#### **#RAMBLINGS**

- The Fordham University Rams open the 2021 season, Fordham's 121st varsity season, by traveling to Lincoln, Nebraska, to face the University of Nebraska Cornhuskers in Memorial Stadium on Saturday, September 4, at 12:00 p.m. (EST)
- The game will be broadcast on the Big Ten Network and broadcast live on WFUV (90.7 FM) and WFUVSports.org.
- Fordham enters the 2021 season after going 2-1 in the 2020-2021 spring season, while Nebraska is 0-1 this fall, falling at Illinois, 30-22, last Saturday.
- This will be the first meeting between Fordham and Nebraska on the gridiron.
- The Rams have played five schools currently in the Big 10 Conference, amassing an 11-14-2 mark against those schools, but only two of those programs were in the conference at the time of the game.
- Senior linebacker Ryan Greenhagen was named a Preseason All-American.
- The crowd of 90,000 will be the largest to ever see a Fordham football game.
- The game will mark the tenth time over the past eleven years that Fordham will face an NCAA FCS school (a 2020 game at Hawaii was canceled due to COVID).
- Senior quarterback Tim DeMorat has 36 career touchdown passes, good for sixth place on the Fordham career list.
- DeMorat and Greenhagen were named the Patriot League Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year.
- The Rams are the winningest New York area college football team since 2012 with 58 wins.



#### THE GAME

- The Fordham University Rams open the 2021 season, Fordham's 121st varsity season, by traveling to Lincoln, Nebraska, to face the University of Nebraska Cornhuskers in Memorial Stadium on Saturday, September 4, at 12:00 p.m. (EST)
- Fordham enters the 2021 season after going 2-1 in the 2020-2021 spring season, while Nebraska is 0-1 this fall, falling at Illinois, 30-22, last Saturday.

#### THE SERIES

- This will be first meeting between Fordham and Nebraska on the gridiron.
- It will also be Fordham's first football game (and believed to be the first ever Fordham game in any sport) played in the Cornhusker State.
- Nebraska and Fordham met once in men's basketball action at the 1992 Rainbow Classic, a game won by the Cornhuskers, 79-55.
- The Rams have played five schools currently in the Big 10 Conference, amassing an 11-14-2 mark against those schools, but only two of those programs were in the conference at the time of the game.
- Fordham played Purdue eight times from 1932-1941, compiling a 5-2-1 record against the Boilermakers, and Indiana once, a 13-0 Fordham win at the Polo Grounds in 1929.
- Fordham has also played current Big 10 members Rutgers 14 times with a 5-8-1 record versus the Scarlet Knights; Penn State three times (1946, 1947, and 1953), with the Nittany Lions taking all three meetings; and Michigan State, a 19-13 loss at the Polo Grounds in 1932.

#### RAMS VS. THE FBS

- When the Rams take on Nebraska it will be mark the eleventh time over the past eleven years that Fordham will face an NCAA FCS school (a 2020 game at Hawaii was canceled due to COVID).
- The Rams have won two of the games, a 30-29 win at Temple in 2013 and a 37-35 victory at Army West Point in 2015.
- •The Rams are scheduled to play another FBS school in 2021 as they to travel Florida Atlantic on September 18.

#### **FORDHAM IN SEASON OPENERS**

- The Fordham University Rams are 49-34 all-time in season openers since 1920, 10-22 since moving to the NCAA FCS in 1989.
- 2020-21 season-opening loss at Holy Cross was Fordham's fifth straight opening day loss but the Rams had taken the four previous season openers.
- On Jack Coffey Field, Fordham is 23-30 since 1970 in home openers but the

## WIN % - PAST 9 YEARS




Rams have won seven of their past ten home openers, having a six-game winning streak stopped by a 14-7 loss to then second-ranked Villanova in 2014.

## FORDHAM AMONG LEADERS IN NCAA FCS HOME WINS SINCE 2012

- Over the past seven years, the Rams have become very adept at protecting their home turf, winning 34 of the 47 home contests over that time.
- The only home losses for Fordham under former head coach Joe Moorhead were the season finale in 2012 when the Rams missed a two-point conversion in the closing seconds that would have sent the game with Colgate to overtime and a 14-7 setback to #2 Villanova on September 12.

JOE CONLIN **HEAD COACH** 8-18 Fourth year at Fordham Third year as head coach



- · Named head football coach at Fordham University on December 22, 2017.
- Served as associate head coach/offensive coordinator at Yale for the previous four
- Yale improved from 3-7 in '16 to 9-1 in '17 and its offense improved in nearly every key statistical category under Conlin's leadership.
- In 2017, the Yale offense ranked 12th in the NCAA FCS in total offense.
- Arrived at Yale as the offensive line coach in 2013 before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2014.
- Also served as the offensive line coach at Yale with his 2013 (and 2014) starting five starting every game..
- Arrived in New Haven after spending the 2011 season as the offensive line coach at Harvard, helping the Crimson win an Ivy League title while setting a school scoring record.
- Also served as an assistant at FCS power New Hampshire, where he helped the Wildcats to seven straight NCAA playoff appearances from 2004 to 2010.
- During his tenure at UNH, served as the offensive line coach in 2009 and 2010 but also worked with the defensive line, safeties and special teams for a program that went 65-25 and won one conference championship.
- A three-year starter at defensive tackle at the University of Pittsburgh, he coached the defensive line at West Virginia Tech in 2003, a year after graduating.
- Also gained coaching experience at Greensburg Central Catholic High School from 2002-03 where he worked with the tight ends and defensive ends while also handling strength and conditioning.

## <u>FORDHAM TO PLAY IN FRONT OF</u> LARGEST CROWD IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- When Fordham takes to the field at Nebraska on Saturday, they will be playing in front of the largest crowd to ever see a Fordham football game.
- The sold-out game will attract 90,000 fans, over 20,000 more than the previous largest crowd to see the Rams.
- The current record for attendance at a Fordham football game is 66,154 who saw the Rams defeat Missouri in the 1942 Sugar Bowl on a blocked punt that went out of the endzone.



• The largest crowd for the Rams on the NCAA FCS level is 33,793 in a 2014 game at Army West Point.

- Senior linebacker **Glenn Cunningham** led the defense, making eight stops, including two for loss and one sack, and he intercepted a pair of passes while freshman linebacker Mike Courtney made six tackles, 3.5 for loss, and returned an interception 49 yards for a score.
- Offensively, junior wide receiver **Fotis Kokosioulis** caught nine passes for 149 yards and one touchdown while sophomore wide out **Dequece Carter** hauled in seven for 111 yards and a score. Junior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** completed 32 of 42 passes for 335 yards and three scores.
- The Rams trailed 17-10 in the third quarter and were threatening to score more when Cunningham stepped in front of a Logan Bitikofer pass in the Fordham end zone and returned it to the Fordham 27. That turnover resulted in a 50-yard touchdown pass from DeMorat to Kokosioulis that tied the game at 17 with six minutes left in the third.

#### FORDHAM IS WINNINGEST NYC COLLEGE FOOTBALL TEAM

- No New York area college football team has won more games since 2012 than Fordham, who has amassed 58 victories over that stretch.
- The closest collegiate competitors are Stony Brook (53), Sacred Heart (52) and Rutgers (38), while the NFL's Giants lead all NYC area professional teams with 57 wins over the past ten years and the Jets have 50.

#### **DEMORAT CLIMBING CAREER LISTS**



- With his five passing touchdowns in the spring, Fordham senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat** brought his career total to 36, good for fifth on the Fordham career list.
- He is nine behind Kevin Eakin (2000-2003) for fourth.
- In the spring season, DeMorat led the NCAA FCS in completion percentage, connecting on 72.1% of his attempts.
- DeMorat also has 473 career completions, placing him sixth on the Fordham career list.
- His 5,356 career passing yards is seventh best at the school.
- DeMorat set a school freshman mark with eleven touchdown tosses in 2018, including a freshman record four versus Bryant.

#### Did You Know?

### Fordham Appeared in the First Televised College Football Game 80 Years Ago



On September 30, 1939, Fordham hosted Waynesburg College at Triboro Stadium on Randall's Island. The game was the season opener for the Rams, who beat Waynesburg, 34-7. Announcer Bill Stern called the contest over station W2XBS (now WNBC) as a demonstration of this new medium at the World's Fair. Two iconoscope cameras, which had just been patented by RCA, were used to televise the game with the images

being sent to a relay station 10 miles from the stadium and then, by cable, to the top of the Empire State Building, where a large transmitter broadcast the game to the lucky few who owned a television in those days. A top-of-the-line set in 1939, a Clifton, sold for about \$600.

Notable Fordham players who appeared in the game include Len Eshmont and Dominic Principe, who went on to play in the professional ranks, as well as Ralph Friegden, father of former Maryland head coach Ralph Friedgen, who scored twice in the game and Donald Lambeau - son of Green Bay Packer legend Earl Louis "Curly" Lambeau.

#### **PASSING THE PIGSKIN...**

- In 2019, the Fordham offense was led by the passing game, ranking second in the Patriot League with an average of 223.9 passing yards/game.
- The passing game helped the Rams lead the Patriot League in scoring offense, averaging 25.0 ppg.
- The Rams were back at it in the spring, gaining 349.7 passing yards/game, tops in the Patriot League and sixth in the NCAA FCS.

#### ... AND RUNNING WITH IT TOO

- The Fordham running game improved tremendously in 2019, after ranking last in the NCAA FCS in rushing yards/game in 2018, averaging just 50.7 yards/contest.
- The 2019 Rams averaged 133.3 yards/game on the ground, third best among Patriot League schools.
- The running game was led by **Zach Davis**, who was second in the Patriot League in rushing yards (1,013) and rushing yards/game (84.4 yards/game).
- Davis also led the League in rushing touchdowns with seven.
- Davis missed the spring season but in his absence, senior **Trey Sneed** managed to average 58.3 yards/game, second in the Patriot League.

## TEN RAMS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE

- Ten members of the 2021 Fordham football squad were named to the 2021 All-Patriot League Preseason Team.
- The ten were led by senior quarterback **Tim DeMorat**, who was named the Preseason Offensive Player of the Year, and senior linebacker **Ryan Greenhagen**, the 2021 Patriot League Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.
- Joining DeMorat on the preseason all-conference team were senior running backs Zach Davis and Trey Sneed, senior offensive linemen Phil Salah and Nick Zakelj, senior wide receivers Fotis Kokosioulis and Hamze El-Zayat, junior defensive back Stephen Williams II, senior defensive lineman Jonathan Coste.

#### **CARTER SETS FORDHAM FRESHMAN MARK**

- In 2019, Fordham wide receiver **Dequece Carter** caught 53 passes for a team-high 723 yards with five touchdowns in his rookie campaign.
- His 723 receiving yards breaks the Fordham freshman record of 591 set by Javarus Dudley in 2000.
- His 53 receptions also broke Dudley's freshman record of 48.

#### DAVIS HITS 1,000

- Fordham senior running back **Zach Davis** gained 1,013 yards in 2019.
- He became the ninth Ram to rush for 1,000 yards in a season.
- Davis joins Chase Edmonds (2014, 2015, 2016) and Kirwin Watson (2001, 2002, 2003), who each did it three times, Carlton Koonce (2012, 2013), who did it twice, Pierre Davis (1977), Juan Pacheco (1980), Chip Kron (1984), James Prydatko (2005), ands Xavier Martin (2008).

#### GREENHAGEN NAMED PESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- For the second straight season, Fordham senior linebacker Ryan Greenhagen was named a Preseason All-American.
- He was also named to the Buck Buchanan Watch List, presented to the NCAA FCS Defensive Player of the Year.
- Greenhagen was named a 2019 HERO Sports Sophomore All-American, All-ECAC, First Team All-Patriot League, and Academic All-Patriot League selection.
- He was second on the team in the spring with 22 total tackles, eleven solo, with 2.0

#### **RAMS IN THE PROS**

- Three former Fordham football Rams appeared in the NFL in 2020.
- Running back **Chase Edmonds**, who was drafted in the fourth round by the Arizona Cardinals in the 2018 draft, completed his third season with the Cardinals in 2020.
- Offensive lineman **Anthony Coyle**, who played with New York Guardians of the XFL, signed a free agent contract to the Pittsburgh Steelers and was elevated from the practice roster to the active roster towards the end of the 2020 season.
- Defensive back **Dylan Mabin** started the 2020 season on the Las Vegas Raiders practice squad before being picked up by the Minnesota Vikings in November.
- After the 2021 cutdowns, Edmonds is the lone Ram still on an NFL active roster.

#### RAMS IN CONFERENCE PLAY

• Fordham is 28-11 against Patriot League opponents over the past nine years (the Rams were 2-1 in the spring, 2-4 in 2019, 3-3 in 2017, 5-1 in 2015 and 2016, a perfect 6-0 in 2014, 5-1 in 2013, though the games in 2013 did not count in the league standings).

#### RAMS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- Over the past eight years the Fordham Rams are 20-13 in non-conference play (not including the five NCAA FCS Championship games).
- In 2013 the Rams were unbeaten against non-conference opponents with a perfect 6-0 record, the most non-conference victories for the Rams since the 2003 squad won five non-conference games.

#### WHAT'S NEXT?

- The Rams return to the Bronx for their home opener next Saturday, September 11, as they host the Monmouth College Hawks on Jack Coffey Field at 6:00 p.m.
- It will be the fourth meeting between the Rams and the Hawks.
- Monmouth leads the all-time series, 2-1, and took the last meeting, 42-41 in overtime at Monmouth in 2016.

### FORDHAM vs. FBS

- When the Rams take on Nebraska it will be mark the eleventh time over the past eleven years that Fordham will face an NCAA FCS school (a 2020 game at Hawaii was canceled due to COVID).
- The Rams have won two of the games, a 30-29 win at Temple in 2013 and a 37-35 victory at Army West Point in 2015.
- •The Rams are scheduled to play another FBS school in 2021 as they to travel Florida Atlantic on September 18.
