### K-STATE PREPS FOR MATCHUP WITH #6 NEBRASKA

**ESPN'S THURSDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL HEADS TO MANHATTAN FOR KEY BIG 12 NORTH BATTLE**

Kansas State, following a bye week this past Saturday, will shift its focus back to Big 12 Conference play as sixth-ranked Nebraska visits Bill Snyder Family Stadium Thursday for a highly-anticipated matchup of two undefeated teams. ESPN's Thursday Night College Football will be in Manhattan to air the battle to a national television audience as Rece Davis (play-by-play), Craig James (analyst), Jesse Palmer (analyst) and Jenn Brown (sideline) will have the call.

The contest can be also heard along the K-State Sports Network, online (for free) at www.k-statesports.com and on SIRIUS satellite radio channel 121 and XM channel 141. Wyatt Thompson will call the action with Stan Weber serving as the color analyst and Matt Walters providing sideline updates. Live stats are also available through CBS College Sports' Gametracker, while Twitter updates and a live in-game blog will all be a part of k-statesports.com's coverage. Westwood One radio will also be on hand to broadcast the matchup as John Tautges, Terry Donahue and Jason Horowitz will have the call.

All reserved tickets for the matchup, which will be the Wildcats' first Thursday night tilt since 1994 (at Kansas) and their first at home since 1992 (vs. Iowa State), are sold out.

**A QUICK LOOK AT THE WILDCATS**

Kansas State improved to 4-0 for the first time since 2003 following its come-from-behind win over UCF on September 25. The Wildcats have established themselves as one of the top rushing attacks in the Big 12 Conference through four games, averaging 216.0 yards a contest on the ground. All-America candidate Daniel Thomas has the entire nation keeping a close watch on the Little Apple as the senior currently ranks fourth in the nation in total rushing yards by a running back with 628 yards, while his 157.0 yards per game average rank fifth nationally overall and fourth among running backs. Quarterback Carson Coffman rallied the Wildcats with two fourth-quarter scoring drives against UCF and came up with big plays when the game was on the line.

Defensively, K-State has gotten solid play from defensive end Brandon Harold. His 20 solo tackles are the most in the Big 12 among all defensive linemen, while linebacker Alex Hrebec ranks third in the Big 12 in tackles with 39. Terrance Sweeney's eight passes defended currently rank second in the country, while the senior defensive back has also tallied two interceptions and forced a fumble.

**CAT FANS POURING THROUGH THE TURNSTILES**

Kansas State has averaged 50,105 fans at Bill Snyder Family Stadium through the first three home games this season, which includes two sellout crowds against UCLA and UCF. K-State's three-game total of 150,317 is a new school record for the first three non-conference games of a season. And, another sellout crowd is expected for Thursday night's matchup with Nebraska, which will mark the first time since 2000 that the Wildcats have sold out three games in the same season.

**A LOOK AT THE OPPONENT**

Sixth-ranked Nebraska will certainly be Kansas State's stiffest test so far in 2010 when head coach Bo Pelini and his Cornhuskers travel to Manhattan on Thursday. Nebraska's defense ranks among the nation's best in almost every statistical category and the emergence of dual threat quarterback Taylor Martinez has provided a spark offensively. On offense, only Nebraska in the Big 12 has rushed for more yards a game than K-State as Martinez and running backs Roy Helu, Jr., and Rex Burkhead account for 1,105 of the Huskers' 1,237 rushing yards this season. The Huskers currently rank fourth nationally with 309.3 rushing yards per game while checking in at No. 11 in scoring offense and 14th in total offense.

Defensively, the Huskers are allowing just 12.8 points a game and can stake claim as the nation's No. 1 pass efficiency defense and a pass defense that ranks third. In total defense, Nebraska ranks 11th, allowing just 265.0 yards per game. Lavonte David leads the squad with a Big 12-high 11.0 tackles per game, while Jared Crick and Baker Steinkuler have combined for 6.0 sacks and 9.0 tackles for loss.

**TWO OF THE BIG 12'S BEST MEET ON NATIONAL TELEVISION**

When Kansas State and Nebraska meet next Thursday, it will pit two of the Big 12 Conference's most successful programs in football. Kansas State, along with Nebraska, are two of five Big 12 programs that have reached the 60-win mark during 14-plus year history of the league. K-State became the fourth program in Big 12 history to reach 60 wins and currently ranks fourth in league history with 67 wins. Texas leads the group with 88 conference wins, while Oklahoma is second with 80 and Nebraska third with 75. Since 1996, K-State is 67-46 in Big 12 play.

**QUICK OUT OF THE GATE IN 2010**

Kansas State, which is ranked 27th (AP) and 29th (Coaches) in this week's national polls, is one of 18 FBS teams nationally that remains undefeated and will face another of those teams in Nebraska on Thursday. Beginning the season with a 4-0 record is not uncommon for Kansas State under head coach Bill Snyder as the Wildcats, with their win over UCF on September 25, moved to 4-0 for the 10th time since 1993. The last time a K-State team began the season 4-0 was back in 2003 when the Wildcats went on to win the Big 12 Championship and finish the season with an 11-4 record. Of the previous nine 4-0 starts, Snyder's Wildcats averaged 10.2 wins a season during those stretches. The last time that a K-State team opened the season 5-0 was back in 2000 when it began the year with six straight wins.

**BYE BENEFITS**

Giving head coach Bill Snyder and the Wildcats an extra week to prepare has traditionally been bad news for Kansas State opponents. The Wildcats have had 15 previous mid-season bye weeks under Snyder and have turned the extra week of preparation into an 11-4 record the following week. **K-STATE VERSUS THE NORTH**

K-State will step back into the Big 12 Conference portion of the schedule against a north division opponent on Thursday against Nebraska. The Wildcats are 45-26 (.634) vs. division opponents since 1996, which is second to only Nebraska among Big 12 North schools. Kansas State opened up Big 12 play on September 18 with a divisional win over Iowa State at Arrowhead Stadium.

**SNYDER AMONG BEST ACTIVE COACHES**

The author of the greatest turnaround in college football history, Bill Snyder is in act two of guiding K-State, and his work ranks among the best in college football when compared to other active coaches. Snyder, who currently ranks 12th all-time in wins among active FBS coaches, is one of just two active BCS coaches who have served at the same school for at least 18 years and have never held the same position at another school (Joe Paterno of Penn State). Also, Snyder holds the 11th-best winning percentage among active FBS coaches with at least 125 wins. What might be even more amazing is that Snyder has tallied the fifth-most victories among active coaches since 1990 despite a three-year hiatus. Snyder has guided K-State to 145 victories since the 1990 season, only to be outdone by Mack Brown, Frank Beamer, Joe Paterno and Steve Spurrier.

**SNYDER IN OCTOBER**

Fast starts propelled the Wildcats to winning seasons throughout the Bill Snyder's era at K-State. The Wildcats' success in the month of September under Snyder is well-documented and K-State has also been a solid team in October under Snyder. Since the inception of the Big 12 Conference, K-State is 27-20 (.574) in October under the legendary head coach.

**DEFENDING THE HOME TURF**

Kansas State, which sported a 5-1 home record in 2009, opened the 2010 season with an impressive 31-22 win at home over UCLA and followed that up with wins over Missouri State and UCF. Under Bill Snyder, the Wildcats have won at least five home games in 14 of Snyder's 18 seasons and have gone unblemished in Manhattan five times. K-State is also 97-22-1 all-time at home under Snyder, including a 96-17-1 mark since the 1990 season, and 9-7-1 at home against ranked teams since 1993.

**DRAWING FIRST BLOOD**

Scoring first has been a big sign of good things to come for the Wildcats. Since 1990, K-State's record when scoring first is very impressive as the Wildcats have gone 126-23 (85-percent) when drawing first blood. This season, the Wildcats are 3-0 when getting on the board first after taking the early lead in their first three games of this season.

**ON THE TUBE**

K-State's game against Nebraska will be the Wildcats' 125th television appearance all-time as K-State is 64-60 (.516) when playing on TV. Last season, K-State was on television a total of 10 times, including one matchup on ESPN3.com, and was 4-6 in those matchups. This season, the Cats are 3-0 following their 31-22 win over UCLA on ABC and wins over Iowa State and UCF on FSN. Also, Kansas State's homecoming contest on October 28, 1939, against Nebraska became the second college football game ever televised, following the Fordham-Waynesburg contest in New York earlier that fall. The Cornhuskers spoiled K-State's homecoming with a 25-9 triumph in Manhattan before a limited Nebraska ETV audience in the surrounding area.

**LINCOLN, Neb.** - Despite out-gaining Nebraska, 293-267, Kansas State came up short in its bid to win the Big 12 North as the No. 25 Huskers defeated the Wildcats, 17-3, at Memorial Stadium.

With the loss, the Wildcats' season ends at 6-6, while Nebraska will represent the North division in the Big 12 Championship game on December 5. The season was the first non-losing year for Kansas State since 2006 as the Wildcats will now look to the 2010 campaign beginning with spring practice in April.

But, Kansas State was not without its chances on Saturday as the Wildcats had five offensive drives that advanced inside the Husker 35-yard line but came away with just three points.

Daniel Thomas, the frontrunner for Big 12 Offensive New-comer of the Year, had a workman-like night against a stout NU defense and finished with 99 rushing yards. Thomas finished the season with the fourth-most rushing yards in a single-season with 1,265, behind only Darren Sproles' top three marks.

The Wildcats drove 58 yards down the field following the opening kickoff and turned it into three points as Josh Cherry nailed a 44-yard field goal to give K-State a 3-0 advantage.

The Huskers then answered with 10 points on their first two possessions of the game, highlighted by a second-quarter Mike McNeill 17-yard touchdown reception, to take a 10-3 lead.

With Nebraska going in for another score before half, Tysyn Hartman's interception on third and goal at the 3:13 mark of the second quarter halted a Nebraska scoring threat. The Huskers had second and goal from the K-State 5-yard line when Jeffrey Fitzgerald sacked Zac Lee for a 14-yard loss. On the following play, Hartman picked off Lee's pass at the goal line and returned it 42 yards; but K-State was not able to turn it into points.

Nebraska opened the second half with a 70-yard touchdown drive, highlighted by a 47-yard pass completion on third and one and a 14-yard touchdown run from 14 yards, to take a 17-3 lead.

But, K-State mounted a drive of its own and threatened to close to within 17-10. Keithen Valentine hauled in a 12-yard pass from Gregory on third-and-nine and appeared to head for the end-zone but safety Larry Asante jolted the ball loose with the Huskers recovering at the five yard line.

**HALFWAY HOME**

There's no better indicator of a Wildcat victory than when K-State leads or is tied at the half. Since 1990, the Cats have protected a halftime lead 97-percent of the time, going 140-5 when leading at halftime.

**AYE, CAPTAIN**

Head coach Bill Snyder named six captains for the 2010 season as senior quarterback Carson Coffman and junior linebacker Alex Hrebec were named captains for the second straight season. Junior defensive backs Tysyn Hartman and Emmanuel Lamur, along with senior offensive lineman Zach Kendall and sophomore quarterback Collin Klein were each named captains for the first time in their careers.

**CATS OWN NATION'S 10TH-LONGEST SCORING STREAK**

Kansas State extended one of the nation's longest scoring streaks against UCF as the Wildcats have now tallied points in 168 consecutive games. The 168-game stretch is the 10th-longest streak in the nation. The Wildcats have not been kept off the scoreboard since Colorado shutout K-State, 12-0, on Nov. 16, 1996. In the Big 12, only Nebraska (180 games) owns a longer streak than the Cats.

**CARRYING THE MAIL**

So far this season, Kansas State has established its running game and rushed its way to 864 yards through the first four games of the season, a figure that ranks second in the Big 12 and 22nd nationally. Daniel Thomas has paved the way with 628 of those yards through the first four games, which ranks fourth in the nation among running backs, while William Powell has also provided a spark, averaging 11.2 yards per carry with two touchdowns.

**BY GROUND, THROUGH THE AIR**

Although the Wildcats have shown the ability to be a physical team up front with a power running game, quarterback Carson Coffman has proven that the Cats can take to the air when needed. Against Missouri State, Coffman threw for 280 yards on 18-of-26 aim as the Wildcats totaled 290 passing yards on the night. Coffman tossed three touchdown passes with no interceptions and followed that up with two fourth-quarter touchdown drives in the win over UCF, including a 58-yard strike to Aubrey Quarles.

**CONTINUITY ALONG THE FRONT**

Although the Wildcats have broken in two new starting tackles along the offensive line this season, the experience of guards Zach Kendall and Kenny Mayfield and center Wade Weibert have helped pave the way for Daniel Thomas and the K-State rushing attack this season. The group has led the way for the second-ranked rushing attack in the Big 12, averaging over 216 yards a game on the ground. K-State returned four of its five regular starters from a season ago (65 combined starts) and has a combined 83 career starts among all of its current linemen. This season marks the third time since 1997 that four starting offensive linemen from the previous season return (also happened in 2007).

**WELCOME HOME**

Kansas State has become a haven for transfers returning to the state of Kansas after spending time at other FBS institutions. K-State boasts five Division I transfer players on its roster - all originally from the state of Kansas - including wide receivers Chris Harper (Wichita; Oregon) and Brodrick Smith (Garden City; Minnesota), who have returned to the playing field after sitting out in 2009. New to the squad this season are brothers Arthur (Miami, Fla.; linebacker) and Bryce (Tennessee; running back) Brown from Wichita, as well as offensive lineman Nick Puetz (Salina; Wyoming) after all three enrolled at K-State for the fall semester. Brown was rated the nation's top recruit two seasons ago by numerous recruiting services.

**FORCING THE ISSUE**

K-State saw its national ranking in turnover margin improve from 61st to 19th over the second half of the 2009 season and has continued to make strides in forcing turnovers. After collecting just 11 takeaways in its first six games last season, K-State forced 15 turnovers in its final six games. So far in 2010, the Wildcats have forced seven turnovers (3 interceptions and 4 fumbles) while committing five of their own. Over the last nine games, dating back to 2009, K-State has forced 22 turnovers while committing just 12 (+10).

**CLEANING IT UP**

So far in 2010, K-State has ranked among the Big 12's best in terms of being penalized. Through four games, the Wildcats have been flagged for 19 penalties and 167 yards, both of which are the fewest in the league. In the national ranks, K-State's 41.8 yards of penalties per game rank 25th in the country, while its 4.75 penalties per game average ranks 16th.

**CATS RETURN TO FORM**

Kansas State has ranked among the nation's leaders in kickoff returns over the last several years and behind the running ability of former walk-on running back William Powell, and the Wildcat kickoff return team, those numbers are returning to form here in 2010. Powell, the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week following the Iowa State game, currently ranks second in the Big 12 and eighth nationally with his 31.9-yard return average, while the Wildcats as a team rank second in the Big 12 and 12th nationally in the category.

**VERY SPECIAL TEAMS**

The rise of K-State football over the last two decades has much to do with the emphasis on special teams. Since 1990, Kansas State is 42-14 when scoring on special teams and 16-1 when scoring on special teams and on defense.

And, in non-offensive touchdowns, the Cats have ranked among the nation's best over the past 11-plus seasons. Since 1999, the Wildcats rank third nationally in non-offensive touchdowns with 74, behind only Virginia Tech (79) and Texas (75). K-State had five non-offensive touchdowns in 2009 - four kickoff returns and one interception return - and one so far in 2010 (fake field goal).

**BLOCK PARTY**

Kansas State's play on special teams has been unparalleled as the Cats have the fifth-most blocks in the nation since 2002 with 36, which includes a school-record-tying nine total blocks in 2008 (four punts, two extra points and three field goals) and three (one punt, one field goal and one PAT) in 2009, two of which came from safety Emmanuel Lamur.

Also, Kansas State has amassed 52 total blocked kicks since 1996 and currently ranks second among Big 12 schools, behind Texas, in total blocks in the 14-plus year history of the league.

**GRADUATING EARLY**

Kansas State has been the Big 12 leader in all-sports graduation rate by student-athletes each of the last three years. The same holds true specifically for football as the program led the conference in graduation rates each of the last three years.

So it should come as no surprise that the Wildcats are one of the national leaders when it comes to players who have completed their degree or are on track to finish this semester. K-State is fourth nationally with active graduates on its roster with eight. That number is also the most in the Big 12 and will grow to as many as 13 following the fall semester.

**OUT OF THE BLOCKS**

In true running fashion, senior Daniel Thomas, who is fourth in the nation in total rushing yards, has sprinted out of the blocks in 2010, totaling 628 yards on 105 attempts with six touchdowns in the first four games of the season. In the season opener against UCLA, Thomas ran for a career-best 234 yards and two scores en route to Big 12 Player of the Week honors. His week-one rushing total was the highest by a Wildcat in a season-opening game in school history, out-gaining Darren Sproles' 221-yard effort against Western Kentucky in the 2004 opener, while it was the fifth-best single-game rushing output in school history. Despite being held to a season-low 76 yards against UCF, Thomas' total of 628 yards in the first four games of the season are the most in school history to start a season, while they are third in school history to Darren Sproles' magical ending to the 2003 season.

**CENTURY MARK**

Running back Daniel Thomas has had a propensity for earning 100-yard rushing games. After gaining 234 yards against UCLA and then another 137 against Missouri State, Thomas came back with 181 yards on a career-high 34 carries against Iowa State. Thomas, who now has eight 100-yard games in his career to tie for fifth in school history, became the eighth player in school history to have at least three straight 100-yard games and the first since Darren Sproles had five straight towards the end of 2003.

**WORKHORSE**

Running back Daniel Thomas, the reigning Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year, brings a lot more to the table than just his rushing ability. Thomas registered 276 total touches out of 802 offensive plays in 2009 (247 rushes, 25 receptions and 4 pass attempts), which equated to 34.4-percent of the total offense. Thomas is already ahead of that pace in 2010 as he has totaled 109 touches (105 rushes, 4 catches) in K-State's 249 offensive plays, which is 43.8-percent of the total offense.

**BIG-TIME TARGETS**

Wide receiver Brodrick Smith and Aubrey Quarles have been the to-go targets for quarterback Carson Coffman. Smith leads K-State in catches, yards and receiving touchdowns through the first four games. The Minnesota transfer notched career highs vs. Missouri State with six catches for 99 yards and two scores, while he also hauled in a career-long 47-yarder vs. Iowa State.

Quarles, who redshirted the 2009 season due to injury, is second in all three departments and grabbed a 58-yard touchdown reception against UCF, the longest TD catch by a Wildcat since 2008.

**IRONMAN**

Daniel Thomas rushed 247 times in 2009, which were the second-most attempts in a single season in school history. So it comes as no surprise that Thomas has received a majority of the work to begin the 2010 season. The senior, who has 10 career games with 20 or more carries, recorded a career high 34 rushing attempts against Iowa State. Through four games, Thomas has 105 attempts and is on pace for 315 rushes, which would break the school record of 306 rushes by Darren Sproles during the 15-game 2003 season.

**AND THE AWARD GOES TO...**

Running back Daniel Thomas picked up six different preseason honors prior to the 2010 season after leading the league in rushing in 2009. The Hilliard, Fla., product is on the watch list for two prestigious postseason awards in the Doak Walker Award, which is presented to the nation's top running back, and the Maxwell Award, which is presented to the nation's most outstanding player.

In addition to those watch lists, Thomas is a candidate for the Hornung Award, was named a preseason All-American, an All-Big 12 pick, and he was named the 16th best player in the nation by NationalChamps.net.

**CENTER OF ATTENTION**

Daniel Thomas wasn't the only player earning preseason recognition as center Wade Weibert was named to the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which honors the nation's top center. Weibert started all 12 games last season, including 11 at center, and helped K-State average 179.9 rushing yards per game.

The Hillsboro, Kan., product has started each of the first four games in 2010, pushing his consecutive-start streak to 16. The senior has anchored a line that has produced an average of 216 rushing yards over the first four games, which ranks second in the Big 12 and 23rd nationally.

**EFFECTIVE THROUGH THE AIR**

Kansas State senior quarterback Carson Coffman has been effective in the first four games of his senior campaign. Coffman, who is 46-of-76 for 639 with five touchdowns and two interceptions, holds a 147.6 passer rating, which ranks third in the Big 12 and 28th nationally.

Coffman had three scoring strikes against Missouri State, which were the most by a Wildcat since Josh Freeman also had three against Oklahoma in 2008. He also had two long passes - a 58-yarder for a score and a 73-yarder to set up a field goal - against UCF, which marked the first time since Freeman's 77- and 61-yard connections vs. the Sooners in 2008.

**WELCOME BACK**

Sophomore defensive end Brandon Harold has seen the most extensive action since his 2008 Freshman All-American campaign. Harold, who was hampered by injury in 2009, has 26 tackles, including 6.0 TFLs, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. The East St. Louis, Ill., product is the top tackler in the conference among defensive lineman, which includes 20 solo stops.

Harold, whose two forced fumbles are tied for 22nd in the NCAA, came up big against Iowa State when he carded six tackles, including a quarterback sack that caused a fumble, which he recovered, late in the fourth quarter.

**DEFENSIVE FIELD GENERALS**

Linebackers Alex Hrebec and Blake Slaughter have been a ballhawks to begin the season as they are first and third on the team, respectively, in tackles. The duo has combined for 62 stops, including Hrebec's 39, which ranks third in the Big 12 and 27th nationally. The St. Louis, Mo., product began his season with a career best 12 tackles against UCLA and had eight stops against Missouri State before a nine-tackle effort against Iowa State. He tallied another double-digit tackle game vs. UCF with 10 stops, giving him seven in his career.

Slaughter had a career day against the Knights when he made 13 tackles - eight more than his previous career high - and also tallied his first career sack on a third down to help the Cats hold UCF to a field goal.

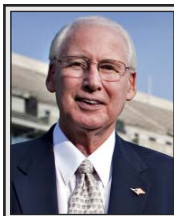
**TIP DRILL**

A pair of former junior-college defensive backs, Terrance Sweeney and David Garrett, have been hazardous to quarterbacks to begin the 2010 campaign. The duo has combined for 12 of K-State's 33 pass breakups and three of its four interceptions this season. Sweeney, whose eight passes defended are tied for second nationally, picked off a passes against UCLA and UCF on the final plays of the game. Garrett, who also had a pick against UCLA, is tied for 38th in passes defended with four, including three vs. the Bruins.

**ADAMS ON TARGET**

The most unsung hero on K-State's roster, and perhaps the Big 12, is long snapper Corey Adams. Adams has been perfect on a combined 399 snaps in his three-plus year career and has appeared in all 40 games of his Wildcat career. This season, Adams has been true on all 23 field goal/PAT attempts and 20 punt snaps. Last year, he was on target on 55 field goal/PAT attempts, as well as a total of 55 punt snaps.

The Monument, Colo., product has also excelled off the field as he was named to the preseason candidate list for the Senior CLASS Award. The award recognizes NCAA Division I seniors that have obtained notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. He was also named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, which is considered the "Academic Heisman."



**HEAD COACH**

**BILL SNYDER**

**19th season at  
Kansas State**

The 2009 season saw one of the greatest legends in college football return to the sidelines in hopes of revitalizing a program that he once built, piece by piece, into a national force.

The architect of the "greatest turnaround in the history of college football" Bill Snyder returned to lead the Kansas State football program in 2009 after 17 ultra-successful seasons as the head coach from 1989-2005. And in his first season back, Snyder led the Wildcats to a 6-6 record and a second place finish in the Big 12 North. In fact, K-State was just one win away from advancing to the Big 12 Championship game as the Wildcats played at Nebraska in the season finale with a championship game berth on the line. Not bad for a program that was picked by most preseason publications to finish fifth or even sixth in the 2009 Big 12 North race.

K-State claimed more First Team All-Big 12 selections on offense than any other school with four last season. Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Daniel Thomas led the league in rushing in his first year at the position, while Nick Stringer, Jeron Mastrud and Brandon Banks also garnered first team accolades.

Named the 32nd head football coach at Kansas State on Nov. 30, 1988, and again as the 34th on Nov. 24 2008, Snyder has amassed a 146-74-1 (.663) record during his tenure with the Wildcats, including an 80-57-1 (.580) mark in Big 8/12 games. His 146 victories are the 12th-most among active FBS coaches and are more than triple the man in second place on K-State's all-time coaching victories list (Mike Ahearn, 39 wins).

But to fully understand the turnaround ushered in by Snyder at Kansas State one must only consider that the Wildcats were in the midst of an 0-26-1 run when he was hired. It also took K-State 51 seasons (1938-1988) to total just 130 wins, while the 12 head coaches prior to Snyder's arrival in Manhattan combined to win just 116 games from 1945-1988.

Snyder led Kansas State to 11 straight bowl berths between the 1993 and 2003 seasons, making K-State one of only seven programs in the nation to appear in the postseason every year during that stretch. During that span, Snyder's Wildcats won

nearly 80 percent of their games, chalking up 109 victories - a staggering average of nearly 10 wins per season - and making Kansas State the nation's second-winningest program over that period.

And Snyder continued to break new ground with the Wildcats. Kansas State's 35-7 victory over top-ranked Oklahoma in the 2003 Big 12 Championship game lifted K-State to its first conference championship since Pappy Waldorf's 1934 squad and secured the school's first BCS bowl berth in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

With an 11-4 record in 2003, K-State was the only team in the country to win 11 games in six of the previous seven years and just the second program in the history of college football to win 11 games six times in a seven-year stretch.

Snyder's unprecedented success in 17 years at Kansas State did not go unnoticed. He was named the National Coach of the Year on three occasions (1991, 1994 and 1998). He has been a finalist for the prestigious Bear Bryant/FWAA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1995 before winning in 1998; a finalist for the Football News National Coach of the Year Award in 1995 and 1998; and a finalist for the Kodak/AFCA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1998.

During his three-year hiatus, Snyder remained involved with the university and is currently a member of the Missouri and Kansas Halls of Fame, the K-State and Austin College Athletics Halls of Fame while also being inducted into the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame. The long-time mentor also remained active in the community as he currently is the Chairman of the Kansas Mentors Council and the Kansas Leadership Council, a member of the Board of Directors for Kansas Leadership Center, the Board of Trustees for the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame, the KSU Leadership Studies Advancement Council, the Terry C. Johnson Cancer Research Center Advisory Council, the Manhattan Community Foundation Board of Trustees, the KSU Foundation Board of Trustees and is the Honorary Co-Chairman of the Kansas Masonic Partnership for Life.

Snyder, 70, received his B.A. from William Jewell in 1963. He earned his M.A. from Eastern New Mexico in 1965. As a player, he was a three-year letterwinner as a defensive back at William Jewell. Snyder and his wife, Sharon, have two sons (Sean and Ross) and three daughters (Shannon, Meredith and Whitney). They also have eight grandchildren, Sydney, Katherine, Tate, Matthew, Alexis, Gavin, Kadin and Tylin, and one great-grandson, D.J.

**MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP)** - Daniel Thomas rushed for 234 yards and two touchdowns and Kansas State rallied for a 31-22 victory over UCLA Saturday before a crowd of 51,059, the biggest for a home opener in Wildcats' history.

There were three touchdowns in the final 123 seconds and Kansas State had two, including Thomas' 35-yard gallop after the Wildcats fell on UCLA's inside kick.

Thomas, the Big 12's leading rusher last year, set up scores with several big runs, including one for 44 yards and another for 29. His 28 carries and 235 yards were both career highs.

After Carson Coffman's 5-yard TD pass to Brodrick Smith put Kansas State ahead 24-16 with 2:03 left, Kevin Prince led the Bruins on a lightning-quick drive, hitting Cory Harkey for 35 yards and then connecting with Ricky Marvray on a 29-yard TD toss. With 1:19 to play, the Bruins elected to go for 2. But Prince's pass into the end zone fell incomplete and Kansas State's Travis Tannahill recovered the ensuing inside kick.

Seemingly just trying to run out the clock, the Wildcats handed the ball to Thomas and the quick, rugged senior burst through a hole over the right side and dashed 35 yards for the TD that clinched Kansas State's 21st consecutive victory in a home opener.

William Powell had 72 yards on just six carries for Kansas State, which erupted in the second half after managing only nine total yards in the entire second quarter. Coffman was 11 for 16 for just 66 yards and was sacked five times by a Bruin defense that had an answer for everything except Thomas. The pre-season pick for offensive player of the year in the Big 12 also had two receptions, including one for 21

yards that set up the first touchdown.

The Bruins held on fourth-and-goal from the 1, but an illegal participation penalty on UCLA gave Kansas State another shot and Thomas scored.

A 60-yard punt and a great open field tackle pinned Kansas State deep in the second quarter and Coffman fumbled the snap. Akeem Ayers recovered for the Bruins, and on the next play, Prince faked left and bootlegged right, dashing untouched into the end zone.

UCLA's Kai Forbath, who struggled all week with a sore groin, kicked three field goals and ran his streak to 40 in a row from inside 50 yards. His 44-yarder put UCLA on top 10-7 near the end of the first half and he added one from 35 and one from 42. The last one came with 6:28 to go and pulled UCLA to 17-16.

Thomas' tackle-breaking 44-yard run in the third quarter was followed by William Powell's 28-yard touchdown run, giving Kansas State a 14-10 lead.

Kansas State's Anthony Cantele had a 35-yard field goal near the end of the third quarter following Thomas' 29-yard burst. Thomas was the first Wildcat to rush for more than 200 yards in six years.

**MANHATTAN, Kan.** - Carson Coffman threw three touchdown passes and Daniel Thomas rushed for 137 yards as Kansas State rolled to a 48-24 victory over Missouri State on Saturday night.

The Wildcats (2-0) led 27-7 at halftime, showcasing a productive passing attack to augment the running of Thomas, who rushed for 234 yards last week against UCLA and has been touted as a Doak Walker Award candidate.

Coffman, who threw for only 66 yards a week ago, was 18 of 26 for 280 yards before sitting out the fourth quarter. With the undersized Bears (1-1) geared to stop the run, Coffman connected on scoring throws of 42 and 7 yards to Brodrick Smith, and 23 yards to Aubrey Quarles.

Missouri State is 1-24 all-time against FBS opponents.

Kansas State had 108 yards rushing in the opening half, with 45 of those coming on a touchdown run by Thomas with 11:50 left in the first quarter.

The Wildcats went to their bag of tricks to take a 13-0 lead with 9:45 left in the second quarter. Kicker Anthony Cantele, who earlier missed a 26-yard field goal, lined up for a 20-yarder. But holder Ryan Doerr took the ball on an option to the right side and pitched to a trailing Cantele for a 3-yard touchdown.

Cantele missed the extra point to take away some of the luster, but the Wildcats quickly made it 20-0 a couple of minutes later when Coffman found Smith for the 42-yard touchdown pass.

Missouri State finally got its offense in gear with a 66-yard touchdown pass from Cody Kirby to Jermaine Safford with 1:22 left in the first half. But Kansas State answered with the 23-yard score from Coffman to Quarles for a 27-7 halftime lead.

The Wildcats had 493 yards of total offense in tuning up for their Big 12 opener against Iowa State next Saturday.

**KANSAS CITY, Mo.** - Daniel Thomas rushed for 181 yards and two touchdowns on a career-high 34 carries, and Kansas State rallied to beat Iowa State 27-20 on Saturday.

Carson Coffman added 104 passing yards for the Wildcats (3-0, 1-0 Big 12), who have won back-to-back conference openers for the first time in 10 years.

Austen Arnaud threw for 122 yards and a touchdown to lead Iowa State (1-2, 0-1), which lost its third straight to Kansas State.

Thomas's 2-yard TD run gave Kansas State a 24-20 lead with 6:47 left. Brandon Harold then sacked Arnaud with 1:58 left and recovered a fumble, setting up a 42-yard field goal by Josh Cherry 20 seconds later.

The Cyclones drove to the Wildcats' 36-yard line with 19 seconds left, but Arnaud threw a pair of incompletions to end the rally.

Down three early in the fourth quarter, Kansas State jumped back ahead 24-20 with an 83-yard touchdown drive. Thomas capped it with five straight carries, including the touchdown run off a pitch from Coffman, after Brodrick Smith came back to the ball for a crucial 47-yard catch.

Iowa State rolled the dice, converting a fourth-and-1 from their own 17 with 4:57 left and on fourth-and-1 from their own 28 a few plays later. But Arnaud never saw Harold coming, and Harold scooped up the ball at Iowa State's 25-yard line.

Iowa State burned all its timeouts to get the ball back with 1:38 left and a chance to tie it. The Cyclones got close, but Arnaud missed a wide-open Alexander Robinson downfield, and Iowa State didn't get any closer.

Thomas opened the second half with a 23-yard

run, and it looked like the Wildcats were finally poised to take over a game they had controlled to that point.

Thomas had a spectacular 1-yard touchdown plunge midway through the third quarter, putting the Wildcats back ahead 17-14.

Grant Mahoney's field goal tied the game at 17 late in the third quarter, and he put Iowa State ahead 20-17 with 11:26 to go.

The Wildcats ran it 28 times for 163 yards against Iowa State's rush defense in the first half and rushed 50 times for 262 yards for the game.

Kansas State quarterback Carson Coffman engineered a 13-play, 67-yard drive, which was capped by his own seven-yard touchdown run with 24 seconds remaining in the contest. K-State scored 14 fourth-quarter points after trailing 7-3 through three quarters.

**MANHATTAN, Kan.** - Carson Coffman's 7-yard touchdown run with 24 seconds left lifted Kansas State to a come-from-behind 17-13 victory Saturday over Central Florida, giving the Wildcats a 4-0 start for the first time since 2003.

Delayed by weather for almost 1 1/2 hours in the first quarter, the game was dominated by Central Florida (2-2) for much of the day. But the Knights failed to make good on several touchdown opportunities, and Kansas State took its first lead of the day when Coffman engineered a 13-play, 67-yard scoring march on the Wildcats' final possession.

Daniel Thomas, who came in as the nation's second-leading rusher, totaled only 76 yards on 22 carries but had a key 12-yard gain during the game-winning drive.

Nick Cattoi, who missed two field goals, connected from 27 yards for a 13-10 Central Florida lead with 5:14 to play, and Kansas State took over on its own 33.

Coffman, on third-and-10, connected with Andre McDonald for 18 yards to keep the drive going. Thomas picked up 12 yards to the 22, and Coffman connected on another third-down pass to set up a first-and-goal from the 10. Two plays later, Coffman kept the ball and darted through a big hole.

Ronnie Weaver ran for 130 yards for Central Florida and freshman quarterback Jeff Godfrey added 99 yards, often on quarterback keepers in which he took advantage of the slower Kansas State defense.

With less than 3 minutes gone in the first quarter, officials halted play because of lightning accompanying a heavy storm bearing down on the area. Dark, boiling, ominous-looking clouds rarely seen on the Great Plains seemed to envelop the stadium before

heavy rains pelted the area and caused a delay of 1 hour, 26 minutes.

In the second quarter, Godfrey went up the middle for 10 yards on a keeper. He then sped 20 yards around left end and possibly would have scored if Ty Zimmerman's ankle tackle hadn't brought him down on the 25.

A 4-yard loss and a 5-yard penalty pushed the Knights back and Cattoi missed a 42-yard field goal attempt.

Late in the third quarter, Weaver broke a 31-yard run to the 9. But Stephen Harrison broke up Godfrey's pass in the end zone, and Cattoi missed from 23 yards.

Both of Kansas State's first two scores came off big pass plays to wide-open receivers. Tramaine Thompson got open for a 73-yard catch-and-run, leading to Josh Cherry's 27-yard field goal. Then the Wildcats tied it 10-10 when Coffman found Aubrey Quarles all alone on the sideline for a 58-yard touchdown play.
