Mike Riley will coach his first game as Nebraska's head coach on Saturday. Riley is the 29th head coach in Husker history. Nebraska coaches are 20-7-1 in their first game, including 5-0 since 1962.

Nebraska has won its season opener for 29 consecutive years dating back to 1986. The streak is the longest in the nation, four longer than Florida (25).

Nebraska plays 11 consecutive games without a bye to start the season. The Huskers are one of only 12 FBS teams who will play 11 or more consecutive weeks without a bye in 2015.

THE MATCHUP

Nebraska opens the 2015 season on Saturday afternoon with an intersectional matchup against BYU at Memorial Stadium. The game is set for a national television audience on ABC, with kickoff set for shortly after 2:30 p.m. CT.

The game will mark the Cornhuskers' debut under head coach Mike Riley. While Riley is new to Lincoln, he is a proven winner in the coaching profession. Before taking over at Nebraska, Riley spent the previous 12 seasons at Oregon State.

Riley will guide a Nebraska team that returns 16 starters from a team that finished 9-4 in 2014. Nebraska will also be looking to win its season opener for the 30th consecutive season, a streak that leads the nation.

BYU finished the 2014 campaign with an 8-5 record, but was a perfect 3-0 against Power Five opponents, including victories at Texas and California. The Cougars are one of 10 programs in the country to have appeared in a bowl game each of the past 10 seasons.

Saturday's game will mark the first-ever meeting between the two schools, which rank first and fifth, respectively, in victories in the past 40 seasons. Saturday's game will also be the 341st consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium.

- Nebraska football is the only team in any sport in NCAA history to total 100 athletic and academic All-Americans.
- Memorial Stadium has been sold out every game since Nov. 2, 1962, a streak of 341 consecutive sellouts.

GENERAL POLICIES

All player and coach interviews must be arranged at least one day in advance through the Nebraska Communications Office. Contact Keith Mann, Shamus McKnight or Matt Smith. All post-practice interviews will be conducted at the practice site. Interviews will not be conducted in the weight room, Student Life Complex, training room, hallways or the tunnel leading from the locker room to the field. The Nebraska locker room, training room and football office meeting rooms are **OFF-LIMITS** to the media. When arriving for post-practice interviews, media should wait in the Hawks Center lobby, or access Memorial Stadium through Gate 11 entrance if practice is in the stadium.

Requested players are available (depending on class schedules) at the Monday press conferences (11:30 a.m.-1 p.m.) and after practice on the field on Monday (defense) and Tuesday (offense). Players cell phone numbers will **NOT** be given to the media.

Practices are **CLOSED** to the media and to the general public during the season. Media will be allowed to shoot photos/video at the start of practice on Tuesdays (app. 15 minutes). A Communications representative will be on hand during the open portion of practice.

After all games, Nebraska's locker room is closed. Head Coach Mike Riley, coordinators and requested players will be brought to the postgame interview room after a 10-minute cooling off period. At home, the postgame interview room is located in the strength complex of the Osborne Athletic Complex. Media are asked to wait to set up equipment until the conclusion of halftime. On the road, Coach Riley, assistant coaches and requested players will be brought to the designated interview area. Please note, **NO INTERVIEWS** will be conducted on the field as the players are returning to the locker room.

2015 SEASON NOTEBOOK

- Nebraska has won at least nine games each of the past seven seasons, joining Alabama and Oregon as the only programs with seven straight nine-win seasons. The Huskers have not posted eight consecutive nine-win seasons since their NCAA-record streak of 33 straight nine-win seasons from 1969 to 2001.
- The 2015 season marks the 20th anniversary of Nebraska's 1995 national championship. The Huskers completed back-to-back national titles with a 12-0 record in 1995, including four victories over teams that ended the year ranked in the top 10.
- The 1994 and 1995 Husker teams are the last teams to win back-to-back national championships with undefeated seasons.
- 2015 will be remembered as a Hall of Fame year for Nebraska as two Huskers were inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in July and one will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in December.
- Will Shields and Mick Tinglehoff were both inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame this summer, marking only the fifth time two players from the same college were inducted in the same hall-of-fame class.
- Trev Alberts will become the 17th former Husker to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame when he is enshrined in December.

ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska features a 136-player roster in 2015. Unofficially, only Navy (184) and Army (145) carry larger rosters than the Huskers.
- The Husker roster features players from 26 states as well as Canada. There are 60 native Nebraskans on the squad, followed by 11 Texas natives and seven players from both California and Florida.
- Nebraska features 58 freshmen and 80 underclassmen on its 136-player roster.
- Six Huskers will serve as captains for the 2015 season. The group includes three players on offense (quarterback **Tommy Armstrong Jr.**, offensive tackle **Alex Lewis** and wide receiver **Jordan Westerkamp**) and three Blackshirts (defensive tackle **Maliek Collins**, defensive end **Jack Gangwish** and safety **Nate Gerry**).
- **Alex Lewis** joins his father Bill as a Nebraska captain. Bill Lewis was a captain and an All-America center on Nebraska's 1985 team. The Lewis family is only the third family to have a father-son duo named as Nebraska team captains. Tom Ruud and sons Barrett and Bo served as captains, as did Dean Steinkuhler and his sons, Ty and Baker.
- Of Nebraska's 10 full-time coaches, only Brian Stewart (0-2 with Missouri in 1996 and 2000) and Keith Williams (0-1 with Fresno State in 2011) had coached a game inside Memorial Stadium prior to the 2015 season.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska will face eight teams that played in a bowl game last season.
- The Huskers will play their first 11 games of the 2015 season without a bye. Nebraska is one of only 12 teams in the FBS ranks to play 11 or more consecutive weeks. Colorado and Hawaii will play 13 consecutive weeks, while Arizona, Florida International, North Texas and Massachusetts play 12 straight weeks.
- Nebraska is among a group of six schools who play 11 straight games without a bye in 2015.
- Nebraska's game at Miami will be its first regular-season game in the Sunshine State since a road game against the Hurricanes in 1951. Nebraska has played 22 bowl games in Florida, including 17 Orange Bowls.
- Nebraska will face Illinois on the road for the first time as Big Ten Conference foes on Oct. 3, while the Huskers will make their first-ever trip to Rutgers on Nov. 14.

STATISTICAL NOTES

- Nebraska has ranked in the top 20 nationally and averaged at least 200 rushing yards per game in each of the past five seasons dating back to 2010.
- A Husker has rushed for 1,000 yards in each of the past six seasons. Only once in school history (1979-85) has NU produced a 1,000-yard rusher in seven consecutive seasons.
- Nebraska's streak of having a 1,000-yard rusher in six straight seasons is the second-longest among Big Ten teams. Wisconsin has had a 1,000-yard rusher each of the last 10 years, while no other Big Ten team has produced more than three consecutive seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher.

ACADEMIC NOTES

- Six Huskers are playing this season as graduate students. **Kevin Williams** (August, 2014), **Jamal Turner** (December, 2014), **Givens Price**, **Matt Finnin** and **Taariq Allen** (May, 2015) and **Alex Lewis** (August, 2015) have all earned their degrees.
- Eleven additional members of the senior class are expected to pick up their undergraduate degrees in December. In 2014, every active Husker senior had earned his degree prior to Nebraska's appearance in the Holiday Bowl.
- Nebraska was 1 of 14 FBS programs to earn Public Recognition for high achievement in the most recent Academic Progress Rate, ranking in the top 10 percent nationally. The Huskers have earned recognition for their APR success in each of the past two seasons.
- Husker football players have combined for 107 CoSIDA Academic All-America awards. Nebraska football has produced more academic All-Americans than any other sport in NCAA history, while Nebraska leads the nation with 320 academic All-Americans across all sports.

RILEY TO MAKE DEBUT AS NEBRASKA HEAD COACH

The matchup with BYU marks Mike Riley's debut as Nebraska head coach. A 41-year coaching veteran, Riley is in his 24th season overall as a head coach and his 15th year as a college head coach.

- Only five FBS head coaches have more experience as a head coach.
- Riley has a 93-80 career record as a college head coach, all at Oregon State.
- Riley is the 29th head coach in Nebraska history. The previous 28 head coaches have combined for a 20-7-1 record in their Cornhusker debut, and each of the past five NU head coaches have won their first game on the NU sideline.

HUSKERS LOOK TO ADD TO SEASON-OPENING WIN STREAK

Nebraska will look to extend its streak of winning its season opener to 30 straight years when the Huskers take on BYU. A 55-7 win over Florida Atlantic in the 2014 season opener extended NU's win streak to 29 straight games, dating back to a 1985 loss to Florida State.

- The season-opening win streak leads the nation, bettering Florida's 25 straight season-opening wins.
- Nebraska has scored at least 40 points in 21 of the past 29 season openers, while limiting the opposition to 14 points or less 19 times.

FIRST-TIME OPPONENTS

Nebraska will open the season with a pair of first-time opponents in BYU and South Alabama. Nebraska last opened the season with a first-time opponent in 2011 when the Huskers defeated Chattanooga. NU met an opponent for the first time in a season opener five straight years from 2007 to 2011.

The 2011 campaign also marks the most recent season the Huskers faced a pair of first-time foes to open a season, as Nebraska defeated Chattanooga and Fresno State in its first-ever meetings with the schools.

HUSKERS FACE RARE MATCHUP WITH INDEPENDENT

The contest with BYU marks the Huskers' first game against an FBS Independent since playing Troy in Lincoln in 2003. The Huskers have since played 50 non-conference opponents without facing an FBS Independent.

HUSKERS HIGHLIGHTED ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Several Nebraska players were included on preseason watch lists for national awards. Sophomore punt returner/receiver **De'Mornay Pierson-El** was named a preseason All-America punt returner. He was also one of 11 players on the Big Ten Players to Watch list, along with junior defensive tackle **Maliek Collins**.

RILEY & STAFF BRING DIVERSE OFFENSIVE ATTACK TO LINCOLN

Head Coach Mike Riley has a long history of offensive success in his previous coaching stops. Riley's offenses have shown the ability to attack defenses both on the ground and through the air.

- In 2003, Oregon State was the first team in NCAA FBS history to have a 4,000-yard passer (Derek Anderson), a 1,500-yard rusher (Steven Jackson) and two 1,000-yard receivers (James Newson and Mike Hass).
- The 2003 Beaver offense was the first offense in the history of the Pac-12 conference to accumulate 6,000 yards of total offense in a season.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS

Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University. The quota was over subscribed.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 250 victories as Nebraska's head coach.

INJURY SIDELINES PIERSON-EL FOR START OF SEASON

Nebraska battled its share of injuries during fall camp, with the receiver position hit hardest during the month of August.

Sophomore receiver **De'Mornay Pierson-El** suffered a foot injury in mid-August that will sideline him for six to eight weeks. Pierson-El led the nation in 2014 with three punt return touchdowns and is expected to be a key offensive weapon when he returns to action.

- True freshman receiver **Lavan Alston** suffered a knee injury that required season-ending surgery.
- Senior receiver **Sam Burtch** missed most of fall camp after arthroscopic surgery on his knee.
- Junior tight end **Trey Foster** is questionable for the BYU game with an ankle injury.

HUSKERS LOOK TO KEEP RUNNING GAME MOVING IN 2015

Nebraska has had one of the nation's most consistent running games over the past several years, and Riley and his staff will look to continue the ground success this fall.

- Nebraska has ranked in the top 20 nationally in rushing each of the past five seasons, while also averaging better than 200 yards per game on the ground each year in that stretch.
- In 2014, Nebraska averaged 240.2 rushing yards per game to rank 17th nationally and fourth in the Big Ten in that category.
- Nebraska led the Big Ten in rushing in 2012, while leading the Big 12 in rushing yards per game in 2010.
- With Ameer Abdullah posting 1,611 rushing yards in 2014, Nebraska has had a 1,000-yard rusher each of the past six seasons. That is the longest stretch for NU since the Huskers had at least one 1,000-yard rusher in a school-record seven straight seasons from 1979 to 1985.

- **Alex Lewis** joins his father in having been elected as a Nebraska team captain. Bill Lewis was a Husker captain in 1985, when he earned All-America honors at center. The Lewis family is the third family to have a father-son duo named as Nebraska team captains. Tom Ruud and sons Barrett and Bo served as captains, as did Dean Steinkuhler and his sons, Ty and Baker.
- **Jordan Westerkamp's** selection marks the third straight year a receiver has served as captain.
- **Jack Gangwish** continues a long line of Nebraska natives and walk-ons who have served as Nebraska captains. His selection marks the 10th straight year a Nebraska native has been named a team captain. Gangwish is the second player in three seasons to become a captain after arriving in the program as a walk-on, joining offensive lineman Spencer Long (2013).

FIRST NEBRASKA ALL-SPORTS HALL OF FAME CLASS TO BE HONORED

Nebraska will induct the inaugural class of the University of Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame as part of the opening weekend. An induction ceremony will be held on Friday and the group will be honored at halftime of Saturday's game.

The creation of the University of Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame serves to honor Husker Athletics programs and student-athletes who have won 26 team national championships, captured 156 individual NCAA titles and lead the nation with 320 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans and 17 NCAA Top 10 Award winners.

The inaugural class includes one inductee from every current Nebraska sport, plus an honoree from the men's swimming program, which was a varsity sport from 1921 to 2001.

As the football honoree, Rimington will be on hand at Saturday's game. The only two-time Outland Trophy winner in NCAA history, Rimington is one of just 11 players to win the Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award in the same season (1982). Rimington is the namesake for the award for the nation's most outstanding center and is also one of the namesakes for the Big Ten's Lineman of the Year award.

Rimington is also a member of the College Football Hall of Fame and CoSIDA Academic All-America Hall of Fame.

TOMMY ARMSTRONG JR. SET FOR THIRD SEASON UNDER CENTER

Junior quarterback **Tommy Armstrong Jr.** has guided the Nebraska offense for the majority of the past two seasons. The Cibolo, Texas, native has a 16-5 record as the Husker starter, including starting all 13 games in 2014.

Armstrong passed for 2,695 yards and 22 touchdowns, while rushing for 705 yards and six touchdowns in 2014. He accounted for 3,400 yards of total offense, the third-best total in NU history. His 261.5 yards of total offense per game ranked second in the Big Ten and 35th nationally. Armstrong also ranked eighth nationally by averaging 14.65 yards per completion.

- Armstrong's 2,695 passing yards were the fourth-most in a single season in Nebraska history and a record for an NU sophomore.
- His 3,400 yards of total offense were also a sophomore school record and the third-highest single-season total in school history.
- The 22 passing touchdowns in 2014 were the fourth-most in school history. Armstrong threw for seven touchdowns in the final two games of the 2014 season.
- Armstrong set Nebraska bowl records for attempts (51), completions (32), passing yards (381) and total offense yards (422) in the Holiday Bowl against USC.
- Armstrong has 3,661 career passing yards to rank seventh in school history. Entering 2015, he is in position to become just the fifth quarterback in school history with 5,000 passing yards.
- Armstrong has 4,568 career total offensive yards, putting him within 212 yards of the top 10 on the NU career chart.
- With 907 career rushing yards, Armstrong is 93 rushing yards from becoming the 10th quarterback in school history with 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Armstrong is one of only two quarterbacks in school history to start 20 games or more before the end of their sophomore season, joining Taylor Martinez.
- Beginning with the opener against BYU, Armstrong will look to match his fast start from 2014. A year ago, Armstrong topped 300 yards of total offense in each of the first three games in 2014 and was the first NU quarterback to top 300 yards of total offense in three straight games since 2008.

WESTERKAMP LOOKS TO BUILD ON FIRST TWO SEASONS

Junior receiver **Jordan Westerkamp** is the leader of the Husker receiving corps and one of six team captains for 2015. Westerkamp has had a productive first two years in the Husker program, putting him in a position to make a strong impression on the NU record book.

- Westerkamp caught 44 passes last season, ranking just outside of the Nebraska single-season top 10 in receptions.
- Westerkamp has 64 career receptions to rank in a tie for 23rd on the NU career receptions list. He is 27 catches from cracking the top 10 on the NU career catches list.
- Westerkamp averaged 17.0 yards per catch last season, racking up 747 receiving yards on his 44 receptions. The 747 yards were the 11th-best season total in school history.
- His career average of 16.1 yards per reception ranks among the top five in school history for players with at least 60 receptions.
- Westerkamp enters his junior season with 1,030 career receiving yards, ranking as one of 23 players in school history with better than 1,000 receiving yards. He is less than 350 yards from reaching the top 10 on the NU career yardage list.

NEBRASKA AMONG HISTORICALLY BEST PROGRAMS

Nebraska enters its 126th season of college football in 2015 and owns an 874-361-40 all-time record in 1,275 games (.701).

Nebraska is one of 10 programs with 800 all-time victories. The Huskers' 874 all-time victories rank fourth nationally.

Since 1970, the year of the Huskers' first national title, Nebraska has compiled a 440-120-5 record, for a .783 winning percentage in 565 games. NU's 440 wins in that time period are 25 more than any other school.

- Nebraska ranks as the nation's winningest program over the last 30, 40, 50 and 60 years. The Huskers have won 26 more games than any other team in the country over the last 50 years.

NCAA RECORD SELLOUT STREAK CONTINUES INTO 2015

One of the most remarkable streaks in collegiate sports continues in 2015. Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, and the game with BYU will be the 341st consecutive sellout in Lincoln.

NU celebrated the 300th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 26, 2009, against Louisiana-Lafayette. Notre Dame is second in all-time consecutive sellouts with 243, 98 fewer than the Huskers.

Nebraska established a stadium record for attendance against Miami on Sept. 20, 2014, with a crowd of 91,585. The crowd ranked as the 10th-largest to see any Nebraska game.

NEBRASKA RANKS AMONG NATION'S ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Nebraska was 10th in average home attendance in 2014 with 91,249 fans per game. The average attendance for seven home games was the largest ever at Memorial Stadium, bettering the 2013 mark of 90,933 per game.

The No. 10 ranking in average attendance marked the second straight year Nebraska was in the top 10 nationally in attendance. The Huskers checked in at No. 9 in 2013, the highest for Nebraska since full attendance figures are available beginning with the 1999 season. NU has ranked in the top 20 nationally in attendance each of the 16 years with available attendance figures.


Nebraska was one of four Big Ten schools to rank in the top 10 in average attendance and the conference had seven teams in the top 25 nationally in attendance.

HUSKERS OWN BIG ADVANTAGE AT MEMORIAL STADIUM

Nebraska has rewarded the loyalty of its fans with great success at Memorial Stadium through the years.

- Nebraska has won at least six home games in 23 of the past 29 seasons. NU is 159-24 (.869) at home in the last 26 seasons (since 1989).
- Nebraska's most recent perfect home season occurred in 2012.
- The Huskers are 12-4 in Big Ten home games since joining the league in 2011.
- In the past three decades, NU has had three home winning streaks of 20 or more games and overall has posted 41 unbeaten and untied home seasons.
- The Huskers are 528-143-20 (.779, 691 games, 125 years) in Lincoln, and 403-120-13 (.764, 536 games, 91 years) in Memorial Stadium (since 1923).
- The 2014 season marked the 46th straight year NU had a winning home season.

- The Huskers have played in the postseason in 44 of the past 46 seasons.
- Nebraska appeared in an NCAA-record 35 straight bowl games from 1969 to 2003.
