Nebraska returns to Lincoln for a two-game homestand at Memorial Stadium, beginning with a primetime contest on Saturday against defending Big Ten West champ Northwestern. Game time at Memorial Stadium is set for shortly after 6:30 p.m., with the game televised on BTN.

Saturday's game is Nebraska's Homecoming contest and the start of five home games over the final seven games of the season.

Nebraska enters the game at 2-3 overall and 0-2 in Big Ten play following a heartbreaking 23-20 overtime loss at No. 20 Michigan State on Saturday night. The Huskers dominated the second half of the game, and held a touchdown lead late in the game, but a Spartan punt return touchdown forced overtime, where the Spartans escaped with the three-point win.

The Blackshirt defense continues to perform at an elite level. Nebraska held Michigan State to 254 yards of total offense, incuding just 14 second-half yards and no first downs in the final 30 minutes of regulation.

Northwestern comes to Lincoln with a 2-2 mark, including an 0-1 record in Big Ten action. The Wildcats opened the season with a home conference loss against Michigan State, and have since won two of three non-conference matchups, including a 35-6 victory over Ohio on Saturday in Evanston. Coach Pat Fitzgerald's squad controlled the line of scrimmage against Ohio, rushing for 373 yards in the victory.

Each of the five Nebraska-Northwestern matchups in Lincoln since 2011 have been decided by one score, including two Nebraska wins on the game's final play.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKAVS. NORTHWESTERN

Saturday's matchup between Nebraska and Northwestern will be the 15th all-time between the two schools, with Nebraska holding an 8-6 advantage. The teams have split 10 meetings since Nebraska joined the Big Ten and the series has a history of close games.

- The five games in Lincoln since 2011 have been decided by a total of 17 points, with the largest margin being a seven-point Northwestern overtime victory in 2017. The 2013 and 2019 Husker victories were both decided on the game's final play, marking two of just three walk-off Nebraska wins in Memorial Stadium history.
- Overall, eight of the 10 meetings since 2011 have been decided by eight or fewer points, including each of the past four games.
- The schools met four times prior to Nebraska joining the Big Ten, with the Huskers holding a 3-1 edge. Nebraska defeated Northwestern, 66-17, in the 2000 Alamo Bowl, a Husker record for points scored in a bowl game.
- The schools are set to open the 2022 season against each other on Aug. 27 in Dublin, Ireland, as part of the Aer Lingus College Football Classic.

NEBRASKA TO CELEBRATE HOMECOMING VS. WILDCATS

This weekend will serve as Homecoming on the University of Nebraska-Lincoln campus. This marks the 110th Homecoming Game in Nebraska history, with Nebraska owning an all-time record of 82-23-4 (.771) in Homecoming games. Nebraska has won nine of its last 11 Homecoming games, including a 6-2 record against Big Ten teams on Homecoming.

HUSKERS WELCOME 'CATS FOR BIG TEN HOME OPENER

After playing its first two Big Ten Conference games away from Lincoln, the Huskers will play host to Northwestern for their league home opener.

• Nebraska is 7-3 in Big Ten home openers since joining the league in 2011, including a 30-23 win over Penn State last season.

PRIME TIME IN MEMORIAL STADIUM

Nebraska will play host to its first night game in Memorial Stadium since a 2019 matchup with Ohio State in Lincoln. It is just the third night game for NU in Scott Frost's four seasons as head coach.

- Historically, Nebraska has a strong history of success in night games at Memorial Stadium. The Huskers are 47-8 all-time in home night games since its first prime-time game at Memorial Stadium in 1986
- Nebraska is 6-3 in home prime-time games against Big Ten foes since joining the league in 2011.

NEBRASKA OFFENSE SHOWING EXPLOSIVE ABILITY

The Nebraska offense has shown good balanced and posted several impressive statistics through five games in 2021.

- Against Fordham, Nebraska finished the game with 329 rushing yards and 304 passing yards to roll up 633 yards of total offense. It was Nebraska's best offensive output since posting 674 yards of total offense at Illinois in 2019.
- The win over Fordham marked the fifth time NU has topped 600 yards in Scott Frost's four years as head coach. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State (10) has more 600-yard games in that time span.
- Nebraska's 300-300 offensive output was a rare statistical feat in school history. The Huskers had reached that mark just twice previously vs. South Dakota State in 2013 and at Illinois in 2019.

NOTING GAME 5

- Nebraska played its first overtime game since a 2019 loss at Colorado and lost in overtime for the sixth consecutive time.
- Nebraska out-gained Michigan State 234-14 in the second half, including a 112-1 advantage in total yards in the fourth quarter.
- Adrian Martinez rushed 21 times for 72 yards and two touchdowns and moved into the top 10 in Big Ten history in quarterback rushing yards.
- Martinez accounted for 316 yards of total offense (244 passing, 72 rushing). It marked his sixth straight game with at least 250 yards of total offense, setting a Nebraska record.
- Wide receiver Zavier Betts tied his career high with five receptions and his 62 yards were a career best, surpassing his 61-yard effort at Oklahoma.
- Running back Rahmir Johnson set career highs with 19 carries and 76 rushing yards.
 He also had a career-long 18-yard rush in the first half.
- Linebacker Luke Reimer led Nebraska with 11 tackles, marking his second double-figure tackle in the past three weeks.
- Senior safety Marqel Dismuke intercepted a pass in the first quarter, marking his first career interception.
- Senior receiver Levi Falck had a 22-yard reception, marking his longest catch in his two seasons at Nebraska.

- Nebraska has accounted for two of the seven 300/300 games by Big Ten teams over the past four years (Ohio State-3; Maryland-1; Penn State-1).
- The Huskers scored 52 points against Fordham, surpassing the 50-point mark for the first time since a 54-7 win at Maryland in 2019.
- In a 28-3 win over Buffalo, Nebraska gained 516 yards of offense, including plays of 71 (Martinez run), 68 (Martinez to Toure TD) and 68 yards (Martinez to Toure TD). The game marked the first time since a 2010 win at Kansas State in which Nebraska had three plays of longer than 60 yards.
- Nebraska averaged 8.5 yards on 61 offensive snaps against Buffalo. For the season, Nebraska averages 6.3 yards per play to rank sixth in the Big Ten and 42nd nationally.
- Nebraska has six plays of 50 yards or more to tie for sixth in the country in that category.
- Nebraska opened the season with a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in each of the first three games. Adrian Martinez had two 100-yard rushing games (Illinois, Buffalo), with Markese Stepp adding a third game over the century mark (Fordham). Samori Toure topped the century mark in receiving yards in back-to-back weeks (Fordham, Buffalo), after Oliver Martin surpassed 100 yards at Illinois
- Research indicates it was the first time in school history Nebraska has had a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in three straight games.
- Nebraska ranks third in the Big Ten and 25th in the nation in total offense at 471.0 yards per game.

MARTINEZ RANKS AMONG NATION'S TOP QUARTERBACKS

Quarterback **Adrian Martinez** has put up statistics in his Husker career that have him ranked among the Nebraska all-time leaders in several categories. Martinez has thrown for 6,889 yards in his career, rushed for 2,138 yards and totaled 9,027 yards of offense. He owns four Nebraska career records, five season records and one game record.

- Martinez is Nebraska's all-time leader in total offensive yards per game (273.5), 400-yard total offense games (5) and 300-yard total offense games (17). He has produced five of Nebraska's 17 individual 400-yard total offense performances.
- In 2021, Martinez is averaging 324.6 yards per game in total offense to rank 12th nationally and second in the Big Ten. Martinez has accounted for at least 250 yards of total offense in each of his last six games, a Nebraska record.
- He averaged a school-record 295.1 yards of total offense per game as a true freshman in 2018. That average ranked 12th nationally, led all freshmen and was the ninth-highest average by a freshman in NCAA history, including the third-best mark ever by a true freshman.
- In Nebraska's win over Buffalo, Martinez rushed nine times for 112 yards for his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and his second of 2021. He had a 71-yard run, marking the second-longest rush of his career, bettered only by a 75-yard touchdown run at Illinois in the season opener.
- Martinez eclipsed the 2,000 career rushing yard mark against Buffalo to become the fifth Nebraska quarterback to crack that rushing milestone. His 2,138 career rushing yards are the fourth-most in Nebraska history by a quarterback.
- Martinez is one of only five players in Big Ten history with 6,000 career passing yards and 2,000 career rushing yards. He joined Taylor Martinez (Nebraska), Antwaan Randle El (Indiana), Denard Robinson (Michigan) and JT Barrett (Ohio State) in the exclusive 6,000/2,000 Big Ten club.

- Against Fordham, Martinez became just the third Husker quarterback to complete 500 career passes and surpass 6,000 career passing yards. He joined Tommy Armstrong Jr. and Taylor Martinez in reaching those statistical milestones.
- Martinez threw for 289 yards at Oklahoma to post 1,000 passing yards for the season through four games. Martinez was just the second quarterback to reach 1,000 passing yards through four games, joining Tommy Armstrong Jr. in 2015. Martinez has four 1,000-yard passing seasons, the first quarterback in Nebraska history to accomplish that feat.
- Martinez's 2,138 career rushing yards leads all active FBS quarterbacks.
- Through five games in 2021, Martinez is leading Nebraska in rushing, passing and scoring. He is one of four three players in the FBS ranks to hold that distinction.
- Martinez also set Nebraska season records for 300-yard total offense games (7) and 400-yard total offense games (3) in 2018. Martinez has four 300-yard total offense games in 2021.
- Martinez has six rushing touchdowns in 2021, and 28 in his career to rank just two outside of the top 10 on the NU career rushing touchdown chart. He is two rushing touchdowns from becoming the fourth Nebraska signal caller with 30 career rushing touchdowns.
- Martinez is one of only four active FBS quarterbacks who entered the 2021 season with 5,000 career passing yards and 1,500 career rushing yards, and is now one of only four QBs with 6,000 passing yards and 1,800 rushing yards.
- Martinez completed a school-record 71.5 percent of his passes in 2020. His completion
 percentage led the Big Ten and ranked fourth nationally. His 71.5 completion percentage also
 ranked fifth overall in Big Ten history and was the fourth-highest mark in a Big Ten Conference
 season. Martinez is completing 66.9 percent of his passes in 2021.
- Martinez set a then-Nebraska record with an 86.2 completion percentage against Minnesota in 2018, connecting on 25-of-29 passes for 276 yards and three touchdowns. He bettered that mark at lowa in 2020, connecting on 18-of-20 passes for a school-record 90.0 percent completion rate.
- Martinez not only led Nebraska in passing in 2020, but he was the Huskers' leading rusher as well, becoming the third player to lead Nebraska in rushing and passing in the same season.
- In 2020, Martinez ranked second nationally in rushing yards per game among quarterbacks (74.4 yards per game). He was the only Power Five quarterback to average 70 rushing yards per game. He opened 2021 with 111 rushing yards at Illinois, including a career-long 75-yard touchdown run.
- At Illinois in 2019, Martinez produced one of only two 300-yard passing and 100-yard rushing performances in Nebraska history (328 passing, 118 rushing).
- In 2018, Martinez became just the sixth freshman in NCAA history to average 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game and just the second true freshman to hit those marks. Martinez was also one of only four FBS quarterbacks regardless of class who averaged 225 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game in 2018.

TOURE LEADING HUSKER RECEIVING CORPS

Nebraska senior receiver **Samori Toure** joined the program in January after earning FCS All-America honors at Montana. Toure has made his mark for the Huskers, catching 21 passes for 375 yards and two touchdowns. He has also rushed six times for 48 yards and a touchdown.

- Toure caught two passes for 136 yards against Buffalo, scoring on a pair of 68-yard touchdown receptions. Toure's two catches of better than 65 yards marked the third time in school history a Husker player had accomplished that statistical achievement, joining Irving Fryar (1983 at Minnesota, 70 and 68 yards) and Frantz Hardy (2006 vs. Kansas, 78 and 75 yards).
- Toure's 136-yard effort against Buffalo was his second straight 100-yard receiving game. He had eight catches for 133 yards against Fordham. Toure is the first Husker with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since JD Spielman accomplished the feat against Purdue and Wisconsin in 2018.
- Toure has 10 career 100-yard receiving games, including eight at Montana.
- Toure's two 100-yard receiving games came after Oliver Martin had a 100-yard effort at Illinois. This marked the first time NU had a 100-yard receiver in three straight games since the 2017 season.

Toure caught 87 passes for a school-record 1,495 receiving yards at Montana in 2019, which ranked second nationally. He came to Nebraska with career totals of 155 receptions, 2,488 yards and 20 touchdowns.

RETURNERS, NEWCOMERS FEATURED AMONG PASS CATCHERS

Toure has earned the headlines early in the season, but he is far from Nebraska's only pass-catching option. Nebraska returned four of its top six receivers from last season, led by a tight end unit with two proven veterans.

- Austin Allen started seven games at tight end last season and ranked second on the team with
 career highs of 18 catches and 236 receiving yards, despite a shortened season. He was on the
 preseason watch list for the Mackey Award (nation's best tight end) and the Senior Bowl. Allen
 ranks second for the Huskers with 17 catches in 2021. He had four receptions for a career-high 61
 yards against Fordham, had a career-best six catches at Oklahoma, and added four at Michigan
 State.
- Travis Vokolek made four starts and caught nine passes for 91 yards in the shortened 2020 season. He was fifth on the team in receiving yards, and Vokolek is on the preseason watch list for the Senior Bowl. He missed the first three games of the 2021 season, before returning at Oklahoma where he showed his potential with a career-long 38-yard reception. He added two receptions at Northwestern.
- Oliver Martin is in his second season at Nebraska in 2021. Martin started four of the final five games last season after gaining eligibility. He opened 2021 by setting career highs in receptions (6) and yards (103) at Illinois. He also had a career-long 43-yard catch, and caught a four-yard touchdown pass, registering a touchdown catch at a third Big Ten school (also Michigan, Iowa). Martin has missed the past four games because of injury.
- Zavier Betts has flashed his play-making ability in his two seasons in the program. Betts has 11 catches for 174 yards this season, including a career-high 62 yards on five catches at Michigan State. The previous week he had a career-long 55-yard catch at Oklahoma.
- Omar Manning has 11 catches for 148 yards, and made his first career TD catch in the fourth quarter at Oklahoma. Manning has nine catches in the past three games.

HUSKERS HAVE YOUNG, TALENTED OFFENSIVE LINE

The Nebraska offensive line had significant experience heading into the 2021 season, but all 23 offensive linemen are also eligible to return for 2022. The group has helped NU become the only Power Five program to average 200 rushing yards each of the last three seasons (2018, 2019, 2020). NU is in position to reach that plateau again this season, averging 199.6 rushing yards per game.

- Cam Jurgens has started 23 of Nebraska's 25 games at center since the start of the 2019 season. In 2019, Jurgens became the first Husker freshman to ever start a game at center.
- Bryce Benhart has started 13 straight games at right tackle dating back to the start of the 2020 season. Benhart was a top-150 recruit out of high school.
- As a true freshman, **Turner Corcoran** started the final game at left tackle last season, becoming the first true freshman to ever start at left tackle for Nebraska. Corcoran was a top-50 recruit out of high school. He is holding down the starting role at left tackle in 2021.
- Offensive guard **Matt Sichterman** earned his first career start at Illinois and has held that position for all five games.

BLACKSHIRTS PLAYING AT HIGH LEVEL IN 2021

The veteran Nebraska Blackshirt defense has shown its teeth in 2021, beginning with dominant efforts in home victories over Fordham and Buffalo. The Blackshirts carried the momentum on the road with impressive efforts against nationally ranked Oklahoma and Michigan State.

- The Blackshirts most impressive defensive effort of the season may have come at No. 20 Michigan State. The Huskers held MSU to 254 total yards in an overtime loss. In the final 30 minutes of regulation, Michigan State had no first downs and gained just 14 yards on 15 offensive plays.
- Nebraska held Oklahoma's high-powered offense to 408 total yards in a 23-16 setback on Sept.18.
 OU's offensive output ended a streak of seven straight games with the Blackshirts limiting opponents to fewer than 400 yards. It was the first time NU has held seven straight foes to less than 400 yards of offense since an eight-game streak spanning the 2009 and 2010 seasons.
- The Blackshirts posted one of the best defensive efforts against Oklahoma in recent years. Nebraska limited the Sooners to 23 points, ending OU's FBS record streak of 65 straight games with at least 27 points.
- Oklahoma was held to seven points in the first half, marking the first time the Sooners were held to single digits in the first half of a home game since 2012.
- The Blackshirt defense allowed 33 points in a three-game stretch from Fordham to Oklahoma.
 That was the fewest points Nebraska has allowed in a three-game stretch since the 2010 season.
- Nebraska defeated Fordham (52-7) and Buffalo (28-3) in consecutive home wins. The defensive efforts in its two victories marked the first time Nebraska has held back-to-back opponents to single digits since 2010 when NU defeated Kansas 20-3 and lost 9-6 at Texas A&M.
- The three points allowed against Buffalo were Nebraska's fewest since a 24-3 win over Michigan State in 2011. Nebraska held the Bulls scoreless in the first half, the first opponent NU has blanked in the first half since taking a 34-0 halftime lead at Maryland in 2019.



- Nebraska went more than seven quarters without allowing a touchdown before Oklahoma's firstquarter score. Nebraska also went 79:57 of game action without allowing a point prior to Buffalo's third-quarter field goal.
- Nebraska did not allow a point in the fourth quarter of its first three games before an Oklahoma touchdown in the fourth quarter. Nebraska has outscored the opposition 48-14 in the fourth quarter, with the defense allowing just seven of those points.
- The defense has also set the tone in the first quarter. Opponents have scored just nine first-quarter points (2, Illinois; 7, Oklahoma), with the Blackshirts surrending just one touchdown in five games.
- The Husker defense forced four turnovers against Fordham and Buffalo, with all four takeaways leading to Nebraska touchdowns (28 points). NU's three takeaways against Fordham were its most since forcing four turnovers at Maryland in 2019. Nebraska intercepted three passes vs. Fordham, the first game with three picks since the 2019 season opener against South Alabama.

VETERAN DEFENSE LEADING HUSKERS

Nebraska's defensive success comes on the strength of a battle-tested veteran unit as Nebraska returned 11 full- or part-time starters in 2021. The Huskers had eight returning players who started at least seven games in 2020.

- Nebraska allowed 169.5 rushing yards and 386.5 total yards per game in 2020. Those totals marked the fewest rushing and total yards allowed per game by a Husker defense since the 2016 season. Through five games, the Huskers have improved on those numbers, allowing 139.2 rushing yards and 327.8 total yards per contest.
- A total of seven Husker defenders earned at least honorable-mention All-Big Ten accolades last season. That was the highest number of all-conference defenders since Nebraska joined the Big Ten in 2011, and six of those seven All-Big Ten selections return this fall.
- Cornerback Cam Taylor-Britt was a second-team All-Big Ten honoree in 2020. Teams generally avoided throwing to Taylor-Britt's side of the field, but when they did he broke up four passes and had a pair of interceptions in eight games. Taylor-Britt has ranked in the top 70 nationally in interceptions each of the last two years, and he ranked third nationally in forced fumbles in 2019.
- Safety Marquel Dismuke, outside linebacker JoJo Domann, inside linebacker Will Honas, defensive lineman Ben Stille and safety Deontai Williams all returned as "super seniors" in their sixth year playing college football. Each of the five "super seniors" earned honorable-mention All-Big Ten accolades last season.
- Dismuke has started 25 consecutive games at safety. He ranked fourth on the team with 47 tackles in 2020 and set career highs with 4.0 TFLs and four pass breakups in last year's shortened season. Dismuke has totaled 173 tackles in his career, including 14 in 2021.
- Domann led the Huskers with a career-high 58 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, five pass breakups, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in eight games last season. Domann is fifth among all active FBS players with seven career forced fumbles. This season, Domann has 27 tackles and four tackles for loss, including a career-high 12 tackles at Oklahoma.
- Stille returned to anchor the defensive line. His 27 career starts are the most of any current Blackshirt. Stille is Nebraska's active career leader with 27.5 tackles for loss and 13.0 sacks.
- Williams set career highs with 51 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack in eight games last year. He also broke up four passes and had a sack, forced fumble and fumble recovery for a touchdown on the same play against Penn State, believed to be the first Husker ever to accomplish that feat. Williams picked off a pair of passes in the Husker victory over Fordham, and has 29 tackles and two tackles for loss in 2021.
- Nebraska returned five additional starters in 2021. **Garrett Nelson** started every game at outside linebacker in 2020. He has a team-high 7.0 tackles for loss in 2021, including 2.5 TFL at Illinois and two at Michigan State. Nelson has at least one tackle for loss in seven of the past eight games.
- Luke Reimer made the most of his five starts at inside linebacker in 2020, recording 40 tackles
 and ranking second on the team with 2.0 sacks and third with 5.0 TFLs despite battling injuries.
- Reimer had his best career game against Buffalo with a career-high 16 tackles and his first career interception which he returned to the UB 1 to set up a touchdown. Reimer's 16 tackles were the most by a Husker since Chris Weber had 17 at Illinois in 2015. His play against the Bulls earned Reimer Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week. Reimer leads Nebraska with 46 total tackles, including 11 stops at 20th-ranked Michigan State.
- Ty Robinson started seven games at defensive end in 2020, and has 14 tackles in 2021.
- **Nick Henrich** started one game in 2020 and is a starter at inside linebacker in 2021. Henrich finished 2020 with a double-figure tackle (12) game at Rutgers, and had a game-high 11 tackles in the season opener at Illinois. He ranks second on the team with 39 tackles.
- Caleb Tannor started five games at outside linebacker in 2020. Despite the shortened season, he finished with a career-high 23 tackles. He has 16 tackles and two TFL this season.
- Damion Daniels started three games at nose guard in 2020 and set career highs in tackles (20) and tackles for loss (4.0). He has 15 tackles, two TFL and two PBU in 2021.

FOUR HUSKERS SERVING AS 2021 TEAM CAPTAINS

Austin Allen, Damion Daniels, Adrian Martinez and Cam Taylor-Britt were elected as captains for the 2021 season. Martinez, who was also selected as a team captain in 2019 and 2020, is the first three-time captain in the history of Nebraska football.

- Allen has played in 37 games in his Husker career with 17 starts. He was named to the preseason
 watch list for the Mackey Award and was selected for the Senior Bowl watch list. He has caught
 44 passes in his career for 536 yards.
- Daniels is the second member of his family to be selected as a Nebraska captain, as his older brother Darrion was a team captain for the 2019 season. Damion and Darrion are the ninth brothers to each serve as Husker captains, and the first since Ty Steinkuhler (2008) and Baker Steinkuhler (2012) were each captains as seniors. Damion has played in 37 career games.
- The first three-time captain in program history, Martinez is in his fourth season as Nebraska's starting quarterback. Martinez has started 32 games in his career, and he owns one Nebraska game record, five season marks and five career records.
- Taylor-Britt was a second-team All-Big Ten selection in 2020. He led the Huskers with four pass breakups, and tied for the team lead with two interceptions. Taylor-Britt has 21 career starts.

FROST IN FOURTH SEASON LEADING HUSKERS

Scott Frost is set for his fourth season at Nebraska in 2021. The consensus 2017 national coach of the year, Frost boasts a 33-30 career record in his sixth season as a collegiate head coach.

- Frost is 14-23 in four seasons at Nebraska with 14 losses by one score or less, including nine by five or fewer points.
- Nebraska went 3-5 in the abbreviated 2020 season. Three of the Huskers' five losses were by a touchdown or less, including two one-possession losses to Northwestern and lowa teams that both finished the year ranked in the top 20.
- Frost has been a proven winner in his coaching career. In his 15th season as a full-time assistant or head coach, Frost's teams have posted a 136-48 record, averaging better than nine wins per season. Frost has been a part of seven conference championship teams in his 14 seasons and has twice coached in the national championship game.
- At UCF, Frost became the first coach in FBS history to turn a winless team into an undefeated team in just two years.
- Frost's teams have been ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his 14 seasons, including eight final top-10 rankings and six final top-five rankings.

HUSKER COACHING STAFF INTACT FOR SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR

All 10 Nebraska assistant coaches returned for the 2021 campaign. This year marked the first time since the 2014 season that Nebraska returns its entire coaching staff from the previous season.

- Of Frost's 10 assistant coaches, seven have been with him in each of his six seasons as a collegiate head coach, while Mike Dawson has been on five of Frost's six staffs.
- In addition to Scott Frost being recognized as the 2017 national coach of the year while at UCF, the Husker staff features three Broyles Award nominees in defensive coordinator **Erik Chinander** (2016 at UCF), offensive coordinator **Matt Lubick** (2012 at Duke) and quarterbacks coach **Mario Verduzco** (2018 at Nebraska). The Broyles Award is presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Lubick was also named the national wide receivers coach of the year and an AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year finalist in 2012.

HUSKERS BOAST 20 GRADUATES PLAYING THIS SEASON

A total of 20 Huskers are playing this season as college graduates. The group of graduates includes all eight seniors and 12 juniors. Fourteen players earned their degree from Nebraska, while the remaining six players were graduate transfers into the Husker program.

- Nebraska is one of only 14 FBS programs including just two Big Ten teams (Illinois 29) with at least 20 college graduates on their 2021 roster.
- Ben Stille has already earned both his bachelor's and master's degree in nutrition and health sciences and began coursework on a second master's degree this fall.

HUSKER STREAKS CONTINUE INTO 2021 SEASON

A pair of impressive team streaks carry over into the 2021 season, while a legendary streak resumed following a one-year hiatus in 2020.

- Nebraska has sold out 377 consecutive games at Memorial Stadium, dating from the next-to-last home game of the 1962 season through the Buffalo game. The Huskers' legendary sellout streak an NCAA record was paused during the 2020 season.
- The Huskers have scored in 320 consecutive games. The streak is the longest in school history, the seventh-longest in FBS history and the fifth-longest active streak. The last time Nebraska was shut out was a 19-0 loss at No. 17 Arizona State on Sept. 21, 1996.
- Nebraska has also scored in 346 consecutive home games, a school record. The last time the Huskers were shut out at home came on Nov. 9, 1968, against Kansas State (12-0 loss).
- Nebraska is 253-0 all-time when scoring 35 or more points at home. **Scott Frost** is also 23-0 in his head coaching career when his team scores at least 35 points.

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 132nd season this fall, and the Huskers boast a 907-403-40 all-time record in 1,350 games (.687). Nebraska is one of eight programs with 900 wins.

- Nebraska became the fifth member of the 900-win club at Illinois on Sept. 21, 2019, joining Michigan, Ohio State, Texas and Alabama as 900-win programs at the time. Notre Dame, Oklahoma and Penn State have since joined the elite club.
- Since 1970, Nebraska owns a 473-163-5 record (.742) with five national championships. The Huskers rank second among all FBS programs in national titles and fourth in wins since 1970.
- NU boasts 27 10-win seasons in school history, including 24 since 1970. The Huskers also have 12 seasons with 11 or more wins, seven seasons with 12 or more wins and three 13-win seasons.
- The Huskers own 50 nine-win seasons, one behind Alabama for the most in NCAA history. Forty-two of those seasons have come since 1970 and 48 since 1962, 12 more than any other school.
- Nebraska was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

NEBRASKA ALSO EXCELS IN THE CLASSROOM

Nebraska's rich tradition is not limited to the field, extending to a history of success in the classroom.

- NU owns the NCAA Division I record with 347 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans across all sports.
- Husker football has produced 108 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, the most of any single sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 18 NCAA Top 10 Award Winners, which is considered the "Heisman Trophy" of academics for NCAA student-athletes.
- Nebraska football has produced nine NCAA Top 10 Award winners, the most of any single team in NCAA history.
- Nebraska recorded an all-time high in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate numbers released in November of 2020. Nebraska's all-sports GSR rate of 94 percent marked the eighth consecutive year the Huskers GSR rate had improved.
- The football team posted a program-record team grade-point average of 3.297 in the 2020 spring semester. Following the spring 2021 semester, the football team's cumulative GPA was 3.137.

HUSKERS RANK HIGHLY IN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Nebraska has won five national championships, including three outright titles (1971, 1994, 1995) and two shared championships (1970, 1997). In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the Associated Press national title, but was No. 3 in the coaches poll behind No. 1 Texas and No. 2 Ohio State, both of whom lost their bowl games (the coaches' poll was voted on before bowl games). In 1997, undefeated Nebraska was voted No. 1 in the coaches' poll, while undefeated Michigan was No. 1 in the AP poll.

- Nebraska's four AP national championships rank seventh all-time.
- The Huskers' four coaches' poll national championships rank fourth all-time.

NEBRASKA NO. 2 IN CONFERENCE TITLES

Nebraska is one of only five schools in NCAA history that has won at least 40 conference championships, ranking second all-time with 46 conference titles. In 36 seasons (1962-97) under Hall-of-Fame coaches Bob Devaney (8) and Tom Osborne (13), the Huskers won 21 conference titles.

HUSKERS OWN BIG HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

Nebraska has enjoyed much success in its history when playing at home in front of the greatest fans in college football.

- Since 1970, NU is 283-57 (.832) at Memorial Stadium and has posted 41 perfect home seasons.
- The Huskers are 552-161-20 all-time in Lincoln (.767 in 130 years).
- Nebraska is 425-138-13 in Memorial Stadium (.749 in 99 years dating back to 1923).
- The Huskers are 47-8 all-time in Memorial Stadium night games.

ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASSES TO BE HONORED

The 2020 and 2021 classes of the Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame will be officially inducted this weekend. There was not an official induction for the 2020 class last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The induction ceremony will take place on Friday afternoon outside of the East Stadium.
- The 2020 Class of the Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame includes Amanda Burgoyne (Bowling, 2004-07); Eric Crouch (Football, 1997-2001); the late Sam Francis (Football and Track and Field, 1935-37), Maurtice Ivy (Women's Basketball, 1985-88); Jordan Larson (Volleyball, 2005-08); Terry Pettit (Volleyball Head Coach (1977-99).

 On Nov. 25, 1971, No. 1 Nebraska defeated No. 2 Oklahoma, 35-31, in a battle of undefeated teams in Norman.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Scott Frost is in his sixth season as a head coach and fourth year at Nebraska. Frost is one of four former Husker players to return to the Nebraska sideline as head coach, and he is one of 18 FBS head coaches coaching at his alma mater in 2021.
- Nebraska's staff also includes former Huskers Greg Austin (2003-06), Ryan Held (1993-96) and Barrett Ruud (2001-04).
- Frost is one of only four FBS head coaches to win a national title as a player. Both Frost (1995 & 1997) and Ryan Held (1994 & 1995) were two-time national champions as Huskers.
- Frost and seven of his 10 assistant coaches are in their sixth consecutive season working together, including two seasons at UCF.
- Frost and all 10 full-time assistants from the 2020 season returned for this fall. This season marks the first time since 2014 that Nebraska returned its entire coaching staff intact.
- Frost was the 2017 national coach of the year, while offensive coordinator Matt Lubick was a finalist for AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2012. Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander was a nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco was a Broyles Award nominee in 2018.
- Frost's teams have been ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his first 14 seasons as a full-time coach. Of those 10 seasons, Frost's teams have posted eight top-10 rankings and six top-five rankings.

HUSKER CAPTAIN NOTES

- Austin Allen, Damion Daniels, Adrian Martinez and Cam Taylor-Britt will serve as team captains for the 2021 season.
- Martinez is a captain for the third straight year, the only three-time captain in program history.
- Damion Daniels joins his brother Darrion (2019) as a Husker team captain. The Daniels are the ninth pair of brothers to each be selected as Nebraska team captains.

 Nebraska's roster features 155 players. With the NCAA granting a free year of eligibility for the 2020 season, all returning Huskers are listed with the same class as last year, leading to more than 60 percent of the Husker roster being comprised of freshmen.

- The Husker roster features 107 returning players and 48 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of 21 starters and 52 letterwinners.
- Nebraska added 48 players 23 scholarship student-athletes and 25 walk-ons - since last season. That group includes 40 true freshmen and eight transfers. Among the transfers, three came from FBS schools, three from FCS programs, one from the junior college rank and one from the NAIA.
- Nebraska's roster features players from 26 states and three foreign countries (Australia, Canada and Germany).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the Huskers' 2021 roster include: Nebraska (69), Iowa (12), Texas (10), Florida (9), Georgia (8), Arizona (6), Alabama (4), California (4), Colorado (4), Kansas (3), Michigan (3), New Jersey (3), Minnesota (2), Oklahoma (2) and South Dakota (2).



HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium's history dates nearly 100 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

HEAD COACH SCOTT FROST



HISTORIC TURNAROUND AT UCF

At UCF, Frost produced the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history, inheriting an 0-12 team and leading the Knights to a 13-0 record just two years later.

- In his first season in 2016, Frost made history as the only first-time head coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season.
- UCF tied for the national lead with a six-win improvement from the 2015 to 2016 season.
 The Knights then ranked third nationally after improving by seven wins from the 2016 to 2017 season.
- The Knights' seven-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 ranked 11th in NCAA history and marked just the second time ever a bowl team improved by more than six wins the next season.
- UCF was the American Athletic Conference and Peach Bowl champions and was the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- Frost called UCF's plays, orchestrating the greatest two-year offensive turnaround in NCAA history. The Knights went from last to fifth in total offense, improving their output by more than 260 yards per game. UCF also went from third-to-last to first in scoring offense, improving by nearly 35 points per

13-0 AS A PLAYER & COACH

In his second year as a head coach, Scott Frost guided UCF to a 13-0 record in 2017, when the Knights were the nation's only undefeated team.

- Frost was the fourth coach in FBS history to post a 13-0 record or better in either his first or second season as a head coach. Among that quartet, Frost is the only coach who inherited a team that won fewer than five games, as UCF went 0-12 the year before Frost's arrival.
- Frost is one of only seven active FBS head coaches who has posted a 13-0 season or better, joining Jimbo Fisher, Gary Patterson, Ed Orgeron, Nick Saban, Dabo Swinney and Kyle Whittingham.
- Frost also led Nebraska to a 13-0 record and a national title as the Huskers' starting quarterback in 1997. Frost was the first person in NCAA history to be part of a 13-0 season as both a player and a head coach.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, earning the honor from at least eight different organizations.

- Frost won the 2017 Paul "Bear" Bryant Award as the national coach of the year. He joined Chris Petersen (2006 & 2009, Boise State) as the only coaches in the 32-year history of the award to win the honor while coaching a team outside of a Power Five Conference.
- Frost was also the AP Coach of the Year, becoming the sixth coach to win the award in his first or second season as a head coach.

FROST A TOP OFFENSIVE COACH

For each of the last 12 years, Scott Frost has either been an offensive assistant, offensive coordinator or head coach who calls the offensive plays. During that time, he has consistently proven to be one of the nation's finest offensive coaches.

- In 12 seasons coaching offense, Frost has worked with eight units that finished in the top 10 nationally in scoring, including seven that ranked in the top five.
- Frost has also been a part of seven teams that ranked in the top 10 nationally in total offense the past 12 seasons.

FROST A PROVEN WINNER

Frost is a proven winner. In his 15-year full-time coaching career, Frost's teams have combined for a 136-48 record.

- Frost teams have averaged better than nin wins per season, including seven 12-win campaigns.
- He has won seven conference titles in 14 years.
- Frost has coached in two national title games and his teams have finished with a top-10 ranking eight times in the past 14 years.
- In two seasons as UCF's head coach, the Knights were the nation's most improved team in 2016 and were the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- As a Husker quarterback, Frost was a two-time national champion who helped NU to a 36-2 record, including a 24-2 mark as a starter.
- Frost is one of four active head coaches who won a national title as a player and is the only coach who won multiple national titles as a player.

Wildcats suffered a 30-23 setback at Duke in week three before bouncing back to earn a decisive 35-6 win vs. Ohio last weekend at home.

The Wildcats feature one of the more dominant rushing attacks in the country this season. Northwestern ranks 24th nationally with 214.0 yards per game on the ground. Evan Hull has 478 rushing yards and four touchdowns while averaging 119.5 yards per game. Hunter Johnson has completed 45-of-75 passes for 424 yards with four

Pat Fitzgerald is in his 16th season at Northwestern and boasts a 108-83 career record.

Fitzgerald served short stints at Maryland, Colorado and Idaho as defensive graduate assistants and linebacker/special teams coach before returning back to his alma mater. In 2001, Fitzgerald joined the Northwestern coaching staff as the defensive backs coach. From 2002-2005 Fitzgerald served the Wildcats as the linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking over as head coach in 2006.

In his 15 years as a head coach, Fitzgerald has taken the Wildcats to 10 bowl games and two Big Ten Championship games, including in 2020. Northwestern finished the season with a 7-2 mark in 2020 and posted a Citrus Bowl victory.

PAT FITZGERALD VS. NEBRASKA

Fiztgerald will face Nebraska for the 11th time as a head coach on Saturday. Fitzgerald holds a 5-5 record against Nebraska with the most recent win occuring in 2020 when the Wildcats beat the Huskers 21-13 in Evanston.

Northwestern University has fielded a football team since 1882 and was a founding member of the Big Ten Conference (originally the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives) in 1896.

The Wildcats have won eight Big Ten Championships (1903, 1926, 1930, 1931, 1936, 1995, 1996 and 2000), and have won two Big Ten West Division Titles (2018 and 2020). Northwestern has had 14 consensus All-America Selections and 142 First-Team All-Big Ten selections.

Champaign, Ill. (Aug. 28) - Nebraska rallied from a 21-point deficit late in the third quarter to pull within a touchdown, but Illinois held on for a 30-22 season-opening victory on Saturday afternoon.

victory on Saturday afternoon.

The Huskers outgained the Fighting Illini (392-326), but a pair of pivotal second-quarter plays - a roughing the passer penalty and an Adrian Martinez fumble that led to a 41-yard scoop and score - to erase an early 9-2 lead.

Trailing 30-9, Martinez started the comeback with a 75-yard scoring run to make it 30-16 late in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, Martinez engineered a 19-play, 91-yard drive capped by his four-yard touchdown pass to Oliver Martin with 2:41 left.

The Nebraska defense got a crucial stop with one minute left in the game to give Martinez and the offense one last shot to send the game to overtime. But Nebraska was unable to mount a scoring drive as time expired.

Martinez finished with 232 yards on 16-of-32 passing with one touchdown and no interceptions, while adding 111 rushing yards on 17 carries. Martin hauled in six catches for a career-high 103 yards and a touchdown.

The Huskers trailed 2-0 at the end of the first quarter after Cam Taylor-Britt was

The Huskers trailed 2-0 at the end of the first quarter after Cam Taylor-Britt was ruled down in the end zone when his left knee touched after fielding a long punt and

retreating all the way to the goal line before slipping to the turf.

Nebraska answered early in the second quarter with the two-yard touchdown run by Markese Stepp, on a drive that also featured a 30-yard reception by Stepp out of the backfield, as NU went 63 yards on seven plays. After a 3-and-out, Nebraska took over at its own 31 and a 43-yard pass from Martinez to Martin moved the Huskers into scoring position. However, the drive stalled at the Illinois 9, and Culp kicked a 27-yard field goal to put NIL up 9-2 to put NU up 9-2.

Perhaps the game's most pivotal play occurred on the ensuing Illinois drive. On 3rd-and-7 at the Illinois 44, Caleb Tannor hit quarterback Artur Sitkowski in the chest just as Sitkowski released the ball. The pass was intercepted by Taylor-Britt, but Tannor was flagged for both roughing the passer and unsportsmanlike conduct, giving the Illini the ball back and a 30-yard gain to the Nebraska 24. Seven plays later, Mike Epstein, who led Illinois with 75 yards rushing, found paydirt on a one-yard blast to tie the game with 2:51 left in the half.

After an Illinois turnover, Nebraska took over at its own 39 with 58 seconds left. On

After an Illinois turnover, Nebraska took over at its own 39 with 58 seconds left. On 3rd-and-2 at the NU 47, Martinez was sacked from behind by Keith Randolph Jr., who knocked the ball loose. It was scooped up by Calvin Hart Jr., who raced 41 yards into the end zone to give the Illini a 16-9 halftime lead.

Illinois seized control on the opening drive of the second half with a 14-play, 75-yard march that consumed 8:04. Sitkowski went 4-for-4 for 30 yards on the drive, including a two-yard pass to Luke Ford to put the Illini up 23-9. Illinois extended the lead by going 47 yards on three plays on its next drive, highlighted by a 45-yard Sitkowski pass to Deúce Spann, before Śitkowski's one-yard toss to Isaiah Williams made it 30-7. Sitkowski finished 12-for-15 passing for 124 yards and two touchdowns in relief.

Lincoln (Sept. 4) - Nebraska produced a dominant and balanced performance with more than 300 yards rushing and passing on its way to a 52-7 win over Fordham.

Adrian Martinez completed 17-of-23 passes for 254 yards and one touchdown,

while adding eight carries for 33 yards and two more scores. He piloted a Husker offense that rolled up well over 600 yards of total offense, including 329 rushing and 304 passing yards.

Markese Stepp led the Big Red ground game with 101 yards on 18 carries, while Sevion Morrison rushed for two TDs. Samori Toure pitched in a big game for Nebraska with eight receptions for 133 yards, while adding three carries for 35 yards, including a touchdown run. Martinez helped the Huskers build a 38-7 lead midway through the third quarter, before Logan Smothers led the Huskers on its final two TD drives.

Overall, Nebraska rushed the ball 65 times and the Husker rushing total likely would have been far greater if not for an historic defensive performance by Fordham's Ryan Greenhagen, who set a NU opponent record with 30 tackles. His tackle total tied the Memorial Stadium record set by Husker Clete Pillen against Oklahoma State on Nov. 6, 1976.

Nebraska's defense surrendered just 292 total yards on the afternoon, holding Fordham to 129 rushing yards on 28 carries. The Rams managed 163 passing yards, as Tim DeMorat completed 18-of-30 passes but was intercepted three times by the Blackshirts. Deontai Williams pulled down two of the interceptions while JoJo Domann snagged the other interception as all three turnovers led to NU scores.

Nebraska took a 7-0 lead on Martinez's first quarter four-yard touchdown run before Fordham tied the score on DeMorat's 31-yard touchdown pass to Fotis Kokosioulis with 14:14 left in the first half.

After that, it was all Huskers. Connor Culp put Nebraska on top less than three minutes later with his 39-yard field goal to make it 10-7. Martinez then pushed NU's lead to 17-7 with his second four-yard scoring run of the day. The Big Red's lead grew to 24-7 at the half after Morrison's one-yard touchdown blast with 29 seconds remaining in the half.

Nebraska's defense continued to put the clamps down on the Rams before Martinez connected with Chancellor Brewington on a two-yard touchdown pass to make it 31-7 with 8:24 left in the third. NU extended the margin to 38-7 less than five minutes later when Toure took an option pitch from Martinez and scored from eight yards.

Lincoln (Sept. 11) - Lincoln – Nebraska limited Buffalo to one score, while Adrian Martinez accounted for over 350 yards of total offense in a 28-3 victory over Buffalo.

Martinez completed 13-of-19 passes for 242 yards, including a pair of 68-yard touchdown passes to Samori Toure. The first came with 34 seconds left in the half to give NU a 14-0 lead, while the second one iced the game with just under six minutes remaining.

The game was scoreless until the second quarter when Martinez unleashed a spectacular 71-yard scamper inside the Buffalo 5-yard line. That run set up a 2-yard run by Gabe Ervin Jr., the first of two touchdowns by the freshaman.

Martinez finished the first half 7-of-9 through the air for 116 yards, while carrying the ball six times for 110 yards. He finished the game with 354 total yards on 28 attempts, including nine carries for 112 yards.

Nebraska's final margin could have been greater had Martinez's apparent 26-yard touchdown pass to Toure on 4th and 3 on the fourth play of the second quarter not been called back because of an offensive pass interference penalty. Later in the second quarter, an apparent 56-yard touchdown pass to Zavier Betts was wiped off by a holding call on the offensive line. The Huskers also had an apparent touchdown taken off the board on their final drive when quarterback Logan Smothers pitched the ball down the 11-yard line on an option to Will Nixon, who sprinted into the end zone. An illegal forward pass was called, and the call stood upon an official review.

None of the adversity appeared to shake the Blackshirts, who got a huge play in the fourth quarter to help the Huskers take complete control of the outcome.

Linebacker Luke Reimer deflected a pass by Kyle Vantrease that bounded into the air. Reimer adjusted to the ball and plucked it from the air and returned it to the Buffalo 1, setting up Ervin's second score to make it 21-3 with 14:47 left.

Reimer finished with a huge game that included a game and career-high 16 tackles, including seven solo stops, to go along with his interception. Fellow linebacker Nick Henrich added eight tackles and a pair of hurries, while JoJo Domann contributed five stops, including a TFL, and a hurry of his own.

Ervin finished with 10 carries for 56 yards and two scores, while Sevion Morrison contributed eight carries for 24 yards. Overall the Huskers amassed 220 rushing yards on 41 carries, while adding 296 yards through the air, including a 54-yard connection between Smothers and tight end Chris Hickman on the final drive.

Hickman finished with career highs of three receptions for a career-high 90 yards. Toure finished with two receptions for 136 yards on his two 68-yard touchdown catches, marking his second straight 100-yard receiving day.

Norman, Okla. (Sept. 18) - Nebraska took No. 3 Oklahoma down to the wire in Norman, but came up just short in a 23-16 setback to the Sooners.

The Huskers held a high-powered Oklahoma offense in check for most of the day, limiting the Sooners to 408 yards of total offense, including 214 through the air. Nebraska nearly matched OU yard-for-yard, managing 384 total yards, including 289 through the air.

Oklahoma survived by converting three drives into touchdowns and adding a defensive two-point conversion after a blocked Nebraska extra-point attempt late in the third quarter. The Huskers were able to answer with two touchdowns and a career-long 51-yard field goal from Connor Culo.

Nebraska's Blackshirts kept the Huskers in it on the road with outstanding performances. JoJo Domann led the Huskers with 12 tackles and a pass breakup, while Deontai Williams added nine stops and a quarterback hurry.

Spencer Rattler marched the Sooners 75 yards on 14 plays in just under seven minutes to open the game. Rattler capped the drive on a one-yard plunge to five OU a 7-0 lead.

Nebraska answered with Culp's 51-yard field goal after a 14-play drive of its own to make it 7-3 at the end of the first quarter.

Nebraska started the second half with the ball and marched into field goal range before the drive stalled in the red zone. The Huskers attempted a 35-yard field goal that missed wide left.

The Sooners then put together another long drive, covering 80 yards in 10 plays on a march that took 5:29 and was capped by Rattler's one-yard touchdown pass to Jeremiah Hall to take a 14-3 lead with 3:50 left in the third quarter. Rattler finished 24-of-34 for 214 yards and one touchdown through the air.

Nebraska answered with eight seconds left in the third on Adrian Martinez's four-yard touchdown run to cap a nine-play, 75-yard drive to cut the margin to 14-9. But NU's extrapoint try was blocked and picked up on the run by Patrick Fields, who returned it 100 yards to put the Sooners up 16-9.

Oklahoma firmed its grip on victory on a 12-play, 65-yard drive that resulted in a two-yard touchdown run by Kennedy Brooks that put the Sooners up 23-9 with 10:24 left.

Nebraska fought back, as Martinez then found Omar Manning streaking across the middle of the end zone for a touchdown to cut OU's lead to 23-16.

After Nebraska's touchdown, Oklahoma misplayed the kickoff, as Marvin Mims scooped up the ball at the OU 8 and dove out of bounds. But the Sooners strung together three first downs to cross into Nebraska territory and chew up more than four minutes off the clock before the Blackshirts forced a Sooner punt on 4th-and-5 at the NU 48.

Trailing by a touchdown, Nebraska got the ball back with just under a minute left in the game but was unable to move down the field without any timeouts.

Martinez finished 19-of-25 for 289 yards and a touchdown through the air in the game but was sacked five times.

East Lansing, Mich. (Sept. 25) - Nebraska held Michigan State without a first down in second-half regulation, but the Huskers fell 23-20 in overtime to No. 20 Michigan State

The Blackshirts held Michigan State scoreless in the second half and led 20-13 before Jayden Reed's 62-yard punt return with 3:47 remaining tied the score. At the time, the defense had held Michigan State (4-0, 2-0 Big Ten) to five total yards of offense in the second half.

Adrian Martinez, who completed 24-of-34 passes for 244 yards in the game and rushed 21 times for 72 yards including both of Nebraska's scores, threw a third-down interception on NU's opening possession of overtime.

The Blackshirts gave up their only first down after halftime on Kenneth Walker III's 23-yard run to the NU 2 on MSU's first offensive play after the interception. But the defense backed Walker and the Spartans up one yard on the next two plays before Matt Coghlin kicked a 21-yard game-winning field goal.

Nebraska trailed 13-10 at halftime before tying the game on Connor Culp's second field goal of the game to cap a 14-play, 60-yard drive.

The Huskers continued to build offensive momentum as Adrian Martinez jogged into the end zone early in the fourth quarter to cap an 11-play, 80-yard drive to give Nebraska its first lead of the game at 20-13 with 7:29 left in regulation.

The Blackshirts continued to dominate, forcing three-and-outs by Michigan State on every second-half possession.

The massive edges in special teams and return yardage (320 yards) were enough to overcome Nebraska's edge in total offense, which was 442-254 on the night.

In addition to 316 yards of total offense from Martinez for the Huskers, Rahmir Johnson led all rushers in the game with 19 carries for 76 yards. Zavier Betts led the Husker receivers with five catches for 62 yards, while Samori Toure had five receptions for 42 yards.

Reed did the most damage for the Spartans in the game, hauling in four receptions for 59 yards including a 35-yard touchdown catch on a second-quarter flea-flicker that gave the Spartans a 7-0 lead. Reed also had two kick returns for 69 yards and totaled 192 all-purpose yards.

The Blackshirts completely shut down MSU quarterback Payton Thome in the second half, as he finished with 14 completions on 23 attempts for 183 yards in the game. Nebraska held Walker to 39 yards on 16 carries in regulation.

Luke Reimer led the Blackshirts with 11 total tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss and a half-sack. Nick Henrich pitched in nine stops and half a sack, while Garrett Nelson was a disruptive force in the second half and finished with six tackles and two tackles for loss with one sack.
