Nebraska opens its 2022 home schedule on Saturday afternoon when the Huskers welcome the North Dakota Fighting Hawks to Memorial Stadium. Game time in Lincoln is set for shortly after 2:30 p.m. CT with BTN providing television coverage.

Nebraska heads into the contest with an 0-1 record following a 31-28 season-opening loss against Northwestern last Saturday in the Aer Lingus Football Classic in Dublin, Ireland. Nebraska twice held 11-point leads against the Wildcats, but Northwestern rallied in the second half for the three-point victory. The Nebraska offense showed its explosiveness in the loss, racking up 465 yards, including 355 passing yards.

After opening with a Big Ten Conference game overseas, the Huskers will now settle into their home environment at Memorial Stadium for the next month. The matchup with North Dakota is the first of four straight games in Lincoln. After the UND contest, Nebraska will welcome non-conference opponents Georgia Southern (Sept. 10) and Oklahoma (Sept. 17) to Lincoln before opening its Big Ten home schedule against Indiana on Oct. 1.

North Dakota will be opening its 2021 season on Saturday in Lincoln. The Fighting Hawks posted a 5-6 record last season against one of the nation's most difficult FCS schedules. North Dakota's five FCS losses last season were all by seven or fewer points, with each of the setbacks coming against 2021 FCS playoff participants.

Nebraska and North Dakota have met just one time previously, with the Huskers opening the 1961 season with a 33-0 shutout over North Dakota at Memorial Stadium.

Saturday's game marks Nebraska's 14th all-time matchup with a Football Championship Subdivision opponent. The Huskers have won each of the 13 prior matchups against FCS foes, including a 52-7 victory over Fordham last season.

100

Nebraska had both a 100-yard rusher (Anthony Grant) and 100-yard receiver (Isaiah Garcia-Castenada) in the season opener against Northwestern. That marked the first time the Huskers had both a runner and receiver top the century mark since 2021 against Northwestern.

300

Quarterback Casey Thompson cracked the 300-yard passing barrier against the Wildcats with 355 yards through the air. His 355-yard outing was the most ever by a Nebraska player in a season opener, bettering Taylor Martinez's 354 yards vs. Southern Miss in 2012.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKA VS. NORTH DAKOTA

Saturday's game is the second all-time meeting between Nebraska and North Dakota. Nebraska defeated North Dakota, 33-0, in the 1961 season opener in the only other meeting between the schools. Nebraska and UND are scheduled to meet again in 2026 in Lincoln.

Saturday's game will mark Nebraska's 14th game all-time against an FCS foe (at time of game), with the Huskers holding a 13-0 record in those contests.

- Nebraska defeated Fordham 52-7 last season in its first game against an FCS opponent since 2018.
- All of Nebraska's games against FCS opponents have occurred since 1992, including facing an FCS opponent for five straight seasons from 2010 to 2014.

NEBRASKA HOME OPENER HISTORY

Nebraska opens its seven-game home schedule on Saturday at Memorial Stadium. The Huskers have won three of four home openers under Scott Frost. Overall, Nebraska has been victorious in 34 of its past 36 home openers.

This marks the third consecutive season Nebraska has opened away from Memorial Stadium.
 Prior to the pandemic shortened 2020 season, Nebraska had not opened away from Lincoln since 1999.

HUSKERS HIT RARE 300-100-100 COMBO IN OPENER

The Nebraska offense reached a rare milestone in the season opener against Northwestern on Saturday. The Huskers recorded a 300-yard passer with Casey Thompson throwing for 355 yards, a 100-yard rusher in Anthony Grant, who had 101 yards and two touchdowns, and a 100-yard receiver with Isaiah Garcia-Castaneda catching four passes for 120 yards and a touchdown.

- Saturday's game marked just the eighth time in school history Nebraska has produced a game with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver.
- Three of the eight games have come during Scott Frost's tenure as head coach, most recently in a 42-38 win at Illinois in 2019. Nebraska also accomplished the trifecta in a 2018 matchup against Purdue.

NOTING GAME 1

- Nebraska and Northwestern played a onescore game for the ninth time in 12 meetings as Big Ten opponents, including the seventh meeting decided by three or fewer points. Five of the last six games have been onescore games.
- Casey Thompson completed 25-of-42 passes for 355 yards and one touchdown in his Nebraska debut. His 355 passing yards are the most ever by a Husker QB in his debut, bettering a 238-yard effort by Tanner Lee against Arkansas State on Sept. 2, 2017. The passing total also set an NU record for most passing yards in a season opener, bettering 354 yards by Taylor Martinez in the 2012 season opener vs. Southern Miss.
- Isaiah Garcia-Castaneda caught four passes for 120 yards in his Husker debut, including a 32-yard touchdown catch on his first reception as a Husker and a 58-yard catch in the third quarter. Castaneda's 120 receiving yards were a career high, bettering his previous best of 106 yards vs. San Jose State in 2021, while at New Mexico State. It marked his second career 100-yard receiving game.
- Receiver Trey Palmer caught eight passes for 68 yards, including six receptions before halftime. His eight catches and 68 yards bettered his career high of seven receptions and 64 yards (while at LSU).
- Tight end Travis Vokolek caught five passes for 63 yards, bettering his previous bests at Nebraska. His five receptions matched his career high of five while at Rutgers and his 63 yards was just shy of his career high of 69 yards.
- Running back Anthony Grant rushed 19 times for 101 yards and a 46-yard third-quarter touchdown. Grant produced his first career 100-yard rushing game, as he had five previous carries at the FBS level before the game.
- Punter Brian Buschini averaged 47.2 yards on six punts in his Nebraska debut, including four downed inside the 20-yard line.

NEWCOMERS MAKE IMMEDIATE IMPACT FOR HUSKERS

Nebraska's roster features 17 first-year Huskers who had previous FBS or FCS experience prior to the 2022 season. The first-year transfers came to Nebraska with a combined 368 games played and 184 starts in their college careers. It took just one game for the newcomers to the Husker program to make their presence known.

- The starting lineup in the opener against Northwestern featured seven transfers, including four on offense, one on defense and both the starting punter and place-kicker.
- Nebraska produced a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the game, with all three of those players being first-year transfers in the Husker program.
- Quarterback Casey Thompson threw for 355 yards and a touchdown and ran for an additional touchdown. His 355 passing yards were the most by a Husker in a season opener and the most by a quarterback making their Nebraska debut. Thompson came to Nebraska with 19 games played at Texas, including 10 starts. He threw for more than 2,400 yards and 30 touchdown at Texas. Thompson was ranked by ESPN as the 15th-best newcomer for the 2022 season and is a member of the Johnny Unitas Award Watch List.
- Running back **Anthony Grant** came to Nebraska from the junior college ranks, but had previous experience at Florida State. Grant rushed for 101 yards and two touchdowns in his Husker debut in Dublin. Grant, who began his career at Florida State playing in 12 games in 2018, ran for 2,549 yards in junior college and was the 2021 National Offensive Player of the Year.
- A trio of FBS transfers led the Nebraska receiving corps against Northwestern. Isaiah Garcia-Castaneda caught four passes for 120 yards and a touchdown on the game's opening drive. He joined Nebraska from New Mexico State where he caught 42 passes for 639 yards in two seasons. Trey Palmer transferred to Nebraska from LSU, and in his first game at Nebraska set career bests with eight receptions for 68 yards. A member of the Paul Hornung Award watch list, Palmer also is a key figure in the return game. He caught 41 passes for 458 yards and three touchdowns in his LSU career. Marcus Washington also started at receiver and caught a pair of passes in his first game in Lincoln. The Texas transferred played in 31 games with eight starts with the Longhorns, logging 25 catches for 366 yards and three touchdowns.
- Edge rusher **Ochaun Mathis** is the most heralded of the Nebraska newcomers on defense. Mathis came to Nebraska with 30.5 career tackles for loss and opened the season by ranking among Nebraska's tackle leaders against Northwestern. Mathis was a two-time All-Big 12 selection at TCU. On3 ranked Mathis as the most impactful edge transfer in the country for the 2022 season, while ESPN ranked him as the No. 7 newcomer in the country. Mathis was one of 85 players nationally named to the watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, which is presented annually to the National Defensive Player of the Year.
- Also on the defensive line, the Huskers added Power Five transfers Devin Drew and Stephon Wynn Jr. Drew, who did not arrive in Lincoln until the second week of August, played in 23 games and started 12 contests in two seasons at Texas Tech, finishing with 55 tackles. Wynn spent four seasons at Alabama and made 16 tackles over 21 games. Both players saw extensive action in Ireland.
- Cornerback Tommi Hill earned a start against Northwestern and made four tackles and added a
 pass breakup. Hill played in 11 games as a freshman at Arizona State in 2021, finishing with nine
 tackles.
- Place-kicker, **Timmy Bleekrode** joined the roster as an FCS transfer from Furman, where he was 15-of-18 on field goals last season. Bleekrode connected on all four of his PAT attempts against Northwestern.
- At punter, **Brian Buschini** is a first-year FCS transfer from Montana. Buschini was outstanding against Northwestern, averging 47.2 yards per punt including four punts downed inside the 20. Buschini was the 2021 FCS Punter of the Year. He ranked third nationally with an average of 46.0 yards per punt last season, and Buschini placed 30 of his 69 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Buschini was named to the preseason watch list for the 2022 Ray Guy Award in July.
- Georgetown transfer **Brady Weas** is Nebraska's starting long snapper on its punting unit.

REIMER & HENRICH AMONG NATION'S TOP TACKLING DUOS

Nebraska returned its top two tacklers from last season in linebackers **Luke Reimer** and **Nick Henrich**. Reimer led Nebraska with 108 tackles, while Henrich was second with 99 tackles in 2021. In game one, Reimer led the Huskers with 12 tackles, while Henrich added nine stops against Northwestern.

- Reimer and Henrich combined for 207 tackles in 2021. The 207 tackles rank as the sixth-highest returning total by two FBS teammates from the 2021 season.
- This season, Reimer and Henrich aim to become the first pair of Husker teammates to each have 100 tackles in a season since Barrett Ruud (149) and Demorrio Williams (128) in 2003.
- Reimer has totaled at least 10 tackles in seven of his 18 career starts (38 percent), while Henrich
 has recorded four games with double-figure tackles.
- Reimer had 19 tackles against Purdue last year, a Nebraska record in a Big Ten Conference game.
- Reimer, a member of the 2022 Butkus and Bednarik Award watch lists, ranked in the top 30 nationally last season in tackles per game (23rd, 9.1) and forced fumbles per game (29th, 0.3).

FOUR HUSKER VETERANS SERVING AS 2022 TEAM CAPTAINS

Linebacker **Nick Henrich**, edge rushers **Garrett Nelson** and **Caleb Tannor** and tight end **Travis Vokolek** are team captains for the 2022 season. The four captains were selected by a vote of their teammates. Each of the four players are in at least their fourth season in the Husker program and have played a combined 116 games at Nebraska, including 66 starts among the group.

- An Omaha native, Henrich made 99 tackles during the 2021 season and has 14 career starts at Nebraska. In addition to his on-field success, Henrich earned his degree in psychology in just three years and is taking graduate classes. Henrich's selection marks the fourth time in the past five seasons that a linebacker has served as a Husker team captain.
- Nelson is in his fourth year at Nebraska and has 21 career starts. The Scottsbluff, Neb., native is a two-time academic All-Big Ten selection and earned his degree in finance in May of 2022. The selection of Nelson and Henrich as captains marks the first time since 2018 season Nebraska has had at least two in-state captains. Three native Nebraskans served as captains in 2018.
- Tannor is in his fifth season in the Nebraska program and has played in 45 games with 23 career starts. A native of Stone Mountain, Ga., Tannor graduated with his degree in child, youth and family sciences in December of 2021. He is the second Husker captain from Georgia in the past four years, joining 2019 team captain Mo Barry.
- Vokolek is in his fourth season in the Husker program and his sixth season of college football.
 Vokolek has played in 37 games during his college career, including 18 games at Nebraska. A
 two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, Vokolek graduated in August of 2021 with a degree in
 child, youth and family studies. His selection marks the second straight season Nebraska has had
 a tight end serve as a captain, following Austin Allen in 2021.

HUSKER ROSTER FEATURES 26 COLLEGE GRADUATES

Nebraska football has continued its tradition of dedicated student-athletes, as a total of 26 Huskers - including grad transfers - will play the 2022 season as college graduates.

- According to research by the National Football Foundation, Nebraska has the most college graduates on its roster of any FBS program.
- This marks the second straight season that Nebraska has had at least 20 graduates on its active roster, as the Huskers had 20 players who played as graduate students during the 2021 season.

HUSKER STREAKS CONTINUE IN 2022 SEASON

Nebraska owns impressive streaks in the 2022 season, most notably an NCAA record sellout streak at Memorial Stadium.

- Nebraska has sold out 383 consecutive games at Memorial Stadium (including North Dakota), dating from the next-to-last home game of the 1962 season through this Saturday.
- The Huskers have scored in 328 consecutive games. The streak is the longest in school history, the seventh-longest in FBS history and the fifth-longest active streak. The last time Nebraska was shut out was a 19-0 loss at No. 17 Arizona State on Sept. 21, 1996.
- Nebraska has also scored in 345 consecutive home games, a school record. The last time the Huskers were shut out at home came on Nov. 9, 1968, against Kansas State (12-0 loss).
- Nebraska is 252-0 all-time when scoring 35 or more points at home. **Scott Frost** is also 24-0 in his head coaching career when his team scores at least 35 points.

FROST IN FIFTH SEASON WITH HUSKERS

Scott Frost is in his fifth season at Nebraska in 2022. The consensus 2017 national coach of the year, Frost is 34-37 in seven seasons as a head coach.

- Twenty of Frost's 30 losses at Nebraska (66 percent) have been by a touchdown or less, including 12 by five or fewer points.
- Nebraska was 3-9 in 2021, but the Huskers outscored their opponents by 63 points on the season.
- All nine Nebraska losses in 2021 were by single digits, including eight by a touchdown or less.
 The Huskers played a school-record six games against ranked opponents during the 2021 regular
 season. Nebraska lost to those six ranked foes all ranked in the top 20 by an average of just
 6.0 points per game.
- In 15 seasons as a full-time assistant or head coach, Frost's teams have posted a 137-55 record.
 He has coached in two national championship games, won seven conference titles and coached
 10 teams that earned a final top-15 ranking.

FIVE NEW ADDITIONS TO HUSKER STAFF

Nebraska's coaching staff features five new faces this fall. New to the staff are offensive coordinator **Mark Whipple**, running backs coach **Bryan Applewhite**, special teams coordinator **Bill Busch**, wide receivers coach **Mickey Joseph** and offensive line coach **Donovan Raiola**.

- Whipple is a 40-year coaching veteran who has won 137 games as a collegiate head coach, including the 1998 Division I-AA (now FCS) national championship. The offensive coordinator at Pittsburgh the past three seasons, Whipple helped the Panthers to the 2021 ACC title. Pitt had the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award winner (Kenny Pickett) and the Biletnikoff Award winner (Jordan Addison) last season.
- Applewhite came to Nebraska after two seasons as the running backs coach at TCU. He helped
 the Horned Frogs rank in the top 30 nationally in rushing in both 2020 and 2021. In Applewhite's
 final season, two TCU running backs posted yards-per-carry averages that ranked among the top
 five marks in school history.
- Busch owns more than 30 seasons of collegiate experience, and he is in his third coaching stint
 at Nebraska. Busch served as a Husker graduate assistant in the 1990s and as the special teams
 coordinator from 2004 to 2007. Before working as a defensive analyst for Nebraska in 2021, Busch
 coached the safeties for three seasons at LSU from 2018 to 2020, helping the Tigers to the 2019
 national title.
- Joseph, a former Husker quarterback, joined the Nebraska staff after spending five seasons at LSU. With the Tigers, Joseph coached 2019 Biletnikoff Award winner Ja'Marr Chase and developed four wide receivers who were selected in the first or second round of the NFL Draft. Joseph also served as LSU's assistant head coach in 2020 and 2021, and he is Nebraska's associate head coach and passing game coordinator in 2022.
- Raiola is the younger brother of former Husker All-America center Dominic Raiola. Donovan came
 to Nebraska after spending the past three seasons as the assistant offensive line coach for the
 Chicago Bears, helping the Bears to a pair of playoff appearances. Raiola, who boasts previous
 collegiate coaching experience at Notre Dame, was a three-time All-Big Ten offensive lineman at
 Wisconsin.
- Three of the new assistants bring a national championship pedigree to the Husker staff. Busch and Joseph were both members of LSU's 2019 national championship team, while Whipple helped Pitt to an ACC championship last season. Whipple also won an FCS national championship as the head coach of Massachusetts.
- With the additions of Whipple and Joseph, members of Nebraska's 2022 staff have coached two of the last three Biletnikoff Award winners as the nation's top wide receiver.
- Of the five returning assistants on Frost's staff, four have been with Frost in each of his seven seasons as a collegiate head coach (Erik Chinander, Sean Beckton, Travis Fisher and Barrett Ruud). Mike Dawson has served on Frost's staff for a total of six seasons.

NEBRASKA RANKS AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska has historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- Nebraska ranks eighth in NCAA history with 908 wins and sixth with 53 all-time bowl game appearances.
- NU has won five national championships. The Huskers' four AP national titles (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fourth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.
- The success extends to the classroom as well. Husker football has produced 108 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, the most of any sport in NCAA history. Nebraska football has produced nine NCAA Top 10 Award winners, the most of any sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 17 NCAA Top 10 Award Winners, which is considered the "Heisman Trophy" of academics for NCAA student-athletes.
- Nebraska football has produced nine NCAA Top 10 Award winners, the most of any single team in NCAA history.

MEMORIAL STADIUM PROVIDES BIG HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

Nebraska has enjoyed much success in its history when playing at home in Memorial Stadium.

- Since 1970, NU is 284-61 (.823) at Memorial Stadium and has posted 41 perfect home seasons.
- The Huskers are 553-165-20 all-time in Lincoln (.763 in 131 years). Nebraska is 426-142-13 in Memorial Stadium (.744 in 99 years dating back to 1923).
- The Huskers are 48-9 all-time in Memorial Stadium night games.

SCOUTING THE NORTH DAKOTA FIGHTING HAWKS



North Dakota kicks off its 2022 season on 0/2 Saturday. Last season, the Fighting Hawks finished 5-6 and 3-5 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. UND was picked

seventh in the annual preseason poll conducted by the MVFC coaches, media and sports information directors.

The Fighting Hawks return their starting quarterback from last season, Tommy Schuster, who led the conference with 2,493 yards through the air and averaged 226.6 yards per game. He accounted for at least one touchdown in 10 of 11 games. The Fighting Hawks also return their top

receiver, Bo Belquist, who led the team in both receptions (52) and receiving yards (535), while averaging a team-best 53.3 receiving yards per game. UND will be without their leading offensive lineman, Matt Waletzko, who earned All-America honors from five different publications and was selected in the fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys.

On defense, North Dakota returns Devon Krzanowski, who led UND with 68 tackles, including 35 solo stops. Krzanowski received All-MVFC honorable mention accolades in 2021. The Fighting Hawks will be without their second-leading tackler, linebacker Noah Larson, who graduated following a standout 2021 season.

Bubba Schweigert is in his ninth season at North Dakota and his 12th career season as a head coach. He owns a 47-40 record with the Fighting Hawks.

Before taking over as head coach, Schweigert was the defensive coordinator at Southern Illinois (2008-13) and the head coach at Minnesota-Duluth (2004-07). This serves as Schweigert's second stint at UND. He spent 15 seasons as an assistant coach in Grand Forks (1989-2003), where he was part of eight NCAA playoff teams and six North Central Conference title squads.

In his first nine years as the head coach, Schweigert has recorded 47 wins including 10 total in the first two seasons in the Missouri Valley Conference.

NORTH DAKOTA INFORMATION

North Dakota has fielded a football team since 1892, but it did not play its first season in the FCS until 2008. The Fighting Hawks made the FCS playoffs for the first time in 2016 and returned in 2019 and 2020. North Dakota boasts a winning all-time record and has won nearly 670 games in program history.

The Fighting Hawks have won 27 conference titles (NCC: 1928, 1929, 1930, 1931, 1934, 1936, 1937, 1939, 1958, 1964, 1966, 1971, 1972, 1974, 1975, 1979, 1993, 1994, 1995,1999, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2006; Great West: 2011; Big Sky: 2016, Missouri Valley: 2020). Additionally, North Dakota claimed the 2001 Division II National Title.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium's history dates nearly 100 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

2022 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska is scheduled to play three games against opponents who were ranked in the final AP poll of the 2021 season. The Huskers take on Oklahoma (10th) on Sept. 17, Michigan (3rd) on Nov. 12 and Iowa (23rd) on Nov. 25. Michigan (8th) and Oklahoma (9th) each appeared in the 2022 preseason
- In addition to the three ranked opponents from last season, Nebraska will face Wisconsin, Minnesota and Purdue, who were all among the top four teams receiving votes outside of the top 25.
- Nebraska is also scheduled to play seven games against opponents who played in a bowl game last season.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Scott Frost is in his seventh season as a head coach and fifth year at Nebraska. Frost is one of four former Husker players to return to the Nebraska sideline as head coach, and he is one of 21 FBS head coaches coaching at his alma mater in 2022.
- Nebraska's staff also includes former Huskers Mickey Joseph (1998-2001) and Barrett Ruud (2001-04), while **Donovan Raiola** is the younger brother of former Husker All-America center Dominic Raiola.
- Frost is one of only four FBS head coaches to win a national title as a player. Frost was a two-time national champion as a Husker (1995 & 1997).
- Frost's teams have been ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his first 15 seasons as a full-time coach. Of those 10 seasons, Frost's teams have posted eight top-10 rankings and six top-five rankings.
- Frost and four of his assistant coaches are in their seventh consecutive season working together, including two seasons at UCF.
- Nebraska added five new coaches to its staff in 2022, including four to the offensive staff. Mark Whipple (offensive coordinator), Bryan Applewhite (running backs), Mickey Joseph (wide receivers) and Donovan Raiola (offensive line) are all in their first season at Nebraska, while Bill Busch is the Huskers' special teams coordinator after being an analyst in 2021.
- Nebraska has two coaches on its staff who have been named national head coach of the year. Scott Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 National Coach of the Year, while Mark Whipple was the 1988 Division I-AA (now FCS) National Coach of the Year after leading UMass to a national title.
- Whipple was also a semifinalist for the Broyles Award in 2021, an award presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. In addition to Whipple, Erik Chinander is a two-time nominee for the Broyles Award (2016 & 2021), while Bill Busch was named the National Defensive Backs Coach of the Year in 2012 at Utah State.

- The Husker roster features 107 returning players and 44 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of nine starters and 46 letterwinners.
- Nebraska has added 44 players 22 transfers and 19 true freshmen - since the end of the 2021 season. Among the 22 transfers are 12 FBS transfers, six FCS transfers, three junior college players and one Division III transfer.
- The Huskers added a total of 11 first-year transfers with previous Power Five playing experience at: Alabama (2), Florida State (2), Texas (2), Arizona State, LSU, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas Tech.
- NU's roster features players from 22 states and two foreign countries (Canada & Germany).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the Huskers' 2022 roster include: Nebraska (63), Iowa (11), Georgia (10), Florida (8), Arizona (7), Texas (7), Louisiana (5), New Jersey (5), California (4), Kansas (4), Minnesota (4), Colorado (3), Michigan (3), Missouri (3), Alabama (2), Illinois (2), Oklahoma (2) and South Dakota (2).
- The states of Mississippi, Montana, South Carolina and Wisconsin are each represented with one player on Nebraska's 2022 roster.
- Nebraska's team captains are linebacker **Nick** Henrich, edge rushers Garrett Nelson and Caleb Tannor and tight end Travis Vokolek.

HEAD COACH SCOTT FROST



HISTORIC TURNAROUND AT UCF

At UCF, Frost produced the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history, inheriting an 0-12 team and leading the Knights to a 13-0 record just two years later.

- In his first season in 2016, Frost made history as the only first-time head coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season.
- UCF tied for the national lead with a six-win improvement from the 2015 to 2016 season.
 The Knights then ranked third nationally after improving by seven wins from the 2016 to 2017 season.
- The Knights' seven-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 ranked 11th in NCAA history and marked just the second time ever a bowl team improved by more than six wins the next season.
- UCF was the American Athletic Conference and Peach Bowl champions and was the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- Frost called UCF's plays, orchestrating the greatest two-year offensive turnaround in NCAA history. The Knights went from last to fifth in total offense, improving their output by more than 260 yards per game. UCF also went from third-to-last to first in scoring offense, improving by nearly 35 points per game.

FROST LED UCF TO 13-0 SEASON

In his second year as a head coach, Scott Frost guided UCF to a 13-0 record in 2017, when the Knights were the nation's only undefeated team.

- Frost was the fourth coach in FBS history to post a 13-0 record or better in either his first or second season as a head coach. Among that quartet, Frost is the only coach who inherited a team that won fewer than five games, as UCF went 0-12 the year before Frost's arrival.
- Frost is one of only five active FBS head coaches who has posted a 13-0 season or better, joining Jimbo Fisher, Nick Saban, Dabo Swinney and Kyle Whittingham.
- Frost also led Nebraska to a 13-0 record and a national title as the Huskers' starting quarterback in 1997. Frost was the first person in NCAA history to be part of a 13-0 season as both a player and a head coach.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, earning the honor from at least eight different organizations.

- Frost won the 2017 Paul "Bear" Bryant Award as the national coach of the year. Frost, Chris Petersen (2006 & 2009, Boise State) and Luke Fickell (2021, Cincinnati) are the only coaches in the 36-year history of the award to win the honor while coaching a team outside of a Power Five Conference.
- Frost was also the AP Coach of the Year, becoming the sixth coach to win the award in his first or second season as a head coach.

FROST A TOP OFFENSIVE COACH

For each of the previous 13 years, Frost was either an offensive assistant, offensive coordinator or head coach who called the offensive plays. During that time, he has consistently proven to be one of the nation's finest offensive coaches.

- In 13 seasons coaching offense, Frost has worked with eight units that finished in the top 10 nationally in scoring, including seven that ranked in the top five.
- Frost has also been a part of seven teams that ranked in the top 10 nationally in total offense the past 13 seasons.

FROST A PROVEN WINNER

Frost is a proven winner. In his 15-year full-time coaching career, Frost's teams have combined for a 137-55 record.

- Frost has averaged more than nine wins per year and been a part of seven 12-win teams.
- He has won seven conference titles in 15 years.
- Frost has coached in two national title games and his teams have finished with a top-10 ranking eight times in the past 15 years.
- In two seasons as UCF's head coach, the Knights were the nation's most improved team in 2016 and were the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- As a Husker quarterback, Frost was a two-time national champion who helped Nebraska to a 36-2 record, including a 24-2 mark as a starter.
- Frost is one of four active head coaches who won a national title as a player and is the only coach who won multiple national titles.

In 2021, Pitt's offense ranked in the top 10 nationally in scoring, passing and total offense.

Dublin, Ireland (Aug. 26) - Nebraska held a pair of 11-point leads, but Northwestern scored the final 14 points in both halves to claim a 31-28 win in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic at Aviva Stadium.

Nebraska amassed 465 yards of total offense, including 355 yards on 25-of-42 passing by quarterback Casey Thompson, but Northwestern answered with 528 total yards, including 314 on 27-of-38 passing by Ryan Hilinski. The Wildcats also pounded the ball for 214 rushing yards.

Nebraska struck first, marching 75 yards in just eight plays capped by Thompson's 32-yard touchdown strike to Isaiah Garcia-Castaneda to give NU a 7-0 lead. Garcia-Castaneda led the Nebraska receivers with 120 yards on four catches.

After an Adam Stage's 35-yard field goal for Northwestern, the Huskers extended the margin to 14-3 by going 80 yards in 15 plays. Thompson capped the drive with a 1-yard run to give the Huskers a 14-3 advantage.

Northwestern answered just over a minute later on Hilinski's 41-yard touchdown pass to Raymond Niro III to cut the Husker lead to 14-10. The Wildcats took their first lead in the half in the final minutes, going 82 yards on 13 plays, as Hilinski connected with Donny Navarro on a 6-yard TD pass with 25 seconds left to give the Cats a 17-14 lead.

The Huskers regained the lead on their first series of the second half, going 88 yards on nine plays, highlighted by a 58-yard hookup from Thompson to Garcia-Castaneda to convert on 3rd-and-8 from the Nebraska 24-yard line. Anthony Grant then hit paydirt for the first time as a Husker, scoring from three yards out to put Nebraska ahead 21-17.

The Blackshirts came up with a big play moments later, as Marques Buford Jr. forced a fumble by Cam Porter and Caleb Tannor recovered to give the Big Red great field position. The Nebraska offense turned the miscue into points two plays later, when Grant galloped 46 yards for a touchdown to put the Big Red back up by 11 points at 28-17 with 9:09 left in the third quarter.

Grant finished with 101 yards on 19 carries in his Husker debut.

Northwestern stopped Nebraska's momentum by recovering an on-side kick attempt, giving the Wildcats a short field. Five plays later, Porter scored from three yards out to cut the Husker lead back to 28-24 with 7:53 left in the quarter.

Nebraska had a chance to extend the margin early in the fourth quarter and was on the move, but Cameron Mitchell intercepted Thompson and returned it to the Nebraska 43-yard line. The Wildcats would convert six plays later as Anthony Hull scored from six yards to give Northwestern a 31-28 advantage.

Hull led all rushers in the game with 119 yards on 22 carries, while Porter pitched in 94 yards on 19 totes.

Luke Reimer was credited with a game-high 12 tackles while Ochaun Mathis added 10 stops in his Husker debut.
