Nebraska and Ohio State are both ranked in the top 10 of this week's AP poll with Ohio State at No. 6 and Nebraska ranked ninth. This matchup will mark the first top-10 meeting Nebraska has played in since the No. 8 Huskers played at No. 7 Wisconsin in October of 2011.

Nebraska guarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr. needs 53 yards of total offense against Ohio State to become the Nebraska career leader in total offense. Taylor Martinez currently holds the record with 10,233 yards.

Nebraska and Ohio State have combined for 81 conference championships in the storied history of the two programs. Nebraska has 46 league titles, while Ohio State has won 35 conference crowns.

THE MATCHUP

Nebraska continues a rugged twogame road trip on Saturday night, when the Huskers travel to Columbus, Ohio to take on sixth-ranked Ohio State. The prime-time tilt will kick off at 7 p.m. CT (8 p.m. local) at Ohio Stadium, with the contest nationally televised on ABC.

Nebraska enters the game with a 7-1 record and a 4-1 mark in Big Ten play, following a 23-17 overtime loss at Wisconsin on Saturday night. Nebraska rallied from a 10-point deficit entering the final quarter, but Wisconsin prevailed in the extra session. The loss ended the Huskers' eight-game overall winning streak, NU's longest in 15 seasons.

Despite the setback, Nebraska maintains a one-game lead in the Big Ten West Division heading into the final month of the season. The Huskers enter this week's contest still in the top 10 in both polls. NU is ranked ninth in the Associated Press Poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Ohio State also comes into the game with a 7-1 record, including a 4-1 mark in the Big Ten Conference. The Buckeyes suffered a three-point loss at Penn State on Oct. 22, but bounced back with a 24-20 win over Northwestern on Saturday in Columbus.

The Buckeyes rank among the nation's best on both offense and defense. Ohio State ranks eighth nationally in rushing offense and No. 10 in scoring. The defense is also stout, holding opponents to just 295.5 yards and 15.1 points per game.

GENERAL POLICIES

All player and coach interviews must be arranged at least one day in advance through the Nebraska Communications Office. Contact Keith Mann, Shamus McKnight, Matt Smith or Jeremy Foote. All postpractice interviews will be conducted at the practice site. Interviews will not be conducted in the weight room, Student Life Complex, training room, hallways or the tunnel leading from the locker room to the field. The Nebraska locker room, training room and football office meeting rooms are OFF-LIMITS to the media. When arriving for post-practice interviews, media should wait in the Hawks Center lobby, or access Memorial Stadium through Gate 11 entrance if practice is in the stadium.

Requested players are available (depending on class schedules) at the Monday press conferences (11:30 a.m.-1 p.m.) and after practice on the field on Tuesday (defense) and Wednesday (offense). Players cell phone numbers will NOT be given to the media.

Practices are CLOSED to the media and to the general public during the season. Media will be allowed to shoot photos/video at the start of practice on Tuesdays (app. 15 minutes). A Communications representative will be on hand during the open portion of practice.

After all games, Nebraska's locker room is closed. Head Coach Mike Riley, coordinators and requested players will be brought to the postgame interview room after a 10-minute cooling off period. At home, the postgame interview room is located in the strength complex of the Osborne Athletic Complex. Media are asked to wait to set up equipment until the conclusion of halftime. On the road, Coach Riley, assistant coaches and requested players will be brought to the designated interview area. Please note, NO INTERVIEWS will be conducted on the field as the players are returning to the locker room.

- Nebraska and Ohio State are meeting for the first time in four seasons after playing in Nebraska's first two years in the Big Ten in 2011 and 2012.
- The Huskers will meet Ohio State each of the next four years with Big Ten schedules currently set through 2019.
- Nebraska's lone win in the series occurred in 2011 in Lincoln, the Huskers' first Big Ten home game. Nebraska rallied from a 27-6 deficit for a 34-27 win, marking the largest comeback in school history.
- With Ohio State entering the game ranked sixth, the Buckeyes have been ranked in the top 12 in the AP poll in all four meetings in Columbus.

HUSKER-BUCKEYE MATCHUP PITS TWO TOP PROGRAMS

Saturday night's matchup not only features two of the top teams in 2016, but also two of the historically great programs in college football.

- In looking at the most wins in college football over the past 30, 40, 50 or 60 years, Nebraska and Ohio State each rank in the top four in all of those categories.
- The schools have combined to win 11 national championships and 81 conference championships, including five national championships and 46 conference titles by Nebraska.

HUSKERS REMAIN IN TOP 10 IN NATIONAL RANKINGS

Nebraska's loss at Wisconsin caused the Huskers to drop in the rankings for the first time in several weeks. However, the Huskers remain No. 9 in the Associated Press Poll and 10th in the coaches poll. The first College Football Playoff rankings will be released on Tuesday evening.

Nebraska began the season unranked before entering the national polls after starting 3-0. The Huskers have been ranked in each of the past seven polls.

- The No. 7 ranking in the Oct. 23 AP poll was the Huskers' highest since being ranked No. 5 in the country in October of 2010.
- Nebraska moved into the top 10 on Oct. 10 prior to its game at Indiana. The Huskers' top-10 ranking was its first since November of 2011.
- With NU ranked ninth heading into a matchup at No. 6 Ohio State, Saturday's game will mark the first top-10 game the Huskers have been involved in since 2011. Nebraska was ranked eighth when it traveled to No. 7 Wisconsin in 2011. NU just missed being part of a top-10 game last week as the No. 7 Huskers lost at 11th-ranked Wisconsin.

NU IN GOOD POSITION HEADING INTO FINAL FOUR GAMES

Nebraska stands at 7-1 heading into the final month of the regular season. The 7-1 start marks the third time in the past seven seasons NU has started 7-1.

- Nebraska started 7-0 before losing in overtime at Wisconsin. The 7-0 record was Nebraska's best start since opening 11-0 in 2001.
- Nebraska saw an eight-game winning streak end at Wisconsin. That streak was NU's longest win streak since its 13-game win streak spanning the 2000 and 2001 seasons. Nebraska had four six-game winning streaks between 2008 and 2014.
- The Huskers opened Big Ten play with four straight wins, marking Nebraska's best conference start since 2001 when NU opened Big 12 action by winning its first seven games.
- The 7-0 start for Nebraska is the best for Mike Riley in his 16 seasons as a college head coach. The Huskers' eight-game win streak was also the longest of Riley's career.

HUSKERS ON STRONG 12-GAME RUN

Nebraska's 7-1 start ties its best eight-game record in the past 15 years. NU also opened 7-1 in 2003, 2010 and 2014. Combined with a 3-1 finish to the 2015 campaign, the Huskers have won 10 of their past 12 games.

- Nebraska's 10-2 record over a 12-game span is its best since the Huskers won 11 of 12 games spanning the 2009 and 2010 seasons.
- NU's 10-2 record in the past 12 games makes the Huskers one of 12 teams in the FBS with a 10-2 or better record in the stretch.

- Nebraska's overtime loss marked just its third loss in 11 all-time overtime games. The Huskers' six-point loss marked the 10th consecutive loss for Nebraska that has been by 10 or fewer points.
- Tommy Armstrong Jr. accounted for 192 yards of total offense in the game and surpassed 10,000 career yards of total offense. He is the 11th Big Ten player to reach that milestone.
- Senior Nathan Gerry intercepted two passes in the fourth quarter, marking his second multi-interception game of the season. Gerry has 13 interceptions in his Nebraska career, one shy of the NU school record.
- Sophomore receiver Stanley Morgan Jr. had a career-high five receptions for 58 yards.
- Nebraska senior receiver Jordan Westerkamp caught three passes to move into third place on the Huskers' career reception list, moving past Johnny Rodgers.
- Freshman punter **Caleb Lightbourn** downed three punts inside the Wisconsin 20, marking his second straight week with three punts inside the 20.
- Linebacker Josh Banderas tied for the team lead with eight tackles, marking his third straight game with eight or more tackles.

RILEY HOPES FOR CONTINUED SUCCESS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

Nebraska suffered a 23-17 overtime setback at Wisconsin last Saturday, dropping NU to 1-1 against ranked opponents this season. The Huskers defeated then-No. 22 Oregon on Sept. 17, continuing Head Coach Mike Riley's strong history of knocking off ranked teams during his college coaching career.

The Huskers will have another opportunity for a win over a ranked foe Saturday night when they take on No. 6 Ohio State in Columbus.

- Riley-coached teams have 16 wins over ranked teams in his 16 seasons as a college coach, 14 at Oregon State and wins over Michigan State in 2015 and Oregon in 2016.
- Last year's win over No. 6 Michigan State marked the sixth top-10 opponent a Rileycoached team defeated since 2006. The win was Nebraska's first over a top-10 opponent since October of 2011.

HUSKERS A TOUGH OUT

Nebraska has proven to be one of the nation's most improved teams in 2016, opening with a 7-1 record after a 6-7 mark a year ago. Despite losing seven games last season, Nebraska was competitive all season, and last week's setback at Wisconsin continued a recent trend of playing tight games.

- In the Huskers' eight losses in Mike Riley's two seasons at Nebraska, the largest margin of defeat has been 10 points. In fact, each of Nebraska's past 10 losses dating back to 2014 have come by 10 or fewer points.
- In 2016, Nebraska lost four games on the opponent's final possession or in overtime. The Huskers' other three losses were by 2, 8 and 10 points.
- Nebraska is 5-8 in games decided by 10 or fewer points under Mike Riley, including 0-2 in overtime.

2016 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

HUSKERS HAMMERING FOES IN FOURTH QUARTER

Nebraska has proven to be a dominant fourthquarter team in 2016. Nebraska owns a nationbest 95-point advantage in fourth-quarter scoring, and has been very strong in Big Ten play.

- Despite falling in overtime, Nebraska forced the extra session at Wisconsin by having a 10-0 fourth-quarter edge. Nebraska held the ball for 9:41 in the final quarter.
- The Huskers closed out their win over Purdue with a 10-0 fourth-quarter edge. NU out-yarded Purdue, 114-52, in the final quarter.
- In Nebraska's win at Indiana, the Huskers scored 10 fourth-quarter points to secure a victory. NU outgained Indiana 150-80 in the final quarter and held the ball for 11:16.
- Against Illinois, Nebraska had a 149-18 advantage in yards in the final quarter. The Huskers also had a 6-0 advantage in first downs and held the ball for 10:59.

- Nebraska averages an impressive 10:05 in time of possession in the final quarter. The Huskers held the ball for 11:11 in the fourth quarter against Purdue.
- Nebraska dominates on the ground in the fourth quarter, averaging 78.6 rushing yards in the fourth quarter to 28.8 for the opposition. Six of eight NU foes have rushed for 10 or fewer yards in the fourth quarter.

The Huskers have also dominated the opening quarter of games this season, outscoring the opposition 55-22 in the first quarter.

2016 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

BIG RED BALANCING ACT

The Nebraska offense is showing outstanding balance in its second season under Head Coach Mike Riley and offensive coordinator Danny Langsdorf. The 2016 success comes a year after Nebraska ranked second in the Big Ten in total offense and passing offense, while finishing third in scoring offense.

Nebraska made a powerful running game and a balanced offense primary goals for 2016, and have produced solid results.

- Nebraska is averaging 204.0 rushing yards per game to rank fifth in the Big Ten. NU had a season-high 310 rushing yards at Northwestern and has rushed for at least 200 yards four times in 2016.
- Nebraska is among the nation's most balanced offensive attacks. The Huskers average 225.6 passing yards per game and 429.6 total yards per game, which ranks fourth in the Big Ten.
- Nebraska's 15.4 yards per completion ranks seventh in the nation. The Huskers had five passing plays of at least 25 yards against Wyoming and had five of 20 or more vs. Purdue.
- Nebraska's 310 rushing yards at Northwestern marked the Huskers' fifth-highest rushing total in a Big Ten Conference game.
- The 556 yards of total offense at Northwestern marked the second-highest total in a Big Ten game in NU's six seasons in the league, trailing only a 624-yard effort against Illinois in 2014.
- Nebraska has gained at least 400 yards of total offense in eight of its past 10 games overall.
- Nebraska has topped 27 points in 12 of its past 15 games, and has scored at least 31 points in four of five home games this season.
- Nebraska is averaging 32.0 points per game in 2016 to rank sixth in the Big Ten. The 52 points against Wyoming were the most in two seasons under Mike Riley.
- Nebraska topped the 300-yard passing mark for the seventh time in two seasons under Mike Riley with 412 passing yards against Wyoming. The yardage total was the fifth highest in school history and most since the 2007 season.
- In addition to its 310-yard rushing effort at Northwestern, the Huskers rushed for 292 yards on 51 carries in the win over Fresno State. NU also had 228 rushing yards against Oregon, including 166 after half.

NEBRASKA LOOKS TO KEEP POUNDING BALL ON GROUND

Nebraska has shown the ability to control the running game on both sides of the ball in 2016.

Nebraska out-gained Northwestern, 310-137, on the ground, marking the third time since the 2015 Foster Farms Bowl that the Huskers have had at least 290 rushing yards. NU churned out 292 rushing yards on 51 carries in its seasonopening victory over Fresno State. That rushing effort came on the heels of running for 326 yards in the Foster Farms Bowl win over UCLA to close the 2015 season.

The Blackshirts have been strong against the run for the majority of the year, holding six opponents to 137 or fewer yards. NU limited Purdue to 24 rushing yards and Fresno State to 31 rushing yards. Oregon did rush for more than 300 yards, but Nebraska held the Ducks' high-powered pass game in check with only 146 passing yards.

• Nebraska is 8-0 under Riley when rushing for 200 yards or more, including 4-0 in 2016. The Huskers are 9-0 under Riley when out-rushing the opposition.

POUND THE ROCK, CONTROL THE CLOCK

Nebraska's ability to dominate the line of scrimmage and control the running game has translated directly to controlling the football.

- Nebraska averages 34:00 of time of possession to rank second in the Big Ten and 10th nationally in that category. Nebraska has won the TOP battle in all eight games and has possessed the ball for at least 35:00 three times in 2016.
- The Huskers' ability to control the football has resulted in Nebraska running 73 more plays than the opposition through eight games.

GAME-DECIDING DRIVES

Nebraska took the lead for good against Illinois with a memorable drive that spanned parts of the third and fourth quarters. Trailing 16-10, the Huskers embarked on an 18-play, 75-yard drive that consumed 10:42. The Huskers scored on a Terrell Newby 3-yard TD run and went on to a 31-16 win.

- The 18-play drive was NU's longest in terms of plays since a 20-play drive at Colorado in 2005.
- The 10:42 consumed on the drive is the most for a Husker scoring drive since at least 1990.
- Against Indiana, Nebraska had a fourth quarter drive that lasted 15 plays and 7:45 and resulted in a field goal that gave NU a 27-22 lead with less than a minute remaining.

FLIPPING THE TURNOVER SCRIPT

Nebraska has had solid success this season in changing its turnover fortunes. The Huskers are +5 in turnover margin after having a -12 turnover margin in 2015. NU has had a positive turnover margin just once in the past 12 seasons (+5 in 2009).

The Huskers +0.63 turnover margin per game ranks fifth in the Big Ten and 24th nationally.

- NU has a nation-leading 15 interceptions this season after posting 10 in 13 games in 2015.
- NU has scored 59 points on its 16 takeaways, while opponents have 18 points off 11 NU turnovers.

HUSKERS REMEMBER SAM FOLTZ Nebraska lost a member of its family this summer, when senior punter Sam Foltz passed away in an automobile accident on July 23.

The latest success story of the Huskers' legendary walk-on program, Foltz embodied Nebraska's commitment to success on the field, in the classroom and in the community. On the field, he was the 2015 Big Ten Punter of the Year and his career average of 42.6 yards per punt ranked fifth all-time at Nebraska. In the classroom, Foltz was a five-time member of the Nebraska Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll, and he earned his degree in agronomy last May. Foltz was also active in the community, earning spots on both the Brook Berringer and Tom Ösborne Citizenship teams in 2016, when he was also awarded a Nebraska Student-Athlete HERO Leadership Award for his leadership and dedicated community service.

INITIATIVES TO HONOR SAM FOLTZ

 Nebraska football players will wear a special "SF27" decal (pictured) on their helmets to honor Foltz's memory. The logo will also



be featured on players' game-day hats, sweatshirts and compression shirts, as well as on the coaches' sideline polo shirts.

- Nebraska's annual student-athlete HERO Leadership Award will be renamed the Sam Foltz Hero 27 Leadership Award. The award will be presented annually to 27 studentathletes across all sports who exhibit strong leadership qualities, commitment to service and ability to encourage/empower peers.
- The Sam Foltz Memorial Scholarship has been created and was presented to Drew Brown before the first game. The Foltz Scholarship will be presented annually to a member of the football team who embodied Foltz's traits of leadership, excellence in the community and in the classroom.
- Nebraska is selecting a Sam Foltz Captain of the Week who will join the season-long captains. The Foltz captain will carry a flag onto the field honoring Foltz's memory.



- Nebraska has won 18 consecutive games when it has a positive turnover margin dating back to a 2011 loss to Northwestern. NU is 6-0 under Mike Riley when it wins the turnover battle.
- Nebraska did not commit a turnover in the opener against Fresno State, while intercepting two Bulldog passes. The zero-turnover effort was NU's first since not having a giveaway in a 48-25 win at Minnesota last season.
- Nebraska has had four games with zero turnovers since 2014. In those games, NU's average margin of victory is 31.3 points.
- The Huskers had six takeaways, including five interceptions, against Wyoming. Those are the best totals in those categories since posting the same numbers against Idaho in 2010.
- The Huskers' plus-5 in turnover margin against Wyoming was their best since a +8 turnover margin against Texas A&M in 2003.
- Nebraska's performance in the first two games marked the first time the Huskers were +2 or better in turnover margin in consecutive games since the final two games of the 2003 season.

ARMSTRONG RE-WRITING NEBRASKA RECORD BOOKS

Quarterback **Tommy Armstrong Jr.** has made 41 starts since taking over as NU's starter in 2013. He has started 33 of 34 games since the start of the 2014 season. Armstrong's 29 career victories are tied for third in school history.

Armstrong ranks among the Big Ten offensive leaders for the second straight year. He has also begun to re-write the Nebraska record book, setting two major passing records already in 2016, with several other career records in his sights.

- Armstrong is averaging 272.9 yards per game in 2016 to rank third in the Big Ten. He averaged 285.8 yards per game in 2015 to rank second in the Big Ten.
- Armstrong became the 11th player in Big Ten history to eclipse 10,000 yards of total offense last week at Wisconsin.
- Armstrong enters this week's game with 10,181 yards of total offense and needs 54 yards to set the Nebraska career record. Taylor Martinez holds the record with 10,233 yards from 2010 to 2013.
- Armstrong is the first player in NU history with two 3,000-yard total offense seasons, after posting 3,430 yards in 2015 and 3,400 yards in 2014. Those totals rank third and fourth, respectively, on the season total offense list.
- Armstrong has 11 touchdown passes this season, including three each against Wyoming and Oregon. He has a school-record 64 career touchdown passes, surpassing the previous high of 56 by Taylor Martinez. Armstrong has thrown for at least three touchdowns nine times in his Nebraska career. His 64 career passing touchdowns rank 10th among active FBS players.
- Armstrong threw for 22 touchdowns in both 2014 and 2015, which tied for fourth on the NU season chart.
- Armstrong has thrown for 1,764 yards in 2016, increasing his career total to 8,455 passing yards, a Nebraska career record. Armstrong's

passing yardage ranks ninth among active FBS players.

- Armstrong is the 20th quarterback in Big Ten history to surpass 8,000 career passing yards.
- Armstrong threw for 377 yards against Wyoming, four yards shy of his career high of 381 yards vs. USC in 2014. The Wyoming game was his sixth career 300-yard passing game (319 vs. BYU, 309 at Miami, 368 vs. Southern Miss, 320 vs. Michigan State in 2015; 381 vs. USC, 2014). Armstrong has topped 250 passing yards 14 times in his career, the most in school history.
- Armstrong threw for 3,030 yards in 2015. The passing total marked the third 3,000-yard passing season in school history. He threw for 2,695 yards as a sophomore. Armstrong is one of just three players in Nebraska history with two 2,000-yard passing seasons, joining Martinez and Zac Taylor.
- With another 3,000-yard passing season in 2016, Armstrong would become the first Husker to post two 3,000-yard passing seasons.
- Armstrong had a career-high 431 yards of total offense against Southern Miss in 2015, and he has 13 career games of at least 300 yards of total offense, tops in school history. He had 303 yards of total offense against Purdue.
- Armstrong ranked 22nd in the nation in passes of 20-plus yards (51) in 2015. He has 19 passes of more than 25 yards in 2016.
- Armstrong rushed for a career-high 132 yards on 13 carries at Northwestern, marking his second career 100-yard rushing game. Armstrong had 95 yards the previous week vs. Oregon. He has 419 yards and seven rushing touchdowns in 2016, while averaging 4.5 yards per carry.
- Armstrong is one of 10 Nebraska quarterbacks to surpass 1,000 career rushing yards. He has 1,726 rushing yards, sixth-most among NU quarterbacks. He has 22 career rushing touchdowns, and is the 10th NU quarterback to reach 20 rushing scores.
- Armstrong earned Big Ten Offensive Player-ofthe-Week honors for his effort at Northwestern. He earned the same honor twice in 2015, first against Southern Miss, and then for his play in the win over No. 6 Michigan State.
- Armstrong is the only active FBS quarterback with 8,000 career passing yards and 1,500 career rushing yards.

WESTERKAMP CHASING NEBRASKA RECEIVING RECORDS

Senior receiver **Jordan Westerkamp** leads a Nebraska receiving corps that ranks as one of the nation's best. Westerkamp is one of the top pass catchers in Nebraska history. He is one of four captains for the 2016 season, marking the second straight year he has served as a captain.

Westerkamp returned to action at Wisconsin after missing the previous two games with a back injury. The two missed games were the first of Westerkamp's career, after he had previously played in all 44 games since the start of 2013.

A Chicago area product, Westerkamp put together one of the most prolific receiving seasons in school history in 2015. He had 65 catches for 918 yards and seven touchdowns. He earned second-team All-Big Ten honors for his effort in 2015.

Against Wyoming, Westerkamp had four receptions for 105 yards and two touchdowns, then added a pair of touchdown catches in the win over Oregon. He had three catches for a team-high 62 yards in his return at Wisconsin.

- Westerkamp continues to move up the NU career charts. He is fourth on the NU career receiving yardage list with 2,176 yards, leaving him 451 yards from the No. 1 spot.
- He has 145 career receptions, to rank third on Nebraska's all-time list. He passed Johnny Rodgers on NU's all-time list with his three catches at Wisconsin.
- Westerkamp's two-touchdown efforts against Wyoming and Oregon are the first multiple-TD games of his Husker career.
- Westerkamp's two multiple-TD reception games is just one off the NU season record. Quincy Enunwa (2013) and Bobby Thomas (1976) each had three games with a pair of receiving touchdowns for the Huskers.
- Westerkamp has 17 career touchdown catches to rank fourth in school history. His seven touchdown receptions in 2015 were tied for 10th on the season charts.
- Westerkamp surpassed 2,000 career receiving yards, joining Kenny Bell, Johnny Rodgers and Nate Swift in NU's 2,000-yard receiving club.
- Westerkamp's 100-yard receiving game vs. Wyoming was the eighth of his career, tying for the second most in school history.
- Westerkamp (105) and Alonzo Moore (109) each topped 100 receiving yards against Wyoming. That marked only the third time in NU history a pair of wideouts topped 100 receiving yards.
- Westerkamp has been a part of all three occasions. He and Kenny Bell combined for the feat against FAU in 2014, and Westerkamp and Reilly each topped the century mark against Southern Miss in 2015.
- Westerkamp's 65 catches in 2015 were second on the NU single-season charts, and were the most receptions ever by a Husker receiver.
- His 918 receiving yards in 2015 were the thirdmost in school history.

- Westerkamp had a career-high 11 receptions for 118 yards against Southern Miss in 2015. The 11 catches were tied for third on the NU single-game receptions list.
- Westerkamp had four 100-yard receiving games in 2015, tying a Nebraska season record, accomplished five times previously.
- Westerkamp has caught a pass in 32 straight games, tied for the second-longest streak in school history. It is just the eighth time in school history a player has had a streak of at least 20 consecutive games with a catch.

REILLY BIG-PLAY LEADER IN HUSKER RECEIVING CORPS

Senior **Brandon Reilly** is another important component of the receiving corps. He established himself as one of the nation's top big-play receiving threats in 2015, and has shown the same ability this fall.

Reilly had 40 receptions for 754 yards and four touchdowns in 2015, including a game-winning score in the final minute against Michigan State.

- Reilly has 12 catches for 249 yards in 2016, an average of 20.8 yards per catch which is eighth nationally. His first catch of the year was a 38-yarder against Wyoming. He missed both the Fresno State and Oregon games. He snagged a 35-yard catch at Northwestern, and had a spectacular 45-yarder at Indiana.
- Reilly has 1,112 career receiving yards, and is the 24th Husker with 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Reilly had eight receptions of at least 30 yards in 2015, the fourth-most in the Big Ten. He has four catches of at least 25 yards this season.
- Reilly's average of 18.9 yards per reception ranked first among Big Ten receivers who averaged at least 2.0 catches per game. The 18.9 yard-per-catch average was also the thirdbest average in NU history for players with at least 40 receptions.

THE LOUISIANA CONNECTION

Not to be forgotten among the Huskers' crew of pass catchers is a trio of Louisiana nativessenior receiver **Alonzo Moore**, sophomore receiver **Stanley Morgan Jr.** and senior tight end **Cethan Carter**.

Moore was the Huskers' top target through four games, with 12 receptions for 310 yards and two touchdowns, before battling a shoulder injury for two games.

Moore posted career receiving highs in each of the first two games with 92 yards against Fresno State and 109 yards in the win over Wyoming.

 Moore posted the three longest catches of his career in September–a 57-yard TD against Fresno State, a 63-yard TD grab against Wyoming, and a 59-yard catch to set up a touchdown at Northwestern. He also scored on a 24-yard run against Purdue.

• Moore is averaging 24.9 yards on his 13 receptions.

Morgan has a team-high 23 catches for 329 yards. He made his biggest impact of the season at Indiana with three catches for a career-high 93 yards, including a 72-yard touchdown. He had a career-high five receptions at Wisconsin.

 Morgan's fourth-quarter touchdown grab at Indiana was Nebraska's longest play of the season, and gave NU a 24-15 lead as the Huskers went on to a 27-22 win.

Carter has given Nebraska a strong passcatching option at tight end for the past several seasons. He has 10 receptions for 101 yards in 2016, with a touchdown catch at Northwestern. Carter left the Illinois game with an elbow injury and has missed the past three games. His status for this week's game is uncertain.

- Carter has 50 career receptions and is just the eighth Nebraska tight end with 50 career receptions.
- When he returns to action, Carter could challenge for second on the NU career tight end receptions list. Kyler Reed is second with 67 career receptions, trailing only Mike McNeill's NU tight end record of 82 career receptions.

Carter caught 24 passes for 329 yards during his junior season and earned honorable-mention All-Big Ten honors. He is on the watch list for the 2016 John Mackey Award.

NEWBY PACING RUSHING ATTACK

Senior **Terrell Newby** has been a workhorse back for the Huskers during Big Ten play. Newby and sophomore Devine Ozigbo split carries fairly evenly through the first five games, but an ankle injury limited Ozigbo to a handful of snaps against Indiana and Purdue, before he returned to more of a regular role at Wisconsin.

Newby has been strong the past four weeks, topping the century mark against both Illinois and Indiana, while churning out 82 yards against Purdue and 77 hard-fought yards at Wisconsin. Newby has been outstanding as Nebraska controlled the ball in the fourth quarter. Newby rushed for 113 yards on 16 fourth-quarter carries against Illinois, 57 yards on 11 carries in the fourth quarter at Indiana, and 65 yards on 10 carries against Purdue.

Newby leads the Huskers with 588 rushing yards and has four rushing touchdowns. Ozigbo has 353 yards and five scores.

- Newby is closing in on 2,000 career rushing yards. He has 1,948 career rushing yards, and is 52 yards from becoming the 29th 2,000-yard rusher in school history.
- In addition to Newby's two 100-yard games (140 vs. Illinois, 102 at Indiana), Ozigbo cracked the century mark with 103 yards vs. Fresno State.
- When including quarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr., Nebraska has had a player rush for at least 95 yards in five games this season.

BLACKSHIRTS LOOK TO REMAIN TOUGH AGAINST THE RUN

The Nebraska Blackshirt defense entered 2016 with a goal of making big improvements in pass defense and pressuring the quarterback. The Huskers also look to duplicate their 2015 success in stopping the opponent run game.

NU has been strong against the run in 2016, holding six foes to less than 140 rushing yards, including 31 yards by Fresno State and 24 yards by Purdue. Opponents are gaining 136.8 yards rushing per game to rank fifth in the Big Ten. In 2015, the Huskers allowed opponents to rush for 109.9 yards per game, second in the Big Ten and ninth nationally.

 Since the start of the 2015 season, Nebraska has limited eight opponents to less than 90 rushing yards, including Indiana and Purdue in Big Ten play. NU is 8-0 in those games.

OPPOSING PASSERS FINDING TOUGH GOING IN 2016

Nebraska struggled against the pass in 2015, and entered the season looking to limit big plays through the air. Nebraska is vastly improved defending the pass in 2016 and has made a habit of taking the ball away.

- Nebraska has intercepted 15 passes to lead the nation. The Huskers also rank 14th nationally in pass efficiency defense with a 107.94 rating.
- Nebraska is allowing 205.4 passing yards per game. Last season, the Huskers allowed 290.5 passing yards per game.
- The Huskers have limited four opponents to less than 200 yards passing, including 114 yards by Wisconsin. Last season, the first seven Husker opponents all topped 250 passing yards.
- The Huskers have allowed just seven passing touchdowns in eight games. Oregon did not have a touchdown pass against the Huskers, ending an NCAA record streak of 82 straight games for the Ducks with a passing TD.
- The vast improvement in pass defense has keyed a big jump in total defense for the 2016 Blackshirts. Nebraska is allowing 342.1 yards per game to rank 20th in the nation.

POINTS AT A PREMIUM VERSUS BLACKSHIRTS

Opponents have had a difficult time putting points on the board in 2016. NU is allowing 18.4 points per game to rank fourth in the Big Ten and 15th nationally in scoring defense.

 Nebraska has limited five foes to 17 or fewer points. Last season, Nebraska held just three opponents all season to less than 17 points.

- The Huskers have held each of their five Big Ten opponents to 23 or fewer points. The last time NU held five straight league foes to 23 points or fewer was in 2009 and 2010 when NU held nine straight Big 12 foes to 20 points or less.
- The Blackshirts are strong in the Red Zone. Opponents have made 16 trips inside the Huskers' 20-yard line, however just eight of those trips have resulted in touchdowns.

GERRY AGAIN SERVING AS LEADER OF HUSKER SECONDARY

Senior safety **Nathan Gerry** has been a fixture for the defense the past four seasons, and is having an All-America caliber season in 2016. Gerry saw action as a true freshman, then started every game in 2014 and 2015. Gerry is in his second season as a captain in 2016.

In 2015, Gerry was a third-team All-Big Ten choice by the league media, marking the second straight year he earned all-conference accolades. As a sophomore, Gerry garnered second-team all-conference honors.

Gerry opened his season against Wyoming with two interceptions and a team-high seven tackles. His play earned him Big Ten Defensive Playerof-the-Week honors. He added his second twointerception game of the season at Wisconsin with a pair of fourth-quarter picks.

Gerry also regularly paces the Huskers in tackles. He had a team-high nine tackles against Oregon, and a team-high eight stops, with two tackles for loss and two breakups at Northwestern. At Indiana he made eight tackles, including two for loss and he had seven solo stops at Wisconsin. Gerry is second on the team with 50 tackles. He led NU in tackles in 2015 and was second in 2014.

- Gerry's two interceptions at Wisconsin give him four interceptoins this season and he is tied for seventh nationally in interceptions per game.
- Gerry has 13 career interceptions total, one shy of the Nebraska career record, and tied for third among active FBS players. Dana Stephenson holds the Nebraska record with 14 interceptions and Gerry is tied with Josh Bullocks at 13 picks.
- Gerry led Nebraska in interceptions the past two seasons with five in 2014 and four in 2015.
- Gerry ranked in the top 10 in the Big Ten in interceptions each of the past two seasons. As a sophomore in 2014, he led the league in interceptions in conference games.
- Gerry has 249 career tackles to rank 11th in school history and second all-time among NU defensive backs. He is five tackles from the top 10 on the NU career list.
- Gerry's seven tackles for loss are second on the team and four TFL from the Nebraska season defensive back record, held by Ciante Evans.
- Gerry has 19 career tackles for loss which represents a school record for defensive backs.

SECONDARY 'LOCKING DOWN' OPPOSING PASSERS

The Nebraska secondary is arguably the Huskers' most improved position group in 2016. Nebraska ranks 14th in the nation in team pass efficiency defense and is first nationally in interceptions.

The success of the secondary has been a true team effort with Nebraska's five Blackshirt defensive backs all having at least one interception.

- Junior safety Kieron Williams is third on the team with 49 tackles, including 32 solo stops. He had 11 tackles at Indiana. Williams is tied for the team lead with four interceptions, including two against Purdue. He ranks 11th nationally in interceptions per game.
- Junior cornerback **Chris Jones** has three interceptions, including a 33-yard return for a touchdown at Indiana. Jones also leads the team with seven pass breakups and has 23 tackles. Jones has five career interceptions, all in the past 11 games.
- Junior cornerback **Joshua Kalu** has 39 tackles, including 29 solo stops. He is tied for third on the team with four breakups and had a gameclinching interception in the fourth quarter at Northwestern.
- Sophomore **Aaron Williams** serves as the Huskers' nickel back and has three interceptions, including the clincher at Indiana. He also has 29 tackles, three tackles for loss and four PBU.

NEBRASKA WINNING ON 'MONEY DOWN' AGAIN IN 2016

Coaches regularly preach the importance of winning on third down. Nebraska was effective on the 'money down' on both offense and defense in 2015, and has carried that success into 2016.

- In 2016, Nebraska is 56-of-114 on third downs (49 percent), to rank 12th in the nation. The Blackshirts have limited opponents to 35-of-106 (32 percent), good for 24th in the nation.
- Nebraska is one of seven teams in the nation to rank in the top 25 in both third-down offense and defense, including Ohio State.
- Nebraska ranked third in the Big Ten in thirddown conversions at 44.8 percent in 2015. Defensively, the Huskers were fifth in opponent third-down conversions at 34.0 percent.
- The Huskers ranked 24th nationally in both categories. Nebraska joined Clemson, Michigan and Tennessee as the only schools in the nation to rank in the top 25 in both third-down offense and defense.

KICKER BROWN CONTINUES FAMILY TRADITION

Place-kicker **Drew Brown** is a leading contender for conference and national honors, including the Lou Groza Award. Brown established himself as one of the nation's top kickers as a sophomore and earned second-team All-Big Ten honors last fall. He is putting together a strong 2016 campaign.

Brown is 8-of-10 on field goals in 2016, including 5-of-6 in the past three games. His streak of 13 straight made field goals ended against Illinois when he was just short on a career-long 56-

HOME OF THE HUSKERS

Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as Nebraska's head coach.

yard attempt. The 13 straight field goals was the third-longest streak in NU history.

Brown made 21-of-27 field goals in 2015, including his last 11 field goals. Nine of those 11 field goals were from at least 40 yards.

- Brown has 43 field goals in his three-year career, tied for the third most in school history.
- Brown connected on a career-long 51-yard field goal against Purdue, and has made 17 field goals of at least 40 yards in his career. He was 13-of-17 from beyond 40 yards in 2015, including 12-of-14 from 40-49 yards.
- Brown's 13 field goals of at least 40 yards tied for the most nationally among all kickers.
- Brown's 21 field goals in 2015 were second on the Nebraska season list.
- Brown was second in the Big Ten at 1.62 field goals per game. He was third in the Big Ten in scoring at 8.2 points per game.
- Brown scored 107 points as a sophomore after posting a freshman-record 101 points in 2014. He is the first player in NU history with 100-point seasons as both a freshman and sophomore.
- Brown has increased his career scoring total to 263 points to rank ninth in NU history.
- Brown made five field goals against Southern Miss in 2015, all in the first half. The five field goals in a half tied an NCAA record. The five field goals were the most ever by a Husker in Lincoln, and tied a Memorial Stadium record held by two opposing kickers.
- The five field goals marked the third time in NU history a kicker had five or more field goals. Dale Klein had an NCAA record seven field goals at Missouri in 1985, and Alex Henery had five field goals at Virginia Tech in 2009.

Junior **De'Mornay Pierson-El** has returned to his big-play ways in the punt return game in 2016. Pierson-El had a 45-yard return in the second quarter against Oregon to set up a touchdown just before halftime.

The play flipped momentum in the game, cutting the Ducks' halftime lead to 20-14, and set the stage for the Nebraska victory. Pierson-El added a 27-yard return against Illinois and averages 9.7 yards per return in 2016 to rank second in the Big Ten.

- The 45 and 27-yard returns in 2016 give Pierson-El 11 career returns of at least 25 yards. Pierson-El had eight returns of 25-plus as a true freshman in 2014, one in an injury-plagued sophomore season and two this season.

NEBRASKA WALK-ON TRADITION CONTINUES

Mike Riley placed three former walk-ons on scholarship before the season. The members of the group are all Nebraska natives and fifthyear seniors in the Husker program.

Nabity has played in 32 games in his Nebraska career, primarily on special teams. Rath is a reserve defensive tackle as a senior, and has played in six games with the Huskers. Simpson is among Nebraska's top special teams performers. He has played in 35 games and has 13 special teams tackles with the Huskers.

Nebraska has a long tradition of relying on its walk-on program to help build the foundation of the program. Six walk-ons have gone on to earn first-team All-America honors for Nebraska, while 13 walk-ons have earned firstteam academic All-America recognition.

FOUR TRUE FRESHMEN SEEING ACTION FOR 2016 HUSKERS

Nebraska has four true freshmen who have seen action in 2016. Punter **Caleb Lightbourn** is Nebraska's starting punter, and the other true freshmen to hit the field include I-back/kickoff returner **Tre Bryant**, cornerback **Lamar Jackson** and safety **JoJo Domann**.

Nebraska Head Coach **Mike Riley** earned his 100th win as a collegiate head coach in the 43-10 win over Fresno State in the season opener. Riley won 93 games in 14 seasons at Oregon State and has 13 victories at Nebraska.

- Riley is one of 23 active FBS head coaches with 100 career college victories.
- All 106 of Riley's victories have come while coaching in a Power Five Conference. Riley is one of nine active coaches to win 100 games at a Power Five Conference school.

NU STAFF BRINGS VETERAN PRESENCE TO SIDELINE

Nebraska Head Coach Mike Riley is in his second season in Lincoln, and his 25th season overall as a head coach. Riley is in his 16th season as a college head coach, including 14 years at Oregon State. He also has nine years as a professional head coach, including three years in the NFL.

- Riley is in his 42nd overall season in either the college or professional coaching ranks, the second-most of any FBS head coach. He trails only Alabama's Nick Saban, who is in his 44th season in coaching in 2016.
- With his 25 years of head coaching experience, Riley ranks second among current FBS head coaches in total years of head coaching experience. Notre Dame's Brian Kelly is in his 27th season in 2016.
- Riley is one of only four FBS head coaches with at least three years of NFL head coaching experience. Three of those four coaches are in the Big Ten, including Riley, Illinois' Lovie Smith and Jim Harbaugh of Michigan.

NU RANKS AMONG NATION'S ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Nebraska is averaging 90,248 fans for five home games in 2016. NU averaged 89,998 fans for its seven home games at Memorial Stadium in 2015, to rank 11th in the nation and fourth among Big Ten schools. The 2015 season marked the third straight year NU ranked 11th or higher in average attendance.

In 2014, Nebraska was 10th in average home attendance with 91,249 fans per game. The average attendance for seven home games was the largest ever at Memorial Stadium, bettering the 2013 mark of 90,933 per game.

NU has ranked in the top 20 nationally in attendance each of the 17 years with available attendance figures.

NCAA RECORD SELLOUT STREAK PASSES 350 GAMES

One of the most remarkable streaks in college sports continues in 2016. Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, a streak of 352 consecutive sellouts, 98 more than second-place Notre Dame.

- NU is 301-51 (.855) record during the streak.
- Overall attendance during the sellout streak totals 26,801,399.

- In the past three decades, NU has had three home winning streaks of 20 or more games and overall has posted 41 unbeaten and untied home seasons.
- The Huskers are 536-147-20 (.777, 703 games, 127 years) in Lincoln, and 411-124-13 (.762, 548 games, 93 years) in Memorial Stadium (since 1923).

NEBRASKA AMONG NATION'S TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is in its 127th season of college football and owns an 887-369-40 all-time record in 1,296 games (.700). Nebraska is one of 10 programs with 800 all-time victories, ranking fourth with 887 wins.

Since 1970, NU has a 453-128-5 record, for a .777 winning percentage in 586 games.

- Nebraska ranks as the nation's winningest program over the last 40, 50 and 60 years.
- Since Nebraska's first football season in 1890, Husker teams have won 11 or more games 12 times, including seven times since 1993.
- Nebraska has won 12 or more games seven times, including three seasons with 13 wins (1971, 1994, 1997).
- Nebraska has 24 10-win seasons since 1970.
- Nebraska has 49 nine-win seasons in school history, including 41 since 1970 and 47 since Bob Devaney took over the Nebraska program in 1962. No other school in the nation has more than 32 nine-win seasons in that same time.
- NU was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.
- Nebraska ranks third in NCAA history with 52 all-time bowl appearances, while the Huskers rank in a tie for seventh with 26 bowl victories.

HUSKERS RANK IN TOP 10 OF ALL-TIME AP RANKING

The Associated Press weekly poll began in 1936 and has been a fixture in college football ever since. This August the AP released an all-time top 100 for the first time, ranking programs over the history 80-year history of the poll.

Nebraska checked in at No. 6 in the alltime rankings and was one of three Big Ten programs in the top seven in the poll. Nebraska has appeared in 65 percent of all polls since 1936 and has been ranked No. 1 in 72 polls.

 In addition to the lofty rankings in the AP alltime top 10 poll, Nebraska was also recently recognized as a historically elite program by ESPN.com. In a late August article, ESPN.com identified Nebraska as one of one of eight "Blue Blood" programs in college football history.

NEBRASKA AMONG LEADERS IN AP NATIONAL TITLES

Alabama leads the nation by winning 10 Associated Press national titles since 1936, with Notre Dame (8), Oklahoma (7), Miami (5), USC (5), Nebraska (4) and Minnesota (4) next in line. While the Huskers were awarded the national title by the coaches in 1997, NU finished second to Michigan in the AP poll.

In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the AP national title, but not the coaches (Texas was first, Ohio State second and NU third) as the final poll was released before the bowl games were played. In the coaches poll (since 1950), NU is tied for fourth with Miami and Texas with four titles, behind Alabama (9), Oklahoma (6) and USC (5).

CONFERENCE CROWNS

Nebraska has won 46 football conference championships in school history. The Huskers won 13 conference titles under Tom Osborne and eight under Bob Devaney.

During its 15-year history in the Big 12 Conference, Nebraska won league titles in 1997 and 1999, and also appeared in the Big 12 Championship Game in 1996, 2006, 2009 and 2010. Nebraska was one of just three teams to capture two or more Big 12 titles in the first 15 years of the league, joining Oklahoma and Texas. Nebraska's six Big 12 title game appearances were second only to Oklahoma's eight. NU made its first appearance in the Big Ten Championship Game in 2012.

A HOLIDAY TRADITION

Nebraska participated in its 52nd bowl game in the 2015 Foster Farms Bowl.

Nebraska is one of only five programs with 50 or more bowl appearances, and its 52 bowl appearances are third all-time, trailing only Alabama (62) and Texas (53).

- The Huskers have played in the postseason in 45 of the past 47 seasons.
- Nebraska appeared in an NCAA-record 35 straight bowl games from 1969 to 2003.
- NU owns a 26-26 all-time bowl record, and the 26 bowl victories rank seventh nationally.

The Huskers have clinced a bowl berth in 2016 with seven victories.

2016 SEASON NOTEBOOK SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Big Ten Conference moved to a ninegame conference schedule in 2016. Nebraska and the other six members of the Big Ten West Division will play four home games and five road games.
- The Huskers' game at Indiana was Nebraska's first conference matchup with the Hoosiers. Nebraska's meeting with Maryland on Nov. 19 will mark the first-ever matchup between the teams.
- The Huskers' non-conference schedule was highlighted by the start of a home-and-home series with Oregon. Nebraska will make a return trip to Eugene in the 2017 season. The two meetings are the first between the schools since Oregon played in Lincoln in both 1985 and 1986.
- Nebraska will play seven games against teams that played in a bowl game last season, including New Year's Six participants lowa (Rose) and Ohio State (Fiesta). The Big Ten Championship Game is scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 3, at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- The Nebraska coaching staff has one new full-time face for the 2016 season, but it is a familiar one to Husker fans. Mike Riley hired John Parrella as the Huskers' defensive line coach in February. A former Nebraska and NFL standout, Parrella returned to his alma mater after two seasons on the defensive staff at Northern Michigan.
- Parrella was an All-Big Eight defensive tackle for Nebraska and played 12 seasons in the NFL, including appearances in three Super Bowls.
- Defensive coordinator Mark Banker did not coach a position in his first year at Nebraska in 2015. This fall, Banker is coaching the Huskers' safeties, allowing Brian Stewart to focus solely on the cornerbacks.
- The Husker full-time coaching staff has numerous ties to the National Football League, led by Coach Riley. The Huskers have also added new faces in support roles with links to the NFL. Former St. Louis Rams General Manager Billy Devaney is the Huskers' Executive Director of Player Personnel and Special Assistant to the Head Coach. Roman Sapolu is in his second season as a graduate assistant with the program and is the son of Jesse Sapolu a member of four World Championship teams with the San Francisco 49ers. Chase Haslett is an offensive assistant in 2016 and is the son of long-time NFL coach Jim Haslett. James Rodgers, who played under Mike Riley at Oregon State, spent time in the NFL with the Atlanta Falcons. Rodgers has joined the program as a personnel assistant.



ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska has a long history of attracting players from all parts of the United States, and the 2016 roster is no different. Nebraska has players from 27 states and Canada on its 137-player roster.
- The Huskers have 57 homegrown Nebraska players on the 2016 roster.
- The roster includes seven additional states with at least five players. Nebraska has 10 players from California, eight each from Florida, Louisiana, Missouri and Texas, and five each from Colorado and Illinois.
- Nebraska's 2016 signing class featured 21 players from 14 states, including multiple signees from California (4), Nebraska, Colorado and Missouri (2).

ACADEMIC NOTES

- Four Huskers are playing this season as graduate students. Charles Jackson (May, 2016), Alonzo Moore (August, 2016), Michael Rose-Ivey (August, 2016), and Corey Whitaker (August, 2016) have all earned their degrees. In addition, punter Sam Foltz (May, 2016) had earned his college degree before his passing in July.
- Nineteen additional members of the senior class are expected to pick up their undergraduate degrees in December.
- Nebraska posted a football Graduation Success Rate of 85 percent in 2015 to rank second in the Big Ten. Nebraska's GSR is the ninth-best among all FBS schools and third among public schools in the FBS ranks.
- Husker football players have combined for 107 CoSIDA Academic All-America awards. Nebraska football has produced more academic All-Americans than any other sport in NCAA history, while Nebraska leads the nation with 325 academic All-Americans across all sports.

Lincoln (Sept. 3) ----On an emotional night for the Husker football Nebraska program. honored Sam Foltz in a 43-10 victory over Fresno State in the season opener.

On Nebraska's first series of the season. NU went three-and-out and was forced to punt, and lined up without a punter, as they honored Foltz, Nebraska's 2015 Big Ten Punter of the Year who



died in a car crash in July. The sellout crowd of 90,013 roared as the play clock expired and Fresno State players applauded the Husker tribute, and declined the delay of game penalty.

Tommy Armstrong and Devine Ozigbo rushed for two touchdowns apiece, as Nebraska took control in the second half to give Mike Riley his 100th collegiate win.

Devine posted his first career 100-yard game, finishing with 103 yards on 17 carries, including first-half touchdown runs of 1 and 6 yards, while Armstrong scored twice in the second half and connected with Alonzo Moore on a 57-yard touchdown pass. The Huskers outscored the Bulldogs 29-0 in the second half. Armstrong rushed for 42 yards on 11 carries while also throwing for 108 yards and a TD. Moore was the biggest beneficiary, hauling in three passes for 92 yards while rushing for 34 yards on two carries.

Leading 14-10 at halftime, Nebraska's defense took over, forcing a three-and-out. The Huskers went 57 yards in nine players, capped by Armstrong's nine-yard scoring run, to push their edge to 21-10 on the opening drive of the half. The Blackshirts, who forced a trio of 3-and-outs in the second half, set up the Huskers' next score after a Kieron Williams interception. Two plays later Armstrong hit Moore in stride for a 57-yard scoring strike to give NU a 28-10 lead on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Williams totaled a career-high 10 tackles for the Huskers, while Ross Dzuris had a pair of sacks, as Nebraska limited Fresno State to just 128 second-half yards with 71 of those coming on the final drive after NU built a 43-10 cushion late in the fourth quarter.

Lincoln (Sept. 10) --- Tommy Armstrong Jr. threw three touchdown passes to become NU's career leader and ran for another score, as the Huskers soared to a 52-17 win over Wyoming.

For the second straight week, Nebraska got off to a fast start, iumping out to a 17-0 lead and finished with a flourish.

After Wyoming cut the Husker lead to 24-17 heading into the fourth quarter, the Big Red erupted, outscoring the Cowboys 28-0 over the next 10 minutes, starting with Armstrong's 34-yard scoring strike to senior wide receiver Jordan Westerkamp.

The Cowboys then let the game get out of hand. On their first play from scrimmage on the ensuing drive, quarterback Josh Allen threw a screen pass behind running back Brian Hill. Ross Dzuris scooped up the backward lateral and rumbled to the one-yard line, setting up a one-yard Devine Ozigbo run to push the Big Red's lead to 38-17 with 12:59 left.

On Wyoming's next drive, Nathan Gerry intercepted Nebraska's third pass of the half, which set up a nine-yard touchdown pass to Westerkamp. The TD pass was Armstrong's 57th of his career, breaking the record of 56 by Taylor Martinez. Armstrong finished his record-setting day by completing 20-of-34 passes for 377 yards and three scores. On the ensuing drive, Chris Jones intercepted another Allen pass and returned it to the Wyoming 35. One play later, Ryker Fyfe hit Gabe Rahn with a 35-yard scoring strike to make it 52-17.

While Armstrong and the offense amassed 550 total yards, the Blackshirts set the tone for the second half by forcing six turnovers including five interceptions. The Husker defense surrendered 320 total yards, including just 131 on the ground.

The first interception of the game for the Blackshirts came from Aaron Williams, which thwarted Wyoming's second drive of the second half after the Cowboys had cut NU's lead to 17-10 with a field goal on the opening drive of the half. On the Cowboys' next possession, the Huskers pushed the lead back to 14, as Kieron Williams intercepted another Allen pass and returned it 23 yards for a score.

Lincoln (Sept. 17) -- Tommy Armstrong Jr. threw for 200 yards and three TDs, while his 34-yard draw play scored the go-ahead touchdown, lifting Nebraska to a 35-32 win over No. 22 Oregon.

Armstrong's gutty performance included completing 17-for-33 for 200 vards and three scores while running 16 times for 95 vards and a touchdown. Nebraska posted its first win in non-conference action against a ranked opponent since 2001.

After Oregon took a 32-28 lead with 10:31 remaining, the Huskers went 80 yards on 11 plays to regain the lead. Nebraska was facing a 4th-and-9 at its 48 with less than four minutes remaining when Armstrong found Westerkamp for 14 yards to keep the chains moving. Two plays later, the senior quarterback sprinted 34 yards to give the Huskers the lead for good with 2:29 left.

Oregon had one last drive and got the ball to midfield before the

Husker defense stiffened. On 3rd-and-20, Freedom Akinmoladun forced a fumble which Oregon recovered at the NU 48. The Ducks had one last chance, but Michael Rose-Ivey snuffed out the play, tackling guarterbck Dakota Prukop at the 45 to secure the win.

Prukop threw for 146 yards and ran for 94 for the Ducks, who rushed for 336 yards, including 100 by Kani Benoit.

Trailing 20-7, De'Mornay Pierson-El electrified the 350th consecutive sellout, taking an Oregon punt back 45 yards to get the Huskers in scoring position. Armstrong connected with Westerkamp for a 2-yard TD pass with five seconds left in the half to cut the lead to six.

The Huskers took the second half kickoff and marched 75 yards in seven plays. The Husker ground game put Nebraska into scoring position, before Armstrong threw a 22-yard touchdown pass to Bryan Reimers to take a 21-20 lead. The Huskers extended the lead to 28-20, as Devine Ozigbo scored on a 7-yard run with 6:13 left in the third guarter.

Oregon answered back with a 75 yard touchdown drive capped by Benoit's 41-yard run one play after the Ducks converted a 3rd-and-27. Oregon regained the lead early in the fourth quarter when Brooks-James scored his third touchdown of the day, this one from one yard, to make it 32-28 after the two-point conversion failed. Oregon went just 1-of-5 in two-point conversion attempts.

Nebraska amassed 556 yards of total offense, as Armstrong accounted for 378 total yards, including his first 100-yard game since 2014. He also completed 18-of-29 passes for 246 yards and one touchdown

Alonzo Moore led the Nebraska receivers with three receptions for a team-high 72 yards, including a 59-yarder to set up Terrell Newby's second-quarter touchdown to give the Huskers a 10-7 lead. Stanley Morgan Jr. added a team-high four receptions for 33 vards, while nine different Huskers hauled in catches on the night. Despite dominating the game statistically, Nebraska was unable

to put Northwestern away because of a pair of first-half fumbles into the end zone that resulted in touchbacks for the Wildcats instead of

touchdowns for the Huskers. Those setbacks caused the Huskers to trail 7-3 late into the first half until Newby found paydirt from four yards out for the Big Red with 1:41 left in the second quarter.

While Nebraska lost a pair of turnovers in the Northwestern end zone in the first half, the Blackshirts evened that category with a pair of second-half interceptions. On Northwestern's opening drive of the second half, Aaron Williams pulled down an interception in the end zone to prevent the Wildcats from regaining the lead. Williams added seven tackles, including one tackle for loss.

Armstrong and the offense made Northwestern pay by marching 80 yards in 10 plays capped by Armstrong's four-yard touchdown pass to tight end Cethan Carter to give the Big Red a 17-7 edge. Carter finished with two catches for 31 yards while adding one carry for 16 yards.

Northwestern responded quickly with Clayton Thorson's 24-yard touchdown pass to Austin Carr to cap a five-play, 52-yard drive that cut Nebraska's lead to 17-13.

Leading 17-13 after Mitchell's missed extra point, Nebraska put the game away on its next drive, as Armstrong marched the Huskers 79 vards in nine plays capped by wide receiver Jordan Westerkamp's 10-yard touchdown run with 3:06 left in the third guarter.

Westerkamp's touchdown run capped the scoring in the game, as Joshua Kalu closed out a strong effort by the Blackshirt defense with his interception deep in Nebraska territory to end Northwestern's final scoring threat late in the fourth quarter. Kalu finished the game with seven tackles.

Husker safeties Nathan Gerry and Kieron Williams led the Blackshirts with eight tackles apiece. Gerry added two tackles for loss including a shared sack with defensive tackle Mick Stoltenberg, while pitching in a pair of big breakups.

Lincoln (Oct. 1) -- Terrell Newby had 113 of his season-high 140 yards in the fourth quarter, including a pair of touchdowns, as No. 15 Nebraska rallied for a 31-16 win over Illinois.

Newby was spectacular, rushing or receiving on 18 of Nebraska's final 21 plays from scrimmage, scoring on runs of 3 and 63 yards as the Huskers outscored Illinois 21-0 in the fourth quarter.

Trailing 16-10, the Huskers took control with an 18-play, 75-yard drive that took 10:42 on the clock. Newby capped the drive with five consecutive carries, extending it with a run on 4th-and-1 before scoring one play later to give Nebraska a 17-16 lead

After forcing a three-and-out, Newby led the Huskers to another score, touching the ball on nine of 10 plays before Tommy Armstrong Jr. found Trey Foster on a six yard TD pass to push the lead to 24-16.

The Blackshirts, who allowed a season-low 270 yards, forced a three-and-out, and Newby put the game out of reach with a season-long 63-yard touchdown run for the final margin. Nebraska extended its fourthguarter dominance to 78-6 on the season.

Newby finished with a season-high 140 yards on 27 carries en route to his third career 100-yard game. Armstrong guided a balanced offense, completing 16-of-23 passes for 220 yards and a touchdown through the air. Armstrong completed passes to 10 different receivers in the win, as Nebraska improved to 5-0 overall and 2-0 in the Big Ten.

Nebraska took control early, going 75 yards on 13 plays on its opening drive, capped by an Armstrong one-yard run. On the next possession, the Huskers tried a 56-yard field goal, but came up short. Illinois took advantage of the short field, going 60 yards on eight plays culminating in a 31-yard touchdown run by Kendrick Foster to tie the score.

Nebraska regained the lead at 10-7 on Drew Brown's 29-yard field goal, but Illinois responded with a pair of field goals in the final 1:01 of the half to take a 13-10 halftime lead. Illinois extended the margin to 16-10 on Chase McLaughlin's third field goal of the game, this one coming from 33 yards with 7:40 left in the third guarter

Bloomington, Ind. (Oct. 15) -- No. 10 Nebraska jumped to a 17-0 first-quarter lead then got 10 huge points in the fourth quarter to hold off Indiana, 27-22.

The Huskers, who improved to 6-0 overall and 3-0 in the Big Ten, bled the clock dry behind the play of Tommy Armstrong Jr., I-back Terrell Newby and the rest of the Nebraska offense.

After Indiana cut the Huskers' lead to 24-22 with 8:26 left, the Huskers mounted a 15-play, 60-yard march that consumed 7:41 on the clock and all of Indiana's timeouts. Newby carried the load on the drive, while Armstrong added a big 12-yard run and a key fourth-down conversion at midfield. Newby, who finished the day with 102 yards and a touchdown, had nine totes for 49 vards on Nebraska's final drive Drew Brown extended NU's lead to 27-22 with a 39-vard field



goal with 45 seconds remaining. The Blackshirts snuffed out Indiana's final drive following Aaron Williams' game-sealing interception with 30 seconds remaining. With the win, NU improved to 6-0 for the first time since 2001 and extended its winning streak to seven games.

Williams' interception was one of two turnovers forced by the Huskers, as Chris Jones' 33-vard interception return for a score helped stake Nebraska an early 17-point lead.

Nebraska completely controlled the first quarter on both sides of the ball. Armstrong led the Huskers on a 12-play, 52-yard drive to set up Brown's 40-yard field goal to give Nebraska a 3-0 lead

On the Huskers' next possession, NU went 64 yards in six plays, highlighted by Brandon Reilly's spectacular 45-yard reception. Newby's four-yard scoring run made it 10-0.

Just 14 seconds later, Nebraska was back celebrating a touchdown as Jones intercepted a Richard Lagow pass and sprinted 33 yards untouched into the end zone to give Nebraska 17-0 lead

While Nebraska owned the first quarter, Indiana controlled the second and third quarters to pull within 17-15 on Devine Redding's 33-yard run on the final play of the third quarter.

But the Husker offense provided a guick-strike answer of their own early in the fourth guarter, when Stanley Morgan Jr. made an outstanding adjustment on a deep ball thrown by Armstrong and turned it into a 72-yard touchdown pass. Morgan's touchdown pushed Nebraska's to 24-15.

Lincoln (Oct. 22) – Tommy Armstrong Jr. became Nebraska's career leader in pass completions and accounted for 303 yards of total offense as Nebraska improved to 7-0 with a 27-14 win over Purdue.

Armstrong completed 17-of-31 passes for 252 yards and one touchdown, while adding 51 rushing yards and a touchdown.

Nebraska used another quick start and a strong second-half defensive effort to remain unbeaten. Kieron Williams opened the game with an interception on Purdue's first play from scrimmage and Armstrong scampered 22 yards on the next play, giving the Huskers a 7-0 lead just 16 seconds into the game.

Purdue came right back behind the play of David Blough, who was 16-of-20 for 231 yards and two TD passes in the first half. Blough found DeAngelo Yancey on scoring passes of one and 88 yards, as the Boilermakers took a 14-10 lead into the locker room.

But as they have done throughout the season, the Huskers controlled the second half, outscoring Purdue 17-0 after halftime, including 10-0 in the fourth quarter. The Blackshirts allowed just 94 yards in the second half, giving the Husker offense time to regroup. Josh Banderas led NU with a season-high 13 tackles, while Williams posted his second multi-interception game of his career.

Nebraska regained the lead for good midway through the third quarter, going 68 yards in five plays, as Armstrong found a streaking De'Mornay Pierson-El for a 40-yard scoring strike to give NU a 17-14 lead. Pierson El had three catches for a season-high 69 yards, while Brandon Reilly led the Huskers with four catches for 73 yards.

After forcing a Purdue punt, Nebraska put together its most sustained drive of the day with an 11-play 82-yard march, culminating in a 24-yard scoring run from Alonzo Moore to extend the lead to 24-14 with 14:05 left.

On Purdue's next possession, the Boilermakers attempted a fake punt in their own territory that was snuffed out by the Husker special teams. Despite losing five yards on their drive, the Huskers and Drew Brown put three more points on the board with his career-long 51-yard field goal to give Nebraska a 27-14 edge. The Blackshirts continued to apply pressure, snuffing out another Purdue drive with Williams' second interception of the game and team-leading fourth of the season.

As a team, Nebraska amassed 409 yards of total offense including 157 rushing yards on 37 attempts. The Huskers also controlled the clock by holding possession for 33:19. Terrell Newby led the NU ground game with 82 yards on 22 carries. Blough completed 25-of-43 passes for 309 yards with two touchdowns and one interception.

The Huskers could not capitalize, as Tommy Armstrong could not connect with Stanley Morgan Jr. in the end zone for the potential game winner. Morgan had four catches for 56 yards in the fourth quarter to help NU get to overtime.

Morgan finished the night with a career-high five catches for 58 yards, while Jordan Westerkamp added three receptions for a team-best 62 yards.

Armstrong struggled throughout the night against a stingy Badger defense, completing just 12-of-31 passes for 153 yards

with two first-half interceptions. However, Nebraska's Blackshirt defense allowed just three points off the turnovers to keep the Huskers within striking distance.

The Blackshirts made up for Armstrong's first-half interceptions by pulling down a pair of their own in the fourth quarter - both by senior safety Nathan Gerry. The Husker offense also managed just three points from the two turnovers.

In fact, the two teams not only matched each other point-for-point during regulation, it was nearly yard-for-yard. Nebraska totaled 303 yards in regulation, while Wisconsin had 312. But in the overtime, Wisconsin prevailed with six points and 25 yards on the ground, while the Huskers mustered just two yards on their OT possession.

The teams traded early touchdowns before Wisconsin took a 10-7 lead on Endicott's 44-yard field goal with 6:53 left in the half. Wisconsin extended the margin to 17-7 midway through the third quarter as Alex Hornibrook hit Robert Wheelwright with a nine-yard touchdown pass.

Nebraska fought back, scoring 10 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to send the game to overtime. Armstrong led NU on a 14-play drive, going the final two yards to pull Nebraska within 17-14 with 13:45 remaining.

Gerry led the Huskers with a pair of fourth-quarter interceptions. His second led to NU's game-tying field goal. NU went 52 yards in 11 plays before Drew Brown's 35-yard field tied the score with 3:43 in regulation.
