Iowa State Postgame Notes

Bret Meyer started his 41st straight game at quarterback, a national best among active signal callers. Second on the list before today's games was Washington State's Alex Brink with 32 straight starts.

Tailback Jason Scales made his first start of the season. It was his first start since the Kansas State game last season. This second quarter touchdown was his first since the game in Manhattan last season. He rushed for a career-high 115 yards. His previous high was 67, also at Kansas State last season.

With Scales' 115 rushing yards, the Cyclones have now had three games with a 100-yard rusher this season. The last time ISU had three games with a 100-yard rusher was in 2005.

Scales' 115 yards also marked the 16th time a Cyclone has rushed for over 100 yards against the Huskers, and the first time since Michael Wagner ran for 107 yards vs. NU on Sept. 28, 2002. It was just the eighth time an ISU player has rushed for 115 yards or more against Nebraska.

Chris Singleton's first quarter interception was his second of the season and the fourth of his career.

Bret Culbertson's 30-yard field goal in the first quarter was his sixth FG of the season. He is now 6-11 this season and 27-of-32 in his career inside 40 yards. Culbertson's pair of PATs makes him 84-84 for his career.

Todd Blythe made five receptions for a season-high 84 yards. The last time Blythe had more than 80 receiving yards in a game was last season against Nebraska when he had six catches for 96 yards. He now has 2,608 career receiving yards, putting him 82 yards behind all-time ISU leader Lane Danielsen who had 2,690 between 2000-03.

In his career against Nebraska, Blythe tallied 22 receptions for 419 yards and two TDs.

In his career against Nebraska, Bret Meyer completed 84 passes for 1,205 yards and one touchdown.
