## K-STATE TRAVELS TO NEBRASKA FOR DIVISIONAL MATCHUP

### WILDCATS AND HUSKERS BATTLE ON VERSUS IN NATIONALLY TELEVISED GAME

Kansas State, after a tough road loss at Iowa State last week, will look to bounce back from a loss for the fourth time this season as the Cats travel to Lincoln, Neb., for a nationally televised game with the Nebraska Cornhuskers. Saturday's matchup with Nebraska will be televised nationally by the Versus Network, while the contest will air live on radio across the 31-station K-State Sports Network and on Sirius Satellite Radio, with Wyatt Thompson and Stan Weber calling the action and Matt Walters providing updates from the sidelines.

The Wildcats, who will earn their pivotal sixth win of the season with their next victory, hit the road in league play for the second straight week after suffering a tough 31-20 setback at Iowa State last weekend. K-State has continued to get strong performances from senior wide receiver Jordy Nelson, who is just eight receptions away from becoming the Big 12 Conference's single-season receptions leader for a senior. The All-America candidate and Biletnikoff Award semi-finalist re-established the K-State single-game receiving yards record last week at Iowa State after collecting 14 catches for 214 yards and a touchdown. Nelson had previously set the record with 209 yards against Missouri State earlier this season.

K-State continues to put up solid numbers offensively as the Wildcats enter the Nebraska game ranked among the top 20 teams nationally in both scoring offense (20th) and passing offense (16th) and are closing in on single-season school records in team passing yards, attempts and yards per completion while already setting the completion record. Individually, Nelson is ranked second nationally in all three receiving categories, including receptions per game (10.0), receiving yards per game (135.8) and total receiving yards (1,222). Quarterback Josh Freeman, who is on pace to set numerous K-State single-season records, ranks 23rd nationally this week in total offense, averaging 281.4 yards a game. The sophomore has thrown for at least 250 yards in seven games this season and ranks third in the Big 12 in passing yards per game in league contests (282.3).

On special teams, the Wildcats continue to lead the nation in punt returns, averaging 22.1 yards per return, and also have scored a nation-leading four times. Anchored by Ray Guy Award semi-finalist Tim Reyer, Kansas State heads into the Nebraska game as the Big 12 leader in net punting (38.9) while also checking in at No. 7 nationally in punting.

Defensively, Kansas State ranks among the top 30 teams nationally in sacks, tackles for loss and turnover margin after generating a combined 20 turnovers over its last six games. Senior linebacker Justin Roland and defensive back Justin McKinney continue to pace the Wildcats in tackles as McKinney leads the squad with 58 total while Roland is close behind at 55. Thirteen different Wildcats have recorded sacks this season while 10 players have recorded interceptions, four of which have multiple picks.



Named Kansas State's 33rd head football coach on Dec. 5, 2005, Prince accomplished so much more during his first 12 months on the job than the experts had envisioned for the '06 Cats that many considered the 37-year-old to be one a leading candidate for Big 12 coach of the year.

Just the second Wildcat head coach in school history to win seven games during his inaugural season and the first to take his team to a postseason bowl, Prince became only the sixth Big 12 head coach in conference history to guide his program to a bowl berth in a debut campaign. Making the accomplishment even more noteworthy is the fact that just four of the six Big 12 head coaches to earn bowl bids in year one took over programs coming off losing seasons, including Texas' Mack Brown in 1998, Colorado's Gary Barnett in 1999, Oklahoma's Bob Stoops in 1999 and now Prince.

When he stepped to the podium after being introduced as the head football coach, it didn't take long for the native Kansan to reveal a long-held affinity for both the University and its football program.

Raised in Junction City, Kan., which is located just 20 miles west of Manhattan, Prince literally grew up in the shadow of Kansas State University. And as far back as he can remember, at least to the age of three or four according to his best recollection, he had dreamt of one day leading the Wildcats.

Now, heading into his second season at the helm, the ultra high-energy Prince continues to pursue excellence with a seemingly limitless level of passion.

Not nearly satisfied with Kansas State's achievements during his inaugural campaign, Prince conducted a thorough review of his first season shortly after returning from the Texas Bowl. The assessment not only included a review of every snap taken by the Wildcats in 2006, but also broke down each practice in an effort to isolate areas of potential improvement.

**A LOOK AT NEBRASKA**

When the Wildcats travel to Lincoln on Saturday, they will square off against a Husker team that is 4-6 overall and looking to snap a five-game losing skid. Nebraska heads into the game with one of the top offenses in the country, ranking 15th in passing offense and 28 in total offense, but has seen its biggest struggles as of late be on the defensive side of the ball. Quarterback Joe Ganz, who earned his first start of the season last week at Kansas following an injury to Sam Keller, threw for 405 yards and four scores against a stout Jayhawk defense last Saturday and will earn his first career start at home against the Wildcats. All-purpose back Marlon Lucky leads the squad in both rushing yards (847) and receptions (61), while Maurice Purify has six touchdown receptions. On defense, Steve Octavien leads the charge with 71 total tackles, 10 for losses, while Larry Asante has totaled 65 stops on the year.

**NEBRASKA SERIES**

Saturday's game will be the 92nd edition in the Kansas State-Nebraska series, which dates to 1911. The Cornhuskers hold a 74-15-2 edge in the all-time series, and have won two in a row, however the rivalry has taken on a decidedly purple hue over the last nine seasons. Overall, Kansas State has won three of the last five, four of the last seven and five of the last nine meetings between the two programs. Since 1998, the Wildcats are 1-3 in Lincoln with the lone win being a 38-9 triumph in 2003. Nebraska took last year's meeting, 21-3, in Manhattan.

**NEBRASKA WILDCATS**

Saturday's game will have a special significance for four Wildcats that all hail from the state of Nebraska. K-State's Nebraska products include: junior running back John McCardle (Omaha - Millard North HS); sophomore wide receiver Tony Purvis (McCook - McCook HS); junior offensive lineman Brad Rooker (Omaha - Millard North HS); and freshman kicker Josh Cherry (McCook - McCook HS).

**ON THE TUBE**

Saturday's game against Nebraska will mark Kansas State's sixth appearance this season on television and its second straight on the Versus Network. Overall, Saturday's game will be the Wildcats' 101st television appearance all-time. Kansas State is 55-45 (.550) when playing on television, including a 2-3 mark this season.

**HOT DOWN THE STRETCH**

Kansas State hits the home stretch of its 2007 season with a 5-4 mark through nine games. Historically, the Wildcats have made a habit of late-season runs. Since the formation of the Big 12 Conference in 1996, the Wildcats are a rock-solid 33-12 in the last four games of the regular season, including a staggering 24-2 at home. Four times during that span the Wildcats went a perfect 4-0 (1997, 1998, 2002 and 2003), with Kansas State posting 3-1 marks during five other campaigns (1996, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2006).

**JUST GET TO NOVEMBER**

Since 1996, Kansas State has posted a number of Novembers to remember. Over the past 10-plus seasons, the Wildcats are 29-9 (.763) in November games and have run the table five times, doing so as recently as 2003. Of those 38 games, 21 have been on the road and the Wildcats are 13-8 in opponent stadiums.

**DIVISIONAL SUCCESS**

Heading into Saturday's game against Nebraska, the Wildcats are 40-18 (.690) vs. division opponents since 1996, which is second to Nebraska among Big 12 North schools. Last season, K-State was 2-3 against its northern brethren, which included wins over Iowa State and Colorado and losses to Nebraska, Missouri and Kansas. This season, the Wildcats are 1-2 after losses to Kansas and Iowa State and a win over Colorado.

**K-STATE ON THE ROAD IN THE BIG 12**

Since the inception of the Big 12, few teams have played as well on the road in conference games as Kansas State. In fact, only two schools have won more Big 12 road games than the Wildcats (not including neutral site games). In all, K-State has won nearly 56 percent of its games in enemy stadiums, going 25-22 during the first 12 years of the league. In those 12 seasons, Kansas State has won at least one Big 12 road game 11 times and has produced three or more road wins six times - 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000 and 2002. K-State is also one of a select few teams in the league that have laid claim to a victory in every Big 12 stadium. The Cats are 1-2 on the road in league play this season, after a 41-21 win at Texas, a two-point loss at Oklahoma State, 41-39, and a 31-20 loss to Iowa State.

**HIGH RATE OF RETURNS**

Kansas State has been known over the last decade as a team that has specialized in the area of special teams and head coach Ron Prince has maintained that philosophy. The Wildcats currently lead the nation in punt returns with a 22.1-yard average and are the only team nationally to score four times on punt returns and once on kickoff returns. Under Prince, the Cats have returned seven punts for scores in 22 total games. Kansas State has seen its punt return numbers rank among the best nationally thanks to the return games of Deon Murphy and Jordy Nelson. Murphy, who ranks fifth nationally with three punt returns of 50-plus yards through nine games, raced 80 yards on a punt return against Missouri State to give the Wildcats their first special teams score of the year, while Nelson added an 89-yarder for a score at Texas and a Big 12 season-best 92-yarder against Baylor. Courtney Herndon was credited with a score vs. Colorado after he picked up a Daniel Gonzalez blocked punt and returned it six yards for a touchdown.

**SPECIAL CAT**

Head coach Ron Prince has placed a huge emphasis on special teams during his time in Manhattan and it has proven to be a key area for the Wildcats. In addition to leading the nation in kickoff return yardage and touchdowns last season, K-State already has scored five special teams touchdowns this season and has pushed across the goal line 12 times on special teams under Prince. Since 1990, Kansas State is 38-9 when scoring on special teams and 15-0 when scoring on special teams and on defense. And, in non-offensive touchdowns, the Wildcats have ranked among the nation's best over the past seven seasons. Since 1999, the Wildcats are third nationally in non-offensive touchdowns with 58, behind only Virginia Tech (62) and Miami, Fla. (60). Also, K-State has scored non-offensive touchdowns in eight of Prince's 12 wins as head coach of the Wildcats.

**LEADING AT THE HALF**

There's no better indicator of a Wildcat victory than when K-State leads or is tied at the half. Under Ron Prince, K-State has led at the break in all 12 of its wins and trailed at the half in eight of 10 losses. Since 1990, the Cats have protected a halftime lead 96-percent of the time, going 128-5 when leading at halftime.

**WE'RE FIRST**

Scoring first has also been a sign of good things to come for the Wildcats. Kansas State has opened the game's scoring in eight of nine contests this season, which has included touchdown drives in six of the last seven games. In fact, the Wildcats have outscored their opponent, 89-31, in the first 15 minutes. Since 1990, K-State's record when scoring first is even more dramatic as the Wildcats have gone 114-16 (88 percent) when drawing first blood.

**THREE IS MAGIC NUMBER**

During the Wildcats last four wins, K-State has committed just three turnovers while forcing its opponent to a combined 16 giveaways over that span. Quarterback Josh Freeman has not thrown a pick in three of the Wildcats' last four wins. Also, the Cats are 5-0 this season when committing fewer than three turnovers. Conversely, the Wildcats are 0-4 this season when committing three or more turnovers.

**TAKE IT AWAY**

Kansas State's defense has forced 20 turnovers over the past six games, 15 of which have come by way of interceptions. In their first three games of the season, the Wildcats had only picked off two passes. Ten different players have recorded 17 total interceptions this season, while Chris Carney has collected a team-leading four while three others have multiple picks. Currently, Kansas State is tied for 25th nationally in turnover margin at plus-6 on the season.

**JUST KICKIN' IT**

Kansas State has been strong once again in 2007 in the area of special teams and the kicking game, especially in the place-kicking and punting aspects. The Wildcats are averaging 2.11 field goals a game this season, which ranks second nationally, and have yet to have a kick blocked. On punts, senior Tim Reyer has put up All-Big 12 numbers through nine games and enters the weekend as the league's top punter. K-State ranks 14th nationally in punting with a 44.12-yard average and seventh in net punting (38.9).

**LIGHT IT UP**

Kansas State has seen its scoring offense light up the scoreboard over the course of the season, especially in Big 12 play. K-State has averaged 40.4 points a game during its last seven games, which includes 51 against Baylor, the largest output for a Ron Prince-led team in Big 12 play. Heading into this week's contest at Nebraska, the Wildcats rank fifth in the Big 12 Conference and 20th nationally with a 36.7 points per game average and are also averaging 37.0 points a contest in league play.

**SCORING STREAK**

Kansas State extended one of the nation's longest scoring streaks against Iowa State. The Wildcats have now tallied points in 137 consecutive games. The 137-game stretch is a school record - more than double the old record - and the 12th longest streak in the nation as the Wildcats have not been kept off the scoreboard since Colorado blanked K-State, 12-0, in 1996. The previous longest streak in school history of 60 games occurred between 1991 and 1996. In the Big 12, only Colorado (230 games) and Nebraska (143 games) own longer streaks than the Wildcats.

**PASSING FANCY**

Kansas State is on pace to set new school team records in nearly every passing category with three games left in the regular season. After the Iowa State game, K-State set a new single-season school record of completions at 228 and currently sit at 243 on the season. Also, at 2,593 yards, the Wildcats need 450 more passing yards to break the 12-game record of 3,042 set back in 1998. The 2003 Wildcat team holds the overall season record with 3,186 yards through the air, which came during a 15-game season. K-State also needs just 61 more pass attempts to set a new season record, which is currently at 443 (1988).

**BEHIND ENEMY LINES**

A big part of Kansas State's production on defense under head coach Ron Prince has been the Wildcats' ability to attack the football behind the line of scrimmage. The Wildcat defense has collected 63 stops behind the line of scrimmage this season and have now totaled 153 tackles for losses in their last 22 games (7.0 avg.) with Prince as head coach and currently rank 28th in the nation (7.0 avg.) in that category. Kansas State has tallied a combined 20 tackles for losses in its last two games against Baylor and Iowa State.

**PAPER OR PLASTIC**

After being one of the nation's top pass rushing teams a year ago, Kansas State has kept things rolling so far in 2007. Through nine games, the Wildcats have recorded 25 sacks and have had at least two sacks in all but two games so far this season. Currently, the Cats rank 22nd nationally and second in the Big 12 in that category. K-State, which has seen 13 different players record sacks, has now recorded 65 sacks in its last 22 games. Of those 13 players who have recorded sacks, nine of those players have tallied two or more sacks, led by Reggie Walker's three.

**RED ZONE SUCCESS**

The Wildcats have entered their opponents' red zone 44 times this season and have been able to come away with points in all but five drives through nine games (One came on the final drive of the game against Colorado in which the clock ran out). Twenty-four of those red zone chances turned into touchdowns, while 15 have been successful field goals. Kansas State is ranked fourth in the Big 12 in red zone offense this week with an 88.6 scoring percentage

**PROTECT THIS HOUSE**

Kansas State head coach Ron Prince takes great pride in the play of his offensive linemen. Prince, a former offensive linemen as a player and offensive line coach, and Assistant Head Coach Tim McCarty give the Cats two tremendously talented and experienced coaches with that group. This season, the play of the line has continued to improve and the proof is in the statistics. Currently, the Wildcats have given up only eight quarterback sacks in nine games this season, which is tops in the Big 12 Conference and ranks third nationally.

**YEAR TWO**

After leading the Kansas State to a winning record and bowl berth in his first season, second-year head coach Ron Prince has the Wildcat program headed in the right direction. In fact, Prince is one win away from becoming the second K-State football coach to win at least 13 games in his first two seasons at the helm. Guy Lowman went 5-4-1 during his first season as head coach back in 1911 and followed up with an 8-2 mark in 1912. Currently, Prince is tied with Z.G. Clevenger (1916-17) for the second-most wins in years one and two.

**THE PEOPLE'S CHAMP**

Senior wide receiver Jordy Nelson had a breakout season as a sophomore in 2005, but Nelson is rewriting virtually every K-State receiving record during his outstanding senior season. The Biletnikoff Award semifinalist and All-American candidate has already broken or tied three Kansas State single-game records. Nelson registered the single-game receiving yardage mark twice this season, racking in 209 yards against Missouri State and then eclipsed his own record with 214 yards at Iowa State. Against Missouri State, the former walk-on grabbed a school record 15 receptions, and was close to tying his own mark with 14 against the Cyclones. And, against Oklahoma State, Nelson tied the school's single-game mark with three receiving touchdowns against the Cowboys.

**THE FULL NELSON**

The Nelson is synonymous for a wrestling move in which you put your opposition into a head lock. Many teams this year have probably felt that way whenever Jordy Nelson touches the ball. The senior wide receiver is the team's leading receiver with a school record 90 receptions for 1,222 yards and eight touchdowns. The former walk-on has now recorded at least one catch in 29 of his last 33 games, including one in every game in 2005 season and 2007. Nelson, an All-American, All-Big 12 and Biletnikoff Award candidate, has 174 receptions for 2,438 yards and 17 touchdowns during his three-year stint at wide receiver to establish himself on three career top-10 receiving lists. Nelson also leads the team and is 22nd nationally in all-purpose yards with 162.1 yards per game. He topped the 200-yard mark in that department in two-consecutive games, racking up 291 yards against Missouri State and 206 against Texas. Nelson's all-purpose numbers have been a combination of eye-popping receiving yards combined with his ability to return punts. Nelson has averaged 52.8 yards on five punt returns, highlighted by an 89-yard return at Texas and a 92-yard return against Baylor - the two longest in the Big 12 this season. His return against Baylor was the sixth longest in school history and the longest since David Allen returned a punt 94 yards for a score at Iowa State in 1999.

**CHARTING NELSON**

Following his monstrous senior season, wide receiver Jordy Nelson will certainly go down as one of the greatest players in K-State history, and one has to look no further than the school's record book to prove that point. Nelson can end his career in the top three on the Kansas State career receptions, yardage and touchdowns lists with a strong finish to his senior campaign. Nelson currently stands third on the K-State career receptions list with 174 and is just five six receptions shy of holding sole possession of second place, currently held by Michael Smith with 179. If Nelson stays on his average of 10 receptions per game, he will end his career with 204 catches, just 13 grabs shy of all-time leader Kevin Lockett. Following his school record 214 yards against Iowa State last week, Nelson overtook Aaron Lockett (1999-00) for third place on the career yardage list at Kansas State - the second consecutive week he improved his placing on the list - and needs just 20 yards to take over second place in that department. The All-American candidate can also move into the top three in career receiving touchdowns as he needs just one more score to tie James Terry (2002-03) for third.

**WALKING INTO STARTING ROLES**

Kansas State has seen a number of former walk-ons go on to earn starting roles. Eight different Wildcats who were at one time walk-ons have flourished and become starters at Kansas State. Jordy Nelson, Daniel Gonzalez, Marcus Watts, Andrew Erker, Ian Campbell, Marcus Perry, Tim Reyer and Logan Robinson have all earned starting roles at some point in their careers after coming to K-State as walk-ons.

**NELSON'S STELLAR SEASON**

Not only is Jordy Nelson towards the top of three different career lists, but he has already broken the single-season receptions record and is cusp of earning one more single-season mark. Two week ago against Baylor, Nelson recorded the single-season reception mark with 76, and added 14 receptions to his total last week against Iowa State. With 90 catches through nine games, Nelson is on pace to end his senior campaign with 120, an unthinkable 45 receptions more than the previous record. Nelson will most likely break the single-season yardage record against Nebraska, as he needs just 11 yards to outgain James Terry's 1,232 yards in 2003. Even more impressive than actually breaking the current mark is that Nelson will break it in just 10 games, while Terry needed 15 games during the 2003 season to establish the record. Nelson is on pace to completely demolish Terry's record as he is on pace to rack up 1,629 yards this season.

**BIG TIME BIG 12 PLAYER**

Not only is he breaking school records, but Jordy Nelson is on pace to break Big 12 records as well. Nelson is just seven receptions shy of tying former Texas Tech alum and NFL wide receiver Wes Welker for receptions in a season by a senior. Welker grabbed 97 receptions for the Red Raiders in 2003. The overall record for receptions in a season is 107 by Oklahoma State's Rashaun Woods in 2002. That record will most certainly be broken by both Nelson and current Texas Tech wideout Michael Crabtree. Another Big 12 record within Nelson's grasp is receiving yards by a senior, currently held by Woods with 1,367 in 2003. The overall yardage leader in a season is Woods with 1,695 yards in 2002.

**MEET ME IN THE END ZONE**

Senior wide receiver Jordy Nelson has recorded two single-game receiving marks this season, but Nelson was close to making it three against Oklahoma State. Nelson caught three touchdown passes from quarterback Josh Freeman, the seventh time in school history a receiver has hauled in three scores, which is the school record. The last time a receiver had three touchdowns in a game was James Terry against Baylor in 2003. Nelson, who has eight receiving touchdowns this season, has an outside chance of tying Quincy Morgan for touchdown in a season with 14.

**10/100**

Prior to 2007, there were only 12 occasions (seven players) in the 111 years of football at K-State that a receiver had 100 or more yards on 10 or more receptions in a single game. Jordy Nelson has accomplished that feat five times this season. Nelson had three consecutive 10/100 games against Missouri State, Texas and Kansas, tallied another one at Oklahoma State and added his fifth one last week against Iowa State. Nelson realistically could have recorded these marks in two more games as he had nine catches for 90 yards to open the season at Auburn and had eight grabs for 105 yards against Baylor.

**NELSON NATIONALLY**

Jordy Nelson's outstanding senior season has not only moved him up the career charts at K-State, but also has ascended him to the top of the national standings. Following the San Jose State game, Nelson was tied for 17th in receptions and tied for 39th nationally in receiving yards. But, after collecting 75 receptions for 1,050 yards in the last seven games, Nelson has leaped to second in the nation with 90 catches for 1,222 yards. Nelson is one of just three receivers in the nation this season that has recorded 1,000 receiving yards.

**FREEMAN AS A STARTER**

Sophomore quarterback Josh Freeman made his 16th-career start against Baylor last week. He now has a 9-8 record as the Wildcats' starting signal caller. Below is a look at Freeman's performances:

**AIR RAID**

No other year in recent history has Kansas State thrown the ball as much as they have in 2007, causing quite the workout for quarterback Josh Freeman. Last week against Iowa State, Kansas State set a team record with 242 attempted passes this season, most of which have come from the arm of Freeman, who, in the same game, set the single-season pass attempts mark with 373. Freeman has attempted over 30 passes eight of nine games this season, including two games of 50 or more attempts. In 2006, Freeman only reached the 30-attempt mark on four occasions and attempted a total of 270 passes, 103 less than what he has thrown in just nine games in 2007.

**COMPLETE PACKAGE**

More impressive than Josh Freeman's attempts this season is the consistency he has shown to continually complete the pass. Freeman has already broken the school's single-season completions record of 200, as he has hit 237 of his 373 passes. Freeman has had 20 or more completions in eight of nine games, including a school-record 36 completions at Oklahoma State, 32 at Auburn and 31 against Kansas. The Kansas City, Mo., product is the only quarterback in Kansas State history to complete 20 or more throws in five consecutive games, as he did so the first five games of the 2007 campaign. Last season, Freeman only had three games with 20 or more completions. Furthermore, the sophomore has had efficiency ratings of over 100.0 in eight straight games - including a season-best 156.6 mark at Oklahoma State - after opening up the season with an 86.6 rating at Auburn.

**TOPPING 200**

Throwing for more than 200 yards has become the norm for Josh Freeman as he has topped the 200-yard plateau in 11 of his last 13 games dating back to 2006, including eight of nine games this season. Freeman has also topped the 300-yard mark on three occasions this year, including 347 yards last week against Iowa State. As a freshman in 2006, Freeman threw for a career-high of just 272 yards, which came against Nebraska.

**TOPPING 400**

For the first time in his career, Josh Freeman eclipsed the 400-yard mark as he threw for 404 yards at Oklahoma State, nearly 100 yards more than his previous career high of 305 against Kansas. The mark is the fourth highest in a single game in school history and the most since Michael Bishop threw for 441 yards against Louisiana-Monroe in 1998. With 403 total offensive yards against the Cowboys, Freeman was the first player to reach the 400-yard mark in total offense since Eli Roberson had 403 at Nebraska in 2003.

**TOPPING 2,000**

Following his 247-yard performance against Baylor, Josh Freeman became just the 10th quarterback in school history to throw for more than 2,000 yards in a single season. With his 347 yards last week at Iowa State, Freeman now sits with 2,521 yards this season. The mark currently sits sixth on the school's single-season yardage list.

**SINGLE-SEASON HIGHS**

The ability Kansas State has shown to move the ball down the field through the air has giving quarterback Josh Freeman a chance to rewrite three of the school's single-season records in 2007. With 237 completions through nine games this season the Grandview, Mo., native has already broke Chad May's single-season record of 200 in 1999, and is on pace to completely shatter the old record with 316. Likewise, Freeman broke the attempts record last week at Iowa State as he currently sits with 373 passes thrown this season, one more than Lynn Dickey's record of 372 attempts in 1969. Even more impressive than the attempts and completions records, Freeman is just 324 yards away from holding the single-season yardage record, currently held by Michael Bishop's 2,844 yards set in 1998. Freeman is on target to throw for 3,361 yards in 2007.

**MOVING UP THE CHARTS**

Although he is over halfway through just his sophomore campaign, Josh Freeman has found himself on three of the top 10 career passing charts in school history. Following his 44 attempts last week at Iowa State, the sophomore jumped from seventh to fourth on the school's career attempts list. He is another 44 attempts away from third place, currently held by Chad May (1993-94) with 687. The Grandview, Mo., product currently sits fourth in school history with 377 career completions and is just eight completed passes away from Chad May (1993-94; 385) for third. Likewise, Freeman is moving up on the career passing yardage list, as he now has 4,301 career passing yards and seventh on the career list in that department. He needs just 101 yards against Nebraska to move into sole possession of sixth and 342 yards to move into fifth. Furthermore, with his 347 yards last week against Iowa State, Freeman became just the eighth player in school history to throw for over 4,000 yards in a career.

**WILDCAT FOOTBALL ON THE RADIO**

Wildcat football is on the air! The 2007 football season marks third year of the K-State Sports Network, a joint venture of Kansas State Athletics and Learfield Communications. Learfield Communications is a national leader in collegiate sports broadcasting and marketing, owning the rights to 34 of the nation's top collegiate programs.



The 2005-06 season was the first year of a 10-year partnership between Learfield and K-State Athletics that grants K-State Sports Properties the exclusive marketing and broadcast rights for all Wildcat athletic teams.

But football is just the beginning. The network also provides play-by-play coverage of K-State men's and women's basketball, volleyball and baseball. Weekly coaches shows for football, men's and women's basketball supplement the live event coverage.

**MARKET ..... CALL LETTERS .....FREQ.**

**RON PRINCE SHOWS**

**Radio:** Affiliates on the K-State Sports Network carry the Ron Prince Show each Monday night during the season. The show originates from the Manhattan Town Center shopping mall from 6-7 p.m. during the season and is open to the public.

**Television:** The weekly Ron Prince Television Show can be seen throughout the Midwest each Sunday at 1 p.m. during the season on Fox Sports Midwest. The half-hour program, produced by Kansas State television specialist Norm Burge and hosted by Wyatt Thompson, features head coach Ron Prince, player and coach spotlights, highlights of previous games and previews of upcoming contests.

**NEW POSITION, SAME RESULT**

Junior Ian Campbell emerged as one of the nation's premier pass rushers in 2006 as he recorded 17.5 tackles for loss, including a K-State single-season record-tying 11.5 sacks. Campbell moved from defensive end to strongside linebacker due to the new-look 3-4 defense, but is still making his presence felt as he leads the team with 7.5 tackles for loss and is second on the team with 2.5 sacks. Campbell has been a ball-hawk this season as he has recovered four fumbles and recorded three pass breakups. The Cimarron, Kan., native also sparked the Wildcats in a 20-point upset win at Texas as he got his hands in front of a Colt McCoy pass at the line of scrimmage, brought it into his body and rumbled 41 yards for a score. It was one of four interceptions by K-State on the day and was Campbell's first career interception and touchdown. He also recorded two pass breakups against the Horns, giving him three passes defended in the game after defending just four passes all of 2006.

**BROOKS IS ON TARGET**

After sitting out 2006 due to NCAA transfer rules, Ohio transfer Brooks Rossman has not shown any signs of rust from his year off as he is the leading place kicker in the Big 12 and second nationally with a 19 field goals. The San Diego, Calif., product nailed 4-of-5 field goals against Colorado, including a career-long 52 yarder to close out the first half, and became the first Wildcat to make four field goals in a game since Joe Rheem converted four against Louisiana-Lafayette on Sept. 18, 2004. Furthermore, his 76.0 percentage (19-of-25) is second in the conference.

**KICKIN' IT OLD SCHOOL**

With 19 field goals this season, junior placekicker Brooks Rossman is already in the top 10 on both the single season and career field goals lists. Rossman moved into a tie for second on the single-season list with Martin Gramatica (1997), and is just three makes away from Gramatica's record of 22 in 1998. The transfer from Ohio moved is currently in eighth place on the career list, and now aims for Jeff Snodgrass who is sixth on the list with 27 field goals made from 2004-06.

**JUST FOR KICKS**

Senior punter Tim Reyer, a semifinalist for the 2007 Ray Guy Award, didn't have his best of averages against Iowa State, but was put in situations where he needed to pin the Cyclones deep. In Ames, Reyer only had an average of 36.2 yards, but two of his punts were downed inside the 20-yard line, including his first which rolled dead at the one. However, the former walk-on's season average stands of 44.4 yards is still tops in the Big 12 and 14th nationally, and he has had 16 of his punts downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Reyer paced the Wildcats in punting for the last three years and was a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list in 2006.

**WILDCATS ON SIRIUS**

SIRIUS Satellite Radio, the K-State Athletics Department and Learfield Sports, have announced an exclusive broadcasting agreement making SIRIUS the official satellite radio broadcaster of K-State athletics. Starting this fall, K-State football and men's basketball games will air nationwide on SIRIUS.

**FREEMAN FLYING UP THE RANKINGS**

Josh Freeman had outstanding performances in the first six games of the season and was in the upper tier of quarterbacks in two and national passing rankings - completions per game and passing yards per game. However, following a three-game stretch in which he has completed 86 passes for 998 yards, the sophomore gunslinger has skyrocketed in both statistics. Prior to the previous three games, Freeman was 14th in completions per game with 25.2, but currently sits ninth with 26.3. In terms of yards per game, Freeman was 28th nationally at 253.8, but has jumped to 12th with 280.1.

**JJ JUMPING IN PRODUCTION**

Senior running back James Johnson has provided the Wildcats offense with a potent rushing attack over the last four games, averaging 97 yards a game - including a 159-yard outburst against Colorado - to move up in the Big 12 rankings. Johnson is now ranked sixth in the conference with an 81.6-yard average per game and has scored nine rushing touchdowns, the fifth most in the league. Johnson has scored touchdowns in six of nine games this season, including a three-touchdown game against Missouri State and a two-score game against Colorado.

**PRIME TIME**

Multi-talented junior college transfer Deon Murphy has made a major impact, not only as a receiver, but also as a rusher and punt returner. The Houston, Texas, product is the team's second-leading receiver as he has caught 41 passes for 416 yards, taken 12 rushes for 79 yards, and has returned 24 punts for a Big 12 best 16.8 yards per return. Not only is he racking in the yards, but Murphy has been able to score when he gets his hands on the ball. The junior has scored a total of eight touchdowns (5 receiving, 2 rushing, 1 punt return), just two total scores behind both Jordy Nelson and James Johnson.

**McKINNEY LEADING THE WAY**

Defensive back Justin McKinney has been one of K-State's most consistent tacklers through this season as he leads the Wildcat defense with 58 stops, which includes a career-high 12 tackles against Colorado. The Sanford, Fla., native, who has led K-State in tackles in three games this season, also leads the defense with 11 pass breakups, including three interceptions. McKinney, whose first interception of the year at Texas was his first in nearly two years, also picked off a pass against Colorado and last week at Iowa State.

**ROLO ROLLING IN CONFERENCE PLAY**

Senior linebacker Justin Roland, who was named a team captain before the season, has shown everyone why his teammates thought he was deserving. Roland is second on the team with 55 stops, an average of 6.1 tackles per game. However, Roland has been even more effective in conference play as he has collected an average of 6.5 tackles per game, including a nine-tackle effort against Texas, an eight-tackle game against Colorado, and a seven-tackle performance at Oklahoma State. Against Colorado, the Ponca City, Okla., native carded his first sack of the season, dropping Buffalo quarterback Cody Hawkins five yards behind the line. Roland, one of five transfers from Northeastern Oklahoma A&M prior to the 2006 season, ranks 28th in the conference in tackles and is on pace to tally 73 stops after just 17 a year ago.

**CARNEY CLIMBS INTO RANKINGS**

Following Kansas State's first conference game against Texas, six different Wildcats had recorded interceptions on the season, none of whom were named Chris Carney. However, following a two-interception performance against Kansas, grabbing one pick against Colorado, and adding another against Baylor, the sophomore from Denver, Colo., all of a sudden finds his name among the Big 12 and national leaders in interceptions. Carney is tied for second in the conference and 27th in the nation with his four picks. He also became the first Wildcat since Bobby Walker in 2002 to record three or more interceptions in a two-game span. Walker recorded one interception against Kansas and picked off Iowa State twice the following week.

**LAYING A LIK**

After a strong finish to his freshman campaign in which he recorded six of his eight tackles in the final four games of the season, sophomore linebacker John Houlik has taken that momentum to elevate him to one of K-State's best tacklers. Houlik is fourth on the team in tackles with 48 takedowns, including three tackles for loss and two sacks. The Wichita, Kan., product recorded back-to-back games with seven stops against Colorado and Oklahoma State, and registered his first-career start against Cowboys.

**ANOTHER WALK-ON, ANOTHER SUCCESS**

Yet again, a Wildcat who was a former walk-on is making big plays in big situations. The latest is Clayton Cox. The senior from Weskan, Kan., who came to K-State from Garden City Community College, had perhaps the best game of any K-State player against Baylor. Cox led the team with eight tackles and brought down the Baylor quarterbacks on two occasions resulting in 18 yards worth of losses for the Bears. One of his sacks forced a fumble and he also recovered one fumble. Over the last three games, Cox has recorded 11 tackles, including 2.0 for losses, after tallying just two total tackles all of last year.

**AUBURN, Ala. (AP)** — Sophomore quarterback Josh Freeman completed a near school-record 32 passes for 268 yards, but it wasn't enough as No. 18 Auburn rallied for two touchdowns in the last two minutes for a 23-13 win at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Freeman completed 32 of 57 passes for 268 yards and was intercepted twice, including on Kansas State's final possession after the Tigers scored on a fumble return.

Trailing 13-9 with less than four minutes to go in the game, Auburn mounted a go-ahead scoring drive that was capped by a 3-yard pass from Brandon Cox to Gabe McKenzie. Auburn then upped the margin to 23-13 when Quetin Groves sacked Freeman, forcing a fumble that was returned 34-yards by Auburn's Antonio Coleman.

Freeman's passing numbers rank as some of the best in school history. His 32 completions rank as the second-most in school history and most since Chad May had 33 against Kansas on Oct. 6, 1994, while his 57 attempts are the third-most in school history and the most since Dennis Morrison had 59 against Iowa State on Oct. 21, 1972.

With the Wildcats trailing 6-3 after a first half dominated by defense, Kansas State's Marcus Watts intercepted Cox at the Wildcats 31 on the first play of the third quarter. Freeman directed the offense to the Auburn 21, and it was time for a trick.

Freeman took the snap and turned left, tossing a lateral to wide receiver Jordy Nelson on a third-and-6 play. Nelson heaved the ball deep to Leon Patton, who was all alone in the right side of the end zone for the first touchdown of the game.

**MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP)** — Sophomore Josh Freeman threw for 272 yards and a touchdown and ran for a score in Kansas State's 34-14 victory over San Jose State at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

James Johnson ran for 111 yards and one TD for Kansas State, which won its 18th straight home opener.

Deon Murphy caught Freeman's touchdown pass and ran 21 yards on a reverse for a 34-7 lead for the Wildcats, who had 153 yards rushing Saturday night after being held to 27 in last week's 23-13 loss at Auburn.

Before his 15-yard scoring pass to Murphy late in the first period put the Wildcats up 10-0, Freeman had gone 13 straight quarters without a TD throw since passing for three touchdowns in a 45-42 upset of Texas on Nov. 11, 2006.

Freeman was 6-for-6 for 88 yards on Kansas States first touchdown drive, part of a longer stretch in which he completed eight straight passes for 106 yards. He was perfect on the Wildcats' other TD drives, too. Freeman was 6-for-6 for 66 yards to set up his own 1-yard run for a 17-7 lead with just under 1 1/2 minutes left in the first half. And he was 5-for-5 for 34 yards before Johnson's 4-yard run made it 24-7 early in the fourth quarter.

**MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP)** — Senior Jordy Nelson set single-game school records with 15 receptions for 209 yards, catching one touchdown pass and throwing another in Kansas State's 61-10 victory over Missouri State on Saturday night.

James Johnson ran for 114 yards and three touchdowns for Kansas State (2-1), which scored touchdowns on its first three possessions against the Bears (2-1) and opened the second half with three straight TD drives and a punt return for another score. Deon Murphy caught Nelson's touchdown pass on a trick play and returned a punt 80 yards early in the fourth quarter for a 54-10 lead.

Nelson's 18-yard catch from Josh Freeman late in the third quarter, putting the Wildcats up 47-10, was the senior's 14th reception of the game. That broke Michael Smith's record of 13 catches against Missouri in 1989 and gave Nelson 207 yards receiving, breaking Darnell McDonald's record of 206 set against Syracuse in the 1997 Fiesta Bowl.

He also took a reverse handoff from Leon Patton on Kansas State's first possession and threw 24 yards to a wide-open Murphy for a 7-0 lead. It was his second TD pass - on as many attempts -- this season.

Freeman was 26-for-39 for 287 yards and didn't throw an interception, breaking a string of five games in which he threw at least one pick.

**AUSTIN, Texas (AP)** — Two kick returns for touchdowns and an interception return for another score propelled Kansas State to a 41-21 win over the No. 7 Longhorns, handing Texas its worst home defeat in 10 years under coach Mack Brown.

Linebacker Ian Campbell scored on a 41-yard interception return in the second quarter and James Johnson took a kickoff 85 yards for a 21-14 lead moments after Texas had tied the score.

Jordy Nelson's 89-yard punt return in the third put the Wildcats up 34-21 and all but sealed their second consecutive victory over Texas.

Kansas State (3-1, 1-0) scored on its opening drive, then didn't need another offensive touchdown until the fourth quarter. The Wildcats put up the most points scored against Texas (4-1, 0-1) in Austin since 1997, the Longhorns' infamous "Rout 66" loss to UCLA, 66-3.

On Campbell's interception return in the second quarter, the linebacker stunted on the pass rush, then stuck up his left hand to snag the throw at the line of scrimmage.

Nelson scored K-State's first touchdown, and his second was a dagger. He fielded the punt at the 11, then moved to his right before cutting up field. Only one Longhorn managed to even get a hand on him before he was in the clear.

**MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP)** — Josh Freeman threw touchdown passes on three straight possessions to open the second half, and wide receiver Jordy Nelson broke another school record in Kansas State's 51-13 victory over Baylor on Saturday.

Nelson had eight catches for 105 yards and broke the Kansas State record for receptions in a season. His 8-yard catch from backup Carson Coffman was his 76th this year, breaking Darnell McDonald's mark of 75 in 1988.

Nelson added a 92-yard punt return for Kansas State's last touchdown in the closing seconds of the game. Earlier this year, he set single-game records with 15 catches for 109 yards in a 61-10 win over Missouri State.

Freeman threw for 247 yards and had two 1-yard TD carries for the Wildcats (5-3, 3-2 Big 12), who pulled away from a 10-point halftime lead to hand Baylor (3-6, 0-5) its eighth straight conference loss. Kansas State's Brooks Rossman kicked three field goals.

Leon Patton had 115 yards on 17 carries for Kansas State, and Daniel Gonzalez caught seven passes for 104 yards and a touchdown.

Nelson registered K-State's first touchdown of the afternoon with a 13-yard connection with Freeman with 2:42 to play in the half. The Cyclones held a 21-10 halftime edge and boosted the lead to 18 on the first play of K-State's third possession in the third stanza. Freeman's throw was picked by Singleton who returned the deflection 21 yards to push the score to 28-10. Kansas State chipped away at the deficit with a Rossman 35-yard field goal on the following drive with 5:08 to play in the third.

James Johnson plunged in from five yards out and bringing the Wildcats to 28-20 with 1:34 to play in the third quarter.
