Nebraska continues its season-opening road trip with a matchup at Colorado on Saturday. The renewal of a rivalry between long-time conference opponents will kick off at 10 a.m. local time (11 a.m. CT) from Colorado's Folsom Field. The game will be televised by FOX, which will also originate its Big Noon Kickoff pregame show live from Boulder. Radio coverage will be provided by the Huskers Radio Network.

Nebraska enters Saturday's matchup looking for its first victory under first-year Head Coach Matt Rhule. The Huskers opened at Big Ten West foe Minnesota last Thursday night and led for nearly all of the second half before Minnesota rallied. The Gophers connected on a game-winning walk-off field goal to post a 13-10 win.

Despite the loss, the Nebraska defense showed its toughness, limiting the Gophers to less than four yards per play and allowing only 55 rushing yards. Nebraska also showed a strong running game against the Gophers, churning out 181 yards on the ground against one of the Big Ten's top defensive units.

Colorado enters the contest at 1-0 after an impressive 45-42 road victory at No. 17 TCU on Saturday. First-year Coach Deion Sanders' squad showed an explosive aerial attack in the win, throwing for 510 yards and four touchdowns to outscore the Horned Frogs.

Nebraska is no stranger to Boulder, having played Colorado in the Rocky Mountains on 36 previous occasions, most recently in 2019. The Huskers own a 23-11-2 edge in Boulder and have won seven of the past 10 meetings at CU's Folsom Field.

Nebraska hits the road for the second straight week to begin the season after opening at Minnesota last Thursday. The Huskers are opening a season with back-to-back road games for the first time since 1995, when Nebraska traveled to Oklahoma State and then to Michigan State.

The two most recent matchups between Nebraska and Colorado were both down-to-the-wire contests. Colorado won both games that were decided by a combined eight points, including a three-point overtime win in 2019.

Saturday's meeting will be the 72nd all-time matchup between Nebraska and Colorado. The schools met 63 straight seasons from 1948 to 2010 when they were members of the same conference and met in a home-and-home series in 2018 and 2019.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKA VS. COLORADO

Nebraska and Colorado will meet for the 72nd time on Saturday in Boulder. The Huskers hold a commanding 49-20-2 all-time lead in the series, but the Buffs have won the two most recent meetings in 2018 and 2019.

- Nebraska and Colorado met 63 straight seasons from 1948 to 2010, while members of the Big Seven, Big Eight and Big 12 Conferences.
- Saturday's meeting is the third of four meetings between the schools between 2018 and 2024. Colorado is set to visit Lincoln on Sept. 7, 2024.
- Colorado was 10-9-1 in the first 20 games in series history, but Nebraska owns a 40-9-1 edge since 1962, including a 23-1 stretch from 1962 to 1985.
- Nebraska won 15 of the final 19 meetings as conference opponents between 1992 and 2010.
- The series featured a nine-year streak from 1988 to 1996 in which both teams entered the game ranked in the top 20. Six of those games pitted top-10 foes and the 1996 game marked the third-ever top-5 matchup between the schools. The 1992 game marked the first time in modern college football history that both teams entered with the same ranking in the Associated Press poll (tie-8th).

RHULE IN FIRST SEASON LEADING HUSKER PROGRAM

Matt Rhule is in his first season at Nebraska in 2023. Rhule is in his eighth season as a college head coach and 11th season overall after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with a stint as head coach of the NFL's Carolina Panthers (2020-22).

- Rhule owns a career record of 47-44 as a college head coach. Including his time in the NFL, Rhule is 58-71 as a head coach.
- He has a proven record as a program builder. Rhule led both Temple and Baylor to the highest win totals in program history in his third season at each school.
- Rhule guided Temple to a pair of trips to the American Athletic Conference title game, the first two appearances in the league title game in school history. His 2016 Owl team won the schools' first conference title in nearly 40 years.
- Rhule led Temple to back-to-back bowl appearances for the first time in school history in 2015 and 2016. He built the foundation for Temple to appear in five straight bowl games from 2015 to 2019.
- At Baylor, Rhule became the first head coach in Power Five history to take a team from 11 losses to 11 victories in two or fewer seasons.
- The 2019 Baylor team set a school record for wins with 11 and the Bears' 9-0 start was the best in school history.
- Rhule is one of just seven current FBS head coaches to have experience as an NFL head coach

NOTING LAST WEEK'S GAME

- The game marked the fourth consecutive season Nebraska opened away from home against a Big Ten Conference opponent.
- Minnesota's 251 total yards were the fewest yards Nebraska allowed since limiting Maryland to 206 yards on Nov. 23, 2019.
- Running back **Rahmir Johnson** had a 63-yard kickoff return to open the second half. The 63-yard kickoff return was a career long for Johnson and the longest by a Husker since a 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by JD Spielman against Arkansas State in 2017.
- Sophomore receiver **Alex Bullock** had three receptions for 56 yards, his first three career catches. Bullock scored his first career TD on a 34-yard catch in the third quarter.
- True freshman defensive end **Cameron Lenhardt** earned a start. He is only the ninth Husker true freshman (excluding kickers) to start a season opener since freshmen regained eligibility in 1972.
- Lenhardt joined Maliek Collins as the only true freshmen defensive linemen to start a game for Nebraska since freshmen regained eligibility in 1972.
- Minnesota native **Bryce Benhart** made his 30th career start, all at right tackle. Benhart is the fourth Husker to start 30 games at right tackle.
- Minneapolis native **Omar Brown** intercepted a third quarter pass, the first interception of Brown's NU career and his ninth career interception.
- Running back **Gabe Ervin** had a career-long 27-yard run in the third quarter, bettering a 21-yard run against Buffalo in 2021.

NINE NEW FACES AMONG 10 FULL-TIME ASSISTANTS

Nine of Nebraska's 10 full-time assistant coaches are in their first season on the Husker sideline in 2023. The lone returning member of the coaching staff is offensive line coach **Donovan Raiola**, who is in his second season at Nebraska in 2023. Including Head Coach Matt Rhule, nine of Nebraska's 11 full-time coaches have experience at both the college and NFL levels.

- Nebraska's offensive staff is led by offensive coordinator **Marcus Satterfield**, who also guides the Husker quarterbacks. Satterfield is in his 12th season as an offensive coordinator, including the past two seasons at South Carolina. He also owns two seasons of experience as a head coach, leading Tennessee Tech in 2016 and 2017.
- Running backs coach **E.J. Barthel** has three seasons of prior experience on Rhule's staffs at Temple and Carolina. Most recently, he guided the UConn running backs in 2022, helping the Huskies rank as one of the most improved teams in the country.
- **Josh Martin** was promoted to tight ends coach in July of 2023. He boasts previous experience as a tight ends coach at SMU (2018-21) and Arizona State (2015). Martin helped a pair of tight ends become NFL Draft picks in his four seasons at SMU.
- **Garret McGuire** coaches the Husker receivers. McGuire played for Rhule at Baylor and served on his Panthers' staff. Garret is the son of Texas Tech head coach Joey McGuire.
- The defensive staff is entirely new, led by coordinator **Tony White**. White has 15 seasons as a full-time assistant at the FBS level, including the past three seasons as the defensive coordinator at Syracuse. White led the Orange to back-to-back top-25 total defense rankings in 2021 and 2022, one of only 12 programs nationally to achieve that statistical milestone.
- **Evan Cooper** has served on Rhule's staff at each of his four head coaching stops. Cooper served as a defensive backs coach with the Panthers and at Baylor and also brings an extensive player personnel and evaluation background to the staff.
- **Rob Dvoracek** leads the linebackers. He played for Rhule at Temple before coaching with the Owls, and Dvoracek also went on to be a part of Rhule's staffs at both Baylor and in the NFL.
- Defensive line coach **Terrance Knighton** spent the past two seasons working on Rhule's staff with the Panthers. Knighton owns the most accomplished playing career among Nebraska's coaches, starting 96 games during his seven-year career as an NFL defensive lineman.
- **Ed Foley** is also in his first season at Nebraska, serving as the Huskers' special teams coordinator. Foley is the most experienced member of the coaching staff, heading into his 35th year of coaching this fall. He has been with Rhule at each of his three previous stops, and Foley also has head coaching experience, leading Fordham for two seasons and twice serving as Temple's interim head coach.

10 POWER FIVE TEAMS ON HUSKER SCHEDULE

Nebraska will play three non-conference games and nine Big Ten contests in 2023. In the last year of the Big Ten divisional format, the Huskers will play each of the other six teams in the Big Ten West while taking on Maryland, Michigan and Michigan State from the Big Ten East.

- Nebraska opened its season with a conference matchup for just the 16th time in school history but for the fourth straight season.
- NU is opening with back-to-back road games at Minnesota and Colorado. The Huskers are beginning the season with consecutive road games for the first time since 1995, when second-ranked NU won at Oklahoma State (64-21) and Michigan State (50-10).
- Among the 69 Power Five schools, Nebraska and Stanford are the only teams playing consecutive road games to open the 2023 season.
- The Huskers' first home game is Sept. 16 against Northern Illinois. Excluding the 2020 Covid season, the Sept. 16 date ties for Nebraska's latest home opener since 1981.
- Nebraska plays three games against opponents ranked in the preseason AP poll (No. 2 Michigan, No. 19 Wisconsin and No. 25 Iowa). The Huskers also face Minnesota and Illinois teams that received votes in the AP top-25 preseason poll.

MEMORIAL STADIUM CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

One of the most iconic venues in all of college sports reaches a milestone this fall as Nebraska's Memorial Stadium hits the 100-year mark. Nebraska will celebrate the anniversary of Memorial Stadium throughout the 2023 home season.

- Memorial Stadium was built at a cost of \$450,000 in 1923 and had an original capacity of 31,080.
- The first game in Memorial Stadium occurred on Oct. 13, 1923, with the official dedication of the stadium a week later when Nebraska hosted Kansas on Oct. 20, 1923. Memorial Stadium was dedicated to honor Nebraskans who served in the Civil War and the Spanish-American War, and Nebraskans who died in World War I. Later, the dedication was expanded to honor Nebraskans who died in World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War.
- Nebraska owns an all-time record of 428-147-13 at Memorial Stadium entering the 2023 season.
- The Huskers have posted 33 unbeaten seasons in Memorial Stadium history, most recently in 2016.
- Every game at Memorial Stadium since 1962 has been sold out, a streak of 389 consecutive games entering the 2023 season. The 389-game sellout streak spans nearly two-thirds of all games played at Memorial Stadium.
- Nebraska opens the 2023 season under the lights at Memorial Stadium against Northern Illinois on Sept. 16. The first night game in Memorial Stadium occurred in the 1986 season opener in a win over Florida State. Nebraska is 49-10 all-time in home night games.

TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE TO NEBRASKA ROSTER

During the offseason, Nebraska added 63 newcomers to its roster. That number includes a large freshman class of 43, but adding experience to the roster are 20 first-year transfers.

- Fifteen of Nebraska's 20 first-year transfers are FBS transfers with three junior college transfers and two Division II transfers.
- The group of 15 FBS transfers includes 14 transfers from Power Five programs. Eleven players came to Lincoln with previous Power Five experience, combining for 252 games played and 87 starts in their careers.
- The transfers add considerable experience to the Husker offense. Arizona State transfer **Ben Scott** ranks second among all current Husker offensive players with 29 career starts, Virginia transfer wide receiver **Billy Kemp IV** is third with 25 career starts and Georgia Tech transfer quarterback **Jeff Sims** is fifth among current Husker offensive players with 24 career starts.

DUAL-THREAT QUARTERBACK SIMS LEADING NU OFFENSE

Jeff Sims made his first Nebraska start last week at Minnesota and his 24th career start. The first-year transfer has previous starting experience at Georgia Tech, where he started 23 games over the 2020, 2021 and 2022 seasons.

- Sims accounted for more than 5,600 yards of total offense in 24 career games at Georgia Tech, including an average of 233.7 yards in his 23 starts. He was a dual threat, passing for 4,464 yards and rushing for 1,152 yards. In his first start at Nebraska, Sims accounted for 205 total yards with 91 rushing yards and 114 through the air.
- Sims is one of 14 active FBS quarterbacks with 4,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.
- In his career, Sims has posted three 300-yard passing games, nine 200-yard passing games, two 100-yard rushing efforts and 13 games where he accounted for multiple touchdowns.
- In August, Sims was one of 35 FBS quarterbacks and four Big Ten signal callers named to the Davey O'Brien Award preseason watch list.

BUSCHINI ON RAY GUY AWARD WATCH LIST

Punter **Brian Buschini** was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List in August, one of 50 FBS punters to make the list. Buschini is in his second season at Nebraska in 2023 after beginning his career at FCS Montana.

- Buschini averaged 44.0 yards per punt in his first season at Nebraska in 2022. That average ranked 25th nationally and eighth in Husker history. He averaged 47.7 yards on three punts in the opener at Minnesota.
- The 2021 FCS Punter of the Year at Montana, Buschini averages better than 45 yards per punt in his career. More than one-third of Buschini's 146 career punts have covered 50 or more yards, while more than one-third of his career punts have been placed inside the 20-yard line.
- Buschini wore No. 95 last season but he switched to No. 18 this fall. Buschini made the number switch after learning about the life of former Nebraska quarterback Brook Berringer. A two-time national champion who wore No. 18, Berringer was killed in a plane crash on April 18, 1996, less than four months after helping Nebraska to the 1995 national title. Berringer was an active member of the community and every year since 1997, Nebraska football players who serve the community are honored with an appointment to the Brook Berringer Citizenship Team.

KEMP RANKS AMONG ACTIVE LEADERS IN CAREER RECEPTIONS

Virginia transfer **Billy Kemp IV** is in first season at Nebraska as one of the most experienced and accomplished receivers in the country. Kemp played in 50 games with 25 starts in five years at Virginia. He is eligible to play this fall after the NCAA granted all UVA players in their final season of eligibility one additional year of eligibility after a shooting on the Charlottesville campus that killed three football players and led to the cancellation of the final two games of Virginia's season.

- Kemp caught 192 passes for 1,774 yards and eight touchdowns in his Virginia career. He ranked fourth all-time at Virginia in receptions and 10th in receiving yards.
- Kemp is eighth among all active FBS players with his 192 career receptions.

HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE

Arguably the most experienced unit on the Nebraska team is the offensive line. The group is also the only unit that did not have a new position coach in 2023, as **Donovan Raiola** was the lone full-time assistant on Nebraska's 2022 coaching staff to join Head Coach Matt Rhule's staff.

- Husker offensive linemen have combined for 127 career starts, including 99 starts at Nebraska. According to research compiled by West Virginia's Mike Montoro, Nebraska's 120 combined offensive line starts prior to 2023 were the 15th-most in the country entering the season.
- Bryce Benhart** leads the way with 30 career starts, starting 30 of Nebraska's 33 games at right tackle since the start of the 2020 season. Benhart is just the fourth Husker to make 30 career starts at right tackle. **Turner Corcoran** has started 25 of Nebraska's last 26 games - including 24 straight - with 20 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. **Ethan Piper** has started 19 games at left guard in his career.
- Bolstering the line is the addition of Arizona State transfer **Ben Scott** and the return of **Nouredin Nouili**. Scott, who was named to the preseason watch list for the Rimington Trophy, made 28 starts for the Sun Devils the past three seasons with starting experience at center (11 starts) and right tackle (17 starts). Nouili, who sat out the 2022 season, is back after he started the final seven games of the 2021 campaign at left guard.
- Teddy Prochazka** (5 starts) and **Henry Lutovsky** (2 starts) have also started multiple games on the Husker offensive line. Prochazka emerged as a true freshman starter at left tackle midway through the 2021 before suffering a season-ending injury. He then started the first three games last season at left tackle before suffering another season-ending injury.

REIMER AIMS TO CLIMB NEBRASKA'S ALL-TIME TACKLES LIST

Linebacker **Luke Reimer** has been Nebraska's leading tackler each of the past two seasons, recording 194 tackles in 22 games during that stretch. In his career, Reimer has amassed 250 tackles with 5.0 sacks and 16.5 tackles for loss. In August, Reimer was one of 80 FBS players named to the Lombardi Award preseason watch list.

- With 250 career tackles, Reimer is second in career tackles among Big Ten players, trailing only Iowa's Nick Jackson who transferred to the Hawkeyes in the offseason. Reimer was the only returning Big Ten player with 220 or more tackles entering 2023.
- Reimer is looking to become the fourth Husker to lead Nebraska in tackles three straight seasons since complete tackle statistics are available beginning in 1965.

- Reimer ranks 13th in school history with his 250 career tackles. With seven tackles, he would move into the top 10 on Nebraska's all-time list and with 34 tackles he would move into the top five. Reimer is just 38 tackles away from the No. 3 spot on the Huskers' all-time tackles chart.

NEWCOMERS MAKE IMMEDIATE IMPACT FOR HUSKERS

Nebraska featured many new faces in the starting lineup in the season opener at Minnesota. A total of 11 players made their first starts at Nebraska, including four players in their first season in the program.

- Two true freshmen earned starting assignments for the Huskers, place-kicker **Tristan Alvano** and defensive end **Cameron Lenhardt**.
- Lenhardt is only the ninth Husker true freshman (excluding kickers) to start a season opener since freshmen regained eligibility in 1972.
- Lenhardt joined Maliek Collins as the only true freshmen defensive linemen to start a game for Nebraska since freshmen regained eligibility in 1972. Collins started one game as a true freshman during the 2013 season, earning a start in the 2014 Gator Bowl.

16 PLAYING 2023 SEASON AS COLLEGE GRADUATES

Sixteen Huskers are playing this season as college graduates, including 11 players who earned their degrees from Nebraska and five players who joined the Husker program as graduate transfers.

In addition to the 16 players who have already graduated, 13 Huskers are on track to earn their degrees in December of 2023.

SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED TO 'TOUGHEST' HUSKERS

In a tradition new to Nebraska but familiar to **Matt Rhule**, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the team's "toughest" players. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.

"I got really tired of having a guy in my program who had spent three years at like No. 47... wanted to wear No. 1 or No. 3, and he had earned it and we would give it to a recruit," Rhule said during the offseason. "What we decided was (numbers) 1-9, now 0-9, would go to the nine or now 10 'toughest' guys on the team. When I say 'toughest', we define that for the guys, but really the guys who best exemplify what it means to be a Cornhusker. To be accountable, to be dependable, to be tough, hard-working, competitive every single day."

The 10 players listed below were selected by their teammates to be worthy of having a single-digit number this season. In addition to the 10 players below, **Ethan Piper** was selected in the first round of team voting to earn a single-digit number, but NCAA rules prevent offensive linemen from wearing a single-digit number.

- Nebraska ranks eighth in NCAA history with 912 wins and seventh with 53 all-time bowl game appearances.
- NU has won five national championships. The Huskers' four AP national titles (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fourth.

- The success extends to the classroom as well. Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and NCAA Top 10 Award winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium celebrates its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

2023 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska is scheduled to play three games against opponents ranked in the 2023 preseason AP poll. The Huskers take on Michigan (2nd) on Sept. 30, Wisconsin (19th) on Nov. 18 and Iowa (25th) on Nov. 24.
- In addition to the three preseason ranked opponents Nebraska will face Minnesota and Illinois, both of whom were among the teams receiving votes outside of the top 25.
- Nebraska plays a total of seven opponents who played in a bowl game in 2022.
- The Huskers open the season with back-to-back road games at Minnesota (Aug. 31) and Colorado (Sept. 9). Nebraska begins a season with consecutive road games for the first time since 1995. Nebraska and Stanford are the only two Power Five programs who open the 2023 season with back-to-back road games.
- Nebraska's first home game is Sept. 16 against Northern Illinois. Excluding the 2020 Covid season, the Sept. 16 date ties for Nebraska's latest home opener since 1981.
- The Huskers will recognize the 100-year anniversary of Memorial Stadium against Northwestern on Oct. 21. The first game played in Memorial Stadium was a 24-0 shutout of Oklahoma on Oct. 13, 1923.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- **Matt Rhule** is in his first season at Nebraska in 2023. Rhule is in his 11th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with a stint as head coach of the NFL's Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- In his last full season at the collegiate level in 2019, Rhule was named the Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Big 12 Coach of the Year after leading Baylor to appearances in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.
- Rhule built winning programs at Temple and Baylor. After laying the foundation in his first two seasons at each stop, Rhule guided both the Owls and Bears to a school-record win total in his third season, when both teams also played in the conference championship game.
- Seven Husker assistants previously coached on a Rhule staff: **Marcus Satterfield** (offensive coordinator), **Ed Foley** (special teams coordinator), **E.J. Barthel** (running backs), **Evan Cooper** (secondary/defensive pass game coordinator), **Rob Dvoracek** (linebackers), **Terrance Knighton** (defensive line) and **Garret McGuire** (wide receivers).

- Three Husker assistants are serving on a Rhule staff for the first time: **Tony White** (defensive coordinator), **Josh Martin** (tight ends) and **Donovan Raiola** (offensive line).
- Eight of Nebraska's 11 full-time coaches have experience coaching in the National Football League.

- Nebraska's roster features 137 players. A player's class reflects the fact that the 2020 season did not count as a year of eligibility.

- The roster features 73 returning players and 64 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of 14 starters and 36 letterwinners.
- Nebraska has added 20 transfers and 44 true freshmen since the end of the 2022 season. Among the 20 transfers are 15 FBS transfers, three junior college players and two Division II transfers.
- The Huskers added a total of 14 transfers from Power Five programs, including: Florida (3), Georgia (3), Arizona State (1), Baylor (1), Georgia Tech (1), Notre Dame (1), Ole Miss (1), Texas A&M (1), Utah (1) and Virginia (1).
- The roster features players from 28 states and two foreign countries (Canada & Germany).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the Huskers' 2023 roster include: Nebraska (52), Texas (11), Georgia (9), Iowa (6), California (5), Florida (5), Arizona (4), New Jersey (4), Pennsylvania (4), Michigan (3), Minnesota (3), Missouri (3), South Dakota (3), Tennessee (3), Colorado (2), Illinois (2), Kansas (2), Louisiana (2), New York (2) and Virginia (2).
- The states of Alabama, Hawaii, Maryland, Mississippi, Montana, Oklahoma, Utah and Washington are each represented with one player on Nebraska's 2023 roster.

- The players wearing a single-digit jersey number (0-9) earned the right to wear that number through a team vote. Offensive lineman Ethan Piper was also selected to wear a single-digit number but NCAA rules prohibited him from wearing a single-digit number.

SCOUTING THE COLORADO BUFFALOES



Colorado began the 2023 campaign with a 45-42 upset at No. 17 TCU last Saturday in Fort Worth, Texas.

Colorado racked up 510 yards through the air and 55 yards on the ground in the season opener. Shedeur Sanders completed 38-of-47 passes for a school-record 510 yards and four touchdowns. Running back Dylan Edwards led a group of four CU players with 100+ receiving yards, compiling 135 yards on five grabs and three scores. Travis Hunter had 11 receptions for 119 yards, while Xavier Weaver and Jimmy Horn Jr. had 118 and 117 yards, respectively. Sy'veon Wilkerson led the Buffaloes on the ground with 13 carries for 45 yards and a touchdown. Edwards carried the ball six times for 24 yards and score, while Anthony Hankerson had 21 yards on nine carries.

Defensively, Colorado allowed 541 yards and 42 points to TCU last Saturday. The Buffaloes gave up 279 passing yards and another 262 yards on the ground. Shilo Sanders and Marvin Ham paced the CU defense with 10 tackles apiece. Trevor Woods totaled nine tackles, a forced fumble and an interception, while Hunter added an interception with three tackles, along with his 11 catches.

Deion Sanders is in his first season as the head coach at Colorado.

Sanders began his tenure with the Buffaloes with a 45-42 upset at No. 17 TCU last weekend in Fort Worth, Texas.

Sanders came to Colorado after spending three years as the head coach at Jackson State, where he was 27-6 overall and won back-to-back Southwestern Athletic Conference championships competing on the FCS level. The Tigers were 4-3 in his first year in 2020, but compiled an 11-2 record in 2021 and 12-1 mark in 2022 to earn Sanders consecutive SWAC Coach of the Year honors.

Prior to joining the collegiate coaching ranks at Jackson State, Sanders had been involved in coaching for over a decade. Sanders was the offensive coordinator at Trinity Christian School (Cedar Hill, Texas), leading the Tigers to three straight Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) titles and a 42-3 record.

DEION SANDERS VS. NEBRASKA

Sanders will face Nebraska for the first time in a coaching role on Saturday. As a player at Florida State, Sanders played against Nebraska three consecutive seasons from 1985 to 1987, with the Seminoles winning two of three matchups.

COLORADO INFORMATION

Colorado has fielded a football team since 1890, and the Buffaloes have tallied over 700 wins as a program. Colorado has claimed one national title and 26 conference championships, including one Big 12 Conference title. The Buffs are a member of the Pac-12 Conference in 2023, before rejoining the Big 12 in 2024.

The Buffaloes have made 29 bowl game appearances, claiming 12 wins. Colorado's last bowl game appearance came in 2020 when the Buffaloes took on Texas in the Alamo Bowl. Texas came away with the victory in a 55-23 rout over the Buffaloes.

Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

Over his last five collegiate seasons before taking the Nebraska job (2015-19), Rhule won one conference title, three division titles and produced three seasons with double-digit wins.

TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016. He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 124-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 87-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Five program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons.
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, the Bears' second-highest final ranking since 1951.

Minneapolis (Aug. 31) Nebraska's defense provided an outstanding effort, but a 47-yard walk-off field goal by Minnesota's Dragan Kesich lifted the Golden Gophers to a 13-10 victory over the Huskers.

Minnesota capitalized on a pair of Nebraska turnovers in the final five minutes after the Huskers built a 10-3 lead and had the ball near midfield late in the fourth quarter.

Nebraska finished the night with 181 rushing yards and 114 passing yards, while holding the Gophers to just 55 on the ground and 196 through the air. A 4-1 turnover edge by the Gophers was enough to doom the Big Red.

Quarterback Jeff Sims finished the night 11-of-19 through the air for 114 yards, while adding a team-best 91 rushing yards on 19 carries. Alex Bullock led the Husker receivers with three receptions for 56 yards and a touchdown.

DeShon Singleton and Omar Brown led a gritty Blackshirt defensive effort with seven tackles apiece, while Brown added an interception. Nash Hutmacher, Blaise Gunnerson and Luke Reimer all contributed sacks for the Husker defense that allowed just 251 yards.

The decisive turnover came with less than one minute left and Nebraska moving the ball in hopes of a walk-off score of its own. A Sims pass over the middle intended for Nate Boerkircher was intercepted by Minnesota's Tyler Nuben - his second of the game - at the Gopher 35 with 58 seconds remaining. Minnesota then moved the ball quickly to the Nebraska 35, hoping to push the ball a few yards closer for the strong leg of Kesich. But the Gophers were flagged for a false start to set up 3rd-and-13 at the NU 40 with 17 seconds left. The Gophers overcame the mistake with an 11-yard run by Sean Tyler to set up Kesich's 47-yard field goal as time expired.

The whole exchange may have been impossible had the Big Red not suffered a lost fumble from Anthony Grant with 4:53 left that was forced by Justin Walley and recovered by Aidan Gousby at the Minnesota 47. Just over two minutes later, UM quarterback Athan Kaliakmanos kept Minnesota's hopes alive by connecting with Daniel Jackson on a 13-yard touchdown on 4th-and-10 with 2:32 remaining in the game. Kaliakmanis finished the night 24-of-44 passing for 196 yards with one touchdown and one interception while being sacked three times. Jackson led the Gopher receivers with nine receptions for 68 yards.

In a low-scoring Big Ten slugfest, Nebraska scored its first touchdown of the season on back-to-back huge plays to open the second half. Rahmir Johnson opened the second half with a 63-yard kickoff return. On the first play from scrimmage, Sims pitched the ball to the right to Grant, who threw a lateral back to Sims in the left flat that bounded to the turf. Sims gave chase, gathered the ball and threw deep for a 34-yard touchdown to Alex Bullock, who was standing alone in the end zone.

Nebraska's defense continued to play lights out for the rest of the quarter, including a crucial interception by cornerback Omar Brown late in the period after the Golden Gophers threatened the Husker red zone.

The Big Red moved the ball effectively late in the period and took the 7-3 edge to fourth quarter after penetrating the Minnesota red zone. The Huskers pushed inside the Gopher 5 but could not punch it in the end zone. Alvano came on to boot the first field goal of his career, connecting from 27 yards with 12:42 left to extend NU's edge to 10-3.
