



ISU TRAVELS TO LINCOLN

Iowa State begins a two-game road swing by traveling to Lincoln before heading south to play Texas A&M ... ISU's victory over Army put the Cyclones at 3-1 with Paul Rhoads at the helm, the first such start for an ISU rookie head coach since 1931 (George Veenker) ... Iowa State is second in the nation in fewest quarterback sacks, giving up just three through seven games ... quarterback Austen Arnaud has cemented himself as a true dual threat, throwing for 1,246 yards and nine touchdowns while rushing for 434 yards and seven scores ... Alexander Robinson has rushed for over 100 yards four times this season, including in three consecutive games (Iowa, Kent State and Army) and is first in the Big 12 in rushing (105.3 ypg) ... senior Marquis Hamilton leads ISU in receiving, catching 31 passes, taking three in for touchdowns ... former walk-on Jake Williams has 23 catches for 234 yards and two scores ... safety David Sims has made an impact, picking off three passes in his first year playing for the Cyclones ... senior linebacker Jesse Smith has notched five double-digit tackle games (15 vs. North Dakota State, 13 vs. Army, 12 vs. Kansas State, 15 vs. Kansas, 11 vs. Baylor) ... true freshman Jake Knott made six tackles against both Kent State and Baylor.

NEBRASKA

Nebraska enters this game after losing 31-10 to Texas Tech at home last weekend ... the Huskers are 4-2 overall, their other loss coming to ACC power Virginia Tech ... Nebraska owns a 1-1 mark in the Big 12, having defeated North opponent Missouri ... running back Roy Helu Jr. is second in the Big 12 in rushing, two yards per game behind the conference's leader, ISU's Alexander Robinson ... Nebraska is sixth nationally in scoring defense, giving up just over 11 points per game ... the team also leads the Big 12 in both pass defense and pass efficiency defense.

Cyclone Notebook

- **2009 Records:** Iowa State (4-3, 1-2) vs. Nebraska (4-2, 1-1).
- **Coaches:** Iowa State's Paul Rhoads (first season, 4-3) and Nebraska's Bo Pelini (2nd season, 14-6).
- **Series:** Nebraska holds a 84-17-2 advantage in the all-time series. The Huskers have won the last four meetings between the two teams and five of the last seven overall. Nebraska's record against Iowa State at Memorial Stadium is 39-4.
- **Last Meeting:** Nebraska's defense shut down the Cyclone offense last season in a 35-7 Husker victory. Iowa State gained 218 yards of total offense while the Nebraska offense rumbled for 548 yards. ISU's Alexander Robinson rushed for 87 yards, getting 67 of those yards on a touchdown run in the third quarter. R.J. Sumrall led the Cyclones with six receptions for 44 yards. Iowa State forced five Nebraska fumbles and recovered three of them while sacking quarterback Joe Ganz twice.
- **Iowa State - Nebraska Notes:** Iowa State's last win in Lincoln came in 1977. The series is disputed, as ISU counts the 1907 game as a 13-10 win in Lincoln and Nebraska claims a 10-9 victory because of a disputed field goal. ISU beat Huskers at home in 2004 and 2006.

Head Coach Paul Rhoads



It was a storybook homecoming for Paul Rhoads. The Ankeny, Iowa native was introduced as the head coach of the Iowa State football team on Dec. 20, marking the return home for one of the nation's top coaches. Rhoads was born in Nevada, just 10 miles from the Iowa State campus. He grew up in Ankeny before going on to begin an outstanding coaching career.

Rhoads comes to Iowa State after serving as Auburn's defensive coordinator during the 2008 season where he led a unit that was ranked 15th nationally in scoring defense. Before that he spent eight seasons as the defensive coordinator at Pitt.

Five of his Panther defenses ranked in the top 30 in scoring and three were in the NCAA's top 12 for fewest yards allowed. He was named the best defensive coordinator in the Big East in 2007. His defense shut down the West Virginia attack, earning Pitt a 13-9 upset win over the No. 2 Mountaineers.

Rhoads was on former Iowa State head coach Dan McCarney's first staff, serving as the Cyclones' linebackers coach in 1995 and working with the secondary from 1996-99.

Rhoads is a 1989 graduate of Missouri-Western University with a degree in economics. He earned his masters from Utah State in 1991.

After graduate assistant positions at Utah State and Ohio State, Rhoads landed his first full-time coaching job at Pacific. He spent four seasons there before accepting McCarney's offer to work at Iowa State. Rhoads and his wife Vickie have two sons, Jacob and Wyatt. His father Cecil is in the Iowa State High School Football Coaches Hall of Fame.

STORY LINES

1. RHOADS RETURNS HOME

Ankeny native Paul Rhoads returns to his roots to take over the Iowa State football program. After successful stints as defensive coordinator at Auburn and Pitt, Rhoads was named Iowa State head coach by athletic director Jamie Pollard in December. A valedictorian at Ankeny High School, Rhoads was on Dan McCarney's staff as linebackers coach (1995) and secondary coach (1996-99) with the Cyclones.

2. RUSHING SUCCESS

Iowa State's run game has emerged as one of the nation's best. The Cyclones are averaging 213.9 yards per game on the ground, good for 14th nationally and first in the Big 12. This is the first season since the 2001 campaign that Iowa State has averaged more than 200 yards on the ground through the season's first seven games.

Junior running back Alexander Robinson has continued to improve in his third season as the team's starting rusher. After leading ISU in rushing yards in 2007 and 2008, Robinson has taken his game to a new level. He has 737 yards on the ground through seven games, going for 100 or more yards against Iowa, Kent State, Army and Kansas. Robinson became the first ISU running back to have three consecutive 100-yard games since 2000 (Ennis Haywood). After opening the season with 83 yards against North Dakota State, Robinson hit the century mark with 100 yards against Iowa. He followed up that performance with a 143-yard game at Kent State before rushing for 127 yards and two scores against Army. Despite playing with a sore groin, Robinson rushed for a career-high 152 yards and two scores at Kansas and added 83 yards in a little more than a half against Baylor.

Quarterback Austen Arnaud's mobility and toughness give the Cyclones a second rusher in the backfield at any given time. Arnaud ran for a career-high 84 yards against Kansas State and has 434 yards and seven touchdowns on the season. Redshirt freshman Jeremiah Schwartz has rushed for 214 yards

on 49 carries. He set career highs with 21 carries for 76 yards against Kansas State while spelling an injured Robinson. Backup quarterback Jerome Tiller set a career-best with 74 rushing yards against Baylor, including a 20-yard scramble for a touchdown.

3. SIMS MAKES SPLASH

Junior college transfer David Sims has made an immediate impact on the field for Iowa State. The safety signed with Oklahoma out of high school before going the JUCO route. He has three interceptions, returning one of his picks 41 yards against Iowa. Sims made a career-best 11 tackles against Iowa and has 42 total stops on the season.

His presence has not just been seen on defense. Sims returned a kickoff 60 yards against North Dakota State and is averaging 24.5 yards on 12 returns so far this season.

4. PROTECT THE QUARTERBACK

Not only has the Iowa State offensive line been opening holes for the running game, it has been helping keep quarterback Austen Arnaud on his feet. The Cyclones have given up only three quarterback sacks this season, second-best in the nation.

5. PASSING FANCY

Austen Arnaud is in only his second season as Iowa State's starting quarterback, but he is already cementing his name in the school record books. The hometown signal caller from Ames is already in the school's top-10 in career passing yards (5th) and completions (5th). He also ranks sixth on the school's all-time touchdown passes list with 24. His 59.7 percent completion percentage is the best in school history.

Despite a lack of offensive consistency - Arnaud is in his third offensive system in his four seasons at Iowa State - he has proven very effective. In 2008, Arnaud threw for 2,792 yards and 15 touchdowns, completing 61.6 percent of his passes. His 247 completions were a single-season school record.

Six times in his 19 starts Arnaud has accumulated over 300 yards of total offense, including a 493-yard showing

against Kansas State last season, tying the school's single-game total offense mark that had been set by Seneca Wallace. His 440 yards passing in that game set a school record, as did the 36 completions he threw against Missouri in 2008.

Arnaud has grown more comfortable with coordinator Tom Herman's offense as the season has gone along. Arnaud has thrown for 1,246 yards and nine touchdowns while completing 56.8 percent of his passes. He is averaging 240 yards of total offense a game, the sixth best mark in the Big 12. He set a season-high with 293 passing yards against Kansas and has thrown at least one touchdown pass in six of seven games this season.

6. DEPTH AT RECEIVER

Tom Herman's offense is predicated on having a large stable of athletic receivers. Fortunately for Iowa State, that key piece of the puzzle is already in place.

Senior Marquis Hamilton leads the team with 31 catches for 479 yards and three scores. Former walk-on Jake Williams has 23 catches and two more scores while tight end Derrick Catlett has been a threat, making 17 grabs for 215 yards on the year. Robinson has been a threat to catch the ball coming out of the backfield, hauling in a 54-yard catch and run against Kansas.

7. JACK TRICE STADIUM FACELIFT

Under the leadership of Athletics Director Jamie Pollard, the home of Iowa State football is getting a face lift. Pollard has spearheaded a remodeling project that included wider concourses, the renovation/construction of suites and the addition of restroom and concession buildings. The Jack Trice Club section on the stadium's east side was also entirely renovated.

8. EXPERIENCED SPECIAL TEAMS

Iowa State's strongest unit may well be its special teams. The Cyclones have standouts at punter, kicker and return positions. Punter Mike Brandtner is averaging 43.5 yards per kick this season, the third best single-season mark in school history. His 41.1 career average is fifth in ISU history. The Cyclones are fifth in the nation in net punting and second in the Big 12, averaging 41.26 yards per kick.

Place kicker Grant Mahoney has made 51 of 54 career extra point attempts and is 26-of-39 on field goals in his ISU career, connecting on a long field goal of 50 yards against North Dakota State and Army. He is one of seven kickers nationally (NCAA-FBS) with multiple field goal makes from 50 yards.

Return specialist Leonard Johnson is a threat to take it to the house any time he touches the ball. As a true freshman, Johnson ranked 19th nationally, averaging 26.4 yards per kickoff return. Johnson ran his way into the record books with an NCAA FBS record 319 kickoff return yards against Oklahoma State and is joined by Sims in the return game. The Johnson-Sims tandem ensures there is no safe place for opponents to kickoff.

True freshman Josh Lenz earned punt return duties during fall camp and had a 44-yard return against Army to set up a Cyclone score.

9. SMITH ANCHORS DEFENSE

Senior Jesse Smith has been the anchor of the ISU defense from his linebacker position for the last three seasons. Smith has a nose for the football. Five times this season Smith has earned double-digit tackles, making 15 stops against North Dakota State, 13 against Army, 12 vs. Kansas State, 15 at Kansas and 11 vs. Baylor. The former walk-on from Altoona, Iowa, has 245 stops, an interception, 5 forced fumbles and 3 fumble recoveries in his ISU career.

Credentials will be granted to the media on assignment from daily newspapers, ISU network radio affiliates (as space permits), originating radio stations and television stations. Misuse of these credentials will result in expulsion from the game and denial of credentials to future ISU athletic activities. Credentials are non-transferrable.

Photo Credentials

Photo credentials must be requested in the same manner as media credentials. For sideline armbands, photo credentials must be presented prior to the game in the press box in accordance with Big 12 Conference rules. Misuse of photo credentials will result in expulsion from the game. An affiliation photo ID must be shown on gamedays to obtain an armband for field admittance.

Radio Originations

A radio booth is provided for the visiting team's designated station. Additional originations may be arranged through Tom Kroeschell. Auxiliary booths (outside the press box) are used for additional stations. Telephone arrangements should be made through Iowa State University Telecommunications at (515) 294-8556.

Telephones & Ethernet

Iowa State provides four courtesy phone lines and one ethernet hub in the main press box area for media use on a first-come, first-served basis, as well as a wireless internet connection. Media requiring their own phone lines or ethernet should contact ISU Telecommunications at (515) 294-8556.

Gameday Operations

Parking

Media parking is located in the South Lot (S-3) of Jack Trice Stadium. Parking passes should be requested when requesting credentials.

Press Tower

The Jack Trice Stadium press tower is located on the west side of the stadium and is accessed through the press tower elevator. Admission is by media credential only. The press tower is a three-level facility with separate donor, media and radio-television decks. As per the instructions of the State Fire Marshal, smoking is not permitted in the press tower. Athletics Communications personnel will staff the press box for three hours following the game.

Services

Complete play-by-play copy, halftime stats, final team and individual stats, tackle charts and quotes from coaches and players are provided.

Photo Deck

A photo deck is located directly under the press tower directly below the donor (first) level. Arrangements to secure a spot should be made with the Athletics Communications office.

Interview Policies

In addition to weekly press conferences, interviews shall be conducted between 6:30-9 p.m. CST on Sunday through Wednesday. **MEDIA WISHING TO INTERVIEW IOWA STATE PLAYERS SHOULD CALL THE IOWA STATE ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS OFFICE BETWEEN 1-4 P.M. ON SUNDAYS WITH THEIR INTERVIEW REQUESTS.** All player interviews must be coordinated through the Communications office.

Post-game Interviews

ISU's locker room is closed. Following a "cooling off" period after the game, head coach Paul Rhoads will conduct a press conference in the Jacobson Athletic Building's Hunziker Auditorium (second floor). Media must enter the Jacobson Athletic Building through the facility's northwest door. Iowa State players requested by media personnel will be escorted from the locker room to the auditorium after Coach Rhoads is finished. Opposing media can attend the visitor's press conference in the meeting room directly opposite the visiting locker room in the Olsen Building.

ISU QB Jerome Tiller was also sacked once against Baylor

The Cyclone punt unit has also been superb. Punter Mike Brandtner is averaging 43.5 yards per punt this season and the coverage unit ranks fifth nationally in net punting, at 41.26 yards per kick.

AMES, Iowa -- Iowa State racked up 442 yards of total offense and Austen Arnaud threw a pair of touchdown strikes to Marquis Hamilton, as the Cyclones were triumphant in head coach Paul Rhoads' debut, defeating North Dakota State 34-17 in Jack Trice Stadium. The win ended ISU's 10-game losing streak. Iowa State began the Rhoads era on a high note, tallying seven points in its opening drive of the season. The Cyclones were successful on two third-down conversions in their 9-play, 81-yard scoring drive. Alexander Robinson scrambled for 18 yards on a draw play up the middle to give ISU an early 7-0 advantage. The Bison appeared on the verge of tying the game late in the first quarter after Pat Paschall squirted away for a 62-yard run to the ISU 18-yard line. Three plays later, quarterback Nick Mertens was closing in on paydirt, but ISU's Jesse Smith jarred the ball loose where it was recovered by Josh Raven at the 1-yard line, halting a potential NDSU score. The Cyclones increased their lead to 14-0 with 14:23 left before the half behind another impressive drive. This time ISU went 80 yards on 10 plays with Arnaud finishing it off with a 5-yard touchdown run. Robinson accumulated 45 of ISU's 80 yards in the scoring march. A costly turnover by the Cyclones helped the Bison get on the scoreboard for the first time. After NDSU recovered an Arnaud fumble, Mike Sigers rambled 42 yards to the ISU 1-yard line on the ensuing play. Paschall made it a 14-7 game two plays later with a 1-yard dive with 4:21 remaining in the second quarter. Both teams added field goals in the closing minutes of the first half, as the Cyclones went into intermission with a 17-10 lead. The Cyclones forced a turnover on NDSU's first drive of the second half, as David Sims picked off a Mertens pass that was tipped at the line of scrimmage. ISU made the Bison pay for the miscue, going 65 yards on six plays to push the lead to 24-10 with 8:31 left in the third quarter. Arnaud picked up a safety blitz and hit Hamilton on a slant for a 39-yard touchdown strike to cap off the drive.

AMES, Iowa -- Iowa State couldn't overcome six costly turnovers, as Iowa downed the Cyclones 35-3 in Jack Trice Stadium. Iowa intercepted five Cyclone passes and recorded four of its five touchdowns off of ISU miscues. Turnovers and penalties plagued the Cyclones in the opening period, as Iowa led at the half 14-3. ISU took an early lead when Grant Mahoney drilled a 46-yard field goal with 2:33 remaining in the first quarter. On the ensuing kickoff, the Cyclones tried an on-side kick, but the Hawkeyes recovered it inside Iowa State territory to give UI outstanding field position. A personal foul then gave Iowa the ball at the 12-yard line, and two plays later, Ricky Stanzi hit Brett Morse on a 1-yard pass to put Iowa up 7-3. Later in the second quarter, an Austen Arnaud pass was picked off by Iowa's Tyler Sash, who returned it 31 yards to the ISU 24-yard line. Stanzi then hit Derrell Johnson-Koulianos a couple of plays later from 18 yards out to give Iowa a 14-3 lead at the half. ISU was penalized seven times for 59 yards and had three interceptions in the first half. Another Cyclone turnover set up Iowa's next score. Alexander Robinson fumbled on the opening drive of the second half, setting up a 7-yard touchdown catch to Allen Reisner from Stanzi to make it 21-3 Iowa. Iowa's Brett Greenwood picked off Arnaud's fourth interception of the game to set up another Hawkeye touchdown. Brandon Wegher ran it in from 1-yard out to put the game out of reach at 28-3 with 4:27 left in the third quarter. Wegher finished the game with 101 yards on 15 carries to pace the Hawkeyes. Stanzi tallied 197 yards through the air on 18-of-34 passing. Sash tied an Iowa school record with three interceptions in the game. Robinson recorded the fourth 100-yard game of his career, rushing for 100 yards on 19 carries to steer the Cyclone offense. ISU defensive back David Sims intercepted a pair of Stanzi passes to give him three picks in the first two games of the season. A crowd of 52,089 saw the game.

Iowa State 34 Kent State 14

KENT, Ohio -- Alexander Robinson rushed for 143 yards, as Iowa State defeated Kent State, 34-14 in Kent, Ohio. The win was ISU's first on the road since October 29, 2005 (42-14; Texas A&M), ending a 17-game road losing streak for the Cyclones. The Cyclones, (2-1) on the season, took advantage of three first-half Golden Flash turnovers while racing out to a 27-7 halftime lead and never looked back. It was the most first-half points scored by a Cyclone team since tallying 28 in the opening period against Kent State last season. The victory marked just the third time an ISU head coach won his road debut since World War II. Clay Stapleton and Johnny Majors were the others. The Cyclones struck first after a solid return from David Sims and a Kent State personal foul gave ISU good field position at the Golden Flash 38-yard line. Austen Arnaud completed three-straight passes to Marquis Hamilton to move the ball inside the 10-yard line. However, the ISU offense got bogged down and had to settle for a 20-yard Grant Mahoney field goal for an early 3-0 lead. ISU stopped KSU on its first possession, forcing a punt. ISU's Austen Arnaud fumbled

on the next play, giving the ball back to the Golden Flashes. KSU took advantage of the Cyclone mistake, as Spencer Keith hit Dri Archer on a 44-yard touchdown toss on its next play to take a 7-3 lead. ISU bounced right back with an impressive 10-play, 69-yard drive to retake the lead at 10-7 with 4:57 remaining in the first quarter. Facing a 3rd-and-17 at the Golden Flash 22-yard line, Arnaud found Jake Williams, who made a diving catch in the corner of the end zone for his first career touchdown. Jesse Smith forced the ball loose from a Golden Flash runner to give ISU the ball back inside Golden Flash territory shortly after Williams' score. A few plays later, Arnaud scrambled in from nine yards out, his second rushing TD of the season, to improve the Cyclone lead to 17-7 with 2:52 left in the first quarter. Another costly KSU mistake helped the Cyclones pad their lead to 24-7.

Army 10 Iowa State 31

Sept. 26 • Jack Trice Stadium • Ames, Iowa

AMES, Iowa -- Alexander Robinson recorded 178 yards of total offense, including 129 on the ground, and scored three touchdowns in a 31-10 Iowa State victory over Army at Jack Trice Stadium. The win improved the Cyclones to 3-1, as ISU head coach Paul Rhoads became the first coach since George Veenker in 1931 to start 3-1 in their rookie season as the Cyclone mentor. Robinson had another big day for the Cyclones, improving his season rushing total to 455. He became the first Cyclone to record three-straight 100-yard games since Ennis Haywood rushed for over 100 yards in the first four games of the 2000 season. The Cyclone defense also came up big, holding Army's vaunted rushing attack to just 186 yards. Army entered the game averaging 258 yards on the ground, the seventh-best total in the nation. The game was tied at 3-3 at the end of the first quarter, as both teams traded field goals. ISU tied the game with a 50-yard field goal from Grant Mahoney, his second 50-yard boot of the season. He became the first Cyclone kicker to drill a pair of kicks from 50 yards or longer in a season since Ty Stewart did it in 1993. The Cyclones then capitalized on an outstanding punt return from Josh Lenz to take their first lead. Lenz returned a punt 44 yards to the Army 18-yard line to set up a Robinson 2-yard touchdown run a few plays later to give the home team a 10-3 lead with 7:36 left in the second quarter. After the Cyclone defense stopped Army on its next possession, Robinson struck again, rambling 68 yards for a touchdown to move ISU ahead 17-3 with 5:07 left before the break. It was the longest run in Robinson's career and the longest rush for a Cyclone since Jason Harris scored on a 68-yard run last season. Army kept the game tight with a late touchdown before the half. Chip Bowden hit Ali Villanueva on a 5-yard fade with 0:13 seconds left before intermission to make it 17-10 Iowa State at the half. Robinson ended the first half with 93 yards rushing.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. -- Emmanuel Lamur blocked a Grant Mahoney PAT attempt with 32 seconds left to help Kansas State escape with a 24-23 victory over Iowa State in the Big 12 Conference opener for both teams at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The loss dropped the Cyclones to 3-2 overall and 0-1 in Big 12 play. It was the first missed PAT in Mahoney's career, ending his streak of consecutive extra-point kicks at 47. An impressive drive and acrobatic touchdown catch by Jake Williams in the closing seconds of the game had set up the extra-point try. Iowa State fell behind early when Kansas State mounted an impressive first drive after the Cyclones stalled in their first series. The Wildcats marched 89 yards in 13 plays to go ahead 7-0 with 5:11 left in the first quarter. KSU recorded 83 of its 89 yards in the drive on the ground, which was capped off by quarterback Grant Gregory's 2-yard touchdown run. The Cyclones capitalized on a KSU turnover for their first points of the game. After running back Daniel Thomas fumbled deep in ISU territory, the Cyclones went 77 yards to set up a 32-yard Mahoney field goal to make it 7-3 KSU with just over nine minutes before the half. ISU grabbed its first lead of the game when Austen Arnaud found Derrick Catlett from 22 yards out to go ahead 10-7 with 3:55 left before intermission. This time the Cyclone drive went for 73 yards on 11 plays. An Arnaud 13-yard hook-up with Williams on a 3rd-and-7 was a key play in the Cyclone scoring drive. The score was tied at 10 at the break thanks to a Josh Cherry 39-yard field goal in the closing seconds of the first period. The halftime score reflected the game stats, as both teams were virtually even in most of the offensive numbers. ISU had 11 first downs to KSU's nine, and the Cyclones tallied 192 offensive yards to the Wildcats' 184.

Iowa State 36 Kansas 41

LAWRENCE, Kan. -- Like two prizefighters exchanging punch for punch, Iowa State and Kansas battled at Kivisto Field. The lead changed hands six times as the Iowa State offense posted its best offensive performance of the season. The Cyclones had one last gasp drive in the final three minutes of the game which expired at the KSU 31-yard line with one minute left in the game. Ultimately, it was Kansas scoring the win, 41-36. Robinson was over 100-yards for the fourth game this season, rushing for a career-high 152 yards on 27 carries and two touchdowns. ISU quarterback Austen Arnaud hit on a season-high 25 passes for a season-high 293 yards and two touchdowns. The ISU offense came out smoking in the second half, driving down the field to set up a 34-yard field goal by Grant Mahoney. The key play of the drive was a 21-yard run by Robinson. KU led 20-15 with 9:58 to go in the third quarter. Iowa State's defense then held at midfield. On the Cyclones' ensuing drive a 22-yard rumble by Robinson and a 39-yard pass play from Arnaud to Marquis Hamilton set up a 2-yard TD run by Arnaud as the Iowa State quarterback dragged a host of Kansas defenders into the endzone. Arnaud then hit Williams with a pass for a successful two-point conversion as ISU led 23-20 with 6:45 left in the third quarter. Again, Kansas answered with a 23 yard TD pass to Desmond Briscoe that put KU up 27-23. But, trading blow for blow, Iowa State's offense drove 71 yards down the field, capping its counter with a 17-yard scoring pass to Hamilton.

Baylor 10 **Iowa State 24**

AMES, Iowa -- The Iowa State football team operated in high gear against Baylor. Establishing control on both offense and defense, the Cyclones defeated BU, 24-10, in Jack Trice Stadium to end an 11-game Big 12 losing streak. ISU head coach Paul Rhoads notched his first Big 12 victory. The Cyclones (4-3/1-2 Big 12) recorded 454 yards of total offense in the win. The Big 12's top rushing offense continued to roll, racking up 240 yards on the ground with four players rushing for more than 40 yards. After staking Baylor an early 3-0 lead, the Cyclones posted 14 second-quarter points behind the stellar play of quarterback Austen Arnaud. The Ames native scored on a 1-yard run after leading the Cyclones on an impressive 12-play, 73-yard drive to help the Cyclones go ahead for the first time. ISU quickly made it 14-3 with another long march for a touchdown. Arnaud was 7-of-8 for 71 yards passing in the drive, connecting with Derrick Catlett on a 4-yard scoring strike to give the Cyclones an 11-point cushion.

The Cyclones were poised to score again late in the first half, but Arnaud was intercepted at the BU 2-yard line, as ISU went into the half with a 14-3 advantage. Marquis Hamilton had 85 yards receiving on eight catches in the first half, while Alexander Robinson rushed for 72 yards on 16 carries. ISU had 19 first-half first downs. Two key plays, one on defense and one on special teams, helped pad the Cyclone lead to 24-3 by the end of the third quarter. On the Bears' first drive of the second half, BU opted to go for it on a 4th-and-1 situation at its own 32-yard line. The Cyclone defense rose to the occasion, stuffing Blake Szymanski for no gain to give the Cyclones great field position. Grant Mahoney later drilled a 45-yard field goal to improve the Cyclone lead to 17-3. On BU's next possession, ISU's Zac Sandvig blocked Derek Epperson's punt attempt to once again provide ISU with great field position. This time the Cyclones capitalized with a touchdown, as Jerome Tiller rambled 20 yards to push the Cyclones ahead, 24-3 with 7:59 left in the third quarter.
