SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL FACT SHEET (GAME #2 – Nebraska)

Next game: San Jose State at Nebraska,
 Saturday, September 6, Memorial Stadium,
 11:30 a.m. (CDT)/9:30 a.m. (PDT)

2008 San Jose State record: 1-0. The Spartans opened the season with a 13-10 non-conference victory over UC Davis.

2008 Nebraska record: 1-0. The Cornhuskers kicked off the season with a 47-24 non-conference triumph over Western Michigan.

San Jose State head coach Dick Tomey: In his fourth season with the Spartans. Has an 18-19 win-loss record at San Jose State. His 17 wins in his first three seasons as the Spartans head coach are the most by the team since the 1990 through 1992 seasons when those San Jose State teams combined to win 22 games.

Overall, Tomey now is in his 28th season as a major college head coach and has a record of 176-129-7. He ranks in top-10 for coaching victories both in WAC and the Pacific-10 Conferences.

As a head coach, Tomey is 1-2 against Nebraska. The Cornhuskers defeated the Tomey-led Hawaii teams in 1978 (56-10 in Lincoln) and in 1982 (37-16 in Honolulu). Tomey directed Arizona to the 1998 Culligan Holiday Bowl title in a 23-20 decision. With the Wildcats' postseason win, Tomey became the only head coach in the decade of the 1990's to lead a team to bowl victories over both Nebraska and Miami (Fla.). Arizona defeated Miami (Fla.), 29-0, in the 1994 Fiesta Bowl.

Commissioner

Nebraska head coach Bo Pelini: In his first full season as the head coach at Nebraska. Has a major college coaching record of 2-0, all with the Cornhuskers. He was Nebraska's interim head coach in the 2003 Alamo Bowl win over Michigan State.

Pelini once was an assistant coach for the San Francisco 49ers and head coach George Seifert during the 1995 through 1997 seasons. The 49ers won their fifth Super Bowl championship in 1995 with Pelini serving as an assistant secondary coach.

San Jose State-Nebraska series: The Cornhuskers lead the series, 1-0. Nebraska won the only meeting between these teams, 49-13, on September 2, 2000, at Memorial Stadium. That contest is the only time in San Jose State history that the Spartans took on the number-one ranked team in a nationally-recognized poll.

San Jose State vs. the Big-12: The Spartans are 3-10 against current Big-12 member schools. The Nebraska game marks the second season in a row that San Jose State is playing its second game of the season against a Big-12 opponent. In 2007, the Spartans lost at Kansas State, 34-14.

San Jose State's last victory over a Big-12 school was in Waco, Texas on November 1, 1980 against then-Southwest Conference member Baylor featuring Mike Singletary and Walter Abercrombie and ranked #10 by the Associated Press. The Spartans trailed, 15-0, in the second quarter and came back for a 30-22 triumph.

Tomey In Exclusive Coaching Group: In 2007, **Dick Tomey** became the 25th coach in college football history to be a head coach in at least 300 major college football games. All of his games have been at the Division I-A/ FBS level.

Seeking a non-conference road win: San Jose State seeks its first non-conference road win since the 2002 season when the Spartans beat Illinois, 38-35. Since then, the Spartans have not won their next 11 non-conference road contests. Then #5-Ohio State; Florida; Illinois; Stanford, three times; Washington, twice; Arizona State; Kansas State; and San Diego State upended San Jose State playing as the road team.

Defending the home turf: With the UC Davis victory, San Jose State has won 13 out of its last 15 home games going back to the November 19, 2005 win against New Mexico State. In Dick Tomey's tenure, the Spartans have a 14-4 record in Spartan Stadium. He is the first San Jose State coach since Ron Turner (1992, 3-1) to lead the Spartans to a plus-.500 record in Spartan Stadium games.

Another San Jose State comeback under Dick Tomey: The UC Davis win marked the 11th time since Dick Tomey became San Jose State's head coach that the Spartans overcame a deficit and emerged victorious. In six of these wins, San Jose State trailed by 10 or more points in the first half.

Effective second-half defense continues into 2008: Since the tenth game of the 2007 season, San Jose State has given up just 10 second-half points. At the end of 2007, New Mexico State scored a fourth-quarter touchdown in a Spartan win, Louisiana Tech kicked an important fourth-quarter field goal to beat San Jose State and Nevada was held scoreless in the last two quarters as the Spartans closed out the season with a win. San Jose State did not allow UC Davis to score any second-half points in the 2008 opener.

Quarterbacks top the ground attack: The UC Davis game marked the seventh time in the last 15 games a San Jose State quarterback was the team's leading rusher. **Kyle Reed**, who played only in the second half, led the Spartans with 28 yards on seven carries.

A schedule turnaround: In 2007, San Jose State played its first four games of the season on the road. This season, the Spartans have two of their first three contests at home and do not play more than two games in a row on the road. San Jose State also has six or more home games for the second time in the last three seasons.

New timing rules quicken game: The San Jose State-UC Davis game was played in 2 hours, 50 minutes and took the least amount of time since the 2007 opener at Arizona State that needed 2 hours, 57 minutes to complete. The Spartans and UC Davis combined for 122 offensive plays. A year ago, there were an average of 141.8 plays per San Jose State game.

First-time starters in the opener: Four Spartans, all on offense, made their first major college start in the UC Davis contest. Left guard **Nathaniel Timo**, center **Robbie Reed**, right guard **Ailao Eliapo**, and quarterback **Myles Eden** were starters. Transfers **Jeff Schweiger**, a defensive end with starting experience from his days as an outside linebacker at the University of Southern California, and cornerback **Coye Francies**, who had five starts in the 2006 season at Oregon State, started for San Jose State for the first time in the UC Davis win.

10 freshmen get playing time in the 2008 opener: The last three seasons, San Jose State has played 42 freshmen. Ten saw action in the UC Davis game. In 2007, head coach Dick Tomey called on 17 freshmen to contribute. In 2006, 15 freshmen during the Spartans' 9-4 record that ended with a new Mexico Bowl victory.

Wide receivers **Josh Harrison** and **Michael Avila**, running backs **Brandon Rutley** and **Ina Liaina**, defensive ends **Ray Rodriguez** and **Vincent Abbott**; linebackers **Kyler O'Neal** and **Wade O'Neill**; defensive backs **Peyton Thompson** and **Tuikē Tuipulotu** are San Jose State freshmen who played in the UC Davis contest. Harrison and Avila are the only two from the group who redshirted the 2007 season.

Starting brothers: **Carl** and **Duke Ihenacho** are listed as starting defensive players on the San Jose State depth chart. Four times in 2007 (at Kansas State, at Stanford, against Hawai'i and Nevada) and in the 2008 opener against UC Davis, they started in the same game. Carl opened at a defensive end position while Duke was at a safety spot.

The Ihenachos are among eight known brother combinations on Football Bowl Subdivision rosters this season. Six of the eight brother combinations were starters in their respective games on August 30. Other schools with brother pairs this season are California, Mississippi, Rutgers, Temple, Utah State, Virginia Tech and Wyoming.

Before the Ihenachos, the last time a pair of brothers started in a game for San Jose State was the 1979 Central Michigan game when Jewel Thomas started at running back and his younger brother, the late Kenny Thomas, started at free safety. Eventually, both brothers were teammates with the Kansas City Chiefs in 1983.

Owens #2 among active players: Cornerback **Christopher Owens** added to his career interception total with his one theft in the UC Davis contest. He now has 13 in 37 games and trails defensive back Alphonso White of Wake Forest by two.

Three quarterbacks - nothing new: San Jose State played three quarterbacks - **Myles Eden**, **Jordan La Secla** and **Kyle Reed**, in the UC Davis victory. In 2007, the Spartans played three or more quarterbacks in each of the first two games and two times later in the season.

Jurovich in line for 100: Wide receiver **Kevin Jurovich** is four catches away from becoming the 18th San Jose State player with at least 100 career receptions. The one-time safety has played just 13 games on offense and averages 7.38 receptions per game. His average is higher than the late Guy Liggins, the Spartans' career leader in pass receiving. Liggins caught 149 passes in 22 regular season games in 1986 and 1987 for an average of 6.77 per contest.

Back for a return engagement: Quarterbacks coach and co-offensive coordinator **Marcus Arroyo** was San Jose State's quarterback when the Spartans met the Cornhuskers in 2000. Arroyo was a third-year sophomore making his fifth major-college start in the season-opener for both teams. He was 10-of-23 with an interception for 120 yards and a 9-yard, first quarter touchdown pass to wide receiver An Truong. Arroyo would go on to direct the offense to a 7-5 win-loss record that year, the only winning record for San Jose State between 1992 and 2006.

San Jose State University football fact sheet/add 4

Ties to Nebraska: There is more to the San Jose State-Nebraska football connection besides Dick Tomey's coaching battles with Dr. Tom Osborne and Frank Solich and Marcus Arroyo's quarterbacking against the Huskers in 2000.

Two-time Nebraska consensus All-American defensive end Willie Harper's sons, **Willie, Jr.**, and **Johnny Harper** were members of the San Jose State teams in the 1990's. Johnny was a starting cornerback in 1995. A highly-touted running back who originally enrolled at Nebraska out of high school, Willie, Jr., had five carries in 1995 as a senior.

One of San Jose State's highlights of the 1972 season was a road win at the University of California, 17-10. Cal used three quarterbacks in that game including freshman Vince Ferragamo who later transferred to Nebraska and earned All-America honors before embarking on a NFL career. Ferragamo was 3-for-3 against San Jose State.

George Darlington was a San Jose State assistant coach from 1969 through 1972 before heading to the University of Nebraska for the next 30 seasons.

Fielding Yost was the Nebraska head coach in 1898. Yost moved on to Kansas in 1899 and was the head coach for San Jose State's last game in the 1900 season. He is credited with leading the Spartans to a 12-0 victory over Chico (now California State University, Chico) and for taking National Football Foundation Hall of Fame halfback Willie Heston with him to the University of Michigan.

Current Nebraska reserve quarterback Zac Lee's dad, Bob Lee, served as a radio analyst for San Jose State football one season in the late 1990's. He was paired with Jon Shrader, a Nebraska native and current member of the Spartan Radio Network broadcast team.

88 Jalal Beauchman (Beach-mun), **WR:** Off to a productive start with four receptions for 40 yards...three out of his four catches resulted in a San Jose State first down...One of three returning Spartans with 30 or more receptions in 2007...hauled in a major college best 36 passes for 332 yards and a touchdown in 2007...has a single-game high of 6 receptions for 83 yards at Louisiana Tech (11/17)...first major college touchdown at Kansas State (9/7/07) on a 21-yard reception.

3 Terrance Williams, WR: Has two career touchdown receptions and both of them have come against UC Davis...3-yard pass from **Kyle Reed** with 2:07 to go in the third quarter opened the scoring.

66 John Konye (KAHN-knee), **OT:** Two major college starts for San Jose State after starting the UC Davis game at left tackle...moved from tight end to offensive tackle for 2008...a starter at Arizona State and no pass receptions in 2007...originally recruited as an offensive lineman...red-shirt in 2006.

65 Fred Koloto, OT: Played as a reserve offensive lineman against UC Davis...starter in eight games last season...opened at left guard in the Stanford game and at left tackle for the last seven contests...one of five first-time freshmen to start a game for San Jose State in the offensive line since freshman eligibility was reinstated in 1972.

71 Nathaniel Timo, OG: Made his first major college appearance against UC Davis and started at left guard...redshirt in 2007.

70 Robbie Reed, C: Made his first major college start in the UC Davis victory...appeared in three games as a reserve in 2007...redshirted the 2006 season.

73 Ailao (EYE-lau) Eliapo (E-lee-ah-poe), **OG:** A starter for the first time in the UC Davis win...was a defensive tackle and a reserve guard in the last four games of 2007...also used as a running back in the 2007 Fresno State game and did not have any carries.

75 Steve Lightsey, OG: First season with the Spartans...reserve offensive lineman and short yardage lineman against UC Davis...belies his name as the team's heaviest player with a 370-pound listing.

77 Bradis (BRAY-diss) McGriff, OT: Saw action as a reserve lineman against UC Davis...seven career starts the last two seasons for San Jose State...played in four 2007 games and started against Arizona State and Kansas State.

59 Jon Moreno, OT: Starter against UC Davis at right tackle...moves from left to right tackle for 2008...played in four games last season and started three times (at Kansas State, at Stanford, and at Utah State).

9 Jeff Clark, TE: Caught one pass for 4 yards against UC Davis...starting tight end in 2006...played in four games in 2007...17 career receptions in his 18 Spartan games.

89 Brian Elledge, TE: Was a reserve tight end against UC Davis with no receptions...16 catches for 105 yards and a touchdown in 2007...season high of three receptions in the New Mexico State win and at Kansas State...back-up long snapper.

11 Myles Eden, QB: Was 10-of-13 for 86 yards and an interception in the UC Davis win...changed his number from 13 to 11 for 2008...has played in 15 games and thrown a pass in seven of those contests...team's leading rusher with 64 yards on five carries against New Mexico State (11/10)...had the team's longest run of the season, a 41-yard scamper, against New Mexico State.

12 Jordan LaSecla, QB: Played one series against UC Davis...was 2-of-3 for 13 yards and an interception against UC Davis ...threw his first major college touchdown pass

in the Kansas State game.

7 Kyle Reed, QB: Was the third quarter used by San Jose State in the UC Davis win...transfer from the University of California...was 14-of-18 for 132 yards and two touchdowns...had a 176.00 passing efficiency rating against UC Davis in his major college debut...was the team's leading rusher with 28 yards on seven carries.

2 Sean Flynn, QB: Played in four games last season and six in his San Jose State career...did not play against UC Davis game...older brother of safety Kyle Flynn.

34 Yonus (YAH-nus) Davis, RB: Last Spartan to rush for 1,000 yards in a season with 1,007 in 2006...Seven carries for 26 yards against UC Davis...Has a 5.7 yards per carry average for his career...eighth on the San Jose State career rushing list with 1,787 yards...two-time second-team All-WAC selection.

33 Dominique Hunsucker, RB: Among the most versatile players on the San Jose State team...A running back, cornerback, safety and kickoff return specialist for the Spartans...Only player to start at least one game on offense and one game on defense in 2007...Three rushes for minus-1 yards against UC Davis.

15 Brandon Rutley, RB: Had one carry for 4 yards against UC Davis in his major college debut.
