Jayhawks Travel To Nebraska For Final True Road Game

QUICKLY -- Kansas (6-3 overall, 3-2 Big 12) will head to Lincoln, Neb. to face Nebraska (5-4, 2-3) on Saturday, Nov. 8 at 1:30 p.m.... The game will be televised on a pay-per-view basis (details will be made available later in the week)... Kansas played eight straight games on network or cable television before this week... The Kansas-Nebraska series is the nation's longest uninterrupted series as the teams will meet for the 103rd consecutive year... KU has won 18 of its last 22 and 21 of its last 26 games... KU is 1-2 on the road this season after going 4-0 in road games a year ago... KU has won 16 consecutive games against un-ranked teams.

BOWL ELIGIBLE -- With a 6-3 record Kansas has become bowl eligible for the fourth consecutive year, marking the first time the Jayhawks have won at least six games in four straight seasons since actually winning six straight five times from 1902-06. The Jayhawks were 7-5 and played in the Fort Worth Bowl in 2005, 6-6 and did not play in a bowl game in 2006, and 12-1 and played in the FedEx Orange Bowl in 2007. A bowl trip in 2008 would give the Jayhawks bowl games in consecutive years for the first time in school history.

TWO YEARS IN A ROW -- For the second season in a row, Kansas enters the Nebraska game with a better overall record than the Huskers as the Jayhawks are 6-3, while Nebraska is 5-4. Last year KU entered the game with an 8-0 mark, while Nebraska was 4-5. Prior to last year, the last time the Jayhawks entered a meeting with Nebraska with a better record was 1974 when KU was 4-1 and Nebraska 3-2. The teams had identical records in 1981 (both 5-2) and 2006 (both 3-1).

LAST TIME OUT -- Behind a career-high 181 yards rushing and a school-record-tying four touchdowns by Jake Sharp and a stout defense, the Kansas football team defeated state rival Kansas State, 52-21, on Saturday. The win marked the third straight year Kansas won the Governor's Cup and the 31-point margin of victory was the widest in a KU win over KSU since a 38-7 win in 1985. Additionally, KU's 52 points were the most for KU against KSU since a 55-0 victory in 1947. A Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium record crowd of 52,230 saw Sharp's 152 rushing yards in the first half surpass his previous game career high of 127 rushing yards set against Toledo last season. Sharp was also effective as a receiver with five receptions for 76 yards. For the game he had 257 all-purpose yards in the victory. Sharp became the sixth Jayhawk to score four touchdowns in a game with the last being Brandon McAnderson last season against Nebraska. In addition to Sharp's performance, the Kansas defense was solid, forcing a season-high five K-State turnovers, including two interceptions by senior defensive end Russell Brorsen. Kansas amassed 468 yards total offense to K-State's 355. Kansas scored the first 31 points of the game, all in the first half, to put the game away. KU took the opening drive 81 yards in 11 plays to take an early lead on a four-yard rush by Sharp up the middle. It marked the first opening drive touchdown of the season for the Jayhawks in 2008. KU junior quarterback Todd Reesing was 4-for-6 on the drive for 45 yards as KU converted all three of its third down tries. Reesing ended the game 14-for-23 yards with one touchdown. He also rushed for a season-high 47 yards and one touchdown.

UP NEXT -- Kansas will return to Lawrence to host its final home game of the season when the Jayhawks face fifth-ranked Texas. The Longhorns host Baylor this Saturday. The game will be the final home contest for 18 Kansas seniors, including DE Richard Alspaugh, S Tang Bacheyie, DE Russell Brorsen, WR Micah Brown, WR Raymond Brown, OC Ryan Cantrell, OT Matt Darton, WR Dexton Fields, WR Gary Green, CB Kendrick Harper, OG Chet Hartley, WR Marcus Herford, LB James Holt, DE John Larson, OG Adrian Mayes, LB Joe Mortensen, S Patrick Resby, and LB Mike Rivera.

DID YOU KNOW? -- Kansas has posted five six-plus win seasons in the seven-year Mark Mangino era. Prior to Mangino's arrival, Kansas had five six-win seasons in the previous 20 years with none in the six years prior to Mangino's arrival ahead of the 2002 season.

DID YOU KNOW? -- According to research by the Houston media relations office, Kansas' 13-7 record in its last 20 Big 12 games is tied for the 19th-best 20-game conference mark in the NCAA and is second in the Big 12 behind Oklahoma's 15-5 league record.

HEAD COACH MARK MANGINO -- Mark Mangino (Youngstown State, 1987) is in his seventh season at Kansas and seventh overall as a collegiate head coach with a 43-39 record... He was the consensus National Coach of the Year in 2007 after guiding Kansas to a school-record 12 wins... He is the first coach in history to win the Broyles National Assistant Coach of the Year honor (won in 2000 while at Oklahoma) and a National Head Coach of the Year honor... He has been a part of 12 bowl games in his last 15 years of coaching... He inherited a program which did not have a winning season for six straight years and has won at least six games in four of the last five seasons... He is the first coach in KU history to lead the Jayhawks to three bowl games... In his first six years, KU placed 41 of its players on the Academic All-Big 12 Team, including 14 in 2007... In his first six years, KU landed 63 players on All-Big 12 postseason teams, including 14 in 2007... Five Jayhawks have earned Associated Press All-America honors in his tenure... Prior to coming to KU, Mangino spent three seasons (1999-2001) at Oklahoma, including the final two years as the offensive coordinator... He also coached at Kansas State from 1991-98... Other coaching stints include New Castle (Pa.) High School (1981-84), Youngstown State (1985-86), Geneva College (1987-89) and Ellwood City (Pa.) High School (1990).

ASSISTANT COACHES

* Offensive Coordinator/QB - Ed Warinner (4th year)... Was offensive line and run-game coordinator at KU in 2003 and 2004 before serving in same position at Illinois in 2005-06.. Was offensive coordinator at Army for 13 years (1987-99).

* Defensive Coordinator/Safeties - Clint Bowen (8th year)... After spending the last two years as co-defensive coordinator, has taken over the KU defense this season... Played at KU (1990, 92-93) and was the team's leading tackler as a senior... Grew up in Lawrence.

* Offensive Line/Running Game Coordinator - John Reagan (4th year)... As run-game coordinator and offensive line coach, KU has averaged more rushing yards in each successive season (94 before he arrived in 2004 to 134 in 2005, 176 in 2006 and 188 in 2007).

* Tight Ends/Recruiting Coordinator - Brandon Blaney (7th year)... Is entering his ninth year on a coaching staff with Mark Mangino (was an offensive line graduate assistant at Oklahoma).

* Running Backs/Special Teams Coordinator - Louie Matsakis (2nd year)... Was at KU in 2004-05 as quality control coordinator... Has coached special teams throughout his career and is working with running backs for second straight season.

* Cornerbacks - Je'Ney Jackson (2nd year)... Former assistant strength coach is in his second year as a field coach... Was an all-WAC cornerback during his collegiate career at Wyoming.

* Linebackers - Steve Tovar (2nd year)... Spent 2006 as a defensive assistant with the Miami Dolphins... Played in the NFL for eight years after an All-America playing career at Ohio State.

* Wide Receivers - David Beaty (1st year)... First year at Kansas after coaching wide receivers at Rice in 2006 and 2007... Was a highly successful high school coach in the state of Texas before going to Rice.

* Defensive Line - Joe Bob Clements (1st year)... Joined the KU staff after spending the past two seasons at San Diego State... Coached at his alma mater Kansas State, where he was a defensive end... Lived in Lawrence during his youth.

2008 CAPTAINS -- Captains for the 2008 Jayhawks are OC Ryan Cantrell, LB Joe Mortensen, QB Todd Reesing and LB Mike Rivera. Cantrell, Mortensen and Rivera are all seniors, while Reesing is a junior.

FOOTBALL FACILITY COMPLETED -- The Anderson Family Football Complex, a \$31 million facility that houses the Kansas football team was completed in July this year. The building is adjacent to the southwest side of Memorial Stadium. The 80,000-square foot building includes offices, academic areas, a weight room, locker rooms, an audio-visual room, meeting rooms, a cardio room, a hydro-therapy room, a nutrition area and a display area. In addition, two practice fields were built just southeast of the stadium.

DID YOU KNOW? -- With a 43-39 record, Mark Mangino needs just one victory to tie Jack Mitchell (44-42-5 from 1958-66) for third on the KU coaches victory list. A.R. Kennedy (52-9-4 from 1904-10) is the winningest coach in KU history in terms of wins, while Glen Mason (47-54-1 from 1988-96) is second.

THE KU-NU SERIES -- Nebraska leads the all-time series by an 88-23-3 count, including a 42-15-2 advantage in games played in Lincoln. The Jayhawks have won two of the last three meetings with the loss, a 39-32 overtime decision at Lincoln in 2006. Prior to KU's win in 2005, Nebraska had won 36 consecutive games from 1969-2004.

THE NATION'S LONGEST UNINTERRUPTED SERIES - Kansas and Nebraska will be meeting for the 103rd consecutive season, making the series the nation's longest uninterrupted. Minnesota and Wisconsin have played 101 consecutive times heading into 2008, while Clemson and South Carolina have met 99 straight years before this season. KU's series with Kansas State (now 99 straight) and with Oklahoma (96 straight between 1903-97) round out the top five.

NATION'S THIRD-MOST PLAYED SERIES -- The Kansas-Nebraska series is the third-most played series in the country as the teams will be meeting for the 115th time since the first game in 1892. Only Minnesota-Wisconsin (117 meetings) and Kansas-Missouri (116 meetings) have met more times than these two programs.

KU-NU LAST TIME -- Todd Reesing threw a school-record six touchdown passes and had 354 yards through the air while Brandon McAnderson ran for 119 yards and a school-record tying four touchdowns as eighth-ranked Kansas beat Nebraska 76-39 in Lawrence on Nov. 3, 2007. After a three and out on their opening drive, the Jayhawks scored on 10 of their next 11 possessions (exception was a one-play kneel down to end the first half). KU's 76 points were the third-most in school history, as well as the most allowed by Nebraska in its history. The Jayhawks produced a school-record tying 34 first downs and ran 90 plays on the night en route to 572 yards of total offense. Reesing set school records for touchdown passes in a game (six) and in a single-season (23). Four of his scoring passes in the first half went to four different players. KU forced four straight Nebraska turnovers in the second half en route to getting five turnovers on the day.

KU-NU LAST TIME IN LINCOLN -- QB Adam Barmann threw for 405 yards while RB Jon Cornish gained 145 yards on the ground, but it was not enough as a furious Jayhawk rally fell short as #21 Nebraska escaped with a 39-32 overtime victory at Lincoln on Sept. 30, 2006. Trailing 24-7 late in the first half, the Jayhawks scored 19 consecutive points to grab a 25-24 lead. The Jayhawks tied the game at 32 with 46 seconds remaining in regulation as Barmann connected with Brian Murph from the Nebraska 26. NU scored on the first possession of overtime, while KU could not match the Husker's touchdown. Both teams ran up more than 500 yards of total offense (Kansas - 574 and Nebraska - 511). Two Jayhawk receivers had 100-yard receiving games as Murph finished with 129 on eight catches and Dexton Fields had 108 on eight receptions.

KU-NU CONNECTIONS -- Kansas has two players on its roster from the state of Nebraska in WR Micah Brown (Kearney) and TE Tim Biere (Omaha/Westside HS)... NU's defensive coordinator Carl Pelini was a restricted earnings coach at Kansas State in 1991 when KU head coach Mark Mangino was an assistant with the Wildcats. Pelini also coached at Blue Valley (Kan.) HS and Winnetonka (Kan.) HS... KU RB coach Tim Beck as an assistant coach at Kansas from 2005-07. He also coached at Kansas State from 1991-92 when Mangino was there... NU LB coach Mike Ekeler is a Kansas State graduate and coached at Manhattan (Kan.) HS... NU WR coach Ted Gilmore was a WR coach at Wyoming when KU CB coach Je'Ney Jackson was a defensive back for the Cowboys. Gilmore was the TE coach at Kansas in 1999... NU DE coach John Papuchis was a defensive GA at Kansas from 2001-03... Nebraska players from the state of Kansas include LB Joseph Camarata (Overland Park), FB Kyler Reed (Shawnee/St. Thomas Aquinas), and IB Kenny Wilson (Liberal).

AWAY -- Kansas is 6-3 in its last nine road games. In the last three years, Kansas is 6-6 on the road with four of the six losses by one score. Included in that stretch is a seven-point overtime loss at Nebraska in 2006.

AND HOME -- Kansas had won 13 straight home games before Texas Tech posted a victory in Lawrence two weeks ago. KU bounced back last week with a win against Kansas State. The Jayhawks have won 23 of their last 26 played at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium. In addition, the Jayhawks have won 17 straight against non-conference opponents in Lawrence.

DRAWING A CROWD -- Kansas is on pace to set a season average attendance record for the fourth consecutive year. KU has already announced that the season finale against Texas is sold out. This year KU has twice established a single-game school record (52,112 vs. FIU and 52,230 vs. Kansas State). Here is a look at the top season attendance marks in school history:

THE LAST 26 -- Kansas has won 20 of its last 26 games dating back to the last part of the 2006 season. That is the best 26-game stretch for the program since going 25-1 from 1907-1910.

FACING THE BEST -- In the last half of the regular season Kansas is facing six of the most explosive offenses in the country as all six rank in the top 14 in the NCAA in passing offense.. Here is a look at the final six opponents, a stretch which the Jayhawks are halfway through with current rankings:

MORE ON THE LAST HALF -- The final half of the season for KU features teams with a combined record of 41-13, four teams ranked in the polls, and as mentioned above, all six in the top 14 of the nation in passing offense.

RANKED OPPONENTS -- There are five Big 12 teams in the Associated Press poll and Kansas has or will meet four of them this season. KU also met South Florida, which was ranked at game time. The Jayhawks could play five ranked teams (six in a possible bowl game) for the most ranked opponents KU has met in the same season since playing five in 1998. KU has played six ranked teams twice in school history (1977 and 1978).

BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL -- True freshman Daymond Patterson, who had started at wide receiver in his second and third collegiate games against Louisiana Tech and South Florida, started at cornerback against Kansas State on Saturday. Last year Aqib Talib, the regular starter at corner, also started at wide receiver against Kansas State.

GETTING TO HARD TO GET QUARTERBACKS -- In the last two games Kansas has recorded six sacks with two against Texas Tech and four against Kansas State (This figure includes a sack by Max Onyegbule against Kansas State, which was not credited in the game's boxscore). What makes this impressive is that Texas Tech entered the game having allowed only one sack in its first seven games and Kansas State had allowed just six to rank third in the NCAA for fewest sacks allowed. The Jayhawks have recorded at least one sack against eight of nine opponents this year (did not get one at Oklahoma).

DEFENSIVE LINEMEN GETTING PICKS -- DE Russell Brorsen came up with two interceptions last week against Kansas State for his second and third career pickoffs (also had one at Kansas State last year). Earlier this year DE Maxwell Onyegbule had an interception at Iowa State. KU defensive linemen have come up with seven interceptions in the last 20 games.

RUSHING GAME ON TRACK -- Much was made of the Kansas running game in the beginning of the season when the Jayhawks averaged just 118.6 yards in the first five games. In the last four contests however, KU has averaged 181.5, including a 280-yard performance against Kansas State last week. The 280 yards were the most in a game for KU since 2001.

FIRST QUARTER OFFENSE -- In the first six games the Kansas offense scored just 20 points combined, including three straight games without a point in the opening period. In the last three games, KU has scored a combined 42 points in the first 15 minutes with seven at Oklahoma, 14 vs. Texas Tech and 21 vs. Kansas State. Against KSU last Saturday, the Jayhawks scored a touchdown on their first possession for the first time this year (only other score on a first possession this year was a field goal against Louisiana Tech).

SCORING QUICK -- The Kansas offense has shown the ability to score quickly recently. The Jayhawks have 18 touchdown drives of less than two minutes, including 10 in the last four games.

LONG DRIVES -- The Kansas offense has had to go a long distance for a number of its touchdown drives in the last part of the season. In its last 24 touchdown drives, the Jayhawks have marched at least 70 yards on 15 occasions. KU's first touchdown drive against Kansas State (81 yards) marked the seventh straight KU touchdown drive of at least 70 yards. KU added two more 70-plus yard drives later in the game.

FIELD POSITION WOES -- Kansas has had worse average starting position than its opponent in six of nine games. In games against Colorado, Oklahoma and Texas Tech, the Jayhawks averaged starting inside their own 27, but against Kansas State last Saturday, the Jayhawks averaged starting at their own 45-yard line.

MISCELLANEOUS NCAA STAT RANKINGS -- Here is a look at some miscellaneous NCAA statistical team rankings for Kansas (top 20 only):

- 7th in third-down efficiency (52.0 percent)

TARGET LIST GETTING SMALLER -- In the last two games, KU has had just four different players with receptions in each contest and they have been the same for each game (Kerry Meier, Dezmon Briscoe, Johnathan Wilson and Jake Sharp). In each of the first seven games of the year Kansas had at least seven different players record receptions each game with a high of 10 different players in the season opener against FIU.

WIDE RECEIVER DUO -- The duo of Kerry Meier and Dezmon Briscoe is fast becoming one of the most prolific duos in Kansas football history. Through nine games both have recorded at least 50 receptions and 700 yards. Here is a look at seasons where KU has had more than one 700-yard receiver and more than one player with at least 50 receptions:

MORE RECEIVING NOTES -- Here are some additional notes on the Kansas wide receivers:

- Five different KU players have recorded a total of nine 100-yard receiving games already this season. The nine 100-yard receiving games are the most in a season in school history (eight last season), while the five different 100-yard receivers are the most in school history (four in 1983).
- KU has had four games with two players recording at least 100 yards receiving this season.
- Dezmon Briscoe owns the nation's best receiving yardage game this season with a school record 269 yards on a school record 12 receptions at Oklahoma.
- Kerry Meier tied a school record with three consecutive 100-yard receiving games earlier this season.
- Meier had matched the school record of single-game receptions with 11 at South Florida, a mark later broken by Briscoe at Oklahoma (12).
- RB Jake Sharp became the first KU running back in school history to record 100 receiving yards in a game with 107 at Iowa State.

BRISCOE HAS RECORD-BREAKING DAY -- Sophomore wide receiver Dezmon Briscoe had a record-setting game at fourth-ranked Oklahoma earlier this year. Briscoe set school records in both receptions (12) and receiving yards (269) to go along with two touchdowns against the Sooners. The 269 yards are the most in a game in the nation this season, as well as the second-best in Big 12 history (Adrius Bowman of Oklahoma State had 300 against Kansas in 2006). The previous school mark was 11 receptions by five players, including Kerry Meier earlier this season, while the old school yardage record was 221 by Quintin Smith against Louisville in 1989.

NATIONAL LEADER -- LB James Holt is tied for first in the NCAA with 0.56 fumbles forced per game. Holt has forced five on the season with two against both South Florida and Kansas State and one vs. FIU.

RECORDS MATCHED AGAINST KSU

-- Last week against Kansas State WR Dezmon Briscoe tied the school record for career touchdown receptions as the sophomore has 17 in his brief career. He tied Willie Vaughn and Bruce Adams for that record. He also matched Marcus Henry's 2007 record of 10 touchdown receptions in a season. RB Jake Sharp tied a school record with four touchdowns against the Wildcats. All four of his scores were rushing touchdowns, which also tied a school record for single-game rushing scores.

RECORD WATCH FOR NEBRASKA

-- QB Todd Reesing needs 83 passing yards for the school career passing yardage mark. The junior has thrown for 6,328 yards, while Frank Seurer owns the record at 6,410. Marcus Herford needs two kickoff returns to match Greg Heaggans' school record of 80 career kickoff returns. WR Kerry Meier needs four receptions to match the school single-season record of 70 by Richard Estell set in 1985.

MEIER AMONG NATION'S BEST IN NEW POSITION

-- Junior QB/WR Kerry Meier has adapted to the wide receiver position after starting at quarterback as a freshman. Here are some quick notes on Meier:

- Ranks eighth in the NCAA in receptions per game at 7.33.
- Is 34th in the NCAA in receiving yards per game at 82.44.
- Tied school record with three straight 100-yard receiving games (stopped vs. Colorado when he had 94 yards).
- Tied then school record for single-game receptions with 11 at South Florida (Dezmon Briscoe set new receptions record with 12 at Oklahoma).
- Owns a school receiving record (most consecutive 100-yard receiving games) and a school passing record (most touchdown passes by a freshman with 13).
- Has caught at least two passes in 17 consecutive games.
- His 66 receptions already this season are tied for the second most in a season in KU history (record is 70 by Richard Estell in 1985).
- Of his 66 receptions, 41 have been for first downs. Of those 41 first down catches, 14 have come on third or fourth down.
- After starting at quarterback as a freshman and throwing for 1,193 yards, he has been the team's backup and was 25 of 29 for 275 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions last season. Meier has thrown just two passes this year, a 15-yard completion at Oklahoma and a 27-yard completion against Kansas State, although he was not lined up at quarterback on the plays.
- Attends quarterback meetings and sees limited time at wide receiver in practice.
- Is the team's holder on place kicks and is also the team's backup punter.
- In 2007 he became the first KU player to record a rushing touchdown, passing touchdown and receiving touchdown in the same season since Garfield Taylor in 1981.
- In 2007 he became the first KU player to record a rush, pass, reception and punt in the same season since Donald Shanklin in 1968.
- Doesn't wear gloves.

SHARP GETTING YARDS - RB Jake Sharp has come on strong in Big 12 games, averaging 112.2 rushing yards per game and 154.2 yards from scrimmage in those five contests. In this stretch, Sharp had 79 rushing and 107 receiving yards at Iowa State and three 100-yard rushing games (118 vs. Colorado, 103 at Oklahoma and 181 vs. Kansas State).

OFFENSIVE NOTES -- KU's 445.6 yards of total offense per game are second in school history only to the 479.8 put up last season... KU's 299.0 passing yards per game are on pace to beat last year's school record of 291.0... KU rushed for 280 yards against Kansas State last Saturday, its most rushing yards since 2001... KU has averaged 181.5 rushing yards in the last four games after averaging 118.6 in the first five games of the season... KU has produced at least 400 yards of total offense in seven of nine games this year... After committing five turnovers against Texas Tech, KU turned it over just once against Kansas State last week... KU's 52 points against KSU last week were its most since scoring 76 against Nebraska last year... In the last 22 games KU has scored 50-plus points six times, at least 40 points 10 times and at least 30 points on 16 occasions... KU's seven explosives (plays of 20-plus yards) against Kansas State, matched a season-high (also had seven vs. USF and Iowa State).

DEFENSIVE NOTES -- KU has limited the opponent to less than 100 yards rushing in five games this season, including 91 by Kansas State last week... KU recorded three interceptions against Kansas State on Saturday after not getting a pick in consecutive games at Oklahoma and vs. Texas Tech... The five turnovers by KSU were the most forced by the Jayhawks since Nebraska had five last year... After allowing back-to-back 400-yard passing games and back-to-back 500-plus yard total offense games against Oklahoma and Texas Tech, KU held Kansas State to 264 passing yards and just 355 total yards (including just 91 rushing yards)... The KU defense has toughened up after a turnover as the opponents have scored just four touchdowns off 16 KU turnovers this year... KU's shutout of KSU in the first half stopped a streak of the opponents scoring in eight straight quarters.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES -- The opponents had averaged better starting field position than the Jayhawks in four straight games before KU started on its own 45 and Kansas State started at its own 25 last week... There has been a combined four punts by KU and its opponent in each of the last two games... KU ranks 119th in the NCAA in kickoff returns at just 15.79 yards per return. Last season KU was seventh in the NCAA at 25.21 per return... KU is listed 23rd in punt return average (12.68) after ranking 103rd (5.97) a year ago.

QUARTERBACK NOTES -- Todd Reesing - Has established 31 school records and is within reach of the school career passing yardage mark (needs 83)... Owns an 18-4 record as a starter... In 25 career games he has thrown 56 touchdowns to just 19 interceptions and in 22 games as a starter he has tossed 53 TDs to 16 pickoffs... Has thrown for 300 yards five times this year and 10 times in his career... His 56 career touchdown passes rank in the top 10 in Big 12 history. Kerry Meier - The backup quarterback has not played a single down at the position this year, instead excelling as a wide receiver... Last year he completed 25 of 29 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns... Started eight games at quarterback in 2006 and threw for 1,193 yards and a KU freshman record 13 touchdowns... He is two of two for 42 yards passing this year from his wide receiver position. Tyler Lawrence... Has seen action as a backup in three games this season... Is one of two passing for 11 yards (completion came against Sam Houston State).

RUNNING BACK NOTES -- Jake Sharp - Has averaged 112.2 rushing yards and 154.2 yards from scrimmage in five Big 12 games... Has three 100-yard rushing games in his last four contests... Against Iowa State he recorded the first 100-yard receiving game in history by a KU running back with three for 107, while also rushing for 79 yards... Coming off a 181-yard, four-touchdown performance against Kansas State. Jocques Crawford - Has produced at least 20 rushing yards in consecutive games for the first time this year with 44 vs. Texas Tech and 22 vs. Kansas State... Was the 2007 Junior College Offensive Player of the Year last season at Cisco JC. Angus Quigley -- Earned his first college start against Sam Houston and responded by rushing for 61 yards on 16 carries... After not getting a carry in two straight games, has rushed 10 times for 54 yards in last two contests combined... Has lost just three yards on 54 carries this season... Has 281 rushing yards on the season after recording 98 yards in 2007.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES -- Kerry Meier - On pace to become the KU single-season receptions leader with 66 catches already (tied for second, just four off the record)... Has three 100-yard receiving games to his credit this season... Has recorded at least two catches in 17 straight games... After a four-game stretch where he averaged 8.75 receptions and 118.75 yards per game, he has averaged 4.3 catches for 44.67 yards in the last three games... Dezmon Briscoe - Had the top receiving yardage game in the NCAA this year with 12 catches for 269 yards (both school records) at Oklahoma... Has three 100-yard receiving games this year... Has tied school records for career touchdown receptions (17) and season touchdown receptions (10)... Has caught at least five passes in six of nine games this year... Has caught at least two passes in 15 straight

Had caught at least one pass in 28 consecutive games he had played in before getting shutout against Texas Tech and Kansas State in last two weeks... Had also caught at least two passes in 26 of 28 games before Texas Tech... Was team's receptions leader in 2006 and 2007.

TIGHT END NOTES -- Tim Biere - True freshman has four receptions on the season with a season best of two for 26 yards against Colorado, but has not had a catch in the three games since then. Bradley Dedeaux - Entered the year with one career catch and caught two in season opener against FIU.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES -- Jeremiah Hatch -- A redshirt freshman, who started in his first collegiate game against Louisiana Tech and has started the last eight games... The starter at right tackle, he moved to left tackle at Iowa State and has remained there since. Adrian Mayes -- Started all 13 games at left guard last season. Ryan Cantrell -- Listed on the Rimington Trophy Watch List... Started all 13 games at center as a junior last season... Also started five games as a freshman in 2005. Chet Hartley -- Started 13 games at right guard after transferring from junior college a year ago. Jeff Spikes -- A redshirt freshman, who earned a start in his first collegiate game against FIU... Started first four games of the year at left tackle and the last five at right tackle. Ben Lueken -- True freshman has seen action in a backup role at the tackle position. Sal Capra -- Has seen time as a backup at both guard positions.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES -- Russell Brorsen - Recorded two interceptions last week against Kansas State, giving him three for his career (also had a pick against KSU last season)... Has started 30 consecutive games and is the only player on the team to start at least one game in four different seasons... Leads the KU defensive linemen with 27 tackles, including making six in the season opener against FIU... Is the only defensive lineman with at least one tackle in every game this year. Richard Johnson - Redshirt freshman started every game this year before last week against Kansas State due to injury... In consecutive games at Iowa State and against Colorado he recorded five and four tackles respectively... Had a combined four tackles in the other six games. Jamal Greene - Started each of the last three games and responded with four tackles against both Oklahoma and Texas Tech, but did not have a stop against Kansas State. John Larson - An on and off starter this year after starting all 13 games last season. Caleb Blakesley - Had started 15 consecutive games before missing the first snap against South Florida... Opened the year with a career-high six tackles against FIU... Missed the Texas Tech game due to injury but returned to make three tackles vs. Kansas State. Jake Laptad - Has recorded a sack in four of the last six games and leads the team with six sacks... Six of his 18 tackles on the year have been for loss... Maxwell Onyegbule - Recorded an interception at Iowa State, the fifth by a Jayhawk defensive lineman in a 16-game span... Was credited with a sack against Kansas State after the coaches reviewed the film. Jeff Wheeler - Started the first three games of the year. Darius Parrish -- Had a season-best three tackles against Kansas State after entering the game with five stops on the season.

LINEBACKER NOTES -- James Holt - Had double-digit tackle totals in three straight games before getting five against Kansas State... However, he had two sacks, another tackle for loss, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and a PBU against the Wildcats... Ranks in the top 100 in the NCAA in four different statistical categories, including tied for first in forced fumbles, tied for 39th in tackles for loss, tied for 75th in tackles and tied for 99th in sacks. Joe Mortensen - Has recorded at least five tackles in eight of nine games this year, including five straight... Has 5.5 tackles for loss to rank third on the team... Has started a team-best 34 consecutive games as well as a team-leading 34 total games in his career. Mike Rivera - Recorded 13 tackles (one shy of his career high) against Texas Tech two weeks ago... Also added a pass broken up... Had seven stops against Kansas State... Did not start against Sam Houston State stopping a 28-game streak... Did not record a tackle in that game, marking his first game without a tackle since the Iowa State game of 2005. Arist Wright - After recording 17 tackles in three games combined, did not have a tackle against Texas Tech... His eight stops against Colorado were a career high... He recorded three stops against Kansas State last week. Justin Springer - Saw most extensive action of his career at Oklahoma and responded with a career-best eight tackles... Was injured in the Kansas State game and will miss the remainder of the season.

SECONDARY NOTES -- Justin Thornton -- Has started the last two games at cornerback after starting the previous seven at free safety... Has recorded at least six tackles in six games this season, including each of the last three... In first start at corner against Texas Tech he had six tackles and two passes broken up... Has defended 11 passes this year with 10 PBU's and an interception... Best game this year was against Sam Houston State when he had eight tackles, an interception and four passes broken up. Darrell Stuckey - Has averaged 10.3 tackles in the last three games with 12 at Oklahoma, 10 vs. Texas Tech and nine vs. Kansas State... Had an interception against Kansas State and leads the team with three this year. One of two players, along with Joe Mortensen, to have at least four tackles in every game this year. Daymond Patterson... Has

JAYHAWK FANS FLOCKING TO KIVISTO -- After three straight years of record-setting season attendance averages, the Jayhawks appear to be on the way to a fourth straight record. KU sold out two of its first three games with a school record 52,112 against FIU and 51,767 vs. Sam Houston State. KU also drew 48,621 on a rainy day against Louisiana Tech and 49,566 vs. Colorado on Saturday. The Texas game is already sold out. Here is a look at some attendance highlights:

- Kansas is on pace for its fourth straight year of breaking the season attendance average mark. Through six games KU has averaged 50,737 fans per game. Last year's record-breaking average was 46,784.
- KU's attendance of 52,112 vs. FIU in the 2008 season opener was a school record beating the 51,910 set against Nebraska last year. However, that mark was broken last week with a crowd of 52,230 for KSU.

KU FOOTBALL PROGRAM NOTABLE -- Here are a few notes about the Kansas football program in the Mark Mangino era:

- KU was the only school to rank in the top five nationally in both scoring offense (second) and scoring defense (fourth) in 2007.
- When KU entered the national polls in 2007, it marked the first time since 1996 the Jayhawks were listed.
- KU has set season attendance records in each of the previous three seasons.
- KU has been to three bowl games in the last five years after seven straight years without a bowl game.
- KU has produced at least six wins in four straight years for the first time since 1902-06.
- KU has landed 63 players on postseason All-Big 12 teams in the Mark Mangino era.
- KU has had 41 players earn Academic All-Big 12 First Team honors in the Mangino era.
- KU has produced five of the top 10 passing yardage season averages in school history, three of the top 10 total offensive yardage seasons and three of the top six scoring averages in the Mark Mangino era.
- In 2007, KU produced a 3,000-yard passer (Todd Reesing), 1,000-yard rusher (Brandon McAnderson) and a 1,000-yard receiver (Marcus Henry) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- KU improved its rushing yardage average in three straight seasons, going from 94.0 in 2004 to 188.8 in 2007.
- KU has kept the opponent under 120 yards rushing per game in each of the past four seasons, including just 83.2 in 2005 and 94.8 in 2007.

Junior QB Todd Reesing connected with Dezmon Briscoe for three touchdown passes, while true freshman Daymond Patterson had 75-yard punt return for a touchdown in his first collegiate game to lead 14th-ranked Kansas to a convincing 40-10 victory against the FIU Golden Panthers in front of a record crowd of 52,112 at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium. Reesing completed a school-record 37 passes on 52 attempts, amassing 256 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. Briscoe finished the night with a career-best nine catches for 55 yards. His three touchdown grabs also tied a career high he set against Nebraska in 2007. Kerry Meier pulled in a career-best nine balls for 62 yards as 10 different Jayhawks had receptions. It took almost two-thirds of the first quarter for the Jayhawks to get going, but once they did they didn't look back. KU scored on five of six offensive possessions with a punt return for a score in that stretch as well. The KU defense limited FIU to just 139 yards of total offense, including just 73 passing yards. The Jayhawks forced three turnovers and turned those into 10 points.

GAME #2 Sept. 6 at Lawrence, Kan.**#14 KANSAS 29, LOUISIANA TECH 0**

Not even soggy conditions could stop 14th-ranked Kansas quarterback Todd Reesing, as the junior connected on 32-of-38 passes for a career-high 412 yards and three touchdowns in KU's 29-0 shutout victory against Louisiana Tech. The victory was KU's 11th straight home victory and 16th consecutive win at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium against non-conference opponents. Defensively, KU posted its second shutout in the Mark Mangino era. Last season the Jayhawks posted a 62-0 win against Southeastern Louisiana on Sept. 8. A crowd of 48,621, the second largest non-conference home crowd at KU, saw Reesing's 412 passing yards for the game rank third on the KU single-game list. Reesing now holds four of the top 13 single-game passing yards in KU history. His 84.2 completion percentage against the Bulldogs ranks fifth on the KU single-game list. Freshman Daymond Patterson and sophomore Dezmon Briscoe combined for 15 catches and 276 yards receiving from Reesing. Patterson ended the game with eight catches for 130 yards and two touchdowns, while Briscoe had seven receptions for a career-high 146 yards and one score. Patterson and Briscoe became the first two Jayhawks to record 100 receiving yards in the same game since the 2006 season against Nebraska - Brian Murph (8-129) and Dexton Fields (8-108). Not to be outshined, junior Kerry Meier led all receivers with nine receptions for 71 yards on the night.

In a back and forth battle #13 Kansas fell to the 19th-ranked USF Bulls 37-34, on a 43-yard field goal by Bulls kicker Maikon Bonani as time expired. After jumping out to a 20-3 first-half lead, the Jayhawks gave up 31 unanswered points to fall behind 34-20 with 13:59 to go in the game. Quarterback Todd Reesing proceeded to lead a KU rally, engineering back-to-back touchdown drives that he capped off with touchdown passes to wide receiver Johnathan Wilson and running back Angus Quigley, respectively to tie the score at 34 with 5:32 left in the game. The Jayhawks had a chance to win the game with under a minute to go, having advanced the ball to their own 40-yard line with 0:41 to go in the game. However, Reesing's pass on first and 10 was picked off by USF defensive back Nate Allen and returned all the way to the KU 27-yard line. The Bulls ran the clock all the way down to 0:02, and Bonani's field goal attempt hooked inside the right upright to give USF the victory. Reesing had a remarkable game in a losing effort, completing 34 of 51 passes for 381 yards, three touchdowns and an interception. The junior from Austin, Texas, also had a rushing touchdown, a four-yard scamper in the second quarter that gave KU a 20-3 lead. Wilson caught 10 passes for 179 yards and two touchdowns, all three career highs. Kerry Meier tied a school record with 11 receptions, which resulte in 120 yards. Defensively James Holt had 13 tackles, including three for loss and two forced fumbles.

#19 KANSAS 38, SAM HOUSTON STATE 14

Kansas junior quarterback Todd Reesing threw for 356 yards and two touchdowns to lead the No. 19 Jayhawk football team to a 38-14 victory against Sam Houston State. In a battle of quarterbacks, Reesing went 23-for-38 for 356 yards and two touchdowns to outshine SHSU's Rhett Bomar, who went for 26-for-46 for 340 yards, a touchdown and three interceptions. The three KU interceptions led to 21 of Kansas' 38 points. For Reesing, it marked his third-straight game of 136-plus passing yards this season. Additionally, the junior from Austin, Texas, broke the school record for most 200-yard passing games with 14 for his career, including all four games in 2008. For the second straight week, one of Reesing's favorite targets was junior Kerry Meier, who had eight catches for a career-high 136 yards, surpassing his career best of 120 receiving yards set at South Florida on September 12. Jayhawk sophomore wide receiver Dezmon Briscoe had his second 100-yard receiving game of the year with 124 yards on five catches. Both Meier and Briscoe were recipients of Reesing touchdown throws in the game. Kansas' defense allowed a season-low 45 rushing yards on 16 attempts for the Bearkats as the Jayhawks outgained SHSU 528 to 385 in total offense.

#16 KANSAS 35, IOWA STATE 33

Behind 186 all-purpose yards from Jake Sharp and an impressive second-half passing performance from Todd Reesing, Kansas turned a 20-point halftime deficit into a 35-33 win against Iowa State in its Big 12 opener at Jack Trice Stadium. The come from behind victory tied the third biggest comeback in school history behind only a 26-point deficit at Iowa State in 1992 and a 21-point deficit vs. Colorado in 1950. A sea of 47,847 Cyclone fans were riding high as Iowa State jumped out to a fast 14-0 lead in the first quarter. By halftime KU was down 20-0 and had mustered just 93 yards and only five first downs. KU went three and out on each of its first three possessions. Everything changed in the second half when Kansas scored touchdowns on five of its six drives, before sitting on the ball to end the game. Reesing was 10-of-12 for 260 yards and three TDs in the second half to finish the game 18-of-26 for 319 yards. Meier hauled in seven catches for 125 yards and two scores. He now has 26 catches for 381 yards and three TDs over the last three games and tied the school record with his third-straight game with more than 100 yards receiving. Linebackers James Holt and Joe Mortensen each had eight tackles to lead the KU defense, while four different players broke up passes including Jake Laptad, who batted down a crucial pass at the line in the final minute. Laptad and Mortensen each posted one sack.

#16 KANSAS 30, COLORADO 14

Kansas junior Jake Sharp rushed for 118 yards on a career-high 31 carries and scored a personal-best three touchdowns to lead #16 Kansas to a 30-14 victory against Colorado at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium Saturday. Sharp's 118 rushing yards were a season high for a KU running back and the second highest of his career behind his 127 yards against Toledo last season. His 31 attempts were the most by a Jayhawk since Jon Cornish also had 31 attempts against Nebraska in 2006 and his three touchdowns tied for sixth-best in school history. Sharp has now rushed for 197 yards in his last two games. Not to be overshadowed by Sharp's performance was the effort of KU's defense, which held Colorado to 233 yards of total offense, nearly 100 yards shy of its 325 per game average. The defense also came up with two interceptions on the day. KU quarterback Todd Reesing completed 27 passes on 34 attempts with one touchdown and no interceptions for 256 yards. The junior moved into second on the KU total offense career list, currently with 6,084 yards. Junior wide receiver Kerry Meier caught nine Reesing passes for 94 yards to mark the fourth game this season he had nine or more receptions in a game. Kansas scored 14 fourth-quarter points on two Sharp touchdowns to extend a 16-14 lead en route to the victory.

#4 OKLAHOMA 45, #16 KANSAS 31

Despite a record-breaking performance by wide receiver Dezmon Briscoe, the No. 16 Kansas football team was defeated by the fourth-ranked Oklahoma Sooners, 45-31 at Gaylord Family-Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. Briscoe caught 12 Todd Reesing passes for 269 yards, both school records, and two touchdowns to lead the Jayhawks in a losing effort. Reesing finished the game 24 of 41 for 342 yards and two touchdowns passing. It was the fifth 300-yard game of the season for the junior from Austin, Texas, tying his own school single-season record that he set last year. Junior running back Jake Sharp was also impressive in defeat, carrying the ball 12 times for 103 yards and a touchdown. It marked the second consecutive game that the Salina, Kan., product eclipsed the 100-yard barrier. Kansas trailed just 24-17 at halftime, and was still within seven at 31-24 after junior running back Jake Sharp waltzed in for a 17-yard touchdown run with 11:21 to play in the third quarter. The first half for the Jayhawks was highlighted by a 69-yard Reesing to Briscoe touchdown connection which cut the Sooner lead to 21-17 with 2:35 to go in the half. Oklahoma added a field goal before the break, and Kansas was behind just 24-17 with the second half to play.

#8 TEXAS TECH 63, #19 KANSAS 21

Sixth-ranked Texas Tech's offensive firepower was too much for 19th-ranked Kansas as the visiting Red Raiders posted a 63-21 victory on Saturday. Texas Tech scored touchdowns on nine of its first 11 possessions, while stopping Kansas' 13-game home field winning streak. The teams were tied at 14 after the first quarter as KU managed its highest scoring first period of the season. However, The Red Raiders proceeded to score 49 unanswered points before KU scored a touchdown with 3:52 left in the game. Texas Tech ran up 556 yards of total offense, while holding Kansas to just 315 yards, the Jayhawks' fewest yards in its last 27 games. KU turned the ball over five times on the day, including on three straight possessions to start the third quarter. QB Todd Reesing suffered through his worst day as a Jayhawk hitting 16 of 26 passes for just 154 yards with three interceptions and two touchdowns. RB Jake Sharp ran for 80 yards on 13 carries, while WR Dezmon Briscoe pulled in eight balls for 55 yards and one touchdown and WR Kerry Meier had six catches for 70 yards. LB Mike Rivera and LB James Holt each had 13 tackles, while SS Darrell Stuckey made 10 stops.

Behind a career-high 181 yards rushing and a school-record-tying four touchdowns by Jake Sharp and a stout defense, the Kansas football team defeated state rival Kansas State, 52-21, on Saturday. The win marked the third straight year Kansas won the Governor's Cup and the 31-point margin of victory was the widest in a KU win over KSU since a 38-7 win in 1985. Additionally, KU's 52 points were the most for KU against KSU since a 55-0 victory in 1947. A Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium record crowd of 52,230 saw Sharp's 152 rushing yards in the first half surpass his previous game career high of 127 rushing yards set against Toledo last season. Sharp was also effective as a receiver with five receptions for 76 yards. For the game he had 257 all-purpose yards in the victory. Sharp became the sixth Jayhawk to score four touchdowns in a game with the last being Brandon McAnderson last season against Nebraska. In addition to Sharp's performance, the Kansas defense was solid, forcing a season-high five K-State turnovers, including two interceptions by senior defensive end Russell Brorsen. Kansas amassed 468 yards total offense to K-State's 355. Kansas scored the first 31 points of the game, all in the first half, to put the game away. KU took the opening drive 81 yards in 11 plays to take an early lead on a four-yard rush by Sharp up the middle. It marked the first opening drive touchdown of the season for the Jayhawks in 2008. KU junior quarterback Todd Reesing was 4-for-6 on the drive for 45 yards as KU converted all three of its third down tries. Reesing ended the game 14-for-23 yards with one touchdown. He also rushed for a season-high 47 yards and one touchdown.
