THE BASICS

Iowa State (2-5, 0-3 Big 12), hits the road to face No. 14 Nebraska (6-1, 2-1 Big 12) in Lincoln ... the Huskers are the Cyclones' fifth ranked opponent in the past six games ... Nebraska's defense ranks second nationally ... Iowa State beat the Huskers, 36-14 last season in Ames but haven't won in Lincoln since 1977 ... ISU's entire 2003 schedule (excluding NCAA Division I-AA opponent Northern Iowa) currently ranks fourth nationally in cumulative won-loss standings (54-23) ... ISU redshirt freshman quarterback Austin Flynn came off the bench to start the second half of last week's 40-19 loss to No. 20 Texas ... he led the Cyclones on three scoring drives and tallied 166 yards of total offense in two quarters against the Longhorns ... senior WR Lane Danielsen's 2,466 career receiving yards are a school record and rank seventh in Big 12 history ... Danielsen recorded the eighth 100-yard game of his career against Texas Tech, tying Tracy Henderson (1982-84) for most 100-yard receiving games in a career ... after three years of good health, Iowa State has suffered a rash of injuries this season as 17 different Cyclones have missed games due to injury ... among those lost for the year are starting DE Tyson Smith and starting TB Hiawatha Rutland ... Iowa State has played 17 freshman, including six true freshmen, two of whom start (DE Jason Berryman, OL Aaron Brant) ... Berryman co-led ISU with 14 tackles against Texas ... former Omaha Central prep JaMaine Billups is having an all-Big 12 season at strong safety with 72 tackles ... today's game is Dan McCarney's 101st as the Cyclone head coach ... that tenure is the longest of any head football coach in ISU history ... McCarney has taken Iowa State to three straight bowl games ... the two Iowa State coaches who took a pair of ISU teams to bowls, Johnny Majors (1971-72) and Earle Bruce (1977-78), are in the College Football Hall of Fame.

LAST WEEK: LONGHORNS SPOIL HOMECOMING, 40-19

Iowa State quarterback Austin Flynn gave the Cyclones a spark, leading ISU on three second-half scoring drives in a 40-19 loss against No. 20 Texas ... Flynn started the second half, replacing Cris Love, who had made his first career start and played the entire first half ... Texas dominated the first half and held a 27-0 lead at halftime ... outgained by the Longhorns 346-45 in the first half, Iowa State made the only two scores of the third quarter on a career-long 51-yard field goal by PK/P Tony Yelk and a 2-yard TD on a reverse by WR Lane Danielsen ... the score was 33-19 with 8:23 left in the game after Flynn capped a 15-play, 80-yard drive with a 5-yard TD pass to Danielsen and ran for his second successful two-point conversion ... but Texas retaliated with pass plays of 50 and 30 yards on the next drive, the second from Chance Mock to Roy Williams that put the Longhorns up 40-19 with 7:07 remaining ... with Flynn as the signal-caller, Iowa State equalled Texas with 232 second-half yards and held a 19-13 advantage on the scoreboard after halftime ... Texas' Cedric Benson ran for 140 yards and three touchdowns and Longhorn QBs Vince Young and Chance Mock combined for 19-of-26 through the air for 343 yards and two TDs ... freshman tailback Stevie Hicks led Iowa State with 67 yards rushing on 11 plays ... Love and Flynn were a combined 11-of-34 for 172 yards and one TD ... Texas made big plays, including a 56-yard pass from WR Williams to WR B.J. Johnson to set up the Longhorns' second score ... Johnson had seven receptions for 187 yards and a TD ... SS JaMaine Billups and true freshman DE Jason Berryman had 14 tackles each for ISU.

2002 REVIEW

Iowa State, playing the toughest schedule in school history, earned an unprecedented third-straight bowl trip ... the Cyclones, 7-7, played nine bowl teams ... Iowa State's season included a 36-31 win at Iowa (Sept. 14, Hawkeyes' only regular-season loss), a 36-14 win over Nebraska and a 31-17 decision over Texas Tech, all bowl teams ... the 2002 campaign marked the first time an Iowa State team posted wins over three bowl teams in a single season ... all seven games away from Ames were against bowl teams, including the season-ending 34-16 loss at No. 18 Boise State in the Humanitarian Bowl ... all-time ISU single-season total offense and passing leader Seneca Wallace set Iowa State school records for passing yards (3,308) and total offense (3,682) ... despite a brutal schedule, Iowa State ranked in the Big 12 Conference's upper division in total defense (fifth) at 358.9 yards allowed per game ... Wallace and ISU were a television favorite in 2002, appearing on air 10 times ... walk-on PK Adam Benike was the AP first-team all-Big 12 place-kicker ... DT Jordan Carstens, OL Bob Montgomery, C Zach Butler and Wallace were second-team selections ... Iowa State was ranked ninth on the AP poll, its highest-ever AP ranking, prior to the Oct. 19 game at Oklahoma.

HEAD COACH DAN McCARNEY

With each victory, Dan McCarney has furthered his own Cyclone legacy. He is coaching his 101st game at ISU (38-62), the longest tenure of any head coach in school history. Iowa State is the only Big 12 North team to finish in the upper half of the division in each of the last three seasons. This underscores the improvement he has wrought in the ISU football program – his vision, grit and boundless energy helped his team earn the school's first bowl victory, the highest AP ranking in school history (ninth, Oct. 13, 2002), secure the first nine-win gridiron campaign in 94 seasons and three-straight bowl seasons – a school first.

MEDIA POLICY CHANGES FOR 2003

(1) Any media outlet desiring to bring a recreational vehicle (RV) to a game and park in Lot S-2 must gain permission from media relations director Tom Kroeschell **at least 72 hours prior to kickoff (Wednesday afternoon).**

(2) Any media outlet desiring to bring a satellite truck for live broadcasts from Jack Trice Stadium must gain permission from media relations director Tom Kroeschell **at least 48 hours prior to kickoff (Thursday afternoon).**

(3) Armbands for sideline photographers will be distributed at each game. **Armbands will be game specific.** Photographers with a season pass will be required to have the proper armband for each game. Armbands will only be distributed to those having proper photo identification and an affiliation identification.

- Iowa State's nine wins in 2000 were the most by a Cyclone team since ISU went 9-1 in 1906 – the only other nine-win season in school history ... ISU's win over Pittsburgh in the Insight.com Bowl was the school's first bowl victory in five tries ... McCarney's Cyclones finished the season ranked 25th on the final Associated Press poll, ISU's first poll appearance since 1981.
- Dan McCarney is in his ninth season as Iowa State's head coach and this week's game will be his 101st, making him the longest-tenured coach in Cyclone history ... Clay Stapleton (1958-67) held the previous mark (99 games) ... McCarney's nine-year tenure ranks second among Big 12 head coaches, and 15th in Division I-A.
- Iowa State's 36-14 win over No. 20 Nebraska Sept. 28, 2002, was ISU's largest margin of victory over the Huskers since 1899 ... it was ISU's first win over Nebraska since 1992 and the Cyclones' first win over a ranked opponent since 1993 ... Iowa State was ranked ninth in the Oct. 13 AP poll, the highest standing in school history.
- Iowa State is 16-8 in its last 24 home games (.667), the school's best 24-game mark in Jack Trice Stadium history (1975-2003), and the school's best overall home stretch since Nov. 14, 1914, to Nov. 20, 1920 (16-7-1).
- Iowa State's win at Iowa Sept. 14, 2002, was the Cyclones' fifth-straight victory against the Hawkeyes, a series first ... it marked the second time Iowa State has won three-straight games in Iowa City, the first trio of road victories over the Hawks coming in the series' first three games in 1894-95-97 ... the Cyclones' 1998 27-9 win at Iowa snapped a 31-game winless streak on the road and was Iowa State's first win over its intrastate rival in 15 years ... the Cyclones' 17-10 victory over the Hawkeyes in 1999 marked the first ISU win over Iowa in Ames since 1981 ... Iowa State's win at Iowa in 2000 marked the first time the Cyclones had posted consecutive series road victories against an annual opponent since beating Missouri in 1989 and 1991.
- Iowa State's 42-point margin of victory in a 49-7 win at Kansas in 2001 was the Cyclones' biggest conference road win since a 54-7 win at Missouri Valley Conference foe Washington (Mo.) in 1923 ... it was also the largest margin of victory over a conference opponent since ISU beat Oklahoma State 54-0 in 1971.
- The Cyclones' 41-0 win over Baylor in 2001 marked the sixth-straight game in which the Cyclones scored at least 30 points – a school record that was equalled against Nebraska in 2002 ... defensively, the victory over Baylor marked Iowa State's first shutout win over a conference opponent since 1978 and the Cyclones' biggest margin of victory against a league opponent since 1971.
- Iowa State's 35-27 win at Colorado in 2000 snapped ISU's longest losing streak against an annual opponent (16 games) ... ISU beat the Buffaloes for the first time since 1983 and won for the first time in Boulder, Colo., since 1982.
- Iowa State is 8-10 in its last 18 road games ... this includes seven straight road losses, all to ranked teams ... still, ISU was a program that was 6-43-1 away from home during the 1990s ... Iowa State wins at Iowa, Baylor and Oklahoma State in 2000 marked the first time an Iowa State team won three-straight road games since the 1978 Hall of Fame Bowl season ... it also marked the first time the Cyclones had won the season's first three road

games since the 1971 Sun Bowl season ... the victories at Baylor and at Oklahoma State marked ISU's first consecutive conference road wins since the Cyclones won at Missouri (35-21, Nov. 11) and Oklahoma State (31-21, Nov. 18) in the final two games of the 1989 season.

- Iowa State's 24-21 win at Missouri in 1999 was the Cyclones' first Big 12 road victory and snapped a 28-game conference winless streak away from home, dating back to a Nov. 2, 1991, win at Mizzou.
- Iowa State's 24-0 win at UNLV in 1999 was the Cyclones' first road shutout victory and biggest win away from home since they defeated Iowa 31-0 in 1978.
- Iowa State's eight-week run in The Associated Press poll from Sept. 16 to Nov. 4, 2002, matched the Cyclones' longest streak set in 1972 (Oct. 2 to Nov. 20).
- Iowa State's wins over Nebraska, Texas Tech and Iowa in 2002 mark the first time ISU has defeated three bowl teams in one season. The previous best was two (2000 and 1981).

INCREDIBLE PROGRESS AT ISU UNDER DAN McCARNEY

Dan McCarney's Iowa State program is 25-20 since the start of the 2000 season ... this from a program that won just 27 games during the 1990s, ranking 117th among 119 NCAA Division I-A schools during the last decade ... only Temple (22) and Kent State (15) had fewer wins from 1990-99 ... ISU was 27-80-3 during the 90s (.259), bettering the record of only UTEP (28-84-2/.254), Temple (22-88-0/.200) and Kent State (15-94-1/.141) in the last decade ... overall, McCarney is 38-61 in his ninth season as head coach at ISU.

ISU'S BRUTAL SCHEDULE/RANKED FOURTH IN NCAA

The venues may change, but the opponents stay the same ... Iowa State squares off against seven teams which played in bowl games last season and five that are ranked this week on the latest AP poll ... five of Iowa State's last six games have been against rated foes, including Saturday's game at No. 14 Nebraska (Independence) ... ISU played host to No. 16 Iowa (Orange), No. 1 Oklahoma (Rose) and No. 19 Texas ... ISU will play host to Kansas State (Holiday) and Colorado (Alamo) ... the Cyclones played at No. 12 Northern Illinois and Texas Tech (Tangerine) ... Tech and Missouri are just outside the top 25 (26th and 27th, respectively).

ABOUT NO. 14 NEBRASKA AND HEAD COACH FRANK SOLICH

Nebraska enters today's game 6-1, 2-1 in Big 12 play ... the Huskers beat Texas A&M 48-12 in Lincoln last week, after suffering a 41-24 loss at Missouri on Oct. 11 ... Frank Solich is 55-17 in his sixth year at Nebraska ... QB Jammal Lord leads the Husker rushing and passing attacks ... Lord is averaging 80 ypg on the ground and has scored eight of NU's 17 rushing touchdowns ... Lord has also thrown for 650 yards and three scores ... NEBRASKA LEADS THE SERIES 79-16-2

Iowa State and Nebraska have met 97 times, the longest-running series in Cyclone history ... ISU broke a nine-game series losing streak with a 36-14 victory last season ... the Cyclones have not won in Lincoln since 1977 (24-21), and are 4-36 all-time in Memorial Stadium.

Jack Trice Stadium (53,888), Ames, Iowa**

Iowa State quarterback Seneca Wallace completed 19-of-32 passes for 220 yards and a touchdown and ran for two more scores as the Cyclone defense held Nebraska to 81 yards rushing for ISU's biggest win over the Huskers since 1899 ... the win was ISU's first over Nebraska since 1992 and marked the Cyclones' first win over a ranked opponent since 1993 ... Iowa State made three turnovers, but Nebraska could not convert any into points ... five Husker turnovers led to 17 Cyclone points ... Iowa State led 19-7 at halftime, and Wallace drove the Cyclones 80 yards in 11 plays on the opening drive of the second half ... Wallace's 1-yard TD sneak gave ISU a 26-7 lead with 10:22 left in the third quarter ... a blocked punt set up a Nebraska touchdown and closed the gap to 26-14, but Iowa State linebacker Brandon Brown picked off a Jammal Lord pass on the Huskers' next possession ... Wallace ran around the Nebraska defense for a 7-yard score two plays later for a 33-14 lead with 13:21 left in the game ... WR Lane Danielsen made a career-high nine receptions for 111 yards and a touchdown ... TB Michael Wagner rushed for 107 yards on 19 carries for the Cyclones ... Wallace had 270 yards of total offense as Iowa State outgained Nebraska 412-273 ... 90 yards of Husker offense came on a TD pass from Lord to Ross Pilkington in the second quarter ... Brown and DT Jordan Carstens had 10 tackles each and true freshman NG Nick Leaders, an Omaha, Neb., native, had nine tackles, including three for loss and two sacks ... Nebraska could muster just three first downs and 37 yards rushing on 20 carries in the first three quarters.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY

The Cyclones are 2-10-1 all-time on Oct. 25 ... ISU defeated Baylor 24-17 in 1997 and Kansas 44-20 in 1969 ... ISU and Nebraska have never met on this date.

Joe Woodley made the switch full time to linebacker after playing both fullback and linebacker in 2002 ... T.J. Klith moved from running back to wide receiver.

Since the 1997 season opener (79 games), Iowa State running backs have lost only SIX fumbles ... that number by itself may be impressive, but compare it to the big picture ... in those 79 games, Cyclone backs have tallied 12,549 yards on 2,582 "touches" (rushes, receptions, returns) ... that's an average of 430 touches and 2,092 yards (1.19 miles) per lost fumble ... Hiawatha Rutland's lost fumble in the third quarter against Kansas State (Nov. 9, 2002) was the first by an ISU back since Rutland's lost fumble at Baylor on Sept. 30, 2000.

Berryman, a Houston native and a snappy dresser, had one tackle against Oklahoma ... redshirt freshman **Korey Smith** (6-4, 232) had four tackles against Oklahoma ... when senior Jordan Carstens couldn't play against Oklahoma, he was replaced by another true freshman from Houston, 6-0, 288 **Brent Curvey** (pronounced kerr-VAY) ... Curvey was second on the team with 11 tackles, including one for loss against OU ... he had seven tackles with a sack against Texas ... true freshman **Aaron Brant**, who graduated from high school last December has started six games this season at right guard ... linebacker **Dominique Flower** started against Texas Tech ... **Ryan Baum**, a true freshman walkon from Gilbert, has played on special teams ... true freshman defensive back **DeAndre Jackson** has played this season but missed the Texas game with a dislocated thumb ... the other true freshman to see action is **Matt Scherbring** of Oelwein in the defensive line.

Iowa State redshirt freshman quarterback Austin Flynn, the first freshman to start a season opener in Cyclone history, led ISU to a 17-10 victory over intrastate foe Northern Iowa ... Flynn finished the contest 9-of-18 through the air for 158 yards and a touchdown and added 67 yards and a score on the ground ... Michael Wagner led all Cyclone rushers, gaining 87 yards on 17 carries ... all-Big 12 kicker Adam Benike started the game scoring, hitting a 27-yard field goal with less than four minutes remaining in the first quarter ... after UNI answered with a 44-yard field goal, the Cyclones drove 74 yards in 10 plays, capped with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Flynn to senior wideout Jack Whitver ... UNI tied the game at 10-10 late in the half after an interception of a tipped Flynn pass was returned to the ISU 1-yard line ... Flynn capped the ISU scoring with a 3-yard run late in the third quarter ... the Iowa State defense held fast in the fourth quarter, denying two fourth-down conversion attempts by the Panthers ... the game was played before the largest home-opener crowd since 1987.

Sept. 6 • Iowa State 48, Ohio 20 • Jack Trice Stadium (40,056) • Ames, Iowa

Redshirt freshman QB Austin Flynn tallied 330 yards of total offense in his second collegiate game while Jack Whitver and Lane Danielsen each had more than 100 yards receiving as Iowa State dispatched Ohio 48-20 ... the Cyclones tallied 523 yards of total offense to Ohio's 404 yards ... the Bobcats gained 219 yards on three plays, including a 68-yard TD run by QB Fred Ray that put Ohio up 7-3 in the first quarter ... ISU answered that effort by driving 56 yards in eight plays with Michael Wagner who gained 115 yards on 21 carries for the day, scoring on a 3-yard run that put the Cyclones ahead to stay ... Flynn hit on 14-of-27 passes for 252 yards and a pair of TDs, including a 59-yard pass play off a short throw to Danielsen that put Iowa State up 31-14 with 4:53 left in the second quarter ... Flynn also gained 78 yards rushing on 14 carries ... Danielsen became the Cyclones' all-time receiving yards leader on the play, eclipsing Tracy Henderson (2,048/1982-84) ... Danielsen, a former walk-on, had five receptions for 102 yards and the TD ... his roommate, Jack Whitver, had 110 yards on five receptions ... Iowa State's defense forced two fumbles that led to 10 Cyclone points ... free safety Marc Timmons led ISU with 10 tackles ... cornerback Ellis Hobbs was the team defensive MVP.

Sept. 13 • No. 23 Iowa 40, Iowa State 21 • Jack Trice Stadium (53,488) • Ames, Iowa

Iowa State outgained Iowa 390-243 and the Cyclone defense held the Hawks to just 10 first downs but Iowa used a superior kicking game and held ISU to 71 yards rushing on 40 carries to end Iowa State's five-year win streak against its intrastate rival with a 40-21 decision before 53,488 – the largest crowd to see a game in Jack Trice Stadium since the facility was reconfigured in 1996 ... Iowa led 10-0 early before ISU QB Austin Flynn ran 25 yards for a touchdown to close the gap to 10-7 ... Iowa State advanced to the Hawk 8-yard line in the first-half's final seconds but couldn't score ... when ISU was forced to punt on the second half's first possession, Troy Blakenship's punt was blocked and Hawk Chris Smith recovered in the Cyclone endzone for a 27-7 Iowa lead ... an interception deep in Iowa State territory set up Iowa's next TD ... another blocked ISU punt then set up a Hawk field goal for a 33-7 advantage with 4:51 left in the third quarter ... Flynn completed 24-of-41 pass attempts for 239 yards and a TD ... he also rushed for 57 yards and one score ... Hiawatha Rutland made eight receptions for 66 yards ... WR Jack Whitver made four receptions for 111 yards and one TD ... Iowa's Nate Kaeding kicked field goals of 42, 23, 19 and 20 yards ... LB Brandon Brown led Iowa State with eight tackles.

Sept. 27 • No. 20 Northern Illinois 24, Iowa State 16 • Brigham Field at Huskie Stadium (28,218) • DeKalb, Ill.

Two interceptions led to 14 Northern Illinois points, and NIU RB Michael Turner became the school's leading rusher with 134 yards as the No. 20 Huskies defeated Iowa State 24-16 before a record crowd in DeKalb, Ill. ... ISU outgained NIU 355-334 but turned the ball over in key situations ... ISU's Hiawatha Rutland opened the scoring with a 2-yard run, giving ISU a 7-0 lead ... the Cyclones drove the ball to the Northern Illinois 16 in the second quarter when Vinson Reynolds picked off a screen pass from Austin Flynn and returned the ball 65 yards ... Turner scored for 2 yards out three plays later for a 7-7 tie ... Adam Benike hit the first of three field goals to put ISU up 10-7 ... Josh Haldi and Dan Sheldon connected on a 38 yard pass with 6:05 left in the first half, and NIU took a 14-10 lead into the lockerroom ... ISU regained the lead on field goals of 43 and 26 yards by Benike ... a Steve Azar field goal tipped the scales back to NIU with 7:45 remaining ... Akil Grant's interception with 5:49 left when Flynn was hit while throwing and P.J. Fleck's touchdown catch with 1:55 on the clock sealed the 24-16 NIU victory ... Michael Wagner led the Cyclones with 97 yards on 18 carries ... Austin Flynn finished 16-of-33 for 182 yards and the two interceptions ... Lance Young and Lane Danielsen each caught four passes ... Benike's three field goals tied a career-high (2002 vs. Nebraska) ... JaMaine Billups blocked a punt in the first quarter, the first for the Cyclones since Oct. 26, 2002, when Nik Mooser blocked a Texas punt ... Steve Paris grabbed his second career interception ... Brandon Brown led the ISU defense with 11 tackles, three for loss ... it was a costly loss as Rutland suffered a season-ending knee injury and DT Jordan Carstens was forced from the game with a knee injury.

Oct. 4 • No. 1 Oklahoma 53, Iowa State 7 • Jack Trice Stadium (49,670) • Ames, Iowa

Oklahoma quarterback Jason White hit on 26-of-34 passes for a career-high 384 yards and a school record-equalling five touchdowns and No. 1 OU played like the nation's best team in a 53-7 decision before an Iowa State crowd of 49,670 ... the Sooners tallied 613 yards of total offense and eclipsed the 50-point mark for the third straight game ... the Iowa State defense hung tough with Oklahoma early ... a fake punt pass from ISU's Tony Yelk early the second quarter was successful in getting a first down only to be called back ... Oklahoma, which held a 3-0 lead, scored on the ensuing 79-yard drive for a 9-0 advantage ... a fumbled second-quarter reception by Iowa State was converted to points by the Sooners on the next play, a 39-yard TD pass from White to Mark Bradley ... 12 different Oklahoma players caught a pass ... OU led 22-0 at halftime ... Iowa State quarterback Austin Flynn hit on 6-of-17 passes for 88 yards with two interceptions ... he also had 26 yards rushing, but was sacked six times by Oklahoma, which held the Cyclones to 88 yards rushing on 31 carries and 234 total yards ... Iowa State's only score came on a 77-yard interception return by JaMaine Billups, who picked off a screen pass thrown by OU backup signal-caller Paul Thompson with 10:48 left in the game ... it was the seventh-longest interception runback in ISU history to make it 39-7 ... Oklahoma's Mark Bradley returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown ... Billups led Iowa State with 14 tackles ... playing for the injured Jordan Carstens, true freshman defensive tackle Brent Curvey made 11 tackles and had a tackle for loss.

Oct. 11 • Texas Tech 52, Iowa State 21 • Jones SBC Stadium (49,627) • Lubbock, Texas

Iowa State held Texas Tech's record-setting pass offense in check into the second half but the Red Raiders took advantage of a key turnover and pulled away for a 52-21 win ... Tech scored on its first drive but Michael Wagner's 25-yard TD run tied the game, 7-7 ... the Red Raiders led 21-7 before Cyclone Joe Woodley intercepted a B.J. Symons pass ... Iowa State, led by quarterback Cris Love who had relieved Austin Flynn, capped the ensuing 58-yard drive with a 21-yard TD pass to Lance Young just before halftime ... Iowa State tied the game on the first play of the second half when Love hit Lane Danielsen in the flat and the Cyclone receiver evaded his only defender for an 80-yard TD pass that was the seventh-longest in school history ... Danielsen finished the game with eight catches for 192 yards and the TD ... his receiving yards total ranked fourth in school single-game history ... Love set career highs, completing 15 passes in 29 attempts for 262 yards, two TDs with one interception ... but Texas Tech answered with another drive capped by a Symons 1-yard TD sneak ... on the ensuing kickoff, Ellis Hobbs fumbled at the Iowa State 9-yard line and the Red Raiders scored four plays later for a 35-21 Tech lead ... Texas Tech scored the last 31 points of the game as Symons completed 45-of-65 passes for 487 yards, two touchdowns and three TDs ... 11 different Texas Tech receivers caught a pass as the Red Raiders ran 111 plays for 775 yards, ranking first and second respectively in ISU opponent single-game history ... Hobbs, who had a team-high 10 tackles also had a school-record 53-yard fumble return ... safety Marc Timmons had 10 tackles and his seventh career interception.

Oct. 18 • No. 20 Texas 40, Iowa State 19 • Jack Trice Stadium (45,355) • Ames, Iowa

Iowa State quarterback Austin Flynn gave the Cyclones a spark, leading ISU on three second-half scoring drives in a 40-19 loss against No. 20 Texas ... Flynn started the second half, replacing Cris Love, who had made his first career start and played the entire first half ... Texas dominated the first half and held a 27-0 lead at halftime ... outgained by the Longhorns 346-45 in the first half, Iowa State made the only two scores of the third quarter on a career-long 51-yard field goal by PK/P Tony Yelk and a 2-yard TD on a reverse by WR Lane Danielsen ... the score was 33-19 with 8:23 left in the game after Flynn capped a 15-play, 80-yard drive with a 5-yard TD pass to Danielsen and ran for his second successful two-point conversion ... but Texas retaliated with pass plays of 50 and 30 yards on the next drive, the second from Chance Mock to Roy Williams that put the Longhorns up 40-19 with 7:07 remaining ... with Flynn as the signal-caller, Iowa State equalled Texas with 232 second-half yards and held a 19-13 advantage on the scoreboard after halftime ... Texas' Cedric Benson ran for 140 yards and three touchdowns and Longhorn QBs Vince Young and Chance Mock combined for 19-of-26 through the air for 343 yards and two TDs ... freshman tailback Stevie Hicks led Iowa State with 67 yards rushing on 11 plays ... Love and Flynn were a combined 11-of-34 for 172 yards and one TD ... Texas made big plays, including a 56-yard pass from WR Williams to WR B.J. Johnson to set up the Longhorns' second score ... Johnson had seven receptions for 187 yards and a TD ... SS JaMaine Billups and true freshman DE Jason Berryman had 14 tackles each for ISU.
