RED RAIDERS HOST HUSKERS FOR HOMECOMING

Texas Tech puts its No. 7 national ranking up against the Nebraska Cornhuskers on Saturday at 2 p.m. at Jones AT&T Stadium in Lubbock. The game will be televised nationally on FSN with Joel Meyers (play-by-play), Gary Reasons (analyst) and Jim Knox (sideline) calling the action. The Red Raiders enter the game with its first 5-0 record since the 2005 season, while Nebraska is 3-2. The Red Raiders are coming off a 58-28 win at Kansas State in its Big 12 Conference opener last weekend. The Huskers dropped a 52-17 decision at home to Missouri over the weekend.

RED RAIDERS ON HOMECOMING

Texas Tech is 47-28-3 all-time on homecoming and has won five of the last six. The last loss came against Missouri in 2006, while last season's win was against Iowa State. This matchup with Nebraska is the second on homecoming in Lubbock as Tech took a 70-10 win in 2004.

TEXAS TECH-NEBRASKA SERIES

Nebraska leads the series 7-2, but the Red Raiders have won the last two meetings, 70-10 in 2004 and 35-31 in 2005. The teams first met in 1976 in the Bluebonnet Bowl in Houston with the Huskers taking a 27-24 win and handing the Red Raiders only their second loss of the season. Big 12 precursor games in 1993 and 1994 pitted a top ten Nebraska team each year against the Red Raiders. The two began Big 12 Conference play in 1996 and 1997 and have jumped on and off each others' schedules every two years.

PREVIEWING NEBRASKA

Nebraska enters the game averaging 33.4 points per game, but has been held below that mark in each of the last two. Opponents are scoring at a 26.2 point per game clip with

the last two eclipsing that mark. The Huskers have been impressive through the air with 270.4 yards per game and are getting 140.2 yards on the ground. The scoring has been balanced offensively as 10 scores have come through the air. Defensively, Nebraska is allowing 376.2 yards of total offense per game and rank 11th in the Big 12, allowing 248.2 yards through the air. Marlon Lucky leads the ground game with 46.4 yards per game and has four of the team's eight rushing scores. Todd Peterson and Nate Swift have been the go-to receivers with 22 and 20 receptions, respectively, and one and three touchdowns. Swift leads with 60.8 receiving yards per game. Joe Ganz ranks fifth in the conference with 257.4 passing yards per game and has thrown nine scoring passes. Cody Glenn and Phillip Dillard are the team's leading tacklers with 35 and 32, while three players, including Zac Potter, have two sacks. Potter leads the team with seven tackles for loss.

RED RAIDERS EARN HIGHEST RANKING SINCE 1976

Texas Tech leapfrogged BYU in the USA Today Coaches Poll and is ranked seventh in each poll this week. The rankings are the highest for the Red Raiders in any poll since sitting at No. 5 three-straight weeks during the 1976 season.

- Texas Tech has appeared in nine final AP polls throughout the program's 83-year history.
- Texas Tech spent 22-straight weeks in the AP top 25 from 2004-06, a program best; the previous high was 20 weeks during the 1976-77 seasons.
- The Red Raiders spent three-straight weeks in the AP at No. 5 in 1976, Tech's highest-ever ranking.
- The Red Raiders spent eight weeks in the top 10 in 1976.
- Texas Tech is currently in a five-year streak of being ranked in the AP poll, the longest streak in school history.

Due to Big 12 regulations, there will be NO live video streams of any Texas Tech home football games in 2009.

TEXAS TECH QUICK NOTES

► Texas Tech is 5-0 on the season for the first time since 2005 ... in the history of the program, Texas Tech has been 5-0 only five times.

► Texas Tech is sixth nationally with 11-straight non-conference wins, including bowl games ... the Red Raiders last lost a non-conference game at TCU (12-3) in 2006.

► Texas Tech's top 10 rankings each of the last three weeks in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls is the first time since the 1976 season that Tech has been ranked among the top 10 in as many weeks ... it also is only the third since the installation of the coaches poll in 1989 that Texas Tech has been ranked among the 10 in both.

► Texas Tech is 9-4 all-time in Big 12 Conference openers, including last weekend's 58-28 win at Kansas State ... last year's league-opening loss at Oklahoma State snapped a string of five-straight conference-opening game wins.

► Since the inception of the Big 12 Conference in 1996, Texas Tech is 19-18 in games against the conference's North division ... the Red Raiders are 14-11 in head coach Mike Leach's nine seasons, but have won 11 of the last 16 ... had perfect seasons against the North in 2004 and 2005.

► Red Raiders may turn into "Road Warriors" after the month of October is complete ... Tech plays at home only once (Oct. 11 vs. Nebraska) during the month ... games at Kansas State (Oct. 4), Texas A&M (Oct. 18) and Kansas (Oct. 25) make up three-quarters of the month's slate.

► Texas Tech boasts a 29-5 record at Jones AT&T Stadium since the start of the 2003 season ... Tech's .853 success rate is tied 11th during the span with Georgia and Florida and is third in the Big 12 to Oklahoma and Texas.

► The Red Raiders have scored 30 or more points in 21 of the last 23 games, including the last nine straight, which leads the country ... Texas, with eight-straight 30-point games, is second among the national leaders in consecutive 30-point games.

► Since Mike Leach's arrival in 2000, the Red Raiders boast a 19-1 non-conference record at Jones AT&T Stadium ... overall, Texas Tech is 32-8 in non-conference matchups, including five bowl wins ... the program is 7-4 on the road and 6-3 at neutral sites.

► Texas Tech has the Big 12 Conference's longest winning streak at seven games, dating back to last season.

► Texas Tech ranks fifth nationally with 13-straight winning seasons. Florida State leads with 30, while Michigan (22), Florida (19), Virginia Tech (14) and Tech comprise the top five.

► Texas Tech has scored 30 or more points in 71 games during the Leach era and has won 60 of those games. The Red Raiders are 30-5 under Leach when scoring 40+ and 21-0 when scoring over 50. On the flip side, Tech is 10-26 when scoring 29 points or less.

► Texas Tech quarterbacks have thrown for 41,551 yards during the Mike Leach tenure - or 23.6 miles. The offense has also accounted for 327 passing scores since 2000 as compared to the 232 thrown the previous 20 seasons.

► Texas Tech ranks third among Big 12 members with consecutive eight-win seasons. Texas leads the group with nine, while Oklahoma has done it in the last seven seasons. Texas Tech has recorded at least eight wins each of the last six seasons.

LAST GAME AGAINST THE HUSKERS

Cody Hodges eluded a tackle and scrambled to find Joel Filani in the back of the end zone with 12 seconds to play to lead Texas Tech to a 34-31 win at Nebraska in 2005. On the series prior, Hodges threw what appeared to be the game-ending interception, but the ball was fumbled on the return, giving the Red Raiders a last shot at a win. Hodges threw for 368 yards in the game, while Filani had three touchdowns and 163 yards on 11 receptions. The Red Raiders held a 27-14 lead in the third quarter, before Nebraska 17-0 scoring run that gave the Huskers the lead early in the fourth quarter until Tech scored the game-winning TD.

OFFENSIVE TEAM NOTES

► Texas Tech has three of the top 20 total offense games in NCAA play this season - third with 693 vs. SMU, 10th with 639 vs. Eastern Washington and 16th with 626 at Kansas State ... the 626 at Kansas State ranks fifth among top total offense games on the road in Tech history.

► Texas Tech's 538 passing yards against Massachusetts ranks as the ninth-best passing game in school history.

► The Red Raiders' 48.2 points per game average is 5.7 points ahead of the single-season best (42.5 in 2003) and ranks fifth nationally.

► Tech's running game is flourishing this season as the

team is averaging 144.4 yards per game, the most under head coach Mike Leach and the most since 1999, when Tech averaged 149.5 yards.

► Thanks to the running game, Tech is second nationally with 583.4 yards of total offense per game ... the passing game is accounting for a national-leading 439.0 yards per game.

► Scoring this season has been fairly balanced at 18 touchdowns through the air and 14 on the ground ... the ground total is four shy of last year's 18 ... if the current pace of 2.8 rushing scores per game sticks, Tech will finish with 34 at the conclusion of the regular season - a school record.

► The Red Raiders lead the nation in passing offense with 439.0 yards per game ... additionally, Tech's 18 scores through the air are tied fifth.

► Texas Tech's ground game ranks sixth in the Big 12 Conference at 144.4 yards per game ... don't look down on the ranking, though; the Red Raiders' No. 64 national rank is considerably higher than last season's No. 119 finish.

► Tech is second to Oklahoma State (20) and Texas (16) with 14 rushing scores in the Big 12 and is tied 11th nationally.

► The Red Raiders rank fifth in the Big 12 with 48.2 points per game.

DEFENSIVE TEAM NOTES

► Texas Tech gave Kansas State its first sack of the season, when McKinner Dixon tracked down KSU quarterback Josh Freeman for a five-yard loss on 3rd & 7 in the third quarter.

► The pass defense is tied third nationally with 10 interceptions and is one of only seven programs with double-digit picks.

► Tech ranks third in the Big 12 Conference in pass efficiency defense with a 105.8 rating.

► The Red Raiders are third nationally in defensive third-down conversion percentage, limited the opposition to 21.2 percent (14-of-66) ... limited Kansas State to 2-of-12 on third down.

► Tech's +6 turnover margin is tied second in the Big 12 and ahead of last year's -5 margin.

► Tech is holding opponents to 102.6 yards per game on the ground, which is 74.4 yards per game better than last year's final average.

► Most importantly, the Red Raiders limited their non-conference opponents this season to 16.0 points per game, which was a quarter of a point below last year's non-conference scoring average.

► The Red Raiders' 10 picks in four games matches last year's total season number ... under Leach, and counting down from last year, here are the interception totals: 10, 11, 12, 11, 16, 16, 18 and 15.

► The defense has been dominant in the first and third quarters, allowing only 17 points in each this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

► Eric Morris ranks fourth in the Big 12 with 13.4 yards per punt return ... his 86-yard return at Nevada was the fifth-longest in school history and ties for the longest in the conference this year.

► The Red Raiders ranks fourth in the league in kickoff coverage with a net average of 45.7 ... newcomer Donnie Carona has kicked off 41 times with nine touchbacks.

► Tech's 24.8 yards per kickoff return ranks fourth in the league.

► Opponents have been stifled on punt returns this season with a mere 3.6 yards per game on 10 opportunities.

SEASON NOTES

► Texas Tech extended its season-opening win streak to six after the 49-24 win over Eastern Washington. The Red Raiders are 55-26-3 all-time in season openers. The Red Raiders opened the season at home for the 56th time and have an overall mark of 43-11-2 in those games, including the last nine. The last time Tech lost in a season opener at home was against Oklahoma in 1992.

► The Red Raiders improved to 63-18-3 all-time in home openers against Eastern Washington, including the last nine straight. The last Tech loss in a home opener came against North Texas in 1999.

► The game against Eastern Washington marked the sixth time Texas Tech opened the season in the month of August and the fourth time under Mike Leach. The Red Raiders are 3-3 in those games.

► For the first time in the program's 84-year history, Texas Tech has sold out of season tickets. The department announced August 20 that 41,773 season tickets were sold for the upcoming season. The number surpasses the

► Eighty-four of the 105 players that reported to preseason camp hail from the state of Texas. Of those, 37 are among the offensive and defensive two-deep. All 11 offensive starters and eight on the defensive side are Texans.

► Of the 21 players on the 105 that hail from outside the state of Texas, nine of those jumped the border from Oklahoma. Texas Tech's reach extends across the continental U.S. from Georgia (2) and South Carolina (1) to California (2) and points in between – Arizona, New Mexico, Tennessee, Louisiana, Kansas and Arkansas are represented with a player each. Additionally, Hawaii has a player on the Texas Tech roster.

O-LINE HAS PROVEN IMPENETRABLE

While the Texas Tech defense has been feasting on opponents to the tune of 12 sacks in five games, the Red Raider offensive line has not been so accommodating to the opposition. The unit has allowed only one sack this season in 262 pass attempts and is tied with Kansas State nationally in sacks allowed. Air Force is the only program that hasn't allowed a sack this season.

LEACH GETS 70TH WIN

Texas Tech's 58-28 win at Kansas State gave the Red Raider head man his 70th win in his ninth season at Texas Tech. The total ranks him fifth among Big 12 Conference coaches all-time, while the 70 wins for the program are the third-most in the conference since the start of the 2000 season, the year Leach arrived in Lubbock. Additionally, Tech's 36 conference wins over that span are tied third with Nebraska. Leach is six wins shy of tying legendary Texas Tech coach Pete Cawthon (1930-40). Spike Dykes is the all-time wins leader with 82.

THE DYNAMIC DUO

Running backs Baron Batch and Shannon Woods combined for 195 yards from scrimmage against Kansas State as the pair were nearly identical in rushing and receiving yards. Woods totaled 70 rushing and 28 receiving yards, while Batch had 68 and 29, respectively. The pair entered the game among the nation's top five most productive tandems in the backfield at 198.5 yards per game from scrimmage.

► Thanks to the efforts of the duo, and those of the offensive line, the Red Raiders have 722 rushing yards on the season – only 49 yards short of last year's season total of 771 ... the Red Raider are averaging 144.4 yards per game on the ground, the most since 1999, when that squad finished with 149.5 yards per game.

► The most yards Texas Tech has rushed for in a season under Leach was 1,397 during the 13-game 2003 campaign (107.5 ypg).

► The duo blistered SMU for nearly 300 yards with Batch totaling 169 on 15 touches.

► Batch's 43-yard touchdown run against SMU was the seventh-longest rush under Mike Leach since the 2000 season.

► Combined for 286 yards against UMass, which ranked as that weekend's sixth-best performance by the nation's backfields (running back/tailbacks only).

► Woods 108 yards on the ground against UMass marked the first time since the Insight Bowl in 2006 that Tech has had a 100-yard rusher (Woods, 109 vs. Minnesota).

RUSHING FOR 100

After closing out the 2007 campaign with the nation's last-ranked rushing offense, the Red Raiders find themselves in the middle of the pack nationally with 144.4 yards per game on the ground. Tech has rushed for 100 yards in each game this season, marking the longest consecutive-games streak in the Leach era.

PLAYING A GOOD GAME OF KEEP AWAY

Texas Tech ranks 12th nationally with a +1.2 takeaway margin per game. The Red Raiders have taken 13 opponent turnovers this season, compared to only seven turnovers for their own. The +6 overall margin is 11 better than last season's -5.

PRODUCTIVE ROTATION AT END

Starting defensive end Brandon Williams and backup

McKinner Dixon lead the team with four and five sacks, respectively, and ranks third and second in the Big 12 Conference – Dixon is tied fifth nationally. No matter that Dixon comes off the bench in the rotation, he has been one of the more productive players on defense this season. A former Tech freshman All-American in 2005, Dixon leads the defensive line with 17 tackles and has five tackles for loss. Williams and Dixon lead the team with five tackles for loss each and Williams has 10 tackles, second behind Dixon on the d-line. Williams also has three tipped balls at the line of scrimmage and two forced fumbles.

LIKE KICKING OVER AN ANT PILE

This accurately describes this year's defensive intensity – they're everywhere. The Red Raiders have adopted a more aggressive, attacking persona since Ruffin McNeill took over the unit five games into last season. The evidence is in the numbers: among the national leaders with 10 interceptions, the nation's individual leader in interceptions, two of the top sack leaders in the country and a chokehold on opponents on third down (21.1%). Additionally, d-linemen are making interceptions (two this year), secondary personnel are forcing fumbles, linebackers are recording sacks and everybody is getting a hand on the ball. Here's a breakdown of passes defended: d-line (4), linebackers (5) and secondary (20).

HARRELL SURPASSES KINGSBURY

Quarterback Graham Harrell passed Kliff Kingsbury (1999-02) against Kansas State on the Tech career passing yardage list with 12,709 yards and the career total offense list with 12,507. He also has set Texas Tech career marks in touchdowns responsible for (115) and touchdown passes (107) this season and is approaching several others. The senior signal caller already set six NCAA records (page 199 in the media guide) prior to this season, including Most 400-Yard Passing Game in a Season (11, 2007). Here's a list of other probable Texas Tech career records for the season:

► Harrell's 536 passing yards against Eastern Washington was the sixth-best individual performance in school history.

► Ranks seventh all-time in NCAA history with 12,709 career passing yards ... if he keeps his current pace of 405.4 yards per game, Harrell would have 15,547 career passing yards by the end of the regular season and would rank second all-time behind Hawaii's Timmy Chang (17,072 from 2000-04).

► Harrell's 31 career starts rank fifth among Texas Tech's all-time quarterbacks ... won't reach Zebbie Lethridge's record of 44 starts from 1994-97 ... if starts the rest of the season, plus a bowl game, he will finish tied for third with 39 with Ron Reeves (1978-81).

► Of the six quarterbacks in NCAA history that have thrown for 5,000 yards in a season, three are Red Raiders. B.J. Symons (2003) threw for 5,833 yards en route to setting the NCAA single-season mark, while Harrell narrowly missed breaking the record last season with a 5,705-yard performance. Kingsbury, in his third year in the offense in 2002, threw for 5,017.

► Harrell and All-America target Michael Crabtree have connected for touchdowns 30 times since the start of last season ... the number is second among the Big 12's top pass/receive tandems: Oklahoma State's Josh Field and Rashaun Woods combined for 31 scores (2001-03).

CRABTREE QUIETLY PRODUCTIVE...

...at least comparatively speaking. This time last season the 2007 Biletnikoff Award winner had 920 yards and 14 touchdowns. That's not to say his performance this season is anything to yawn at. Crabtree's 112.8 yards per game still ranks third nationally this season and he leads the Big 12 Conference in receiving. He is averaging 9.6 points per game and has games of 158 (Nevada) and 164 yards (SMU) – he also caught three TD receptions against the Mustangs. Crabtree has scored in each game this season.

► Tied the Tech career TD receptions record with his 30th against Kansas State (Jarrett Hicks, 2003-06) ... has accomplished this in 18 career games ... needs four to crack the NCAA top 20 career leaders.

► Solid outing at Kansas State with 107 yards and two touchdowns on nine receptions.

► Cracked the career top 10 list at Texas Tech with 172 receptions.

► Has 2,526 career receiving yards, which ranks seventh all-time at Texas Tech ... needs 544 to break the all-time mark of 3,069 yards, set by Wes Welker (2000-03).

► Holds eight season NCAA records (page 199 in the media guide).

CHARBONNET LEADING THE COUNTRY

SS Daniel Charbonnet set a school record with three interceptions in the win over SMU and is currently tied atop the national leaderboard with four. Several Texas Tech players had recorded two in a game in the past – the last being Brock Stratton at Iowa State in 2006. Charbonnet also had near brushes with two other potential picks as one slipped off his fingertips and CB Jamar Wall stepped in front of another (which Charbonnet praised his teammate for).

MORRIS AMONG LEAGUE LEADERS

Senior Eric Morris is fourth among Big 12 Conference punt returners with 13.4 yards per return, and ranks 27th nationally. He has 15 returns on the season and brought one back for a touchdown at Nevada. The 86-yard scoring return was the fifth-longest in school history and the first returned for a touchdown since 2004.

► Return for TD at Nevada was his first career punt return for a touchdown and the 25th by the Red Raiders since 1951. The return gave Texas Tech a 7-3 lead at the eight-minute mark of the first quarter. He also gave the Red Raiders a 20-12 lead with 5:20 remaining in the third quarter when he scored on a 13-yard rush. The rushing touchdown was the first of his career.

► While diminutive in size, Morris is one of the most deceptive players in the Big 12 Conference, if not college football. The 5-foot-8, 172-pound slot back exploded for 164 yards on nine catches in the season opener against Eastern Washington and finished with 189 all-purpose yards after tallying 21 punt return yards.

► Tech coach Mike Leach, the one responsible for Morris' alter ego, has installed the "Elf" package in this year's offense to better utilize the receiver's talents.

► Morris is averaging 112.2 all-purpose yards per game this year.

► His rushing score at Nevada was the first of his career.

SPECIAL TEAMS COMING UP BIG IN '08

Texas Tech's special teams have made an impact on the season. Taylor Charbonnet dropped an SMU punt return for a yard loss on Tech's first punt of the game, while at Nevada, Lance Fuller came off of the right end to block a UNR punt, the second block of the season for the Red Raiders (T. Charbonnet blocked an Eastern Washington field goal in the opener). The return teams have done well, too, as Eric Morris returned a punt 86 yards for a score at Nevada and is fourth among Big 12 Conference punt returners.

DUNCAN LEADING THE CHARGE IN THE MIDDLE

Tech's linebackers have been active this season as middle backer Brian Duncan leads the team with 40 tackles and is tied sixth in the Big 12 Conference. The sophomore grabbed Tech's first interception of the year on the first play of the season against Eastern Washington. He and Marlon Williams lead the unit with two pass breakups each. Bront Bird, who has a 14-tackles game to his credit this season, is third on the team with 25 tackles. He also has two tackles for loss, a sack and a pass breakup. The three aforementioned linebackers are among the top six tacklers on the team.

PROGRAM APPROACHING A MILESTONE

Texas Tech Football is four wins away from the 500th win in program history. Beginning with the first win against Montezuma on Oct. 17, 1925, to the Red Raiders' win in the Gator Bowl against Virginia in January, the program has accumulated 496 wins to 387 losses and 32 ties.

HARRELL, DUNCAN RECEIVE HONORS

QB Graham Harrell was named to the semifinalist for the Draddy Award, given annually to the nation's top academic collegiate football player. Also known as the "Academic Heisman," the honor will be awarded in New York City in December. LB Brian Duncan was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his participation in the community. Duncan is one of 12 players on the Football Bowl Subdivision level to be honored.

FIRST-TIME MEETINGS

UMass was the 127th different opponent to make an appearance on the Texas Tech ledger (Eastern Washington and Nevada were the 125th and 126th new opponents). Texas Tech has faced 15 programs for the first time under Mike Leach and is 13-2 in those games, including the last nine. Other first-time meetings under Leach include Northwestern State and Virginia in 2007; Southeastern Louisiana and Minnesota in 2006; Florida International, Sam Houston State, Indiana State and Alabama in 2005; California in 2004; Navy in 2003; Clemson in 2002; Stephen F. Austin in 2001; and East Carolina in 2000. A first-time matchup has taken place 25 times in bowl games, with the opponents holding a 14-10-1 advantage (Tech 5-2 under Leach in first-time matchups in bowl games).

DEFENSE DOMINATES SMU

SMU entered the Sept. 13 game with one of the nation's top 10 offensive units, but Texas Tech's stingy defense limited the Mustangs to a slim 274 yards of total offense. The Mustang's then-ninth ranked passing game managed 213 yards and threw five interceptions. The Red Raiders also held SMU to 61 yards on the ground. Tech recorded three sacks and totaled seven pass breakups.

DEFENSE COMES UP BIG IN THE REDZONE

Chants of "DEFENSE-DEFENSE" resonated from the modest gathering of Tech fans following the win over Nevada in Reno. And, deservedly so. The unit found itself up against a wall as the Wolf Pack entered the red zone five times during the game. However, the unit didn't yield, holding UNR to three field goals in the five trips. Additionally, the D gave UNR's quarterback fits all evening, sacking him four times. A bulk of Nevada's 488 yards of total offense came between the 20s.

LIVING IN A BIZARRO WORLD?

If you do a double-take when looking at the stats, don't worry, they're correct. Texas Tech has scored 14 touchdowns on the ground and 18 through the air in five games this season. The Red Raiders exploded for five ground scores in the season opener and another three at Nevada and against Massachusetts, while the air attack closed the gap with five passing scores against SMU.

NICE START FOR McNEILL

Although he served as defensive coordinator on an interim basis last season, Ruffin McNeill's first play with the interim tag removed got his tenure off with a bang. LB Brian Duncan took a deflected pass off of EWU receiver Aaron Boyce on the initial play of the game. Tech scored eight plays later.

FOUR RED RAIDERS GET FIRST STARTS

SAM Bront Bird, CB Brent Nickerson, WR Detron Lewis and SS Daniel Charbonnet made their first-career starts against Eastern Washington and each turned in some of the top performances of the night. Nickerson, who had 10 total appearances for the Red Raiders in the previous two seasons, finished the game fourth with six solo tackles and a pass breakup. Lewis exploded for 163 yards on nine receptions, including a 76-yard catch. Charbonnet collected his second-career interception in the fourth quarter and had five tackles and a pass breakup.

TECH SCORES FIVE ON THE GROUND

Texas Tech's running game was the scoring machine in the opener as the ground troops scored five times. RB Shannon Woods scored twice, RB Baron Batch and RB Aaron Crawford once each and QB Graham Harrell once. The five scores were the most in a game since Tech's Insight Bowl win over Minnesota in 2006.

REED'S BENCH IS IM"PRESS"IVE

Can you imagine the force a guy with a 625-pound bench press max has when he plants his hands in your chest coming off the snap? Opposing defensive ends will be able to answer that this season when facing OT Rylan Reed. The senior returning starter raised the record weight prior to preseason camp in late July, breaking his previous mark of 565 pounds. Reed is a cancer survivor (2004) and former minor league pitcher with the Chicago White Sox. In Reed's last game against Virginia in the Gator Bowl, he held defensive end Chris Long, the nation's sack leader, to three tackles and no sacks.

CRABTREE PICKS UP PRESEASON HONORS

As one of eight unanimous consensus All-Americans last season, it's no surprise that WR Michael Crabtree is on virtually every preseason All-America list. Additionally, he, along with QB Graham Harrell, is a candidate for the Maxwell Award, presented annually to the nation's top collegiate player at season's end.

OFFENSIVE LINE INTACT

Undoubtedly the most important group on the offense is the five guys up front. Texas Tech returns all five starters and backup center Stephen Hamby, who appears to have a hold on the starting nod at center. The unit allowed a meager 18 sacks on 763 pass attempts last season and led the country with only one sack allowed per every 42.4 pass attempts. Additionally, preseason All-American OG Louis Vasquez did not allow a sack last season, while OT Rylan Reed gave up only one throughout the 13-game season.

WALL PICKS UP PRESEASON NOD

CB Jamar Wall was named to the preseason All-Big 12 squad, marking only the second time a Texas Tech defensive back has been named to an All-Big 12 first-team squad - pre- or post-season (Dwayne Slay, 2005). The junior was one of the league leaders with five interceptions a year ago in his first season as a starter. Wall also made 54 stops and recorded six pass breakups. OG Louis Vasquez and WR Michael Crabtree also were named to the preseason first team.

HALF OF LEAGUE-LEADING SECONDARY BACK

CB Jamar Wall and FS Darcel McBath are the two returning starters from a secondary that led the Big 12 Conference in pass defense last season. McBath (2) and Wall combined for seven interceptions last season and 14 pass breakups. The unit limited opponents to 188.4 yards per game through the air. The two likely successors to fill the vacated strong safety and corner positions are Daniel Charbonnet and LaRon Moore or Brent Nickerson, respectively. Charbonnet, known for his prowess on special teams, logged 31 tackles and an interception last season in a backup role, while Moore played in all 13 games, primarily on special teams. Nickerson played in one game last season, but rose to the top of the charts, along with Moore, during spring and preseason camp. A decision on the position could linger up to game day.

DEFENSIVE LINE GETS BOOST IN OFFSEASON

Already a talented unit that returns all four starters, the defensive line received a jolt of talent in February as the Red Raiders inked the nation's fourth-ranked d-line class. Headlining the group are JUCO transfers McKinner Dixon and Brandon Sesay. A freshman All-American for the Red Raiders in 2005, Dixon went the junior college route following that season, where he redshirted the 2006 season at Cisco (TX) Junior College and starred for the program last season. Sesay is the gem of the group, coming to Texas Tech from College of the Sequoias in California as one of the most talented and highly-touted defensive linemen in the country. Additionally, the Red Raiders hit the jackpot when defensive tackle Chris Perry was cleared to play immediately after transferring from the University of Miami in January. Perry was a redshirt during his true freshman year for the Hurricanes last season.

The group joins one of the most talented and experienced game of linemen in school history. Brandon

Williams and Jake Ratliff anchor the ends for the unit, while Rajon Henley and freshman All-American Colby Whitlock plug up the inside. Henley led the group with 52 tackles last season. He also had 7.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. Whitlock posted 47 stops and 8.5 tackles for loss and two sacks, while Williams led the team with 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. Ratliff had 26 tackles and six quarterback hurries.

LINEBACKERS ALSO RETURN

The trio of Brian Duncan, Marlon Williams and Bront Bird return as the core of the defensive unit. Duncan was brought in as a starter in the fifth game of the season on the outside, while Williams started all but the opener. Bird played a vital backup role on the outside and was able to gain considerable experience coming off the bench. Duncan will move back to his natural position in the middle, while Williams will remain on the weak side. Bird, standing at 6-foot-3, will cover the strong side. Williams finished second on the team last season with 81 tackles and six pass breakups. He also had a nose for the ball with two fumble recoveries. Duncan logged 69 tackles and four tackles for loss, while Bird had 16 stops.

LaCOUR AMONG FRESHMAN ELITE

While he didn't meet NCAA minimum standards to be ranked nationally, punter Jonathan LaCour's 42.6 yard average would have ranked second overall for freshman punters in 2006.

Crabtree, winner of last year's Biletnikoff Award as the nation's top collegiate receiver, is once again among the nation's top receivers, averaging 114.3 yards per game. The sophomore electrified the country as a freshman in 2007 with NCAA freshman records in receiving yards, receiving touchdowns and receptions. He solidified his place in college football history as one of only eight players nationally to earn unanimous consensus All-America status.

As Texas Tech's senior passer, Harrell leads what has undoubtedly become the nation's most prolific offense this decade. He ranks among the top ten quarterbacks by yardage in NCAA history and is one of six all-time to pass for 5,000 yards in a season. Harrell is a member of an elite group of players that have passed for more than 12,000 yards in a career and thrown more than 100 touchdowns.

HEAD COACH MIKE LEACH

Arguably one of the most innovative coaches in the country, Mike Leach has not only transformed Texas Tech Football, but also the face of college football with an all-out aerial assault. This is evidenced by the number of programs incorporating more passing into their schemes than before. Leach's offense has become a hot, commodity as coaching staffs from across the country have come to Lubbock get a glimpse into what makes the program tick; but none have mastered it like the ninth-year head coach.

Leading the nation's most prolific passing offenses in the country, Leach, who received the All-American Football Foundation's Johnny Vaught Head Coach Award in 2006, spreads the field with his exciting brand of football and has guided the Red Raiders to five NCAA passing titles and three total offense titles during his tenure. Leach's offense produced school records in nearly every passing category in 2000, but surpassed those numbers in each of the last eight seasons. His eight teams have combined for over 151 team and individual records at Tech.

The 2007 season was special for the Red Raiders as a team and individually. Freshman wide receiver and Biletnikoff Award winner Michael Crabtree led the nation in receptions (134), receiving yards (1,960) and touchdown receptions (22), all NCAA freshman records. For his efforts, he was been decorated as a unanimous consensus All-American, being named to first team of the top five All-America teams (AFCA, FWAA, Walter Camp, Associated Press and The Sporting News). Additionally, he was the first freshman and Big 12 Conference receiver in the history of the prestigious Biletnikoff Award to win the honor.

The Red Raiders' appearance in the tradition-rich Gator Bowl in 2007 was a testament to the team's performance and ability to overcome tremendous losses from the previous season. The graduation of four offensive linemen and three receivers had everyone writing off the offense, while the departure of three key defensive players left many wondering what the 2007 season had in store. The answer: the nation's leading offense; the nation's leading receiver and quarterback; a defense that held Oklahoma to 106 rushing yards, its lowest of the season; and two 100-reception receivers to name a few.

The Texas Tech program has established itself as one of the nation's leading producers of productive quarterbacks since the 2000 season. Current quarterback Graham Harrell threw for 4,555 yards in his debut as the starter in 2006 and became the sixth player and third Red Raider in NCAA history to throw for 5,000 yards in a season with his 5,705-effort in 2007. He also is the third quarterback under Leach to win nine games in a season. Former quarterback Kliff Kingsbury in 2002 and Cody Hodges in 2005 each posted nine-win seasons during their careers, while 2003 and 2004 signal callers B.J. Symons and Sonny Cumbie each won eight games in their respective seasons as the starter.



The Red Raiders have improved their total offensive numbers from 324.8 yards per game to 529.6 yards per game since Leach's arrival. The last eight seasons rank as the top eight all-time at Tech in total offense, while scoring went from 23 points per game in 1999 to 40.9 points last season. The most significant increase has been in the passing game, where the Red Raiders averaged 470.3 yards per game in 2007 compared to 175.4 yards in 1999.

The Red Raiders are not solely known for their play on the scoring side of the ball. The Texas Tech defense also has flourished during Leach's eight seasons. The Red Raiders tied for the national lead with three shutouts in 2000 and followed with others in 2001, 2002, 2005 and 2006. Combined with the six shutouts are five other games where the opposition was held without an offensive touchdown. Tech's shutout of Baylor in Waco during the 2005 season marked Tech's first blanking of a conference opponent on the road since the inception of the Big 12 Conference in 1996.

The program continues to make strides academically as well under Leach. For the last eight years Tech has been recognized as one of the nation's top institutions for consistently being above a 70 percent graduation rate, according to the American Football Coaches Association. In 2007, 16 players were named to the Big 12 Conference Academic Football Team, the second-most of the league institutions.

Prior to coming on board at Texas Tech, Leach, in just one season at Oklahoma, directed a Sooner offense that went from one of the worst in the Big 12 Conference to one of the best. Under Leach's tutelage, Heupel was named 1999 Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year. For his efforts, Leach was nominated for the 1999 Broyles Award as the top assistant coach in the country.

Prior to joining Bob Stoops' Oklahoma staff, Leach served as offensive coordinator for Hal Mumme at the University of Kentucky and Valdosta (Ga.) State University.

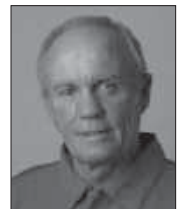
