Nebraska continues a three-game homestand on Saturday afternoon when the Huskers play host to the Louisiana Tech Bulldogs at Memorial Stadium. The Huskers will complete their non-conference schedule with the contest, which will kick off shortly after 2:30 p.m. Central in Lincoln. The game will be televised by Big Ten Network and available on the Fox Sport App. The radio broadcast will be available on the Huskers Radio Network, Huskers.com and the official Huskers App.

The Huskers picked up their first victory of the 2023 season last Saturday with a decisive 35-11 victory over Northern Illinois at Memorial Stadium. Nebraska was paced by a strong defensive effort as the Huskers limited NIU to just 149 total yards, including just 73 yards through three quarters. On the offensive side, quarterback Heinrich Haarberg had a solid outing in his first career start, accounting for 256 yards of total offense and three total touchdowns. The Huskers picked up 244 yards on the ground, including 96 rushing yards in the fourth guarter.

Nebraska will be playing host to Louisiana Tech for the third time in school history. The Huskers hold a 2-0 advantage in the all-time series, with the Bulldogs, most recent trip to Lincoln coming in 2006.

Louisiana Tech will bring a 2-2 record to Lincoln, following a 40-37 loss at North Texas on Saturday night. The Bulldogs trailed by 17 points in the fourth quarter, before rallying to tie the game in the final three minutes. North Texas kicked the game-winning field goal in the waning seconds. Louisiana Tech's offense will challenge the Huskers, as the Bulldogs' balanced attack averages better than 400 yards and 31.0 points per game.

THIS WEEK'S NUMBERS

Nebraska ranks second nationally in rushing defense allowing 46.3 yards per game. NU has held each of its first three opponents to less than 60 rushing yards. The last time Nebraska held three straight opponents under 60 rushing yards was the final three games of the 2008 season (Kansas State, Colorado, Clemson).

Quarterback Heinrich Haarberg was just the fourth Nebraska native to start a game at quarterback for the Huskers since 2001. The Kearney native joined Noah Vedral (Wahoo, 2019), Ryker Fyfe (Grand Island, 2015 and 2016) and Ron Kellogg III (Omaha, 2013) as native Nebraskans to start since Eric Crouch completed his career in 2001.

Seven former Huskers and one former Nebraska coach will become the eight newest Huskers in the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame this weekend. The group will be officially inducted on Friday evening and honored on the field before Saturday's game.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKA VS. LOUISIANA TECH

Saturday's meeting between Nebraska and Louisiana Tech will be the third all-time matchup between the two schools. Nebraska has won both previous meetings with victories at Memorial Stadium in 1998 and 2006.

- The 1998 meeting came in the Eddie Robinson Football Classic and was Nebraska's first game under Frank Solich. In that game, Louisiana Tech's Troy Edwards set NCAA records with 21 receptions for 405 yards in a 56-27 Nebraska win.
- The 2006 matchup featured the first crowd of more than 80,000 in Memorial Stadium history.
- Nebraska has a 7-0 all-time record against current members of Conference USA, most recently
 defeating Western Kentucky in 2010. Nebraska has C-USA member UTEP on its 2024 and 2028
 home schedules.

RHULE IN FIRST SEASON LEADING HUSKER PROGRAM

Matt Rhule is in his first season at Nebraska in 2023. Rhule is in his eighth season as a college head coach and 11th season overall after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with a stint as head coach of the NFL's Carolina Panthers (2020-22).

- Rhule owns a career record of 48-45 as a college head coach. Including his time in the NFL, Rhule is 59-72 as a head coach.
- He has a proven record as a program builder. Rhule led both Temple and Baylor to the highest win totals in program history in his third season at each school.
- Rhule guided Temple to a pair of trips to the American Athletic Conference title game, the first
 two appearances in the league title game in school history. His 2016 Owl team won the school's
 first conference title in nearly 40 years.
- Rhule led Temple to back-to-back bowl appearances for the first time in school history in 2015 and 2016. He built the foundation for Temple to appear in five straight bowl games from 2015 to 2019.
- At Baylor, Rhule became the first head coach in Power Five history to take a team from 11 losses to 11 victories in two or fewer seasons.
- The 2019 Baylor team set a school record for wins with 11 and the Bears' 9-0 start was the best in school history.
- Rhule is one of just seven current FBS head coaches to have experience as an NFL head coach

NINE NEW FACES AMONG 10 FULL-TIME ASSISTANTS

Nine of Nebraska's 10 full-time assistant coaches are in their first season on the Husker sideline in 2023. The lone returning member of the coaching staff is offensive line coach **Donovan Raiola**, who is in his second season at Nebraska in 2023. Including Head Coach Matt Rhule, nine of Nebraska's 11 full-time coaches have experience at both the college and NFL levels.

- Nebraska's offensive staff is led by offensive coordinator Marcus Satterfield, who also guides
 the Husker quarterbacks. Satterfield is in his 12th season as an offensive coordinator, including
 the past two seasons at South Carolina. He also owns two seasons of experience as a head
 coach, leading Tennessee Tech in 2016 and 2017.
- Running backs coach **E.J. Barthel** has three seasons of prior experience on Rhule's staffs at Temple and Carolina. Most recently, he guided the UConn running backs in 2022, helping the Huskies rank as one of the most improved teams in the country.
- Josh Martin was promoted to tight ends coach in July of 2023. He boasts previous experience
 as a tight ends coach at SMU (2018-21) and Arizona State (2015). Martin helped a pair of tight
 ends become NFL Draft picks in his four seasons at SMU.
- Garret McGuire coaches the Husker receivers. McGuire played for Rhule at Baylor and served on his Panthers' staff. Garret is the son of Texas Tech head coach Joey McGuire.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S GAME

- Sophomore quarterback Heinrich Haarberg made his first career start, and was the first Nebraska native to start at quarterback since Noah Vedral started games against Indiana and Minnesota in 2019.
- Haarberg is just the fourth Nebraska native to start a game at quarterback since 2001 (Vedral, Ryker Fyfe, Ron Kellogg III).
 Haarberg is the first Nebraska native to start and win a game since Ryker Fyfe led Nebraska to a win over Maryland in 2016.
- Haarberg accounted for 256 yards of total offense, including 158 passing yards and 98 rushing yards.
- Nebraska allowed 149 yards of total offense, the fewest by a Nebraska opponent since Kansas had 87 yards against the Huskers on Nov. 13, 2010.
- Nebraska limited Northern Illinois to 26 rushing yards, the fewest by a Husker opponent since Purdue had -2 rushing yards on Dec. 5, 2020.
- The Nebraska defense had 3.0 sacks after entering the game leading the nation with 11 sacks. Nebraska has had at least three sacks in all three games this season. This is the first time NU has had three sacks in three straight games in the same season since the first three games of 2019 (South Alabama, Colorado, Northern Illinois).
- Nose tackle Nash Hutmacher had a career night with a career-high six tackles, including a career-best 2.5 tackles for loss and 0.5 sacks. His previous highs were four tackles and 1.0 TFL. Hutmacher had a pair of TFL on a red zone drive in the first quarter when Nebraska held NIU to a field goal.

- The defensive staff is entirely new, led by coordinator **Tony White**. White has 15 seasons as a full-time assistant at the FBS level, including the past three seasons as the defensive coordinator at Syracuse. White led the Orange to back-to-back top-25 total defense rankings in 2021 and 2022, one of only 12 programs nationally to achieve that statistical milestone.
- Evan Cooper has served on Rhule's staff at each of his four head coaching stops. Cooper served
 as a defensive backs coach with the Panthers and at Baylor and also brings an extensive player
 personnel and evaluation background to the staff.
- Rob Dvoracek leads the linebackers. He played for Rhule at Temple before coaching with the Owls, and Dvoracek also went on to be a part of Rhule's staffs at both Baylor and in the NFL.
- Defensive line coach **Terrance Knighton** spent the past two seasons working on Rhule's staff with the Panthers. Knighton owns the most accomplished playing career among Nebraska's coaches, starting 96 games during his seven-year career as an NFL defensive lineman.
- Ed Foley is also in his first season at Nebraska, serving as the Huskers' special teams coordinator. Foley is the most experienced member of the coaching staff, heading into his 35th year of coaching this fall. He has been with Rhule at each of his three previous stops, and Foley also has head coaching experience, leading Fordham for two seasons and twice serving as Temple's interim head coach.

10 POWER FIVE TEAMS ON HUSKER SCHEDULE

Nebraska finishes non-conference play this week against Louisiana Tech, before resuming Big Ten play for the final eight games of the 2023 season. In the last year of the Big Ten divisional format, the Huskers play each of the other six teams in the Big Ten West while taking on Maryland, Michigan and Michigan State from the Big Ten East.

- Nebraska opened its season with a conference matchup (at Minnesota) for just the 16th time in school history but for the fourth straight season.
- NU opened with back-to-back road games at Minnesota and Colorado. The Huskers began the season with consecutive road games for the first time since 1995, when second-ranked NU won at Oklahoma State (64-21) and Michigan State (50-10).
- Among the 69 Power Five schools, Nebraska and Stanford were the only teams that played consecutive road games to open the 2023 season.
- The Huskers' first home game against Northern Illinois on Sept. 16 is NU's latest home opener since 1981 (excluding 2020 Covid season).
- Nebraska plays three games against opponents ranked in the preseason AP poll (No. 2 Michigan, No. 19 Wisconsin and No. 25 Iowa). The Huskers played their first game against a ranked opponent at then-No. 22 Colorado on Sept. 9.

MEMORIAL STADIUM CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

One of the most iconic venues in all of college sports reaches a milestone this fall as Nebraska's Memorial Stadium hits the 100-year mark. Nebraska will celebrate the anniversary of Memorial Stadium throughout the 2023 home season.

- Memorial Stadium was built at a cost of \$450,000 in 1923 and had an original capacity of 31,080.
- The first game in Memorial Stadium occurred on Oct. 13, 1923, with the official dedication of the stadium a week later when Nebraska hosted Kansas on Oct. 20, 1923. Memorial Stadium was dedicated to honor Nebraskans who served in the Civil War and the Spanish-American War, and Nebraskans who died in World War I. Later, the dedication was expanded to honor Nebraskans who died in World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War.
- Nebraska owns an all-time record of 429-147-13 at Memorial Stadium.
- The Huskers have posted 33 unbeaten seasons in Memorial Stadium history, most recently in 2016.
- Every game at Memorial Stadium since 1962 has been sold out, a streak of 390 consecutive games. The 390-game sellout streak spans nearly two-thirds of all games played at Memorial Stadium.
- Nebraska opened the 2023 home season under the lights at Memorial Stadium against Northern Illinois. The first night game in Memorial Stadium occurred in the 1986 season opener in a win over Florida State. Nebraska is 50-10 all-time in home night games following the win over NIU.

BLACKSHIRTS FLEXING MUSCLE EARLY IN SEASON

Nebraska's defense has performed well in each of the first three games this season, ranking among the nation's best teams in stopping the run and pressuring the passer. Early in the season, Nebraska also boasts one of the nation's most improved defenses under first-year Head Coach Matt Rhule and defensive coordinator Tony White.

Northern Illinois managed just 149 total yards in the Huskers' 35-11 victory last Saturday. The
Huskies had just 87 total yards before the final drive of the game. The 149 total yards were the
fewest by a Nebraska opponent since Kansas had 87 yards on Nov. 13, 2010. The last time
Nebraska had limited an opponent to fewer than 200 yards was at Illinois in 2017.

- The Husker defense ranks 29th nationally in total defense, allowing 284.7 yards per game. The
 average through three games is a 207.3-yard improvement when compared to the first three
 games of the 2022 season.
- Nebraska ranks 15th nationally in allowing only 4.19 yards per play, including just 1.7 yards per opponent rushing attempt. Opponents have a total of 139 rushing yards on 80 attempts.

NOWHERE TO RUN

The most dominant part of the Blackshirt defense through three games has been stopping the run and pressuring the passer. Nebraska owns the nation's most improved run defense compared to 2022, allowing 142.8 fewer yards per game on the ground.

- Nebraska ranks second in the nation, allowing just 46.3 yards rushing per game.
- Minnesota (55 yards), Colorado (58) and Northern Illinois (26) have all rushed for fewer than 100 yards. It is the longest stretch of holding opponents to 100 yards or fewer rushing since also limiting each of the first three opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in 2019.
- The last time Nebraska held four straight opponents to less than 100 rushing yards was a fivegame stretch covering the last two games of 2003 and the first three games in 2004.
- Before the start of this season, Nebraska had not held three straight foes to less than 60 rushing
 yards since the final three games in 2008. NU has not held four straight opponents under 60
 rushing yards since the first four games in 1999.
- Nebraska has allowed just 12 rushing first downs, which is tied for seventh nationally.
- Nebraska has registered 14 sacks in three games, including a season-high eight at Colorado.
 The 4.67 sacks per game lead the Big Ten and rank fourth in the nation. The Huskers' 104 sack
 yards are tied for the national lead. Nebraska's 7.0 tackles for loss per game ranks third in the
 Big Ten, and Nebraska's 120 TFL yards are 10th nationally.
- The Huskers racked up eight sacks at No. 22 Colorado. The team sack total was Nebraska's best since recording 9.0 sacks against Texas in the 2009 Big 12 Championship Game.

REIMER AIMS TO CLIMB NEBRASKA'S ALL-TIME TACKLES LIST

Linebacker **Luke Reimer** has been Nebraska's leading tackler each of the past two seasons, recording 194 tackles in 22 games. Reimer has amassed 257 tackles with 6.5 sacks and 18.0 tackles for loss. Reimer was one of 80 FBS players named to the Lombardi Award preseason watch list.

- With 257 career tackles, Reimer is second in career tackles among Big Ten players, trailing only lowa's Nick Jackson who transferred to the Hawkeyes in the offseason. Reimer was the only returning Big Ten player with 220 or more tackles entering 2023.
- Reimer is looking to become the fourth Husker to lead Nebraska in tackles three straight seasons since complete tackle statistics are available beginning in 1965.

TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE TO NEBRASKA ROSTER

Nebraska added 63 newcomers to its roster during the offseason. That number includes a large freshman class of 43, and 20 first-year transfers.

- Fifteen of Nebraska's 20 first-year transfers are FBS transfers with three junior college transfers and two Division II transfers.
- The group of 15 FBS transfers includes 14 transfers from Power Five programs. Eleven players came to Lincoln with previous Power Five experience, combining for 252 games played and 87 starts in their careers prior to arriving in Lincoln.
- The transfers add considerable experience to the Husker offense. Arizona State transfer Ben Scott ranks second among all current Husker offensive players with 31 career starts, Virginia transfer wide receiver Billy Kemp IV is fourth with 26 career starts and Georgia Tech transfer quarterback Jeff Sims has 25 career starts.

KEMP RANKS AMONG ACTIVE LEADERS IN CAREER RECEPTIONS

Virginia transfer **Billy Kemp IV** is in first season at Nebraska as one of the most experienced and accomplished receivers in the country. Kemp played in 50 games with 25 starts in five years at Virginia. He is eligible to play this fall after the NCAA granted all UVA players in their final season of eligibility one additional year of eligibility after a shooting on the Charlottesville campus that killed three football players and led to the cancellation of the final two games of Virginia's season.

- Kemp caught 192 passes for 1,774 yards and eight touchdowns in his Virginia career. He ranked fourth all-time at Virginia in receptions and 10th in receiving yards.
- Kemp had three catches against Northern Illinois, including an 8-yard touchdown catch to push his career receptions total to 200. He is tied for sixth among all active FBS players with his 200 career receptions.

DUAL-THREAT QUARTERBACK SIMS LEADING NU OFFENSE

Jeff Sims has made his first two Nebraska starts at Minnesota and Colorado and has 25 career collegiate starts. The first-year transfer has previous starting experience at Georgia Tech, where he started 23 games over the 2020, 2021 and 2022 seasons.

- Sims accounted for more than 5,600 yards of total offense in 24 career games at Georgia Tech, including an average of 233.7 yards in his 23 starts. He was a dual threat, passing for 4,464 yards and rushing for 1,152 yards. Through two games at Nebraska, Sims has accounted for 378 total yards with 158 rushing yards and 220 through the air.
- Sims is one of 15 active FBS quarterbacks with 4,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.
- In his career, Sims has posted three 300-yard passing games, nine 200-yard passing games, two 100-yard rushing efforts and 13 games where he accounted for multiple touchdowns.
- Sims was one of 35 FBS quarterbacks named to the Davey O'Brien Award preseason watch list.

HAARBERG SHINES IN FIRST CAREER START

Sophomore quarterback **Heinrich Haarberg** made his first career start against Northern Illinois and guided Nebraska to a 35-11 victory. The native of Kearney, Neb., accounted for 256 yards of total offense, including 98 rushing yards and 158 passing yards. He also had three total touchdowns, two through the air and one rushing score.

- Haarberg is the first Husker quarterback to account for three total touchdowns in his first career start at Nebraska since Adrian Martinez accounted for three touchdowns in his first career start in 2018 against Colorado.
- Haarberg is the first Nebraska native to start at quarterback for the Huskers since Noah Vedral started games against Indiana and Minnesota in 2019.
- Haarberg is just the fourth Nebraska native to start a game at quarterback since 2002 (Vedral, Ryker Fyfe, Ron Kellogg III). Omaha native Eric Crouch started 42 games at quarterback for Nebraska from 1998 to 2001.
- Haarberg is the first Nebraska native to start and win a game since Fyfe led Nebraska to a 28-7 win over Maryland in 2016.

BUSCHINI ON RAY GUY AWARD WATCH LIST

Punter **Brian Buschini** was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List in August, one of 50 FBS punters to make the list. Buschini is in his second season at Nebraska in 2023 after beginning his career at FCS Montana.

- Buschini averaged 44.0 yards per punt in his first season at Nebraska in 2022. That average ranked 25th nationally and eighth in Husker history. He averaged 47.7 yards on three punts in the opener at Minnesota, and is averaging 41.5 yards per punt on the season.
- The 2021 FCS Punter of the Year at Montana, Buschini averages better than 45 yards per punt in his career. More than one-third of Buschini's 146 career punts have covered 50 or more yards, while more than one-third of his career punts have been placed inside the 20-yard line.
- Buschini wore No. 95 last season but he switched to No. 18 this fall. Buschini made the number switch after learning about the life of former Nebraska quarterback Brook Berringer. A two-time national champion who wore No. 18, Berringer was killed in a plane crash on April 18, 1996, less than four months after helping Nebraska to the 1995 national title. Berringer was an active member of the community and every year since 1997, Nebraska football players who serve the community are honored with an appointment to the Brook Berringer Citizenship Team.

HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE

Arguably the most experienced unit on the Nebraska team is the offensive line. The group is also the only unit that did not have a new position coach in 2023, as **Donovan Raiola** was the lone full-time assistant on Nebraska's 2022 coaching staff to join Head Coach Matt Rhule's staff.

- Husker offensive linemen have combined for 137 career starts, including 109 starts at Nebraska.
 According to research compiled by West Virginia's Mike Montoro, Nebraska's 120 combined offensive line starts entering 2023 were the 15th-most in the country entering the season.
- Bryce Benhart leads the way with 32 career starts, starting 32 of Nebraska's 35 games at right tackle since the start of the 2020 season. Benhart is just the fourth Husker to make 30 career starts at right tackle. Turner Corcoran has started 27 of Nebraska's last 28 games including 26 straight with 22 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. Ethan Piper has started 21 games at left guard in his career.
- Bolstering the line in 2023 is the addition of Arizona State transfer **Ben Scott** and the return of **Nouredin Nouili**. Scott, who was named to the preseason watch list for the Rimington Trophy, made 28 starts for the Sun Devils the previous three seasons with starting experience at center (11 starts) and right tackle (17 starts). Nouili, who sat out the 2022 season, is back after he started the final seven games of the 2021 campaign at left guard.
- Teddy Prochazka (5 starts) and Henry Lutovsky (2 starts) have also started multiple games on the Husker offensive line. Prochazka emerged as a true freshman starter at left tackle midway through 2021 before suffering a season-ending injury. He then started the first three games last season at left tackle before suffering another season-ending injury.

NEWCOMERS MAKE IMMEDIATE IMPACT FOR HUSKERS

Nebraska has featured many new faces in prominent roles early in the 2023 season. A total of 15 players have made their first starts at Nebraska through three weeks, including five players in their first season in the program.

- Two true freshmen have earned starting assignments in each of the first three games for the Huskers, place-kicker **Tristan Alvano** and defensive end **Cameron Lenhardt**.
- Lenhardt was only the ninth Husker true freshman (excluding kickers) to start a season opener since freshmen regained eligibility in 1972.
- Lenhardt joined Maliek Collins as the only true freshmen defensive linemen to start a game for Nebraska since freshmen regained eligibility in 1972. Collins started one game as a true freshman during the 2013 season, earning a start in the 2014 Gator Bowl.
- Lenhardt has made his presence known, particularly at Colorado. He recorded 2.0 sacks against the Buffs, becoming the first Husker true freshman with two sacks in a game since Barry Turner had two sacks at Baylor in 2005.
- Lenhardt is one of four true freshmen to see action on the defensive line. Princewill Umanmielen
 has made four tackles, Riley Van Poppel split a sack at Colorado, and Sua Lefotu recovered a
 fourth-quarter fumble against the Buffs.

SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED TO 'TOUGHEST' HUSKERS

In a tradition new to Nebraska but familiar to **Matt Rhule**, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the team's "toughest" players. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.

"I got really tired of having a guy in my program who had spent three years at like No. 47... wanted to wear No. 1 or No. 3, and he had earned it and we would give it to a recruit," Rhule said during the offseason. "What we decided was (numbers) 1-9, now 0-9, would go to the nine or now 10 'toughest' guys on the team. When I say 'toughest', we define that for the guys, but really the guys who best exemplify what it means to be a Cornhusker. To be accountable, to be dependable, to be tough, hard-working, competitive every single day."

The 10 players listed below were selected by their teammates to be worthy of having a single-digit number this season. In addition to the 10 players below, **Ethan Piper** was selected in the first round of team voting to earn a single-digit number, but NCAA rules prevent offensive linemen from wearing a single-digit number.

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 134th football season this fall, and the Huskers have historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- Nebraska ranks eighth in NCAA history with 913 wins and seventh with 53 all-time bowl game appearances.
- NU has won five national championships. The Huskers' four AP national titles (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fourth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.
- The success extends to the classroom as well. Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and NCAA Top 10 Award winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.

NEBRASKA FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME TO INDUCT 2023 CLASS

The Nebraska chapter of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame will induct the newest class of the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame this weekend in Lincoln. The class will officially be inducted during a Friday night dinner, and the group will be recognized on the field before Saturday's game. The class includes seven former Husker players, a former Nebraska head coach, a state college standout and two families who have supported Nebraska Athletics for decades.

The six players selected to the 2023 class by balloting of the Hall of Fame membership include defensive tackle **David Clark** (1980s category), linebacker **Troy Dumas** (1990s category), punter **Sam Koch** (2000-06 category), defensive end **Kyle Vanden Bosch** (2000-06 category), quarterback **Taylor Martinez** (2007-13 category) and offensive guard **Spencer Long** (2007-13 category).

The Nebraska Football Hall of Fame Board also selected a pair of former Huskers from the Legends category, including head coach W.C. "King" Cole and quarterback Leon G. Warner. The 2023 class of inductees also includes a state college representative in Dan Klepper, an All-America offensive guard for Nebraska-Omaha in the 1960s. In addition, the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame will present the Clarence E. Swanson Meritorious Service Award to the Lauritzen Family of Omaha, and the Lyell Bremser Special Merit Award to the Jim and Sharri Baldonado Family of Elwood, Neb.

Prior to 2015, players must have been either an All-American or first-team all-conference selection to make the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame ballot. Beginning in 2015, Huskers who earned second-team all-conference honors dating back to the expansion of the Big Eight to the Big 12 (1996) and now the 14-team Big Ten, are eligible.

FORMER HUSKER INDUCTEES

David Clark, Defensive Tackle, 1978-80—Clark had a standout senior season in 1980. The Texas, native had 40 tackles, including nine for loss as a senior, and also recovered two fumbles. He was a first-team All-Big Eight selection in 1980 and earned honorable-mention All-America honors.

Troy Dumas, Linebacker, 1991-94—Dumas was a four-year letterwinner for Coach Tom Osborne, highlighted by an outstanding senior season in 1994. Dumas played his first three seasons in the secondary, before moving to Sam linebacker as a senior when he had 69 tackles, four tackles for loss and seven quarterback hurries. Dumas helped Nebraska rank in the top 10 nationally in all four major defensive statistical categories and he earned first-team All-Big Eight honors for his play.

Sam Koch, Punter, 2003-05—The school record holder for season punting average, Koch was part of a long line of kicking standouts for the Huskers. The Seward native averaged 46.51 yards per punt in 2005 to earn first-team All-Big 12 honors and was named a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award. Koch averaged better than 44 yards per punt in his career to rank second in Nebraska history. He went on to a 16-year NFL career with the Baltimore Ravens.

Kyle Vanden Bosch, Defensive End, 1997-2000—Vanden Bosch played in 50 games in his career and had more than 140 tackles, including 34 TFL and 13 sacks. As a senior, Vanden Bosch had 17 tackles for loss and 26 quarterback hurries. He was a two-time second-team All-Big 12 selection and was a three-time Pro Bowl selection during a 12-year NFL career. Off the field, Vanden Bosch was the recipient of the National Football Foundation's Draddy Trophy, commonly referred to as the academic Heisman.

Taylor Martinez, Quarterback, 2010-13—A record-setting quarterback, Martinez led Nebraska to more than 30 wins as a starter. Martinez was a first-team All-Big Ten pick as a junior in 2012, when he set a Nebraska season record with 3,890 yards of total offense and accounted for 33 touchdowns. A two-time team captain, Martinez was a freshman All-American and Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year in 2010. Martinez finished his career with more than 10,000 yards of total offense.

Spencer Long, Offensive Guard, 2011-13—A three-year starter on the Husker offensive line, Long earned second-team All-America honors as a junior in 2012. With Long manning an offensive guard position, the Huskers ranked among the nation's top rushing offenses in each of his three seasons as a starter. A team captain as a senior, Long also distinguished himself in the classroom, earning first-team Academic All-America honors as a senior.

Legends Category

Coach W.C. "King" Cole, 1907-10—Cole led Nebraska to a 25-8-3 record in four seasons from 1907 to 1910. Cole guided the Huskers to their first two conference championships, winning the Missouri Valley Conference in 1907 and 1910.

Leon G. Warner, Quarterback, 1910-11—Warner guided Nebraska to the 1910 Missouri Valley Conference title as a quarterback. He was recognized as the top quarterback in the Missouri Valley and is often referred to as the school's first dual-threat quarterback.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS

Memorial Stadium celebrates its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Irag.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

2023 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska is scheduled to play three games against opponents ranked in the 2023 preseason AP poll. The Huskers take on Michigan (2nd) on Sept. 30, Wisconsin (19th) on Nov. 18 and Iowa (25th) on Nov. 24. NU played its first game against a ranked opponent at game time at then-No. 22 Colorado on Sept. 9.
- Nebraska plays a total of seven opponents who played in a bowl game in 2022.
- The Huskers opened the season with back-toback road games at Minnesota (Aug. 31) and Colorado (Sept. 9). Nebraska began a season with consecutive road games for the first time since 1995. Nebraska and Stanford were the only two Power Five programs to open the season with back-to-back road games.
- The Huskers will recognize the 100-year anniversary of Memorial Stadium against Northwestern on Oct. 21. The first game played in Memorial Stadium was a 24-0 shutout of Oklahoma on Oct. 13, 1923.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Matt Rhule is in his first season at Nebraska in 2023. Rhule is in his 11th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with a stint as head coach of the NFL's Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- In his last full season at the collegiate level in 2019, Rhule was named the Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Big 12 Coach of the Year after leading Baylor to appearances in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.
- Rhule built winning programs at Temple and Baylor. After laying the foundation in his first two seasons at each stop, Rhule guided both the Owls and Bears to a school-record win total in his third season, when both teams also played in the conference championship game.
- Seven Husker assistants previously coached on a Rhule staff: Marcus Satterfield (offensive coordinator), Ed Foley (special teams coordinator), E.J. Barthel (running backs), Evan Cooper (secondary/defensive pass game coordinator), Rob Dvoracek (linebackers), Terrance Knighton (defensive line) and Garret McGuire (wide receivers).
- Three Husker assistants are serving on a Rhule staff for the first time: Tony White (defensive coordinator), Josh Martin (tight ends) and Donovan Raiola (offensive line).
- Eight of Nebraska's 11 full-time coaches have experience coaching in the National Football League.

ROSTER NOTES

 Nebraska's roster features 137 players. A player's class reflects the fact that the 2020 season did not count as a year of eligibility.

- The roster features 73 returning players and 64 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of 14 starters and 36 letterwinners.
- NU added 20 transfers and 44 true freshmen since the end of the 2022 season. Among the 20 transfers are 15 FBS transfers, three junior college players and two Division II transfers.
- The Huskers added 14 transfers from Power Five programs, including: Florida (3), Georgia (3), Arizona State (1), Baylor (1), Georgia Tech (1), Notre Dame (1), Ole Miss (1), Texas A&M (1), Utah (1) and Virginia (1).
- The roster features players from 28 states and two foreign countries (Canada & Germany).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the roster include: Nebraska (52), Texas (11), Georgia (9), Iowa (6), California (5), Florida (5), Arizona (4), New Jersey (4), Pennsylvania (4), Michigan (3), Minnesota (3), Missouri (3), South Dakota (3), Tennessee (3), Colorado (2), Illinois (2), Kansas (2), Louisiana (2), New York (2) and Virginia (2).
- The states of Alabama, Hawaii, Maryland, Mississippi, Montana, Oklahoma, Utah and Washington are each represented with one player on Nebraska's 2023 roster.
- The players wearing a single-digit jersey number (0-9) earned the right to wear that number through a team vote. Offensive lineman Ethan Piper was also selected to wear a single-digit number, but NCAA rules prohibited him from wearing a single-digit number.
- Alex (WR) and John Bullock (LB) were the first brothers to start the same game at Nebraska since 2019. They are the first brothers to start a game on the opposite side of the ball for the Huskers since 1987.

ACADEMIC NOTES

 A total of 16 Huskers are playing the 2023 season as graduates, including players who earned their degree at another institution before transferring to Nebraska.

SCOUTING THE LOUISIANA TECH BULLDOGS



Louisiana Tech has split its first four games of the season after falling 40-37 in a high-scoring affair against non-conference foe North Texas last weekend.

The Bulldogs enter Saturday averaging 406.5 yards per game, with 225.5 yards per game through the air and 181.0 yards per game on the ground. Hank Bachmeier has completed 70-of-106 passes for 756 yards, five touchdowns and a pair of interceptions. Smoke Harris has 24 receptions for 288 yards and three touchdowns, followed by Cyrus Allen with 11 grabs for 144 yards and a

Sonny Cumbie is in his second season as the head coach at Louisiana Tech.

Cumbie joined the Bulldogs in 2022 after serving one season at the offensive coordinator and interim head coach at Texas Tech in 2021. In his first season at the helm of the LA Tech program, Cumbie led the Bulldogs to a 3-9 overall record and posted wins over Stephen F. Austin, UTEP and Middle Tennessee.

Prior to his one-year gig at Texas Tech, Cumbie was the offensive coordinator at TCU from 2014 to 2020. Cumbie began his coaching career in the college ranks as a graduate assistant at Texas Tech in 2009, before becoming an assistant coach with the Red Raiders in 2010 and offensive coordinator in 2013.

Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

Over his last five collegiate seasons before taking the Nebraska job (2015-19), Rhule won one conference title, three division titles and produced three seasons with double-digit wins.

TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016. He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 124-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 87-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Five program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons.
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, the Bears' second-highest final ranking since 1951.



SCOPE

Minneapolis (Aug. 31) Nebraska's defense provided an outstanding effort, but a 47-yard walk-off field goal by Minnesota's Dragan Kesich lifted the Golden Gophers to a 13-10 victory over the Huskers.

Minnesota capitalized on a pair of Nebraska turnovers in the final five minutes after the Huskers built a 10-3 lead and had the ball near midfield late in the fourth quarter.

Nebraska finished the night with 181 rushing yards and 114 passing yards, while holding the Gophers to just 55 on the ground and 196 through the air. A 4-1 turnover edge by the Gophers was enough to doom the Big Red.

Quarterback Jeff Sims finished the night 11-of-19 through the air for 114 yards, while adding a team-best 91 rushing yards on 19 carries. Alex Bullock led the Husker receivers with three receptions for 56 yards and a touchdown.

DeShon Singleton and Omar Brown led a gritty Blackshirt defensive effort with seven tackles apiece, while Brown added an interception. Nash Hutmacher, Blaise Gunnerson and Luke Reimer all contributed sacks for the Husker defense that allowed just 251 yards.

The decisive turnover came with less than one minute left and Nebraska moving the ball in hopes of a walk-off score of its own. A Sims pass over the middle intended for Nate Boerkircher was intercepted by Minnesota's Tyler Nuben - his second of the game - at the Gopher 35 with 58 seconds remaining. Minnesota then moved the ball quickly to the Nebraska 35, hoping to push the ball a few yards closer for the strong leg of Kesich. But the Gophers were flagged for a false start to set up 3rd-and-13 at the NU 40 with 17 seconds left. The Gophers overcame the mistake with an 11-yard run by Sean Tyler to set up Kesich's 47-yard field goal as time expired.

The whole exchange may have been impossible had the Big Red not suffered a lost fumble from Anthony Grant with 4:53 left that was forced by Justin Walley and recovered by Aidan Gousby at the Minnesota 47. Just over two minutes later, UM quarterback Athan Kaliakmanos kept Minnesota's hopes alive by connecting with Daniel Jackson on a 13-yard touchdown on 4th-and-10 with 2:32 remaining in the game. Kaliakmanis finished the night 24-of-44 passing for 196 yards with one touchdown and one interception while being sacked three times. Jackson led the Gopher receivers with nine receptions for 68 yards.

In a low-scoring Big Ten slugfest, Nebraska scored its first touchdown of the season on back-to-back huge plays to open the second half. Rahmir Johnson opened the second half with a 63-yard kickoff return. On the first play from scrimmage, Sims pitched the ball to the right to Grant, who threw a lateral back to Sims in the left flat that bounded to the turf. Sims gave chase, gathered the ball and threw deep for a 34-yard touchdown to Alex Bullock , who was standing alone in the end zone.

Nebraska's defense continued to play lights out for the rest of the quarter, including a crucial interception by cornerback Omar Brown late in the period after the Golden Gophers threatened the Husker red zone.

The Big Red moved the ball effectively late in the period and took the 7-3 edge to fourth quarter after penetrating the Minnesota red zone. The Huskers pushed inside the Gopher 5 but could not punch it in the end zone. Alvano came on to boot the first field goal of his career, connecting from 27 yards with 12:42 left to extend NU's edge to 10-3.

Boulder, Colo. (Sept. 9) - Nebraska got a third-quarter touchdown by Jeff Sims to pull within 13-7, but the Huskers were unable to get any closer as No. 22 Colorado pulled away for a 36-14 victory.

Sims capped a 66-yard drive with a career-long 57-yard sprint to paydirt to pull the Big Red within six with 9:50 remaining in the third quarter.

The rest of the second half belonged to Colorado, as the Buffaloes put up 23 unanswered points before Nebraska scored in the final seconds.

Colorado quarterback Shedeur Sanders connected on 31-of-42 passes for 393 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for another. Xavier Weaver led the CU receiving corps with 10 grabs for 170 yards and a score that extended CU's advantage to 20-7 midway through the third quarter.

The Huskers managed 341 total yards, including 119 passing and 222 rushing, while the Buffaloes had 468 total yards, including 396 through the air, and took advantage of four Husker turnovers that led to 17 CU points.

Colorado capitalized on back-to-back turnovers to break a scoreless tie and take a 13-0 lead into the locker room. A fumbled snap gave CU the ball at the NU 25-yard line before settling for a Jace Feely 31-yard field goal. On the next possession, Sims was picked off and CU turned that miscue into a touchdown, as Sanders found Tar'Varish Dawson on a 30-yard pass on the Buffs' next play from scrimmage. After a Husker punt, Feely's 32-yard field goal capped a six-play 50-yard drive in the final seconds of the first half.

Sims completed 9-of-15 passes for 106 yards and an interception, while Heinrich Haarberg completed 2-of-6 attempts for 13 yards and a score for Nebraska. Billy Kemp IV was Nebraska's top target, hauling in five catches for 57 yards. Gabe Ervin Jr. led the NU ground game with a career-high 74 yards on 17 carries. Sims added 67 yards on 10 attempts with a score, while Rahmir Johnson contributed 66 yards on 11 totes.

After Sims' score, Colorado responded by going 75 yards in 10 plays capped by Weaver's 12-yard touchdown catch after his 41-yard catch and run on third down set up the score. The Buffaloes tacked on a field goal and a pair of touchdowns to grow the lead to 29, before Haarberg threw a 4-yard pass for Travis Fidone II on the final play from scrimmage.

Nebraska had eight sacks – the most by Nebraska since 2009 in the losing effort, including two apiece from Nick Henrich and Cameron Lenhardt.

Lincoln (Sept. 16) -The Blackshirts put up an impressive defensive performance, while quarterback Heinrich Haarberg guided the Huskers effectively in his first career start as Nebraska picked up its first win under Matt Rhule with a 35-11 victory over Northern Illinois in the home opener at Memorial Stadium.

Haarberg, making the start as Jeff Sims was out with an injury, finished with 256 total yards to guide a Husker attack that rolled up 382 yards of total offense. Haarberg completed 14-of-24 passes for 158 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for 98 yards and a score on 21 carries.

The Blackshirts were dominant, holding Northern Illinois to just 26 rushing yards, while limiting NIU starting quarterback Rocky Lombardi to 11-for-28 passing for 73 yards and an interception. Nebraska, which notched its first win of the season, held Northern Illinois to just 149 total yards in a dominant defensive performance, as the Huskies were held without a touchdown until the final seconds of the game.

The Huskers scored on their first possession, going 55 yards in six plays as Haarberg connected with Billy Kemp IV on a 10-yard touchdown strike to put the Huskers up 7-0 with 9:39 left in the first quarter.

Northern Illinois had an early opportunity to tie the game, getting the ball first-and-goal at the NU 5-yard line following a sack and fumble by Haarberg. The Blackshirts stood tall and got a nine-yard sack on third down to force a 30-yard field goal from Jake Seibert.

Nebraska continued to lead 7-3 until late in the second quarter, when the Huskers took advantage of a short field that was created by a stout Husker defense and a low snap that was momentarily mishandled in the end zone by NIU's punter. Nebraska needed only four plays to go 36 yards, as Haarberg found Thomas Fidone II for a 16-yard scoring strike to extend the lead to 14-3. Fidone finished with team highs of four receptions for 42 yards in the game.

Nebraska used its best drive of the night to extend the lead to 21-3 late in the third quarter. NU marched 76 yards on 14 plays before Gabe Ervin Jr. scored from three-yards out with 1:00 left in the third period. The sophomore running back finished with 14 carries for 67 yards on the night.

Haarberg led another sustained drive in the fourth quarter, moving the Big Red 65 yards in nine plays capped by his own 20-yard touchdown run to put the Huskers up 28-3 with 8:19 left. Javin Wright's interception set up NU's last score, as Anthony Grant scampered 11 yards to paydirt to wrap up a 35-yard drive in five plays to make it 35-3 with 3:23 remaining.

NIU was held under 100 total yards until an 11-play, 75-yard drive in the final minutes culminated in a Chris Carter four-yard touchdown reception from Ethan Hampton with four seconds remaining.
