The Arkansas State Department of Athletics unveiled its new online virtual media guide in 2010, launching the interactive publication on AStateRedWolves.com.

A-State Athletics partnered with DOCDI Consulting to construct a virtual media guide intended to compliment AStateRed-Wolves.com and the printable versions of its reference guides created for each of its 16 NCAA Intercollegiate sports. The virtual guide not only highlights each A-State sport, it also makes information and videos detailing different aspects of the athletic department and university available in one central location for fans, alumni, media and prospective student-athletes.

The newest addition to AStateRed-Wolves.com can be found at the top of the home page under "virtual guides" and can also be accessed by going directly to AStateGuides.com. Visitors are greeted by an introduction from ASU Director of Athletics Dr. Dean Lee on a home page that allows viewers to easily navigate information about A-State Athletics and its individual sports.

PRESS BOX: The press box at ASU Stadium is a three-floor facility located on the west side of the stadium complex. It has elevator service to the two media levels (top and middle) used by working media representatives. The top level contains the photo deck and television booth, and the air-conditioned middle level houses sportswriters, statisticians and radio personnel. The press box is equipped with phone lines, high-speed internet connections and wireless internet service. Admittance to these levels is by special credentials issued only by the ASU Sports Information Department. The credential must be shown to the elevator operator.

CREDENTIALS: Requests with names should be made as far in advance as possible because of space limitations. Requests are honored from official media outlets. Requests from individuals not employed by a media outlet, including free lance photographers, will not be considered. Because of space limitations, some requests may be filled with a game ticket instead. Passes will be mailed to valid applicants as long as time permits; otherwise, they may be claimed at the "Media Will Call" window on the northwest side (press box side) at Gate 10. Spouses, dates, children (under the age of 18), and non-workers are NOT permitted in the press box. Passes must be displayed at all times during the game. ASU reserves the right to revoke passes and privileges at any time due to misrepresentation or misconduct. Credentials are not transferable. Direct ALL requests for home game credentials to the ASU Sports Information Department. Requests for road game credentials should be made to the Sports Information Director of the host institution.

MEDIA WILL CALL: If time does not permit to mail, credentials may be picked up at Media Will Call. The Ticket Office is open on game day beginning at 9:00 a.m. until two hours before kickoff. At that time, media representatives may pick up credentials by showing a photo ID at the stadium (Gate 10).

PARKING: Parking is available for the working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex across the street from the ASU soccer field. Parking is on a first-come-first-served basis. Show the parking credential to the parking attendant and you will be allowed in the parking lot if space permits.

GAME-DAY RADIO/TELEVISION: Radio broadcasts of ASU football games are part of the EAB Sports Radio Network. Stations wishing to receive the broadcasts or needing more information about the EAB Sports Radio Network should contact Brad Bobo in ASU's Athletics Department at 870-972-3930. Only the "official" radio outlet of the visiting team, as designated by the visiting sports information director, will be permitted originating privileges unless special permission is obtained by the ASU Sports Information Director. Radio booths are located on floor two of the Press Box. Both the home and visitor booths contain two dial-up lines. There is also a dry pair hookup in both the home and visitor's dressing room for post-game radio interviews. For additional telephone information, contact the ASU Telecommunications Office at 870-972-2542

SATELLITE TRUCKS: Any outlet using a satellite truck must request access and have the truck in place five hours prior to kickoff. Contact the Sports Information Office.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: ASU Stadium's lighting system is multi-vapor with a 100 candlepower rating and a color temperature of 3400 degrees Kelvin. Credentials are required to shoot from either the photo deck or the sidelines and are issued by the Sports Information Department. Certified photographers of newspapers, magazines, wire services and TV stations must request passes in writing. Credentials must be visible at all times. Freelance photography is prohibited. No credentials will be issued freelance photographers. Photographers are not permitted to shoot between the 25-vard lines. No one is permitted in the bench area, on the playing field or in the 12-foot area between the limit line and the sideline any time after competition begins, including timeouts. Photographers working on the field level may not obstruct the view of a ticket purchaser. No media personnel or their equipment shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box.

GAME SERVICES: Programs, notes, reference guides, flip cards, statistics, quotes and play-by-play are provided. Six phones are available in the press box for media use, as is a fax machine. Books of all information will be available after the game. The Press Box refreshment bar, with complimentary soft drinks and snacks, is open before and throughout the game.

LOCKER ROOM POLICY: ASU's locker room is closed to all media both at ASU Stadium and on the road. The equipment room and athletic training room are off limits to the media. Media members wishing to interview any players following the game may submit a list of players they wish to interview to the Sports Information Director during the game. All media members will have access to any player or coach in the designated interview area on the third floor of the ASU Football Complex.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS: All telephone or inperson interviews with any of the players must be arranged through the Sports Information Office. No player telephone numbers or housing information will be given out, but arrangements will be made for players to return calls to media members at a mutually agreed upon time. When visiting practice sessions, media members are encouraged to conduct interviews with players after practice. PRACTICES: Practices will be announced as open or closed through the ASU Sports Information Department. Video crews wishing to film practice must notify the Sports Information Office in advance. If TV crews wish to interview a player or coach, please notify the Sports Information Department.

WEEKLY MEDIA CONFERENCES: Media representatives are encouraged to visit with Head Coach Gus Malzahn during his weekly press conference. Quotes from the press conference and game notes are available on-line (www.AStateRedWolves.com). Those wishing to receive weekly releases should send your e-mail address to the Sports Information Office. Media representatives can receive the notes through a PDF format. Notes can also be faxed to the media outlet.

VIDEO HIGHLIGHTS: The Arkansas State Department of Athletics regularly posts video from ASU football press conferences, practices and games to the department's FTP site. Television stations wishing to access the FTP site to download video and sound should contact the ASU Sports Information Office.

COLLEGE PRESS BOX: Media can access notes, quotes, stats, media information and much more from Arkansas State and its opponents on the Sun Belt section of College-PressBox.com. BEST TIME TO CALL HEAD COACH: If you find it impossible to attend the regular media conference, Coach Malzahn is usually available for phone interviews in his office from 10-noon Monday through Thursday. Contact the Sports Informaiton Office.

INJURY INFORMATION POLICY: A student-athlete's health information is protected by federal regulations under either the Health Information Portability and Accountability (HIPPA) or the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (the Buckley Amendment) and may not be disclosed without either the student-athlete's authorization under HIPPA or their consent under the Buckley Amendment. Authorized/consented injury information pertaining to a student-athlete shall be released

to the media through the Sports Information Department after being authorized by the athletic trainer and head football coach. Team physicians may be available to offer explanation on injuries if requested by the athletic trainer and head coach. Any sideline or locker room report made to the media shall be made by an athletic trainer, team physician, or sports information staff representative.

DIRECTIONS TO ASU STADIUM

From Memphis International Airport: Start going toward the Airport Exit on Winchester Road. Bear right on Plough Boulevard for 1.4 miles. Take ramp onto I-240 West toward I-240 Little Rock/Downtown for 2.6 miles. Continue on I-55 North for 6.1 miles. Take the St. Louis/Little Rock exit on I-55 North and go 24.4 miles. Take exit 23B/Marked Tree/Jonesboro onto US-61for 0.5 miles. Continue on US-63 North for 41 miles. Take ramp toward Caraway Road/Stadium Boulevard for 0.2 miles. Bear right on Stadium Boulevard and go 2.2 miles until seeing ASU Stadium on the left. Parking is available for the working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex.

From Little Rock National Airport: Leaving the airport on East Roosevelt Road go 0.3 miles and continue on Annie M. Bankhead Drive for another 0.4 miles. Turn left to take the ramp onto I-440 East toward TO I-40 for 11.3 miles. Take the Jacksonville exit onto US-67 North and go 96.5 miles. Turn right on AR-226E and go 11.7 miles. Turn right on Co. Road 203. Turn left on US-49 for 6.5 miles. Take ramp onto US 49 North and go 2.7 miles until taking the Stadium Boulevard exit for 0.2 miles. Turn left on Stadium Boulevard and go 2.4 miles until seeing ASU Stadium on the left. Parking is available for working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex.

2012 ARKAI TE FOOTBALL

As another football season approaches, the excitement surrounding the Arkansas State Red Wolves football program continues to escalate. There have been a number of changes over the last year, leading to an unprecedented level of anticipation for a new season to kickoff.

The Red Wolves enjoyed a successful 2011 campaign that saw them finish with a 10-3 record, including a perfect 8-0 mark in Sun Belt Conference play, to earn an invitation to the Go-Daddy.com Bowl. ASU's 10 wins was its most as an FBS member and is tied for the fourth most in school history. The Red Wolves also became just the third Sun Belt Conference team to go undefeated in league play and claimed the SBC title outright for the first time in school his-

tory. Building on the excitement garnered by the 2011 team, Director of Athletics Dr. Dean Lee announced at a Dec. 14 press conference that Gus Malzahn had been selected as the 28th head football coach in school history. Malzahn returns to his home state after enjoying three successful stints as a top assistant at three FBS universities. A name highly recognized throughout Arkansas and

ASU also returns starting tight end Kedric Murry and will look to McKnight to anchor an offensive line that was strong in the spring.

ASU returns four starters on defense, including 2011 All-Sun Belt Conference performer Nathan Herrold at linebacker. Sterling Young will anchor one of the safety positions, while Ryan Carrethers is expected to play a big role up front and Jones lead a talented secondary.

QUARTERBACK

The Red Wolves are set at the quarterback position with All-America and Heisman candidate Ryan Aplin. The senior signal caller holds 16 schools records, and he is currently second in career total offense and passing yards, third in passing touchdowns and fifth in rushing touchdowns. He has been added to the Walter Camp, Manning, Davey O'Brien and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm preseason award watch lists. A-State also returns Phillip Butterfield, who missed the entire 2011 season with an injury. During the 2010 season, Butterfield averaged 5.7 yards per rush, while running and throwing for one touchdown.

RUNNING BACKS

back Sophomore running Frankie Jackson returns after appearing in 12 of the Red Wolves' 13 games in 2011. As a freshman, Jackson ran for 355 yards and six touchdowns. He also caught 13 passes out of the backfield for 178 yards. Sirgregory Thornton

WIDE RECEIVER

Senior Josh Jarboe made an immediate impact in 2011 and figures to be a big part of the A-State passing attack in 2012. Last year, the junior college transfer hauled in 54 catches for 730 yards and two touchdowns. He averaged nearly 13.5 yards and per catch recorded a seasonlong reception of 71 yards against Memphis. Senior **Taylor Stockemer** became а vorite target for Aplin, finishing the

year with 48 receptions that ranked as the third most on the team. He enters this year tied for second all-time in career touchdown receptions with 13 and needs just three more to break the school record. His also ranks among the top-10 in career receiving yards and career receptions. posted career highs in the GoDaddy.com Bowl with 11 receptions for 185 yards. The Red Wolves also expect production from senior Allen Muse, junior Carlos McCants and sophomore Earl Lucas.

Gus Malzahn was named the Red Wolves' 28th head football coach Dec. 14, 2011, bringing him back to his home state after most recently enjoying highly successful stints as a top assistant coach at three NCAA FBS universities that garnered national acclaim.

A name highly recognized throughout Arkansas and the nation, Malzahn comes to Arkansas State after serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Auburn for the past three seasons. A native of Fort Smith, Malzahn was named the winner of the 2010 Frank Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top collegiate assistant coach.

"The things I appreciate and the things I look at in the hiring process is that we want to hire a man of character, a man of integrity and a man of honor, and Coach Malzahn has all of those qualities and many more," said Lee. "He is going to do so many things outside of football for our student-athletes, and I know he shares a pride in the quality and substance of our student-athletes."

"This is a program on the rise, and when I initially talked with Dr. Lee discussing his vision of where this program is heading, that is when I knew that this was the place for me. I told the team to buckle up because we are about to take this thing to the next level."

"Arkansas State University is fortunate to attract a head football coach with the proven talent and personal integrity of Gus Malzahn," said ASU Interim Chancellor Dr. Dan Howard. "Throughout his coaching ca-

reer, he has achieved great success with inspiring and motivating young athletes. Coach Malzahn will lead the Red Wolves football program through a smooth transition and will work hard to ensure the best possible collegiate experience for our student-athletes. The university is extremely grateful to the Red Wolf Club and the private donors whose confidence and support made it possible to bring Coach Malzahn back to his home state of Arkansas. Intercollegiate athletic competition is a vital part of the university experience, and Coach Malzahn will help Arkansas State to continue building upon recent successes."

His innovative offense made an immediate and profound impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national championship since 1957. The Auburn offense set nine school records, including points in a season (577), points per game (41.2), total yards (6,989), total offense (499.2), rushing yards (3,987), rushing touchdowns (41) and passing touchdowns (31). Malzahn's recordsetting offense in 2010 led the Southeastern Conference and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories.

He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton during the Tigers run to the 2011 BCS National Championship. Under Malzahn's direction, Newton later became the overall No. 1 pick in the 2011 NFL Draft after producing one of the best single-season quarterback performances in collegiate history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and an additional 20 touchdowns as Auburn finished 14-0 and defeated Oregon 22-19 in the BCS title game.

Newton also won the school's first-ever Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award, given to the nation's top quarterback. He also claimed the Maxwell Award presented annually to college football's top player, while also earning Associated Press National Player of the Year and SEC Offensive Player of the Year awards.

He helped lead the Tigers to a 7-5 record this season, which will include an appearance in the Chik-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31. The Malzahn-led Auburn offense had four players named to the All-SEC Team, including sophomore running back Michael Dyer, junior tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen, senior offensive

lineman Brandon Mosley and junior running back Onterio McCalebb.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to 7th in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to 7th in total offense. It also took Auburn just six games in 2009 to score more

points than it did in all 12 games in 2008.

Before coaching at Auburn, Malzahn spent two seasons at Tulsa, coordinating a Golden Hurricane offense that finished first nationally in total offense in 2007 and 2008. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team school records and 12 individual records. The Hurricane also set nine Conference USA team records, while Tulsa quarterback Paul Smith broke an NCAA record by throwing for at least 300 yards in 14 consecutive games.

Prior to his time at Tulsa, he coached one season at Arkansas, where he served as offensive coordinator, coached Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helped the Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense at 228.5 yards per game. In fact, two of Malzahn's first three collegiate offenses ranked in the top 10 nationally in rushing, including the 2008 Tulsa team and 2006 Arkansas squad.

In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. Malzahn coached two quarterbacks. Josh Floyd and Rhett Lashlee, who set national passing records. Malzahn also tutored 2005 Gatorade, Parade Magazine and Rivals.com National Player of the Year Mitch Mustain at Springdale High School.

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie (23) and Kenzie (20).

Rhett Lashlee enters his first season at Arkansas State as the Red Wolves' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Lashlee comes to ASU after serving as the offen-

sive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2011 at Samford, where he installed a high-tempo offense that improved the Bulldog's national ranking in total offense from No. 57 in the nation to No. 36 over the course of just one year. Samford's offense averaged 17 points per game the year prior to Lashlee's arrival, but put 28 points per game on the scoreboard in 2011 to help the Bulldogs improve their record from 4-7 to 6-5.

Under Lashlee's direction, Samford averaged 391 yards per game just one year after averaging 355. The Bulldogs also averaged 255 passing yards per game to rank No. 45 nationally, while they were ranked No. 72 in 2010 with 179 yards per game. Lashlee's offense also averaged 166 rushing yards per game, good enough to rank among the top 50 teams in the nation as well.

The Bulldogs posted a 4-4 Southern Conference record in 2011, matching their best ever as a member of the league. Samford broke the school record for points scored in a league game with 52 against Western Carolina as Lashlee helped the school jump from No. 100 in the nation in scoring offense to No. 43.

Lashlee coached Samford wide receiver Kelsey Pope, who broke the school record for receptions in a game with 17 in 2011. Under Lashlee's leadership, quarterback Dustin Taliaferro broke Samford's career record completions during the 2011 campaign as well.

Lashlee has spent five of the last eight seasons working closely with Malzahn and his offense in a variety of capacities, including the 2009 and 2010 seasons as an offensive graduate assistant at Auburn.

He assisted Malzahn with all aspects of the offense and coached the slot receivers in 2010. In 2009, the Tigers finished 8-5 winning the Outback Bowl. During the 2010 season he helped the Tigers finish 14-0, winning the Southeastern Conference championship and the BCS National Championship behind Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Cam Newton.

Prior to working at Auburn, Lashlee's college coaching career began in 2006 at Arkansas, where he served as Offensive Student Graduate Assistant while working with Malzahn. He helped lead the Razorbacks to a 10-4 record and an SEC Western Division championship behind Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and fellow All-American Felix Jones. Prior to working at Arkansas, he worked under Malzahn at Springdale High School

in Arkansas in 2004 and 2005, working with the quarterbacks and 2005 Gatorade, Parade Magazine and Rivals.com National Player of the Year, Mitch Mustain.

Lashlee was a backup quarterback at the University of Arkansas from 2002-04, when his career was cut short due to a shoulder injury.

Prior to attending Arkansas, Lashlee graduated from Shiloh Christian high school in Springdale, Ark. in 2002. He played quarterback for Malzahn and Chris Wood at Shiloh Christian High School from 1999-2001, posting a state-record 40 career wins (40-3-2 as a starter) while leading his team to three straight state championship game appearances that included two state titles. He was also named the 2001 AP Arkansas Player of the Year. To date he still owns virtually every state passing record and when his career had finished he had broken the national record for career touchdown passes (171), career touchdowns (200), most passing yards in a game (672) and was second with 13,201 passing yards.

Lashlee graduated from the University of Arkansas in 2006 with a degree in Marketing and Business Administration. He received his Masters degree in Higher Education from Auburn University in 2009.

Lashlee is married to the former Lauren Lee, of Rogers, Ark., and they have 15-month old twin boys, Thomas Price and Hudson Rhett.

Defensive Coordinator • Linebackers • First Year Central Arkansas, 1978

Arkansas native John Thompson, a veteran coach with over 29 years of experience at the collegiate level, enters his first season as the Red Wolves' defensive coordi-

nator.

Thompson has worked 25 seasons as a coordinator and was also the head coach at East Carolina for two years. Recognized as a top defensive mind, Thompson has worked as defensive coordinator or co-coordinator at Southeastern Conference schools Mississippi, Florida, Arkansas, South Carolina and LSU, as well as at Memphis, Southern Mississippi, Louisiana Tech and Northwestern State.

As a defensive coordinator, Thompson has seen more than 40 of his defensive players drafted by, or sign with, National Football League teams. Forty of his defenders earned all-conference honors, five were named all-America, and one, former Northwestern State linebacker Gary Reasons, has been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame.

Thompson comes to A-State after most recently serving as Georgia State's assistant head coach for scheduling and strategic planning and defensive coordinator. Thompson also coached inside linebackers at Georgia State, where he spent the last four seasons.

Thompson came to Georgia State in July 2008 after spending the 2007 season as defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach at Ole Miss. That followed a one-year stint as athletics director at his alma mater, the University of Central Arkansas, which he guided in its move to NCAA Division I. He served as co-defensive coordinator at South Carolina in 2005.

As the head coach at East Carolina in 2003-04, he coached three first-team all-conference players and seven all-freshman selections.

Thompson was the defensive coordinator at Florida in 2002, when the Gators' pass defense was ranked seventh in the nation, allowing just 162.4 yards per game. He also spent two years at Arkansas, serving as co-defensive coordinator in 2000 and then defensive coordinator in 2001. In 2000, the Razorbacks were second in the nation in pass defense while leading the SEC in pass defense and total defense. The following year, Thompson helped lead Arkansas to the Cotton Bowl.

Thompson's first position as a defensive coordinator came at Northwestern State, where he served from 1983-86, and again from 1988-89 after spending the 1987 season as linebackers coach at Alabama.

In 1990, he became the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech for two seasons before moving to Southern Miss as defensive coordinator in 1992. He was given additional responsibility as assistant

head coach in 1993. In Thompson's seven seasons at Southern Miss (1992-98), the Golden Eagles won or shared two Conference USA titles, twice ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring defense and made two bowl appearances.

In one season at Memphis in 1999, his Tiger defense ranked 11th in the nation in scoring defense and 23rd in total defense.

A native of Forrest City, Ark., Thompson began as a high school coach in 1977 while pursuing his bachelor's degree at UCA. He continued to coach prep football until moving to the college ranks in 1982 as a graduate assistant at Arkansas, where he worked under Lou Holtz.

A high school quarterback, Thompson was inducted into the Forrest City High School Hall of Fame in 2006. His playing career also includes two seasons as a defensive back at Central Arkansas. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from UCA in 1978.

Thompson and his wife, Charleen, have two sons, Cabe and Hays.

Running Backs • Special Teams Coordinator • First Year Arkansas Tech, 2004

Eliah Drinkwitz enters his first season at Arkansas State as running backs coach and special teams coordinator.

The Alma, Ark. native most recently spent the 2010-11 seasons as an offensive graduate assistant coach at Auburn, working with Malzahn for the second time of his career. He also worked with Malzahn as an assistant coach at Springdale (Ark.) High School in 2004.

While at Auburn, Drinkwitz assisted Malzahn with all aspects of the offense. During the 2010 season he helped the Tigers finish 14-0, winning the Southeastern Conference championship and the BCS National Championship behind Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Cam Newton. The 2011 season saw Auburn finish 8-5, including a 43-24 victory over Virginia in the Chik-fil-A Bowl.

Prior to Auburn, Drinkwitz coached four seasons at Springdale from 2006-09. He first

served as the Bulldogs' offensive line coach and running game coordinator in 2006 before spending the next three years as their offensive coordinator. During his time as offensive coordinator, Springdale averaged 422 yards of total offense per game while setting school records in completions, receptions and yardage.

Drinkwitz spent the 2005 season as an assistant coach at Alma High School, where he started his coaching career as a volunteer assistant from 2001-03 while still attending college. He earned his bachelor's degree in education from Arkansas Tech in 2004, graduating Magna Cum Laude after serving as student body president.

Prior to attending Arkansas Tech, Drinkwitz was an all-conference and all-state selection for the Alma football team and was named an FCA Huddle Leader of the Year.

Drinkwitz is married to the former Linsey Sivils, and they have one daughter, Addison, born March 19, 2010.

Offensive Line • First Year Henderson State, 1977

J.B. Grimes, a veteran coach who has been a part of 14 bowl games and a national championship in his career, enters his first

season at Arkansas State as the offensive line coach.

Grimes most recently spent the last two seasons as Kansas' offensive line coach, but has also overseen the position group at Mississippi State, East Carolina, Texas A&M, Virginia Tech, Arkansas, Louisiana-Monroe and Delta State as an assistant coach over the last 29 years.

Prior to his time with the Jayhawks, Grimes spent five seasons as the offensive line coach at Mississippi State (2004-08). In his inaugural season, MSU rushed for 1,744 yards, the most at the school in four years. Behind his offensive line, Mississippi State produced three seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher.

In his one season at East Carolina (2003), the Pirates' offensive line paved the way for its third straight 1,000-yard individual rusher. At Texas A&M (1998-2002) Grimes coached the offensive line under R.C. Slocum for five seasons as the Aggies posted a 40-22 overall record while playing in four straight bowl games.

While at Virginia Tech (1993-97) coaching

for Frank Beamer, Grimes helped the Hokies to back-to-back Big East championships and five bowl games in five seasons.


Grimes also coached at Arkansas, serving as a graduate assistant in 1981-82 and as a full-time assistant coach in 1989-92, where he helped the Razorbacks to the Southwest Conference Championship and a Cotton Bowl appearance in 1990. At Arkansas, Grimes worked for Lou Holtz, Ken Hatfield and Jack Crowe.

Grimes also coached at Louisiana-Monroe (1979-80, 1985-88), Delta State (1983) and Missouri (1984) after spending his first two seasons at the high school level in the state of Arkansas at Nashville (1977) and Des Arc (1978). Louisiana-Monroe won the 1987 Division I-AA national championship.

As an offensive lineman at Henderson State, he helped his team to a 40-6 record in four seasons, including a berth in the 1974 NAIA Championship game.

He earned a bachelor's degree in education from Henderson State in 1977 and a master's degree in education from Louisiana-Monroe in 1981.

Grimes grew up in Clarendon, Ark. and is married to the former Jennifer Graves. The couple has four children, including sons Aaron and Nick and daughters Danielle and Lindsey.



DAVID GUNN



Cornerbacks • 11th Year Arkansas, 1987

David Gunn enters his 11th season as an assistant coach at Arkansas State. Gunn will coach defensive backs in 2012, after spending his first 10 seasons as the Red

Wolves running backs coach.

Gunn also held the role of Director of Player Development in 2011, the same season he served as the Red Wolves' Interim Head Coach for the Go-Daddy.com Bowl.

Over the last 10 seasons, Gunn has coached three All-Sun Belt Conference selections and two of the Red Wolves' top three all-time leading rushers. Under Gunn's watch, ASU has had a running back named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Year and the league's Freshman of the Year

Since arriving at ASU in January 2002, Gunn has overseen some powerful performances coming out of the A-State backfield. ASU's most recent back to attack the ASU record books is Derek Lawson, a senior who is currently ranked 13th in career rushing yards and needs just 92 yards to become the 12th player in school history to rush for 2,000 yards.

Arnold, A-State's featured back from 2006-09, was listed as a Doak Walker Award candidate entering the 2007, 2008 and 2009 seasons. Arnold entered his senior year as the third leading active rusher in the NCAA and finished his career as ASU's second all-time leader in total rushing yards and tied for second in rushing touchdowns. Arnold piled up numerous awards, including All-Sun Belt Conference honors three times.

Gunn's first season featured Danny Smith, who broke ASU's all-time rushing record which had stood for 50 years. Gunn proudly watched Smith receive Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Year Honors. A unanimous pick for first-team all-conference, Smith ended up scoring 14 touch-downs while picking up 1,390 yards.

Then, Antonio Warren and Shermar Bracey churned out extraordinary rushing totals and signed contracts with teams in the National Football League. In fact, Warren finished his career as ASU's third all-time leading rusher with 3,040 yards.

Prior to joining the ASU staff, Gunn served as the head coach for Little Rock McClellan High School and took his team to the 2001 AAAAA playoffs. Gunn was the head coach at McClellan for five seasons (1996-2001), taking the Crimson Tide to the playoffs twice.

Prior to that, he served as the boys head track coach at Watson Chapel High School in Pine Bluff. While at Watson Chapel from 1991-95, he also served as the running backs and defensive backs coach and helped that team go to the AAA playoffs three straight years and won the 1996 state cham-

pionship.


That was the second stop at Watson Chapel for Gunn, who began his career as the linebackers and wide receivers coach from 1987-89.

Gunn, a native of England, Ark., who excelled in football, basketball and track at England High School, has also coached at Lake Highlands High School in Dallas, Texas, where he coached running backs and helped his team to a 1990 conference title

After graduating from England High School in 1982, he attended the University of Arkansas, where he played defensive back and running back from 1982-87.

As a Razorback player, he played in the 1984 Liberty Bowl and the 1987 Orange Bowl. He graduated in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and biological science.

Gunn is married to the former Aleachia Stephenson of England, and they have two daughters - 27-year-old Tiffany, a second year Law student at Arkansas, and 19-year-old Bethany is a sophomore at ASU.

Safeties • First Year Oklahoma, 2000

Brandon Hall enters his first season at Arkansas State as the Red Wolves' linebackers coach.

Hall most recently completed his second stint as the defensive assistant for quality control at Oklahoma, but has also served as the co-defensive coordinator at Central Oklahoma, the defensive coordinator at Broken Arrow (Okla.) High School, the linebackers coach at Northern lowa and as a defensive graduate assistant coach with the Sooners over the last 11 years.

Since graduating from the University of Oklahoma in 2000 with his bachelor's degree, Hall has been a part of seven bowl teams, four conference championship squads and one national championship.

Hall's most recent stop at Oklahoma saw the Sooners post a 10-3 record that included a 31-14 victory over Iowa in the Insight Bowl. He rejoined the Sooners after working as an assistant coach at Central Oklahoma the previous three seasons, including the 2008 campaign when the Bronchos won the the Lone Star Conference North Division with a perfect 5-0 record within the division.

Hall served on the coaching staff in a different capacity each year at UCO, including co-defensive coordinator, linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator. During his tenure at Central Oklahoma, Hall coached four players who received first-team All-Lone Star Conference North Division honors, including 2008 LSC North Linebacker of the Year K.C.

Hall went to UCO after spending the 2007 season as an assistant coach at Broken Arrow, where he was in charge of linebackers and helped the Tigers to the state playoffs. The season prior he served as linebackers coach at Northern Iowa, helping lead the Panthers to a 7-4 record in 2006.

Hall started his coaching career as a student assistant coach at Oklahoma from 1998-2000. He then worked three seasons as a graduate assistant with the Sooners. coaching linebackers. He joined the OU staff as a full-time defensive assistant for quality control in 2003 and served in that capacity for an additional three years.

During Hall's tenure at Oklahoma, the Sooners won the 2000 national championship with a perfect 13-0 record and played in two additional national championship Oklahoma also posted a 78-14 record during Hall's seven seasons at the school and claimed victories in the Orange Bowl, Cotton Bowl, Rose Bowl, Holiday Bowl and Insight Bowl.

A native of Newcastle, Okla., Hall earned an associate's degree from Oklahoma City Community College before going on to receive his bachelor's and master's degrees from OU. Brandon and his wife Crystal have one daughter, Maddie.

ASU alumnus and former football letterman Kenny Ingram enters his first season as an assistant coach at Arkansas State, serv-

ing as the Red Wolves' defensive line coach.

Ingram, who played at ASU from 1989-92 as a defensive end, returns to his alma mater after most recently serving as an interim defensive coach for the Red Wolves' during the month leading up to their appearance in the 2012 GoDaddy.com Bowl.

Prior to his recent interim stint at ASU, Ingram was an assistant coach at Memphis from 2006-09. He was promoted to defensive coordinator at Memphis in 2009, just three years after joining the Tigers' program. Ingram continued to guide the linebackers, the same position he coached the previous three seasons. Ingram was a part of two bowl teams in his four years at Memphis, including the 2007 New Orleans Bowl and the 2008 St. Petersburg Bowl.

Ingram joined the Memphis staff after spending the 2005 season as defensive line coach at Tennessee State University, where he was responsible for recruiting his hometown area of Memphis and west Tennessee.

Ingram also coached at Melrose High School, where he was credited with returning the program to prominence. He was the head coach from 2002-04 and posted a 37-4 overall record after serving as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator from 2001-02. He led the school to one appearance in the state finals and a pair of appearances in the state semifinals.

Ingram was a three-time Regional Coach of the Year and was the Commercial Appeal's 2004 Coach of the Year for Metro Memphis. He also was selected to serve as the Liberty Bowl All-Star Game defensive coordinator in 2003 and was a member of the Tennessee East-West Shrine All-Star Game coaching staff that same season. In addition, Ingram was elected as an assistant coach for the 2004 Tennessee-Kentucky All-Star Game.

In his three seasons at Melrose, he coached 17 players who signed scholarships to play college football.

Previously, Ingram taught and coached at

Corry Middle School and worked in the Youth Habilitation Center prior to moving to Mel-

A standout at Whitehaven High School in Memphis. Ingram was the team co-captain in 1992, and received his bachelor's degree in political science from Arkansas State University in December 1999.

Ingram and his wife, Carla, have five children: Kendrien, Taylor, Kameron and twins Kennedy and Karleigh.

Dean Jackson, a veteran coach with over 30 years experience at the high school and collegiate levels, enters his first season at

Arkansas State as the Red Wolves' tight ends coach.

Jackson comes to ASU after spending the last three seasons as the assistant head football coach and defensive line coach Naaman Forest High School in Garland, Texas.

He spent the previous three seasons at the University of Tulsa, including the 2009 campaign as an administrative assistant to the head coach and the director of high school relations. He spent his first two seasons as Tulsa's tight ends coach when the Golden Hurricane played in the GMAC Bowl in Mobile, Ala. in both 2007 and 2008 while Malzahn was serving as offensive coordinator.

In 2008, Jackson was part of an offensive coaching staff that had Tulsa ranked as the nation's top offense for the second consecutive year, gaining 569.9 yards and scoring

47.2 points per game. In 2008, the Hurricane led the nation in total offense with 543.9 yards per game, while Tulsa posted an overall 10-4 record.

Jackson went to Tulsa after coaching the tight ends for one season at Rice in 2006, when the Owls played in the New Orleans Bowl. Jackson helped lead the Owls to a 7-6 record and the school's first bowl game appearance in 45 vears. Before his stint at Rice. Jackson spent 25 years in the high school ranks in north Texas.

Jackson was the defensive coordinator at Dallas' Hillcrest High School in the 2004-05 seasons, helping the Panthers compile an 8-3 record and a Class 4A area finalist spot in 2004.

Previously, Jackson spent six years on the coaching staff at Allen High School. He helped the Eagles advance to the playoffs five times, including the 2003 campaign when they finished as a Class 5A state semi-finalist.

Jackson was the head coach and athletic director at Wilmer-Hutchins High School for three seasons (1995-97). He was also on the Wilmer-Hutchins coaching staff as offensive coordinator when it won the 1990 Class 4A state championship. Jackson coached in the Texas High School Coaches Association All-Star Game in 1992.

While at Wilmer-Hutchins, Jackson also coached Eagle athletes to seven national championships in power-lifting along with the 1989 state title and five regional crowns.

Jackson had previous assistant coaching assignments at Athens High School (1985-87), Paris High School (1981-84) and Pittsburg High School (1994), all in Texas.

A native of Atlanta, Texas, Jackson earned his bachelor's degree in education/physical education, from Wichita State University in 1981. He and his wife, Cora, have three children: son, Cory, and daughters, Dena and

Woods comes to A-State after spending the last three seasons as Auburn's Director of Offensive Quality Control, working closely with Malzahn during that time. He was a part of three bowl teams at Auburn, including the 2010 squad that won the BCS National Championship. During his tenure at Auburn, the Tigers also competed in the 2009 Outback Bowl and 2011 Chik-fil-A Bowl.

Prior to Auburn, he served as a graduate

assistant coach at Tennessee during the 2008 season, working with wide receivers.

Woods was a three-year letterman at Tennessee from 2003-07, playing in 40 career games while also working two seasons as a player volunteer coach. He played in three bowl games and was a member of three 10win teams. He was team captain of the 2007 Tennessee team that won the SEC East and Outback Bowl.

Ryan Russell begins his first season as Head Strength and Conditioning coach and Director of Sports Nutrition at Arkansas State. Prior to arriving at ASU, Russell was the top Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach at Auburn University for the past two seasons.

During his time at Auburn, he helped develop, coordinate, implement and supervise yearly strength and conditioning programs, and supervised all nutritional advice, supplementation, analysis and programming on both a team and individual level for the Auburn football program.

Prior to his time at Auburn, he served as Associate Strength and Conditioning Coach and Director of Sports Nutrition at Boise State from 2007-10, and was a graduate assistant at Auburn from 2005-07. Russell also served as a Strength and Conditioning Intern at the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Louisville.

Among the achievements associated with teams that Russell has worked with are the 2011 BCS National Championship at Auburn, the 2011 SEC Championship at Auburn, the 2010 Fiesta Bowl Championship and No. 4 national ranking at Boise State, the 2009 WAC Championship at No. 6 national ranking at Boise State, the 2009 WAC Championship and NCAA Soccer Tournament berth at Boise State, the No. 9 national ranking and WAC Championship for the 2008 Boise State football team, the 2005 SEC Western Division Championship at Auburn and the No. 8 national ranking and C-USA Championship won by the Louisville football team.

He was an all-conference receiver and kick returner at West Liberty State from 2000-2002, while also running track. 

Burns, who played under Malzahn at Auburn in 2009

and 2010, will work on the offensive side of the ball in his newly appointed role at A-State. Burns was originally recruited as a guarterback at Auburn, but moved to wide receiver later in his career and helped lead the Tigers to the 2010 national championship.

Burns ended his four-year career at Auburn with 16 receptions for 227 yards, including a 35-yard touchdown catch in the 2010 BCS national championship game that saw the Tigers record a 22-19 victory over Oregon. He was a triple threat for the Auburn offense, also recording 799 rushing yards and 1,312 passing yards from 2007-10.

Burns earned his bachelor's degree in May 2011 from Auburn. He was ranked as the No. 8 dual-threat quarterback prospect in the country and the No. 3 overall recruit in Arkansas by Rivals.com coming out of Northside High School. An all-state selection by the Arkansas High School Athletic Association, Burns threw for 1,903 yards and 23 touchdowns as a senior, while also rushing for 835 yards and 13 touchdowns.

He is the younger brother of Khayyam Burns, a fouryear letterman at Arkansas State from 2004-07 who was a three-time All-Sun Belt Conference selection at his safety position for the Red Wolves.

A-State Inks Sun Belt's Top Class



First-year Arkansas State head football coach Gus Malzahn announced on National Signing Day that 26 high school and junior college standouts from eight different states signed with the Red Wolves.

With a Parade All-Amercian, Under Armour All-American, NJCAA All-American, 23 players that earned either junior college all-conference or high school all-state recognition and 18 players rated at least three stars by one or more of the major recruiting sources, the 2012 class could be considered one of the best in the history of the ASU football program.

Arkansas State had the top-rated class in the Sun Belt Conference by Rivals.com. Scout.com. ESPN.com and 247Sports.com.

The Red Wolves' first recruiting class under Malzahn is made up 22 high school players and five junior college transfers. ASU also signed FBS-transfers Michael Dyer (RB) and Travis Bodenstein (OL), while former Tennessee running back David Oku signed with ASU during the offseason.

The Red Wolves signed five offensive linemen, the most among any position, and have signed 11 players expected to play on the offensive side of the ball. Including three defensive ends and four interior defensive linemen, A-State inked 12 defensive players and an additional four players listed as athletes that could potentially play on either side of the ball.

Eleven players from Arkansas are included in the class, followed by five from Texas, four from Alabama, four from Mississippi, three from Kansas and one each from Georgia, Oklahoma and Tennessee. The 11 players from Arkansas, which includes Bodenstein, are the most to join the Red Wolves in an incoming class since the 2005 season.

2011 SUN BELT CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS GODADDY.COM BOWL PARTICIPANTS



The Sun Belt Conference champion Arkansas State Red Wolves carried a ninegame winning streak, the nation's second longest at the time, and 10 regular-season victories into their first bowl game since 2005 when they faced Mid-American Conference champ Northern Illinois in the ESPN-televised GoDaddy.com Bowl on Jan. 8.

The Red Wolves put together an unblemished 8-0 Sun Belt record to claim their first outright championship as a member of the league. A-State received as many as 18 votes in the AP Top 25 Poll and 13 votes in the USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll, while also ranking as high as No. 35 in the BCS and reaching No. 30 in the CBSSports.com 120 rankings during the season.

ASU recorded its most victories ever as an FBS member with 10, topping the previous best of six wins in 1995, 2002, 2005, 2006 and 2008. The last time the Red Wolves won 10 games at any level was 1986 when it posted a 12-2-1 record and finished as the NCAA I-AA runner-up. A-State's 10 victories tied the fourth most in school history. ASU had 10 victories in 1951, 11 in 1970 and 1975 and 12 in 1986.





RED WOLVES IN THE PROS, SUPER BOWL

There has been at least one Red Wolf on 31 of 32 NFL teams so far. The only team yet to have a former ASU player is the Carolina Panthers, and defensive back Darren Toney signed a rookie free agent contract with them in 2009. The team most frequented by ASU alums are the Philadelphia Eagles and New York Jets with 11 each. The Dallas Cowboys and the Chicago/ St. Louis/Phoenix Cardinals are next with nine. The Miami Dolphins have had eight Red Wolves play for them and the Denver Broncos follow with seven former Red Wolves.

Arkansas State has had more than 100 players sign pro contracts. From Clifton Mack in 1939 to Demario Davis in 2012, the Red Wolves have a very long tradition of developing players that move on to the next level. In fact, A-State has had a player taken in the NFL Draft each of the last six years. Many players have gone on to very long and successful careers at a number of different levels.

A total of seven former players for ASU have played in the Super Bowl, and six coaches have experience in pro football's biggest event.

Most recently, Super Bowl XLIII presented an especially intriguing match-up for Arkansas State fans with four coaches, including Pittsburgh head coach Mike Tomlin, participating that have ties to ASU's football history.

The road to Super Bowl XLIII for Tomlin and two others on the Steelers' coaching staff, linebackers coach Keith Butler and wide receivers coach Randy Fichtner, went through Jonesboro in the mid-to-late 1990's as assistant coaches on the Arkansas State staff. Tomlin, Butler and Fichtner were back in the Super Bowl last year, along with David Johnson, former ASU tight end taken by the Steelers in the 2009 NFL Draft.

Working on the opposite sideline in Super Bowl XLIII was Arizona assistant coach Maurice Carthon, who played running back at Arkansas State from 1979-82. Carthon also played in Super Bowls XXI and XXV for the New York Giants, brought home a pair of championship rings, and was an assistant coach on the 1996 Super Bowl runner-up New England Patriots in Super Bowl XXXI.

In 2002, players and coaches moved into a new three-story complex which features office space for coaches, dressing rooms, meeting rooms and a players' lounge.

These rooms are also utilized as suites for use dur-

ing games, academic study areas, conference rooms, alumni functions, booster meetings, recruiting and other gatherings. It also houses the Bill Templeton Recruiting Room.

The complex is not just the three-story building, but also ASU Stadium and the surrounding parking areas, practice fields and concession stands.

On the ground floor are locker rooms, a player lounge area and the entrance to the weight room. Coach Malzahn and his staff can be found at the complex with offices and video areas located on the second floor. The top floor includes meeting rooms which are converted into suites on game day.

Suite holders enjoy watching the Red Wolves play football from inside or from the balcony. Televisions are mounted throughout the suite and on the balconies to capture and show replays.

The structure complements the million dollar video scoreboard constructed in 2001. This massive structure is located in the south end zone.

The former football complex now houses academic and student services, compliance and some sports offices.

An ASU Stadium-record crowd of 30,427 was on

hand to watch the Red Wolves play long-time rival Memphis on Sept. 18, 2004.

When Arkansas State's football team took the field for its 2010 home opener, it was on a new and upgraded state-of-the-art GEO Surfaces field turf.

ASU originally transitioned from a grass field to an artificial playing surface prior the 2006 season. Like the original field turf installed five years ago, the new Geo-Surfaces product still features a large A-State logo in the center of the field and red end zones with large white "ARKANSAS STATE" lettering.

However, the new product has an enhanced look with the addition of two Red Wolves logos, two Sun Belt Conference logos and a black trim that will outline the field. The Red Wolves and Sun Belt Conference logos are located on each 25-yard line.

The newest Geo-Surfaces field turf is slightly thicker than the previous product and also includes a sand base for the first time in addition to the noflyout rubber that was again put in place.

The multi-use surface provides year-round training opportunities for other ASU sports in addition to the school's football program.

ASU Stadium features a three-story press box, which includes a large suite for fans on the first floor, houses the media on the second floor and has a photo and film deck on level three.

One of the most impressive aspects of Arkansas State's Football Complex is the strength and conditioning program and the weight room. Success on the football field begins in the weight room, and ASU has one of the best.

ASU's athletics department moved one huge step closer to achieving its goal of a new Performance Enhancement Complex when a gift of \$250,000 from longtime supporters Boe and Myrna Adams of Leachville was presented to Dr. Dean Lee in March 2004.

The single donation equals the second largest ever given to the athletics program at ASU.

"Thanks to the generous support of Boe and Myrna Adams, we will be able to provide an ultramodern facility for our student-athletes to have proper training and workouts enabling them to reach their full potential," said Dr. Lee.

Upon completion of ASU's three-story football complex, improvement to the current strength and conditioning area was the next step.

Enhancements to the structure included connecting it to the football building through complementary architectural design as well as providing services for student-athletes in the classroom through computer labs, study areas and academic support staff.

Behind the efforts of John Arce, ASU's strength and conditioning coach, the new area is in use to help ASU's student-athletes become bigger, stronger and faster.

"We are so grateful for this gift from Boe and Myrna Adams and their continued support of ASU athletics," said Dr. Lee.



The ASU strength and conditioning area features 70 work stations, flooring, flexibility area, power area, speed area, cardiovascular area, training equipment, Olympic weight-lifting platforms, a plyometric training area, air and heating system and training security measures.





Arkansas State University took another step to achieving its goal of a total Performance Enhancement Complex when a gift of \$250,000 was presented by Dr. Tim and Terri Langford in September 2004.

The donation equals the second largest single donation ever given to the athletics program at ASU. Longtime supporters Boe and Myrna Adams made an equal contribution to the Performance Enhancement Complex March 4, 2004.

Because of the Langford's generous gift, the Athletic Training Program located in the Football Facility has been enhanced considerably. The furnished and refurbished training room is now named the Tim and Terri Langford Sports Medicine Center.

"We are honored that Tim and Terri so generously agreed to assist us with our Sports Medicine Center," said ASU Director of Athletics Dr. Dean Lee. "This state-of-the-art facility allows us to better manage the health and safety of our student-athletes through the prevention and treatment of injuries.

"Tim and Terri have served as exceptional ambassadors for this University and represent the absolute best that ASU has to offer. Tim has been a role model for our program since he enrolled here in 1979 through his athletic, academic and leadership abilities."

In fact, Langford was recently named as one of the Sun Belt Conference's distinguished alums during the league's first 31 years. Langford was also inducted into ASU's Ring of Honor during the 2008 football season.

Langford, a urologist in Little Rock with Arkansas Urologists Associates, played quarterback for ASU from 1980-83 under former head coach Larry Lacewell. His wife, Terri, is a former physical therapist and received part of her physical therapy training at Arkansas State.







The sports medicine department expanded into the former Red Wolves football team locker room. This conversion increased available athletic training work space from 700 square feet to over 2,800 square feet. Other training centers in the Convocation Center, Tomlinson Stadium and the Track and Field Complex serve to complement this primary space and provide frontline care for practices and events.

The Tim and Terri Langford Sports Medicine area has undergone recent changes and construction and is in use. The project included new tables, flooring, ceiling, paint and offices.

ASU student-athletes, who already receive great medical care, enjoy plenty of room and quality surroundings.





"We are proud to announce the largest gift in the history of ASU Athletics of \$400,000, and we are also proud to announce the renaming of this facility to the Charles F. Luter Family Academic Success Center," said ASU Director of Athletics Dr. Dean Lee at the press conference. "We have the great opportunity to announce the completion of what we call the third phase of our performance enhancement complex. We previously had the Boe and Myrna Adams Strength and Conditioning Center, the Tim and Terri Langford Sports Medicine Center and now a vital and very important part of what we call the Academic Success Center.

"That is a very appropriate name for what we do here, because we have had a tremendous amount of academic success," Lee added. "We work extremely hard to build a culture where our student-athletes want to succeed not only in competition, but in the classroom, and they have done that."

Among ASU's most recent accomplishments was 173 student-athletes achieving a 3.0 grade point average for the 2011 spring semester, including 32 with a 4.0. There were also a school-record 186 members on the 2010 fall ASU Athletic Director's Honor Roll, and 40 of those student-athletes held a 4.0 to also set a school record. The spring numbers represented 54 percent of all ASU student-athletes, while the fall totals represented 56 percent.

The Charles Luter Family Academic Success Center serves as a foundation for structure, discipline and organization for the education of all ASU student-athletes. The facility, coupled with innovative programs and equipment, currently houses the academic support staff, tutors, computer labs, a resource room, study areas, tutorial rooms, small group study centers, a large conference room, the compliance office and spring sports coaching of-

The athletic department came back on May 20, 2011 to hold a ribbon-cutting ceremony and open-house reception for to showcase some of the renovations that have occured since the donation was made.

Among the most recent and noticeable modifications to the Charles Luter Family Academic Success Center is a new foyer housed in a brick and rock exterior that, along with new landscaping, gives the entrance to the building a modern look and creates a stronger image. The actual foyer has a large Red Wolves logo embedded in a terrazzo flooring that greets visitors as they enter the building. A receptionist office now also connects to the lobby area, which holds all-new furniture and a plaque recognizing Charles and his wife, Kay.

A restructuring of the academic resource center, now known as Dawson's Den, has occurred, including a wallwrap celebrating academic success that is clearly visible for student-athletes working in the computer lab. Additionally, tutorial rooms and computer-work stations have been upgraded in this area, which also displays pictures of the most recent ASU graduates. The names of the latest members of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll are also showcased in Dawson's Den. The area is named after Scott and Kay Dawson, longtime supporters of Red Wolves' athletics

Team photos have been hung and are displayed along the walls of the building, along with plaques displaying the all-time winners of the Terry Gwin and Scott and Kay Dawson Ambassador Awards, two of the highest honors and ASU student-athlete can receive.

Additional renovations are still scheduled, includiing a "Wall of Honor" that will recognize special student-athletes that come to Arkansas State and excelled in their business, in their profession, in their career or in their commu-



Those who have not visited the campus of Arkansas State University in the last five or 10 years would be shocked at the school's appearance today. So much on campus is tied to athletics. ASU Stadium is the gathering site for Saturdays and excitement surrounding each game can be felt for miles. The sights, the smells, the sounds of football.

There is so much construction and new projects on campus. The school looks . . . and is . . . a modern educational institution that has kept up with technology and student needs as much, if not more, than most schools in the nation. A student center addition anchors the campus, and a new student recreation and wellness center was completed in fall 2009.

New campus housing has recently been completed, including a "Collegiate Park" apartment complex, coastal-type soft-colored housing throughout campus, and a new dorm. There is a new Alumni Center and construction of a new overpass connecting the campus to local businesses is about to become a reality. It's a new-look campus that is growing and improving each day.

Arkansas State University is an extremely valuable part of Northeast Arkansas and surrounding areas.







Arkansas State University was established April 1, 1909, as a "public school of agriculture" by Act 100 of the Arkansas General Assembly. It was located at Jonesboro because citizens of the city bid \$40,000 to the state and pledged 200 acres of land as a site.

After a century of growth, ASU-Jonesboro now has an annual budget of some \$122.6 million, owns more than 3,000 acres of land in five different counties, has a physical plant valued at almost \$200 million, and has an alumni roll exceeding 53,000.

ASU's rapid development over the years has been typical of other major universities in an emerging modern South. From an agricultural high school in 1909, to a junior college in 1918, to a four-year degree-granting institution in 1930, to a university in 1967, ASU has become regionally respected and nationally recognized for its qualities of teaching, research and service.

The ASU system includes campuses at Beebe (White County), Mountain Home (Baxter County), and Newport (Jackson County) where associate degree programs are offered, and at Marked Tree, Searcy and Heber Springs. An instructional site is located at Paragould.

The Jonesboro campus, which occupies 942 acres amid the gentle slopes of Crowley's Ridge in east Jonesboro, is located between the vast and fertile Mississippi River Valley and the cultural and scenic richness of the Ozark Mountains.

More than 10,000 students annually work toward degrees in 141 areas of specialization at the graduate and undergraduate levels. Fifteen undergraduate degrees are offered through the Colleges of Agriculture, Business, Communications, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, Nursing and Health Professions, Sciences and Mathematics, and the University College. The Honors College was instituted July 1, 2004, evolving from the Honors Program.

Jonesboro, home of Arkansas State University, weighs in as the largest city in Northeast Arkansas. As a matter of fact, if you form a triangle by connecting Little Rock, St. Louis and Memphis, Jonesboro stands out as the largest metropolitan city in what amounts to a 17,000 square mile triangular area.

Jonesboro is a great city of over 60,000, and is always ready to welcome incoming ASU students from the moment they arrive in town. The booming community has matured over the past half century into a regional center for cultural, educational, industrial, commercial, agricultural, communication, transportation, recreational and medical interests. It contains almost every convenience of a big city and every comfort of a small town.

The community is alive with cultural events such as the art exhibitions, theatrical and musical productions, not only on campus but in the city itself through the Jonesboro Fine Arts Council. NEA Foundation of Arts, the Forum and the Northeast Arkansas Symphony. One highlight is the annual Hispanic celebration when downtown Main Street is transformed into a festive explosion of Hispanic music, food and cultural activity.

Jonesboro is also the medical hub of northeast Arkansas and southeast Missouri. with two major hospitals and countless medical professionals. The city is also a shopping mecca, offering a modern business district as well as quaint downtown antique shops and restaurants. The \$100 million Mall at Turtle Creek recently opened with more than 100 stores.

One of the five largest cities in Arkansas. Jonesboro is located between the vast and fertile Mississippi River and the cultural and scenic richness of the Ozark Mountains. It is nestled about 70 miles west of Memphis. Tennessee, on the gentle slopes of Crowley's Ridge.

Jonesboro is a comfortable one hour drive from Memphis, two hours from Little Rock and four hours from St. Louis. The city and University have meshed resources in recent years and have truly become the "capital" of the northeast quadrant of the state.

Northeast Arkansas is a recreation haven for the person who enjoys water sports, fishing, hunting, and boating as well as the joys of unspoiled nature. Jonesboro and the surrounding area have an abundance of lakes, rivers, ponds, streams and forests to serve as nature's playgrounds for the avid outdoors person.

And, Jonesboro, ranked by Forbes.com as the 27th "best small place to live" is a nice place to call home.



Formed in 1976 the Sun Belt Conference quickly rose to the greatest heights of collegiate athletics by sending a team to the NCAA Final Four in the league's first year of existence. Fast forward 36 years and the league again finds itself at the pinnacle of collegiate athletics as a member of the 11league alliance of the Bowl Championship Series.

During the 2012-13 season the Sun Belt Conference's membership will consist of Arkansas-Little Rock, Arkansas State, Florida Atlantic, FIU, Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana-Monroe, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, South Alabama, Troy and Western Kentucky University. Ten of the 11 current Sun Belt members play football at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level.

As the conference moves forward to the year 2013, the league will be comprised of 12 members with Arkansas-Little Rock, Arkansas State, Georgia Florida Atlantic, Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana-Monroe, Middle Tennessee, South Alabama, Texas-Arlington, Texas State, Troy and Western Kentucky University. The reformatted league will have 10 football playing members of the 12 total members. The league's new look will feature two evenly matched and geographically logical divisions divided into an East Division and West Division.

Because of its status as a member of the Football Bowl Subdivision, the Sun Belt Conference has a permanent seat on the NCAA's 18-member Board of Directors. As a result, the conference has a crucial voice on some of the most pressing issues in college athletics and will always have a role in the implementation of any future NCAA legislation and quidelines.

The conference continues to utilize television to grow and promote the league and its member institutions. The Sun Belt Conference signed a new multi-year agreement with ESPN, Inc. in 2012 that will result in unprecedented national coverage for the league. Fans of the Sun Belt Conference can look forward to seeing more Sun Belt teams playing on national television on ESPN and ESPN2 and additionally the new ESPN deal will result in more coverage on ESPNU. ESPN will continue to televise the conference's men's basketball championship game for the 32nd straight season in 2013, marking its longest affiliation with any conference in the country.

The conference's regional television partnership with Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast (CSS) and Cox Sports Television (CST) enables live telecasts of Sun Belt events to reach millions of households. The addition of volleyball, baseball and softball to the conference's television package has resulted in more national and regional television exposure for the league than at any time in its history.

Success has been easy to find in recent years as

Since the 2007 football season, the Sun Belt Conference ranks fifth out of the 11 FBS conferences in postseason bowl game winning percentage. In fact, the Sun Belt Conference ranks ahead of noted "Big Six" leagues - the ACC, Pac-12 and the Big Ten. Furthermore, the Sun Belt Conference outpaces its non-automatic qualifying BCS partners in the WAC, Conference USA and the MAC.

The world has taken notice of the Sun Belt Conference as well. Proof of that comes as the league now has two automatic tie-ins to postseason bowl games. The R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl agreement with the Sun Belt Conference ensures that a Sun Belt team will play in that bowl game through 2013 (the league has sent a team to that game every year since the game's inception in 2001). The Sun Belt Conference also recently signed an extension with the GoDaddy.com Bowl, played annually in Mobile, Alabama, that will ensure that a Sun Belt team plays in that bowl game through 2017.

Over 95 percent of Sun Belt Conference teams earned a multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) of over 925 as the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) released its annual APR report recently. The most recent APR scores are based on a multi-year rate that averages scores from the 2007-08, 2008-09, 2009-10 and 2010-11 academic years. The Division I Board of Directors set cut scores of 925 and 900 (out of 1,000) as a threshold for teams to meet or face possible immediate and historical sanctions. In total, 95.2 percent of Sun Belt Conference teams earned a multi-year APR score over 925. Eight institutions had 100 percent of their programs score above the 925 mark, those institutions are: UALR, Denver, Florida Atlantic, Louisiana-Lafayette, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, Troy and Western Kentucky. The league's APR numbers are up compared to a year ago, as Sun Belt Conference institutions improved from 92.4 percent of all programs hitting the 925 thresh-

Prominent Sun Belt alumni include NFL Hall of Fame football player "Mean" Joe Greene (North Texas) former All-Star baseball player Luis Gonzalez (South Alabama), former All-Star baseball player Mike Lowell (2007 MLB World Series MVP, FIU), former member of the United States Senate and House of Representatives John Breaux (Louisiana-Lafayette), country music superstar Tim McGraw (Louisiana-Monroe) and actor Andy Garcia (FIU).

The conference's first 36 years have also produced numerous individual national champions along with Olympic track medalists including Earl Bell, Tom Hill and Al Joyner (Arkansas State), Hollis Conway (Louisiana-Lafayette), and Tayna Lawrence (FIU). Old Dominion's Anne Donovan, who received the Naismith Trophy recognizing the nation's top women's basketball player in 1983, helped the United States win the Olympic gold medal in 1984 and helped the Lady Monarchs capture the national championship in 1985.

INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLET-ICS COMMITTEE

The Intercollegiate Athletics Committee was formed in the spring of 1997.

The Intercollegiate Athletics Committee reviews and makes recommendations on issues involving the welfare of student-athletes, the role of athletics in campus life, and the athletics program's compliance with the uni-

versity, conference, and NCAA regulations; serves as a search advisory committee for key athletics program personnel; reviews the role of existing and potential sports programs; and reviews the athletics budget. The committee reports to the Chancellor.

Membership consists of four students appointed annually by the Student Government Association (one should be a student-athlete); four faculty appointed by the Faculty Senate (staggered two-year terms); one Faculty Athletic Representative appointed by the Chancellor (two-year term); one executive staff member appointed by the Chancellor (two-year term); the Dean of University College; two staff members appointed by the Staff Senate (staggered two-year terms); Student Government Association and Student Activities Board presidents; and representatives from the following external organizations: Alumni Association, Red Wolf Club, Letterman's Club, and the Jonesboro Regional Chamber of Commerce ASU Committee. The Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and the Senior Woman Athletic Administrator serve as ex-officio, nonvoting members. The chancellor appoints a chair at the beginning of each academic year.

2012 ARKANSAS STATE FOOTBALL



Dr. Tim Hudson took office as the second chancellor of Arkansas State University in Jonesboro on May 1, 2012. He was appointed by Dr. Charles W. Welch, president of the Arkansas State University System, following a national search process.

Most recently Dr. Hudson was vice chancellor of the Texas Tech University System, after serving as special assistant to the chancellor for International Programs and Initiatives at the University of Houston System. From 2004 until 2010 he was president of the University of Houston-Victoria, following a two-decade career as a professor of economic development, program director, founding dean of the College of International and Continuing Education, and provost at the University Southern Mississippi. Earlier in his career he was an analyst for the Bureau of Intelligence and Research in the U.S. Department of State.

At Arkansas State University he leads the campus executive team as the institution strives for progressive excellence in academics, research, fiscal management and student life.

Hudson earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in history and Latin American studies and a Master of Arts in geography from the University of Southern Mississippi. His PhD in geography is from Clark University in Worcester, Mass. He has written numerous scholarly works for national and international publications; a recent co-authored book focuses on multinational corporation subsidiaries in China (Chandos, Cambridge).

During his tenure as president of the University of Houston–Victoria, the campus experienced tremendous growth and development including: doubling enrollment and the number of fulltime faculty; exceeding external fundraising goals for five consecutive years; founding a new school of nursing and health professions, which earned full national accreditation on its initial petition; achieving AACSB International accreditation; and ranking first in Texas on the student satisfaction portion of the 2010 National Survey of Student Engagement.

Hudson is the recipient of two Fulbright Fellowships (Germany and Mexico), and an ITT International Fellowship to study in Colombia, South America. He also has developed and led more than 30 programs for U.S. students to study abroad and was awarded an honorary doctorate by London Guildhall University for his contributions to global literacy.

Hudson is married to Dr. Deidra "Dee Dee" Ransburgh Hudson, who holds a Master of Science in speech pathology from the University of Tennessee and a PhD degree in educational leadership from the University of Southern Mississippi. The Hudsons and their children, Gianna Grace, 14, and twins Daisy and Nathaniel, 10, will live in the ASU chancellor's residence on Nettleton Avenue in Jonesboro.



Dr. Dean Lee is in his 11th year as Director of Athletics at Arkansas State University. He continues to restore the old and build new tradition at A-State while leading the Red Wolves to unprecedented levels of success.

The 2008 AAFF's Outstanding Athletic Director, Lee serves on the NCAA Men's Basketball Issues Committee, the BCS Athletic Directors Advisory Committee and the Division 1A Athletic Directors Association Board

of Trustees. He was recently named chair of the NCAA Women's Bowling Committee after spending the previous two years on the committee's Board of Director's. Lee was named chair of the Sun Belt Conference Athletic Director's Committee as well, and he is currently serving as a member of the SBC Executive Committee. Lee is associated with 27 national championships, nine bowl teams, five Final Fours and four national runners-up.

He has guided the athletic department to annual success academically and competitively, and ASU athletics is once again enjoying growth through a number of unique accomplishments and projects.

For instance, ASU took third place in the 2010-11 Bubas Cup standings, the Sun Belt Conference all-sports award, for its best results in over a decade. This came on the heels of a fourth-place finish the previous year, which marked a six-place jump in the standings.

The Red Wolves continue to upgrade their facilities with a new baseball scoreboard, renovations to the Charles Luter Family Academic Success Center and installation of a new state-of-the art GEO Surfaces turf inside ASU Stadium. A-State also recently made first-class renovations to the men's and women's basketball and volleyball locker rooms and their media/film room in the Convocation Center. Under Lee's direction, 206 field-level seats and new party boxes available for corporate events have been added to Tomlinson Stadium, and the Convocation Center weight room underwent major renovations that included new weights and cardio equipment.

The ASU Athletic Department has brought in a number of significant donations under Lee's leadership. ASU received the largest single donation in its history, a \$400,000 gift from Charles Luter in 2008. Included among some of the other major donations was a \$150,000 contribution from ASU alumnus and former football letterman Steve Bryant. The athletic department also received a \$250,000 donation from alumni and long-time supporters Scott and Kay Dawson. The \$250,000 donation matched the second largest gift in the department's history and was used to improve the academic environment for all student-athletes.

Under Lee's direction, the ASU athletic department enjoyed another significant year in 2011-12. Not only did ASU enjoyed some of the most exciting moments ever on the fields, courts, and tracks, but also in the arenas of academics, donor and alumni involvement, community service and achievement.

Among the many athletic accomplishments attained last year, the women's bowling team made its fifth straight appearance in the NCAA Championships. The Red Wolves also claimed the Sun Belt Conference football championship and appeared in the GoDaddy.com Bowl, and Lee was instrumental in recruiting one of the nation's hottest and most well-respected coaches in the nation in Gus Malzahn. The volleyball team won the West Division title, and the year prior the men's basketball team also claimed the league's West Division championship.

The football program has seen its annual season attendance rise during Lee's tenure, and last year was no exception as the Red Wolves averaged a school-record 21,257 fans per game.

Academically, the Red Wolves placed 183 members on a recent Athletic Director's Honor Roll, representing a school-record 60 percent of all student-athletes. One in four

student-athletes are achieving a 3.5 GPA and one in eight hold a 4.0. Additionally, the most recent overall GPA for all student-athletes was a school-record 3.016.

The Red Wolf Club, the major fundraising arm of ASU Athletics, has posted record years three of the last four years in annual giving and has seen its membership grow to an all-time high during Lee's time. Corporate giving is also at an all-time high and continues to increase each year.

Lee was also responsible for arranging a public speaking engagement on the ASU campus with former Boise State Athletic Director and 2011 Bobby Dodd Division 1A Athletic Director of the Year Gene Bleymaier, who shared his experiences at Boise State and how they relate to Arkansas State moving its program in the same direction.

Those are just a few of the many ways the ASU athletic department has continued to develop under Lee, who is always looking for new and creative ways to take the Red Wolves athletic program to the next level while maintaining its main focus on academics, competitive performance and a well-rounded environment for student-athletes.

Dr. Lee became ASU's 10th Director of Athletics July 9, 2002. It wasn't long before the department began to experience important and progressive changes which were capped by an unprecedented "State of A-State" address in the spring of 2004.

When he concluded the address to a packed house, there was no mistaking that he is committed to building a successful program at ASU.

Lee's vision for ASU Athletics was also revealed in a 2008 video called "Inside A-State Athletics", which focused on the Red Wolves athletic programs and how the athletic department plans to meet challenges in the future. A-State released a second "Inside A-State Athletics" video featuring Lee in 2009 that gave an in-depth look at facilities and the progress that is being made in that area.

Lee was also a key figure in the recruitment and hiring of John Brady, who was just two years removed from an NCAA Final Four appearance and recently named the 2009-10 Sun Belt Conference Men's Basketball Coach of the Year.

In a very short time, he has orchestrated sellout and capacity crowds, overseen the expansion and growth of ASU's athletic facilities, and provided sound leadership to both the athletic staff and population of student-athletes.

Lee came to ASU from Oklahoma State University, where he was the Associate Director of Athletics for External Operations.

His administrative experience at two NCAA Division I-A universities, OSU and the University of Arkansas, and his achievements in mobilizing financial support make him well-suited for Arkansas State University and Northeast Arkansas. While at the University of Arkansas, Lee served as the Vice President of the Razorback Foundation.

In addition, Dr. Lee's experience as athletic director at Arkansas Tech University and his familiarity with ASU and the state of Arkansas help him feel right at home.

He earned his bachelor's degree in 1979 and master's in education at Henderson State University, then completed his doctor of education degree at the University of Arkansas in 1989. In 2009, Lee was chosen as a Distinguished Alumni of Henderson State University, the highest honor Henderson State bestows.

Although born in Tulsa, Okla., Lee competed in high school sports in Berryville, Arkansas, and was selected to play in the all-Star basketball and football games in 1975.

He also played basketball, baseball and tennis at Henderson State, where he later served as an assistant coach. He played in two national championship games as a member of Henderson State's basketball team. He was head basketball coach at Malvern High School early in his career.

Dean and wife Reba are the parents of two daughters, Diamond Olivia (17) and Anna Pearl (15).
