Nebraska Postgame Notes - Nebraska vs. Wake Forest

• Nebraska's win over Wake Forest gives the Huskers a 2-0 start for the third consecutive season. It also marks Nebraska's 10th consecutive win in its past 12 games against non-conference opponents.

▶ Head Coach Bill Callahan now owns a 3-1 record in road openers at Nebraska, and is 24-15 overall at NU.

▶ With the win, the Huskers own a perfect 3-0 all-time record against Wake Forest and a record of 14-14 all-time against ACC opponents, including 5-0 in the regular season

▶ Today's attendance of 32,483 was the smallest at a Nebraska game since 30,150 fans were in attendance at Nebraska's 1991 win at Oklahoma State.

▶ Senior wide receiver **Terrence Nunn** caught six passes for 83 yards in today's game, the second-highest receptions total in his career, trailing only his eight reception effort against lowa State in 2005. Today marked the 15th time in his career Nunn has caught four or more passes.

▶ Nunn has now caught a pass in 29 straight games, the second-longest streak in school history. Nunn's streak is also tied for the fourth-longest such streak in the nation entering today's game.

• Nunn's six receptions pushed his career receptions total to 109, the second-highest total in school history, trailing Johnny Rodgers' school record of 143. Nunn's 83 receiving yards, give him 1,429.

▶ Senior quarterback Sam Keller completed 24-of-41 passes for 258 yards and one touchdown in today's game. Keller's 258-yard effort surpassed his 193 yards last week against Nevada.

> Keller completed passes to seven different receivers in today's game, a week after 11 Husker receivers caught passes against Nevada.

▶ Keller was sharp on Nebraska's scoring drive in the two-minute drill before halftime, connecting on 8-of-11 passes for 80 yards, including a 25-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end Sean Hill.

> The 25-yard touchdown reception by Sean Hill was the first catch of his Nebraska career.

▶ Nebraska senior linebacker **Corey McKeon** intercepted a Wake Forest pass in the first quarter to set up a field goal that gave Nebraska a 3-0 lead. McKeon's interception was the fifth of his career, but his first since 2005, when he had a team-leading three interceptions. He also picked off a pass in 2004.

• Husker senior cornerback Zack Bowman gave Nebraska its second interception of the game when he picked off a pass in the end zone to stop a Wake Forest Red Zone drive in the fourth quarter. It was the third interception of Bowman's career and the first since he picked off a pass against Michigan to help the Huskers win the 2005 Alamo Bowl.

▶ Junior wide receiver Nate Swift had five receptions in today's game, pushing his career receptions total to 74. Swift passed Cory Ross and Tim Smith on the NU career receptions list and is now tied for fifth with Guy Ingles.

▶ Junior I-back Marlon Lucky caught three passes in today's game, covering 34 yards. It is the second consecutive game that Lucky has caught at least three passes for 30 yards.

▶ Lucky rushed 24 times for 90 yards in today's game, including a 22-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. Lucky's touchdown was his fifth of the season, after entering the season with six career touchdowns.

▶ Nebraska freshman place-kicker Alex Henery connected on his first career field-goal attempt in the first quarter, hitting a 22-yarder with 8:48 to play to give Nebraska a 3-0 lead.

• Nebraska junior punter **Dan Titchener** punted five times for a 45-yard average in today's game. Titchener connected on punts of 51 and 49 yards in the first quarter alone.

> Nebraska junior wide receiver Todd Peterson served as today's game captain, alongside senior captains Zackary Bowman, Brett Byford and Bo Ruud.
