# WASHINGTON at #10/10 NEBRASKA Huskies and Huskers To Play For Third Time In A Year

**THE GAME:** The Washington football team (2-0) takes to the road for the first time this season as the Huskies travel to Lincoln to face Nebraska (2-0) for the third time in a year. This Saturday's game at Memorial Stadium kicks off at 12:30 p.m. PT (2:30 p.m. CT) and will air live on ABC television (and on ESPN in areas where ABC is showing a different game). The Cornhuskers are ranked No. 10 in both major polls while the UW is receiving votes (but is unranked) in both. Last year, on Sept. 18, Nebraska came to Seattle and beat the Huskies, 56-21, but the two ended up in the Holiday Bowl, where the Huskies avenged the loss with a 19-7 victory in San Diego. The Huskies will travel to Lincoln on Thursday, as the UW has yet to begin its fall academic quarter. After this Saturday's game, the Dawgs return to Husky Stadium Sept. 24 to open Pac-12 Conference play vs. California.

**CUICK SNAPS:** The UW's current six-game winning streak is the fourth-longest (tied) in the nation ... only Auburn (17), Stanford (10) and Ohio State (8) have longer current win streaks (Oklahoma and UCF also have six-game win streaks currently) ... Washington is plus-five in turnover margin so far this season, tops in the Pac-12 and sixth in the nation ... the UW is second in the conference and seventh in the nation in rush defense (43.0 yards per game) ... with 116 rushing yards per game, Chris Polk leads the Pac-12 ... Polk now has 13 career 100-yard games, third-most in UW history (Napoleon Kaufman had 17; Greg Lewis had 15) ... six true freshmen have played this year for the UW: S James Sample, TB Bishop Sankey, TE Austin Seferian-Jenkins, DT Danny Shelton, OLB John Timu and WR Kasen Williams ... Washington is 2-0 for the first time since 2007 and looking to go 3-0 for the first time since 2001 ... at 182.26, Husky QB Keith Price ranks 14th in the nation in pass efficiency ... the redshirt sophomore is tied (with six others) for the national lead in TD passes with seven ... the UW has faced 114 pass attempts in two weeks, by far the most in the nation ... next closest is Pittsburgh, which has had 95 opponent pass attempts in two games.

**TELEVISION:** The Washington-Nebraska game will air live to a national audience on ABC and ESPN. In markets airing a different game on ABC, the UW-NU game will air on ESPN. Sean McDonough, Matt Millen and Heather Cox will provide the commentary. Additionally, "Huskies All-Access" airs each Wednesday evening on FSN. The program is an up-close look at each Husky game, with features, one-on-one interviews and sideline video.

**RADIO:** The Washington ISP Sports Network, with its flagship station KJR 950-AM, will carry the live broadcast of every football game on 16 Northwest radio stations. Longtime play-by-play man Bob Rondeau and color analyst Damon Huard are joined by sideline reporter Elise Woodward. Many game broadcasts will also be carried on SiriusXM Satellite Radio and can be heard over the internet at gohuskies.com.

THE HEAD COACH: In a frequently-told tale, Husky football coach Steve Sarkisian recalls his days as a young assistant traveling to face Washington at Husky Stadium. During the drive across Lake Washington, with the iconic home of the Dawgs towering ahead. Sarkisian marveled aloud at the city, the stadium and the atmosphere surrounding the UW program. A decade or so later, Sarkisian is in charge of the Washington football program he was admiring that day. And in just two years, he has re-established the kind of tough, exciting environment that was then, and is again now, so closely associated with the Husky football. In 2010, Sarkisian's second season in Seattle, the Huskies made another clear step forward. The Dawgs went 7-6 overall and finished third in the Pac-10 Conference with a 5-4 record. Then, in the Holiday Bowl, Washington provided one of the bowl season's top games, beating an 18th-ranked Nebraska squad, 19-7. The win over the Cornhuskers was the last of a series of exciting, gutsy victories in 2010. The season included three Husky wins decided on the very last play of the game (Oregon State, USC and Cal), plus another in which the winning score came inside the final minute (WSU). Sarkisian was introduced as the new head coach of the Washington football team on Dec. 8, 2008. From the start, Sarkisian made it clear that he didn't think it would take long to turn the program around and get it back to the high level of success that UW football has enjoyed throughout its history. In his first season, 2009, he seemed to prove that he was right. Washington, which posted a winless season for the first time in school history the year before Sarkisian signed on, surged to a 5-7 record in 2009, an improvement of five victories over the previous year. No BCS-conference school in the nation could boast such improvement in terms of wins in 2009. And, Sarkisian's Husky squad pulled off that feat against a schedule that included 10 opponents who ended the season bowl-eligible. Sarkisian came to the UW with a wealth of experience as a guarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator. His string of success is nearly unprecedented as, during his time at USC, he coached two Heisman Trophy winners and oversaw one of the nation's most consistent and dominant offenses. Sarkisian spent 2007 and 2008 as the Trojans' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He had also previously served as assistant head coach and guarterbacks coach (2005-06), guarterbacks coach (2002-03) and as an offensive assistant (2001) at USC, for a total of seven seasons there. During his seven seasons as a member of the Trojans' staff, the team posted a combined 74-15 record. As offensive coordinator, his record was 22-3. Aside from his various roles at USC, Sarkisian also spent one season as quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders in 2004 and as QBs coach at El Camino College in Torrance, Calif., in 2000, his first coaching job. Sarkisian starred at the guarterback position at the prep, collegiate and pro levels. After his standout career at Brigham Young University, he was played for the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League for three seasons (1997-99). He had a record-setting two-year (1995-96) career at BYU, playing under legendary coach Lavell Edwards. Sarkisian completed 549-of-824 passes (66.6 percent) for 7,755 yards and 55 touchdowns in his career. His 162.0 career passing efficiency rating ranked third on the all-time NCAA list. As a senior in 1996, he led the nation in passing efficiency (173.6, No. 7 all-time) as the Western Athletic Conference champion Cougars went 14-1 and won the 1997 Cotton Bowl. He was the WAC Offensive Player of the Year in 1996, and earned second-team All-America honors. Sarkisian transferred to BYU from El Camino Junior College, where he played two seasons (1993-94). He was a first-team Junior College All-America selection as a sophomore and earned all-conference honors in 1993 as a freshman. He also played baseball at El Camino in 1993. He originally enrolled at USC as a baseball player, spending the fall of 1992 on the Trojans' roster before transferring. Sarkisian was a standout football and baseball player at West Torrance (Calif.) High. He earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from BYU in 1997 after receiving his associate's degree in general studies from El Camino in 1994. Sarkisian was born March 8, 1974. He and his wife, Stephanie, have two daughters, Ashley and Taylor, and a son, Brady.

COACHING STAFF: Washington's assistant coaching staff returns entirely in tact for a third straight season. In 2009, every member of the staff was new to the UW (though a couple had worked at the UW in prior staffs). While there are a few of coaches who made their way to Washington via USC, like head coach Steve Sarkisian, more notably, many of the new coaches have very specific ties to the Northwest. Nick Holt is the UW's defensive coordinator, the role he served at USC for three seasons prior to his arrival in Seattle. Holt, however, is tied to the Pacific Northwest by way of the fact that he was head coach at Idaho in 2004 and 2005. He was also an assistant with the Vandals from 1990-97. Offensive coordinator and QBs coach Doug Nussmeier, who grew up in the Portland, Ore., area was a star quarterback at Idaho, where he passed for 10,824 career yards and won the Walter Payton Award (the I-AA Heisman). He's also in the Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame, just like running backs coach Joel Thomas. Thomas, a native of Port Angeles, Wash., is still the Vandals' all-time leader in rushes, rushing vards and rushing TDs. Offensive line coach and run game coordinator Dan Cozzetto, who went to high school in Spokane, is another Idaho grad. Cozzetto, who was also the Washington line coach in 2003, came to the UW from Arizona State, but also coached at Idaho under former head coach Dennis Erickson. Safeties coach Jeff Mills, who played his college football at Western Washington, was a graduate assistant at the UW in 1990 and 1991 under coach Don James. He helped the Dawgs to Pac-10 titles both seasons and the national championship in '91. Mills has also coached at Idaho. Defensive line coach/special teams coordinator/recruiting coordinator Johnny Nansen grew up in Long Beach, Calif., but played football at Washington State and came to Seattle after spending five seasons at Idaho (including two under Holt). Finally, as to the Idaho connection, linebackers coach Mike Cox is a native of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, played for the Vandals under Erickson and former Husky head coach Keith Gilbertson, and coached in Moscow from 1987-94. He came to Washington from the St. Louis Rams. Cornerbacks coach Demetrice Martin was new to the Northwest in 2009, having previously worked with Sarkisian at USC. Another newcomer to this part of the country, receivers coach Jimmie Dougherty, played at Missouri and had most recently coached at the University of San Diego. Washington's two graduate assistants are Jordan Paopao (offense) and Donte Williams (defense). Paopao, who works with the tight ends, was a four-year starting center at the University of San Diego while Williams, who prepped at Culver City High in the Los Angeles area, was a defensive back at Syracuse.

**ENTIRE STAFF RETURNS FOR THIRD SEASON:** The UW's entire fulltime coaching staff returns, in tact, for a third straight season in 2011. Dating back to the mid-1950s, before which records are incomplete, the 2011 season marks the first time in Husky history that the entire coaching staff has remained the same for three straight years. Last year's feat of returning an entire staff for just two straight years marked the first time that had happened at the UW since the 1989 and 1990 seasons.

**HUSKIES vs. CORNHUSKERS HISTORY:** The Huskers and the Huskies will meet for the 10th time this Saturday and the all-time series is knotted at four wins, four losses and one tie for each team. Last year, Nebraska beat Washington, 56-21, in Seattle during the regular season before the UW avenged that loss with a 19-7 victory in the Holiday Bowl, breaking a streak of three straight Cornhusker wins (1997, 1998, 2010). Prior to the two games last year, the most recent meeting was on Sept. 26, 1998, when

Nebraska cruised to a 55-7 win in Lincoln. The Huskers rushed for 434 yards, led by 146 from DeAngelo Evans while the Huskies were limited to 273 yards of total offense. A year prior in Seattle, Nebraska handed the second-ranked Huskies a 27-14 loss as Ahman Green and Joel Makovicka rushed for 129 yards each. Nebraska's defense surrendered only 43 yards to Washington on the ground. True freshman QB Margues Tuiasosopo came off the bench for injured starter Brock Huard and threw for 270 yards and a pair of touchdowns in only his third appearance. In the pervious two meetings, Washington came from behind to take two wins against the Huskers. In 1991, the fourth-ranked Huskies found themselves down 14-6 at halftime at Memorial Stadium. Derek Brown pushed the score to 21-9 before the Billy Joe Hobert led Huskies rallied for 25 unanswered points, giving No. 9 Nebraska a 36-21 loss. Washington went on to win the national title that year. In 1992, a raucous, packed house watched the second-ranked Huskies beat the No. 12 Huskers 29-14 in a then-rare night game at Husky Stadium. Nebraska tied Washington in 1925, 7-7. That UW team went on to lose by a point to Alabama in the 1926 Rose Bowl. Washington won in 1926 by a 10-7 margin and, 41 years later in 1967, Nebraska evened the series with a 17-7 win.

**WASHINGTON-NEBRASKA TIES:** There are just a couple direct links between Washington's and Nebraska's coaching staffs as new NU receivers coach Rich Fisher was on Idaho's staff for one year (1999) when current Husky safeties coach Jeff Mills worked for the Vandals. UW running backs coach Joel Thomas was also briefly on another Idaho staff along with Fisher. Not too surprisingly, there are no Washingtonians on the Nebraska roster, nor Nebraskans on the UW roster. Additionally, there are no players from the two teams who attended the same high school (it's worth noting that UW's Kevin Smith (Compton) and NU's Taylor Martinez (Corona) attended two different Centennial High Schools in southern California).

THREE GAMES IN ONE CALENDAR YEAR: On Saturday, Washington and Nebraska will meet on the football field for the third time inside of one calendar year (Sept. 18, 2010; Dec. 30, 2010; Sept. 17, 2011). Last year, of course, they played twice, marking the first time since World War Il that the Huskies had played a team twice in one season. In 1945, the UW played Oregon, Oregon State and Washington State twice each, in addition to one-off games with USC, Idaho and Cal. In '44, the UW played two each against Whitman and Willamette Colleges. Prior to those years, the last time the UW played an opponent twice was in 1927, when Enoch Bagshaw's team took on the USS Idaho in back-to-back games, winning a pair of shutouts (the first of those two games was on the same day that the UW also beat Willamette). The last time that Washington played a major-college opponent twice in a non-wartime season was in 1916 (U.S. had not yet entered WWI) when Gil Dobie's Sundodgers beat California on the road and then at home 12 days later to end their season (and Dobie's 61-game unbeaten run as Washington's head coach). However, despite those seasons in which the UW played the same team twice, the ONLY time that Washington has ever played a team three times inside of one year was in 1945 and 1946, when the Huskies played Washington State on Oct. 13, 1945, Nov. 24, 1945 and Oct. 12, 1946.

### TEAM NOTES

HUSKIES vs. THE BIG TEN: Washington holds a 44-43-2 record alltime vs. Big Ten opponents, a record that includes an 0-2 mark against Penn State (though the Nittany Lions were not members of the Big Ten at the time of their games against the UW) and 4-4-1 vs. Nebraska, also obviously not a Big Ten member at the time of any of those games. Washington has played all 12 Big Ten teams multiple times, but have faced an Big Ten opponent only once since 2003 (the UW played Indiana in '03 and Ohio State in '07). The Huskies have played Big Ten teams seven times in bowl games since 1990 (not counting Nebraska in the Holiday Bowl last season): Iowa in the 1990 Rose Bowl, Michigan in the 1992 and 1993 Rose Bowls, Iowa in the 1995 Sun Bowl, Michigan State in the 1997 Aloha Bowl, Purdue in the 2001 Rose Bowl and Purdue in the 2002 Sun Bowl. The Huskies went 4-3 in those games. Here's the UW's all-time record vs. current Big Ten teams: 5-4 vs. Illinois, 1-2 vs. Indiana, 3-3 vs. Iowa, 5-7 vs. Michigan, 2-1 vs. Michigan State, 7-10 vs. Minnesota, 4-4-1 vs. Nebraska, 3-0 vs. Northwestern, 3-8 vs. Ohio State, 0-2 vs. Penn State, 7-2-1 vs. Purdue, 4-0 vs. Wisconsin.

**THE PAC-12:** This season, the Pac-10 Conference has added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, will play in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and California. Under current plans, each school will play all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. This year, the Huskies will not face UCLA or Arizona State. The last time that Washington didn't face UCLA in a season was in 1992 (when the Pac-10 schedule was eight games). The UW didn't face Arizona State in 2003 or 2004.

**CAPTAINS:** At the end of the spring practice season, the four captains for the 2011 season, as voted by their teammates, were revealed. They are senior linebacker Cort Dennison (Salt Lake City, Utah), senior wide receiver Jermaine Kearse (Lakewood, Wash.), senior offensive tackle Senio Kelemete (Seattle, Wash.) and senior defensive tackle Alameda Ta'amu (Kent, Wash.). Kelemete was also voted as a season captain in 2010. The team also names two game captains each game. Here's a list of those:

EWU: Cody Bruns, Greg Walker

Hawai'i: Desmond Trufant, Marlion Barnett

**DECADE AFTER DECADE:** Washington has won a conference title and a trip to the Rose Bowl in each of the last nine decades, dating back to the 1920s when Washington won the berth in 1923 and 1925. In the 1930s, the Dawgs won the '36 title. In the '40s, Washington earned the trip in 1943 and then barely slipped in under the wire in the 1950s, winning the 1959 crown. The Huskies won two Rose Bowl berths in the 1960s -- 1960 and 1963 -- and one in the 1970s (1977). Titles in 1980 and 1982 did it for that decade and three straight trips to Pasadena to begin the 1990s covered that 10-year span. In the 2000s, UW was the first team to earn Rose Bowl berths in nine straight decades. USC joined the Dawgs in that distinction in 2004 after their New Year's Day appearance in Pasadena.

**FINISHING FIRST OR SECOND:** UW has finished either first or second in the conference (including ties) in 18 of the last 34 seasons, dating back to a fourth-place finish in 1976. Over that span, Washington has won the championship (outright or shared) eight times – 1977, 1980, 1981, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995 and 2000 – while finishing second 10 other times.

**THE 100-YARD FACTOR:** Since the 1947 season, Washington is 175-52-3 (.767) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. So far this year, the UW is 2-0 in such games (Chris Polk vs. EWU and UH).

**HISTORY LESSON:** Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 76 times. The Huskies' record stands at 64-12-1 (.838) in those contests. Since 1995, UW is 39-9-1 (.806) when rushing for 200 yards.

**PLAYING AT HOME:** Washington has gone unbeaten at home 13 times in its history, including six times in the last 21 seasons. UW has won 89 of its last 135 (.663) games at Husky Stadium with one tie (89-45-1). Since 1980, the Huskies stand 137-56-2 (.708) at home. Since 1990, the Huskies are 55-32-1 (.631) at Husky Stadium vs. Pac-10/Pac-12 opponents.

**HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION:** Husky Stadium will undergo a massive renovation following the 2010 season. In fact, in order to aid the project, the Huskies will play this season's Apple Cup vs. Washington State Nov. 26 at CenturyLink Field (home of the Seahaws), meaning the Nov. 5 game vs. Oregon will be the final game in the "old" Husky Stadium. The Seattle icon was first opened in 1920. Upper decks were added in the 1950s (south) and 1980s (north). Renovations will completely remake the lower bowl and the south deck. The stadium track will be removed and an operations center for the football team will be built into the west end. **HISTORIC HUSKY STADIUM:** The 2011 season marks the 92nd season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. Thanks to several major renovations, Husky Stadium's seating capacity has increased to its current total of 72,500. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium currently stands at 354-168-21 (.671).

FAMILY TIES: As is the case with most seasons of Husky football, there are a number of players on the Washington football team related to either current or former Huskies. The team has one set of brothers in Jermaine (Sr. WR) and Jamaal (RS-Fr. LB) Kearse. Senior TB Johri Fogerson is related to both Nate Robinson (former UW football and basketball player; current NBAer) and former Husky basketball standout Dion Brown. Freshman safety Evan Zeger's father, John, played safety at the UW, lettering in 1980 and 1981, while freshman WR Kasen Williams' dad, Aaron was a four-year letterman (1979-82) wide receiver for the Huskies. Junior linebacker Jordan Wallace is the younger brother of former Husky safety C.J. Wallace. Another junior, Talia Crichton, is a cousin of former DE Daniel Te'o-Nesheim. Sophomore guarterback Keith Price is a cousin of former UW tailback Jelani Harrison. Freshman fullback Nick Holt is the son of the UW defensive coordinator of the same name (they are actually Nick Holt V and VI). A little further afield, freshman TE Michael Hartvigson is a cousin to former UW baseball pitchers Chad and Grant Hartvigson. Incidentally, at least three Huskies have close family ties to Washington State. Cooper Pelluer's father played at WSU, as did Husky cornerback Desmond Trufant's brother Marcus. Sophomore safety Nate Fellner is the grandson of former WSU head coach Jim Sweeney. Pelluer's uncle Steve, however, was a UW QB and his father Scott was an assistant coach at UW.

He's the first of those three to do it as a freshman and sophomore. Last year's final tally of 1,415 yards was the second-highest total in UW history.
