GENERAL POLICIES

All player and coach interviews must be arranged at least one day in advance through the Nebraska Communications Office. Contact Keith Mann, Shamus McKnight, Matt Smith or Jeremy Foote. All postpractice interviews will be conducted at the practice site. Interviews will not be conducted in the weight room, Student Life Complex, training room, hallways or the tunnel leading from the locker room to the field. The Nebraska locker room, training room and football office meeting rooms are OFF-LIMITS to the media. When arriving for post-practice interviews, media should wait in the Hawks Center lobby, or access Memorial Stadium through Gate 11 entrance if practice is in the stadium.

Requested players are available (depending on class schedules) at the Monday press conferences (11:30 a.m.-1 p.m.) and after practice on the field on Tuesday (defense) and Wednesday (offense). Players cell phone numbers will NOT be given to the media.

Practices are CLOSED to the media and to the general public during the season. Media will be allowed to shoot photos/video at the start of practice on Tuesdays (app. 15 minutes). A Communications representative will be on hand during the open portion of practice.

After all games, Nebraska's locker room is closed. Head Coach Mike Riley, coordinators and requested players will be brought to the postgame interview room after a 10-minute cooling off period. At home, the postgame interview room is located in the strength complex of the Osborne Athletic Complex. Media are asked to wait to set up equipment until the conclusion of halftime. On the road, Coach Riley, assistant coaches and requested players will be brought to the designated interview area. Please note, NO INTERVIEWS will be conducted on the field as the players are returning to the locker room.

NEBRASKA SHOOTS FOR HOMECOMING SUCCESS

This weekend will mark Homecoming on the UNL Campus in Lincoln. The matchup with Illinois will be Nebraska's 106th Homecoming game. The Huskers own an all-time record of 79-22-4 (.771 winning percentage) in Homecoming games.

• Nebraska has won its past seven Homecoming games, including wins over Illinois in 2013 and 2014. Nebraska won 36 straight Homecoming games from 1969 to 2004.

RILEY, SMITH AMONG NATION'S MOST EXPERIENCED COACHES

Nebraska Head Coach Mike Riley and Illinois head man Lovie Smith are among a group of six current FBS head coaches who were NFL head coaches at one time in their career.

- Smith (11 years) and Riley (9 years) have more professional coaching experience than any other coaches in the college ranks. In addition to three years as the head coach of the San Diego Chargers, Riley was a head coach in the CFL and WLAF. Smith spent 11 years as an NFL head coach.
- Riley and Smith did not meet as NFL coaches. Riley served as an NFL head coach from 1999 to 2001, while Smith was an NFL head coach from 2004-12 and 2014-15.
- The meeting of two former NFL head coaches is one of just two such matchups in the college ranks this season. Illinois will play Michigan and Head Coach Jim Harbaugh on Oct. 22.

HUSKERS CLIMB RANKINGS

Nebraska entered the national polls at No. 20 following its 35-32 victory over then-No. 22 Oregon on Sept. 17. After passing its first road test of the season at Northwestern, the Huskers climbed to No. 15 in the Associated Press Poll and 15th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

• The No. 15 ranking in the AP poll is the highest for the Huskers since late in the 2014 season when Nebraska was ranked 11th with an 8-1 record.

RILEY JOINS 100-WIN CLUB IN SEASON-OPENING VICTORY

Nebraska Head Coach Mike Riley earned his 100th win as a collegiate head coach in the 43-10 win over Fresno State in the season opener. Riley won 93 games in 14 seasons at Oregon State and has 10 victories at Nebraska.

- Riley is one of 23 active FBS head coaches with 100 career college victories.
- All 103 of Riley's victories have come while coaching in a Power Five Conference. Riley is one of 10 active coaches to win 100 games at a Power Five Conference school.

NOTING GAME 4

- Nebraska's win marked the fifth time in six games in the Nebraska-Northwestern series that the road team has been victorious.
- Quarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr. rushed for a career-high 132 yards, bettering his 131 yards vs. McNeese State in 2014. Armstrong increased his career rushing total to 1,588 yards to become the seventh NU quarterback with more than 1,500 career rushing yards.
- Nebraska improved to 7-0 under Mike Riley when rushing for at least 200 yards, including 3-0 in 2016. The 310 rushing yards was the second-highest total for Nebraska in the past two seasons.
- Stanley Morgan Jr. tied his career high with four receptions, matching his four catches at Miami in 2015.
- Senior I-back Terrell Newby had a 49-yard run in the first quarter, marking the Huskers' longest rush of the 2016 campaign.
- Senior defensive tackle Kevin Maurice had two sacks for 12 yards, with the sacks coming on consecutive plays in the second quarter. Maurice had 1.5 career sacks prior to the game.
- Sophomore Mikale Wilbon established career highs with six carries for 55 yards, including a career-long 32-yard run.
- Jordan Westerkamp scored on a 10-yard run in the third quarter, his first career rushing touchdown. Westerkamp had just two previous career rushing attempts.
- Alonzo Moore had a 59-yard reception in the second quarter, his third catch of more than 50 yards this season.

BIG RED BALANCING ACT

The Nebraska offense is showing outstanding explosiveness and balance in its second season under Head Coach Mike Riley and offensive coordinator Danny Langsdorf. The 2016 success comes a year after Nebraska ranked second in the Big Ten in total offense and passing offense, while finishing third in scoring offense.

Riley and his staff made a powerful running game and a balanced offense primary goals for 2016. Through four games the results have been outstanding.

- Nebraska is averaging 242.0 rushing yards per game to rank third in the Big Ten and 21st nationally. NU had a season-high 310 rushing yards at Northwestern and has rushed for at least 200 yards in three of four games.
- Nebraska is among the nation's most balanced offensive attacks. The Huskers' average 243.0 passing yards per game and 485.0 total yards per game, which ranks 23rd in the nation.
- Nebraska's 310 rushing yards at Northwestern was the Huskers' fifth-highest rushing total in a Big Ten Conference game.
- The 556 yards of total offense at Northwestern marked the second-highest total in a Big Ten Conference game in NU's six seasons in the league, trailing only a 624-yard effort against Illinois in 2014.
- Nebraska was held to 24 points at Northwestern, but has topped 28 points in nine of its past 11 games.
- Nebraska is averaging 38.5 points per game in 2016 to rank fifth in the Big Ten. The 52 points against Wyoming were the most in two seasons under Mike Riley.
- Nebraska passed for 266.9 yards per game to rank second in the conference in 2015. Nebraska has averaged 243.0 passing yards this season to rank third in the Big Ten.
- Nebraska topped the 300-yard passing mark for the seventh time in two seasons under Mike Riley with 412 passing yards against Wyoming. The yardage total was the fifth highest in school history and most since the 2007 season.
- Nebraska has also shown big-play ability again this season. Nebraska's 15.7 yards per completion ranks 12th in the nation. The Huskers had five passing plays of at least 25 yards against Wyoming. Last season, NU's 78 plays of 20-plus yards ranked second in the Big Ten.
- In addition to its 310-yard rushing effort at Northwestern, the Huskers rushed for 292 yards on 51 carries in the win over Fresno State. NU also had 228 rushing yards against Oregon, including 166 after half.

POUNDING BALL ON GROUND

Nebraska has shown the ability to control the running game on both sides of the ball in 2016.

Nebraska out-gained Northwestern 310-137 on the ground, marking the third time in its past five games the Huskers have had at least 290 rushing yards. NU churned out 292 rushing yards on 51 carries in its season-opening victory over Fresno State. That rushing effort came on the heels of running for 326 yards in the Foster Farms Bowl win over UCLA to close the 2015 season.

The Blackshirts have been strong against the run in three of four games, limiting Fresno State to just 31 rushing yards, while holding Wyoming and Northwestern to less than 140 yards on the ground. Oregon did rush for more than 300 yards, but Nebraska held the Ducks' high-powered pass game in check with only 146 passing yards.

• Nebraska is 7-0 under Riley when rushing for 200 yards or more, including 3-0 in 2016. The Huskers are 6-0 under Riley when out-rushing the opposition.

FLIPPING THE TURNOVER SCRIPT

Nebraska is off to a good start in changing its turnover fortunes in 2016. The Huskers are +6 in turnover margin after four games, and ranks eighth in the nation in that category.

Nebraska was -12 in turnover margin in 2015, and has had a positive turnover margin just once in the past 12 seasons (+5 in 2009).

- Nebraska did not commit a turnover in the season opener against Fresno State, while intercepting two Bulldog passes. The zero-turnover effort was NU's first since not having a giveaway in a 48-25 win at Minnesota last season.
- Nebraska has had four games with zero turnovers since the start of the 2014 season. In those games, Nebraska's average margin of victory is 31.3 points.
- The Huskers had six takeaways, including five interceptions against Wyoming. Those are the best totals in those categories since posting the same numbers against Idaho in 2010.
- The Huskers' plus-5 in turnover margin against Wyoming was their best since a +8 turnover margin against Texas A&M in 2003.
- Nebraska's performance in the first two games marked the first time the Huskers were +2 or better in turnover margin in consecutive games since the final two games of the 2003 season.
- Nebraska had just two games last season when the Huskers were +2 or better in turnover margin (South Alabama, Minnesota) and won those two games by a combined 62 points.
- NU has nine interceptions in four games this season after posting 10 in 13 games in 2015.
- Nebraska has scored 42 points on its 10 takeaways, while opponents have just six points off NU turnovers.
- Nebraska has won 17 consecutive games when it has a positive turnover margin dating back to a 2011 loss to Northwestern. NU is 5-0 under Mike Riley when it wins the turnover battle.

2016 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

START FAST, FINISH STRONG

Nebraska has controlled the first and fourth quarters of games this season, helping the Huskers to a 4-0 record.

Nebraska owns a 21-8 scoring advantage in the opening guarter this season, allowing only a touchdown by Oregon. The Huskers' have a much more decided edge in the game's final quarter.

- NU has outscored the opponent 57-6 in the fourth quarter, allowing only a TD by Oregon.
- Nebraska also controls the ball in the fourth quarter, averaging 9:24 in time of possession in the final period.

ARMSTRONG RE-WRITING NEBRASKA RECORD BOOKS

Quarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr. has made 37 starts since taking over as NU's starter in 2013. He has started 29 of 30 games since the start of the 2014 season. Armstrong's 26 career victories are tied for sixth in school history.

Armstrong ranks among the Big Ten offensive leaders for the second straight year. Armstrong has also begun to re-write the Nebraska record book, setting two major passing records already in 2016, with several other career records in his sights.

- Armstrong has eight touchdown passes this season, including three each against Wyoming and Oregon. That has increased his career total to 61, a new school record. He surpassed the previous record of 56 by Taylor Martinez. Armstrong has thrown for at least three touchdowns nine times in his Nebraska career. His 61 career passing touchdowns rank seventh among active FBS players.
- Armstrong threw for 22 touchdowns in both 2014 and 2015, which tied for fourth on the NU season chart.
- Armstrong has thrown for 931 yards in 2016, increasing his career total to 7,622 passing yards, a Nebraska career record. He passed the previous record of 7,258 passing yards by Taylor Martinez. Armstrong's passing yardage is eigth among active FBS players.
- Armstrong threw for 377 yards against Wyoming, four yards shy of his career high of 381 yards vs. USC in 2014. The Wyoming effort marked his sixth career 300-yard passing game (319 vs. BYU, 309 at Miami, 368 vs. Southern Miss, 320 vs. Michigan State in 2015; 381 vs. USC, 2014). Armstrong has topped 250 passing yards 13 times in his career, the most in school history.
- Armstrong threw for 3,030 yards in 2015. The passing total marked the third 3,000-yard passing season in school history. He threw for 2,695 yards as a sophomore. Armstrong is one of just three players in Nebraska history with two 2,000-yard passing seasons, joining Martinez and Zac Taylor.

- With another 3,000-yard passing season in 2016, Armstrong would become the first Husker to post two 3,000-yard passing seasons.
- Armstrong averaged 285.8 yards of total offense per game in 2015 to rank second in the Big Ten. He is averaging 303.0 yards per game in 2016 to rank third in the Big Ten.
- Armstrong has 9,210 career total offense yards, good for second at Nebraska. He is 1,023 yards from Martinez's school record of 10,233 yards.
- Armstrong is the first player in NU history with two 3,000-yard total offense seasons, after posting 3,430 yards in 2015 and 3,400 yards in 2014. Those totals rank third and fourth, respectively, on the season total offense list.
- Armstrong had a career-high 431 yards of total offense against Southern Miss in 2015, and he has 12 career games of at least 300 yards of total offense, the most in school history.
- Armstrong ranked 27th in the nation in passes of more than 10 yards (132) in 2015, and 22nd in passes of 20-plus yards (51). He had six throws of at least 25 yards against Wyoming, and has 10 passes of more than 25 yards in 2016.
- Armstrong rushed for a career-high 132 yards on 13 carries at Northwestern, marking his second career 100-yard rushing game. Armstrong had 95 yards the previous week vs. Oregon. He has 281 yards and four rushing touchdowns in 2016, while averaging 5.4 yards per carry.
- Armstrong is one of 10 Nebraska quarterbacks to surpass 1,000 career rushing yards. He has 1,588 rushing yards, sixth-most among NU quarterbacks. He is one rushing touchdown from becoming the seventh NU quarterback with 20 career rushing touchdowns.
- Armstrong earned Big Ten Offensive Player-ofthe-Week honors for his effort at Northwestern. He earned the same honor twice in 2015, first against Southern Miss, and then for his play in the win over No. 6 Michigan State.
- Armstrong is the only active FBS quarterback with 7,000 career passing yards and 1,500 career rushing yards.

HUSKERS REMEMBER SAM FOLTZ Nebraska lost a member of its family this summer, when senior punter Sam Foltz passed away in an automobile accident on July 23.

The latest success story of the Huskers' legendary walk-on program, Foltz embodied Nebraska's commitment to success on the field, in the classroom and in the community. On the field, he was the 2015 Big Ten Punter of the Year and his career average of 42.6 yards per punt ranked fifth all-time at Nebraska. In the classroom, Foltz was a five-time member of the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll, and he earned his degree in agronomy last May. Foltz was also active in the community, earning spots on both the Brook Berringer and Tom Ösborne Citizenship teams in 2016, when he was also awarded a Nebraska Student-Athlete HERO Leadership Award for his leadership and dedicated community service.

INITIATIVES TO HONOR SAM FOLTZ

 Nebraska football players will wear a special "SF27" decal (pictured) on their helmets to honor Foltz's memory. The logo will also



be featured on players' game-day hats, sweatshirts and compression shirts, as well as on the coaches' sideline polo shirts.

- Nebraska's annual student-athlete HERO Leadership Award will be renamed the Sam Foltz Hero 27 Leadership Award. The award will be presented annually to 27 studentathletes across all sports who exhibit strong leadership qualities, commitment to service and ability to encourage/empower peers.
- The Sam Foltz Memorial Scholarship has been created and was presented to Drew Brown before the first game. The Foltz Scholarship will be presented annually to a member of the football team who embodied Foltz's traits of leadership, excellence in the community and in the classroom.
- Nebraska is selecting a Sam Foltz Captain of the Week who will join the season-long captains. The Foltz captain will carry a flag onto the field honoring Foltz's memory.

WESTERKAMP CHASING NEBRASKA RECEIVING RECORDS

Senior receiver Jordan Westerkamp leads a Nebraska receiving corps that ranks as one of the nation's best. Westerkamp is one of the top pass catchers in Nebraska history. He is one of four captains for the 2016 season, marking the second straight year he has served as a captain.

A Chicago area product, Westerkamp put together one of the most prolific receiving seasons in school history in 2015. He had 65 catches for 918 yards and seven touchdowns. He earned second-team All-Big Ten honors for his effort in 2015.

Against Wyoming, Westerkamp had four receptions for 105 yards and two touchdowns, then added a pair of touchdown catches in the win over Oregon.

- Westerkamp's two-touchdown efforts against Wyoming and Oregon are the first multiple-TD games of his Husker career.
- Westerkamp's two multiple-TD reception games is just one off the NU season record. Quincy Enunwa (2013) and Bobby Thomas (1976) each had three games with a pair of receiving touchdowns for the Huskers.
- Westerkamp has 17 career touchdown catches to rank fourth in school history. His seven touchdown receptions in 2015 were tied for 10th on the season charts.
- Westerkamp surpassed 2,000 career receiving yards, joining Kenny Bell, Johnny Rodgers and Nate Swift in NU's 2,000-yard receiving club.
- Westerkamp's 100-yard receiving game vs. Wyoming was the eighth of his career, tying for the second most in school history.
- Westerkamp (105) and Alonzo Moore (109) each topped 100 receiving yards against Wyoming. That marked only the third time in NU history a pair of wideouts topped 100 receiving yards in the same game.
- Westerkamp has been a part of all three occasions. He and Kenny Bell combined for the feat against FAU in 2014, and Westerkamp and Reilly each topped the century mark against Southern Miss in 2015.
- Westerkamp continues to move up the NU career charts. He is fourth on the NU career receiving yardage list with 2,111 yards, leaving him 578 yards from the No. 1 spot.
- He has 138 career receptions, to rank fourth on Nebraska's all-time list. He is 43 catches from the top spot on the career list.
- Westerkamp's 65 catches in 2015 were second on the NU single-season charts, and were the most receptions ever by a Husker receiver.
- His 918 receiving yards in 2015 were the thirdmost in school history.
- Westerkamp had a career-high 11 receptions for 118 yards against Southern Miss in 2015. The 11 catches were tied for third on the NU single-game receptions list.

• Westerkamp had a season-high 143 receiving yards against Michigan State, one of four 100yard games in 2015. The four 100-yard games tied the Nebraska season record, accomplished five times previously.

• Westerkamp has caught a pass in 30 straight games, the third-longest streak in school history and just the eighth time in school history a player has had a streak of at least 20 consecutive games with a catch.

REILLY BIG-PLAY LEADER IN HUSKER RECEIVING CORPS

Jordan Westerkamp is joined in the wide receiving corps by fellow senior Brandon Reilly, who established himself as one of the nation's top big-play receiving threats in 2015.

Reilly had 40 receptions for 754 yards and four touchdowns in 2015. His biggest touchdown reception was a game-winning score in the final minute against No. 6 Michigan State. He totaled three catches for 87 yards against MSU, with two receptions of at least 30 yards.

- Reilly had eight receptions of at least 30 yards in 2015, the fourth-most in the Big Ten.
- Reilly's average of 18.9 yards per reception ranked first among Big Ten receivers who averaged at least 2.0 catches per game. The 18.9 yard-per-catch average was also the thirdbest average in NU history for players with at least 40 receptions.
- Reilly's first catch of 2016 was a 38-yarder against Wyoming. He missed both the Fresno State and Oregon games, before snagging a 35-yarder at Northwestern.
- Reilly has 950 career receiving yards, leaving him 50 yards from becoming the 24th Husker with 1,000 career receiving yards.

ZO IN THE ZONE

Not to be forgetton among the Huskers' crew of senior receivers is Alonzo Moore. The Louisiana product has been the Huskers' top receiver through four games, with 12 receptions for 310 yards and two touchdowns.

Moore posted career receiving highs in each of the first two games with 92 yards against Fresno State and 109 yards in the win over Wyoming.

- Moore has posted the three longest catches of his career in September. Moore had a 57-yard TD against Fresno State, a 63-yard TD grab against Wyoming, and a 59-yard catch to set up a touchdown at Northwestern.
- Moore is averaging 25.8 yards on his 12 receptions and ranks fifth in the nation in that category.

CARTER CLIMBING NEBRASKA TIGHT END CHARTS

Senior **Cethan Carter** gives Nebraska a strong pass-catching weapon from the tight end position. Through four games, Carter has nine catches for 99 yards, including a career-high five catches against Oregon. He had his first TD catch of the season at Northwestern.

- Carter has 49 career receptions, and is one catch from being just the eighth Nebraska tight ends with 50 career receptions.
- Carter is on pace to finish his career second on the NU career receptions list. Kyler Reed is second with 67 career receptions, trailing only Mike McNeill's NU tight end record of 82 career receptions.

Carter caught 24 passes for 329 yards during his junior season and earned honorable-mention All-Big Ten honors. He is on the watch list for the 2016 John Mackey Award.

KICKER BROWN CONTINUES FAMILY TRADITION

Place-kicker **Drew Brown** is a leading contender for conference and national honors, including the Lou Groza Award. Brown established himself as one of the nation's top kickers as a sophomore and earned second-team All-Big Ten honors last fall.

Brown made 21-of-27 field goals in 2015, including each of his last 11 field goals. Nine of the 11 field goals in his streak were from at least 40 yards. He is 2-of-2 on field goals in 2016, and his streak of 13 straight made field goals is the third-longest streak in NU history.

- Brown connected on 13 field goals of at least 40 yards in 2015. He was 13-of-17 from beyond 40 yards, including 12-of-14 from 40-49 yards.
- Brown's 13 field goals of at least 40 yards tied for the most nationally among all kickers. Only five kickers had at least 10 field goals of 40 yards or more in 2015.
- In Big Ten games in 2015, Brown connected on 12-of-14 field goals.
- Brown's 21 field goals in 2015 were second on the Nebraska season list.

- Brown was second in the Big Ten at 1.62 field goals per game and ranked 16th nationally in the category. He was third in the Big Ten in scoring at 8.2 points per game.
- Brown scored 107 points as a sophomore after posting a Nebraska freshman-record 101 points in 2014. He is the first player in Nebraska history with 100-point seasons as both a freshman and sophomore.
- Brown has increased his career scoring total to 233 points to rank 10th in NU history.
- Brown made five field goals against Southern Miss in 2015, all in the first half. The five field goals in a half tied an NCAA record. The five field goals were the most ever by a Husker in Lincoln, and tied a Memorial Stadium record held by two opposing kickers.
- The five field goals marked the third time in NU history a kicker had five or more field goals. Dale Klein had an NCAA record seven field goals at Missouri in 1985, and Alex Henery had five field goals at Virginia Tech in 2009.

PIERSON-EL ENERGIZES HUSKER RETURN GAME

Junior **De'Mornay Pierson-El** returned to his big-play ways in the punt return game against Oregon. Pierson-El had a 45-yard return in the second quarter to set up a Nebraska touchdown just before halftime.

The play flipped momentum in the game, cutting the Ducks' halftime lead to 20-14, and setting the stage for the Nebraska victory.

- The 45-yard return by Pierson-El marked the 10th return of his career that covered at least 25 yards. Pierson-El had eight returns of 25-plus as a true freshman in 2014, one in an injury-plagued sophomore season and the return against Oregon.
- Pierson-El averaged 17.5 yards per return in 2014, and his 596 return yards topped the nation by nearly 200 yards.

2016 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

BLACKSHIRTS LOOK TO STUFF THE RUN AGAIN IN 2016

The Nebraska Blackshirt defense entered 2016 with a goal of making big improvements in pass defense and pressuring the quarterback. The Huskers also look to duplicate their 2015 success in stopping the opponent run game.

The Huskers allowed opponents to rush for 109.9 yards per game, second in the Big Ten and ninth nationally. NU has been strong against the run in three of four games, holding three foes to less than 140 rushing yards, including 31 yards by Fresno State.

- Since the start of the 2015 season, Nebraska has limited six opponents to less than 90 rushing yards. NU is 6-0 in those games.
- Nebraska held Southern Miss to 11 rushing yards in 2015, its best run defense effort since Michigan had -17 rushing yards in 2013.
- Nebraska's vastly improved pass defense is allowing 207.3 yards per game. Oregon threw for just 146 yards and did not have a touchdown pass, ending an NCAA record streak of 82 straight games for the Ducks with a passing TD.

GERRY AGAIN SERVING AS LEADER OF HUSKER SECONDARY

Senior safety **Nathan Gerry** has been a fixture for the Husker defense the past four seasons. Gerry saw action as a true freshman, then started every game in the secondary in 2014 and 2015 and made his mark as one of the top defensive backs in the Big Ten Conference. Gerry is in his second season as a captain in 2016.

In 2015, Gerry was a third-team All-Big Ten choice by the league media, marking the second straight year he earned all-conference accolades. As a sophomore, Gerry garnered second-team all-conference honors.

Gerry made his 2016 season debut against Wyoming in style with two interceptions and a team-high seven tackles. His play earned him Big Ten Defensive Player-of-the-Week honors. He added a team-high nine tackles against Oregon. He had a team-high eight stops, with two tackles for loss and two breakups at Northwestern.

- Gerry's two interceptions against Wyoming marked his first career multiple-TD game. It also pushed his career interceptions total to 11, three shy of the Nebraska career record. The 11 interceptions are tied for third among active FBS players.
- Gerry led Nebraska in interceptions each of the past two seasons with five in 2014 and four in 2015.
- Gerry ranked in the top 10 in the Big Ten in interceptions each of the past two seasons. As a sophomore in 2014, he led the league in interceptions in conference games, with all five picks coming in Big Ten play.
- Gerry has 223 career tackles to rank 21st in school history and fourth all-time among NU defensive backs. He is 31 tackles from the top 10 on the NU career list, and just four tackles from ranking second among defensive backs.

• Gerry led Nebraska in tackles in 2015 with 79 stops and ranked second in 2014 with 88 tackles.

NEBRASKA HOPES TO CONTINUE WINNING ON 'MONEY DOWN'

Coaches regularly preach the importance of winning on third down. Nebraska was effective on the 'money down' on both offense and defense in 2015, and looks to carry that success into this season.

- Nebraska ranked third in the Big Ten in thirddown conversions at 44.8 percent in 2015. Defensively, the Huskers were fifth in opponent third-down conversions at 34.0 percent.
- The Huskers ranked 24th nationally in both categories. Nebraska joined Clemson, Michigan and Tennessee as the only schools in the nation to rank in the top 25 in both third-down conversions and opponent third-down conversions.
- In four games in 2016, Nebraska is 25-of-52 on third downs (48 percent), while limiting opponents to 17-of-53 (32 percent).

FOUR SENIORS ELECTED AS 2016 TEAM CAPTAINS

Four Nebraska seniors were selected by their teammates as 2016 team captains. The four players include two each on offense and defense and come to Nebraska from three states.

- Westerkamp's selection marks the fourth straight year a receiver has served as captain.
- Dylan Utter and Josh Banderas continue a long line of Nebraska natives who have served as Nebraska captains. This marks the 11th straight year a Nebraska native has been named a team captain.
- Utter is the third player in four seasons to become a captain after arriving in the program as a walk-on, joining offensive lineman Spencer Long (2013) and defensive end Jack Gangwish (2015). It also marks the fourth straight year an offensive lineman has been a captain.
- Nathan Gerry serving as a captain marks the fourth straight year a defensive back has been a captain. That group includes Gerry in 2015, Corey Cooper and Josh Mitchell in 2014 and Ciante Evans in 2013.

Simpson is among Nebraska's top special teams performers. He has played in 31 games and has 11 special teams tackles with the Huskers.

Nebraska has a long tradition of relying on its walk-on program to help build the foundation of the program. Six walk-ons have gone on to earn first-team All-America honors for Nebraska, while 13 walk-ons have earned firstteam academic All-America recognition.

NU STAFF BRINGS VETERAN PRESENCE TO SIDELINE

Nebraska Head Coach Mike Riley is in his second season in Lincoln. The season also marks Riley's 25th season overall as a head coach. Riley is in his 16th season as a college head coach, including 14 years at Oregon State and two at Nebraska. He also has nine years as a professional head coach, including three years as an NFL head coach.

- Riley picked up his 100th career college coaching win in the season opener. Riley won 93 games in 14 seasons at Oregon State, before coming to Nebraska.
- Riley is in his 42nd overall season in either the college or professional coaching ranks, the second-most of any FBS head coach entering 2016. He trails only Alabama's Nick Saban, who enters his 44th season in coaching in 2016.
- With his 25 years of head coaching experience, Riley ranks second among current FBS head coaches in total years of head coaching experience. Notre Dame's Brian Kelly is in his 27th season in 2016.
- Riley is one of only four FBS head coaches with at least three years of NFL head coaching experience. Three of those four coaches are in the Big Ten, including Riley, Illinois' Lovie Smith and Jim Harbaugh of Michigan.
- Riley posted a win over No. 22 Oregon on Sept. 17, marking the 16th win of his collegiate coaching career over a ranked team. A victory over No. 6 Michigan State last season was Riley's sixth win over a top-10 team.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS

Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as Nebraska's head coach.

NU RANKS AMONG NATION'S ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Nebraska averaged 89,998 fans for its seven home games at Memorial Stadium in 2015. Nebraska's attendance average ranked 11th in the nation and fourth among Big Ten schools. The 2015 season marked the third straight year Nebraska ranked 11th or higher in average attendance. The Big Ten had seven of the top 24 schools in average home attendance in 2015.

In 2014, Nebraska was 10th in average home attendance with 91,249 fans per game. The average attendance for seven home games was the largest ever at Memorial Stadium, bettering the 2013 mark of 90,933 per game.

NU has ranked in the top 20 nationally in attendance each of the 17 years with available attendance figures.

NCAA RECORD SELLOUT STREAK PASSES 350 GAMES

One of the most remarkable streaks in collegiate sports continues in 2016. Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, a streak of 351 consecutive sellouts, 99 more than second-place Notre Dame.

- Nebraska owns a 299-51 (.854) record during the sellout streak.
- Overall attendance during the sellout streak totals 26,620,479.

HUSKERS OWN BIG ADVANTAGE AT MEMORIAL STADIUM

Nebraska has rewarded the loyalty of its fans with great success at Memorial Stadium.

- Nebraska has won at least six home games in 23 of the past 29 seasons. NU is 165-28 (.855) at home in the last 28 seasons (since 1989).
- Nebraska's most recent perfect home season occurred in 2012. Nebraska is 3-0 at home in 2016.
- The Huskers are 13-7 in Big Ten home games since joining the league in 2011.
- In the past three decades, NU has had three home winning streaks of 20 or more games and overall has posted 41 unbeaten and untied home seasons.
- The Huskers are 534-147-20 (.776, 701 games, 127 years) in Lincoln, and 409-124-13 (.761, 546 games, 93 years) in Memorial Stadium (since 1923).

NEBRASKA AMONG NATION'S TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is in its 127th season of college football and owns an 884-368-40 all-time record in 1,292 games (.700). Nebraska is one of 10 programs with 800 all-time victories, ranking fourth with 884 wins.

Since 1970, NU has a 450-127-5 record, for a .777 winning percentage in 582 games.

- Nebraska ranks as the nation's winningest program over the last 40, 50 and 60 years.
- Since Nebraska's first football season in 1890, Husker teams have won 11 or more games 12 times, including seven times since 1993.
- Nebraska has won 12 or more games seven times, including three seasons with 13 wins (1971, 1994, 1997).
- Nebraska has 24 10-win seasons since 1970.
- Nebraska has 49 nine-win seasons in school history, including 41 since 1970 and 47 since Bob Devaney took over the Nebraska program in 1962. No other school in the nation has more than 32 nine-win seasons in that same time.
- NU was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.
- Nebraska ranks third in NCAA history with 52 all-time bowl appearances, while the Huskers rank in a tie for seventh with 26 bowl victories.

HUSKERS RANK IN TOP 10 OF ALL-TIME AP RANKING

The Associated Press weekly poll began in 1936 and has been a fixture in college football ever since. This August the AP released an all-time top 100 for the first time, ranking programs over the history 80-year history of the poll.

Nebraska checked in at No. 6 in the alltime rankings and was one of three Big Ten programs in the top seven in the poll. Nebraska has appeared in 65 percent of all polls since 1936 and has been ranked No. 1 in 72 polls.

 In addition to the lofty rankings in the AP alltime top 10 poll, Nebraska was also recently recognized as a historically elite program by ESPN.com. In a late August article, ESPN.com identified Nebraska as one of one of eight "Blue Blood" programs in college football history.

NEBRASKA AMONG LEADERS IN **AP NATIONAL TITLES**

Alabama leads the nation by winning 10 Associated Press national titles since 1936, with Notre Dame (8), Oklahoma (7), Miami (5), USC (5), Nebraska (4) and Minnesota (4) next in line. While the Huskers were awarded the national title by the coaches in 1997, NU finished second to Michigan in the AP poll.

In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the AP national title, but not the coaches (Texas was first, Ohio State second and NU third) as the final poll was released before the bowl games were played. In the coaches poll (since 1950), NU is tied for fourth with Miami and Texas with four titles, behind Alabama (9), Oklahoma (6) and USC (5).

CONFERENCE CROWNS

Nebraska has won 46 football conference championships in school history. The Huskers won 13 conference titles under Tom Osborne and eight under Bob Devaney.

During its 15-year history in the Big 12 Conference, Nebraska won league titles in 1997 and 1999, and also appeared in the Big 12 Championship Game in 1996, 2006, 2009 and 2010. Nebraska was one of just three teams to capture two or more Big 12 titles in the first 15 years of the league, joining Oklahoma and Texas. Nebraska's six Big 12 title game appearances were second only to Oklahoma's eight. NU made its first appearance in the Big Ten Championship Game in 2012.

A HOLIDAY TRADITION

Nebraska participated in its 52nd bowl game in the 2015 Foster Farms Bowl.

Nebraska is one of only five programs with 50 or more bowl appearances, and its 52 bowl appearances are third all-time, trailing only Alabama (62) and Texas (53).

- The Huskers have played in the postseason in 45 of the past 47 seasons.
- Nebraska appeared in an NCAA-record 35 straight bowl games from 1969 to 2003.
- NU owns a 26-26 all-time bowl record, and the 26 bowl victories rank seventh nationally.

#PRO BIG RED

Nebraska has a long-standing tradition of being one of the leading programs in putting into the National players Football League.



A total of 26 former Nebraska

players are on NFL rosters as of Sept. 7. The group includes five rookies making their NFL debuts in 2016-defensive tackle Maliek Collins (Dallas), fullback Andy Janovich (Denver), offensive tackle Alex Lewis (Baltimore), nose tackle Vincent Valentine (New England) and offensive lineman Givens Price (Arizona, practice squad).

Janovich got his NFL career off to a strong start with a 28-yard touchdown run in Denver's victory over Carolina. The touchdown run came on the first carry of Janovich's career.

Nebraska's NFL contingent is led by four players who have made Pro Bowl appearances in their career, including Dolphins defensive tackle Ndamukong Suh, Buccaneers linebacker Lavonte David, Ravens punter Sam Koch and Giants kicker Josh Brown.


Nebraska's Will Compton and Niles Paul were two of five Redskin players elected as captains for the 2016 campaign.

Nebraska is the only program to have at least two players selected in every NFL Draft of the Common Draft Era (since 1967).

Three Huskers have won the Heisman Trophy, all since 1972. Johnny Rodgers won in 1972, Mike Rozier in 1983 and Eric Crouch in 2001.

Nebraska ranks fourth in NCAA history with 884 all-time victories. The Huskers are one of only 10 teams with 800 all-time wins.

Nebraska has won five national titles: 1970, 1971, 1994, 1995 and 1997. The Huskers have won the second-most national titles of any school in the country since 1970.

Nebraska ranks ninth nationally with a total of 23 former players and coaches (17 players, six coaches) who have been enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Nebraska leads the nation with a former Husker on a Super Bowl roster for 23 consecutive years.

The Huskers have won 46 conference titles in program history, the most of any school in the country. This includes 33 perfect conference seasons and 27 unbeaten seasons.

Nebraska ranks third in NCAA history with 52 all-time bowl appearances. The Huskers are one of only five teams to appear in 50 bowl games.

Nebraska football has totaled 107 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, the most of any team in any sport in NCAA history.

Across all sports, the University of Nebraska has totaled a nation-leading 325 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 73 more than any other school.

Memorial Stadium has been sold out for an NCAA-record 351 consecutive games dating back to Nov. 3, 1962. (includes Illinois)

2016 SEASON NOTEBOOK SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Big Ten Conference moved to a ninegame conference schedule in 2016. Nebraska and the other six members of the Big Ten West Division will play four home games and five road games.
- The Huskers' games against Maryland and Indiana will mark Nebraska's first conference matchups with those schools. The meeting with Maryland will mark the first-ever matchup between the teams.
- The Huskers' non-conference schedule was highlighted by the start of a home-and-home series with Oregon. Nebraska will make a return trip to Eugene in the 2017 season. The two meetings are the first between the schools since Oregon played in Lincoln in both 1985 and 1986.
- Nebraska will play seven games against teams that played in a bowl game last season, including New Year's Six participants lowa (Rose) and Ohio State (Fiesta). The Big Ten Championship Game is scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 3, at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- The Nebraska coaching staff has one new full-time face for the 2016 season, but it is a familiar one to Husker fans. Mike Riley hired John Parrella as the Huskers' defensive line coach in February. A former Nebraska and NFL standout, Parrella returned to his alma mater after two seasons on the defensive staff at Northern Michigan.
- Parrella was an All-Big Eight defensive tackle for Nebraska and played 12 seasons in the NFL, including appearances in three Super Bowls.
- Defensive coordinator Mark Banker did not coach a position in his first year at Nebraska in 2015. This fall, Banker is coaching the Huskers' safeties, allowing Brian Stewart to focus solely on the cornerbacks.
- The Husker full-time coaching staff has numerous ties to the National Football League, led by Coach Riley. The Huskers have also added new faces in support roles with links to the NFL. Former St. Louis Rams General Manager Billy Devaney is the Huskers' Executive Director of Player Personnel and Special Assistant to the Head Coach. Roman Sapolu is in his second season as a graduate assistant with the program and is the son of Jesse Sapolu a member of four World Championship teams with the San Francisco 49ers. Chase Haslett is an offensive assistant in 2016 and is the son of long-time NFL coach Jim Haslett. James Rodgers, who played under Mike Riley at Oregon State, spent time in the NFL with the Atlanta Falcons. Rodgers has joined the program as a personnel assistant.



ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska has a long history of attracting players from all parts of the United States, and the 2016 roster is no different. Nebraska has players from 27 states and Canada on its 137-player roster.
- The Huskers have 57 homegrown Nebraska players on the 2016 roster.
- The roster includes seven additional states with at least five players. Nebraska has 10 players from California, eight each from Florida, Louisiana, Missouri and Texas, and five each from Colorado and Illinois.
- Nebraska's 2016 signing class featured 21 players from 14 states, including multiple signees from California (4), Nebraska, Colorado and Missouri (2).

ACADEMIC NOTES

- Four Huskers are playing this season as graduate students. Charles Jackson (May, 2016), Alonzo Moore (August, 2016), Michael Rose-Ivey (August, 2016), and Corey Whitaker (August, 2016) have all earned their degrees. In addition, punter Sam Foltz (May, 2016) had earned his college degree before his passing in July.
- Nineteen additional members of the senior class are expected to pick up their undergraduate degrees in December.
- Nebraska posted a football Graduation Success Rate of 85 percent in 2015 to rank second in the Big Ten. Nebraska's GSR is the ninth-best among all FBS schools and third among public schools in the FBS ranks.
- Husker football players have combined for 107 CoSIDA Academic All-America awards. Nebraska football has produced more academic All-Americans than any other sport in NCAA history, while Nebraska leads the nation with 325 academic All-Americans across all sports.

THE ILLINOIS FIGHTING ILLINI AT A GLANCE

- Illinois has lost two straight games following a season-opening 52-3 win over Murray State.
- After scoring nine touchdowns in its first five quarters of the season, Illinois has scored only two touchdowns over its last seven guarters.
- The Illini were 2-6 in Big Ten play last season, including a win over Nebraska in their conference opener.
- Lovie Smith is in his first season as a collegiate coach, after 11 seasons as an NFL head coach.
- Smith led the Chicago Bears to an 81-63 record and three NFC North championships from 2004 to 2012 before guiding the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to an 8-24 record in 2014 and 2015.



Lincoln (Sept. 3) --On an emotional night for the Husker football Nebraska program. honored Sam Foltz in a 43-10 victory over Fresno State in the season opener.

On Nebraska's first series of the season. NU went three-and-out and was forced to punt, and lined up without a punter, as they honored Foltz, Nebraska's 2015 Big Ten Punter of the Year who



died in a car crash in July. The sellout crowd of 90,013 roared as the play clock expired and Fresno State players applauded the Husker tribute, and declined the delay of game penalty.

Tommy Armstrong and Devine Ozigbo rushed for two touchdowns apiece, as Nebraska took control in the second half to give Mike Riley his 100th collegiate win.

Devine posted his first career 100-yard game, finishing with 103 yards on 17 carries, including first-half touchdown runs of 1 and 6 yards, while Armstrong scored twice in the second half and connected with Alonzo Moore on a 57-yard touchdown pass. The Huskers outscored the Bulldogs 29-0 in the second half. Armstrong rushed for 42 yards on 11 carries while also throwing for 108 yards and a TD. Moore was the biggest beneficiary, hauling in three passes for 92 yards while rushing for 34 yards on two carries.

Leading 14-10 at halftime, Nebraska's defense took over, forcing a three-and-out. The Huskers went 57 yards in nine players, capped by Armstrong's nine-yard scoring run, to push their edge to 21-10 on the opening drive of the half. The Blackshirts, who forced a trio of 3-and-outs in the second half, set up the Huskers' next score after a Kieron Williams interception. Two plays later Armstrong hit Moore in stride for a 57-yard scoring strike to give NU a 28-10 lead on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Williams totaled a career-high 10 tackles for the Huskers, while Ross Dzuris had a pair of sacks, as Nebraska limited Fresno State to just 128 second-half yards with 71 of those coming on the final drive after NU built a 43-10 cushion late in the fourth quarter.

Lincoln (Sept. 10) --- Tommy Armstrong Jr. threw three touchdown passes to become NU's career leader and ran for another score, as the Huskers soared to a 52-17 win over Wyoming.

For the second straight week, Nebraska got off to a fast start, iumping out to a 17-0 lead and finished with a flourish.

After Wyoming cut the Husker lead to 24-17 heading into the fourth quarter, the Big Red erupted, outscoring the Cowboys 28-0 over the next 10 minutes, starting with Armstrong's 34-yard scoring strike to senior wide receiver Jordan Westerkamp.

The Cowboys then let the game get out of hand. On their first play from scrimmage on the ensuing drive, quarterback Josh Allen threw a screen pass behind running back Brian Hill. Ross Dzuris scooped up the backward lateral and rumbled to the one-yard line, setting up a one-yard Devine Ozigbo run to push the Big Red's lead to 38-17 with 12:59 left.

On Wyoming's next drive, Nathan Gerry intercepted Nebraska's third pass of the half, which set up a nine-yard touchdown pass to Westerkamp. The TD pass was Armstrong's 57th of his career, breaking the record of 56 by Taylor Martinez. Armstrong finished his record-setting day by completing 20-of-34 passes for 377 yards and three scores. On the ensuing drive, Chris Jones intercepted another Allen pass and returned it to the Wyoming 35. One play later, Ryker Fyfe hit Gabe Rahn with a 35-yard scoring strike to make it 52-17.

While Armstrong and the offense amassed 550 total yards, the Blackshirts set the tone for the second half by forcing six turnovers including five interceptions. The Husker defense surrendered 320 total yards, including just 131 on the ground.

The first interception of the game for the Blackshirts came from Aaron Williams, which thwarted Wyoming's second drive of the second half after the Cowboys had cut NU's lead to 17-10 with a field goal on the opening drive of the half. On the Cowboys' next possession, the Huskers pushed the lead back to 14, as Kieron Williams intercepted another Allen pass and returned it 23 yards for a score.

Lincoln (Sept. 17) -- Tommy Armstrong Jr. threw for 200 yards and three TDs, while his 34-yard draw play scored the go-ahead touchdown, lifting Nebraska to a 35-32 win over No. 22 Oregon.

Armstrong's gutty performance included completing 17-for-33 for 200 vards and three scores while running 16 times for 95 vards and a touchdown. Nebraska posted its first win in non-conference action against a ranked opponent since 2001.

After Oregon took a 32-28 lead with 10:31 remaining, the Huskers went 80 yards on 11 plays to regain the lead. Nebraska was facing a 4th-and-9 at its 48 with less than four minutes remaining when Armstrong found Westerkamp for 14 yards to keep the chains moving. Two plays later, the senior quarterback sprinted 34 yards to give the Huskers the lead for good with 2:29 left.

Oregon had one last drive and got the ball to midfield before the

Husker defense stiffened. On 3rd-and-20, Freedom Akinmoladun forced a fumble which Oregon recovered at the NU 48. The Ducks had one last chance, but Michael Rose-Ivey snuffed out the play, tackling guarterbck Dakota Prukop at the 45 to secure the win.

Prukop threw for 146 yards and ran for 94 for the Ducks, who rushed for 336 yards, including 100 by Kani Benoit.

Trailing 20-7, De'Mornay Pierson-El electrified the 350th consecutive sellout, taking an Oregon punt back 45 yards to get the Huskers in scoring position. Armstrong connected with Westerkamp for a 2-yard TD pass with five seconds left in the half to cut the lead to six.

The Huskers took the second half kickoff and marched 75 yards in seven plays. The Husker ground game put Nebraska into scoring position, before Armstrong threw a 22-yard touchdown pass to Bryan Reimers to take a 21-20 lead. The Huskers extended the lead to 28-20, as Devine Ozigbo scored on a 7-yard run with 6:13 left in the third guarter.

Oregon answered back with a 75 yard touchdown drive capped by Benoit's 41-yard run one play after the Ducks converted a 3rd-and-27. Oregon regained the lead early in the fourth quarter when Brooks-James scored his third touchdown of the day, this one from one yard, to make it 32-28 after the two-point conversion failed. Oregon went just 1-of-5 in two-point conversion attempts.

Evanston, III. (Sept. 24) -- Quarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr. rushed for a career-high 132 yards and threw for 249 yards, leading No. 20 Nebraska to a 24-13 win over Northwestern,

Nebraska amassed 556 yards of total offense, as Armstrong accounted for 378 total yards, including his first 100-yard game since the 2014 season. He also completed 18-of-29 passes for 246 vards and one touchdown.

Alonzo Moore led the Nebraska receivers with three receptions for a team-high 72 yards, including a 59-yarder to set up Newby's second-quarter touchdown to give the Huskers a 10-7 lead. Stanley Morgan Jr. added a team-high four receptions for 33 yards, while nine different Huskers hauled in catches on the night.

Despite dominating the game statistically, Nebraska was unable to put Northwestern away because a pair of first-half fumbles into the end zone that resulted in touchbacks for the Wildcats instead

of touchdowns for the Huskers. Those setbacks caused the Huskers to trail 7-3 late into the first half until Newby found paydirt from four yards out for the Big Red with 1:41 left in the second quarter.

While Nebraska lost a pair of turnovers in the Northwestern end zone in the first half, the Blackshirts evened that category with a pair of second-half interceptions. On Northwestern's opening drive of the second half, Aaron Williams pulled down an interception in the end zone to prevent the Wildcats from regaining the lead. Williams added seven tackles, including one tackle for loss.

Armstrong and the offense made Northwestern pay by marching 80 yards in 10 plays capped by Armstrong's four-yard touchdown pass to tight end Cethan Carter to give the Big Red a 17-7 edge. Carter finished with two catches for 31 yards while adding one carry for 16 yards.

Northwestern responded quickly with Clayton Thorson's 24-yard touchdown pass to Austin Carr to cap a five-play, 52-yard drive that cut Nebraska's lead to 17-13.

Leading 17-13 after Mitchell's missed extra point, Nebraska put the game away on its next drive, as Armstrong marched the Huskers 79 vards in nine plays capped by wide receiver Jordan Westerkamp's 10-yard touchdown run with 3:06 left in the third guarter.

Westerkamp's touchdown run capped the scoring in the game, as Joshua Kalu closed out a strong effort by the Blackshirt defense with his interception deep in Nebraska territory to end Northwestern's final scoring threat late in the fourth quarter. Kalu finished the game with seven tackles

Husker safeties Nathan Gerry and Kieron Williams led the Blackshirts with eight tackles apiece. Gerry added two tackles for loss including a shared sack with defensive tackle Mick Stoltenberg, while pitching in a pair of big breakups.
