CONFERENCE ROAD OPENER

Nebraska will play the first of four Big Ten road games at Illinois. In the Big Ten schedule rotation, all West Division teams play five home games and four road contests in 2017.

 Nebraska is 2-4 in Big Ten road openers since joining the conference, including a 24-13 win at Northwestern last season.

NEBRASKA TO PLAY RARE WEEKNIGHT MIDSEASON GAME

Nebraska is a regular on Friday at season's end, playing on the Friday following Thanksgiving each of the past 27 seasons. However, the Huskers have made rare weeknight appearances during the middle of the season.

The Big Ten Conference added Friday night games to its schedule this season, including a conference tilt between the Huskers and Fighting Illini.

- Nebraska played Thursday night road contests at Kansas State (2010), Missouri (2009), Southern Miss (2003), Oklahoma State (1995), Texas Tech (1994) and Oklahoma State (1993).
- Nebraska also played a Thursday night home contest against Rice in 2001. The game was originally scheduled for Sept. 15, but was postponed following 9/11.
- Nebraska is a perfect 7-0 in its non-Black Friday weeknight games since 1993.

HUSKERS LOOK FOR CONTINUED SUCCESS AGAINST ILLINI

Nebraska has been victorious in three of four games against Illinois since joining the Big Ten. The Huskers have won three games by 15 or more points, while its lone setback was a last-second one-point loss in 2015.

- NU has outscored Illinois by an average of 32.0-15.6 in the four meetings since 2013.
- The Husker offense has been productive against Illinois, gaining better than 500 yards twice, and averaging 465.0 yards per game in the past four meetings. Illinois has averaged only 340.7 yards per game in the matchups.
- The NU offense has been particularly effective on the ground against Illinois, rushing for 295.8 yards per game over the past four seasons.

RILEY IN THIRD SEASON AT HELM OF HUSKER PROGRAM

Head Coach Mike Riley is in his third season as the Nebraska head coach in 2017. Riley has guided the Huskers to a 17-13 record.

- Riley is in his 26th season as a head coach, tying for the second-most experience of any FBS head coach entering the 2017 season.
- Riley is one of eight active FBS head coaches who also has experience as an NFL head coach.
- Riley owns 16 victories over nationally ranked opponents during his college head coaching tenure.

DIACO LEADING NEW-LOOK BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE

Nebraska has three new faces on its defensive staff in 2017. The group is led by new defensive coordinator Bob Diaco, while Donté Williams coaches the Husker cornerbacks and Scott Booker tutors the NU safeties.

- Diaco was the winner of the 2012 Broyles Award as the nation's best assistant coach, while at Notre Dame. He is regarded as one of the top defensive minds in college football and has a proven track record of success at the highest level. Diaco came to Nebraska after three seasons as the head coach at the University of Connecticut. Diaco has roots in the Big Ten, twice earning All-Big Ten honors as a linebacker at lowa in the mid-1990s.
- Williams joined the Nebraska staff last December prior to the Music City Bowl and worked with the secondary during bowl preparation. Williams spent the 2016 season at Arizona, helping compile the Wildcats' top recruiting class in recent years. He previously coached the secondary at San Jose State, where the Spartans ranked among the nation's best against the pass under Williams' direction.
- Booker brings 10 years of full-time FBS coaching experience to the Nebraska sideline, including five seasons on the Notre Dame coaching staff.
 Before being elevated to safeties coach in June,
 Booker served as a special teams consultant with the Huskers. In addition to his duties with the safeties, Booker serves as Nebraska's special teams coordinator in 2017.

NOTING GAME 4

- True freshman Brenden Jaimes became just the fifth true freshman offensive lineman to start a game at Nebraska since 1972.
- De'Mornay Pierson-El had a 63-yard punt return in the second quarter. It marked his 12th career punt return of 25 or more yards.
- The Nebraska defense limited Rutgers to just 194 yards, including 58 after halftime.
 The total offensive output was the lowest by a Nebraska opponent since Michigan had 175 yards in November of 2013.
- Junior running back Devine Ozigbo rushed a career-high 24 times for 101 yards, including 86 yards after halftime. It was the second career 100-yard rushing day for Ozigbo.
- Nebraska allowed fewer than 85 rushing yards for the sixth straight home game at Memorial Stadium. Nebraska's three opponents at Memorial Stadium this season are averaging just 78.3 rushing yards per game.
- Redshirt freshman receiver JD Spielman caught a career-high five passes, including an 18-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter.
- Nebraska had a third-quarter touchdown drive that covered 17 plays, 97 yards and 8:10. The scoring drive was the longest of the season for Nebraska in terms of plays, time and yards. The previous longer drive was an 18-play scoring drive against Illinois last season that lasted 10:42. The 97-yard scoring drive matched a 97-yard scoring drive against Wyoming last season.

VETERANS LEADING 2017 HUSKERS

The 2017 version of Nebraska football features several players with extensive starting experience. Five players have at least 20 career starts at Nebraska, led by place-kicker Drew Brown.

Overall, Nebraska has 16 players with at least 10 collegiate starts, including quarterback Tanner Lee, who made 19 starts at Tulane and has each game in 2017 with the Huskers. Senior cornerback Chris Jones who has made 20 career starts is currently sidelined by a knee injury, and his status for the 2017 season in unclear.

JAIMES JOINS RARE CLUB FOR NU OFFENSIVE LINEMEN

True freshman Brenden Jaimes earned his first career start against Rutgers. Jaimes started at right tackle where senior David Knevel and redshirt freshman Matt Farniok were both limited by injury.

A native of Austin, Texas, Jaimes became just the fifth true freshman offensive lineman to start a game at Nebraska since 1972, and the first since 2011. Jaimes is also just the 11th offensive lineman to play at Nebraska as a true freshman.

The status of Knevel and Farniok for this week's game at Illinois remains uncertain.

YOUTH DOMINATES NU ROSTER

At quarterback, Nebraska boasts one true freshman, one redshirt freshman, one sophomore and one junior. Tanner Lee is the only member of the group who has seen action at the FBS level, but he had not played a game since 2015 before taking over the starting quarterback job in 2017.

INJURIES TAKING EARLY TOLL

Nebraska has had its share of injuries early in the 2017 season. The hits started in the summer when All-America candidate cornerback Chris Jones was sidelined with a knee injury. The timetable for his return is unknown.

Nebraska has been without starters David Knevel (RT), Joshua Kalu (S) and Tre Bryant (IB) for all or part of the past three games, and saw linebacker Marcus Newby, center Cole Conrad and receiver Stanley Morgan Jr. all missed the Rutgers contest.

In addition, key reserves Bryan Reimers (WR) and Tyrin Ferguson (LB) also missed the Rutgers game, and starting safety Aaron Williams was ejected less than five minutes into the game on a targeting call.

BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE MAKING BIG STRIDES

The Nebraska defense has been impressive since halftime of week two at Oregon. Since that time, Nebraska's defense has allowed just two touchdowns and 17 points in 10 quarters, with three of those points on a field goal allowed after a Husker interception.

Against Rutgers, Nebraska allowed a 75-yard drive to start the game, but gave up just 119 yards and three points the rest of the game.

- The 194 yards of total offense by Rutgers was the fewest by a Nebraska opponent under Mike Riley, bettering the 207 yards allowed to Maryland last season. Overall, it was the fewest yards allowed by Nebraska in 47 games dating back to a win at Michigan in November of 2013, when the Blackshirts allowed 175 yards. Nebraska has recorded two of the lowest three opponent yardage totals under Mike Riley in the past two weeks (213 vs. No. Illinois).
- In the second half of the win over Rutgers, Nebraska allowed just 58 total yards, 10 rushing yards and three first downs.
- The 194 yards by Rutgers was the fifth-lowest total NU has allowed a Big Ten opponent since joining the conference in 2011.
- The 407 yards allowed the past two games by Nebraska are the fewest yards the Huskers have allowed in back-to-back games since allowing 377 yards to Minnesota and Iowa in 2012.
- Nebraska has allowed only 340 yards and just seven offensive points in the second half of its past three games combined. In the three second halves, the Blackshirts have limited opponents to just 340 yards and 16 first downs over six quarters.
- Since halftime of the Oregon game, Nebraska has forced a total of 13 three-and-out possessions.

YOUNG, WEBER TO ANCHOR LINEBACKING CORPS

Junior Dedrick Young II and senior Chris Weber serve as the anchors of Nebraska's linebacking corps in 2017. Young played on the outside the past two seasons, but has moved inside this fall to give NU a veteran tandem on the inside as the Huskers transition from a 4-3 defensive scheme to a 3-4 attack.

Young totaled 121 tackles in his first two seasons. He ranks second among all 2017 Huskers in career tackles despite his junior status. He was only the third Husker to record 100 tackles prior to his junior season. Young has 22 tackles this season and had his second career sack in the season opener against Arkansas State.

Weber is one five team captains for the 2017 season. Weber made 10 tackles at Oregon, marking his fourth career double-figure tackle game despite making just eight career starts. He has 22 total tackles on the season.

Junior Luke Gifford has held down an outside linebacker position in 2017, making his first four career starts. Through four games, Gifford leads the team with 28 tackles and closed the Rutgers game with an interception.

INJURY-RIDDLED SECONDARY RELYING ON 'NEXT MAN UP'

The Nebraska secondary suffered a significant loss this summer when senior cornerback Chris Jones went down with a knee injury. The timetable for his return remains uncertain.

The loss of Jones came on the heels of losing sophomore safety JoJo Domann during spring practice. Domann was pushing for significant playing time after seeing action as a true freshman.

The injury bug has continued to plague the secondary during the season. Senior Joshua Kalu injured his hamstring in the first half at Oregon and has missed the past 2 1/2 games. His timetable to return remains uncertain.

Kalu had started all 28 games over the past twoplus seasons. After lining up at cornerback in his first three years, Kalu moved to safety this spring.

One of five team captains, Kalu remains in position to leave his mark in the NU record book despite his injury.

- Kalu opened the season with six tackles, an interception and a pass breakup against Arkansas State. The interception was the sixth of his career and gave him at least one interception in each of his four seasons as a Husker.
- Kalu is one of only five players at Nebraska to record at least one interception in four consecutive seasons. The other players to have at least one interception in four straight seasons since World War II are Mike Brown (1996-99), Ralph Brown (1996-99), Tyrone Byrd (1989-92) and Tom Novak (1946-49).
- Kalu has 175 career tackles and is in line to become just the sixth Husker defensive back to post 200 career tackles. Had he remained at cornerback, Kalu would likely have shattered the NU cornerback record of 192 career tackles.

Junior Aaron Williams has been a stalwart in the secondary early in the season. Against Oregon, he posted a career-high 12 tackles and was part of two second-half takeaways. He registered his fourth career interception in the third quarter, before recovering a fumble in the fourth quarter. He is second on the team with 24 tackles, despite missing nearly the entire Rutgers game following a targeting penalty.

In the absence of Kalu and Williams, junior Antonio Reed and senior Kieron Williams stepped up against Rutgers. Reed had a teamhigh six tackles and an interception.

RUSHING BATTLE OFTEN HOLDS THE KEY TO SUCCESS

The 2017 season has continued a tell-tale statistic for Nebraska in the running game. Nebraska rushed for 225 yards, while holding Arkansas State to 82 yards on the ground in a 43-36 victory in the season opener.

In a 42-35 loss at Oregon, Nebraska rushed for 109 yards, while the Ducks gained 201 yards on the ground. NU picked up just 85 rushing yards in a loss to Northern Illinois, but rebounded with 197 rushing yards against Rutgers.

- Nebraska is now 16-3 under Head Coach Mike Riley when out-rushing the opposition, and has won 14 straight games when having an advantage in that category.
- In three seasons under Coach Riley, Nebraska is 9-0 when rushing for 200 yards or more, including 4-0 records in both 2015 and 2016.
- Stopping the run also keyed Nebraska victories in 2016. The Blackshirts held five opponents to 88 or fewer rushing yards last season, winning each of those five contests. NU opened by limiting Arkansas State to 82 yards on the ground. The Huskers did hold NIU to just 85 rushing yards despite losing in Lincoln, and held Rutgers to just 68 rushing yards.
- Nebraska has held its last six opponents at Memorial Stadium to 85 or fewer rushing yards, including all three foes in 2017. In its last six home games, NU has allowed a total of 355 rushing yards or 59.2 yards per game.

HUSKERS STRIVING FOR BALANCED OFFENSIVE ATTACK

The Nebraska offense will continue to strive for a balanced attack in 2017. Nebraska showed its best balance of the season against Arkansas State, and got back to a strong running game against Rutgers with 197 yards on the ground.

The Huskers rushed for 225 yards against the Red Wolves, while passing for 238 yards. It marked the first time NU had topped 200 yards in both rushing and passing since accomplishing that feat in three straight wins against Oregon, Northwestern and Illinois in 2016.

 Running back Tre Bryant rolled up 192 rushing yards, while receiver Stanley Morgan Jr. had 102 receiving yards vs. Arkansas State. It marked the first time Nebraska has had a 100-yard rusher and receiver in the same game since a 2014 victory over Illinois when Ameer Abdullah ran for 208 yards and Kenny Bell had 105 receiving Bryant and Morgan duplicated the feat at Oregon, with Bryant rushing for 107 yards and Morgan posting 103 receiving yards. This marked the first time Nebraska has had consecutive games with a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver since 1983. Heisman Trophy winner Mike Rozier and No. 1 NFL Draft pick Irving Fryar accomplished the feat against Minnesota and UCLA.

HUSKER BACKS SHARING THE LOAD IN RUN GAME

Sophomore I-back Tre Bryant earned the starting job with a strong preseason practice effort. The 5-11, 200-pound Bryant showed through two games when he was atop the depth chart.

Bryant was strong in games against Arkansas State and Oregon, topping the century mark in both contests. However, he has missed the past two games with a knee injury.

Bryant carried 31 times for 192 yards and a touchdown in the season opener. It marked the most rushing yards for a Husker in 25 games, dating back to Terrell Newby's 198 yards against South Alabama in 2015. Bryant responded with 20 carries for 107 yards and a touchdown at Oregon before leaving with an injury.

- Bryant's 31 carries against Arkansas State were the most by a Husker since Ameer Abdullah carried 35 times for 229 yards against Miami in September of 2014.
- Bryant's previous career highs were 13 carries for 56 yards against Maryland last season.
 Bryant reached those totals before halftime against Arkansas State with 13 carries for 78 yards before intermission.
- With his second straight 100-yard rushing day at Oregon, Bryant was the first Husker to post back-to-back 100-yard rushing games to start the season since Ameer Abdullah in 2013.
- Bryant's 299 rushing yards through two games was the best by a Husker since Taylor Martinez rushed for 301 yards in the first two games in 2011. Bryant's total was the most by a Husker running back since Marlon Lucky rushed for 323 yards in the first two games of 2007.
- Bryant has posted the three longest runs of his career over the first two games. He had runs of 24 and 35 yards against Arkansas State and had a 25-yard rush at Oregon.
- Bryant has been impressive on first down through two games. He is averaging 6.5 yards per carry on 36 first-down rushes. Bryant has two touchdowns and eight runs for a first down on his 36 first-down carries.
- His 192-yard effort against Arkansas State is the 20th-best rushing outing of the 2017 season in the FBS ranks.

Nebraska has continued to excel in the run game despite Bryant's absence. Mikale Wilbon rushed for 90 yards against Northern Illinois and had 78 yards vs. Rutgers. Fellow junior Devine Ozigbo posted his second career 100-yard game against the Scarlet Knights, with a careerhigh 24 carries for 101 yards.



VETERAN RECEIVING DUO LEADING PASSING ATTACK

Nebraska has the luxury of two veteran and proven pass catchers to lead the receiving corps. Senior De'Mornay Pierson-El and junior Stanley Morgan Jr. both have extensive playing experience and are off to strong starts in 2017. Morgan has 18 receptions for 299 yards and three scores, despite missing the Rutgers game. Pierson-El has caught 17 passes for 210 yards and three touchdowns.

The duo leads a receiving corps that also features a pair of explosive newcomers in redshirt freshman JD Spielman and true freshman Tyjon Lindsey.

 The 299 receiving yards by Morgan through three games was the second-most in NU history through the season's first three contests. His 18 catches through three games were the most in school history.

- Morgan opened the 2017 season with a pair of 100-yard receiving games. He is the first player in Nebraska history to have 100 receiving yards in each of the first two games. Morgan fell just shy of tying a school record with three straight 100-yard receiving games when he had six catches for 94 yards against Northern Illinois.
- The Nebraska season record for 100-yard receiving games is four by six Huskers, most recently Jordan Westerkamp in 2015.
- Morgan had seven catches for 103 yards and two touchdowns at Oregon, setting career highs in all three categories. His seven catches bettered five-reception efforts on two previous occasions. His 103 yards were one yard better than his 102 yards in the season opener.
- Morgan had touchdown catches of 28 and 18 yards at Oregon, marking his first career multiple-TD game.
- Morgan surpassed the 1,000-yard career receiving mark with his effort against Northern Illinois. Morgan is the 25th Husker to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards, and ranks 24th in NU history with 1,056 career yards.
- Morgan was Nebraska's second-leading receiver last season with 33 catches for 453 yards and a pair of touchdowns.
- Pierson-El earned All-America honors as a punt returner in 2014 and has continued to grow as a receiver. He had a 12-yard touchdown against Arkansas State in the opener. Pierson-El added four catches for 67 yards and a touchdown at Oregon. He tied his career high with eight

receptions against Northern Illinois, while his 101 receiving yards, was just one shy of his career best. He added his third touchdown catch of the season on an 8-yard catch against Rutgers.

- Pierson-El is poised to quickly join Morgan in the 1,000-yard club. Pierson-El has 72 receptions for 896 yards in his NU career.
- Pierson-El is a versatile performer who is an electrifying punt returner and is used in the NU run game. Against Arkansas State, he rushed two times for 23 yards and narrowly missed a 71-yard touchdown run as he just stepped out of bounds. He had his 12th career punt return of at least 25 yards, with a 63-yarder against Rutgers to set up a touchdown. The 63-yard return was the third-longest of his career.
- Pierson-El has 881 career punt return yards, putting him in position to be the third Husker with 1,000 career punt return yards. His yardage total is third among active FBS players.

LEE BRINGS PASSING TALENT TO NEBRASKA OFFENSE

Quarterback Tanner Lee posted three consecutive 200-yard passing games to begin his Nebraska career.

The 6-4, 220-pound Lee became just the third opening-day starting quarterback for the Huskers since 2010, joining Taylor Martinez and Tommy Armstrong Jr.

Lee threw for a Nebraska-best 299 yards against Northern Illinois, and also ran for two touchdowns against the Huskies. He had thrown for 252 yards and three touchdowns a week earlier at Oregon.

- Lee was the first Nebraska quarterback to throw for 200 yards in their first three Nebraska starts since Joe Ganz did so in his first five starts spanning the 2007 and 2008 seasons.
- The 238 passing yards by Lee vs. ASU were the third-most by an NU quarterback in their starting debut. The yardage total trailed only Ryker Fyfe (407 yards at Purdue, 2015) and Joe Ganz (405 yards at Kansas, 2007). Lee's 238 yards were the most passing yards by a first-time starter in a Husker win.
- Lee has made 23 collegiate starts, including 19 as the starting quarterback at Tulane in 2014 and 2015.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS

Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as Nebraska's head coach.

GATES CONTINUES TO HOLD DOWN LEFT SIDE OF O-LINE

Junior Nick Gates is the most game-tested of a veteran Nebraska offensive line. The five regular starters on the offensive front all had at least four career starts entering the 2017 season and all five are in at least their fourth year in the program.

- Gates leads the way with 27 career starts, all at left tackle. His 27 starts are the most of any offensive player.
- Gates has started 21 consecutive games at left tackle. The streak is the longest by a Husker at the position Richie Incognito started 22 straight games at the spot in 2002-03.

The stability of Gates at left tackle has been important early in the season, as injuries have forced Nebraska to start three players at right tackle. Against Rutgers, Nebraska started true freshman Brenden Jaimes at right tackle.

SENIOR KICKER DREW BROWN CONTINUES FAMILY TRADITION

Place-kicker Drew Brown is in his final season with the Huskers after three solid seasons as a starter. One of the nation's top kickers since 2014, Brown earned honorable-mention All-Big Ten recognition in 2016 and was a second-team all-conference pick in 2015. Brown will be a leading contender for the Lou Groza Award and other conference and national honors in 2017.

Brown has made 5-of-6 field goals this season and is a perfect 15-of-15 on extra-point attempts.

Brown connected on 12-of-14 field goals in 2016, including 9-of-10 over the final six games. Brown had a streak of 13 straight made field goals prior to a miss against Illinois last season. The 13 straight field goals marked the third-longest streak in Nebraska history.

- Brown made a pair of fourth-quarter field goals against Rutgers, giving him 52 career field goals. He is third in school history in that category, five behind his brother, Kris, for second on the NU career field goals list. Drew Brown trails career record holder Alex Henery by 16 field goals.
- Brown has 312 career points to rank in a tie for fifth in NU history. He is on pace to finish third in school history in scoring and could challenge his older brother for second place on the scoring list at 388 points. Alex Henery holds the school record with 397 career points.
- Brown's 312 career points are sixth among active Football Bowl Subdivision Players.
- Brown connected on a career-long 51-yard field goal against Purdue last season and has made 20 field goals of at least 40 yards in his career. He is 18-of-25 in his career from 40-49 yards.
- Brown scored 107 points as a sophomore after posting a freshman-record 101 points in 2014. He was the first player in NU history with 100-point seasons as both a freshman and sophomore.
- Brown's 21 field goals in 2015 were second on the NU season list. He made each of his last 11 attempts that season.

 Brown made five field goals against Southern Miss in 2015, all in the first half. The five field goals in a half tied an NCAA record. The five field goals were the most ever by a Husker in Lincoln, and tied a Memorial Stadium record held by two opposing kickers.

HUSKERS STRIVING FOR SPECIAL TEAMS CONSISTENCY

Nebraska has had several bright spots in its special teams play in 2017. In addition to Drew Brown's continued strong place-kicking Nebraska made strong statements in the return and punting game through three games.

- Redshirt freshman JD Spielman had a 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the first quarter of the season opener against Arkansas State. His return tied for the fifthlongest in school history and was the first kickoff return score by a Husker since Kenny Bell had a 99-yarder at Penn State in 2013. Spielman averages 38.8 yards per kickoff return to rank fifth in the nation.
- Sophomore punter Caleb Lightbourn posted one of his best days as a Husker against Northern Illinois. He averaged a career-best 47.3 yards on six punts, including four punts of at least 50 yards. Lightbourn booted a career-long 64-yard punt against Rutgers, and has seven punts of at least 50 yards in 2017. He has pinned the opposition inside the 20 yard line nine times. Lightbourn is averaging 42.3 yards per punt to rank seventh in the Big Ten.

NEBRASKA LOOKS TO CLIMB IN TURNOVER MARGIN

Nebraska was one of the nation's top teams in 2016 in protecting the football. The Huskers committed just 14 turnovers in 13 games. As a result of the ball security, Nebraska was a +5 in turnover margin, the Huskers' first positive turnover margin since 2009. Nebraska has had mixed results in the turnover area in 2017.

- The Huskers were turnover-free against Arkansas State, while intercepting two Red Wolves' passes.
- Over the past three games, Nebraska has been a combined -4 in turnover margin. NU did force two second-half Rutgers turnovers to help secure a 10-point win.
- Nebraska has won 20 consecutive games when it has a positive turnover margin dating back to a 2011 loss to Northwestern. NU is 8-0 under Mike Riley when winning the turnover battle.



FIVE PLAYERS ELECTED AS 2017 TEAM CAPTAINS

Five players are serving as 2017 captains as voted by their teammates. The group consists of three seniors and two juniors, and three players on offense and two defenders. The 2017 captains also include three Nebraska natives and two players who began their career as walk-ons before earning scholarships.

- The three Nebraska natives (Foster, McNitt, Weber) to be named captains are the most in-state captains since Nebraska also had three in-state captains in 2001 (Eric Crouch, Jeremy Slechta, Dave Volk). The Huskers have had at least one Nebraska native as a captain for 12 consecutive seasons.
- Foster is the third captain from Lincoln in four seasons, joining Jake Cotton (2014) and Josh Banderas (2016).
- A Husker offensive lineman has served as a captain for five straight seasons. Foster joins Spencer Long (2013), Jake Cotton (2014), Alex Lewis (2015) and Dylan Utter (2016).
- Kalu is the fifth defensive back to be a captain since 2013, joining Ciante Evans (2013), Corey Cooper (2014), Josh Mitchell (2014) and Nathan Gerry (2015, 2016).
- McNitt and Weber are the fourth and fifth players since 2013 to earn the role of a captain after starting their career as a walkon. They join Spencer Long (2013), Jack Gangwish (2015) and Dylan Utter (2016) in that group.
- McNitt is the first fullback to serve as a captain since Judd Davies in 2003.
- Lee's selection marks the fourth time in six seasons a quarterback has served as a Husker captain, joining Taylor Martinez (2012, 2013) and Tommy Armstrong Jr. (2015).

NEBRASKA WALK-ON TRADITION CONTINUES

Mike Riley placed six former walk-ons on scholarship before the start of the season. Five of the six members of the group are fifth-year seniors and four are Nebraska natives.

Nebraska has a long tradition of relying on its walk-on program to help build the foundation of the program. Six walk-ons have gone on to earn first-team All-America honors for Nebraska, while 13 walk-ons have earned first-team academic All-America recognition.

2017 HUSKERS FEATURE PROMINENT FATHERS

Husker fans could see some famous faces at Nebraska games this fall, as three freshmen feature prominent fathers.

- Redshirt freshman JD Spielman is the adopted son of Minnesota Vikings General Manager Rick Spielman, and JD's uncle is former Ohio State All-America linebacker and NFL standout Chris Spielman, who now serves as an NFL analyst for Fox Sports.
- Freshman fullback Ben Miles is the son of former national championship head coach Les Miles. Les compiled a 141-55 record in 15 seasons as a head coach at Oklahoma State and LSU. He led the Tigers to the 2007 national title and an appearance in the 2011 BCS National Championship Game.
- Freshman wide receiver Kade Warner is the son of former two-time NFL MVP Kurt Warner. In addition to a distinguished Arena Football League career, Kurt enjoyed a 12-year NFL career with the St. Louis Rams and the Arizona Cardinals. He threw for more than 32,000 yards in his career and ranks seventh in NFL history with an average of 260.8 passing yards per game. Kurt was also a four-time Pro Bowler, a two-time NFL MVP (1999 & 2001) and the Super Bowl XXXIV MVP. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2017.

NU LOOKS TO REMAIN AMONG ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Nebraska averaged 90,200 fans for seven home games in 2016 to rank 10th nationally in average attendance. That marked the fourth straight year Nebraska ranked 11th or higher in average attendance. NU averaged 89,998 fans for its seven games in 2015, to rank 11th in the nation and fourth among Big Ten schools.

In 2014, Nebraska was 10th in home attendance with 91,249 fans per game. The average attendance for seven home games was the largest ever at Memorial Stadium, bettering the 2013 mark of 90,933 per game. NU has ranked in the top 20 nationally in attendance each of the 18 years with available attendance figures.

NCAA-RECORD SELLOUT STREAK ROLLS INTO 2017

One of the most remarkable streaks in college sports continues in 2017. Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, a streak of 357 consecutive sellouts, 99 more than second-place Notre Dame.

- Nebraska owns a 305-52 (.854) record during the sellout streak.
- The overall attendance during the streak is nearly 27 million fans.

Nebraska has rewarded the loyalty of its fans with great success at Memorial Stadium.

- Nebraska has won at least six home games in 24 of the past 30 seasons, including 2016. NU is 171-29 (.855) at home since 1989.
- NU was 7-0 at home in 2016, marking the Huskers' first perfect home season since 2012.
- The Huskers are 18-7 in Big Ten home games since joining the league in 2011.
- In the past three decades, NU has had three home winning streaks of 20 or more games and has posted 41 unbeaten and untied home
- The Huskers are 540-148-20 (.777, 708 games, 128 years) in Lincoln, and 415-125-13 (.762, 553 games, 94 years) in Memorial Stadium (since

NEBRASKA TO HONOR 1997 NATIONAL TITLE TEAM

Nebraska will celebrate the 20th anniversary of the 1997 national championship team this season, culminating with a team reunion on Oct. 7 when the Huskers host Wisconsin at Memorial Stadium.

- The 1997 Huskers (13-0) won the fifth national title in school history and third in four years. Nebraska was voted No. 1 in the coaches' poll, while Michigan (12-0) was voted No. 1 in the Associated Press poll.
- The 1997 season marked Tom Osborne's final season on the Husker sideline, as the Hall-of-Fame coach capped his career with a 42-17 win over No. 3 Tennessee in the Orange Bowl. Osborne ended his 25-year career with a 255-49-3 record, 13 conference championships and three national titles.
- Nebraska's senior class capped a remarkable run with its 1997 national title. In their four seasons, the Husker seniors compiled a 49-2 record with three undefeated national championship seasons.

EIGHT HUSKER GREATS ADDED TO RETIRED JERSEY GROUP

Nebraska Athletics Department posthumously honored eight members of the College Football Hall of Fame by adding them to a prestigious group of former Cornhuskers with retired jerseys.

The group of eight Hall of Fame players now have their names displayed on the façade of the North Stadium. They were honored at the season opener against Arkansas State. The uniform numbers of those retired jerseys will continue to be used, but the eight names will join 17 other former Huskers with their jerseys retired.

Nebraska College Football Hall of Fame players added to the retired jersey fraternity include Guy Chamberlin, Ed Weir, Clarence Swanson, George Sauer, Sam Francis, Forrest Behm, Bobby Reynolds and Wayne Meylan.

NEBRASKA AMONG NATION'S TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is in its 128th season of college football and owns an 891-374-40 all-time record in 1,305 games (.698). Since 1970, NU has a 457-132-5 record (.774).

- Nebraska is one of 10 programs with 800 alltime victories, ranking fourth in NCAA history with 890 wins.
- Nebraska is the nation's winningest program over the last 40, 50 and 60 years.
- Nebraska was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

NEBRASKA AMONG LEADERS IN NATIONAL TITLES

Nebraska has won five national titles in program history - all since 1970 - as the Huskers have won the second-most national titles since 1970. NU also ranks highly in most Associated Press national championship and most coaches' poll national titles. The Huskers have won four AP and four coaches' poll national championships. In 1997, Nebraska was crowned national champion by the coaches, but NU finished second to Michigan in the AP poll. In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the AP national title, but Texas was No. 1 in the coaches' poll, as the coaches released their final poll prior to the bowl games. Texas lost its bowl games, while Nebraska defeated No. 5 LSU.

HUSKERS RANK NEAR TOP OF ALL-TIME AP RANKING

The Associated Press weekly poll began in 1936 and has been a fixture in college football ever since. In August of 2016 the AP released an alltime top 100 for the first time, ranking programs over the 80-year history of the poll. The poll was updated following the 2016 campaign.

Nebraska checks in at No. 6 in the all-time rankings and is one of three Big Ten programs in the top seven in the poll. Nebraska has appeared in 65 percent of all polls since 1936 and has been ranked No. 1 in 72 polls.

A HOLIDAY TRADITION

Nebraska participated in its 53rd all-time bowl game with its appearance in the 2016 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

Nebraska is one of only five programs with 50 or more bowl appearances, and its 53 bowl appearances are tied for second nationally, trailing only Alabama (63).

- The Huskers have played in the postseason in 46 of the past 48 seasons.
- Nebraska appeared in an NCAA-record 35

HUSKERS IN THE NFL

Nebraska has a long-standing tradition of being one of the leading programs in putting players into the National Football League.



Twenty-five Huskers are currently on NFL rosters, including 18 on active 53-man rosters. Another three plyaers are on NFL practice squads with three players on injured reserve.

The group is led four-time All-Pro and five-time Pro Bowl selection Ndamukong Suh who is in his third season with the Miami Dolphins. Linebacker Lavonte David is a captain of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and has more than 650 tackles in five NFL seasons. David is a two-time All-Pro.

- Nebraska has had more than 400 players see action in the National Football League.
- At least one Husker has been selected in 55 consecutive NFL Drafts, the fifth-longest streak in NFL history.
- Two or more Huskers were taken in every NFL Draft from 1963 to 2016, the longest such streak in Draft history.
- A former Husker has appeared on a Super Bowl roster for 24 consecutive years, the longest streak in the nation.
- Since 1997, Nebraska ranks second in the Big Ten Conference with 89 NFL draftees.

2017 SEASON NOTEBOOK SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska will play seven games against teams that played in a bowl game last year, including Ohio State (Fiesta Bowl - College Football Playoff Semifinal), Penn State (Rose Bowl) and Wisconsin (Cotton Bowl), all of which played in a New Year's Six Bowl last season.
- The Huskers will face three teams who won 11 games last season in Ohio State (11-2), Penn State (11-3) and Wisconsin (11-3). All three of those teams also finished the 2016 season with a top-10 ranking in the AP poll, as Ohio State was sixth, Penn State was seventh and Wisconsin was ninth.
- Nebraska will play five conference home games for the first time in program history this fall, as all seven Big Ten West Division teams will play five league games at home and four on the road.
- Five of Nebraska's seven home games are against teams who qualified for a bowl game last season, including each of the final four home games.
- In Big Ten play, NU will travel to Illinois (Sept. 29), Purdue (Oct. 28), Minnesota (Nov. 11) and Penn State (Nov. 18). The Huskers will be seeking their first win at Illinois since 1986 and first win at Purdue since 1958.
- The 2017 Big Ten Championship Game is scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 2 at 7 p.m. on FOX. The game will be played at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, the site of each of the first six Big Ten Championship Games. Nebraska made its lone appearance in the championship game in 2012.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Head Coach Mike Riley is in his 17th season as a collegiate head coach in 2017. Riley's 17 years of experience rank ninth nationally among all active FBS head coaches.
- Nebraska's 10 full-time head coaches boast a combined 190 years of collegiate coaching experience, including 113 seasons in Power Five Conferences.
- The Husker staff also features four coaches with a combined 14 years of NFL coaching experience including Mike Riley (three seasons as an NFL head coach and one season as an NFL assistant coach), Reggie Davis (four seasons as an NFL assistant), Danny Langsdorf (four seasons as an NFL assistant) and Mike Cavanaugh (two seasons as an NFL assistant).
- Nebraska welcomes three new additions to its full-time coaching staff for the 2017 season.
 Bob Diaco takes over as the Huskers' defensive coordinator, while Scott Booker will coach NU's safeties and Donté Williams - whose Nebraska debut came in the 2016 Music City Bowl - will tutor the Husker cornerbacks.
- Bob Elliott (1953-2017) passed away in July after being hired in February to coach the Husker safeties. The Nebraska coaching staff will honor Elliott by wearing a game day patch with the initials "BE".



ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska's 2017 roster features players from 28 states and one Canadian province.
- The Huskers have 48 homegrown Nebraska players on the 2017 roster.
- The roster includes seven additional states with at least four players. The Huskers have eight players from both California and Florida, seven from Louisiana and Texas, six from Missouri and four each from Colorado and Illinois.
- Nebraska's 2017 freshman class features players from 15 states, including multiple players from Nebraska (15), California (2), Florida (2) and Texas (2).
- NU could have its first-ever letterwinner from the state of Delaware this fall, as linebacker Avery Roberts (Wilmington, Del.) has seen the field as a true freshman this season after enrolling at Nebraska in January. The Huskers have had a letterwinner from 45 of the 50 states (every state except Delaware, Idaho, Kentucky, New Hampshire and Rhode Island).
- Nebraska features a 129-player roster. The roster is unofficially the third-largest roster in the country behind Army (174) and Navy (173).
- Nearly two-thirds of the Huskers' 2017 roster are underclassmen, as 81 of Nebraska's 129 players are either freshmen or sophomores.

ACADEMIC NOTES

- Nebraska has always placed an emphasis on academic success, as the Husker football program has produced more CoSIDA Academic All-Americans than any other sport in NCAA history. With that emphasis, it has become a trend in recent years for many NU football players to earn their degree before playing in their final game.
- Three Huskers fullback Harrison Jordan, defensive lineman Joel Lopez and wide receiver Gabe Rahn - will play the 2017 season as graduate students.
- As many as 17 Huskers could earn their degree by the end of the fall semester. That would continue an impressive recent early graduation trend for Nebraska, as 39 of the 50 players in Mike Riley's first two senior classes obtained their degree before playing in their final game.



THE ILLINOIS FIGHTING ILLINI

Illinois is just one victory away from matching last year's win total, as the Fighting Illini are 2-1 in **Lovie Smith's** second season. Illinois was off last week and has not played since a 47-23 road loss at No. 22 South Florida on Sept. 15. The Fighting Illini are opening their Big Ten schedule with Nebraska for the fifth straight season. Illinois features one

of the youngest teams in the country, as the Illini had started more true freshmen (9) than any team in the nation and played more true freshmen (17) than any team except LSU through the first three weeks of the season.

Illinois is last in the Big Ten and 119th nationally in total offense (290 yards per game), including 110 rushing yards per game (110th nationally) and 180 passing yards per game (102nd). Defensively, Illinois is allowing 433 yards of total offense per game to rank last in the Big Ten and 100th nationally. The Illini have forced five turnovers and rank 38th nationally with an average of nearly three sacks per game.

Mike Epstein is the Illini's leading rusher with 221 yards, including a 111-yard effort against Western Kentucky in his last home game. Quarterback **Chayce Crouch** is the Illini's second-leading rusher with 56 yards through three games. Through the air, Crouch is completing 51.6 percent of his passes and has thrown for 328 yards with one touchdown and three interceptions. **Mike Dudek** leads Illinois with 14 catches and 158 receiving yards.

Defensively, **Del'Shawn Phillips** leads Illinois with 32 tackles, and his 10.7 tackles per game are second in the Big Ten and 16th nationally. **Bobby Roundtree** has recorded 3.0 sacks in three games, ranking 12th nationally in sacks per game.

NEBRASKA VS. ILLINOIS SERIES HISTORY

Nebraska owns a 10-3-1 all-time record against Illinois, and the Huskers have won five of the past six meetings, including three of the first four contests as Big Ten Conference foes. In Nebraska's last trip to Illinois in 2015, Wes Lunt threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Geronimo Allison with 10 seconds remaining and Taylor Zalewski converted the extra point to lift the Fighting Illini to a 14-13 win. That game - Nebraska's only visit to Champaign since joining the Big Ten in 2011 - marked the Huskers' first loss to the Fighting Illini since 1924.

ABOUT ILLINOIS FOOTBALL

Like Nebraska, Illinois is a five-time national champion, although the Fighting Illini's last title came in 1951. Illinois has claimed 15 Big Ten titles in its history, most recently in 2001. The Illini's last Big Ten Conference victory - a 31-27 win over Michigan State last November - marked the 600th all-time win in program history. Illinois has appeared in 18 bowl games, most recently a 20-14 win over UCLA in the 2011 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl.

Lincoln (Sept. 2) --- Sophomore I-back Tre Bryant erupted for a career-high 192 yards on 31 carries to pace Nebraska to a 43-36 win over Arkansas State in the season opener for both

Bryant had 114 of his yards in the second half, as Nebraska built a 14-point fourth quarter lead and weathered a frantic finish. Leading 43-29 after a Husker safety, ASU's Justice Hansen hit Kendrick Edwards on a three-vard touchdown pass with 47 seconds left to pull the Red Wolves within 43-36. Arkansas State then recovered an on-side kick to keep its upset hopes alive. The Red Wolves drove to the 11-vard line with 11 seconds remaining



before the Blackshirts preserved the win. On first down, Lamar Jackson broke up a pass in the end zone intended for Justin McInnis, before Hansen threw too high to Edwards on the game's final play.

Hansen set the Arkansas State record and tied the Nebraska individual opponent passing record by completing 46 throws on a Nebraska opponent-record-tying 68 attempts. He finished with 415 passing yards and three touchdowns, but he also threw a pair of costly interceptions.

Husker quarterback Tanner Lee led a balanced NU attack, completing 19-of-32 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns without committing a turnover, as Nebraska threw for 238 and rushed for 225. Stanley Morgan led the Huskers with five catches for 102 yards to set career bests in both categories. Freshman JD Spielman accounted for 143 all-purpose yards, highlighted by a 99-yard kickoff return in the first quarter. Six Huskers had multiple catches on the evening.

Leading 27-26 at the half, Bryant took over for the Huskers in the third quarter. His one-yard touchdown run with 11:14 left in the third quarter pushed Nebraska's lead to 34-26, before the Blackshirts slowed down the Red Wolves by allowing just 43 yards in the third quarter. The Huskers extended their lead to 41-26 early in the fourth quarter on an eight-yard pass from Lee to senior De'Mornay Pierson-El to cap a six-play, 53-yard drive with 12:25 left in the game.



Eugene, Ore. (Sept. 9) -- Nebraska's defense held Oregon scoreless on seven straight possessions in the second half to spur a furious rally, but the Ducks forced four turnovers, including a clinching interception in the final two minutes and held on for a 42-35 victory at Autzen Stadium.

NU trailed 42-14 at halftime but scored on its first two possessions of the second half to stay in the game. The Husker defense forced two turnovers and another turnover on downs to redeem themselves from a first half in which Oregon amassed 409 yards.

Antonio Reed forced a fumble by running back Royce Freeman that linebacker Aaron Williams recovered at the Oregon 22-yard line, and it led to a Mikale Wilbon 2-vard touchdown run to pull Nebraska within seven with 2:47 remaining.

The Huskers used their three time outs in forcing a three-and-out and regained possession with 2:17 remaining on the Nebraska 43yard line. But on the first play from scrimmage, Oregon cornerback



Justin Herbert completed 25 of 33 passes for 365 yards and three touchdowns, and Freeman ran 29 times for 153 yards and two touchdowns, as the Ducks amassed 566 total yards, but only 157 came in the second half.

Oregon scored on its first possession before a Husker turnover led to another Ducks touchdown just 3:31 into the game. Nebraska settled in and went on a 10-play, 95-yard drive capped by DeMornay Pierson-El's 23-yard touchdown catch. Nebraska eventually pulled to within 21-14 after a Tre Bryant touchdown run early in the second quarter, but Oregon took control with 21 straight points to close the half.

Lee directed two scoring drives, sandwiched around a three-and-out by the defense, to start the second half. On the second play of the half, Lee hit Pierson-El for a 34-yard pass to get the Huskers into Oregon territory. On 4th-and-10. Morgan gained 22 yards on a catch-and-run, and then hauled in an 18-yard touchdown pass on the next play. Morgan finished with career highs of seven receptions and 103 yards to increase his career total to 962 receiving yards

NU's next drive began at the Husker 47-yard line. This time, Bryant paced the Huskers with rushes of 12, 8 and 5 yards, before Lee found Morgan for a 28-yard touchdown, pulling Nebraska within 42-28.

Lincoln (Sept. 16) — Nebraska put up 171 more yards of total offense than Northern Illinois, but the Huskies used three interceptions, including a pair of first-quarter pick sixes, to defeat the Huskers, 21-17. The loss snapped Nebraska's eight-game home winning streak.

Nebraska quarterback Tanner Lee completed 25-of-47 passes for 299 yards on the day, but he threw a trio of interceptions and was sacked three times. After Nebraska drove quickly down the field on the opening drive, NIU's Shawun Lurry jumped a wide receiver screen and raced 87 yards for a touchdown to give the Huskies an early 7-0 lead. Later in the quarter, Jawuan Johnson picked off another Lee pass and scampered 25 yards to put NIU up 14-0.



While the offense was unable to get untracked, the Blackshirts played solid on defense to keep the Northern Illinois

offense off the board in the first half. In fact, Nebraska out-yarded NIU, 201-88, in the half and ran 43 plays compared to just 25 for the Huskies.

The Huskers got on the scoreboard midway through the third quarter, as Lee scored on a four-yard run after Marquel Dismuke recovered a muffed NIU punt at the 2-yard line. Nebraska cut the margin to 14-10 with 15 seconds left in the third quarter on Drew Brown's 36-yard field goal to finish a 15-play, 71-yard drive. The Huskers then took their first lead of the day on Lee's one-yard touchdown run with 11:14 left in the game to cap a six-play, 63-yard march by the Big Red.

However, Nebraska's lead was short-lived, as Northern Illinois quarterback Daniel Santcaterina moved the Huskies 75 yards in just six plays to put NIU back in front 21-17 with 8:52 remaining.

Nebraska had two chances to answer down the stretch, the first drive ended with an incomplete pass on 4th-and-7 at the NIU 33 with 5:31 left. The Blackshirts got another stop with 3:09 left, but Lee was intercepted for the third time on 4th-and-14 from the Nebraska 16 with 1:36 left.

NU I-back Mikale Wilbon led the Nebraska backs with 90 yards on 24 carries. De'Mornay Pierson-El led Nebraska's receivers with 101 yards on a career-high eight receptions while Stanley Morgan Jr. added six catches for 94 yards to go over 1,000 yards receiving in his career.

Jordan Huff led the Northern Illinois running game with 105 yards and a touchdown on just 16 carries, while Santacaterina threw for 128 yards on 15-of-22 passing to improve to 2-0 as a starter for the Huskies this season.

Lincoln (Sept. 23) -- Nebraska's defense produced another strong effort, while the offense used a powerful ground game fueled by Devine Ozigbo and Mikale Wilbon to claim a 27-17 win over Rutgers

Nebraska dominated the second half on both sides of the ball, erasing a 17-14 deficit in the opening minutes of the second half following Kiy Hester's interception return for a TD off Tanner Lee.

Two drives later, Lee led the Huskers on a massive 17-play, 97-yard march that consumed 8:10 and culminated with his



eight-yard touchdown strike to De'Mornay Pierson-El with 2:49 left in the third quarter.

While the Husker offense assumed control, the Blackshirts continued to show consistent improvement on defense. After allowing Rutgers to open the game 2-for-2 on third-down conversions on an 11-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by a Gus Edwards two-yard touchdown run, the Blackshirts forced the Scarlet Knights to go without a conversion on their next eight third-down attempts.

The Blackshirts also provided a big play of their own late in the third quarter with Antonio Reed's interception and 19-yard return. Nebraska converted the turnover into points five plays later on Drew Brown's 32-yard field goal with 14:10 left.

Then Ozigbo, who had two carries in NU's first three games, took over. The junior carried nine times for 42 yards on a game-clinching 12-play, 50-yard drive to set up Brown's 27-yard field goal.

Ozigbo finished the game with a career-high 24 carries for 101 yards, including 19 carries for 85 yards in the second half. Ozigbo and starter Mikale Wilbon led a Big Red rushing binge that racked up 197 yards on 47 carries against the Rutgers defense. Wilbon finished with 78 yards and a touchdown

JD Spielman added a career-best five receptions for 46 yards and a score to lead Nebraska's air attack, as his 18-yard touchdown reception on a Lee pass with 6:52 left in the first quarter tied the game at 7-7. Pierson-El contributed three catches for 22 yards and a touchdown, which gave Nebraska the lead for good at 21-17 with 2:49 left in the third quarter. Pierson-El also gave Nebraska's its biggest play of the day with his 63-yard punt return midway through the second quarter to set up Wilbon's scoring run.

For the game, Nebraska finished with 306 yards of total offense on 73 plays while accumulating 35:21 of possession time. The Blackshirts held the Scarlet Knights to just 194 total yards on just 53 plays, including just 68 rushing yards on 24 carries.
