All-Time Series: UCLA trails, 6-7

Saturday marks the fourth UCLA-Nebraska matchup on the gridiron since 2012 (UCLA is 2-1 in those games)

### THE MATCHUP

The UCLA football team (2-5, 1-4 Big Ten) will face Nebraska (5-3, 2-3 Big Ten) at Memorial Stadium on Saturday, Nov. 2, beginning at 12:30 p.m. PT. The 14th meeting between the Bruins and Huskers, and first in Lincoln, Neb. since 2013, will be televised by the Big Ten Network. The UCLA Sports Network will broadcast the contest, which will also be aired over SiriusXM.

The Bruins most recently defeated Rutgers, 35-32, in Piscataway, N.J. for their first Big Ten Conference win two weeks ago on Oct. 19 behind a career performance by quarterback Ethan Garbers. The redshirt senior captain was awarded Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after logging career highs in passing yards (383), passing touchdowns (four), and completion percentage (32-38, 84%). Garbers also completed the longest pass of his career (67 yards) and made the longest rush of his career (49 yards), both for touchdowns. He dialed up touchdown passes to four different receivers: WR Logan Loya and RBs Keegan Jones, T.J. Harden and Jalen Berger. Defensively, linebacker Carson Schwesinger logged a team-leading 10 tackles for his fifth straight game with double-digit tackles. Schwesinger is the first Bruin to accomplish that feat since Eric Kendricks in 2014 who went on to win The Butkus Award that season.

UCLA's last trip to Lincoln in September 2013 was an emotional one resulting in a 41-21 comeback victory a week after Bruin receiver Nick Pasquale was tragically killed in a car accident. Quarterback Brett Hundley threw three touchdown passes while No. 16 UCLA wiped out an 18-point deficit to defeat No. 23 Nebraska and stun a record crowd of 91,471. The Nebraska fan base honored Pasquale with a moment of silence, No. 36 helmet stickers and the Huskers' students released 200 blue and gold balloons in honor of Pasquale. UCLA continues to celebrate the life and legacy of Pasquale, a former walk-on, by awarding the No. 36 to a walk-on who resembles Pasquale's passion for the game and limitless determination.

It is a year of change for UCLA football, as head coach DeShaun Foster took the reins at his alma mater Feb. 12, 2024. A member of the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame for his prowess in the Bruin offensive backfield from 1998-2001, Foster spent seven seasons in the National Football League. He piled up more than 4,500 total yards and 16 touchdowns, including a 33-yard scoring dash in Super Bowl XXXVIII as a member of the Carolina Panthers. Foster spent the previous 11 seasons — including 10 at UCLA — in the collegiate coaching ranks before being promoted from associate head coach and running backs coach.

### UCLA OFFICIALLY JOINS BIG TEN CONFERENCE

UCLA officially joined the Big Ten Conference Aug. 2, ushering in a new era in the Bruins' storied and illustrious athletic tradition. UCLA, along with previous conference foes Oregon, USC and Washington, have moved to an 18-team Big Ten Conference with a footprint spanning from the Pacific to the Atlantic. UCLA's membership in the Big Ten Conference was initially announced on June 30, 2022.

"The day has finally come," said Martin Jarmond, The Alice and Nahum Lainer Family Director of Athletics. "After two years of planning and preparation, UCLA is proud and excited to join the Big Ten Conference. I am grateful for the energy and effort that has been put into shaping this pivotal move by our hard-working staff members, as well as our coaches and student-athletes. The investments we have made into our programs and student-athletes over the past 24 months have set us up to continue to compete at the elite level that defines UCLA Athletics."

## QUICK HITS

- QB Ethan Garbers was awarded UCLA's first-ever Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week award after leading the Bruins to their first conference win in a 35-32 decision at Rutgers (Oct. 19). Garbers recorded the best statistical game of his career, setting single-game career highs in passing yards (383), passing touchdowns (four) and completion percentage (32-38, 84%). He also completed the longest pass of his career (67 yards) and made the longest rush of his career (49 yards), both for touchdowns.
- Garbers' completion percentage (.842) at Rutgers was fifth-highest in UCLA single-game history since 1980. The last time a Bruin QB had a higher completion percentage was Oct. 13, 2018 at California (Dorian Thompson-Robinson; 13-15, .866). Additionally, Garbers is the second Bruin QB in program history to complete at least 30 passes with a completion percentage of 80% or higher (Dorian Thompson-Robinson vs. USC in 2022; 30-36, .833).
- LB Carson Schwesinger is the Big Ten leader and ranks second in the NCAA in solo tackles per game (6.5). Schwesinger also ranks second in the conference in total tackles (72) and tackles per game (10.3).
- Schwesinger led UCLA with 10 tackles in UCLA's win at Rutgers, marking his fifth straight double-digit tackling performance. He is the first Bruin to accomplish that feat since Eric Kendricks in 2014, who went on to win The Butkus Award that season.
- Schwesinger has recorded 10-plus tackles in each of his first career starts against LSU (Sept. 21), Oregon (Sept. 28), Penn State (Oct. 5), Minnesota (Oct. 12) and Rutgers the past five weeks, leading the team with 12, 13, 15, 13 and 10 tackles in each contest, respectively.
- UCLA registered season highs in points (35), touchdowns (five), and total offense (478 yards) in its most recent outing at Rutgers.
- UCLA's rushing defense ranks 13th in the nation with 98.6 yards allowed on the ground per game. Last year, the Bruins finished second in the nation in rushing defense, giving up 80.8 rushing yards per game to opponents in 2023.
- Garbers completed TD passes to four different receivers at Rutgers, becoming the first Bruin to accomplish that feat since Thompson-Robinson on Nov. 7, 2020 at Colorado.

## MOST RECENT MEETING

## Nebraska 37, UCLA 29

## Dec. 27, 2015 - Levi's Stadium (Santa Clara, Calif.)

Josh Rosen threw for 319 yards and two touchdowns, and the Bruins built an early 21-7 lead, but ultimately absorbed a 37-29 loss to Nebraska in the 2015 Foster Farms Bowl. The result gave the Bruins an 8-5 record to close the 2015 campaign.

The Bruins broke out to a 21-7 lead when Rosen threw a 60-yard touchdown to Kenneth Walker III and a 26-yarder to Nate Starks. The Other UCLA touchdown came when Paul Perkins ran it in from the 1 a play after Rosen completed a 22-yard pass to Thomas Duarte on fourth-and-1.

Nebraska fought back with back-to-back TD drives to tie it 21 at the half. The Huskers went ahead for good in the third, outgaining UCLA 196-1 for the quarter. The Bruins responded with a 9-yard TD pass to Jordan Payton early in the fourth to get within eight, but a comeback effort stalled with an interception at the 2:54 mark of the fourth quarter.

• Redshirt senior QB Ethan Garbers was awarded UCLA's first-ever Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week award after leading the Bruins to their first conference win in a 35-32 victory at Rutgers (Oct. 19). Garbers recorded the best statistical game of his career, setting single-game career highs in passing yards (383), passing touchdowns (four) and completion percentage (32-38, 84%). He also completed the longest pass of his career (67 yards) and made the longest rush of his career (49 yards), both for touchdowns. Garbers became the first Bruin QB to pass for 300+ yards, or throw four TD passes, or account for five total TDs in a game since 2022 (Dorian Thompson-Robinson accomplished all three against USC).

• Garbers' completion percentage (.842) at Rutgers was fifth-highest in UCLA single-game history since 1980. The last time a Bruin QB had a higher completion percentage was Oct. 13, 2018 at California (Dorian Thompson-Robinson; 13-15, .866). Additionally, Garbers is the second Bruin QB in program history to complete at least 30 passes with a completion percentage of 80% or higher (Dorian Thompson-Robinson vs. USC in 2022; 30-36, .833). His 32 completions were the most by a Bruin QB since Dorian Thompson-Robinson also had 32 against Bowling Green in 2022. - Garbers' 49-yard scoring dash at Rutgers was the second-longest by a Bruin QB on the road in the last 10 years. The 49-yard rush for Garbers more than doubled UCLA's previous rushing long for the season (Keegan Jones, 22 yards).
- Garbers completed TD passes to four different receivers at Rutgers, becoming the first Bruin to accomplish that feat since Thompson-Robinson on Nov. 7, 2020 at Colorado.

- Garbers now has a pair of 40-plus-yard TD passes this season with a 67-yard completion to RB Keegan Jones at Rutgers (Oct. 19) and 42-yard connection to WR J. Michael Sturdivant in the fourth quarter versus Minnesota (Oct. 12).
- Garbers has completed passes to nine different receivers twice this season (Minnesota on Oct. 12 and LSU on Sept. 21).
- Redshirt sophomore QB Justyn Martin made his first-career start, and fifth-career appearance, in the Bruins' Oct. 5 contest at Penn State. He completed 22 of 30 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown (to Logan Loya, in the final minute of the game) without committing a turnover. He connected with eight different pass catchers.
- Martin is the first UCLA signal caller to complete 70% of his passes on 30-plus attempts in his first-career start since Josh Rosen against Virginia on Sept. 5, 2015 (28 of 35 passing).
- Martin has also made appearances against Indiana and Oregon this season.
- Garbers' 293 passing yards versus Minnesota are the most by a quarterback against the Golden Gophers this season.
- Garbers passed for 281 yards and two touchdowns at LSU (Sept. 21). He went for 198 yards and two scores through the air in the opening half alone. Garbers connected with nine different receivers during that contest, with all nine posting at least one catch of 10-plus yards. The Bruins' loss to the Tigers was their first ever when Garbers threw for multiple touchdowns (UCLA was 4-0 when Garbers threw for multiple TDs in 2023).
- Garbers began his 2024 campaign by posting 319 yards of total offense (272 passing yards) in UCLA's 16-13 win at Hawai'i (Aug. 31). He completed 13 of 19 passes for 203 yards and one touchdown in the second half alone.
- Against Indiana (Sept. 14), Garbers had a 20-yard run to set up a UCLA touchdown late in the second half. The 20-yard scamper matched his career-long for a rush (Dec. 16, 2023 vs. Boise State in the Starco Brands LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk).
- Garbers was named to the 2024 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award Watch List, handed out annually to the nation's top graduating quarterback.
- Garbers was named offensive MVP of UCLA's 2023 finale at the LA Bowl (9-12, 152 yards and two touchdowns through the air in a 35-22 win against Boise State). Garbers is coming off a junior season in which he recorded 1,136 yards and 11 touchdowns on 98-of-146 passing over 11 games (six starts).
- Besides his offensive MVP outing at the LA Bowl, other standout efforts from Garbers in 2023 included a 155-yard, three-touchdown performance to help the Bruins defeat crosstown rival USC on the road, and a season-high 269 yards with two scoring passes against Colorado.
- Had he appeared in enough games last year to qualify, Garbers' .671 completion percentage would have ranked 17th nationally, fifth in the Pac-12 Conference and third among quarterbacks in the 2024 configuration of the Big Ten Conference.
- Last year, UCLA ranked fourth in the Pac-12 and 41st nationally with a 12.52 yards-per-completion average.
- UCLA has eight quarterbacks on its roster for the 2024 season, including a trio of freshmen.
- Chase Griffin is the only other Bruin QB on the roster who has seen game action at the Division I level.
- Griffin was tabbed recently a semifinalist for the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy, college football's premier award for community service. The selection also earned him a spot on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Earlier this year, Griffin was named the 2024 UCLA Young Alumnus of the Year for his leadership and philanthropic commitment.

## BRUIN BALL CARRIERS

- Three Bruin RBs – T.J. Harden, Keegan Jones and Jalen Berger – hauled in touchdown passes in UCLA's 35-32 win at Rutgers (Oct. 19). Berger's receiving touchdown in his home state of New Jersey marked his first score in a Bruin uniform and the first TD reception of his career.
- Jones' 67-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter at Rutgers marked the longest reception of his career. He finished with a career-high 114 receiving yards and is now the third Bruin this season to top 100+ receiving yards in a game (Rico Flores Jr., J. Michael Sturdivant).
- On the season, Harden leads UCLA with 180 rushing yards on 62 attempts (2.9 yards per carry). Jones (20 carries) and Berger (35 carries) are averaging 5.3 and 3.6 yards, respectively.
- Keegan Jones tallied his first touchdown of the season by punching in a goal-line rush on the opening drive of the game versus Minnesota (Oct. 12). The TD marked the first time this season UCLA scored first in a game.

- Harden bruised through tacklers for a 32-yard reception on a screen play to set up a field goal before halftime versus Minnesota (Oct. 12). The massive gain marked the second straight week Harden had a 30-plus-yard reception.
- Harden added a career-long 53-yard catch-and-run at Penn State (Oct. 5), matching UCLA's longest gain from scrimmage thus far this season. The catch more than doubled his previous career-long reception (25 yards vs. Colorado, 2023).
- Keegan Jones recorded a season-long 22-yard rush at the start of the fourth quarter at Penn State.
- Berger co-led the Bruins with 38 yards on the ground at Penn State. He had an 18-yard gain in the third quarter, his longest as a Bruin.
- Harden had a season-long 21-yard rush in the start of the third quarter versus Oregon (Sept. 28) before finishing with a season-high 53 rushing yards.
- Berger made his second appearance of the season in the second half at LSU (Sept. 21) and went for 13 yards on his first carry of the game. He touched the ball six times – three carries and three catches – for a total of 38 all-purpose yards.
- Jones totaled a team-high 72 all-purpose yards on six plays at LSU (50 receiving, 22 rushing). Jones caught a key third-down pass for 28 yards on the first drive of the game to set up a touchdown.
- Harden punched in a goal-line rush from one yard out to put UCLA on the board just before halftime against Indiana (Sept. 14). It was his first rushing touchdown of the season and the 11th of his career. Harden was also the Bruins' leading pass catcher in the game with 41 receiving yards, including a 24-yard catch-and-run.
- UCLA led the Pac-12 Conference and finished 16th nationally with a rushing-yards-per-game average of 197.9 in 2023.
- The Bruins eclipsed the 200-yard rushing mark six times in 2023, going 5-1 in those games. Their 404 ground yards against North Carolina Central (Sept. 16) were the most by a UCLA team since 2010.
- Harden, who was named a preseason candidate for the Doak Walker Award in August, rushed for more than 100 yards in two of the Bruins' final three 2023 contests.
- Harden had a career game last season at USC (Nov. 18, 2023), rushing for a personal-best 142 yards and tacking on his first receiving touchdown. He also scored on the ground.
- Harden's 5.3 rushing yards per carry (fifth), eight touchdown runs (ninth) and 63.6 ground yards per game (10th) were good for top-10 finishes among Pac-12 performers in 2023.
- Jones, who was put on the Paul Hornung Award preseason watch list in August, rushed 14 times for 152 yards and two touchdowns while catching eight balls for 77 yards and returning four kicks for 78 yards in 2023.
- Berger has broken the 100-yard rushing mark three times, including a season-opening 16-carry, 120-yard performance against Western Michigan (Sept. 2) for Michigan State in 2022. He started 11 games for the Spartans that year.
- UCLA had six rushers – including returners Harden (5.3), Keegan Jones (10.9) and RB Anthony Adkins (5.9) – log 10 or more carries while averaging 5.1 yards or better per carry in 2023.

## WIDEOUTS

- WR Titus Mokiao-Atimalala set career-highs in receptions (five) in UCLA's 35-32 win at Rutgers (Oct. 19).
- WR Logan Loya recorded his team-leading third touchdown catch of the season on the opening drive at Rutgers (Oct. 19).
- WR J.Michael Sturdivant recorded season highs in receptions (seven) and receiving yards (107) and his first touchdown of the year in UCLA's loss to Minnesota (Oct. 12). The 107 receiving yards were the most in a single game by a UCLA wide receiver this season and marked the third 100-yard receiving performance of his UCLA career. Sturdivant's 42-yard TD reception in the fourth quarter marked the longest scoring play by UCLA this season.
- WR Rico Flores Jr. enters Saturday's contest at Nebraska leading his position group in receiving yards (187) and yards per reception (15.6).
- Loya led UCLA in receptions (six) at Penn State (Oct. 25) and caught a one-yard touchdown pass in the final minute of the game. The catch represented the first-career TD pass for Justyn Martin.
- Flores made his third 20-plus-yard reception in the second quarter versus Indiana (Sept. 14). Flores caught two passes that went for 39 yards or more at Hawai'i (Aug. 31). His 39-yarder went for a touchdown. WR J. Michael Sturdivant caught a pair of 39-yard strikes twice in 2023, doing so against Boise State in the Starco Brands LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk (Dec. 16) and versus Coastal Carolina (Sept. 2).
- Flores, a transfer from Notre Dame, ranked second on the 2023 Fighting Irish squad with 27 catches and totaled 392 receiving yards (14.5 yards per catch). His season-best marks from 2023 included a 102-yard game on eight catches against Wake Forest and a season-long 60-yard catch-and-run against Pittsburgh.
- WR Kwazi Gilmer made his first-career start versus Oregon (Sept. 28) and led the team with four receptions for 31 yards.
- Gilmer notched the first two receptions of his career at LSU, both going for 25-plus yards to set up scoring drives. His 32-yard, juggling snag late in the second half was a game-long for Bruin receivers, and helped set up a game-tying touchdown drive.
- WR Carter Shaw's first career reception went for a 27-yard gain in the first quarter of UCLA's season-opening win at Hawai'i. The catch came on a third down and placed the Bruins in the red zone.
- Loya had an 11-yard touchdown catch to tie the game late in the first half at LSU. It was his first TD catch of the season. He's caught at least one TD pass in each of the past three seasons (2022-24).
- Loya was tops on the team in receiving yards (655), receptions (59) and touchdowns (five) in 2023.
- Loya had a career-best nine catches in each of the last two games of the 2023 regular season against California (88 yards, including six catches for first downs with five on third or fourth down) and at USC (60 yards), with five going for first downs and four of those catches coming on third or fourth down in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. He caught seven passes for a career-high 111 yards versus Colorado.
- In his first season in Westwood in 2023, Sturdivant ranked second on the squad in receiving yards (597), receptions (36) and receiving touchdowns (four). Sturdivant averaged 16.58 yards per reception, which was good for sixth-best in the Pac-12.
- Sturdivant, a native of Highland Village, Texas, was selected to Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List in August. The award, first handed out in 2013, is given annually to the top offensive player in the country who was born in Texas, graduated from a Texas high school or played at a Texas university.

Y-LIFE

- TE Moliki Matavaio registered career-highs in receptions (six) and receiving yards (104) in UCLA's win at Rutgers (Oct. 19). Three of his catches went for 20-plus yards. The performance marked the first 100-yard receiving game by a Bruin TE since Greg Dulcich caught nine passes for 136 yards versus Arizona State on Oct. 2, 2021.
- TE Bryce Pierre made his first start as a Bruin at Rutgers and finished with a season-high three catches and 20 yards.
- Matavaio and TE Jack Pedersen each hauled in 20-plus-yard grabs in UCLA's loss to Oregon (Sept. 28), going for 23 and 21 yards, respectively. Pedersen has a pair of 20-yard receptions this season, both of which are career longs.
- Pedersen scored UCLA's first points at LSU (Sept. 21), reeling in a 20-yard touchdown catch on the Bruins' opening drive at Tiger Stadium.
- Matavaio, who was named to the John Mackey Award Watch List in August, recorded 283 yards on 14 receptions (20.2 yards per catch) and two touchdowns in his first season as a Bruin in 2023.
- Matavaio had eight catches in 2023 for at least 20 yards: 23 versus Arizona State, 26 (touchdown) against Colorado, 20 (touchdown) at Stanford, 34 at Oregon State, 29, 27 and 20 versus Washington State and 35 at San Diego State.
- TE Bryce Pierre came to UCLA after spending 2023 at Arizona State, where he totaled 139 receiving yards on 17 catches (8.18 yards per catch).
- Pierre spent time at two southern California junior colleges: Mt. SAC College (2022) and Chaffey College (2021). Pierre was the No. 3-ranked JUCO tight end prospect in the country, according to ESPN.
- The UCLA tight end group is now coached by Jerry Neuheisel, who was formerly working with the Bruins' receivers.

OBSERVING THE O-LINE

- Redshirt sophomore Niki Prongos has made the first seven starts of his career this season at three different spots, lining up at right tackle at Hawai'i (Aug. 31) right guard against LSU (Sept. 21) and Oregon (Sept. 28) and left tackle at Penn State (Oct. 5) and versus Minnesota (Oct. 12).
- Josh Carlin made his season debut at right guard against Penn State (Oct. 5) after playing the previous four games at center.
- Redshirt freshman Tavake Tuikolovatu, who appeared in one game as a true freshman, made his first-career start against Minnesota (Oct. 12). Tuikolovatu has taken snaps off the bench in each of the Bruins' other six games.
- UCLA returns three starters from last year's offensive line, including Carlin, G Spencer Holstege and T Garrett DiGiorgio.
- Last year, the offensive line helped the Bruins record the No. 16 rushing offense in the nation (197.9 yards per game) and No. 32 total offense (427.1 yards per game).
- Carlin was one of 10 Bruins selected to the 12th annual Reese's Senior Bowl watch list.
- A year ago, the Bruins allowed two sacks or fewer in each of the team's first three games. UCLA then held Boise State without a single sack in the 2023 Starco Brands LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk (Dec. 16).
- UCLA opponents tallied five tackles for loss or fewer in eight of 13 games last season.
- Newcomers Reuben Unije (Louisville, 26) and Alani Makihele (UNLV, 17) had combined for 43 appearances at the Division I level going into 2024.

D-LINE DATA

- UCLA's rushing defense ranks 13th in the nation with 98.6 yards allowed on the ground per game. Last year, the Bruins finished second in the nation in rushing defense, giving up 80.8 rushing yards per game to opponents in 2023. A UCLA team most recently held opponents under 100 rushing yards per game over the course of a season in 2006 (91.1).
- DL Siale Taupaki recorded the first sack of his career in the second quarter versus Minnesota (Oct. 12). Taupaki's sack marked the first by a UCLA interior lineman since Keanu Williams in Week 1 at Hawai'i (Aug. 31).
- Oluwafemi Oladejo posted 10 tackles and two tackles for loss (TFL) coming off the edge at Penn State (Oct. 5). Both totals matched single-game career highs in a UCLA uniform for Oladejo, who has spent most of his Bruin career at linebacker. His 10 total tackles were the most by a UCLA defensive lineman this season. A Bruin lineman has not posted 11 tackles in a game since Takk McKinley in 2016.
- Oladejo also picked up a sack at PSU, his first full sack as a Bruin and UCLA's first QB sack since Week 1 at Hawai'i (Aug. 31).
- Taupaki, making the first start of his career, recorded a career-high six tackles (3-3-6) against Oregon (Sept. 28).
- DL Jay Toia posted a season-high five tackles (2-3-5) at LSU (Sept. 21).
- DE Devin Aupiu notched season-highs in tackles (3.0) and TFL (1.0) at LSU
- DL Jacob Busic picked up a sack and made three tackles in his UCLA debut at Hawai'i.
- UCLA rated second in the nation allowing just 2.65 yards per rush in 2023 (Penn State was first at 2.26). A Bruin team most recently had a lower mark for a season in 1985 (2.12).
- UCLA allowed just five rushing touchdowns in 2023, which led the nation. Ohio State was second with six.
- UCLA boasted one of the top defensive lines in the nation last year, headlined by edge rusher Laiatu Latu who was the first defensive player taken in the 2024 NFL Draft with the 15th overall pick by the Indianapolis Colts. Latu, UCLA's first-ever winner of the Lombardi Award and Ted Hendricks Award, had multiple TFL in seven games during the season and at least 0.5 TFL in each game in 2023.
- Latu led the nation in TFL per game (1.8) and ranked fourth nationally, second in the league, in sacks per game (1.08) average.
- Latu totaled 13.0 sacks last season to finish his career with 23.5 sacks in just two seasons. That career total ranks sixth all-time in UCLA's record books.
- Including Latu, four members of UCLA's 2023 defensive line unit are either joining NFL rosters or seeking to land a roster spot: Carl Jones Jr. (Chicago) and twins Gabriel (Minnesota) and Grayson Murphy (Miami).
- UCLA's 2023 defensive line forced four fumbles and recorded two interceptions (both Latu).
- Toia started in 12 of 13 games (not California) last season and finished the year with 28 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss and 1.0 sack.
- Toia is UCLA's most experienced defensive line talent with 38 games, including 24 starts, under his belt coming into 2024.

## LOOKING AT THE LINEBACKERS

- LB Carson Schwesinger is the Big Ten leader and ranks second in the NCAA in solo tackles per game (6.5). Schwesinger also ranks second in the conference in total tackles (72) and tackles per game (10.3).
- Schwesinger led UCLA with 10 tackles in UCLA's win at Rutgers (Oct. 19), marking his fifth straight double-digit tackling performance. He is the first Bruin to accomplish that feat since Eric Kendricks in 2014, who went on to win The Butkus Award that season.
- Schwesinger has recorded 10-plus tackles in each of his first career starts against LSU (Sept. 21), Oregon (Sept. 28), Penn State (Oct. 5), Minnesota (Oct. 12) and Rutgers the past five weeks, leading the team with 12, 13, 15, 13 and 10 tackles in each contest, respectively.
- Against Minnesota, Schwesinger set career highs in sacks (2.0) and tackles for loss (TFL - 4.5). His 4.5 TFL marked the most by a Bruin since Takk McKinley in 2016 versus Utah.
- At PSU, Schwesinger became just the second Bruin defender over the last six seasons to total 15 tackles in a game (Mo Osling III, 2022) and the first linebacker to accomplish that feat since Kenny Young in 2017 (Nov. 24 vs. California).
- Schwesinger has paced the Bruins in tackles in all but one game this season (vs. Indiana).
- Medrano was a defensive standout for the Bruins in their loss to Indiana at the Rose Bowl (Sept. 14). Medrano recorded a team and career-high 3.0 tackles for loss, marking the third multi-TFL performance of his career. The Pueblo, Colo. native also paced the Bruins with nine total tackles, including eight solo.
- Medrano recorded five total tackles – including one for a loss of two yards – and a forced fumble at Hawai'i (Aug. 31). His showing earned a Pro Football Focus grade of 88.4, which was the fourth-best number of all linebackers during Week 1 and ranked first among those in the Big Ten Conference.
- Playing in his first game since the 2023 season opener, College Football Comeback Player of the Year Award candidate LB Ale Kaho posted four total tackles at Hawai'i (Aug. 31). One of his stops was a sack on the game's final drive that drove the Rainbow Warriors backwards 11 yards. Bruin Laiatu Latu won the Comeback honor in 2022.
- Kaho drew a start at Penn State (Oct. 5), his first since the 2021 campaign.
- Schwesinger made seven total tackles – including one for negative yardage – at Hawai'i. He also forced a fumble on the game's final play.
- The Bruins return two starting linebackers in redshirt senior Medrano and senior Oluwafemi Oladejo.
- Redshirt senior Kaho returns for his fourth year at UCLA after being limited to one game over the past two seasons while rehabbing injuries. Kaho appeared in 52 games going into the 2024 season, winning the College Football Playoff National Championship with Alabama in 2020.
- In 2023, UCLA's linebacker corps helped record the No. 2 rushing defense in the country (80.8 yards per game) and the No. 10 total defense (301.5 yards per game).
- Linebackers figured in five UCLA turnovers a season ago. Oladejo led the way with an interception and two fumble recoveries, while Medrano also forced a fumble.
- Medrano (56) and Oladejo (54) ranked second and third on the team in total tackles last year. Darius Muasau, who led the Bruins in tackles in both 2022 and 2023, was selected in the sixth round of the 2024 NFL Draft by the New York Giants.
- Medrano paced UCLA linebackers with seven tackles for loss (TFL) in 2023. His top outing of the year came on Sept. 23 at Utah, as he posted career highs of 10 total tackles and 2.5 TFL while also forcing a fumble.
- Oladejo led UCLA with 10 tackles at San Diego State in Week 2 of the 2023 season, and added his first interception as a Bruin against Washington State. He compiled six tackles at Arizona on Nov. 4, and again at the Starco Brands LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk on Dec. 16.
- Veterans JonJon Vaughns (44 games played) and Joseph Vaughn (Yale transfer, 32) combined for 76 appearances at the Division I level going into 2024. Redshirt sophomore LB Jalen Woods appeared in all 13 of the team's games last year in his freshman campaign.

## SCOUTING THE SECONDARY

- DB Bryan Addison notched his team-leading second interception of the season and sixth of his career in the fourth quarter at Rutgers (Oct. 19).
- Addison recorded the first pick-six in the second quarter against Oregon (Sept. 28). Addison picked off quarterback Dillon Gabriel and sprinted 96 yards to the endzone for the longest INT return by a Bruin since Ishmael Adams who also had a 96-yard pick-six against Colorado in 2015.
- Making their debuts as Bruins, Addison, Ramon Henderson and K.J. Wallace shined in the defensive backfield at Hawai'i (Aug. 31). Addison made four total tackles and recovered a fumble. Henderson had three stops – including one sack – and picked off a pass. Of Wallace's seven total tackles, one was a sack and two went for negative yardage.
- Alex Johnson, who has since moved on to the NFL's Indianapolis Colts, paced the Pac-12 Conference with five interceptions (sixth nationally) and 0.4 picks per game (13th overall) in 2023.
- DB Jaylin Davies has four career interceptions. His pick in the 2022 Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl (Dec. 30) was returned 52 yards for a touchdown.
- Newcomers Addison (five), Henderson (seven), Moore (18) and Wallace (19) combined for 49 career defensive-backfield starts at their previous stops going into 2024.
- The Bruins saw their passing efficiency defense ranking climb from 96th nationally (139.64) in 2022 to 19th overall (119.31) in 2023.
- Former walk-on DB Kanye Clark earned a scholarship during 2024 spring practice. In five games as a true freshman, he made three tackles – including a pair in the Bruins' Starco Brands LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk win versus Boise State (Dec. 16, 2023).
- DB Devin Kirkwood's two career interceptions have come in road wins against USC (Nov. 18, 2023) and Washington (Oct. 16, 2021). The one in Seattle came with 4:59 to go and the Huskies threatening. UCLA prevailed 24-17.
- The Bruins registered two or more interceptions in five of their 2023 games.



## SPECIAL TEAMERS

- K Mateen Bhaghani recorded a career-long field goal for a second straight week against Oregon (Sept. 28). Bhaghani was good from 54 yards out versus the Ducks, which was UCLA's longest field goal since Ka'imi Fairbairn who converted on a program-record 60-yard attempt against California in 2015. Bhaghani's 54-yarder is tied for the fourth-longest in UCLA history. His previous career-best was 47 yards, accomplished the previous week at LSU (Sept. 21).
- Bhaghani is 10-for-11 on field goal attempts this season after hitting a 34-yarder before the end of the half versus Minnesota (Oct. 12). His 90.9% success rate ranks third in the Big Ten. Bhaghani's 1.67 field goals per game lead the conference.
- Bhaghani drilled three field goals, including one that stood as the game winner, at Hawai'i (Aug. 31). A UCLA kicker had most recently checked both of those boxes when Nicholas Barr-Mira made four, including the decider, against South Alabama on Sept. 17, 2022. Bhaghani's performance earned him Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week.
- P Brody Richter had a standout performance at LSU (Sept. 21). Over four attempts, he uncorked a career and game-long 61-yard punt and then had his final three punts downed inside the LSU 10-yard line.
- Bhaghani was two-for-three on his field goal attempts against Indiana (Sept. 14), connecting from distances of 28 and 34 yards in the second half. Bhaghani is five-for-five on field goal attempts in the second half this season.
- Logan Loya was UCLA's featured punt returner last season with 17 returns for a 7.2-yard average, which ranked third in the Pac-12.
- Loya had a season-long 31-yard punt return in UCLA's game versus Arizona State in Week 10 last year.
- Joining the kicking personnel group is sophomore Bhaghani, a transfer from California who went eight-for-nine on field goal attempts and 29-for-29 on extra-point attempts last season.
- Bhaghani connected for a season-long 43-yard field goal twice, once against Oregon and once against UCLA, last season.
- Bhaghani also kicked off 13 times with one touchback last season with the Golden Bears.
- Glessner (Montana State transfer) registered 22 touchbacks on 54 kickoffs in his first season for the Bruins. He booted his first career field goal for UCLA at Arizona (29 yards) after missing from 41 and 42 yards against the Wildcats. He was good from 35 yards on a field goal attempt at USC and missed from 36. He misfired from 23 yards versus California.
- UCLA had 48 punts in 2023. The Bruins' total of 27 punts in 2022 was the second-lowest mark by any team in the nation and the fewest in school history.
- LS Travis Drosos, a transfer from South Alabama, was named to the Patrick Mannelly Award Watch List earlier this month. Drosos was the Jaguars' long snapper in all 13 contests and assisted on 14 made field goals.
- UCLA has blocked 24 kicks (extra points, field goals or punts) since the start of the 2012 season.

### UCLA TRADITIONS

#### Bruin Walk

Head coach DeShaun Foster is bringing back a UCLA football tradition from his playing days – the Bruin Walk. For all home games, the UCLA football team will be greeted upon arrival at the Rose Bowl Stadium by cheering fans and walk through the UCLA Football Fan Zone (located in Parking Lot Area H) prior to entering the venue.

#### The Eight-Clap

The UCLA fanbase's touchdown and postgame victory celebration. The boisterous cheer begins with eight claps, followed by a spell-out of U-C-L-A and three yells of "Fight! Fight! Fight!" What was originally called the "eight-clap yell" was introduced by a UCLA student in 1948 to show off Bruin spirit.

#### The Inverted Fountain

Located in the heart of UCLA's south campus is the Inverted Fountain which is steeped in student tradition and lore. On orientation day, incoming UCLA freshmen and transfer students are directed to take an oath and dip their hands in the water of the Inverted Fountain in a process known as becoming "Bruintized." Students are not to touch the water again until graduation day. Designed by Howard Troller, the Inverted Fountain has an off-centered 12-foot wide and five-foot deep crater that recirculates approximately 10,000 gallons per minute.

### BIG-PLAY ABILITY

The Bruins registered six offensive touchdowns of more than 50 yards in 2023. Since 2016, UCLA has scored 37 touchdowns of 50 yards or more on the offensive side of the ball. Here are the 21 recorded since 2020.

## 2023 IN REVIEW

- UCLA earned its third consecutive bowl invite, beating Boise State 35-22 in the Starco Brands LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk. The bowl win was UCLA's first since the 2015 Valero Alamo Bowl.
- UCLA won at least eight games for the third consecutive season.
- UCLA was 8-0 when scoring 25 points or more.
- UCLA finished with 105 tackles for loss, finishing just shy of the program record of 114 set in 2007.
- The Bruins were credited with 43 sacks, the program's most since piling up a school-record 47 in 2012.
- UCLA led the Pac-12 Conference in rushing. It marked the first time the Bruins had paced the league in back-to-back years since it did so in 1975 and 1976.
- Consensus first-team All-American Laiatu Latu became UCLA's first ever winner of three awards: Lombardi Award, Hendricks Award and Polynesian College Football Player of the Year . He was also tabbed UCLA's fifth Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year Award winner.
- Latu became UCLA's fifth winner of the Pac-12's Morris Trophy, joining OL Xavier Su'a-Filo (2013), DE Dave Ball (2003), DE Kenyon Coleman (2001) and OL Jonathan Ogden (1995).
- UCLA finished ranked second nationally in rushing defense (80.8 yards allowed per game) and gave up just 18.38 points per game, which rated 14th overall. A Bruin team last finished a season with a points-per-game average under 20 in 2006 (19.9).
- UCLA ranked sixth in the nation with 43.0 sacks and third overall with 105 tackles for loss. The Bruins' 2.65 yards allowed per rush attempt was second nationally.

## EXPERIENCE AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL

Head coach DeShaun Foster's staff has 47 seasons of NFL coaching experience. Leading the way is offensive line coach Juan Castillo, who spent 28 years at the highest level before moving to Westwood. His longest tenure came in Philadelphia where he helped the Eagles capture six NFC East titles, advance to five NFC Championship Games and reach Super Bowl XXXIX during his 18 seasons (1995-2012) on staff. Castillo also coached in Baltimore (2013-16), Buffalo (2017, 2018), Chicago (2020, 2021) and Washington (2022, 2023). Associate head coach and offensive coordinator Eric Bieniemy spent 16 of his previous 18 years with the Minnesota Vikings (2006-2010), Kansas City Chiefs (2013-2022) and Washington Commanders (2023). He guided some of the most prolific offenses in league history while a member of the Chiefs. Kansas City captured the Super Bowl LVII and LIV championships and reached Super Bowl LV during his tenure. Rounding out the quartet of NFL veterans are wide receivers coach Erik Frazier, who was on the Tennessee Titans staff in 2021 and 2022, and quarterbacks coach Ted White, who worked with the Houston Texans in 2022.

## THE STORY OF NO. 36

Head coach DeShaun Foster awarded redshirt senior defensive back Joshua Swift the No. 36 in honor of Nick Pasquale, who wore the number for the Bruins in 2012 and 2013 before his tragic death in a car accident.

"It was amazing," Swift said during Thursday morning media availability when asked how it felt to wear No. 36 for the first time. "To represent something bigger than yourself is what it's all about. It's what this sport is all about. That's what life is about. (I'm) extremely grateful. It's an honor."

"The way (Swift) approaches the game, we wanted (the person wearing No. 36) to be a potential walk-on who can try to win a scholarship and just exudes what being a Bruin is. Discipline, respect and enthusiasm," Foster said during his first fall camp media availability. "He's the same guy every day. He's somebody most of the players respect. They love him. And it's not because he's a great football player. It's because he does things the right way."

Pasquale was a 5-7, 172-pound redshirt freshman walk-on receiver for the Bruins who had seen his first game action a week before his death in September 2013. He was known for his passion for the game, his limitless determination and his high qualities as a teammate. Current UCLA tight ends coach Jerry Neuheisel was a teammate of Pasquale.

Swift walked onto the football team in 2020, serving on scout teams in practice for the entirety of the season. A product of Chaparral High School in Temecula, Calif., Swift saw his first playing team in the 2021 season and was later awarded the Nick "Pac" Pasquale Memorial Award for Special Teams Scout Team Player of the Year at the annual team banquet.

Swift played two games in both 2022 and 2023 and logged his first-career tackles (four) against North Carolina Central on Sept. 16, 2023.

The previous two Bruins to wear No. 36 were defensive back Alex Johnson in 2022 and 2023 and wide receiver/running back Ethan Fernea from 2019-2021.

## BRUINS IN GRAD SCHOOL

Five members of the UCLA football team are currently enrolled in the master's degree program in Transformative Coaching and Leadership (TCL) — Josh Carlin, Justyn Martin, Devin Kirkwood, Logan Loya and Joshua Swift.

Offered by UCLA's Department of Education, the master's degree in TCL prepares graduates for careers in coaching and sports leadership in professional and collegiate athletics, K-12 schools and community-based sports organizations. Inspired by the legendary John Wooden, the goals of the program include enabling prospective candidates to develop their own philosophy of coaching and leadership—and one that is premised on a holistic understanding of persons and sound principles of coaching, teaching and learning.

The degree program is also informed by an ethic of social justice, where teaching and coaching in various contexts—collegiate sports, professional sports, K-12 schools, Boys and Girls Clubs and other community sports programs—are analyzed through the lens of equity, access, diversity, and human dignity with the steadfast aim of contributing to the creation of a more just, equitable and humane society through enlightened and socially conscious sports education and leadership.

In addition, Chase Griffin, Hudson Habermehl and Dovid Magna have completed the TCL program. Griffin and Magna have also finished their studies in the Master of Legal Studies program at UCLA Law, while Habermehl is pursuing his Legan Studies degree.

### COACH DONAHUE HONORED WITH STATUE AT ROSE BOWL

The winningest coach in UCLA football and Pac-12 Conference history, Terry Donahue, was celebrated with a statue at Rose Bowl Stadium in 2023. The unveiling and dedication took place Oct. 28, during Homecoming Weekend.

The statue of Coach Donahue is surrounded by 151 bronze roses of varying shapes and sizes to honor the conference- and school-record win total achieved during his career. As a gift by over 100 donors to the Rose Bowl Legacy Foundation, the non-profit that supports the preservation, protection and enhancement of the Stadium's future, each rose has been supported by an individual or family.

Coach Donahue's statue is the fourth on Rose Bowl property to represent key moments and people in the venue's history, joining Jackie Robinson (dedicated in 2017), the 1999 Team USA FIFA Women's World Cup Champions (dedicated 2019) and iconic broadcaster Keith Jackson (dedicated 2019). It is the first statue located inside the Stadium's gates with the other three located outside the venue's fence line near the Stadium's main entrance at Gate A. The statue's location is adjacent to the Charles E. Young Locker Room and UCLA players and coaches pass by the iconic coach before each home game.

Donahue won more games than any other coach in the school's and the Pac-12 Conference's history. He ended his career with a winning record against each of the conference's teams, including the Bruins' crosstown rival, the University of Southern California Trojans. Overall, he won 151 games, and 98 of those victories were in the Pac-10. He was the first person to appear in the Rose Bowl Game® as a player, an assistant coach and a coach.

### BRUIN FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS

UCLA true-freshman quarterbacks to start games over the years include: Dante Moore (2023), Dorian Thompson-Robinson in 2018 (eight games), Josh Rosen in 2015 (13), Matt Moore in 2002 (one), Drew Olson in 2002 (five), Cade McNown in 1995 (nine), Ryan Fien in 1992 (one), Tom Ramsey in 1979 (two) and Steve Bukich in 1974 (one). Rosen was the first Bruin true freshman signal caller to start a season opener (a 2015 win versus Virginia). Thompson-Robinson (currently with the Cleveland Browns), Rosen (Minnesota Vikings, Browns, Atlanta Falcons, San Francisco 49ers, Miami Dolphins and Arizona Cardinals), Moore (Kansas City Chiefs, Dolphins, Carolina Panthers and Dallas Cowboys), Olson (49ers, Panthers and Baltimore Ravens), McNown (49ers, Dolphins and Chicago Bears) and Ramsey (Indianapolis Colts and New England Patriots) each saw action in the NFL.

WR Kwazi Gilmer has played in all seven 2024 games. He made his first two grabs (32 yards and 29 yards) at LSU on Sept. 21. RB Cameron Jones made his debut on special teams against Minnesota on Oct. 12. He took on the same role the next week at Rutgers.

\*\*\*

Eighteen true freshman saw game action for the Bruins in 2023. QB Dante Moore led the group with nine games played and was the only one to start, taking the first snap five times. DB Kanye Clark and LB Donavyn Pellot each made it into five contests, while WRs Carter Shaw (three) and Jerry McClure (two) took the field in multiple outings. The remaining 13 — DL Grant Buckey, RB Isaiah Carlson, OL Jack Clarke, LB Larry Edwards III, DL A.J. Fuimaono, WR Grant Gray, DB R.J. Jones, LB Ty Lee, RB Troy Leigber, LB Mone Malafu, LB Wyatt Mosier, OL Tavake Tuikolovatu and DB Marquise Villahermosa — were made up of one-game participants.

UCLA used 11 true freshmen during the 2022 season. Two true freshmen saw action in the 2022 opener against Bowling Green — RBs T.J. Harden and Carsen Ryan. Nine more saw the field in Game 2 versus Alabama State: P Chase Barry, WR Jady Marshall, RB Jack Pedersen, WR Braden Pegan, DB Kamari Ramsey, WR Elijah Rodriguez, DB Clint Stephens, DB Croix Stewart and LB Jalen Woods.

In 2021, six true freshmen saw action. Five saw the field in the 2021 season-opener against Hawai'i: OL Garrett DiGiorgio, DB Devin Kirkwood, WR Keontez Lewis, DL Tiaoalii Savea and DL Jay Toia. A sixth true freshman, LB Devin Aupiu, played for the first time at Washington. In 2020, 10 Bruins took the field for the opener at Colorado: LB Damian Sellers, LB Choé Bryant-Strother, DB D.J. Warnell, WR Matt Sykes, WR Logan Loya, LB Myles Jackson, K R.J. Lopez, P Luke Akers, DB John Humphrey and DB JonJon Vaughns. An 11th true freshman, LB Jeremiah Trojan, saw action versus USC.

Nine true frosh saw action in 2019. Kain Medrano appeared on special teams versus California, while LB John Ward saw action against Oregon State. Three true freshmen Bruins played at Washington State: LS Jack Landherr IV, OL Duke Clemens and RB Keegan Jones. Four Bruins saw action in the 2019 opener at Cincinnati: LB Carl Jones Jr., TE Mike Martinez, OT Sean Rhyhan and LB Adam Cohen.

## Head Coach DeShaun Foster

UCLA All-American and NFL standout DeShaun Foster was named head coach at his alma mater on Feb. 12, 2024.

Foster spent the previous 11 seasons, including 10 at UCLA, in the collegiate coaching ranks. He also coached one year at Texas Tech. Foster spent the 2017-2023 campaigns as the Bruins' running backs coach, adding the title of associate head coach in 2023.

In 2023, the UCLA rushing attack led the Pac-12 for the second straight season (191.1 yards per game) with four backs in the regular rotation averaging at least 5.1 yards per carry. Carson Steele (847 yards) and T.J. Harden (722) led the ground attack while ranking seventh and 10th in the conference in rushing yards per game, respectively.

In the fall of 2022, Foster was inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame and nominated for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. Zach Charbonnet became the fourth Bruin running back selected in the NFL Draft over the past four seasons when he was chosen by the Seattle Seahawks. Following the 2022 campaign, Foster was elevated to Associate Head Coach, Running Backs.

In 2022, UCLA led the Pac-12 and ranked sixth in the nation in rushing offense (237.2). It marked the first time UCLA had topped the conference in rushing since the 1976 season. The Bruins rushed for 200 yards or more in nine regular season contests during the year, including three of over 300 yards. UCLA set a new school record with an average of 503.6 yards of total offense per game, a mark which rated fourth in the nation. Charbonnet, who paced the nation in all-purpose yards per game (168.0), became the ninth Bruin to record back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons (1,359). He topped the Pac-12 in rushing (135.9 yards per game) and ranked fourth nationally. Bruin rushers led the Pac-12 with a 6.1 yards per carry average. The Bruin running backs caught over 60 passes on the year and scored five receiving TDs.

In 2021, the Bruins ran for at least 200 yards in all eight wins during the regular season. UCLA's average of 215.1 rush yards per game ranked 14th in the nation. Charbonnet led all Pac-12 rushers with seven 100-yard games this season. He ranked second in the conference in rushing yards per game (94.8) and overall rushing yards (1,137). Brittain Brown's 6.03 yards per carry mark was the best by a Pac-12 back. He also ranked eighth in the league in rushing yards per game (61.5). The Bruins led the Pac-12 in scoring (36.5, 12th in NCAA) and were second in total offense (441.2, 31st in NCAA).

In the 2020 campaign, UCLA rushers averaged 5.1 yards per carry while upping their rushing average by over 70 yards per contest and finishing over 200 yards per game for just the fourth time since 1990. It was the highest average per carry for Bruin running backs since the 1976 squad posted a 5.4 yards per carry mark. UCLA finished 12th in the nation and second in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (230.6). It rated 30th nationally in total offense (455.0) and 20th in scoring offense (35.4). Demetric Felton Jr., a consensus All-Pac-12 selection who was drafted by the Cleveland Browns, ranked 14th in the nation and fourth in the Pac-12 in rushing average (111.3). He was ranked sixth in the nation as the conference leader in all-purpose yardage (165.8). Brown rated 15th in the nation in rushing yards per carry (6.62), eighth in the league in rushing (77.6) and was a second-team all-conference pick by PFF. Felton and Brown each gained over 500 yards on the season while averaging at least 5.0 yards per carry to become just the third Bruin duo to hit that pair of milestones since 1975 (Johnathan Franklin and Derrick Coleman in 2011; Wendell Tyler and Theotis Brown in 1976).

In 2019, Joshua Kelley became the eighth Bruin to post back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons. Kelley, who was selected by the Chargers in the 2020 NFL Draft, finished second in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game average. Felton set a school mark for a running back with 55 receptions and another record with four scoring plays of at least 75-yards of length during the season. UCLA produced five straight 200-yard rushing games in a season for the first time since the 1978 campaign. Kelley completed his career 14th on the school career rushing list after just two seasons and with a total of 10 100-yard rushing games to his credit, 10th on that all-time school list.

In 2018, UCLA's rushing attack improved by a margin of over 40 yards per game on average. Kelley ran for 1,243 yards, the 10th-highest single-season total in school history. In addition, the junior back racked up 289 rushing yards against USC, the most by any back in the rivalry series, and the third-highest total in school history. Kelley, who ranked ninth in FBS rushing yards per game, finished with six 100-yard rushing games during the season. The Bruins generated over 432 yards of offense, on average, over the course of the last eight games of the season, including over 164 yards per game on the ground.

In 2017, Foster's Bruin running backs upped their rushing average per carry by almost a yard per attempt. Rushing yardage, rushing touchdowns and rushing first downs all went up for the Bruins. UCLA ranked third in the conference in total offense. The top four running backs each produced career-high rushing totals during the season and also generated new highs for receptions.

Prior to joining the Texas Tech staff, Foster began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at UCLA in 2013 while also returning to school. In 2014, in addition to his work on the field, Foster completed his degree and graduated from UCLA. In 2015, he was promoted to Director of Player Development and High School Relations.

The Bruins were among the top programs in the country during Foster's tenure assisting with the running backs, going 28-11 overall with three bowl appearances during that span. Foster was instrumental in the development of Paul Perkins, who capped off his career third all-time at UCLA in rushing yards.

Foster joined the coaching ranks not long after a successful seven-year NFL career with the Carolina Panthers and San Francisco 49ers in which he recorded more than 4,500 total yards and 16 touchdowns – 3,570 yards and 11 touchdowns on the ground

and another 1,129 yards and five touchdowns through the air.

Foster's strong pro numbers came after he missed his rookie season due to a preseason injury. A second-round selection by the Panthers in the 2002 NFL Draft, he recovered from that first-year setback to rush for over 600 combined regular season and playoff yards as Carolina advanced all the way to the Super Bowl. In Super Bowl XXXVIII, Foster rushed three times for 43 yards, including a 33-yard run into the end zone to pull Carolina within a single score against the New England Patriots early in the fourth quarter. It was the fifth-longest touchdown run in Super Bowl history.

Foster put together his best three professional seasons from 2005-07 to close his career with the Panthers, surpassing the 1,000-yard mark for the first time in 2005 with a combined 1,084 yards on the ground during the regular season and two playoff games. Foster rushed for over 100 yards in back-to-back games late in the year, totaling 165 yards in the regular-season finale with Atlanta before pounding out 151 yards in Carolina's 23-0 shutout of the New York Giants to open the NFC playoffs.

Foster followed up his 2005 campaign with a regular season-high 897 yards in 2006. The following year, he closed out his tenure with the Panthers by posting 876 yards before signing with the San Francisco 49ers in the offseason, where he would play one season before hanging up his cleats.

Foster is one of the most accomplished UCLA running backs in school history. He completed his career second on the all-time touchdowns scored list (44), third on the school's all-time rushing list (3,194 yds) and fifth on the all-time Bruin scoring list (266 pts). Foster was ranked 18th on the Pac-10 career rushing list when he left Westwood, and his 722 career rushing attempts were the most in school history. His 13 100-yard career rushing games ranked fifth on UCLA's all-time list and led to his earning first-team All-Pac-10 selections following the 2000 and 2001 seasons.

As a senior in 2001, he led the Pac-10 in rushing with a 138.6 yards per game average, in scoring with a mark of 9.75 points per game and in all-purpose yardage at 154.75 yards per game. He rushed for 1,109 yards, the 10th highest total in school history, after becoming the first Bruin to reach the 1,000-yard mark in as few as seven games. On Oct. 13, playing against a University of Washington defense which had not allowed a rushing touchdown all year, Foster exploded for a school-record 301 yards and four touchdowns on 31 carries. His final scoring run of the contest came on a 92-yard jaunt, the second-longest in school history. He became just the third Pac-10 player, at the time, to have rushed for over 300-yards in a game.

In 2000, he ran for 1,037 yards and scored 13 touchdowns. In the season-opener against Alabama, he tied a school record with 42 carries and finished with 187 rushing yards and three touchdowns. In 1999, he was limited to 375 rushing yards after suffering a severe ankle sprain early in the season. He also played five defensive snaps in the Bruin secondary that season.

In 1998, Foster burst onto the college scene with a school freshman record 673 yards rushing and scored 12 touchdowns. He was the first true freshman to lead a UCLA team in rushing since Skip Hicks in 1993. He scored all four touchdowns (three rushing and one receiving) in UCLA's 34-17 win over USC to tie the school record and set a new mark for Bruin true freshmen.

A local product, as a Tustin High School senior, Foster rushed for 3,398 yards and scored 59 touchdowns, ultimately setting single-season (55) and career (90) CIF Southern Section marks for rushing touchdowns.

He is married to Charity Foster, and has two sons, Noel Washington and Nolen Washington, and daughters Viviana Foster and Destiny Foster.

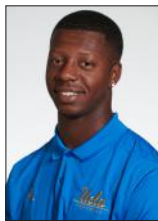

## SPIEKER FIELD AT THE ROSE BOWL: HOME OF BRUIN FOOTBALL

The nation's most famous college football stadium – the Rose Bowl – will be in its 43rd season as the home of the UCLA Bruins football team in 2024. The stadium is recognized as both a United States National Historic Landmark and a California Historic Civil Engineering landmark. Thanks to a generous donation in 2017 from prominent UCLA alum Tod Spieker and his family, the playing surface is called Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl.

The Rose Bowl was built specifically for football, but has been utilized as a venue for portions of the 1932 Olympic Games' cycling events and was the soccer site for the 1984 Olympics. The Rose Bowl has also played host to five NFL Super Bowls – XI in 1977, XIV in 1980, XVII in 1983, XXI in 1987 and XXVII in 1993. It was a venue for the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournaments, including the championship games. The USA women's soccer team victory over China in the 1999 event drew over 90,000 fans. In addition, the 1983 Army-Navy game was played in the Rose Bowl.

On Jan. 1, 2018 and Jan. 1, 2015, the Rose Bowl served as the site of one of the College Football Playoff semifinal games. In 2014, the Rose Bowl hosted the final BCS Championship contest. It had also played host to the BCS Championship game in 2002, 2006 and 2010.

Considered an ideal concert venue, the Rose Bowl has hosted shows by such groups and artists as Taylor Swift, Beyonce, Jay-Z, Kenny Chesney, Jason Aldean, One Direction, U2, 'N Sync, Eagles, Rolling Stones, Pink Floyd, Michael Jackson, Metallica, Guns and Roses, Depeche Mode and Journey.

The iconic stadium has put the final touches on a \$181 million dollar renovation, and now features a new video board, improved exiting, wider aisles in the end zones and the Terry Donahue Pavilion. The Pavilion area houses the press boxes, broadcast booths, premium seating, boxes and suites. In December of 2015, the radio and TV booths were renamed "The Keith Jackson Broadcast Center". Jackson, the former sportscaster, coined the phrase "The Granddaddy of Them All" for the Rose Bowl Game. Also added are field level entrances and exits, and



additional concession stands and restroom facilities.

Since 2007, UCLA and its opponents have dressed in new locker rooms located underneath the south concourse of the stadium. The locker area features all of the latest amenities to benefit the players, coaches, sports medicine and equipment staffs. In addition, a new media interview room and working press area were included in the upgrades. In 1998, new individual chairs were installed in the seating areas between the end zones. Also, improved seating areas for the physically challenged were installed, as well as a new sound system.

Completed in 1922 at a cost of \$272,198, the Rose Bowl was first used for the USC-California football game that year which was won by the Golden Bears 12-0. The stadium was originally horseshoe shaped and seated 57,000 persons when it hosted the 1923 Rose Bowl Game. The south end zone was enclosed prior to the 1929 game to increase seating capacity to 76,000.

Further enlargements took place in 1932 (83,677) and 1949 (100,807). A record crowd of 106,869 fans witnessed the 1973 Ohio State – USC Rose Bowl contest.

The Rose Bowl has many firsts in its vast history. On Jan. 1, 1927, radio stations across the nation were linked together for the first time in a coast-to-coast broadcast. On Jan. 1, 1954, The UCLA-Michigan State Rose Bowl Game was the first west-to-east color telecast on a nationwide connection.

The Rose Bowl has 77 rows of seats. It measures 880 feet from the north to south rims and 695 feet from east to west. Its circumference around the rim is 2,430 feet, compared to 1,350 feet at field level. It took 28 miles of lumber to provide the original seats. The square footage of the grass on the floor of the stadium is 79,156.

UCLA sophomore kicker Mateen Bhaghani kicked a game-winning 32-yard field goal to snap a 13-13 tie with 56 seconds to play, lifting the visiting Bruins past Hawai'i, 16-13, at Clarence T.C. Ching Athletics Complex.

The Bruins trailed during the first three quarters of the contest in Honolulu, overcoming a 10-0 first-half deficit before tying the game, 13-13, early in the final period. The victory marked the first win for first-year UCLA head coach DeShaun Foster, who starred as a running back for the Bruins from 1998-2001.

Bhaghani was a perfect 3-for-3 in field goal attempts at Hawai'i, converting from 22 yards away in the third quarter and from 37 yards and 32 yards, respectively, in the final quarter on a hot afternoon in Honolulu. Bhaghani's final successful attempt clinched UCLA's first game-winning drive since the final week of the 2022 regular season at California.

UCLA quarterback Ethan Garbers completed 19 of 38 pass attempts for 272 yards and one touchdown. Garbers threw two interceptions and totaled 47 net rushing yards on seven carries. The senior signal-caller had a game-high 16-yard carry in UCLA's season-opening win.

Hawai'i quarterback Brayden Schager completed 25 of 42 pass attempts for 227 yards and one touchdown. Schager finished Saturday's game with two interceptions and connected with Pofele Ashlock on nine receptions, totaling 112 yards.

UCLA dropped a 42-13 decision to Indiana in the Bruins' first-ever Big Ten Conference game before a crowd of 47,811 at the Rose Bowl.

UCLA trailed by a 21-7 margin at halftime against Indiana, pulling to within 21-10 early in the third quarter. From that point, Indiana outscored the Bruins by a 21-3 margin.

Bruins' quarterback Ethan Garbers completed 14 of 23 passes for 137 yards in UCLA's first home game of the season. Indiana quarterback Kurtis Rourke was 25-for-33, throwing for 307 yards and four touchdowns.

Indiana was effective on third-down opportunities, converting on nine of 12 third downs. In addition, the Hoosiers were 5-for-5 from within the redzone.

Indiana led by a 21-0 margin midway through the second quarter before UCLA scored a touchdown with under one minute to play in the second half, reducing the Hoosiers' advantage to 21-7.

The Bruins used a nine-play, 78-yard drive to get on the board with 42 seconds remaining in the first half. After a 20-yard run by Garbers down to the 1-yard line, T.J. Harden punched the ball through for a one-yard touchdown carry.

UCLA lost at then-No. 16 LSU, 34-17, before a crowd of 100,315 at Tiger Stadium in a nationally-televvised showdown.

In the second all-time matchup between UCLA and LSU, the host Tigers outscored the Bruins by a 17-0 margin in the second half.

UCLA was playing its first-ever game in the state of Louisiana and bounced back from a 17-10 second quarter deficit to head into halftime tied, 17-17.

The first 17 minutes of Saturday's game featured multiple lead changes. LSU took a 7-0 cushion on its first offensive possession before UCLA secured a 10-7 advantage late in the opening quarter. LSU regained the lead, at 14-10, less than 90 seconds into the second quarter.

Trailing 7-0 less than three minutes into the contest, UCLA drove downfield with a 75-yard touchdown drive. Facing a 4th-and-2 on LSU's 33-yard, Garbers completed a 13-yard pass to T.J. Harden before firing a 20-yard TD strike to TE Jack Pedersen (his first collegiate TD reception).

With UCLA trailing LSU, 17-10, Garbers connected with Logan Loya for an 11-yard game-tying touchdown with two seconds to play before halftime. Garbers' second passing touchdown of the day tied the game, 17-17.

UCLA dropped a week 4 matchup at home to Oregon, with a late-second quarter pick-six from safety Bryan Addison representing the Bruins' lone touchdown of the contest.

Oregon led from start to finish, claiming a 28-10 lead by halftime. The Ducks' second-half cushion never fell below 15 points.

Oregon's Dillon Gabriel had 280 passing yards and three TDs, including two connections with Tez Johnson (11 rec, 121 yds, 2 TDs). UCLA's Ethan Garbers went 12-20 for 118 yards and two interceptions. Bruins' kicker Mateen Bhaghani was a perfect 2-for-2 on field goals, connecting on a career-best 54-yard field goal in the third quarter.

In the Bruins' second home contest of the season, Oregon outgained UCLA in total net yards, 433 to 172. The visiting Ducks tallied 280 yards through the air and 153 yards on the ground.

Addison made the biggest play of the day for UCLA in the dying seconds of the first half, picking off a Gabriel pass at the UCLA four-yard line and taking it to the house for a 96-yard pick-six. It was the Bruins' longest pick-six since 2015.

Justyn Martin completed 22 of 30 passes for 167 yards and one touchdown in his first-ever collegiate start, but UCLA dropped a 27-11 decision at No. 7 Penn State in front of 110,047 at Beaver Stadium. It was the Bruins' first-ever Big Ten road game.

The Bruins fell behind by a 14-3 margin at halftime against Penn State, finishing the contest having totaled 260 net yards. Penn State jumped ahead 27-3 with 8:17 to play in regulation before UCLA scored a touchdown and ensuing two-point conversion in the game's final minute.

Playing their third road game in five contests, the Bruins went up against a top-20 ranked opponent for the third consecutive Saturday (previously at No. 16 LSU and at home versus No. 8 Oregon).

UCLA's 16-play, 73-yard drive in the game's final minutes helped the Bruins close the final gap to 27-11. Martin found Logan Loya in the end zone for a one-yard touchdown pass with 16 seconds left in the fourth quarter. The ensuing two-point conversion was a two-yard pass up the middle from Martin to running back Keegan Jones.

Bruins' linebacker Carson Schwesinger totaled a career-best 15 tackles against Penn State, including six solo tackles and one-half tackle for loss. Linebacker Oluwafemi Oladejo had 10 total tackles, one quarterback sack and two tackles for loss (TFL).

UCLA led 10-0 at halftime and allowed a season-low 234 yards of total offense against, but Minnesota scored a touchdown with less than 30 seconds remaining in regulation to claim a 21-17 Big Ten win at the Rose Bowl.

The game featured multiple lead changes, as Minnesota scored 14 unanswered in the third quarter to take the lead before the Bruins answered with a go-ahead touchdown drive midway through the fourth quarter.

However, the Gophers were able to get a defensive stop ahead of the two-minute warning, and then put together a game-winning drive (seven plays, 61 yards, 1:53) capped off by a five-yard touchdown pass to running back Darius Taylor on third down with 27 seconds remaining.

Ethan Garbers had a season-high 293 yards passing thanks in part to a solid connection with wideout J.Michael Sturdivant, who posted season highs in receptions (7) and receiving yards (107) while hauling in the Bruins' longest receiving touchdown of the year to date at 42 yards.

Carson Schwesinger paced the defensive corps, notching his fourth consecutive double-digit tackle performance (13) while recording career highs in tackles for loss (4.5) and sacks (2.0).

UCLA beat Rutgers, 35-32, in the first-ever meeting between the teams in front of a sold-out crowd of 53,736. Quarterback Ethan Garbers recorded career highs in passing yards (383), passing touchdowns (four) and completion percentage (32-38, 84%).

Garbers also completed the longest pass of his career (67 yards) and made the longest rush of his career (49 yards), both for touchdowns.

Garbers dialed up touchdown passes to four different receivers – WR Logan Loya and RBs Keegan Jones, T.J. Harden and Jalen Berger – to become the first Bruin to accomplish that feat since Dorian Thompson-Robinson on Nov. 7, 2020 at Colorado. Berger scored his first TD in a Bruin uniform in the fourth quarter in his home state of New Jersey.

The Bruins never trailed in the contest. UCLA tacked on two key scores in the second quarter. The first came on a 10-play, 91-yard drive ending in a 49-yard TD run by Garbers. Earlier on that drive, Garbers converted on a 4th and 1 on UCLA's own 18 yard line.
