#### **GENERAL MEDIA POLICIES**

All player and coach interviews must be arranged at least one day in advance through the Nebraska Communications Office. Contact Keith Mann, Shamus McKnight, Matt Smith or Erica Nett. All post-practice interviews will be conducted at the practice site. Interviews will not be conducted in the weight room, Student Life Complex, training room, hallways or the tunnel leading from the locker room to the field. The Nebraska locker room, training room and football office meeting rooms are **OFF-LIMITS** to the media. When arriving for post-practice interviews, media should wait in the Hawks Center lobby, or access Memorial Stadium through Gate 11 entrance if practice is in the stadium.

Requested players are available (depending on class schedules) at the Monday press conferences (11:30 a.m.-1 p.m.) and after practice on the field on Tuesday. Player cell phone numbers will **NOT** be given to the media.

Practices are **CLOSED** to the media and to the general public during the season. Media will be allowed to shoot photos/video at the start of practice on Tuesdays (app. 15 minutes). A Communications representative will be on hand during the open portion of practice.

After all games, Nebraska's locker room is closed. Head Coach Mike Riley, coordinators and requested players will be brought to the postgame interview room after a 10-minute cooling off period. At home, the postgame interview room is located in the strength complex of the Osborne Athletic Complex. Media are asked to wait to set up equipment until the conclusion of halftime. On the road, Coach Riley, assistant coaches and requested players will be brought to the designated interview area. Please note, **NO INTERVIEWS** will be conducted on the field as the players are returning to the locker room.

#### MOOS NAMED NEBRASKA ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Bill Moos, a distinguished leader in collegiate athletics who elevated programs at the Oregon and Washington State to national prominence, was named Nebraska's athletic director on Sunday, Oct. 15.

Moos, who had been director of athletics at Washington State since 2010, began his tenure in Lincoln on Monday, Oct. 23.

In his seven years at Washington State, Moos secured a 10-year, \$35 million marketing rights agreement with IMG College and led a \$130 million addition and remodel of WSU's football stadium. He was in a leading position in securing the conference's 12-year, \$3 billion television contract with Fox and ESPN. In Moos' time in Pullman, the Cougar Athletic Fund's Annual Giving program has seen an 81 percent increase in gifts. From 2010-16, Cougar student-athletes and coaches earned 805 academic all-conference honors, 130 all-conference selections, 45 All-America accolades and three Pac-12 coach-of-the-year honors.

Moos led Oregon's athletics from 1995-2007, during which time the athletic department grew to national prominence – its annual budget rose from \$18.5 million in his first year to more than \$40 million by 2007 and became self-sufficient. In Moos' Oregon tenure, the Ducks won 13 Pac-10 championships in six different sports; and UO student-athletes earned 722 academic all-conference selections, 34 Academic All-America selections, nine NCAA post Graduate Scholars and one NCAA Top VIII Award. Moos came to Oregon after five years as the University of Montana's director of athletics. He began his career in 1982 as assistant athletic director at Washington State and also was the school's associate director. He was director of development for more than five years and associate director for nearly two, supervising all external operations. For eight years prior to that, he managed and owned private businesses in Washington and Oregon.

Raised on a wheat and cattle ranch in eastern Washington, Moos went to high school in Olympia when his father was in the governor's cabinet. He earned a bachelor's degree in history in Pullman and was a threeyear letterman in football. He co-captained Washington State's 1972 team and was firstteam All-Pac-8. He and his wife Kendra have three daughters, Christa, Brittany and Kaiti; and two sons, Bo and Benjamin.

#### RILEY IN THIRD SEASON AT HELM OF HUSKER PROGRAM

Head Coach Mike Riley is in his third season as the Nebraska head coach in 2017. Riley has guided the Huskers to an 18-15 record.

- Riley is in his 26th season as a head coach, tying for the second-most experience of any FBS head coach entering the 2017 season.
- Riley is one of eight active FBS head coaches who also has experience as an NFL head coach.
- Riley owns 16 victories over nationally ranked opponents during his college head coaching tenure.

#### VETERANS LEADING YOUNG 2017 HUSKER TEAM

The 2017 version of Nebraska football is one of the youngest teams in the Big Ten Conference. Coupled with that youth, Nebraska does feature several players with extensive starting experience. Six players have at least 20 career starts at Nebraska, led by place-kicker Drew Brown.

Overall, Nebraska has 19 players with at least 10 collegiate starts, including quarterback Tanner Lee, who made 19 starts at Tulane and has started each game in 2017 with the Huskers.

#### **NOTING GAME 6**

- Redshirt freshman JD Spielman set a Nebraska record with 200 receiving yards on 11 receptions, including a 77-yard touchdown catch. Spielman's 11 receptions were a Nebraska freshman record, and the 200 yards bettered the previous NU record of 167 receiving yards by Matt Davison at Texas A&M in 1998.
- Spielman's 200 receiving yards were the most by a freshman in 2017 in the FBS ranks.
- Quarterback **Tanner Lee** passed for a Nebraska career-high 303 yards and two touchdowns. Lee has thrown for at least 200 yards in six of seven games.
- Senior linebacker **Chris Weber** had a teamhigh 15 tackles, marking his second doublefigure tackle game of the season.
- Junior linebacker Dedrick Young registered a career-high 14 tackles, bettering his previous career high of 11 tackles against Illinois in 2015 and against Purdue in 2016.
- Redshirt freshman Dicpario Bootle made his first career start in the game, lining up at safety after playing cornerback in the first six games.
- Sophomore linebacker Mohamed Barry set a career-high with eight tackles, while junior linebacker Sedrick King had a career-best seven stops.

#### NUMEROUS HUSKERS MAKE FIRST CAREER STARTS IN 2017

Due to injuries and youth, Nebraska has had a number of players make their first career starts in 2017. Most recently, Nebraska saw redshirt freshman defensive back Dicaprio Bootle shift from cornerback to safety and make his first career start against Ohio State, while receiver Conor Young also make his first career start against the Buckeyes.

The starts by Bootle and Young brought Nebraska's first-time starters total in 2017 to 15 players.

#### JAIMES IN RARE COMPANY FOR NU OFFENSIVE LINEMEN

True freshman Brenden Jaimes earned his first career start against Rutgers and has continued to hold down the right tackle position the past three games. Jaimes originally started at right tackle where senior David Knevel and redshirt freshman Matt Farniok were out with injury, but has continued to hold the No. 1 spot after those two have returned.

A native of Austin, Texas, Jaimes became just the fifth true freshman offensive lineman to start a game at Nebraska since 1972, and the first since 2011. Jaimes is also just the 11th offensive lineman to play at Nebraska as a true freshman.

The large number of first-time starters throughout the 2017 season is indicative of a young 2017 Husker roster.

Nearly two-thirds of the squad is comprised of underclassmen, as 81 of the Huskers' 129 players are either freshmen or sophomores. Among players on Nebraska's offensive and defensive two-deep depth charts, 32 of 63 players are freshmen or sophomores. Nebraska has just five seniors listed on its defensive two-deep.

#### INJURIES TAKE EARLY TOLL ON 2017 HUSKERS

Nebraska is hopeful of a much healthier second half of the 2017 season. The injury hits started in the summer when All-America candidate cornerback Chris Jones was sidelined with a knee injury. Jones returned against Wisconsin in a part-time role at cornerback, and was back in the starting lineup against Ohio State.

Nebraska running back starter Tre Bryant went down with a knee injury after two games and has missed the past five games. His availability for the remainder of 2017 remains uncertain.

Nebraska was also without Joshua Kalu (S), and Marcus Newby (LB) for several weeks, before they returned against Wisconsin. Starters and key reserves Mikale Wilbon (IB), Aaron Williams (S), Antonio Reed (S), David Knevel (RT), Cole Conrad (C), Stanley Morgan Jr. (WR), Matt Farniok (RT), Bryan Reimers (WR) and Tyrin Ferguson (LB) have all missed time as well.

• Through seven games, Nebraska has lost 23 games by projected starters to injury.

#### 🕺 2017 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

#### RUSHING BATTLE OFTEN HOLDS THE KEY TO SUCCESS

The 2017 season has continued a tell-tale statistic for Nebraska in the running game. Nebraska has outrushed the opponent in all three of its victories, while losing the run game battle in three of its losses, and being even in the run department in a third loss.

Nebraska rushed for 225 yards, while holding Arkansas State to 82 yards on the ground in a 43-36 victory in the season opener.

In a 42-35 loss at Oregon, Nebraska rushed for 109 yards, while the Ducks gained 201 yards on the ground. NU picked up just 85 rushing yards in a loss to Northern Illinois, but rebounded with 197 rushing yards against Rutgers, and had 165 yards on the ground against Illinois. The Huskers struggled to get the run game untracked against Wisconsin and Ohio State.

- Nebraska is now 17-3 under Head Coach Mike Riley when out-rushing the opposition, and has won 15 straight games when having an advantage in that category.
- In three seasons under Coach Riley, Nebraska is 9-0 when rushing for 200 yards or more, including 4-0 records in both 2015 and 2016.
- Stopping the run also keyed Nebraska victories in 2016. The Blackshirts held five opponents to 88 or fewer rushing yards last season, winning each of those five contests. Nebraska has held four of seven opponents this season to fewer than 100 rushing yards, but has given up an average of 316.0 rushing yards the past two games.

#### HUSKERS STRIVING FOR BALANCED OFFENSIVE ATTACK

The Nebraska offense is striving for a balanced attack in 2017. NU produced its most efficient offensive effort of the year in the win at Illinois on Sept. 29.

Nebraska rushed 38 times for 165 yards, while completing 17-of-24 passes for 246 yards. The Huskers showed great balance to open the season against Arkansas State, rushing for 225 yards while passing for 238 yards. That game was the first time NU had topped 200 yards in both rushing and passing since accomplishing that feat in three straight wins against Oregon, Northwestern and Illinois in 2016.

- The balanced attack in the opener produced a rare indiviudal stat milestone. Tre Bryant rushed for 192 yards, while Stanley Morgan Jr. had 102 receiving yards. That was the first time Nebraska had a 100-yard rusher and receiver in the same game since a 2014 victory over Illinois when Ameer Abdullah ran for 208 yards and Kenny Bell had 105 receiving yards.
- Bryant and Morgan duplicated the feat at Oregon, with Bryant rushing for 107 yards and Morgan posting 103 receiving yards. This marked the first time NU had consecutive games with a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver since 1983.

- Morgan posted his third 100-yard receiving game against Wisconsin with a career-high 115 yards, while Devine Ozigbo rushed for a career-best 112 yards against the Badgers.
- Nebraska has five individual 100-yard rushing games through seven games in 2017, including three straight by Ozigbo against Rutgers, Illinois and Wisconsin. Last season, Nebraska had a total of four 100-yard rushing games.
- The Huskers have had a total of five 100-yard receiving games, including three by Morgan and one each by De'Mornay Pierson-El and JD Spielman.

#### HUSKER BALL CONTROL

Nebraska's offense has been at its best when it shows the ability to control the football. The Huskers had great success in that department in wins over Rutgers and Illinois, before Wisconsin and Ohio State easily won the time of possession battle in wins over the Huskers.

- Against Illinois, Nebraska scored touchdowns on all three of its first half possessions. NU reached the end zone on its first three possessions for the first time since a 2009 game against Arkansas State.
- The Huskers had three scoring drives of at least 88 yards at Illinois. Nebraska has six scoring drives this season that have covered at least 85 yards.
- In the second half of wins over Rutgers and Illinois, Nebraska has held the ball for 22:50 and 18:39, respectively.

# NU FEATURES TRIPLE THREAT OF WIDEOUTS IN PASSING ATTACK

Nebraska began the season with the luxury of two veteran and proven pass catchers to lead the receiving corps. Senior De'Mornay Pierson-El and junior Stanley Morgan Jr. both had extensive playing experience entering 2017.

That duo has had a strong first half of the 2017 season, and redshirt freshman JD Spielman has emerged to give Nebraska three dangerous receiving options.

Morgan has 33 receptions for 540 yards and six touchdowns, despite missing the Rutgers game. Spielman is coming off a Nebraska record 200yard receiving day on 11 catches against Ohio State. He has 31 receptions for 475 yards in 2017. Pierson-El has caught 26 passes for 371 yards and four touchdowns.

- Morgan ranks second in the Big Ten in receiving yards (540), second in receiving yards per game (90.0 ypg), third in receiving touchdowns (6) and is tied for first in 100-yard games (3).
- The 540 receiving yards by Morgan through the team's first seven games is the third-most in NU history through seven contests. His 33 catches through seven games are tied for the fifth-most in school history.

- Morgan opened the 2017 season with a pair of 100-yard receiving games. He is the first player in Nebraska history to have 100 receiving yards in each of the first two games.
- Morgan fell just shy of tying a school record with three straight 100-yard receiving games when he had six catches for 94 yards against Northern Illinois. He added his third 100-yard receiving game of 2017 with a career-high 115 yards against Wisconsin.
- The Nebraska season record for 100-yard receiving games is four by six Huskers, most recently Jordan Westerkamp in 2015.
- Morgan has had at least 94 receiving yards and at least four receptions in five of six games he has played in 2017.
- Morgan had seven catches for 103 yards and two touchdowns at Oregon, setting then-career highs in all three categories. He has since bettered his career high in receptions with eight at Illinois, and his receiving high with 115 yards against Wisconsin.
- Morgan had touchdown catches of 28 and 18 yards at Oregon, marking his first career multiple-TD game.
- Morgan surpassed the 1,000-yard career receiving mark with his effort against Northern Illinois. Morgan is the 25th Husker to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards, and now ranks 13th in NU history with 1,295 career yards.
- Morgan caught an 80-yard touchdown pass from Tanner Lee against Wisconsin, marking the seventh-longest pass play in NU history. It was the longest pass for Nebraska since the 2014 Gator Bowl.
- Morgan has at least one catch in 21 straight games, the seventh-longest stretch in Nebraska history.
- Pierson-El earned All-America honors as a punt returner in 2014 and has continued to grow as a receiver. He has 26 receptions for 371 yards and four touchdowns in 2017.
- He had a 12-yard touchdown against Arkansas State, then added four catches for 67 yards and a touchdown at Oregon. He tied his career high with eight receptions against Northern Illinois, while his 101 receiving yards was just one shy of his career best. He an 8-yard TD catch against Rutgers and a 45-yard touchdown reception at Illinois, the second-longest catch of his career.

#### 2017 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

- Pierson-El joined Morgan in the 1,000-yard club against Wisconsin. Pierson-El has 80 receptions for 1,057 yards in his NU career.
- Pierson-El is a versatile performer who is an electrifying punt returner and is used in the NU run game. He had his 12th career punt return of at least 25 yards, with a 63-yarder against Rutgers to set up a touchdown. The 63-yard return was the third-longest of his career.
- Pierson-El has 895 career punt return yards, putting him in position to be the third Husker with 1,000 career punt return yards. His yardage total is fourth among active FBS players.
- Spielman has taken his game to a higher level in recent weeks. Against Ohio State, Spielman set a Nebraska single-game record with 200 receiving yards, shattering the previous record of 167 yards. Spielman also set a freshman record with 11 receptions, tied for the thirdmost in a game by any NU player.
- Spielman's 200 yard-effort against Ohio State is the second-best receiving total in the Big Ten this season. It is also the most receiving yards by a freshman in the the FBS ranks in 2017.
- Spielman has been very effective on third and fourth downs. He has 14 receptions on third down and five on fourth down. His 19 catches on those two downs ranks as the third-most in the nation. His five fourth-down catches are the most in the nation.
- Spielman has 31 receptions for 475 yards through seven games. The Nebraska freshman records are 45 receptions and 641 receiving yards by Nate Swift in 2005.

#### LEE BRINGS PASSING TALENT TO NEBRASKA OFFENSE

Quarterback Tanner Lee has had a productive first half of the 2017 season, his first as Nebraska's starting quarterback. Lee has completed 55 percent of his passes for 1,709 yards and 13 touchdowns.

The 6-4, 220-pound Lee became just the third opening-day starting quarterback for the Huskers since 2010, joining Taylor Martinez and Tommy Armstrong Jr. He has passed for at least 200 yards in six of seven games this season, and is coming off a career-high 303 yards and two touchdowns against Ohio State.

Lee threw for 299 yards against Northern Illinois, and also ran for two touchdowns against the Huskies. He had thrown for 252 yards and three touchdowns a week earlier at Oregon.

The Tulane transfer put together his most complete game as a Husker at Illinois. Lee completed 17-of-24 passes for 246 yards and three touchdowns. The game was his best as a Husker in terms of completion percentage, NCAA passer rating while tying his NU best with three TD passes.

- Lee was the first Nebraska quarterback to throw for 200 yards in their first three Nebraska starts since Joe Ganz did so in his first five starts spanning the 2007 and 2008 seasons.
- The 238 passing yards by Lee vs. ASU were the third-most by an NU quarterback in their starting debut. The yardage total trailed only Ryker Fyfe (407 yards at Purdue, 2015) and Joe Ganz (405 yards at Kansas, 2007). Lee's 238 yards were the most passing yards by a first-time starter in a Husker win.
- Lee is nearing the top 10 on the NU singleseason passing yardage list. With his 1,709 yards, Lee is 372 yards from the top 10 on the single-season list.
- Lee has made 26 collegiate starts, including 19 as the starting quarterback at Tulane in 2014 and 2015.

### GATES CONTINUES TO HOLD DOWN LEFT SIDE OF O-LINE

Junior Nick Gates is the most game-tested of a veteran Nebraska offensive line. The five regular starters on the line at the start of the season all had at least four career starts entering the 2017 season and are all in at least their fourth year in the program.

- Gates leads the way with 30 career starts, the most of any offensive player.
- Gates has started 20 consecutive games at left tackle. The streak is the longest by a Husker at the position since Mike Smith also started 20 straight games at the position in 2009 and 2010.

The stability of Gates at left tackle has been important in the first half of the season. Injuries forced Nebraska to start three players at right tackle in the first four games, and NU has shifted to new starters at right tackle and center.

#### HUSKER BACKS SHARING THE LOAD IN RUN GAME

Sophomore I-back Tre Bryant earned the starting job with a strong preseason practice effort. The 5-11, 200-pound Bryant showed through two games why he earned the nod. However, he has missed the past five games with a knee injury, and his status for the remainder of 2017 is uncertain. In Bryant's absence, juniors Devine Ozigbo and Mikale Wilbon have shown the Huskers have strong depth at the position.

Bryant carried 31 times for 192 yards and a touchdown in the season opener. It marked the most rushing yards for a Husker in 25 games, dating back to Terrell Newby's 198 yards against South Alabama in 2015. Bryant responded with 20 carries for 107 yards and a touchdown at Oregon before leaving with an injury.

- Bryant's 31 carries against Arkansas State were the most by a Husker since Ameer Abdullah carried 35 times for 229 yards against Miami in September of 2014.
- With his second straight 100-yard rushing day at Oregon, Bryant was the first Husker to post back-to-back 100-yard rushing games to start the season since Ameer Abdullah in 2013.

Ozigbo had three consecutive 100-yard rushing games against Rutgers, Illinois and Wisconsin., He churned out 101 yards on a career-high 24 carries against Rutgers, 106 yards at Illinois, and a career-high 112 yards against Wisconsin.

- Ozigbo was the first Husker to post three straight 100-yard rushing games since Ameer Abdullah accomplished the feat in September of 2014. His three 100-yard rushing games is tied for second in the Big Ten.
- Ozigbo was the first back to eclipse the century mark against Wisconsin since LSU's Leonard Fournette did so in the 2016 season opener.

Ozigbo shared the running back load with fellow junior Mikale Wilbon for three games, before Wilbon was sidelined with an ankle injury against Wisconsin. Wilbon rushed for a careerhigh 90 yards against Northern Illinois. He returned to action against Ohio State and has 254 rushing yards this season.

#### **BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE** LOOKS TO REGAIN STRIDE

The Nebraska defense was very impressive from halftime of the Oregon game through its next 14 quarters. Wisconsin and Ohio State have had success against the Blackshirts to end the impressive run.

From halftime at Oregon through Illinois game, the Blackshirt defense has allowed just two touchdowns and 23 points in 14 quarters.

- The six points allowed in a 28-6 win at Illinois were the fewest by a Nebraska defense since a 24-3 win over Michigan State in October of 2011. It was also the lowest point total allowed by NU on the road since 2006.
- Nebraska held Illinois to 199 total yards, including 46 yards in the second half and zero yards in the final 22:49 of the game.

#### HOME OF THE HUSKERS

Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as Nebraska's head coach.

- The Illinois game marked the second straight game NU has held the opposition to fewer than 200 yards, after limiting Rutgers to 194 yards. Those two games were the two best total defensive efforts in three seasons under Mike Riley, and marked the first time NU held consecutive opponents to fewer than 200 yards since opening the 2001 season by holding three straight foes under 200 yards. Nebraska had not held two straight conference opponents to less than 200 yards since 1997.
- Nebraska's 194-yard total defense effort against Rutgers was the fewest yards allowed by Nebraska in 47 games. It was the fifth-lowest total NU had allowed a Big Ten opponent since joining the conference in 2011.
- The 393 yards allowed against Rutgers and Illinios were the fewest yards the Huskers allowed in back-to-back games since allowing 377 yards to Minnesota and Iowa in 2012.
- Nebraska closed non-conference play by allowing just 213 yards against Northern Illinois. The Huskers have three of the top four total defense efforts under Mike Riley in the past four weeks. This marked the first time since the first three games of 2003 that the NU defense held three straight foes to fewer than 250 yards.

#### **BIG PLAY PREVENTION**

The three-game run of success for the Blackshirts was due in large part to preventing the big play. Nebraska allowed just one play of more than 20 yards in the three-game stretch, including none in wins over Rutgers and Illinois.

On the season, Nebraska has allowed a total of 23 offensive plays of more than 20 yards to rank in a tie for 14th in the nation.

• Nebraska's defense has allowed 15 passing plays of 20 yards or more, a total that is tied for 10th nationally.

#### RETURN OF JONES AND KALU HELPS SOLIDIFY SECONDARY

Nebraska has been forced to battle through its share of injuries in the first half of the 2017 season. No area has been harder hit than the Nebraska secondary.

The position group suffered a significant loss this summer when senior cornerback Chris Jones went down with a knee injury. Jones returned against Wisconsin as part of the Huskers' cornerback rotation, and earned his first start of 2017 against Ohio State.

The loss of Jones came on the heels of losing sophomore safety JoJo Domann during spring practice. Domann was pushing for significant playing time after seeing action as a true freshman.

The injury bug has continued to plague the secondary. Senior Joshua Kalu injured his hamstring in the first half at Oregon and missed 3 1/2 games. He returned to the starting lineup against Wisconsin and had a career-high 10 tackles and two breakups, and added five tackles against Ohio State before re-injuring his hamstring. He is expected to be ready for the Purdue game.

Kalu had started all 28 games over the past twoplus seasons. After lining up at cornerback in his first three years, Kalu moved to safety this spring.

One of five team captains, Kalu remains in position to leave his mark in the NU record book despite missing a third of his senior year.

- Kalu opened the season with an interception and a pass breakup against Arkansas State. The interception was the sixth of his career and gave him at least one interception in each of his four seasons as a Husker.
- Kalu is one of only five players at Nebraska to record at least one interception in four consecutive seasons. The other players to have at least one interception in four straight seasons since World War II are Mike Brown (1996-99), Ralph Brown (1996-99), Tyrone Byrd (1989-92) and Tom Novak (1946-49).
- Kalu has 190 career tackles and is in line to become just the sixth Husker defensive back to post 200 career tackles. Had he remained at cornerback, Kalu would likely have shattered the NU cornerback record of 192 career tackles.

While Kalu and Jones have returned, the injury bug continued to show up against Ohio State as safeties Aaron Williams and Antonio Reed were both sidelined. Both players are hopeful of returning to action at Purdue.

With the loss of Kalu and Jones in the first half of the season, Williams has been the leader of the Nebraska secondary.

Williams had 11 tackles and an interception return for a touchdown against Wisconsin, continuing his strong play. Against Oregon, Williams posted a career-high 12 tackles and was part of two second-half takeaways. Williams ranks third on the team with 40 tackles, including 23 solo stops.

#### WEBER, YOUNG ANCHORING **BLACKSHIRT LINEBACKERS**

Junior Dedrick Young II and senior Chris Weber serve as the anchors of Nebraska's linebacking corps in 2017.

Weber is one five team captains for the 2017 season. Weber leads the team with 54 tackles, and is coming off a Nebraska season-high 15-tackle effort against Ohio State. He is also tied for the team lead in tackles for loss (5) and pass breakups (5).

Weber had a complete game at Illinois, recording nine tackles, two tackles for loss, while adding his first career sack and first career interception. Weber also reached doublefigures with 10 tackles at Oregon and as five double-figure tackle efforts in his career.

Young played on the outside the past two seasons, but moved inside this fall to give NU a veteran tandem on the inside as the Huskers transitioned from a 4-3 defensive scheme to a 3-4 attack.

Young totaled 121 tackles in his first two seasons. He was only the third Husker to record 100 tackles prior to his junior season. He ranks second among all 2017 Huskers in career tackles despite his junior status. Young has 52 tackles this season to rank second on the squad. Young had a career-high 14 tackles against Ohio State.

Junior Luke Gifford has been the other mainstay at linebacker, making his first seven career starts in 2017. Gifford has recorded 39 tackles and 1.5 sacks. He also closed the Rutgers game with an interception.

#### SENIOR KICKER DREW BROWN CONTINUES FAMILY TRADITION

Place-kicker Drew Brown is in his final season with the Huskers and has put together four solid seasons as a starter. One of the nation's top kickers since 2014, Brown earned honorablemention All-Big Ten recognition in 2016 and was a second-team all-conference pick in 2015. Brown is a leading contender for the Lou Groza Award and other conference and national honors in 2017.

Brown has made 6-of-8 field goals this season and is perfect on 23 extra-point attempts.

Brown connected on 12-of-14 field goals in 2016, including 9-of-10 over the final six games. Brown had a streak of 13 straight made field goals prior to a miss against Illinois last season, tying for the third-longest streak in NU history.

- Brown made a field goal to close the first half against Wisconsin, giving him 53 career field goals. He is third in school history in that category, four behind his brother, Kris, for second on the NU career field goals list. Drew Brown trails career record holder Alex Henery by 15 field goals.
- Brown has 323 career points to rank fourth in NU history. He is on pace to finish third in school history in scoring and could challenge his older brother for second place on the scoring list at 388 points. Alex Henery holds the school record with 397 career points.

- Brown's 323 career points are sixth among active Football Bowl Subdivision Players.
- Brown connected on a career-long 51-yard field goal against Purdue last season and has made 20 field goals of at least 40 yards in his career. He is 18-of-25 in his career from 40-49 yards.
- Brown scored 107 points as a sophomore after posting a freshman-record 101 points in 2014. He was the first player in NU history with 100-point seasons as both a freshman and sophomore.
- Brown's 21 field goals in 2015 were second on the NU season list. He made each of his last 11 attempts that season.
- Brown made five field goals against Southern Miss in 2015, all in the first half. The five field goals in a half tied an NCAA record. The five field goals were the most ever by a Husker in Lincoln, and tied a Memorial Stadium record held by two opposing kickers.

#### HUSKERS STRIVING FOR SPECIAL TEAMS CONSISTENCY

Nebraska has had several bright spots in its special teams play in 2017. In addition to Drew Brown's continued strong place-kicking Nebraska made strong statements in the return and punting game.

- Redshirt freshman JD Spielman had a 99yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the first quarter of the season opener against Arkansas State. His return tied for the fifthlongest in school history and was the first kickoff return score by a Husker since Kenny Bell had a 99-yarder at Penn State in 2013. Spielman averages 27.9 yards per kickoff return to rank 12th in the nation.
- Sophomore punter Caleb Lightbourn averaged a career-best 48.0 yards on four punts against Ohio State. A week earlier he had set a then-career best by 47.4 yards on five punts against Wisconsin, including a career-long 69-yard punt. He had four punts of at least 50 yards against Northern Illinois.
- Lightbourn is averaging 43.2 yards per punr this season to rank sixth in the Big Ten. He has 10 punts of at least 50 yards this season and has pinned the opposition inside the 20vard line 14 times.

Nebraska football is the only team in any sport in NCAA history to boast 100 athletic All-Americans and 100 academic All-Americans.



Three Huskers have won the Heisman Trophy, all since 1972. Johnny Rodgers won in 1972, Mike Rozier in 1983 and Eric Crouch in 2001.

Nebraska ranks fourth in NCAA history with 892 all-time victories. The Huskers are one of only 10 teams with 800 all-time wins.

#### Nebraska has won five national titles: 1970, 1971, 1994, 1995 and 1997. The Huskers have won the second-most national titles of any school in the country since 1970.

#### Nebraska ranks ninth nationally with a total of 23 former players and coaches (17 players, six coaches) who have been enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Nebraska leads the nation with a former Husker on a Super Bowl roster for 24 consecutive years.



The Huskers have won 46 conference titles in program history, the most of any school in the country. This includes 33 perfect conference seasons and 27 unbeaten seasons.

#### NEBRASKA LOOKS TO CLIMB IN TURNOVER MARGIN

Nebraska was one of the nation's top teams in 2016 in protecting the football. The Huskers committed just 14 turnovers in 13 games. As a result of the ball security, Nebraska was a +5 in turnover margin, the Huskers' first positive turnover margin since 2009. Nebraska has had mixed results in the turnover area in 2017.

- The Huskers were turnover-free against Arkansas State, while intercepting two Red Wolves' passes.
- Since the opener, Nebraska has been a combined -6 in turnover margin.
- Nebraska has won 20 consecutive games when it has a positive turnover margin dating back to a 2011 loss to Northwestern. NU is 8-0 under Mike Riley when winning the turnover battle.

#### DIACO LEADING NEW-LOOK BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE

Nebraska has three new faces on its defensive staff in 2017. The group is led by defensive coordinator Bob Diaco, while Donté Williams coaches the cornerbacks and Scott Booker tutors the safeties.

- Diaco was the winner of the 2012 Broyles Award as the nation's best assistant coach, while at Notre Dame. He is regarded as one of the top defensive minds in college football and has a proven track record of success at the highest level. Diaco came to Nebraska after three seasons as the head coach at the University of Connecticut. Diaco has roots in the Big Ten, twice earning All-Big Ten honors as a linebacker at Iowa in the mid-1990s.
- Williams joined the Nebraska staff last December prior to the Music City Bowl and worked with the secondary during bowl preparation. Williams spent the 2016 season at Arizona, helping compile the Wildcats' top recruiting class in recent years.
- Booker brings 10 years of full-time FBS coaching experience to the Nebraska sideline, including five seasons on the Notre Dame coaching staff. Before being elevated to safeties coach in June, Booker served as a special teams consultant with the Huskers. In addition to his duties with the safeties, Booker serves as Nebraska's special teams coordinator in 2017.

#### FIVE PLAYERS SERVING AS 2017 TEAM CAPTAINS

Five players are serving as 2017 captains as voted by their teammates. The group consists of three seniors and two juniors, and three players on offense and two defenders. The 2017 captains also include three Nebraska natives and two players who began their career as walk-ons before earning scholarships.

- The three Nebraska natives (Foster, McNitt, Weber) to be named captains are the most in-state captains since Nebraska also had three in-state captains in 2001 (Eric Crouch, Jeremy Slechta, Dave Volk). The Huskers have had at least one Nebraska native as a captain for 12 consecutive seasons.
- Foster is the third captain from Lincoln in four seasons, joining Jake Cotton (2014) and Josh Banderas (2016).
- A Husker offensive lineman has served as a captain for five straight seasons. Foster joins Spencer Long (2013), Jake Cotton (2014), Alex Lewis (2015) and Dylan Utter (2016).
- Kalu is the fifth defensive back to be a captain since 2013, joining Ciante Evans (2013), Corey Cooper (2014), Josh Mitchell (2014) and Nathan Gerry (2015, 2016).
- McNitt and Weber are the fourth and fifth players since 2013 to earn the role of a captain after starting their career as a walkon. They join Spencer Long (2013), Jack Gangwish (2015) and Dylan Utter (2016) in that group.
- McNitt is the first fullback to serve as a captain since Judd Davies in 2003.
- Lee's selection marks the fourth time in six seasons a quarterback has served as a Husker captain, joining Taylor Martinez (2012, 2013) and Tommy Armstrong Jr. (2015).

#### NEBRASKA WALK-ON TRADITION CONTINUES

Mike Riley placed six former walk-ons on scholarship before the start of the season. Five of the six members of the group are fifth-year seniors and four are Nebraska natives.

#### 2017 HUSKERS FEATURE PROMINENT FATHERS

Husker fans could see some famous faces at Nebraska games this fall, as three freshmen feature prominent fathers.

- Redshirt freshman JD Spielman is the adopted son of Minnesota Vikings General Manager Rick Spielman, and JD's uncle is former Ohio State All-America linebacker and NFL standout Chris Spielman, who now serves as an NFL analyst for Fox Sports.
- Freshman fullback Ben Miles is the son of former national championship head coach Les Miles. Les compiled a 141-55 record in 15 seasons as a head coach at Oklahoma State and LSU. He led the Tigers to the 2007 national title and an appearance in the 2011 BCS National Championship Game.
- Freshman wide receiver Kade Warner is the son of former two-time NFL MVP Kurt Warner. In addition to a distinguished Arena Football League career, Kurt enjoyed a 12-year NFL career with the St. Louis Rams and the Arizona Cardinals. He threw for more than 32,000 yards in his career and ranks seventh in NFL history with an average of 260.8 passing yards per game. Kurt was also a four-time Pro Bowler, a two-time NFL MVP (1999 & 2001) and the Super Bowl XXXIV MVP. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2017.

#### NU LOOKS TO REMAIN AMONG ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Nebraska averaged 90,200 fans for seven home games in 2016 to rank 10th nationally in average attendance. That marked the fourth straight year Nebraska ranked 11th or higher in average attendance. Nebraska is averaging 89,763 fans for five home games in 2017.

NU averaged 89,998 fans for its seven games in 2015, to rank 11th in the nation and fourth among Big Ten schools.

In 2014, Nebraska was 10th in home attendance with 91,249 fans per game. The average attendance for seven home games was the largest ever at Memorial Stadium, bettering the 2013 mark of 90,933 per game. NU has ranked in the top 20 nationally in attendance each of the 18 years with available attendance figures.

#### NCAA-RECORD SELLOUT STREAK CONTINUES IN 2017

One of the most remarkable streaks in college sports continues in 2017. Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, a streak of 359 consecutive sellouts, 99 more than second-place Notre Dame.

- Nebraska owns a 305-54 (.850) record during the sellout streak.
- The overall attendance during the streak is nearly 27 million fans.

#### NEBRASKA OWNS BIG ADVANTAGE AT MEMORIAL STADIUM

Nebraska has rewarded the loyalty of its fans with great success at Memorial Stadium.

- Nebraska has won at least six home games in 24 of the past 30 seasons, including 2016. NU is 171-31 (.847) at home since 1989.
- NU was 7-0 at home in 2016, marking the Huskers' first perfect home season since 2012.
- The Huskers are 18-9 in Big Ten home games since joining the league in 2011.
- In the past three decades, NU has had three home winning streaks of 20 or more games and has posted 41 unbeaten and untied home seasons.
- The Huskers are 540-150-20 (.775, 710 games, 128 years) in Lincoln, and 415-127-13 (.759, 555 games, 94 years) in Memorial Stadium (since 1923).

#### NEBRASKA AMONG NATION'S TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is in its 128th season of college football and owns an 892-376-40 all-time record in 1,308 games (.697). Since 1970, NU has a 458-134-5 record (.771).

- Nebraska is one of 10 programs with 800 all-time victories, ranking in a tie for fourth in NCAA history with 892 wins.
- Nebraska is the nation's winningest program over the last 40, 50 and 60 years.
- Nebraska was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

#### NEBRASKA AMONG LEADERS IN NATIONAL TITLES

Nebraska has won five national titles in program history - all since 1970 - as the Huskers have won the second-most national titles since 1970. NU also ranks highly in most Associated Press national championship and most coaches' poll national titles. The Huskers have won four AP and four coaches' poll national championships. In 1997, Nebraska was crowned national champion by the coaches, but NU finished second to Michigan in the AP poll. In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the AP national title, but Texas was No. 1 in the coaches' poll, as the coaches released their final poll prior to the bowl games. Texas lost its bowl games, while Nebraska defeated No. 5 LSU.

#### NATIONAL LEADER IN CONFERENCE CROWNS

Nebraska has won a nation-leading 46 conference titles. NU won three Western Inter-State University Foot Ball Association championships, 12 Missouri Valley Conference titles (in 18 seasons), nine Big 6 titles, 20 Big Eight championships (in 36 seasons) and two Big 12 titles. The Huskers appeared in six Big 12 Championship Games before playing in the 2012 Big Ten Championship Game in only their second season in the league.

#### HUSKERS RANK NEAR TOP OF ALL-TIME AP RANKING

The Associated Press weekly poll began in 1936 and has been a fixture in college football ever since. In August of 2016 the AP released an alltime top 100 for the first time, ranking programs over the 80-year history of the poll. The poll was updated following the 2016 campaign.

Nebraska checks in at No. 6 in the all-time rankings and is one of three Big Ten programs in the top seven in the poll. Nebraska has appeared in 65 percent of all polls since 1936 and has been ranked No. 1 in 72 polls.

#### A HOLIDAY TRADITION

Nebraska participated in its 53rd all-time bowl game with its appearance in the 2016 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

Nebraska is one of only five programs with 50 or more bowl appearances, and its 53 bowl appearances are tied for second nationally, trailing only Alabama (63).

- The Huskers have played in the postseason in 46 of the past 48 seasons.
- Nebraska appeared in an NCAA-record 35 straight bowl games from 1969 to 2003.
- NU owns a 26-27 all-time bowl record, and the 26 bowl victories rank seventh nationally.

# 2017 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

#### NEBRASKA HONORS 1997 NATIONAL TITLE TEAM

Nebraska celebrated the 20th anniversary of the 1997 national championship team the weekend of the Wisconsin game.

- The 1997 Huskers (13-0) won the fifth national title in school history and third in four years. Nebraska was voted No. 1 in the coaches' poll, while Michigan (12-0) was voted No. 1 in the Associated Press poll.
- The 1997 season marked Tom Osborne's final season on the Husker sideline, as the Hall-of-Fame coach capped his career with a 42-17 win over No. 3 Tennessee in the Orange Bowl.
- Nebraska's senior class capped a remarkable run with its 1997 national title. In their four seasons, the Husker seniors compiled a 49-2 record with three undefeated national championship seasons.

#### EIGHT HUSKER GREATS ADDED TO RETIRED JERSEY GROUP

The Nebraska Athletics Department posthumously honored eight members of the College Football Hall of Fame by adding them to a prestigious group of former Cornhuskers with retired jerseys.

The group of eight Hall of Fame players now have their names displayed on the façade of the North Stadium. They were honored at the season opener. The uniform numbers of those retired jerseys will continue to be used, but the eight names join 17 other former Huskers with their jerseys retired.

Nebraska College Football Hall of Fame players added to the retired jersey fraternity include **Guy Chamberlin, Ed Weir, Clarence Swanson, George Sauer, Sam Francis, Forrest Behm, Bobby Reynolds** and **Wayne Meylan**.

#### BROWN, GLOVER TO JOIN NU ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

Football standouts Bob Brown and Rich Glover were part of an illustrious group of six distinguished student-athletes enshrined into the Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 13 and recognized at the Ohio State game.

Both Brown and Glover are College Football Hall of Fame members, while Brown is also in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Brown was the the Huskers' first African-American football player to be named an All-American, when he played a leading role in the Huskers winning their first-ever Big Eight title in 1963 in Bob Devaney's second year as coach. Glover then helped the Huskers win back-to-back national titles in 1970 and 1971, the first football national championships in school history.

The other inductees in the 2017 Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame were Karen Dahlgren (Volleyball), Denise Day (Softball, Track & Field), Dave Hoppen (Men's Basketball) and Scott Johnson (Men's Gymnastics).

Brown and Glover join three previous football inductees into the Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame. Dave Rimington was the football representative in the inaugural class in 2015, while Johnny Rodgers and WIII Shields were part of the 2016 class.

#### HUSKERS IN THE NFL

Nebraska has a long-standing tradition of being one of the leading programs in putting players into the National Football League.



Twenty-four Huskers are currently on NFL rosters, including 19 on active 53-man

rosters, with another player are on and NFL practice squads and four players on injured reserve.

The group is led four-time All-Pro and five-time Pro Bowl selection Ndamukong Suh who is in his third season with the Miami Dolphins. Linebacker Lavonte David is a captain of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and has more than 650 tackles in five NFL seasons. David is a two-time All-Pro.

- Nebraska has had more than 400 players see action in the National Football League.
- At least one Husker has been selected in 55 consecutive NFL Drafts, the fifth-longest streak in NFL history.
- Two or more Huskers were taken in every NFL Draft from 1963 to 2016, the longest such streak in Draft history.
- A former Husker has appeared on a Super Bowl roster for 24 consecutive years, the longest streak in the nation.
- Since 1997, Nebraska ranks second in the Big Ten Conference with 89 NFL draftees.

# SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska will play seven games against teams that played in a bowl game last year, including Ohio State (Fiesta Bowl - College Football Playoff Semifinal), Penn State (Rose Bowl) and Wisconsin (Cotton Bowl), all of which played in a New Year's Six Bowl last season.
- The Huskers will face three teams who won 11 games last season in Ohio State (11-2), Penn State (11-3) and Wisconsin (11-3). All three of those teams also finished the 2016 season with a top-10 ranking in the AP poll, as Ohio State was sixth, Penn State was seventh and Wisconsin was ninth.
- Nebraska will play five conference home games for the first time in program history this fall, as all seven Big Ten West Division teams will play five league games at home and four on the road.
- In Big Ten play, NU traveled to Illinois (Sept. 29), and will travel to Purdue (Oct. 28), Minnesota (Nov. 11) and Penn State (Nov. 18). The Huskers posted their first win at Illinois since 1986.
- The 2017 Big Ten Championship Game is scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 2 at 7 p.m. on FOX. The game will be played at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, the site of each of the first six Big Ten Championship Games. Nebraska made its lone appearance in the championship game in 2012.

#### **COACHING STAFF NOTES**

- Head Coach Mike Riley is in his 17th season as a collegiate head coach in 2017. Riley's 17 years of experience rank ninth nationally among all active FBS head coaches.
- Nebraska's 10 full-time head coaches boast a combined 190 years of collegiate coaching experience, including 113 seasons in Power Five Conferences.
- The Husker staff also features four coaches with a combined 14 years of NFL coaching experience including Mike Riley (three seasons as an NFL head coach and one season as an NFL assistant coach), Reggie Davis (four seasons as an NFL assistant), Danny Langsdorf (four seasons as an NFL assistant) and Mike Cavanaugh (two seasons as an NFL assistant).
- Nebraska welcomes three new additions to its full-time coaching staff for the 2017 season. Bob Diaco takes over as the Huskers' defensive coordinator, while Scott Booker will coach NU's safeties and Donté Williams - whose Nebraska debut came in the 2016 Music City Bowl - will tutor the Husker cornerbacks.
- Bob Elliott (1953-2017) passed away in July after being hired in February to coach the Husker safeties. The Nebraska coaching staff will honor Elliott by wearing a game day patch with the initials "BE".



### **ROSTER NOTES**

- Nebraska's 2017 roster features players from 28 states and one Canadian province.
- The Huskers have 48 homegrown Nebraska players on the 2017 roster.
- The roster includes seven additional states with at least four players. The Huskers have eight players from both California and Florida, seven from Louisiana and Texas, six from Missouri and four each from Colorado and Illinois.
- Nebraska's 2017 freshman class features players from 15 states, including multiple players from Nebraska (15), California (2), Florida (2) and Texas (2).
- NU could have its first-ever letterwinner from the state of Delaware this fall, as linebacker Avery Roberts (Wilmington, Del.) has seen the field as a true freshman this season after enrolling at Nebraska in January. The Huskers have had a letterwinner from 45 of the 50 states (every state except Delaware, Idaho, Kentucky, New Hampshire and Rhode Island).
- Nebraska features a 129-player roster. The roster is unofficially the third-largest roster in the country behind Army (174) and Navy (173).
- Nearly two-thirds of the Huskers' 2017 roster are underclassmen, as 81 of Nebraska's 129 players are either freshmen or sophomores.

### **ACADEMIC NOTES**

- Nebraska has always placed an emphasis on academic success, as the Husker football  $program has \, produced \, more \, CoSIDA \, Academic$ All-Americans than any other sport in NCAA history. With that emphasis, it has become a trend in recent years for many NU football players to earn their degree before playing in their final game.
- Three Huskers fullback Harrison Jordan, defensive lineman Joel Lopez and wide receiver Gabe Rahn - will play the 2017 season as graduate students.
- As many as 17 Huskers could earn their degree by the end of the fall semester. That would continue an impressive recent early graduation trend for Nebraska, as 39 of the 50 players in Mike Riley's first two senior classes obtained their degree before playing in their final game.
- Senior linebacker Chris Weber is one of 181 semifinalists for the Campbell Trophy. Weber is a two-time Academic All-District selection and a strong contender for first-team academic All-America honors in 2017.
- Senior kicker Drew Brown is one of 30 candidates nationally for the Senior CLASS Award.

#### THE PURDUE BOILERMAKERS

Purdue has shown dramatic improvement under first-year head coach Jeff Brohm. The Boilermakers enter Saturday's game with a 3-4 record. The Boilermakers have already tied their highest season win total since a 6-6 campaign in 2012.

Purdue has won three of its four of its games against unranked opponents. Purdue has had a chance to win or tie in the fourth quarter in each of their four losses, three of which have come to top-20 opponents. Purdue held a lead with under 10 minutes to play in a season-opening loss to then-No. 16 Louisville. In its conference opener, Purdue trailed then-No. 8 Michigan by only four points in the fourth quarter before the Wolverines pulled away for a 28-10 win. Two weeks ago, Purdue drove inside the Wisconsin 10-yard line trailing by eight with less than 10 minutes to play before an interception spoiled any hopes of a Boilermaker upset in a 17-9 loss to the then-No. 7 Badgers. Last week at Rutgers, Purdue failed to convert on a two-point conversion with 25 seconds remaining that would have tied the game.

Purdue has split time between quarterbacks **David Blough** and **Elijah Sindelar**, with Sindelar earning four starts - including two straight - and Blough making three starts. Sindelar has thrown for a team-high 907 yards, while Blough leads Purdue with eight touchdown passes. The Boilermakers average only 146.6 rushing yards per game, but ran more than a quarter of their seasons yards last week when they ran for 279 yards at Rutgers despite being without leading rusher **Tario Fuller**.

Defensively, Purdue has forced 15 turnovers, its highest total since 2001. The Boilermakers rank 26th nationally in scoring defense by allowing an average of 19.3 points per game, an improvement by 19 points per game from 2016, when Purdue ranked 117th in scoring defense at 38.3 points per game.

#### NEBRASKA VS. PURDUE SERIES HISTORY

Nebraska leads the all-time series with Purdue, 3-2, but the Huskers have only won once in three tries in West Lafayette. The first meeting between the teams was a 28-0 Purdue home win in 1958. The programs did not meet again until Nebraska joined the Big Ten, with the Huskers winning 44-7 at Purdue in 2013 and 35-14 at home in 2014. Purdue defended its home field with a 55-45 win in 2015 before the Huskers defeated the Boilermakers last season, 27-14.



Lincoln (Sept. 2) --- Sophomore I-back Tre Bryant erupted for a career-high 192 yards on 31 carries to pace Nebraska to a 43-36 win over Arkansas State in the season opener for both teams.

Bryant had 114 of his yards in the second half, as Nebraska built a 14-point fourth quarter lead and weathered a frantic finish. Leading 43-29 after a Husker safety, ASU's Justice Hansen hit Kendrick Edwards on a three-vard touchdown pass with 47 seconds left to pull the Red Wolves within 43-36. Arkansas State then recovered an on-side kick to keep its upset hopes alive. The Red Wolves drove to the 11-vard line with 11 seconds remaining

before the Blackshirts preserved the win. On first down, Lamar Jackson broke up a pass in the end zone intended for Justin McInnis, before Hansen threw too high to Edwards on the game's final play.

Hansen set the Arkansas State record and tied the Nebraska individual opponent passing record by completing 46 throws on a Nebraska opponent-record-tying 68 attempts. He finished with 415 passing yards and three touchdowns, but he also threw a pair of costly interceptions.

Husker quarterback Tanner Lee led a balanced NU attack, completing 19-of-32 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns without committing a turnover, as Nebraska threw for 238 and rushed for 225. Stanley Morgan led the Huskers with five catches for 102 yards to set career bests in both categories. Freshman JD Spielman accounted for 143 all-purpose yards, highlighted by a 99-yard kickoff return in the first quarter. Six Huskers had multiple catches on the evening.

Leading 27-26 at the half, Bryant took over for the Huskers in the third quarter. His one-yard touchdown run with 11:14 left in the third quarter pushed Nebraska's lead to 34-26, before the Blackshirts slowed down the Red Wolves by allowing just 43 yards in the third quarter. The Huskers extended their lead to 41-26 early in the fourth quarter on an eight-yard pass from Lee to senior De'Mornay Pierson-El to cap a six-play, 53-yard drive with 12:25 left in the game.

Eugene, Ore. (Sept. 9) -- Nebraska's defense held Oregon scoreless on seven straight possessions in the second half to spur a furious rally, but the Ducks forced four turnovers, including a clinching interception in the final two minutes and held on for a 42-35 victory at Autzen Stadium.

NU trailed 42-14 at halftime but scored on its first two possessions of the second half to stay in the game. The Husker defense forced two turnovers and another turnover on downs to redeem themselves from a first half in which Oregon amassed 409 yards.

Antonio Reed forced a fumble by running back Royce Freeman that linebacker Aaron Williams recovered at the Oregon 22-yard line, and it led to a Mikale Wilbon 2-vard touchdown run to pull Nebraska within seven with 2:47 remaining.

The Huskers used their three time outs in forcing a three-and-out and regained possession with 2:17 remaining on the Nebraska 43yard line. But on the first play from scrimmage, Oregon cornerback

Uguchukwu Amadi intercepted Tanner Lee to clinch the win. Lee was 19-of-41 passing for 252 yards and three touchdowns, with four interceptions. Sophomore running back Tre Bryant ran 20 times for 107 yards for his second straight 100-yard rushing game, as the Huskers finished with 361 yards of total offense.

Justin Herbert completed 25 of 33 passes for 365 yards and three touchdowns, and Freeman ran 29 times for 153 yards and two touchdowns, as the Ducks amassed 566 total yards, but only 157 came in the second half.

Oregon scored on its first possession before a Husker turnover led to another Ducks touchdown just 3:31 into the game. Nebraska settled in and went on a 10-play. 95-yard drive capped by DeMornay Pierson-El's 23-yard touchdown catch. Nebraska eventually pulled to within 21-14 after a Tre Bryant touchdown run early in the second quarter, but Oregon took control with 21 straight points to close the half.

Lee directed two scoring drives, sandwiched around a three-and-out by the defense, to start the second half. On the second play of the half, Lee hit Pierson-El for a 34-yard pass to get the Huskers into Oregon territory. On 4th-and-10. Morgan gained 22 vards on a catch-and-run, and then hauled in an 18-vard touchdown pass on the next play. Morgan finished with career highs of seven receptions and 103 yards to increase his career total to 962 receiving yards

NU's next drive began at the Husker 47-yard line. This time, Bryant paced the Huskers with rushes of 12, 8 and 5 yards, before Lee found Morgan for a 28-yard touchdown, pulling Nebraska within 42-28.

Lincoln (Sept. 16) -- Nebraska put up 171 more yards of total offense than Northern Illinois, but the Huskies used three interceptions, including a pair of first-quarter pick sixes, to defeat the Huskers, 21-17. The loss snapped Nebraska's eight-game home winning streak.

Nebraska quarterback Tanner Lee completed 25-of-47 passes for 299 yards on the day, but he threw a trio of interceptions and was sacked three times. After Nebraska drove quickly down the field on the opening drive, NIU's Shawun Lurry jumped a wide receiver screen and raced 87 yards for a touchdown to give the Huskies an early 7-0 lead. Later in the quarter, Jawuan Johnson picked off another Lee pass and scampered 25 yards to put NIU up 14-0.

While the offense was unable to get untracked, the Blackshirts played solid on defense to keep the Northern Illinois

offense off the board in the first half. In fact, Nebraska out-yarded NIU, 201-88, in the half and ran 43 plays compared to just 25 for the Huskies.

The Huskers got on the scoreboard midway through the third quarter, as Lee scored on a four-yard run after Marquel Dismuke recovered a muffed NIU punt at the 2-yard line. Nebraska cut the margin to 14-10 with 15 seconds left in the third quarter on Drew Brown's 36-yard field goal to finish a 15-play, 71-yard drive. The Huskers then took their first lead of the day on Lee's one-yard touchdown run with 11:14 left in the game to cap a six-play, 63-yard march by the Big Red.

However, Nebraska's lead was short-lived, as Northern Illinois quarterback Daniel Santcaterina moved the Huskies 75 yards in just six plays to put NIU back in front 21-17 with 8:52 remaining.

Nebraska had two chances to answer down the stretch, the first drive ended with an incomplete pass on 4th-and-7 at the NIU 33 with 5:31 left. The Blackshirts got another stop with 3:09 left, but Lee was intercepted for the third time on 4th-and-14 from the Nebraska 16 with 1:36 left.

NU I-back Mikale Wilbon led the Nebraska backs with 90 yards on 24 carries. De'Mornay Pierson-El led Nebraska's receivers with 101 yards on a career-high eight receptions while Stanley Morgan Jr. added six catches for 94 yards to go over 1,000 yards receiving in his career.

Jordan Huff led the Northern Illinois running game with 105 yards and a touchdown on just 16 carries, while Santacaterina threw for 128 yards on 15-of-22 passing to improve to 2-0 as a starter for the Huskies this season.

Lincoln (Sept. 23) -- Nebraska's defense produced another strong effort, while the offense used a powerful ground game fueled by Devine Ozigbo and Mikale Wilbon to claim a 27-17 win over Rutgers

Nebraska dominated the second half on both sides of the ball, erasing a 17-14 deficit in the opening minutes of the second half following Kiy Hester's interception return for a TD off Tanner Lee.

Two drives later, Lee led the Huskers on a massive 17-play, 97-yard march that consumed 8:10 and culminated with his

eight-yard touchdown strike to De'Mornay Pierson-El with 2:49 left in the third quarter

While the Husker offense assumed control, the Blackshirts continued to show consistent improvement on defense. After allowing Rutgers to open the game 2-for-2 on third-down conversions on an 11-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by a Gus Edwards two-yard touchdown run, the Blackshirts forced the Scarlet Knights to go without a conversion on their next eight third-down attempts.

The Blackshirts also provided a big play of their own late in the third quarter with Antonio Reed's interception and 19-yard return. Nebraska converted the turnover into points five plays later on Drew Brown's 32-yard field goal with 14:10 left.

Then Ozigbo, who had two carries in NU's first three games, took over. The junior carried nine times for 42 yards on a game-clinching 12-play, 50-yard drive to set up Brown's 27-yard field goal.

Ozigbo finished the game with a career-high 24 carries for 101 yards, including 19 carries for 85 yards in the second half. Ozigbo and starter Mikale Wilbon led a Big Red rushing binge that racked up 197 yards on 47 carries against the Rutgers defense. Wilbon finished with 78 yards and a touchdown

JD Spielman added a career-best five receptions for 46 yards and a score to lead Nebraska's air attack, as his 18-yard touchdown reception on a Lee pass with 6:52 left in the first quarter tied the game at 7-7. Pierson-El contributed three catches for 22 yards and a touchdown, which gave Nebraska the lead for good at 21-17 with 2:49 left in the third quarter. Pierson-El also gave Nebraska's its biggest play of the day with his 63-yard punt return midway through the second quarter to set up Wilbon's scoring run.

For the game, Nebraska finished with 306 yards of total offense on 73 plays while accumulating 35:21 of possession time. The Blackshirts held the Scarlet Knights to just 194 total yards on just 53 plays, including just 68 rushing yards on 24 carries.

### Game 5 Nebraska 28, Illinois 6



Champaign, III. (Sept. 29) -- Nebraska scored touchdowns on its first three offensive possessions and held Illinois to under 200 yards of total offense in a 28-6 victory Friday night in Champaign.

The Husker offense totaled 411 yards on the night, while the Blackshirts held the Illini to 199 yards, as the Blackshirts held its third straight opponent to 250 yards of less. NU's defense notched season highs in both tackles for loss and sacks with 10 and five, respectively.

Nebraska's offense included 246 vards

and three touchdowns from quarterback Tanner Lee on 17-for-24 passing, while Devine Ozigbo rushed for a career-high 106 yards, as NU had 165 yards on the ground.

After missing last week's game due to an injury, Stanley Morgan Jr. returned to the lineup and caught a career-high eight passes for 96 yards, including a 23-yard touchdown, while De'Mornay Pierson-El had four catches for 94 yards.

On its first possession, the Huskers went 88 yards on eight plays, capped by a 45-yard touchdown pass to Pierson-El for his fourth TD catch of the year.

The Illini responded with a 15-play drive that ate nine minutes off the clock. Illinois had 1st-and-goal at the three, but the Blackshirts stiffened and held the Illini to a field goal.

Nebraska's offense got the ball back and Lee again led a scoring drive, and he was a perfect 5-for-5 on the drive for 52 yards. Ozigbo ended the drive with a 15-yard scamper to make it 14-3.

The Huskers stretched the lead to 21-3, as Lee marched the Huskers 89 yardsm capped by a 6-yard TD pass to Tyler Hoppes for his first career score. Lee was 11-for-13 in the first half for 167 and two touchdowns, including a perfect 9-for-9 in the second quarter for 110 yards.

Nebraska got the ball to start the second half and the Illini defense delivered its first stop of the night as it came through with a quick 3-and-out. The Illini offense put together a 12-play drive, but were unable to get the ball in the end zone and settled for a field goal.

Nebraska's offense got back in rhythm and strung together a 93-yard scoring drive that lasted 14 plays over 6:27. Lee polished the drive with his third touchdown pass of the game, a 23-yard delivery to Morgan Jr. for the final margin.

Lincoln (Oct. 7) --- Nebraska' battled back from a 10-point deficit to tie the game at 17, but No. 9 Wisconsin scored 21 unanswered points to post a 38-17 victory.

The Huskers took the opening kickoff and raced into the Wisconsin red zone before a huge momentum swing. On 3rd-and-2 at the Wisconsin 17, Tanner Lee's pass to Devine Ozigbo went through Ozigbo's hands, ricocheted off his helmet and bounded into the arms of Badger linebacker Chris Orr who went 78 yards for the score.

Wisconsin extended the lead to 10-0 on its first offensive series, going 61 yards on 11 plays capped by Rafael Gaglianone's 37-yard field goal. The Huskers, who got into Wisconsin territory



on four of its first five drives but could not score, finally broke through late in the first half, as Lee connected with Stanley Morgan Jr. for an 80-yard touchdown pass to pull NU within 10-7. Lee completed 16-of-32 passes for 262 yards, while Morgan finished his night with four receptions for a career-high 115 yards and a score.

On Wisconsin's next offensive play, UW running back Jonathan Taylor sprinted 75 yards to the end zone to push the lead back to 17-7. Taylor finished with 249 yards and two touchdowns on 25 carries.

Nebraska responded quickly, as Ozigbo, who rushed for a career-high 112 yards on 23 carries, unleashed a 28-yard burst to put the Big Red quickly into Wisconsin territory. Nebraska eventually worked its way to the Badger 14, where Drew Brown booted a 32-yard field goal as time expired to make it a 17-10 game.

Nebraska's defense then capitalized on a Wisconsin turnover, as Aaron Williams intercepted an Alex Hornibrook pass and raced 14 yards to the end zone to tie the game with 10:43 left in the third quarter.

After a fumble and a pair of penalties on the kickoff, the Huskers had Wisconsin back at its own 7-yard line, but the visitors went 93 yards for the go-ahead score. Taylor took the first three carries of the drive and galloped 32 yards before Hornibrook connected with Quintez Cephus on a 31-yard pass to convert on 3rdand-4. Moments later, Hornibrook found Cephus in the end zone on a five-yard TD pass to make it 24-17.

Wisconsin extended the lead to 31-17 midway through the fourth quarter, going 80 yards in 10 plays, culminating in a two-yard touchdown by Taylor.

Nebraska's next drive ended with a fumble after a completion on a short pass from Lee to Morgan, and Wisconsin turned the mistake into points with a 10-play, 40-yard drive that ate up 6:15 and ended with a one-yard plunge by Bradrick Shaw with 2:40 left to extend the Badger margin to 38-17. In the fourth quarter, Wisconsin outgained the Huskers, 125-17, with all 125 yards coming on the ground.

Lincoln (Oct. 14) – Nebraska freshman JD Spielman set the Husker single-game record with 200 receiving yards on 11 catches, but quarterback J.T. Barrett led Ohio State to touchdowns on each of its first eight possessions on the way to a 56-14 win.

The Buckeyes amassed 632 yards of total offense and weren't unsuccessful on a drive until their ninth possession of the game after Barrett ended his night. Ohio State's balance included 354 yards passing and 279 yards rushing and a whopping 41 first downs. Nebraska passed for 349 yards to nearly match the Buckeyes through the air, but the Huskers could only muster 44 yards on 16 carries on the ground.

Barrett finished a spectacular night by completing 27-of-33 passes for 325 yards and five touchdowns. He added 10 carries for 48 yards

and two more scores as he had a hand in seven of Ohio State's eight touchdowns. J.K. Dobbins led OSU on the ground with 12 carries for 106 yards and a score, while Mike Weber added 18 carries for 82 yards.

Nebraska quarterback Tanner Lee also had a solid night, completing 23-of-38 passes for 303 yards and two scores with no interceptions.

In a first half completely controlled by Ohio State, the Buckeyes took a 35-0 lead to the halftime locker room. Ohio State rolled up 366 total yards on 42 plays in 15:35 of possession time. The Buckeyes scored on each of their five first-half drives, with all five drives covering at least 59 yards and all taking at least eight plays. On the flip side, the Huskers managed just 116 yards on 33 plays and went just 2-for-9 on third-down conversions in the first half.

Nebraska finally broke through on its first possession of the second half with Lee's 77-yard touchdown pass to Spielman with 11:05 left in the quarter. Nebraska's two-play drive took just 17 seconds, but gave life back to Huskers.

Barrett kept the Buckeyes moving, leading a seven-play, 75-yard march that ended with his 18-yard pass to Marcus Baugh with 7:49 left in the quarter to extend the margin to 49-7.

However, the Huskers continued to fight, as Lee led a four-play, 68-yard scoring drive that closed with his 17-yard touchdown pass to Stanley Morgan Jr., who finished the night with three receptions for 30 yards against a tough and talented Ohio State secondary.

Ohio State produced its final scoring drive of the night with a 15-play, 66-yard drive that lasted 6:24 and resulted in Barrett's six-yard touchdown pass to Hill. It was Hill's second touchdown catch of the night, as he led the Buckeyes with seven receptions for 80 yards.
