Noting the Golden Eagles

- Southern Miss is currently in its 99th football season, having competed for the first time in 1912. The Golden Eagles have posted an all-time record of 566-405-27.
- The program looks to snap a three-season losing season streak after previously compiling a school-best 18 consecutive winning seasons and appearing in 14 bowl games in 15 years, which ending in 2011.
- After finishing the 2012 campaign winless, the Golden Eagles have improved on their victory total in each season under Todd Monken, capturing one win in 2013 and three in 2014. Southern Miss already has two victories during the 2015 campaign.
- Southern Miss will play in its 20th season of Conference USA since the league's debut in 1996, having won five league championships (1996, 1997, 1999, 2003, 2011) which is more than any other school to participate in the league for the sport of football.
- Southern Miss established a stadium record with 36,641 in its season opener against Mississippi State. The previous best was a 36,232 mark against Alcorn State on Sept. 5, 2009. Four of the five top crowds at M.M. Roberts Stadium are against in-state institutions.
- For the second-straight game, the Golden Eagles had a running back rush for over 100 yards – Ito Smith (135 vs. Austin Peay) and Jalen Richard (vs. Texas State). It was the first time Southern Miss had consecutive games with a 100-yard rusher since Jamal Woodyard had back-to-back 100-yard games in 2011 against SMU (116) and UTEP (134).
- The program finishes up its non-conference portion of the schedule this weekend when they travel to Nebraska.
- Southern Miss has tallied back-to-back 50-point performances for the first time since 2010. The Golden Eagles scored 59 in a win against Houston (W, 59-41 on Nov. 20, 2010) and followed that with 50 in a loss at Tulsa (L, 56-50 on Nov. 26, 2010).
- For the first time since 2011, the Golden Eagles have a winning record and have posted consecutive victories. The win at Texas State was the first against a non-Conference USA opponent on the road since a 63-35 victory over Navy in Annapolis, Md. On Oct. 8, 2011. The Golden Eagles defeated Nevada in the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl that season (W, 24-17) at a neutral site in Honolulu.

The Nebraska Series

- The two schools have played each other five times in its football history with Nebraska holding a 4-1 advantage in the series (For a breakdown of the series, please go to page 4 of the notes).
- The Golden Eagles have lost the last two contests to the Huskers, having been outscored by an average of 36 points in each of the last two contests.
- Southern Miss took advantage of five Husker turnovers on Sept. 11, 2004, to capture its lone victory in the series, 21-17, in Lincoln.
- This will be the fifth trip to Lincoln to face the Huskers and the school has posted a 1-3 mark. NU won the only meeting in Hattiesburg, 38-14, on Sept. 25, 2003, in a Thursday night contest.
- This contest ends a three-game series between the two schools. The 2013 game was scheduled to be played in Hattiesburg, but was moved to Lincoln.

Southern Miss Versus the Big Ten

- Southern Miss has posted a 2-5 overall record against schools that were members of the Big Ten when the two teams played. The Golden Eagles are 2-0 record against Illinois, while dropping its only meeting with Indiana as well as falling twice to Nebraska and Penn State.
- The Golden Eagles have won its only home game against a Big Ten school in Hattiesburg, defeating Illinois 23-20 at home on Sept. 7, 2002.

Todd Monken Head Football Coach | Third Season - 6-21 (.222)

In two years in charge of the Southern Miss football program, Todd Monken has spearheaded an approach that has produced continual improvement for the Golden Eagles, forging the team on a path in leading them back to a familiar setting – winning seasons and bowl games.

When Monken was announced as the 20th head coach in Southern Miss history in December of 2012, his mission was charged to turn around a Golden Eagles' team that went winless the year before he took over the reins.

In his first season at the helm of the Golden Eagles, Monken battled injuries and a tough schedule as he began the rebuilding process for the Southern Miss football team. During his first year, Monken directed the injury-prone team to a 1-11 mark. After dropping the first 11 contests of the year, the Monken led Golden Eagles trailed rival UAB 21-13 at halftime. Southern Miss rallied for a 62-27 victory over the Blazers. In the game, the Golden Eagles scored 49 second-half points, including a season-best 28 points in the third quarter to take control of the game and earn the victory.

Despite the results on the scoreboard, Monken's first season saw several highlights from his first season.

Southern Miss' senior Khyri Thornton was named second team All-Conference USA, while true freshman Tyre'oune Holmes and junior Emmanuel Johnson were both honorable mention selections. In addition, a trio of Golden Eagles appeared on the C-USA 2013 All-Freshman team – Holmes, Nick Mullens and Cameron Tom.

Thornton culminated his Golden Eagle career by being selected in the third round (85th overall) of the NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers, becoming the first player selected in the NFL Draft in the Monken era.

Off the field, Corey Acosta was named to the 2013 Conference USA Football All-Academic team for his efforts on the field and in the classroom as announced by the conference office.

In addition, football had 27 players recognized for their achievements in the classroom, including five student-athletes who earned Dean's List honors. The Southern Miss football program was also recognized by the American Football Coaches Association for its academic achievement on the Division I Football Bowl Subdivision level as having a graduation rate of 75 percent or better.

In his second season, Monken improved the squad's win total to three and the number could have been pushed higher had Mullens, the team's starting quarterback, not gotten hurt in the first series of the Louisiana Tech game in late October.

Still, the Golden Eagles showed improvement as two players were honored as first-team All-Conference USA selections, including placekicker Corey Acosta and defensive lineman Rakeem Nunez-Roches. Wide receivers Casey Martin and Michael Thomas, along with offensive lineman Cameron Tom were honorable mention selections on the offensive side of the ball, while defensive lineman Dasman McCullum joined defensive backs Jacorius Cotton and Emmanuel Johnson represented the defense. In addition, true freshman defensive back Cornell Armstrong was named to the C-USA All-Freshman team.

Nunez-Roches also became the second Golden Eagle taken in the NFL Draft as he was chosen in the sixth round by the Kansas City Chiefs. Acosta and McCullum also signed free-agent contracts with the San Francisco Giants and Washington Redskins, respectively, heading into each organization's training camp.

In addition, Acosta excelled off the playing field, earning a Wuerffel Trophy finalist spot and was named a Lou Groza Award semifinalist. In the classroom, he was named second team Academic All-American after also being tabbed Academic All-District and Academic All-Conference USA for the third time.

Monken came to Southern Miss after serving the previous two seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Oklahoma State. It was his second stint at OSU, after serving as pass game coordinator and wide receivers coach there from 2002-04.

Under Monken during the 2012 season, the Cowboys – which had a true freshman starting quarterback to start the season and a redshirt freshman as the primary backup – ranked among the nation's top 10 nationally in scoring offense (4th/44.7 ppg), total offense (5th/548.9 ypg) and passing offense (7th/333.4 ypg). OSU will play in the Heart of Dallas Bowl on Jan. 1.

OSU scored more than 50 points 10 times, broke the 60-point mark in five contests, the 70-point mark twice

and the 80-point plateau once in just two years with Monken calling the plays.

Also during that span, the Cowboys set single-season records for points scored, touchdowns scored, first downs, pass attempts, pass completions, passing yards, completion percentage, touchdown passes, yards per play and third-down conversions in 2011, in addition to posting six of the top seven single-game passing marks in school history.

In 2011, Monken served as Brandon Weeden's position coach, who set single-season school records for passes completed, passes attempted, passing yards, touchdown passes, completion percentage and total offense in 2011. Weeden, who was drafted as the 22nd overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft by the Cleveland Browns, also set single-game school records for passing yards and total offense under Monken's watch in 2011. On the national level, Weeden finished the 2011 season second in passing yards, third in total offense, fourth in touchdown passes and ninth in pass efficiency.

Monken's offense produced the 2011 Biletnikoff Award winner in Justin Blackmon – a 2012 first round draft pick by the Jacksonville Jaguars (fifth overall) – in addition to a pair of All-Americans in Blackmon and offensive lineman Levy Adcock and the Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year, Grant Garner.

Prior to returning to OSU for his second time, Monken spent four years as wide receivers coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars of the National Football League. He had been promoted to the role of Jaguars' quarterback coach immediately before taking the offensive coordinator job at Oklahoma State. In his final year in Jacksonville, the Jaguar trio of Mike Thomas, Mercedes Lewis and Mike Sims-Walker combined to make 167 catches for 2,082 yards and 21 touchdowns with Lewis earning a spot in the Pro Bowl.

Monken also worked at LSU from 2005-06, where he developed several receivers including Skyler Green, Dwayne Bowe and Buster Davis. Bowe and Davis were selected in the first round of the 2007 NFL Draft. Bowe combined with Davis and Early Doucet to form one of the nation's premier receiving corps in 2006. The trio combined for 180 receptions, 2,598 yards and 24 TDs. Bowe finished his career with 154 catches for 2,403 yards, and his school-record 26 touchdowns ranked eighth in SEC history.

In his first stay at OSU, Monken spent three seasons (2002-04) as pass game coordinator/wide receivers coach. The Cowboys averaged more than 32 points per game during that time. In 2004, Monken tutored first-round pick Rashaun Woods, who was selected 31st overall by the San Francisco 49ers. Woods was a two-time All-America honoree and concluded his career with 293 receptions for 4,414 yards and 42 touchdowns.

He also helped engineer one of the nation's best passing attacks in his two seasons (2000-01) at Louisiana Tech – one year as the running backs coach and the other as wide receivers coach. In 2001, Louisiana Tech ranked eighth in the nation in passing, averaging 313 yards through the air per game. A year earlier, Tech ranked seventh in the nation averaging 313 yards passing per game.

In addition, Monken spent seven seasons at Eastern Michigan (1993-99) including the last two as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He also spent time at Grand Valley State (1989-90) and Notre Dame (1991-92).

A native of Wheaton, Ill., Monken was a three-year letterwinner at quarterback for Knox College. He earned a bachelor's degree in economics (1989) and followed with a master's degree in education leadership from Grand Valley State. He is a member of the Knox College Athletic Hall of Fame. Monken and his wife, Terri, have one son, Travis.

Last Time vs. Nebraska

Nebraska 56, Southern Miss 13 Aug. 31, 2013

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) – Stanley Jean-Baptiste and Ciente Evans returned first-quarter interceptions for touchdowns and No. 22 Nebraska defeated Southern Miss in a 56-13 at Memorial Stadium.

Nebraska limited the Golden Eagles to 284 yards and intercepted four passes, with the first two picks going for early touchdowns.

Jean-Baptiste jumped in front of Rickey Bradley Jr. just as Allan Bridgford's pass arrived on the third play of the game and ran it back 43 yards.

Evans put the Huskers up 21-3 with the first of his two interceptions, catching a ball tipped by Tyre'oune Holmes and going 22 yards to the end zone.

Nebraska limited the Eagles to 62 yards rushing, but only 4 of those came before the fourth quarter.

Taylor Martinez threw for 170 yards and three touchdowns, Ameer Abdullah ran for 114 yards and two TDs and the Huskers finished with 285 yards rushing.

Southern Miss scored on its first series of the second half. Bridgford's 41-yard touchdown pass to Bradley made it 35-13.

After Bradley's touchdown, Kenny Bell ran back the kickoff 63 yards, and Abdullah scored from 37 yards on the next play.

Evans intercepted Bridgford on the first play of Southern Miss' following possession, and Martinez threw a 26-yard touchdown pass to Sam Burtch to make it 49-13.

Nebraska's two interception returns for touchdowns marked the first time the Huskers have had two defensive scores in a game since they had two picks for TDs against Idaho in 2010.

Bridgford was 21 of 35 for 222 yards. But Bridgford and the Eagles, who turned over the ball six times the previous week, couldn't overcome the four interceptions - the last one thrown by Nick Mullens.

A Proud History

Despite three-straight losing seasons, the Southern Miss football program has captured 67 winning campaigns including a school-record 18 straight from 1994 to 2011. When the most recent streak was broken, the Golden Eagles had the fourth-longest season winning streak behind Florida State, Florida and Virginia Tech. Since 1935, the Golden Eagles have finished below .500 only 11 times. Since 1997, the Golden Eagles have been to 14 bowl games and had a string of 10 straight bowl contests from the 2002 to 2011 seasons.

Five Time C-USA Champions

The Golden Eagles collected their first C-USA championship game win and the school's fifth league title - more than any other school in the conference - when they defeated Houston 49-28 for the 2011 league crown. It was the school's second C-USA East Division crown, as the other four league crowns came during the inaugural season of 1996 as well as the 1997, 1999 and 2003 campaigns. The league divisional setup began during 2005 and also marked the first year for a league championship game of which the Golden Eagles have now appeared in both 2006 and 2011. Since Conference USA went to a divisional format for the 2005 campaign, the Golden Eagles had been in the East Division. That changed in 2014 as Southern Miss moved to the West with current league foes Louisiana Tech, North Texas, Rice, UTEP and UTSA.

Bower Academic Excellence Center Announced

Earlier this summer, the Department of Athletics, in conjunction with the Southern Miss Athletic Foundation, announced the launch of the Bower Academic Excellence Center Campaign. The \$2 million capital campaign, of which \$1.15 million had already been privately raised when announced, will fund a new student-athlete academic center named in honor of longtime Golden Eagle football coach Jeff Bower. As the second-winningest coach in the program's history with 119 victories over 17 seasons and Conference USA's first Coach of the Decade, Bower established a very strong record of success on the field while placing an even greater emphasis on his student-athletes' success in the classroom. In addition to the program's graduation rate, numerous former Golden Eagles earned Academic All-Conference and Academic All-American honors. Also, the Bower family's emphasis on academics has been demonstrated by their scholarship endowment, which currently ranks as the Southern Miss Athletic Foundation's largest endowment.

Overtime Anyone?

Southern Miss has been involved in 10 overtime games since the rule went into effect prior to the 1996 season and the Golden Eagles are 4-6 overall, after losing a 38-31 double OT game at UCF in 2012. Nine of the 10 games that have taken OT to complete have been in C-USA contests. Here is a look of all the overtime games Southern Miss has played in since the 1996 season:

Pro Traditions

Southern Miss, which has a reputation in training and producing professional talent over the years, has a long list of former players that have reached the National Football League including the likes of Ray Guy, Brett Favre, Sammy Winder, Michael Boley and Jamie Collins. Southern Miss has had at least one player drafted in 11 of the last 15 NFL drafts, including Rakeem Nunez-Roches, a sixth-round selection by Kansas City last April, while many others, including Tampa Bay offensive lineman Demar Dotson, realized their dream by signing as a free agent. Since 1942, 118 players have been drafted by the NFL, AFL or AAFC, which including a school-best four on nine different occasions. Guy became the first Golden Eagle to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014.

Richard Goes over 1,000 Yards for Career

Senior running back Jalen Richard rushed for career-highs of 230 yards and four touchdowns in leading visiting Southern Miss to a 56-50 non-conference victory over Texas State last Saturday. Richard, the senior from Alexandria, La., posted the fourth-highest rushing game in school history as he helped the Golden Eagles erase a three-point halftime deficit with three second-half touchdowns, that included scoring runs of 54 and 63 yards. It was the first time in the senior's career to rush for over 100 yards. The last time a Southern Miss player rushed for four touchdowns in a game was on Nov. 20, 2010, when quarterback Austin Davis did it four times against Houston. It was the first time in Richard's career he ran for four scores and the second time to notch at least two rushing touchdowns in a game. Richard last rushed for two scores in a game on the road against UCF on Oct. 13, 2012. He started his senior campaign against Mississippi State by rushing for 48 yards on 16 carries, going over the 1,000-yard career rushing mark. He currently has 1,308 yards in his 31 career games.

Top Rusher from a Year Ago Returns

Sophomore Ito Smith enjoyed one of his best performances of his young career with a season-best 135 yards on the ground on 10 carries, including a 75-yard rushing score, as well as 49 yards on his lone catch for a touchdown against Austin Peay to become the first Golden Eagle to register both a rushing and receiving TD since Jamal Woodyard did it against Southeastern Louisiana on Sept. 17, 2011. Smith has rushed for 788 career yards in 15 games for a 52.5 per game average. He has picked up where he left off following his initial season in which he led the team in rushing a year ago with 536 yards on 136 carries as a true freshman, compiling a pair of 100-yard rushing games including a career-best 141 yards against No. 23 Marshall and 118 yards against Alcorn State.

100-Yard Rushers in Consecutive Games

For the second consecutive game, the Golden Eagles had a running back rush for over 100 yards – Ito Smith had 135 against Austin Peay and Jalen Richard tallied 230 against Texas State. It was the first time Southern Miss had back-to-back games with a 100-yard rusher since Jamal Woodyard had back-to-back 100-yard games in 2011 against SMU (116) and UTEP (134).

Mullens Opens Season at Quarterback

Junior quarterback Nick Mullens won the top signal caller job during summer camp and has started all three games to open 2015. The Golden Eagles had two players battling for the quarterback position since the end of last season, between the incumbent Mullens and transfer Tyler Matthews. Mullens has been the starting quarterback since halfway through his freshman year, having now made 19 career starts (6-13). Matthews became eligible this season after sitting out a year ago following his transfer from TCU. He played in four games during his redshirt freshman season with the Horned Frogs.

Mullens Over His First Two Years

After starting the final six games of the 2013 season, Nick Mullens returned as the team's starting signal caller last year by opening the first eight contests before missing the next two with a foot injury he sustained on the opening drive against Louisiana Tech. Mullens collected 200-yard passing games in nine of 10 starts in 2014 and now has 17 200-plus throwing contests in 19 career starts after throwing for 333 yards last week against Texas State. His best performance in 2014 was a 426-yard game on 36-of-54 passing with three touchdowns and just one interception in the Golden Eagles' contest at Middle Tennessee. It was only the third 400-yard passing

game in Southern Miss history and the second-highest total behind only Austin Davis' 461-yard performance against Rice in 2008. Mullens' completions set a school mark, while his attempts and total offensive yards (439) ranked second on the Golden Eagle school game ledgers. In addition, he led the team to 19 fourth-quarter points. Mullens was the fifth true freshman ever to get a start at quarterback two seasons ago. He has thrown for 5,165 yards over his two-plus seasons for the Golden Eagles and has posted 33 career touchdowns.

Mullens Throws for over 300 Yards Again

With his 333 yards against Texas State, Mullens threw for over the 300-yard plateau for the sixth time in his career. That moves him ahead of Brett Favre for the second-most 300-yard passing outings in school history. Austin Davis, who played for the Golden Eagles from 2008-11, holds the record with 17.

Spreading the Love

Through the first three games for the Golden Eagles, 13 players have caught at least one pass. Eleven different Southern Miss receivers caught passes in the opening contest against MSU – the most since the same number caught at least one pass last season in Starkville – including team bests of six catches and 81 yards for Corey Robertson in his first career contest. D.J. Thompson and Casey Martin each added five receptions in that game.

Martin Mania

Casey Martin led Southern Miss in receptions with 55 (4.6 per game) last season to finish tied for fifth on the school's single season chart for receptions with Shawn Mills (2000). Martin's best day came at UTEP with six catches for a season-best 129 yards. It was his first 100-yard receiving game for the Golden Eagles. His total included a 55-yard TD grab, which was the second longest offensive play of the season. He opened the 2015 ledger with five catches against Mississippi State and followed that with a team-best seven catches for 81 yards. He saved his best game of the season for Texas State last week as he tallied five catches for 114 yards and a pair of touchdown grabs (4 and 50 yards). He leads the team in receptions with 17 and receiving yards with 201 this season, having tallied a total of 72 for his career.

Working Up Front

The Golden Eagles offensive line, who had two players back that started in all 12 games, including left tackle Rashod Hill and center Cameron Tom, start in those spots to open the first three games of 2015. Brandon Farmer (13 career starts) got his first start of the year at Texas State at left guard, while Devin Farrior started at the right guard spot against Texas State, earning his 15th career starting assignment. Norman Price opened at right tackle for the seventh-straight time and ninth overall. Farmer and Hill graded out the best among offensive linemen against Texas State as the unit produced 39 knockdowns, including 10 from Hill, eight from Andrew Peterson and seven from Tom.

Explosive Plays

Southern Miss registered eight plays of at least 20 yards against Texas State to give them a total of 25 for the season. Three of those plays last Saturday went for at least 50 yards and a touchdown against the Bobcats. That was the first time Southern Miss had scored three touchdowns of at least 50 yards in a game since scoring on a pair of interceptions (97 and 79) along with a punt return for 60 yards against East Carolina (11/5/11).

Transfers Set to Help Defensive Side of the Football

Despite having just five starters return on defense for the Golden Eagles, Southern Miss added some strong defensive four-year transfers to help solidify the losses from last season. The Golden Eagles have added defensive linemen Andrew Bolton (Kansas), Naim Mustafaa (Miami), Quincy Russell (Oklahoma) and linebacker Anthony Swain (Auburn) to the mix for this season and all have made strong contributions during the early part of the 2015 season.

Bradley Looking to Stop Folks in Backfield Again

Dylan Bradley enjoyed his best game of the early 2015 season by registering a game-high eight tackles, which included a pair of sacks and three tackles for loss, against Austin Peay. Injuries limited Bradley to just eight games a year ago, but the junior defensive lineman returned as the top defensive player in terms of tackles for loss (4.5) and sacks (3.0). Bradley totaled 29 total tackles on the year of which 12 were solos, including a season-high eight stops at UTEP last season. In 2015, Bradley is third on the squad in tackles with 13, of which six have been for loss, which leads the team, including three sacks - also a team best.

Smith Returns as the Dean of the Defensive Front

Senior Michael Smith returns with the most game action for the Golden Eagles on the defensive front. Smith has played in 37 career games, including 33 starts and has posted 94 career tackles, including 31 a year ago. He was the only Golden Eagle to start and play in all 12 games in 2013. The Birmingham, Ala., native collected 33 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and a blocked kick that season and had a string of 29 straight starts snapped last year after missing the North Texas game with an injury.

Anderson Returns as Top Tackler

Senior Brian Anderson came back in 2015 as the team's top returning tackler from a year ago. Anderson tallied 65 stops (38 solos) with 3.0 tackles for loss and one fumble recovery despite playing in just eight games. Anderson missed four games with a back injury last season, but finished fourth on the total tackles list behind Jacorius Cotton, Emmanuel Johnson and Alan Howze. Anderson is second on the squad in tackles with 14 this season, including a half sack to his credit and 3.5 tackles for loss.

Reed Headlines Young Secondary

Senior Kalan Reed returns with the most experience in the defensive backfield for the Golden Eagles, having played in 37 games and made 25 career starts, including 18 consecutive after the Texas State game. Reed went over the 100-tackle mark for his career with a career-best nine stops against the Bobcats, including one impressive stop on the goal line on fourth-down late in the game to thwart a late Texas State drive. He also has the most passes broken up of any returning defensive back with 20 as well as interceptions with five. He tallied 34 stops a year ago with a team-tying best two interceptions. Reed intercepted a pass and returned it 76 yards for a touchdown against Austin Peay. It was the first INT returned for a touchdown by Southern Miss since Reed picked off a pass and returned it 19 yards for a score against Marshall on Oct. 20, 2012. The interception was his second returned for a touchdown.

Youngsters in the Secondary Getting Older

The Golden Eagles had three freshman a year ago that saw action in all 12 games and made at least one start, including Picasso Nelson, Jr., who collected 10 starts as a true freshman, while Cornell Armstong and Jomez Applewhite made five starts each as redshirt freshmen. Applewhite led the trio in tackles with 37, while Nelson, Jr., added 36 and Armstrong added 30. Armstrong also returned a blocked field goal 78 yards for touchdown at UTEP.

Antoine Stepping In

Junior transfer D'Nerius Antoine has stepped into his role at safety nicely, leading the squad in tackles through the first three games. Antoine has 17 stops, which includes two tackles for loss and a pass breakup. Antoine posted his season-high tackle game last Saturday at Texas State with nine.

Snap to It

Redshirt senior Lance Schuffert has handled the primary deep snapping responsibilities since his redshirt freshman season in 2012. In his time at Southern Miss, Schuffert, who was signed out of high school from Prattville, Ala., had snapped the ball 209 times during punts without a single punt being blocked over his career until the Mississippi State game when Tyler Sarrazin's attempt in the second quarter was blocked by the visitors.

Kickin' It

After four years of Corey Acosta handling the kicking duties for the Golden Eagles, Southern Miss has had to find a new placekicker for the 2015 season. Redshirt freshman Stephen Brauchle got the nod for both kickoff and place-kicking duties in the opener against Mississippi State. Brauchle hit all three field goals in his debut from 31, 27 and 27 and led the team with 10 points, also converting his lone extra point. Brauchle missed his first two field goal attempts against Austin Peay before Parker Shaunfield converted a 28-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter and also tallied an extra point in the contest. Shaunfield then handled all the place-kicking duties in the Texas State game by converting all eight extra points, while Brauchle handled the kickoff chores.

Game Recaps

Game 1: Mississippi State 34, at Southern Miss 16 (Sept. 5, 2015)

HATTIESBURG, Miss. – Despite a 311-yard passing performance from Nick Mullens and a M.M. Roberts Stadium record crowd of 36,641, Southern Miss dropped its season opener Saturday night to Mississippi State, 34-16, in front of a nationally televised audience.

Southern Miss, who entertained the Bulldogs for the first time here since 1989, started the game by holding on to the football for 13:15 minutes of the opening quarter to jump out to a 10-7 advantage.

Stephen Brauchle, in his first game for the Golden Eagles, got the squad on the board first with a 31-yard field goal, but the Bulldogs bounced right back with a 100-yard return on the ensuing kickoff from Brandon Holloway.

The Golden Eagles responded by taking their last lead of the game when Mullens, who finished 30-of-44 passing, hit tight end Jay/Shawn Washington for his first career touchdown on a 19-yard strike with 2:20 left in the quarter.

The scored remained that way until MSU then took the lead for good on a Justin Johnson 5-yard pass from Dak Prescott with 10:57 to go in the second quarter.

Prescott, who finished with a pair of touchdown passes, added his second scoring strike with 12:15 to go in the third quarter on a four-yard toss to Gus Walley before Westin Graves extended the MSU lead to 24-10 with a 38-yard field goal just under two minutes later.

The two teams then traded field goals after that as Brauchle added a 27-yarder midway through the third, before Graves tallied his second try of the night from 37 yards. Brauchle opened the final period with a 27-yard field goal to cut the margin to 27-16. It was Prescott, though, who added another scoring tally with 5:55 remaining on a seven-yard scoring run.

Golden Eagle running back Ito Smith tallied a team-best 69 yards on eight carries, while redshirt freshman Corey Robertson added six catches for 81 yards for the home squad.

Game 2: at Southern Miss 52, Austin Peay 6 (Sept. 12, 2015)

HATTIESBURG, Miss. – Southern Miss quarterback Nick Mullens threw three touchdowns and ran for another as the Golden Eagles captured their first victory of the season in a 52-6 decision over Austin Peay here Saturday afternoon at Carlisle-Faulkner Field at M.M. Roberts Stadium.

Mullens finished with 275 passing yards on a 22-of-40 throws, but got the Golden Eagles on the board at the 5:36 mark of the opening quarter with his legs on a 2-yard scoring run.

The Governors (0-2) answered with their only points of the contest just over two minutes later as Trey Taylor hit Rashaan Coleman on a 44-yard strike. The extra point was missed and that was the closest Austin Peay got the rest of the contest as Southern Miss limited the visitors to just 189 total yards and 2-for-16 on third down conversions. The Governors did not convert their first third-down conversion until the final quarter.

Ito Smith, who rushed for a game-best 135 yards on 10 carries, extended the Golden Eagle lead in the second period on a 75-yard score down the right sideline for his longest rush of his career. It was his third 100-yard rushing performance for the sophomore running back.

DJ. Thompson and Corey Robertson each then caught touchdown passes from Mullens from 3- and 9-yards, respectively to give the Golden Eagles a 28-6 advantage at halftime.

The Golden Eagles added three more touchdowns in the third quarter as Smith added his second score to start the third quarter, this time on a 49-yard pass from Mullens with 9:23 left. Senior Justice Hayes added a one-yard scoring run and Kalan Reed intercepted a pass and returned it 76 yards for his second career pick for a touchdown.

Parker Shaunfield added a 28-yard field goal to complete the scoring in the fourth quarter.

Southern Miss tallied 514 total yards including 239 yards on the ground.

Game 3: Southern Miss 56, at Texas State 50 (Sept. 19, 2015)

SAN MARCOS, Texas – Jalen Richard rushed for career-highs of 230 yards and four touchdowns to lead visiting Southern Miss to a 56-50 non-conference victory over Texas State at Bobcat Stadium.

Richard posted the fourth-highest rushing game in school history as he helped the Golden Eagles erase a three-point halftime deficit, with three second-half touchdowns that included scoring runs of 54 and 63 yards.

After falling behind at halftime, the Golden Eagles forced Texas State to punt on its opening drive of the second half. Mullens, who threw for 333 yards on 19-of-27 passing with four touchdown passes, gave Southern Miss the lead for good when he hit wide receiver Casey Martin on a four-yard scoring strike just under three minutes into the second half.

Richard then scored on a three-yard run to go along with his 54 yard scoring scamper in the third quarter as the Bobcats sandwiched a 37-yard field goal in between and Southern Miss led 42-28 after three quarters.

Mullens then pushed the lead back to 21 points at 49-28 when he hit Martin for a 50-yard scoring pass across the middle just 1:24 into the final period.

The Bobcats, though, rallied with 22 points down the stretch to get back into the game, but Kalan Reed helped thwart a late TX State drive with 1:57 left as the senior defensive back made a goal-line stop on fourth down to keep the Bobcats out of the end zone.

Southern Miss started the game quickly in the first half as well, taking the opening kickoff and driving it 75 yards over eight plays as Mullens hit receiver DJ. Thompson on a pair of completions, one of 27 yards to start the drive and the second of 23 yards to complete it for the first score of the game just 3:13 into the contest.

After Texas State cut the gap to 7-3 on its opening drive with a 27-yard Lumi Kaba field goal, Mullens pushed the Golden Eagles down the field again. The junior started the drive by connecting with Martin for 38 yards and four plays later hit freshman Jordan Mitchell for 19 yards on his 1st career touchdown reception for a 14-3 advantage.

The Bobcats punted back to Southern Miss on their following possession and Southern Miss extended its lead to 21-3 as Richard tallied a one-yard scoring run, just six seconds into the second quarter.

Texas State then scored 22 unanswered points in the second quarter as quarterback Tyler Jones started the run with a 35-yard scoring run just over a minute later to cut the gap to 21-10. Jones finished the contest with 310 yards passing (31-of-46), and team-best 160 rushing yards.
