STORYLINE

KANSAS STATE hosts NEBRASKA in a battle of longstanding rivals in the Big 12 Conference Northern Division...

K-State comes into the game just one game behind Colorado in the Big 12 Conference North Division... The Wildcats' win last weekend over Iowa State moved K-State past the Cyclones alone into second in the division...

The Buffaloes hold a tie-breaker edge over the Wildcats by virtue of their 35-31 win in Boulder in early October in terms of determining the North representative to the conference title game... Still, should Colorado lose either at home to Iowa State or in two weeks at Nebraska, the Wildcats could earn a co-championship in the division...

K-State has either won or tied for the division title in three of the last four seasons...

The Wildcats play at KSU Stadium for a school-record eighth time in the 2002 season... The 'Cats are 6-1 at home this year, with the lone loss coming at current-No. 3 Texas...

Kansas State was ranked 11th in this week's ESPN/USA Today coaches' poll, its highest ranking of the season... The

Wildcats moved up one spot after their 58-7 win over Iowa State last Saturday on national television...

K-State was also ranked 11th in the Associated Press poll this week, also a season-best...

Kansas State reached bowl-eligible status with last week's win over Kansas... K-State is one of only seven schools to appear in a bowl game each of the last nine years...

The group includes Nebraska (33 straight), Michigan (27), Florida State (20), Tennessee (13), Florida (11) and Virginia Tech (9)...

With two games left in the regular season, K-State still has a chance at achieving a number of milestones in 2002...

K-State is within reach of only the seventh season in school history with at least 10 wins... In the 106 previous years of football at Kansas State, the Wildcats have had at least 10 wins in a season in 1910 (10-1), 1995 (10-2), 1997 (11-1), 1998 (11-2), 1999 (11-1) and 2000 (11-3).

The Wildcats have hit the nine-win mark nine times in school history, including eight of the last nine seasons.

Kansas State's two losses are by a combined seven points (35-31 at Colorado and 17-14 vs. Texas).

SPROLES ROLLS

RB DARREN SPROLES reached some milestones and placed his name in the record books during the Iowa State game...

Sproles became the SIXTH WILDCAT EVER TO REACH 1,000 RUSHING YARDS IN A SEASON after gaining 103 yards in 18 carries against the Cyclones...

He also became the fastest ever to reach 1,000 yards, hitting the mark on his 159th carry of the season...

Sproles matched Isaac Jackson's six-game string of 100-yard outings set in 1973, matching the longest such streak in school history...

Jackson is the only other K-State player ever to have more than three straight 100-yard games...

Sproles also tied the record of seven 100-yard games in a season, set last year by Josh Scobey...

Over the last five games, Sproles has 724 yards on 112 carries (6.46 per carry and 103.4 per game), with nine touchdowns...

Now with 1,072 yards for the season, Sproles is fifth on the K-State single-season rushing list...

Earlier this year, he became the 21st Wildcat in school history and the second-fastest to 1,000 career yards, when he reached the milestone in his 14th game at K-State... Only Cornelius Davis, who needed just 10 games to hit the mark in 1966, reached 1,000 career yards faster...

He now ranks 27th in the nation in rushing at 107.2 yards per game... On the list of NCAA rushers, Sproles' 6.31 per-carry average ranks fourth among players with at least 170 attempts.

MORE SPROLES

That per-carry average is significantly higher than the school record of 5.34 set by Eric Hickson in 1998...

Against Colorado, Sproles picked up 80 yards on a touchdown run with 7:32 left in the third quarter, his longest run from scrimmage as a Wildcat and K-State's longest run since the 71-yard TD scamper by QB ELL ROBERSON in the second quarter vs. Colorado...

Since 1969 when records were kept on the longest K-State plays from scrimmage, Sproles' 80-yard run ranks fourth on the list, while Roberson's 71-yarder is eighth.

Sproles' three touchdowns against Colorado moved him into the team lead in scoring... Sproles now has 74 points, ranking 50th in the nation in scoring... He is also the top-scoring sophomore in school history, surpassing the 64 points of Martin Gramatica in 1995...

Sproles ranks 30th in all-purpose yards (133.2 ypg) and 56th in punt-return average (10.3 avg)...

With his 1,332 all-purpose yards, Sproles has nearly double the figure of CB TERENCE NEWMAN, who has 670... Sproles has exactly 200 yards in punt and kick return yardage, and also has 60 yards on seven pass receptions this year...

Sproles also became the top sophomore in terms of rushing yards against Iowa State, passing Cornelius Davis, who had 1,028 in 1966.

ROBERSON RUSHING

QB ELL ROBERSON tied a career-high with three rushing touchdowns against Kansas, matching the three he had in last season's game at Oklahoma...

He had two more last weekend against Iowa State, giving him 19 for his career, tying him for eighth on that list...

With 670 yards this season, he has passed the 643 he had a year ago... The single-season record for rushing yards by a QB is 748 by Michael Bishop in 1998...

Roberson is now averaging 74.4 rushing yards per game this season, ranking 72nd this week on the NCAA list, but sixth among QBs...

Roberson is 64th in the NCAA this week in individual total offense, averaging 188.8 yards per game.

MORE ROBERSON

Roberson's 100-yard game at Colorado was his first in 2002 and the fifth of his career... The five are the most in a career by a Wildcat QB, surpassing Bishop's four in 1997 and 1998... Roberson owns five of the top eight rushing games ever by a Wildcat QB...

Against Colorado, he passed the 1,000-yard mark in career rushing yards, becoming only the 20th Wildcat and the second K-State QB to hit that mark...

Roberson's 1,481 rushing yards rank 10th on the career list, and he is now the top rushing QB in Wildcat history, passing Michael Bishop, who is 13th with 1,314...

Roberson had a career-high 178 yards rushing against Colorado, the best mark by a Wildcat in 2002... Roberson's 178 yards rank second on the top rushing games by a K-State QB, listed behind only Bishop's 196 yards against Missouri in 1997...

The double 100-yard game vs. Colorado (Darren Sproles had 121 yards) was the third in the last two seasons for Kansas State, as Roberson joined Josh Scobey over 100 yards against USC and Iowa State during the 2001 season... Prior to the last two years, though, K-State accomplished the feat only four times in school history...

Now with 3,484 total offense yards, Roberson has become only the ninth Wildcat in school history to go over the 3,000-yard mark in his career... He ranks eighth on the K-State list...

He moved past current K-State assistant coach MATT MILLER and Dan Manucci on the total offense list with his effort at Colorado...

His current pass efficiency rating of 133.8 would rank 30th in the nation should he have enough attempts to qualify for the national list... He is currently 14 attempts below the 15 per game he needs to make the NCAA pass efficiency list.

MORE RUSHING

K-STATE CURRENTLY LEADS THE NATION WITH 41 RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS... Boise State is a distant second with 34, while Air Force and West Virginia are the only other teams in the nation with more than 30...

The Wildcats' next rushing touchdown will set a team record for the most in a season... K-State had 42 each in 2000 (13 games) and 1998 (12 games)... The school record for an 11-game season is 38...

The Wildcats are fifth this week in rushing offense at 253.1 yards per game...

FB AYO SABA had as efficient a collegiate debut as possible, as the first three carries of his college career were each 2-yard touchdowns (two vs. Western Kentucky, one vs. Louisiana-Monroe).

Saba had 11 carries for 46 yards against Eastern Illinois, getting career-highs in carries and yards but dropping his touchdowns-per-carry average below 100 percent... Still, after scoring in each of the last three games and four of the last five, Saba has seven touchdowns in only 29 carries as a redshirt freshman...

There were 13 Wildcats who got at least one carry against Louisiana-Monroe... LANCE KRAMER, PAUL O'NEIL and MARQUES JACKSON had their first career carry against the Indians, while LARRY LEWIS had his second.

SUPERVISION

Wildcat Head Coach BILL SNYDER (William Jewell '62) is 113-51-1 (.686) in his 14th season at Kansas State... His 113 victories are nearly triple the man in second place on the all-time coaching victories list at Kansas State (Mike Ahearn had 39 wins from 1905-10)...

Snyder has directed one of the most spectacular turnarounds in college football history, as before his arrival, it took K-State 47 seasons (1942-1988) to total 114 wins...

The 12 head coaches prior to Snyder's arrival in Manhattan combined to win 115 games from 1945-1988...

Snyder is 67-18 the past seven seasons, trailing only Bobby Bowden of Florida State (70) in victories over that stretch... Snyder's six-year mark of 58-15 ranks third in the number of victories among coaches in Division I-A over that span...

The 99 victories over his first 12 seasons ranked 13th all-time among the best career starts in the NCAA...

By achieving his 100th career victory in a win at USC in 2001, he matched the 14th-fastest trip to the century mark in the history of college football...

Snyder opened the 2002 season in 11th place in winning percentage among active NCAA Division I-A coaches who have coached at least five years... In terms of coaching victories, Snyder currently ranks 13th...

Snyder won National Coach of the Year honors in 1991, 1994 and 1998...

Snyder is 75-14-1 (.838) in games at KSU Stadium... His Wildcat teams are 63-39-1 in all league games and 41-13 in Big 12 games...

He is 2-11 against Nebraska, including 2-3 in Manhattan...

Snyder's teams are 32-12 in November, 30-12 in conference games in November and 19-2 in home games during the month... Snyder's Wildcats have won 11 straight November home games, with the last loss being a 27-17 defeat in the regular-season finale on 11/18/95... His only other home loss in November came to Colorado in 1989, his first season as the K-State head coach...

Nebraska Head Coach FRANK SOLICH (Nebraska '66) is 49-13 in his fifth season as head coach at his alma mater... He is 2-2 against Kansas State and 0-2 in games played in Manhattan.

EVEN MORE RUSHING

Five different Wildcats had at least one rushing TD against ULM... Over the first three games, eight different K-State players had at least one rushing touchdown...

RB DANIEL DAVIS scored his first touchdown as a Wildcat against Eastern Illinois... Davis had a combined 123 yards in back-to-back outings against ULM and EIU...

Owing in no small measure to the "Nick, Vic and Thick" formation that puts fullbacks NICK HOHEISEL, VICTOR MANN and AYO SABA in the backfield at the same time, Hoheisel has made the most of his two rushes in 2002... He had a 3-yard touchdown against Louisiana-Monroe and scored against Texas on a 2-yard dive.

SERIES

This will be the 87th meeting between Nebraska and Kansas State on the football field... K-State trails in the series, 12-72-2, after the schools split the last four games in the series.

Kansas State is 5-32-2 in games played in Manhattan, and the Wildcats have won the last two meetings at KSU Stadium... K-State won 40-30 in 1998 to end a 29-game series win streak the Huskers held from 1969-98... The last Husker win in Manhattan was a 39-3 victory on Oct. 5, 1996...

The last time the Huskers were unranked coming into the Kansas State game, the Wildcats won 12-0 in Lincoln on Nov. 9, 1968... That shutout stands as the only shutout of Nebraska in Memorial Stadium in the last 37 years... At no time in the history of the series has K-State been

ranked and the Huskers been unranked when the two teams met...

Last season, Dahrran Diedrick led Nebraska with 108 yards on 24 carries, including a 2-yard touchdown run to help the Huskers erase a halftime deficit and earn a 31-21 victory in Lincoln...

Kansas State led 14-13 at halftime, getting a 32-yard touchdown pass from Ell Roberson to Aaron Lockett with six seconds left in the first half to take the lead... But the Huskers took the second-half kickoff 77 yards in 15 plays, eating up nearly half of the third quarter to regain the advantage...

Later in the quarter, DeJuan Groce scored on a 60-yard punt return to put Nebraska ahead 28-14...

The Wildcats also got touchdowns in the game from Joe Hall and Roberson, who rushed for 119 yards against the Huskers.

MORE THAN 1,000 GAMES

K-State stands 412-561-41 in its 107th football season...

More than a quarter of the Wildcats' wins (112) have occurred in the last 14 seasons under Head Coach BILL SNYDER...

The loss in the 2001 Insight.com Bowl ended an eight-year streak of winning seasons, longest at K-State in 88 years (K-State had eight winning seasons from 1905 through 1912)...

Of the 34 winning seasons in 106 years of football at the school, nine have come in the last 11 years.

PASSING

After four weeks of leading the NCAA in pass efficiency rating, Kansas State has fallen to 11th nationally... Still, the Wildcats' rating of 145.3 is significantly higher than the 92.1 rating K-State had to finish the 2001 regular season...

Over the past two weeks, K-State has thrown only five incompletions in each game...

Kansas State went four games before suffering an interception this season... The Wildcats were the last school at Division I-A to suffer a pick in 2002... Only seven schools have thrown fewer than the five K-State has suffered this season...

CATCHING

WR TACO WALLACE had a career-high seven catches last week against Iowa State, the most by a Wildcat this season...

Wallace had four catches for 101 yards against Oklahoma State... It was Wallace's first 100-yard game of his Wildcat career and is tops by a K-State player in 2002... The senior has the team lead in receptions (34) and receiving yards (571)...

Wallace has led or tied for the team lead in catches in eight of K-State's 10 games so far this year...

One of the games Wallace failed to lead the team was the Wildcats' outing against Texas... WR JAMES TERRY had four catches for 80 yards to lead the 'Cats against the Longhorns... Terry has five touchdowns on his 18 catches this season...

The 571 receiving yards by Wallace have already surpassed the 357 that Aaron Lockett had in leading K-State a year ago...

Four different Wildcats have a touch-down catch this season, including CB **TERENCE NEWMAN**, whose 51-yard touch-down against Louisiana-Monroe remains his only catch of the season,

A NICE TOUCH

In a stretch of 6:35 against Louisiana-Monroe, Kansas State scored five straight times it touched the ball late in the first quarter and early in the second...

- ▶ Marc Dunn 1-yd TD run with 4:02 left in 1st qtr, Wildcats lead 14-0
- ▶ Marc Dunn 51-yd TDpass to Terence Newman with 1:26 left in 1st qtr, Wildcats lead 21-0
- ▶ Terence Newman 40-yard punt return for TD with 0:00 left in 1st qtr, Wildcats lead 28-0
- ▶ Danny Morris 16-yd blocked punt return for TD with 13:28 left in 2nd qtr, Wildcats lead 34-0
- ▶ Ayo Saba 2-yd TDrun with 12:27 left in 2nd qtr, Wildcats lead 40-0

STRANGE START

The first half of the Eastern Illinois game unfolded in an interesting manner. K-State's offense was kept off the field for the first 12:54 of the first quarter, but the Wildcats were still able to grab and maintain a lead...

- ▶ Wildcats hold Panthers to a three-and-out, Rashad Washington then blocks a punt that is covered by Danny Morris in the end zone.
- ▶ The Wildcats line up in a spread set for the two-point conversion and holder Travis Brown finds Travon Magee with a pass for a two-pointer.
- ▶ ElUgoes 80 yards in 11 plays for the first TD against the Wildcats in 2002, but misses the two-point try.
- ▶ K-State's Terence Newman returns the ensuing kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown and the extra-point kick makes it K-State 15-6 with 7:00 left.
- ▶ Panthers repeat the 11-play, 80-yard drive scenario to score a touchdown and the extra-point kick makes it 15-13 with 2:13 remaining.
- ▶ Wildcats' offense finally takes the field with 2:06 left. K-State starts a 60-yard, 12-play drive to go ahead 22-13.
- ▶ ElUthrows an incomplete pass on a fake punt, setting up Marc Dunn's 19-yard TD pass to Thomas Hill on the next play for a 29-13 Wildcat lead.
- ▶ Late in the quarter, Darren Sproles goes 54 yards for a TD, capping a 47-second drive, and Dunn hits Taco Wallace on a 58-yard TD pass for a 1-play, 8-second drive for a 43-13 halftime lead.
- ▶ K-State led by 30 points at the break despite being outgained, 252-170, trailing in first downs, 14-7, and facing a time of possession disadvantage, 22:16-7:44.

STREAKS

Kansas State has scored at least one rushing touchdown in each of the last 25 regular-season games, including the 2000 Big 12 Championship... In the 27 games since 10/28/2000, K-State missed scoring on the ground only in the 2001 Insight.com Bowl against Syracuse...

K-State has forced a turnover in each of the last 15 games, including the 2001 Insight.com Bowl... The last time the Wildcat defense failed to create a turnover was vs. Kansas on 10/27/2001...

The win over USC extended a pair of streaks... Kansas State has a 38-game home winning streak against non-conference opponents... The last loss to a non-league foe at KSU Stadium came against Northern Illinois, 37-20, on 9/23/89...

Against all non-conference opponents home or away in the regular season, K-State has won 35 straight games... The last loss was a 28-16 defeat at Utah State on 10/17/92...

The 'Cats have held the time of possession advantage in each of the last five games...

K-State has rushed for more yards than its opponent in each of the last 10 games (last miss was 2001 Insight.com Bowl).

SCORING

Kansas State has moved up to second in the nation in scoring offense, with its average of 46.1 points per game trailing only Boise State's 47.9...

The Wildcats' 34.7 average margin of victory leads the nation, despite being six games into the eight-game Big 12 Conference schedule and playing three ranked teams this season...

Other schools in the top five in terms of scoring margin are Boise State (27.3), Miami, Fla. (25.1), Oklahoma (23.1) and Iowa (20.5)...

Kansas State (62) and Boise State (64) are the only schools in the nation to have scored more than 60 touchdowns to this point in the season...

In each of the past two weeks, K-State has had the largest margin of victory ever in its series against Kansas (64-0) and Iowa State (58-7)... In each case, the Wildcats did not score a point in the fourth quarter...

The Wildcats' total of 461 points are more than in any season other than 1998 (610 in 13 games) and 2000 (549 in 14 games)... The school record for points per game in a regular season is the 48.0 posted by the 1998 team...

In only five full seasons, including bowl games, has K-State scored 400 points in a single year... All of those occurrences have come since 1995...

The 64 points against the Jayhawks marked the third time this season K-State has hit the 60-point mark... Only in 1998 did the 'Cats have three 60-point games (66-0 vs. Indiana State, 73-7 vs. Northern Illinois, 62-7 vs. Louisiana-Monroe)...

K-State is the only team in Division I-A to have three 60-point games this year... Boise State, with two, is the only other I-A team to hit the 60-point mark more than once this year... K-State has hit the 40-point mark seven times in 10 games...

There have been 23 games in which I-A teams have scored at least 60 points this season... Of the 33 times nationally teams have scored at least 58 points in a game, four of those occurrences are by the 'Cats...

Of K-State's 62 touchdowns, 10 have come either on special teams or on defense...

The NCAA combines blocked punt and punt returns into one statistical category, and only Kentucky, Louisville, Maryland and Nebraska have more than the Wildcats' three punt returns for TDs so far...

Twenty different K-State players have scored this season, with 17 different players having scored touchdowns... Those marks surpass the top marks in school history in those categories, as 19 players scored and 16 had TDs when the 'Cats scored 457 points in 1999...

The 68-point margin of victory over Louisiana-Monroe ranked second behind a 76-0 win over Ball State in 2000...

FB AYO SABA, WR JAMES TERRY and WR/CB TERENCE NEWMAN scored TDs on either their first career carry or their first career reception as Wildcats...

PK JOE RHEEM has scored 37 points by kicking in the last three games... In those games, he is a combined 6-for-7 in field goals and 19-for-20 in extra-point kicks...

K-State is the only team in the nation with three players among the top 65 in individual scoring (Rheem 45th, Sproles 50th, Ell Roberson 62nd).

INTERCEPTIONS

FS BOBBY WALKER returned two interceptions for touchdowns in a span of 23 seconds and three plays against Iowa State... It was the first time in K-State history a player had returned a pair of picks for touchdowns in a single game...

Walker now has three interception returns for scores in 2000, matching both the single-season and career school records posted by Brad Lambert in his freshman season of 1984... Waker had a 73-yarder for a score in the opener against Western Kentucky...

Now with 177 yards in returns, Walker also has the school record in that category, surpassing the 154 that Jaime Mendez had on his six interceptions in 1990... Walker's 177 yards leads the nation this week and his three returns for TDs is tied with Hawaii's Hyrum Peters for the best in Division I-A...

Walker now has five interceptions on the season, taking over the team lead from CB TERENCE NEWMAN, who has four... Walker also had a pick against Kansas...

Newman has four interceptions this season and nine in his career... He moved into a tie for ninth on the career interceptions list with that pick...

K-State has at least one interception in 49 of the last 55 games and in 58 of the last 65 outings (including bowl games)...

The Wildcats now have had 26 interceptions in their last 15 games, a string dating back to last season and including the Insight.com Bowl game against Syracuse... K-State has grabbed a dozen opposing passes in the last five games combined...

Overall, the 'Cats have had 70 take-aways in the last 28 games, including 22 in the last five weeks (12 interceptions, 10 fumbles) and 13 in the last two weeks (7 vs. Kansas, 6 vs. Iowa State)...

K-State snapped a two-game drought without an interception with four against Oklahoma State... LB BRYAN HICKMAN had a pair of picks, becoming the first Wildcat this season with two in a single game...

The last K-State player to accomplish that feat was current Houston Texan DeMarcus Faggins, who had two interceptions at Texas Tech on 10/13/01...

Now with 18 interceptions, K-State

ranks T3th nationally this week among Division I teams in picks...

Only San Jose State (20 in 11 games) and Arizona State (19 in 11 games) have more interceptions than K-State this season.

"TO THE HOUSE"

FS JESSE TETUAN had the Wildcats' first of two interceptions against Baylor, returning his pick 34 yards for a touchdown... It was the first collegiate touchdown for Tetuan...

Three Wildcats have returned interceptions for touchdowns this season – SS RASHAD WASHINGTON went 40 yards for a score against Eastern Illinois...

The Wildcats' five interception returns for touchdowns lead the nation (San Jose State, Hawaii have four)...

The five interception returns for TDs tied the team record set in 1999...

Kansas State has now had at least one interception returned for a touchdown in each of the last eight seasons... The last time K-State failed to take one "to the house" was in 1993...

Walker's 73-yard pick against Western Kentucky was the 4th-longest in school history and the longest in six seasons... Mario Smith had the proverbial record-never-to-be-broken 100-yard interception return for a TD against Missouri in 1996... John Welch (90 yards, 1984) and C.J. Masters (80 yards, 1992) have had longer returns.

SHUTOUTS

Kansas State's 64-0 shutout of Kansas was the second of the season for the Wildcats and the 10th by the 'Cats since the inception of the Big 12 Conference... The Wildcats have more shutouts in the seven-year history of the league than any other school...

K-STATE HAS POSTED A SHUTOUT IN EACH OF THE LAST NINE SEASONS... The last season in which the Wildcats failed to blank an opponent was 1993... In those nine years, Kansas State has posted 13 shutouts...

THE SHUTOUT ON THE ROAD WAS K-STATE'S FIRST SINCE BLANKING TAMPA, 17-0, ON 9/29/73.

BARNETT STARTS

K-State senior OT THOMAS BARNETT is among the nation's leaders in the number of starts he's had in his career... The start against Iowa State was Barnett's 40th in his Wildcat career (6 in 1998, 10 in 1999, 14 in 2000 and 10 in 2002).

HELLO, NEWMAN

In addition to being a preseason candidate for the Thorpe Award, the defending Big 12 Conference indoor track champion at 60 meters and the reigning Big 12 100-meter champion outdoors, CB TERENCE NEWMAN is making his presence felt as one of the most versatile threats in all of college football...

The senior captain from Salina, Kan., has scored on a 51-yard pass reception on offense against Western Kentucky, a 40-yard punt return against Louisiana-Monroe, a 95-yard kickoff return against EIU and a 90-yard defensive extra-point on a blocked-kick return against USC...

He is only the third Wildcat in history to have scored on both a kickoff and punt return and only the second to have accomplish that feat in the same season... Mack Herron scored on a punt and kickoff return in 1968, while Aaron Lockett hit the end zone on both types of returns in his career...

Newman now has 670 all-purpose yards this season, second on the team to RB DARREN SPROLES... He has earned those yards on one pass reception, four interceptions, 10 kick returns and 17 punt returns... As a result, he is averaging 20.9 yards per touch of the ball...

Newman's 35.4 kick-return average would currently rank first in the NCAA if Newman had the requisite 1.2 returns per game to qualify... He is two attempts short of having enough to be listed...

Newman is averaging 27.2 yards per kick return in his 29 career returns... Should that average hold up, it would snap the school record 26.2 average set by Mack Herron in 1968-69...

Newman is 7th this week on the NCAA punt-return list with a 15.7 average... RB DARREN SPROLES is 56th on the punt-return list at 10.3.

DEFENSIVE EXTRA-POINTS

K-State CB TERENCE NEWMAN scooped up a blocked extra-point during the USC game and returned it 90 yards for a defensive extra-point that helped the Wildcats thwart a Trojans' rally...

It was the third DXP scored by the Wildcats since the rule was put in place by the NCAA prior to the 1988 season...

Newman's defensive extra-point against

USC was the Wildcats' first since Chris Canty went 98 yards with an interception vs. Oklahoma in 1994...

Against Oklahoma State, Darrent Williams picked up a blocked extra-point kick and went 85 yards to give the Cowboys two points... It was the first DXP allowed by K-State.

'TNT' ON DEE

K-State's linebacking trio of JOSH BUHL, TERRY PIERCE and BRYAN HICKMAN have been outstanding throughout the season... With Buhl and Hickman hailing from Mesquite and Pierce being from Fort Worth, local media have dubbed the trio "Three Nasty Texans"...

Buhl was credited with a 7-5-12 tackle chart against Iowa State after review of films by coaches on Sunday... It was the eighth time in 10 games he has either led or tied for the team lead in tackles in a game...

It was also Buhl's seventh double-figure game of the year...

Buhl led K-State with 17 tackles against Colorado, the most by a Wildcat this season... Buhl now leads the team in tackles (117), solo tackles (69) and assists (48)... He is the first Wildcat since Monty Beisel (102 in 2000) to reach the 100-tackle mark in a season and only the second in the last five years... His 117 are the most since Kirby Hocutt led the 'Cats with 135 in 1993...

Pierce has five double-figure games, including back-to-back games against Texas and Baylor... Pierce's dozen against Texas matched his season-high...

Hickman had a career-high 11 tackles against Iowa State, his third double-figure game of 2002... He also had two interceptions, broke up two other passes and had a 15-yard sack when he forced the Cowboys into an intentional grounding penalty...

Buhl, Pierce and Hickman are the only Wildcats to have double-figure tackle games in 2002.

SCHOOL RECORD

K-State held Baylor to a net minus-37 yards rushing, setting a Wildcat record for fewest yards allowed in a game... Previously, K-State forced Texas A&M to a minus-35 net on 10/18/97... It was the sixth time in school history the 'Cats held an opponent to negative net yards rushing...

DE ANDREW SHULL was credited with three after coaches' review of the Baylor film...

It was the second time this season that Shull had more than one sack in a game... He had a pair against Louisiana-Monroe... Shull leads the Wildcats with 8.5 sacks, placing ninth on the season sacks chart.

Kansas finished with 41 yards rushing, the fifth Wildcat opponent this season to be held to less than 50 net yards rushing... K-State is now allowing 72.5 yards per game

on the ground this season, fifth in the nation... The 'Cats have held their last five opponents to a net 161 yards rushing combined.

STINGY WITH SCORES

The Wildcats moved up to first in the nation in scoring defense after the shutout of Kansas and the seven points allowed to Iowa State, as their scoring average fell to 11.4 points per game... K-State has allowed the fewest points in the nation at 114 through 10 games... North Texas has given up 126 points in 10 games...

Big 12 Conference teams also rank 4th (Texas) and 6th (Oklahoma) nationally in scoring defense this week...

Kansas State ranks 2nd in scoring offense and 1st in scoring defense... Only Oklahoma (6th in defense, 8th in offense) ranks on the top 10 on both those lists...

Only North Texas and Southern Miss (nine games) have allowed fewer than the 14 touchdowns given up by the Wildcats this season...

Of the 15 touchdowns allowed this season, five have come in the first quarter, five in the second period, three in the third quarter and two in the fourth quarter...

K-State has not allowed a touchdown in the fourth quarter over the past six games.
