

Nebraska Post-Game Notes

Nebraska vs. Iowa, Nov. 29, 2019, Memorial Stadium, Lincoln, Neb.

- Nebraska dropped its fifth straight game in the Heroes matchup with Iowa. Following today's game, the Huskers own a 29-18-3 all-time record in the series.
- Today's game marked the 375th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium. The sellout streak now spans 57 years after beginning in November of 1962.
- Nebraska scored 24 points in today's game, matching the most against Iowa this season, tying the 24 points scored by Wisconsin.
- Junior receiver **JD Spielman** caught three passes for 34 yards in the game, including a 39-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. With his three receptions, Spielman increased his career total to 170 moving him into third in school history and 19 shy of Stanley Morgan Jr.'s school-record 189 career receptions.
- Spielman increased his career receiving yardage total to 2,546, moving him within 201 yards of Morgan's career record of 2,747 receiving yards. He increased his season receiving yardage total to 898 yards putting him in sixth place on the Nebraska single-season yardage list.
- Spielman's touchdown reception was his fifth of the season and the 15th of his career, moving him into a tie for eight on the Nebraska career TD reception list.
- Junior running back **Dedrick Mills** rushed 24 times for 94 yards, including 19 carries for 74 yards in the second half. Mills has averaged 116.3 rushing yards over the past three games.
- Martinez accounted for 94 yards of total offense, including 50 passing yards and 44 rushing yards. Martinez increased his career total to 5,828, and moved to fourth place on the Nebraska career chart, passing Zac Taylor (5,777) in today's game.
- Sophomore defensive back **Cam Taylor-Britt** had a 38-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter, marking his third interception of the season, tying him for the team lead.
- The pick-six was Nebraska's second of the season, after Eric Lee Jr. had an interception return for a touchdown against South Alabama in the season opener. Nebraska has three defensive touchdowns this season, also returning a fumble for a touchdown against South Alabama.
- Senior linebacker **Mohamed Barry** tied for the team lead with six tackles in today's game to increase his career total to 245, moving him into a tie with Mike Knox (1981-1985) for 15th on the Nebraska career tackles chart.
- Senior **Wyatt Mazour** had a nine-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, marking his first touchdown on the 2019 season and the second of his career.
- Iowa had 18 plays for 191 yards in the first quarter, and tallied just 131 yards on 38 plays for the remainder of the game. Iowa gained 11 yards in the second quarter and just seven yards in the third quarter.
- Nebraska entered today's game ranked 22nd nationally in fewest penalty yards per game and committed just three penalties for 25 yards in today's game.
