#### THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

Nebraska stays at home on Saturday to take on the Troy Trojans in a non-conference contest at Memorial Stadium. The game is set for an 11 a.m. kickoff with the contest televised on BTN and available on the IMG Husker Sports Network.

The Huskers enter the contest with an 0-1 mark following a 33-28 loss to Colorado last Saturday in the season opener in Lincoln. Nebraska showed promising signs on both sides of the ball, rolling up 565 yards of total offense and registering seven sacks. However, three turnovers and a late Colorado score were the difference in the contest.

Troy comes to Lincoln with a 1-1 record, following a 59-7 victory over Florida A&M on Saturday evening. The Trojans opened the year with a home setback against Boise State, but rebounded by rolling up 477 yards of offense and forcing four turnovers in the victory. Troy is coming off an outstanding season in 2017, posting an 11-2 record and capturing the Sun Belt Conference crown.

Saturday's matchup will be the fifth all-time meeting between the schools. The Huskers defeated Troy four times in six seasons between 2001 and 2006, with each of the games at Memorial Stadium.

#### THIS WEEK'S NUMBERS

329

Nebraska rushed for 329 yards on 54 carries against Colorado. The rushing total was Nebraska's first 300-yard game since a 310-yard effort at Northwestern in 2016, and the highest by the Huskers since NU rushed for 458 yards against Illinois on Sept. 27, 2014.

Nebraska recorded seven sacks for 43 yards against Colorado. The seven sacks were the most by Nebraska since also posting seven at Michigan in 2013. Nebraska had a total of 14 sacks as a team in 2017 with a high of five at Illinois.

In the opener against Colorado, 87 percent of the Huskers' total offense output was produced by players making their Husker debut. Of the 565 total yards, 492 were produced by players in their first Nebraska game, including 236 passing yards and 256 rushing yards.

Nebraska and Troy will meet for the fifth time on Saturday, with NU holding a 4-0 edge in the series.

- The four previous meetings have all been played in Lincoln between 2001 and 2006.
- Nebraska won each of the first four meetings by 15 or more points, including a pair of shutouts in the most recent meetings in 2003 and 2006.
- DeJuan Groce returned two punts for touchdowns in the 2002 victory in Lincoln, setting a Nebraska record.

#### **HUSKERS VS. SUN BELT**

Nebraska owns a perfect 9-0 record alltime against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. The most recent matchup was a a season-opening victory over Arkansas State in 2017.

- In addition to a 4-0 record against Troy, Nebraska is 3-0 against Arkansas State and 1-0 against both Louisiana-Lafayette and South Alabama.
- In addition to Saturday's game, Nebraska has future games scheduled against South Alabama (2019) and Georgia Southern (2022).

#### **FOUR SENIORS SELECTED AS 2018 TEAM CAPTAINS**

Four Husker seniors were elected by their teammates as captains for the 2018 season. On offense, the captains are OG Jerald Foster and WR Stanley Morgan Jr. Representing the defense are NT Mick Stoltenberg and LB Luke Gifford.

- This marks the second straight season Nebraska has had three Nebraska natives as captains. Prior to last season Nebraska had not had three homegrown captains since 2001.

- This marks the 13th straight season at least one native Nebraskan has been elected as a captain.
- Foster and Gifford were teammates at Lincoln Southeast High School. This marks the first time high school teammates have served as captains in the same year since Jerry Tagge and Jim Anderson in 1971. Tagge and Anderson both went to high school at Green Bay West in Wisconsin. Foster and Gifford are the first pair on in-state high school teammates to serve as captains together.
- Foster is serving as a captain for the second straight season, and becomes just the 11th two-time team captain in NU history. This marks the sixth straight season an offensive lineman has served as a captain.

#### MARTINEZ EXCELS IN FIRST CAREER START AT NEBRASKA

True freshman Adrian Martinez made a memorable first start for Nebraska on Saturday against Colorado. Martinez rushed 15 times for 117 yards and two touchdowns, including a 41yard run in the first quarter. He completed 15of-20 passes for 187 yards and one touchdown.

- The 117 rushing yards by Martinez were the most rushing yards by a Nebraska quarterback since Tommy Armstrong Jr. rushed for 132 yards at Northwestern in 2016. It marked the most rushing yards for a quarterback in a season opener since Taylor Martinez ran for 135 yards against Chattanooga in 2011.
- The 41-yard touchdown run by Martinez was the longest rush by a Husker quarterback since Armstrong had a 42-yard run against McNeese State in 2014.
- Martinez accounted for 302 yards of total offense, just the third 300-yard total offense game by a Nebraska freshman. It was also the first-ever 300-yard total offense game by a true freshman quarterback.
- Martinez became the first true freshman quarterback in NU history to start a season opener. He was just the second freshman quarterback to start an opener, joining Taylor Martinez who started as a redshirt freshman in 2010
- Martinez joined Tommie Frazier (1992) and Cody Green (2009) as the only true freshmen to start at quarterback in Husker history.

#### **HUSKERS SHOW POTENTIAL** FOR POWERFUL RUNNING GAME

Nebraska churned out 329 rushing yards on 54 attempts against Colorado. Both totals bettered Nebraska's season highs from the 2017 season. In fact, the Huskers had 243 rushing yards by halftime, surpassing last year's single-game high of 225 yards against Arkansas

- The 329 rushing yards were Nebraska's most yards on the ground since rushing for 458 yards against Illinois in 2014.
- Nebraska surpassed 300 yards on the ground for the first time since rushing for 310 yards at Northwestern on Sept. 24, 2016.

#### **NOTING GAME 1**

- Nebraska's 329 rushing yards were its most in four seasons, dating back to a 458-yard outburst against Illlinois in 2014. It was the Huskers' first 300-yard effort since rushing for 310 yards at Northwestern in 2016.
- Freshman quarterback Adrian Martinez rushed for 117 yards and two touchdowns.
   His 117 rushing yards are the most by a Husker quarterback since Tommy Armstrong Jr. had 132 yards rushing at Northwestern in 2016.
- Running back Greg Bell had 104 rushing yards, giving the Huskers a pair of 100yard rushers in the same game. It marked Nebraska's first double 100-yard rushing game since a 2014 win at Fresno State.
- Bell had a 45-yard rush in the second quarter, marking Nebraska's longest rushing play since a 63-yard run by Terrell Newby against Illinois in 2016.
- Nebraska registered seven sacks against Colorado, its most since also recording seven sacks at Michigan in 2013. The Huskers sack total is halfway to its 2017 season total of 14 sacks.
- Senior linebacker Luke Gifford had 1.5 sacks for 11 yards and three tackles for loss in the game. He entered the contest with career totals of 1.5 sacks and six tackles for loss.
- Junior defensive lineman Khalil Davis had two sacks for 16 yards. He entered the game with career totals of two sacks for 11 yards.
- Running back Devine Ozigbo scored a rushing touchdown in the second quarter for his 10th career rushing touchdown. He has at least one rushing TD each of his four seasons.

- Adrian Martinez (117) and running back Greg Bell (104) both cracked the century mark on the ground. That marked the first time Nebraska has had a pair of 100-yard rushers in the same game since a 2014 win over Illinois.
- Nebraska had a pair of runs of 40 yards or more in the game—a 41-yard touchdown by Martinez and a 45-yard rush by Bell. That was the first time Nebraska had two runs of at least 40 yards in a game since a 2014 win at Fresno State.

## HIGH-OCTANE OFFENSE POSTS PROLIFIC NUMBERS IN GAME ONE

Head Coach Scott Frost and his staff oversaw one of the nation's most potent offenses at UCF in 2017. The season opener against Colorado showed that Nebraska could feature similar explosiveness in 2018.

- Nebraska posted 565 yards of total offense vs. Colorado, with 329 rushing yards and 236 through the air.
- The 565 yards marked the first 500-yard total offense game for the Huskers since posting 556 yards at Northwestern in 2016.
- The total offense output was the best by Nebraska in 35 games, dating back to a 610yard effort against Southern Miss in 2015.

## NEBRASKA PASSING GAME LED BY RECORD-SETTING TANDEM

In 2017, Stanley Morgan Jr. and JD Spielman combined for 1,816 receiving yards, the highest two-player total in Husker history. The duo set the top mark despite each player missing a game due to injury. Morgan is primed for a strong senior season in 2018, while Spielman is back for his sophomore campaign.

Morgan set a Nebraska record with 986 receiving yards in 2017. Spielman added 830 receiving yards, a total that ranked seventh in school history and was the most ever by a Husker freshman.

• In the season opener, Morgan (5-75) and Spielman (3-67-TD) combined for eight receptions for 142 yards and a touchdown.

## MORGAN AIMS TO BE NEBRASKA'S ALL-TIME LEADING RECEIVER

After setting a school record with 986 receiving yards in 2017, Stanley Morgan Jr. will look to become Nebraska's all-time leading receiver this fall.

Morgan has 124 career receptions, which ranks seventh on NU's all-time list. He needs 57 receptions to tie Kenny Bell (181) atop the Husker chart. Morgan has 1,818 career receiving yards to rank fifth on Nebraska's all-time list. Against Colorado, he moved past Terrence Nunn into the top five on the list. Morgan needs 871 yards to tie Bell (2,689) for the most receiving yards in program history.

The New Orleans native put himself in position to challenge Nebraska's all-time records thanks to a breakout junior season, when he earned All-Big Ten accolades. Morgan caught 61 passes for 986 yards and 10 touchdowns in 2017 after entering the year with 58 career receptions, 757 career receiving yards and five career touchdown catches.

- Morgan set Nebraska records with 986 receiving yards and five 100-yard receiving games in 2017, while ranking third in school history in touchdown receptions (10) and fifth in catches (61).
- He led the Big Ten and ranked 14th nationally in receiving yards per game (89.6) in 2017. His 986 receiving yards ranked second nationally among players who saw action in 11 or fewer games.
- Morgan led all Big Ten wide receivers and ranked 16th nationally in touchdown catches with his 10 touchdown grabs.
- He produced his first five career 100-yard receiving efforts in 2017, leading the Big Ten in that category.
- Morgan posted 185 receiving yards at No. 13 Penn State, the second-highest total in school history.
- He had at least three catches in every game last season. Morgan had five catches in the opener with Colorado, extending his streak to 27 consecutive games with a reception, the fifth-longest streak in Husker history.

#### SPIELMAN LOOKS TO BUILD ON FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA SEASON

JD Spielman returns for his sophomore season in 2018 after earning freshman All-America accolades in 2017. Spielman emerged as one of the nation's most productive freshmen in 2017 after redshirting in 2016, when he was named Nebraska's Offensive Scout Team MVP.

Spielman was named a freshman All-American by both USA Today and the Football Writers Association of America and was a thirdteam coaches' All-Big Ten pick. He also made the Big Ten Network's All-Freshman team as both a wide receiver and kickoff returner.

Spielman hauled in 55 receptions for 830 yards as a redshirt freshman in 2017, both of which were Nebraska freshman records. He also totaled 669 kickoff return yards to finish with 1,572 all-purpose yards, the most by a freshman in school history.

- Spielman opened the 2018 season with 106 all-purpose yards against Colorado. He caught three passes for 67 yards, including a 57-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter.
- The 57-yard touchdown catch marked the sixth play of 40 yards or longer for Spielman in 12 career games. He has three kickoff returns of that length, two receptions and one rush.
- Spielman enters the Troy game with 897 career receiving yards. He is 103 yards from becoming the 27th player in school history with 1,000 career receiving yards.
- $\bullet \, \mathsf{Spielman} \, \mathsf{led} \, \mathsf{all} \, \mathsf{FBS} \, \mathsf{freshmen} \, \mathsf{in} \, \mathsf{receiving} \, \mathsf{yards} \,$ (830) in 2017. Spielman also ranked second among all freshmen nationally in kickoff return yards (669) and catches per game (5.0), was third in all-purpose yards (1,572) and fifth with 55 total receptions.
- Among all FBS players, Spielman ranked 13th nationally in all-purpose yards and was one of only five players in the country to total 1,500 all-purpose yards in fewer than 90 attempts. He also led all FBS players in fourth-down receptions (7) and receiving yards (89) and ranked fifth in third-down receiving yards (350).
- Spielman led the Big Ten in kickoff return yards and kick return average and was third in allpurpose yards and receiving yards per game. He also led the league with 88.1 receiving yards per game in conference play and tied Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor for second with an average of 157.8 all-purpose yards per game in league play.

- An explosive playmaker, Spielman posted Nebraska's longest return in 2017 (a 99-yard kickoff return vs. Arkansas State), the Huskers' longest rush (40 yards vs. Northwestern) and the team's second-longest reception (77 yards vs. No. 9 Ohio State).
- Spielman had 11 catches for a school-record 200 yards against No. 9 Ohio State. In addition to posting the only 200-yard receiving game in school history, Spielman's 11 catches were the most ever by a Husker freshman and ranked third overall in program history.
- In addition to setting freshman records for receptions, receiving yards and all-purpose yards, Spielman posted the sixth-most overall receiving yards in school history and the seventh-most receptions.

#### **DEFENSE SHOWS PLAYMAKING** ABILITY IN SEASON OPENER

The Nebraska defense showed the ability to be one of the nation's most improved units in 2018. Despite falling to Colorado, the positive signs from the defense were evident last Saturday.

- Nebraska recorded seven sacks for 43 yards against Colorado. The seven sacks were the most for the Huskers since also recording seven at Michigan in 2013-a span of 56 games. The last time Nebraska had more than seven sacks was in the 2009 Big 12 title game against Texas, when the Huskers had nine sacks.
- The seven sacks on Saturday represented half of Nebraska's 2017 season team sack total. The Huskers finished 2017 with 14 sacks for 85 yards.
- Nebraska limited Colorado to 44 rushing yards, including just 12 first-half rushing yards. The 44 yards rushing are the fewest by a Nebraska opponent since Maryland rushed for 11 yards in 2016.

#### YOUNG CLIMBING NU TACKLE LIST

Dedrick Young II entered his senior season with 201 career tackles, nearly 70 more than any other Husker. Young will look to move into the top five on NU's all-time tackle list this fall. In the season opener, Young recorded nine tackles, including two tackles for loss.

- Young is the 35th Husker to record 200 career tackles and just the fourth to reach the mark prior to his senior season.
- Young needs 46 tackles to move into 10th place on Nebraska's all-time tackles list and 66 to crack the top five. Young has averaged 67 tackles per season over his first three years.
- This fall, Young will look to become the first player in school history to total at least 60 tackles all four seasons. He set a Nebraska true freshman record with 61 tackles in 2015, added 60 stops as a sophomore in 2016 and totaled 80 tackles as a junior in 2017.

## LINEBACKERS MAKE MARK IN SEASON OPENER

Young is the most experienced veteran among a seasoned group of Nebraska linebackers. Against Colorado, Nebraska started Young, a fourth-year senior, in addition to fifth-year senior Luke Gifford and fourth-year juniors Mohamed Barry and Tyrin Ferguson.

- Each of the four linebackers made their presence known against Colorado. The group represented the top four tacklers in the game, all totaling at least nine tackles.
- As a group, the Huskers' four starting linebackers combined for 42 tackles, 2.5 sacks and seven tackles for loss in the opener.
- Gifford made 11 tackles, 1.5 sacks and two tackles for loss. Barry led the team with 12 total tackles, while Young and Ferguson both had a pair of tackles for loss.

## STILLE BACK AFTER STRONG FRESHMAN YEAR

Ben Stille flourished as a redshirt freshman in 2017 in his first season as an outside linebacker and defensive end in NU's 3-4 defensive scheme. Stille did not play in the first three games but was a major contributor over the season's final nine games, earning one start against Wisconsin. He totaled 24 tackles on the season and led the Huskers with 10 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. This fall, Stille has turned his attention to the defensive end spot.

In the season opener, Stille picked up where he left off in 2017, recording a nine-yard sack in the fourth quarter.

 With his 10 TFLs in 2017, Stille became the first Husker freshman to lead the team in tackles for loss since 1968, the first year the stat was tracked.

- Stille led all Big Ten freshmen and ranked eighth overall in the league in tackles for loss per game (1.06). All 10 of his TFLs came during Nebraska's nine-game Big Ten schedule.
- With his 3.5 sacks, Stille became the first Husker freshman to lead the team in sacks since the stat began being tracked in 1981.
- Stille was named to the Big Ten Network All-Freshman team. He was also named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after registering four tackles, three TFLs and his first career sack and forced fumble in the Huskers' win at Illinois.

#### **CLEAN SLATE AT QUARTERBACK**

Nebraska's roster features four quarterbacks, none of whom had ever taken a snap for the Huskers before last Saturday's game. Among the four quarterbacks, only a pair of transfers - junior Andrew Bunch (Scottsdale CC) and sophomore Noah Vedral (UCF) - had taken a snap at the collegiate level. Vedral is the only quarterback on the roster who has appeared in an FBS game, but he must sit out this fall due to NCAA transfer rules.

- This year marks the first time since 1972 Bob Devaney's final year that the Huskers opened a season without a single quarterback who has ever taken a snap at Nebraska. In that 1972 season, Dave Humm emerged as the starter and threw for 2,259 yards, which at the time was both a Nebraska and Big Eight Conference record. Humm was a freshman on the Husker roster in 1971, but freshmen were ineligible at the time per NCAA rules.
- True freshman starter Adrian Martinez missed all of his senior season in 2017 due to injury. Before Saturday he last played in a game on Nov. 25, 2016, for Clovis High School in the semifinals of the Central Section CIF Division I Championships.
- For the third time in four seasons, Scott Frost's offense is being run by a quarterback who had never taken a snap at the FBS level prior to the start of the season. That group includes Adrian Martinez this season, true freshman McKenzie Milton at UCF in 2016 and FCS transfer Vernon Adams Jr. at Oregon in 2015.
- Frost has been an offensive play-caller for three quarterbacks in his career, and each of those quarterbacks have been among the most efficient passers in NCAA history. Heisman Trophy winner Marcus Mariota led the nation in pass efficiency in 2015 with the 11th-best mark in NCAA history. The next year, first-year starter Vernon Adams led the nation in pass efficiency with the 16th-best mark in NCAA history. McKenzie Milton emerged as the starter in the third game of his true freshman season at UCF in 2016 and in his first year as the full-time starter, Milton ranked second nationally in pass efficiency in 2017 with the No. 16 mark in NCAA history.
- Quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco has guided four quarterbacks to conference newcomerof-the-year accolades in the past 17 seasons.

#### FROST IN FIRST SEASON

Scott Frost is in his first season as Nebraska head coach in 2018. Frost is in his third season overall as a head coach, and owns a 19-8 career record as a head coach.

- Frost was the consensus 2017 national coach of the year after leading UCF to a 13-0 season. UCF was the only FBS unbeaten team in 2017.
- In Orlando, Frost led the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history. He inherited an 0-12 team and led the Knights to a bowl game in his first season in 2016. That set the stage for Frost to become the first coach in FBS history to turn a winless team into an undefeated team in just two years.
- Frost brought all nine of his UCF assistant coaches with him to Lincoln. Barrett Ruud also followed Frost to Lincoln after serving as a quality control administrator with the Knights. Ruud was promoted to inside linebackers coach in January, when the NCAA permitted schools to add a 10th assistant coach.
- Before becoming UCF's head coach in 2016, Frost spent seven seasons at Oregon (2009-15) and two years at Northern Iowa (2007-08). Included in those stops were stints as the Ducks' offensive coordinator from 2013 to 2015 and as the Panthers' defensive coordinator in 2008.
- Frost has been a proven winner in his coaching career. In 12 seasons as a full-time assistant or head coach, Frost's teams have posted a 122-26 record, averaging more than 11 wins per season. Frost has been a part of seven conference championship teams in his 11 seasons and has twice coached in the national championship game.
- Frost's teams have been ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his 11 seasons, including eight top-10 final rankings and six top-five final rankings.
- A Nebraska native, Frost is the fifth Husker player to return to Nebraska as head coach. His staff also features former Husker players Greg Austin (2003-06), Ryan Held (1993-96) and Barrett Ruud (2001-04).

#### STAFF HAS FAMILIAR, FRESH FACES

All 11 members of Nebraska's 2018 coaching staff are in their first season with the Huskers. None of the 11 had ever been a full-time coach at Nebraska before, but the staff still has plenty

Head Coach Scott Frost played for Nebraska from 1995 to 1997 and served as a graduate assistant coach during the Huskers' preparations for the 2002 Independence Bowl. Running backs coach Ryan Held also played for Nebraska (1993-96) and was an undergraduate coach on Nebraska's 1997 national championship team. Barrett Ruud (2001-04) and Greg Austin (2003-06) are also former Huskers, although neither had ever coached at Nebraska prior to this season.

The fresh faces on staff are seven assistants who are Nebraska newcomers: defensive Erik Chinander, offensive coordinator coordinator Troy Walters, special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach Jovan Dewitt, tight ends coach Sean Beckton, defensive line coach Mike Dawson, defensive backs coach Travis Fisher and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco.

#### **HUSKER HIGHLIGHTS**

Nebraska football is the only team in any sport in NCAA history to boast 100 athletic All-Americans and 100 academic All-Americans.

Three Huskers have won the Heisman Trophy, all since 1972. Johnny Rodgers won in 1972, Mike Rozier in 1983 and Eric Crouch in 2001.

Nebraska ranks fourth in NCAA history with 893 all-time victories. The Huskers are one of only 10 teams with 800 all-time wins.

Nebraska has won five national titles: 1970, 1971, 1994, 1995 and 1997. The Huskers have won the second-most national titles of any school in the country since 1970.

Nebraska ranks ninth nationally with a total of 24 former players and coaches (18 players, six coaches) who have been enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Nebraska leads the nation with a former Husker on a Super Bowl roster for 25 consecutive years.

The Huskers have won 46 conference titles in program history, the most in NCAA history. This includes 33 perfect conference seasons and 27 unbeaten seasons.

Nebraska ranks third in NCAA history with 53 all-time bowl appearances. The Huskers are one of only five teams to appear in 50 bowl games.

Nebraska has had at least one player selected in each of the past 56 NFL Drafts. Only four schools have a longer NFL Draft streak.

Nebraska football has totaled 108 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, the most of any team in any sport in NCAA history.

Across all sports, the University of Nebraska has totaled a nation-leading 333 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, 75 more than any other school.

Memorial Stadium has been sold out for an NCAA-record 363 consecutive games dating back to Nov. 3, 1962 (includes Troy game)

#### STAFF FEATURES TOP COACHES

Nebraska Head Coach Scott Frost, the 2017 conference, regional and national coach of the year, brought a top-notch staff with him from Orlando to Lincoln as each of his assistant coaches and his head strength coach followed Frost to Nebraska.

- Frost was the consensus choice for the 2017 national coach of the year, after he led UCF to a 13-0 record as the nation's only undefeated team. Frost was named the 2017 national coach of the year by eight different organizations.
- Frost, Alabama's Nick Saban and Wisconsin's Paul Chryst are the only coaches to be a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach-ofthe-Year Award in both 2016 and 2017.
- Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander was one of 40 nominees for the 2016 Broyles Award, when he helped UCF rank in the top 10 nationally in four defensive categories.
- Offensive coordinator Troy Walters was one of five finalists for the 2017 Broyles Award after helping UCF lead the nation in scoring and rank fifth in total offense.
- Zach Duval was named the 2017 National Strength & Conditioning Coach of the Year.

## STAFF AIMS FOR ANOTHER OFFENSIVE TURNAROUND

Nebraska aims for an improved offense in Scott Frost's first season, after Frost and his staff orchestrated the greatest two-year offensive turnaround in NCAA history at Central Florida.

- The game one results at Nebraska shows things are pointed in the right direction. Nebraska rolled up 565 total yards, the best by a Husker team in 35 games.
- In two seasons in Orlando, Frost and his offensive staff helped UCF improve by an average of more than 27 points per game and by more than 270 yards of total offense per game.
- The staff inherited a UCF offense that ranked 125th nationally in scoring and 127th in total offense in 2015. Two years later, the Knights led the nation in scoring and ranked fifth in total offense.

- In 2017, Nebraska ranked 84th nationally in scoring while UCF led the nation. The Knights' averaged more than 48 points per game, while the Huskers' season high was 44 at Penn State.
- Nebraska ranked 87th nationally in total offense in 2017, while UCF was fifth. The Knights averaged 530.5 yards per game, while the Huskers' high mark of the season was 471 yards at Purdue, a mark NU eclipsed in week one.

## STAFF ALSO SEEKS ANOTHER DEFENSIVE TURNAROUND

Nebraska's defense struggled in 2017, but hope that the Blackshirts can show dramatic improvement lies in the immediate turnaround Erik Chinander and his fellow defensive assistants orchestrated at UCF in 2016.

- Against Colorado, Nebraska recorded seven sacks, half of last season's team total of 14.
   The Huskers held the Buffs to 44 rushing yards, bettering the season opponent low of 2017.
- Chinander and his defensive staff inherited a UCF defense that ranked 113th in total defense in 2015 and 117th in scoring offense. The staff inherited a unit that had allowed 464.1 yards per game and 37.7 points per game.
- Those totals are similar to what Chinander and company inherited at Nebraska, as the Huskers ranked 100th in total defense (463.2 ypg) and 115th in scoring defense (36.4 ppg).
- In his first season at UCF, Chinander earned a nomination for the prestigious Broyles Awardpresented annually to the nation's top assistant coach - after helping the Knights allow nearly two fewer touchdowns per game and 94 fewer yards per game.

#### **HUSKERS SEEK MORE TURNOVERS**

Nebraska's defensive staff was known for producing takeaways the past two seasons at UCF. Nebraska hopes increased takeaways can help the Huskers win the turnover battle that has proven key to success the past decade.

- UCF forced 58 takeaways the past two seasons, a total that ranked third nationally. The Knights ranked in the top 20 nationally in takeaways in each of the staff's two seasons in Orlando, while the Huskers last ranked in the top 20 nationally in takeaways in 2003.
- Nebraska was 115th nationally in takeaways in 2017, forcing just 12 turnovers. By comparison, UCF was second nationally with 32 takeaways.
- Led by the takeaways, UCF finished with a positive turnover margin in both 2016 and 2017. In contrast, Nebraska has posted a positive turnover margin just twice in the past nine seasons, winning nine games in each of those years.
- Nebraska has won 20 of its last 21 games when winning the turnover battle. The Huskers were -3 in the season opener with Colorado in a five-point loss.

## RUSHING BATTLE OFTEN HOLDS THE KEY TO SUCCESS

The ability to win the running game battle has been key to victory for the Huskers, and Nebraska will make a strong running game a focus again this fall. Nebraska dominated the running game in the opener against Colorado, out-rushing the Buffs 329-44. Nebraska's loss was a rarity when dominanting the line of scrimmage.

- Nebraska had won 15 consecutive games when holding an advantage in rushing yards prior to Saturday's loss.
- Scott Frost is 11-2 in his coaching career when his team out-rushes the opponent. The lone losses were Saturday vs. Colorado and UCF's game at Michigan in 2016.
- Stopping the run also keyed Nebraska victories.
   Nebraska has won 28 of its last 30 games when holding the opponent to fewer than 100 yards rushing, dating back to 2009.
- Frost and staff are 6-2 over the past three seasons when holding the opponent to under 100 rushing yards.

Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

- Nebraska plays a nation-leading seven games against teams that won a bowl game in 2017.
- The Huskers will play four games against teams ranked in the top 14 of the 2018 Associated Press preseason poll, with three of those four games on the road.
- The Huskers face one of the nation's toughest road schedules in 2018. NU faces preseason No. 4 Wisconsin, No. 5 Ohio State and No. 14 Michigan on the road and each of NU's five road opponents won at least eight games in 2017 while combining for a 51-16 record.

#### NFL STARS HIGHLIGHT 2018 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME CLASS

Long-time NFL standouts Mike Rucker, Kyle Larson and Danny Woodhead headline a list of six players, including four Huskers, who will be inducted into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame in 2018.

This year's class will celebrate together with an induction dinner on Friday evening. The class will be introduced prior to Nebraska's football game with Troy on Saturday.

- Rucker was a major contributor on Nebraska's 1995 and 1997 national championship teams, went on to an All-Pro selection in his nine-year career as a starter at defensive end with the Carolina Panthers. Rucker recorded 17 sacks and 40 tackles for loss during his Nebraska career.
- Larson, one of the top punters in Nebraska football history, claimed first-team All-America honors for the Big Red as a senior in 2003. A three-time All-Big 12 selection, Larson was one of three finalists for the Ray Guy Award in 2003. Larson went on to a five-year career as an NFL starter with the Cincinnati Bengals.
- Joining Rucker and Larson in the group of four Husker Hall of Famers, are offensive linemen Dan Schmidt and Bob Sledge. Schmidt was an honorable-mention All-American and an All-Big Eight pick at left guard for the Huskers as a senior in 1975. Sledge was a first-team All-Big Eight choice as an offensive tackle for the Huskers in 1988, when he helped NU to an NCAA rushing title and a conference title.

• Chadron State greats Danny Woodhead and Casey Beran add an impressive state college presence to the 2018 induction class. Woodhead was a two-time winner of the Harlon Hill Trophy (2006, 2007) as the nation's top player in NCAA Division II and a two-time firstteam CoSIDA Academic All-American during his career at Chadron State. He went on to a nine-year NFL career as a running back with the Jets, Patriots, Chargers and Ravens. Beran was the first Chadron State Eagle in history to earn both All-America and CoSIDA Academic All-America honors in the same season. He also joins Woodhead as one of just three Eagles in history to be named the Omaha World-Herald's Nebraska State College Athlete of the Year.

## SEVEN INDUCTED INTO NEBRASKA ATHLETICS HALL

Hall of Fame head coaches Bob Devaney and Tom Osborne headlined the fourth class of the Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame. The class was honored last weekend and recognized at the Nebraska-Colorado game.

Devaney and Osborne were the first coaches enshrined in the Nebraska Athletic Hall of Fame. Devaney guided Nebraska to a 101-20-2 record over 11 seasons from 1962 to 1972 and won eight Big Eight titles and the first two national championships – in any sport – in school history (1970 and 1971). Osborne served on Devaney's staff each year before taking over as head coach. He won 14 conference titles and three national championships in his 25 seasons (1973-97), guiding Nebraska to a 255-49-3 record. Devaney and Osborne were just the third coaching duo to post back-to-back 100win careers at the same institution and the first to do so in 22 years after Osborne recorded his 100th victory in 1983.

The 1983 Heisman Trophy winner, Rozier was the other football honoree. He was the second player in NCAA history to rush for 2,000 yards in a season when he ran for 2,148 yards in 1983 en route to winning the Heisman Trophy.

#### **NU AMONG ATTENDANCE LEADERS**

Nebraska averaged 89,798 fans for seven home games in 2017 to rank 10th nationally in average attendance. Nebraska has ranked in the top 11 nationally in attendance each of the past five seasons. The Huskers ranked 10th in 2016 (90,200), 11th in 2015 (89,998); 10th in 2014 (91,249, a school record) and ninth in 2013 (90,933).

• The Huskers have ranked in the top 15 nationally in attendance every season since 2006 and in the top 20 every year since at least 2000.

#### NCAA-RECORD SELLOUT STREAK CONTINUES

One of the most remarkable streaks in college sports continued in 2017. Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, an NCAA-record streak of 363 consecutive sellouts, 99 more than secondplace Notre Dame. NU is 305-57 (.843) during the streak and overall attendance during the streak is more than 27 million fans.

#### **HUSKERS OWN IMPRESSIVE HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE**

Nebraska has rewarded the loyalty of its fans with great success at Memorial Stadium.

- Nebraska has won at least six home games in 24 of the past 31 seasons. NU is 171-34 (.834) at home since 1989.
- The Huskers were 7-0 at home in 2016, marking the Huskers' first perfect home season since 2012, and just the second since 2001.
- NU is 18-11 in Big Ten home games since joining the league in 2011.
- Since 1970, Nebraska has had three home winning streaks of 20 or more games and has posted 41 unbeaten and untied home seasons.
- The Huskers are 540-153-20 all-time in Lincoln (.771, 713 games, 129 years), and 415-130-13 (.755, 557 games, 95 years) in Memorial Stadium (since 1923).

#### **NEBRASKA AMONG TOP** ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is in its 129th season and boasts an 893-381-40 all-time record in 1,314 games (.695). Nebraska is one of 10 programs with 800 all-time victories, ranking fourth with 893 wins.

- Nebraska will look to join the 900-win club this fall. Entering the 2018 season, Michigan (943) was the only program with 900 wins. Ohio State (900) has joined the group, with Texas (899) just one win short of the milestone.
- Since 1970, Nebraska owns a 459-139-5 record, for a .765 winning percentage in 603 games
- Nebraska is the nation's wins leader over the last 40 and 50 years.
- Nebraska has 24 10-win seasons since 1970. Overall, the Huskers have won at least 10 games in a season 27 times, including 12 seasons with 11 or more wins, seven seasons with 12 or more wins and three 13-win seasons (1971, 1994, 1997).
- NU posted its nation-leading 50th all-time nine-win season in 2016. Forty-two of those nine-win seasons have come since 1970 and 48 since 1962, 15 more than any other school.
- NU was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

#### **HUSKERS RANK 4TH & 7TH** ALL-TIME IN NATIONAL TITLES

Nebraska has won a total of five national titles in 1970, 1971, 1994, 1995 and 1997. In 1971, 1995 and 1997, the Huskers were crowned national champions in both the Associated Press and coaches' polls. In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the AP national title, but was No. 3 in the coaches poll behind No. 1 Texas and No. 2 Ohio State, both of whom lost their bowl games (the coaches' poll was voted on before bowl games). In 1997, undefeated Nebraska was voted No. 1 in the coaches' poll, while undefeated Michigan was No. 1 in the AP poll.

- In the coaches' poll (since 1950), Nebraska is tied with Miami and Texas for fourth with four national titles, behind Alabama (10), Oklahoma (6) and USC (5).
- In the AP poll (since 1936), Nebraska is tied with Minnesota for seventh with four national titles, trailing Alabama (11), Notre Dame (8), Oklahoma (7), Miami (5), Ohio State (5) and

#### NU LEADS IN CONFERENCE CROWNS

Nebraska has won a nation-leading 46 football conference championships in school history. The Huskers won 13 conference titles under Tom Osborne and eight under Bob Devanev.

- The Huskers have won titles in five different conferences, including: the Western Inter-State University Foot Ball Association (3 titles); the Missouri Valley (12 titles); the Big 6 (9 titles); the Big Eight (20 titles); and the Big 12 (2 titles).
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles are tied with Oklahoma for the most in NCAA history. Nebraska, Oklahoma and Michigan (42) are the only programs in NCAA history to win at least 40 conference championships.

#### NEBRASKA ALSO EXCELS IN THE CLASSROOM

Nebraska's rich tradition is not limited to the field, as the Huskers have been outstanding in the classroom as well.

- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 333 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans across all sports.
- Nebraska football has produced 108 academic All-Americans, the most of any single team in NCAA history.
- Nebraska also owns the NCAA record with 17 Top 10 Award Winners, which is considered the "Heisman Trophy" of academics.
- Nebraska football has produced nine Top 10 Award winners, the most of any single team in NCAA history.

#### 2018 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

#### **SCHEDULE NOTES**

- Nebraska's 2018 opponents combined for a 91-51 record in 2017.
- The Huskers will play five games against opponents who won at least 10 games in 2017, the second-most nationally.
- Nebraska will play nine games against 2017 bowl teams, the second-most nationally. NU is the only Big Ten team who will play nine games against 2017 bowl teams.
- NU will play a nation-leading seven games against teams that won a bowl game in 2017.
- Nebraska will face four teams who finished the 2017 season ranked in the top 20 of the Associated Press poll (at No. 5 Ohio State, at No. 7 Wisconsin, No. 15 Michigan State and at No. 17 Northwestern).
- Each of Nebraska's five road opponents won at least eight games in 2017 while combining for a 51-16 record.
- Three of the Huskers' five road opponents were ranked in the top 20 of the final 2017 AP poll (Ohio State, Wisconsin, Northwestern), while Iowa received votes in the final poll and Michigan spent 11 weeks ranked during the 2017 season, including six weeks in the top 10.

#### **COACHING STAFF NOTES**

- Head Coach Scott Frost is in his third season as a head coach in 2018. Frost is one of four former Husker players to return to the Nebraska sideline as head coach, and he is one of 26 FBS head coaches coaching at his alma mater.
- Nebraska's staff also includes former Huskers Greg Austin (2003-06), Ryan Held (1993-96) and Barrett Ruud (2001-04).
- Scott Frost and all 10 of his assistant coaches are in their third season working together, after Frost's entire staff followed him from UCF to Nebraska.
- The Huskers' staff teammed up to produce the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history at Central Florida. The staff inherited an 0-12 Knight team and led UCF to a 13-0 season in 2017, when the Knights were the nation's only undefeated team.
- Frost is one of only four FBS head coaches who won a national title as a player. Both Frost (1995 & 1997) and Ryan Held (1994 & 1995) were two-time national champions at Nebraska.
- Scott Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, while offensive coordinator Troy Walters was a finalist for the Broyles Award last season. Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander was a nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award.
- Troy Walters, the all-time leading receiver in Pac-12 history, was the 1999 Biletnikoff Award winner as the nation's top receiver. He is the only Biletnikoff Award winner currently coaching in college football.



#### **ROSTER NOTES**

- Nebraska's roster features 135 players hailing from 27 different states.
- The roster features 58 homegrown Huskers and is unofficially the largest roster of any non-service academy in the country.
- Behind Nebraska, the states most represented are: Florida (10), California (7), Texas (6) and Colorado, Georgia, Kansas and Missouri (5).
- Nebraska's 135-player roster is believed to be the third-largest roster in the country behind Army and Navy.
- The roster features 50 newcomers, including 38 true freshmen and 12 transfers (6 junior college transfers, 4 FBS transfers and 2 FCS transfers).
- Nearly two-thirds of the Huskers' 2018 roster are underclassmen, as 89 of Nebraska's 135 players are either freshmen or sophomores.

#### **ACADEMIC NOTES**

- Nebraska has always placed an emphasis on academic success, as the Husker football program has produced more CoSIDA Academic All-Americans than any other sport in NCAA history. With that emphasis, it has become a trend in recent years for many NU football players to earn their degree before playing in their final game.
- A total of nine Huskers are playing the 2018 season as graduates. Nebraska's total of nine graduates rank 25th in the FBS, 16th among Power Five program and fifth among Big Ten schools.

Troy comes to Lincoln with a 1-1 record. The Trojans fell in the season opener to No. 22 Boise State by a score of 56-20, but most recently defeated Florida A&M, 59-7 last Saturday. Troy had nearly 300 rushing yards and forced four turnovers in the game against Florida A&M.



On offense, sophomore running back Jabir Daughtry-Frye has rushed for 112 yards in two games and is averaging eight yards a carry. Senior Deondre Douglas leads the receivers with 128 yards and two touchdowns this season. Junior quarterback Kaleb Barker is 34-for-52 for 351 yards. He has five touchdown passes and one interception.

On the other side of the ball, sophomore inside linebacker Justin Whisenhunt and junior safety Melvin Tyus lead the defense with 11 and eight tackles, respectively. As a unit, the Trojan defense has racked up four sacks, two

interceptions and three fumbles.

#### **NEBRASKA VS. TROY SERIES HISTORY**

Nebraska and Troy have met four times prior to today - all in the early and mid 2000s. The Huskers have won all four meetings by a combined score of 159-30, which includes a pair of shutouts in 2003 and 2006. In the most recent meeting, the NU offense generated nearly 600 yards of total offense and the Blackshirts shutout the Trojans in a 56-0 victory. Marlon Lucky had 10 carries for 156 yards and three touchdowns, while Zac Taylor completed 14-of-17 passes for 268 yards and one touchdown.

#### ABOUT TROY FOOTBALL

The Troy football program had its inaugural season in 1909. Troy was a member of the NAIA before moving to NCAA Division II. In 1987, the Trojans won the NCAA Division II National Championship. The Trojans moved to Division I-AA (now FCS), before moving to Division I-A, now FBS, in 2001. A member of the Sun Belt Conference since 2004, Troy has claimed 21 conference titles in program history, including six in its current Conference.



#### NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Scott Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, earning the honor from at least eight different organizations.

As the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award winner, Frost joined Chris Petersen (2006 & 2009, Boise State) as the only coaches in the 32-year history of the award to win the honor while coaching a team outside of a Power Five Conference.

#### HISTORIC TURNAROUND AT UCF

At UCF, Frost and his staff produced the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history, inheriting an 0-12 team and leading the Knights to a 13-0 record just two years later.

- In his first season in 2016, Frost made history as the only first-time head coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season.
- UCF tied for the national lead with a six-win improvement from the 2015 to 2016 season. The Knights then ranked third nationally with a seven-win improvement from 2016 to 2017.
- UCF's seven-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 ranked 11th in NCAA history and was just the second time a bowl team improved by more than six wins the next season.
- Frost called UCF's plays, leading the greatest two-year offensive turnaround in NCAA history. The Knights' went from last to fifth in total offense, improving their output by more than 260 yards per game. UCF also went from third-to-last to first in scoring offense, improving by nearly 35 points per game.

#### FROST LED UCF TO 13-0 SEASON

In just his second season, Scott Frost guided UCF to a 13-0 record in 2017, when the Knights were the nation's only undefeated team.

- Frost became the fourth coach in FBS history to post a 13-0 record or better in either his first or second season as a head coach. Among that quartet, Frost is the only coach who inherited a team that won fewer than five games (inherited an 0-12 UCF team).
- Frost is one of only six active FBS head coaches who has posted a 13-0 season or better, joining Jimbo Fisher, Gary Patterson, Chris Petersen, Nick Saban and Kyle Whittingham.

 Frost also led Nebraska to a 13-0 record and a national title as the Huskers' starting quarterback in 1997. Frost is the only person in NCAA history to post a 13-0 season (or better) as both a player and a head coach.

#### FROST A TOP OFFENSIVE COACH

This fall marks Scott Frost's 10th season as either an offensive assistant, offensive coordinator or head coach who calls the offensive plays. During that time, he has consistently proven to be one of the nation's finest offensive coaches.

- In his last nine seasons coaching offense, Frost has worked with eight units that finished in the top 10 nationally in scoring, including seven that ranked in the top five.
- Frost has also been a part of seven teams that ranked in the top 10 nationally in total offense the past nine seasons.

#### FROST A PROVEN WINNER

The teams Scott Frost has been a part of have averaged 11 wins per season over the last 11 years, winning a total of seven conference titles.

- Frost has coached in two national title games and his teams have finished with a top-10 ranking eight times in the past 11 years.
- In two seasons as UCF's head coach, the Knights boasted the nation's best win improvement in 2016 and were the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- Frost was a two-time national champion who helped Nebraska to a 36-2 record, including a 24-2 mark as NU's starting quarterback.
- Frost is one of four active head coaches who won a national title as a player and is the only coach who won multiple national titles.

Walters is the only former Biletnikoff Award winner currently coaching in the FBS ranks, and he is the Pac-12's all-time leading receiver (4,047 yards).

**Lincoln (Sept. 1)** - Steven Montez's touchdown pass with 1:06 remaining gave Colorado a 33-28 win over Nebraska, spoiling the debut of Husker Head Coach Scott Frost.

The Huskers, who overcame an early 14-0 deficit, led 28-27 before Montez drove CU 77 yards for the winning score. A costly personal foul on NU on 3rd-and-24 kept the drive alive before Montez hit Laviska Shenault on a 40-yard strike for the winning score.

The Huskers who were hurt by 11 penalties and three turnovers, still had an opportunity as backup quarterback Andrew Bunch drove NU to the Colorado 21 in the final minute but were unable to score in the final seconds.

Nebraska put up 565 total yards on Colorado, including 329 rushing yards, as quarterback Adrian Martinez (117) and Greg Bell (104) both reached the century mark, the first time NU had two 100-yard rushers since 2014. Martinez added 187 yards on 15-of-20 passing in his collegiate debut before leaving the game with an injury.

The Blackshirts held CU to just 44 rushing yards, while recording seven sacks of Montez – the most by the Nebraska defense in five seasons. But Montez answered with 351 yards on 33-of-50 passing with three scores, two touchdown passes to Jay MacIntyre and the game-winner to Shenault, who had 177 receiving yards.

Trailing 14-0 after a pair of turnovers, Martinez put the Big Red on the board, sprinting 41 yards to paydirt on Nebraska's next drive to cap an eight-play, 75-yard march to pull the Huskers within 14-7. The Huskers tied the score going 52 yards in seven plays, as Devine Ozigbo scored from eight yards out. The senior had 25 of the 52 yards on the drive for the Huskers.

Martinez gave the Huskers their first lead, scoring from three yards with 2:24 left in the half. That capped an eight-play, 79-yard march for the Big Red. Martinez also completed 9-of-11 first-half passes for 86 yards.

In the second quarter, the Huskers outgained Colorado 140-36, including 105-(-12)

In the second quarter, the Huskers outgained Colorado 140-36, including 105-(-12) on the ground, to carry a 329-139 edge in total yards for the half despite managing just a 21-17 halftime lead.

After Colorado kicked a second field goal to pull within 21-20, Martinez found JD Spielman on a 57-yard strike to put the Big Red up 28-20 with 5:35 left in the third quarter.

The Buffaloes came right back on their next drive as Montez found MacIntyre on an 8-yard pass to put the visitors within one with 1:24 left in the third quarter.
