ISU 1-3 HEADING TO NEBRASKA

Iowa State, which held a 35-24 lead at Toledo with 5:25 left in the game but suffered a 36-35 loss on three plays (KO Return TD/fumbled punt snap for TD and blocked FG attempt), opens Big 12 Conference play at No. 25/22 Nebraska Saturday ... Iowa State quarterback Bret Meyer, who completed 24-of-33 passes for 251 yards and three TDs with an interception against the Rockets will make a nation-leading 41st straight start for the Cyclones ... Iowa State took a 20-17 double overtime loss in Lincoln's Memorial Stadium in 2005 ... Meyer, who was sacked 105 times in his first three seasons has only been sacked three times this fall ... Meyer is spreading out the passing wealth ... nine different players caught passes in the Toledo game ... there has been significant improvement in Iowa State's defense, which is allowing only 305 total yards per game after allowing 392.2 yards per game last season.

NEBRASKA IS RANKED 25/22

Nebraska, ranked 25/22 brings a 3-1 record into this week's Big 12 opener ... the Huskers are coming off a 41-40 shootout victory over Ball State ... Nebraska outgained Ball State, 610-552 as Husker QB Sam Keller hit on 29-of-37 passes for 438 yards and three TDs ... Ball State had two opportunities to take the lead in the final 22 seconds, one when an almost sure TD pass was dropped, the other when a long field-goal attempt failed ... Nebraska opened the season with a 52-10 win over Nevada ... three weeks ago, the Huskers beat a strong Wake Forest team, 20-17, on the road before falling to USC, 49-31, in Lincoln, Neb.

ISU QB Bret Meyer hit on 19-of-39 passes for 262 yards with a TD and an interception but two other scoring tosses, were called back, turning those drives into clock sappers. The biggest play of the game was a 27-yard TD pass from Zac Taylor to Maurice Purify with three seconds left in the first half for a 21-7 Husker halftime lead.

STAT OF THE WEEK

41 Iowa State QB Bret Meyer makes his nation-leading 41st straight start. Running an NCAA active best 1,613 career plays, Meyer has been incredibly durable. His 8,957 career total yards are second only to Hawaii's Colt Brennan (11,666) among active players.

THE TOP 15 STORY LINES

1. WHEN IOWA STATE HEAD COACH GENE CHIZIK tasted victory for the first time as a head coach Sept. 15, in a 15-13 win over intrastate rival Iowa, he became the first Cyclone head coach to win his first Iowa State-Iowa game since Clyde Williams in 1907.

2. IOWA STATE'S LAST VISIT TO LINCOLN ENDED AFTER TWO OVERTIMES

In 2005, the game came down to the last play of double overtime. No. 23 Iowa State, which had a 20-13 lead in the first overtime, fell at Nebraska on the second of two Cory Ross touch-downs after regulation, 27-20. ISU QB Bret Meyer completed 23-of-41 passes for 317 yards and a TD against the Huskers. When Bret Culbertson hit on a 32-yard field goal attempt for the Cyclones with 2:01 left in the third quarter for a 13-10 ISU advantage, it marked Iowa State's first lead in Lincoln since 1981.

3. ISU QUARTERBACK BRET MEYER makes his 41st start in this week's game. Meyer is second among active NCAA signal-callers in total offense (8,957 yards) and his 1,613 career offensive plays make him by far the busiest collegiate football player of the last four years (second/Colt Brennan, Hawai'i 1,421). Despite this and being sacked 108 times he has never missed a game because of injury. He passed Reggie McNeal of Texas A&M (8,861, 2002-05) last week to move into fourth place on the all-time Big 12 total offense list. Last week, Meyer passed Heisman Trophy winner Jason White of Oklahoma (7,922 2000-04) to move into fourth place on the all-time Big 12 passing yards list with 8,159.

4. UNDER ATHLETICS DIRECTOR JAMIE POLLARD, Iowa State has crushed previous records, selling more than 36,000 season tickets. This, after the Cyclones posted their previous two largest crowds in school history in 2006: 55,518 vs. Northern Iowa and 55,338 vs. Nebraska. On Sept. 8, ISU topped those crowds with an all-time record of 56,795 fans against Northern Iowa. Iowa State averaged 51,208 fans for its first three home games. Iowa State has only topped that number twice before

in school history, in 1981 (51,456) and 1982 (51,522).

5. IOWA STATE WIDE RECEIVER TODD BLYTHE has averaged 17.7 yards per reception, second among active NCAA receivers with at least 100 career catches. Blythe's 28 touch-down catches are a school record, second is Ed Williams (1994-97) and Keith Krepfle (1971-73) with 15. His 2,524 career receiving yards ranks him second in school history behind Lane Danielsen (2,690, 2000-03).

6. R.J. SUMRALL ISU'S LEADING RECEIVER

The junior has 22 catches for 221 yards. He has figured large in Iowa State's plan to spread out the passing game. Sumrall caught a career-high seven passes against UNI and Iowa. He had a 41-yard kickoff return against Kent State and UNI. He is averaging 29.8 yards per kickoff return.

7. IOWA STATE PLACEKICKER BRET CULBERTSON WAS BIG 12 SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK after having the biggest day of his career against Iowa Sept. 15, hitting on field-goal attempts of 21, 33, 42, 40 and 28 yards in six attempts. His last field goal came with one second left in the game to give the Cyclones a 15-13 victory. Culbertson's five field goals equalled the school record. The 42- and 40-yard field goals were kicked into a stiff breeze. He had a 47-

yard attempt that hit the left upright. He is the among most accurate placekickers in school history, hitting on 33-of-47 field career field-goal attempts. The former walk-on has made all of his 82 PAT tries. The Des Moines-Lincoln graduate is 26-of-31 inside 40 yards and had a career-long 52-yard three-pointer against Texas Tech last season. Overall, the senior has made 115-of-129 kicks in his career. Culbertson's 38-yard field goal attempt at Toledo last week in the final minute was blocked, the first time that a Culbertson field-goal attempt has been blocked.

8. LAST SECOND HEROICS RARE AT ISU

Culbertson's winning field goal with one second left against Iowa marked only the second time in school history that Iowa State has won with a second or less remaining. Marc Bachrodt drilled a 47-yard field goal as time expired to beat Kansas 38-35 on Oct. 8, 1983 in Ames.

9. LINEBACKER ALVIN "ACE" BOWEN led the nation with 12.91 tackles per game last season. He began 2007 as a consensus first-team all-Big 12 selection and made nine tackles against Kent State. Against Iowa, he made seven tackles, with a sack and a tackle for 12 yards in losses and forced a fumble. He figured large against Toledo with nine tackles, two for loss and an interception. He owns 220 career tackles in his third collegiate season.

10. TURNOVERS HURTING THE CYCLONES

Gene Chizik, a former defensive coordinator at Auburn and Texas, has put a premium on turnovers this season. It is easy to see why. In ISU's 2005 Houston Bowl season (7-5), the Cyclones outscored opponents off turnovers, 119-57 (+62). Last season, opponents outscored Iowa State, 67-30 off turnovers in a 4-8 season. In the first four weeks of 2007, 11 ISU turnovers have cost the Cyclones dearly, leading to 37 opponent points. ISU has yet to tally a score on four opponent turnovers. A fumbled punt snapped recovered in the end zone for a Toledo touchdown last week put the Rockets ahead to stay. ISU ranks last in the Big 12 in turnover margin.

11. IOWA STATE'S SMITH & SMITH ARE 10-WANS MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Free safety James Smith has made 30 tackles in the four three games. He had earned a starting spot in fall camp in 2006 but the Council Bluffs (across the river from Omaha) native suffered a broken ankle that kept him from playing until the eighth game of last season. Middle linebacker Jesse Smith is a former walk on from Altoona, Iowa who played at Southeast Polk High School (same school as Chicago Bears QB Kyle Orton). He has 26 tackles.

12. IOWA STATE RB J.J. BASS had four runs of 15 or more yards in the first half of the season-opening game against Kent State. Iowa State did not get its fifth run of more than 15 yards until the 11th game of last season. Bass rushed for a season-high 134 yards on 34 carries and two TDs at Toledo, his second game over 100 yards rushing. Bass' 34 carries at Toledo were the most rushing attempts by a Cyclone since Nov. 17, 2001, when Ennis Haywood toted the rock 35 times for 185 yards and four touchdowns in a 49-7 win at Kansas.

13. IOWA STATE BEAT IOWA WITHOUT A TD

Before the Iowa game, the last time the Cyclones won a game without the benefit of a touchdown (offense, defense or special teams) was on Nov. 6, 1948, when Iowa State beat Drake, 2-0.

14. PLAYING BY THE RULES

Through four games Iowa State is the second-least penalized team in the Big 12 Conference, having been flagged just 14 times for 124 yards.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Credentials

Media Credentials and Parking

All requests for credentials must be made on-line at cyclones.com. Questions should be directed to Kendra Smith in the ISU Athletics Communications Office at kendras@iastate.edu or (515) 294-3372. Parking passes should be requested when requesting credentials. Credentials will either be mailed to the address indicated on the request or may be picked up on game day at Media Will Call. Credentials will be granted to the media on assignment from daily newspapers, ISU network radio affiliates (as space permits), originating radio stations and television stations. Misuse of these credentials will result in expulsion from the game and denial of credentials to future ISU athletic activities. Credentials are non-transferrable.

Photo Credentials

Photo credentials must be requested in the same manner as media credentials. For sideline armbands, photo credentials must be presented prior to the game in the press box in accordance with Big 12 Conference rules. Misuse of photo credentials will result in expulsion from the game. An affiliation photo ID must be shown on gamedays to obtain an armband for field admittance.

Radio Originations

A radio booth is provided for the visiting team's designated station. Additional originations may be arranged through Tom Kroeschell. Auxiliary booths (outside the press box) are used for additional stations. Telephone arrangements should be made through Iowa State University Telecommunications at (515) 294-8556.

Telephones & Ethernet

Iowa State provides four courtesy phone lines and one ethernet hub in the main press box area for media use on a first-come, first-served basis, as well as a wireless internet connection. Media requiring their own phone lines or ethernet should contact ISU Telecommunications at (515) 294-8556.

Gameday Operations

Parking

Media parking is located in the South Lot (S-2) of Jack Trice Stadium. Parking passes should be requested when requesting credentials.

Press Tower

The Jack Trice Stadium press tower is located on the west side of the stadium and is accessed through the press tower elevator. Admission is by media credential only. The press tower is a three-level facility with separate donor, media and radio-television decks. As per the instructions of the State Fire Marshal, smoking is not permitted in the press tower. Athletics Communications personnel will staff the press box for three hours following the game.

Services

Complete play-by-play copy, halftime stats, final team and individual stats, tackle charts and quotes from coaches and players are provided.

Photo Deck

A photo deck is located directly under the press tower directly below the donor (first) level. Arrangements to secure a spot should be made with the Athletics Communications office.

Interview Policies

In addition to weekly press conferences, interviews shall be conducted between 6:30-9 p.m. CST on Sunday through Wednesday. **MEDIA WISHING TO INTERVIEW IOWA STATE PLAYERS SHOULD CALL THE IOWA STATE ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS OFFICE BETWEEN 1-4 P.M. ON SUNDAYS WITH THEIR INTERVIEW REQUESTS.** All player interviews must be coordinated through the Communications office.

Post-game Interviews

ISU's locker room is closed. Following a "cooling off" period after the game, head coach Gene Chizik will conduct a press conference in the Jacobson Athletic Building's Hunziker Auditorium (second floor). Media must enter the Jacobson Athletic Building through the facility's northwest door. Iowa State players requested by media personnel will be escorted from the locker room to the auditorium after Coach Chizik is finished. Opposing media can attend the visitor's press conference in the meeting room directly opposite the visiting locker room in the Olsen Building.

HEAD COACH GENE CHIZIK



CHIZIK UP CLOSE

Born in Tarpon Springs, Fla. Family moved to Clearwater, Fla. when Gene was six years old. Clearwater is part of the Tampa-St. Petersburg metropolitan area.

Chizik taught third grade for two years at Bauder Elementary School in Seminole, Fla. After school, he walked across the street to help coach football at Seminole HS.

Gene has three older sisters.

Gene was a Miami Dolphins fan until the Tampa Bay Buccaneers franchise was formed. He backed the Bucs even when the team lost its first 26 games in 1976-77.

Gene was a high school linebacker at Clearwater High School. He was also a member of the chess club.

His first job was washing cars.

His father, Gene, earned a bronze star on Okinawa during the battle of Sugar Loaf Hill in May 1945. Gene Chizik Sr., coached high school football while getting a graduate degree and went on to be principal at Tarpon High School and Largo High School. The best advice Iowa State's head coach got from his father was "don't tell me, show me."

Gene's favorite hobbies include fishing and chess. He loves chess because of the all the different strategy that is involved. His fishing highlight came two years ago when his son, Cally, caught his first fish, a bass, while on vacation.

He has an eclectic love of music. Likes country and ABBA.

Gene Chizik was the man. From the moment Iowa State athletics director Jamie Pollard began a search for a new head football coach, Chizik was at the top of Pollard's list of potential candidates. He wasn't alone. Everyone wanted Gene Chizik. It was easy to see why. Chizik had the perfect résumé.

He had been assistant head coach and defensive coordinator on Texas' 2005 national championship team. Before that, three years as defensive coordinator at Auburn, where in the midst of 30 wins in three seasons he earned the Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. Because of his experience as a defensive coordinator on conference title teams in three different BCS conferences, Chizik was mentioned as a candidate for the most high profile head coaching jobs.

Chizik's track record of preparing players for college football and beyond is unassailable. Amazingly, the new ISU head coach has tutored the last three winners of the Jim Thorpe Award (Carlos Rogers, Michael Huff, Aaron Ross). The honor is given annually to the nation's top collegiate defensive back.

As defensive coordinator, Chizik learned from the best head coaches in the nation's top collegiate programs while making tremendous contributions toward the enhancement of their national head coaching reputations. The national championship won by Texas in 2005 was the school's first since 1970. When Auburn won the 2004 SEC Championship game, it was the Tigers' first league crown since 1989.

Chizik's defense loomed large in Texas' 2005 national championship season under head coach Mack Brown. The Longhorns ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense, 10th in total defense and fourth in pass efficiency defense. UT allowed opponents to reach 300 yards of total offense only five times in 2005 and held the remaining eight opponents to less than 267 yards. Ten UT defenders were all-Big 12 Conference selections.

At Auburn, Chizik's defenses were unforgiving and set a standard for the rest of the country. In 2004, the Tigers gave up a national low 11.3 points per game en route to an undefeated season. Overall, the Tigers gave up an average of just 277.62 yards of total offense per contest, ranking fifth nationally for the second straight season. The 2003 Auburn defense was fifth nationally in total defense, allowing just 281.6 yards per game, the best total by a Tiger defense in more than a decade.

Chizik was also defensive coordinator for four seasons (1998-2001) at Central Florida. He improved a unit that ranked 81st nationally in total defense before his arrival to one that rated 16th in 2001. Chizik coached both linebackers (1998) and the secondary (1999-2001) at UCF. During his tenure with the Golden Knights, Chizik made frequent trips from Orlando to Tampa to study defensive concepts with Buccaneers head coach Tony Dungy and defensive coordinator Monte Kiffin.

Chizik also coached at Stephen F. Austin University, tutoring linebackers (1992-94) and the secondary (1995-97). He was SFA's defensive coordinator in 1996 and 1997. Philadelphia Eagle Jeremiah Trotter was his star with the Lumberjacks.

He stepped into college coaching at Clemson University (1988-89) as a graduate assistant for a pair of 10-win teams and then worked at Middle Tennessee State (1990-91) as a full-time assistant. The Blue Raiders made the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in both of his seasons and were conference champions in 1990.

Chizik, a native of Clearwater, Fla., and his wife (Jonna) have identical twin daughters (Landry Grace and Kennedy Danielle) and one son, Cally.

Iowa State 13, Nebraska 10 (or was it Nebraska 10, Iowa State 9)

Lincoln, Neb.

This controversial game explains the discrepancy between the two schools all-time series records. *The Des Moines Register and Leader* called the game "the fiercest, most thrilling football game ever waged on the Nebraska field." The game came down to a disputed drop-kick field goal by Iowa State that bounced once before going over the goal post. The referee disallowed the play which would have given Iowa State a 13-10 victory. ISU protested what Nebraska called a 10-9 Cornhusker win and appealed the next day to football coaching and rules guru Walter Camp. Camp stated several months later that the goal should have been allowed. Iowa State, playing under first-year head coach Clyde Williams, went on to beat Iowa (20-14) and Drake (13-8) to be self-proclaimed state champions of Iowa.

AMES, Iowa -- Kent State quarterback Julian Edleman totalled 236 yards of total offense, throwing for one TD and running for another as the Golden Flashes controlled the tempo in the second half to beat Iowa State ... ISU was playing for the first time under coach Gene Chizik ... Iowa State had gone ahead 7-6 after a 13-yard TD run by running back J.J. Bass with just 1:12 left in the first half ... the junior college transfer rushed for 133 yards, 106 in the first half for the best debut by an Iowa State tailback since Blaise Bryant rushed for 213 yards in the 1989 season opener ... Kent State's Jack Williams returned the ensuing kickoff 57 yards to the Cyclone 32 ... Kent State drove quickly to the ISU 7-yard line before PK Nate Reed connected on a 24-yard field goal with 2 seconds left for a 9-7 halftime advantage ... It was Shaggy's day ... Iowa State placekicker Bret Culbertson, whose nickname was founded in his resemblance to the Scooby-Doo cartoon character, kicked a school-record tying five field goals in six attempts, the last from 28 yards with one second left as ISU defeated heavily-favored and previously unbeaten Iowa, 15-13 in Jack Trice Stadium ... Culbertson earned Big 12 Special Teams Player-of-the-Week honors for his performance ... Culbertson's field goals of 21, 33, 42, 40 yards before hitting the game winner complemented a tenacious defensive effort that held Iowa to only 233 yards of total offense ...
